#### Miami Travels to Gainesville to Face Top-Ranked Florida...

The 24th-ranked University of Miami baseball team is set to play a three-game series at top-ranked University of Florida this weekend inside McKethan Stadium, beginning Friday, March 4, at 7 p.m. Saturday and Sunday's games will be televised live on Sun Sports.

Miami (4-4) is coming into the weekend after a tough 4-2 setback against USF on Tuesday night as part of the Florida Four Showcase in Tampa. Florida (7-1) also took part in that event, falling 5-3 to fifth-ranked Florida State in the nightcap of the second annual affair at George Steinbrenner Field.

The Hurricanes last competed at UF in the 2010 NCAA Gainesville Regional, falling in consecutive games to the Gators, who advanced to the NCAA College World Series in Omaha, Neb.

UM will look to pick up on its hitting this weekend, batting .241 for the season. However, the 'Canes have increased their average the last five games, batting .266 during that span and holding opponents to .217 over that period.

Miami's starting pitching has gotten solid performances in weekend games this year, especially in the front and back ends of the series. Freshman Bryan Radziewski (Miami, Fla.) has performed well on the hill in two starts, picking up a win in his last outing against Appalachian State. In that contest, the Florida Christian School product went five innings on the mound, spreading out three unearned runs on five hits and collecting seven strikeouts in the win. He has 15 K's in his first two collegiate starts.

Radziewski leads all UMiami pitchers with a 0.83 ERA.

Sophomore right-hander Eric Whaley has embraced his starting job this season in the third game of series, holding an ERA of 2.13, and owns a team second-best 13 strikeouts. Against Appalachian State last Saturday in Coral Gables, the Pompano Beach, Fla., native sparked the 'Canes to victory with seven scoreless innings, allowing just three hits and registering a career-best nine strikeouts.

Miami will throw left-hander Radziewski in the series-opener Friday night, while the Gators will counter with left-hander Brian Johnson, entering with a 2-0 record and a clean ERA of 0.00.

The Hurricanes use the bat of freshman first baseman Brad Fieger with a .333 average, including a team-high tying three doubles. Following him at the dish is Rony Rodriguez with an even .300 average. Sophomore outfielder Zeke DeVoss carries a .286 average into the weekend, owning two doubles and a triple for a .429 slugging percentage.

#### The Starting Five...

the mound in their first two series of the year against Rutgers and Appalachian State, respectively.

#### Scouting Florida...

The Gators are batting .336 on the campaign, while the pitching staff enters holding opponents to just a .216 average. As a staff, the Gators' pitchers stake a 1.88 ERA on the year, while Miami holds an ERA of 3.08 for the year.

#### UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI HEAD COACH JIM MORRIS - 18TH SEASON

2001, 1999, & 1994 National Coach of the Year • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



In his 18th season at Miami, no other program, nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 38 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 17 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 26 years, 17 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 776-298-3 (.721) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,280-542-4 (.701) Division I record in 29 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 32 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,411-583-4 (.706) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 18 years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the new stadium project.

#### **MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR**

Jim Morris earned his 26th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2010 when he guided the 'Canes to the NCAA Coral Gables Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 17 seasons (1994-2010), winning 15 of his last 17 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris has led the 2010 Hurricanes to their 38th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2010 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft. In 2008, the 'Canes reached the College World Series after winning the Atlantic Coast Conference, widely considered one of the toughest - if not the toughest - collegiate baseball conference in the country.

MORRIS IN HIS 33RD SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,279-540-4 (.703) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,410-581-4 (.708) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 17 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

#### JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

# SHORTSTOPS AND JIM MORRIS

Morris, who played shortstop during college at Elon and then in the Boston Red Sox organization, has had great success developing the position while a head coach. Over the last decade Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases. He currently works with sophomore Stephen Perez, a slick-fielding switch-hitter expected to bat near the upper-half of the order this year for the 'Canes.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres, from 1997-

99. Before Hill, it was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Mets. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and played for the Oakland A's in 2009.

Florida has five players batting above .300 on the slate, including Daniel Pigott with a team-high .538 average. Preston Tucker has a .455 average with a team-high tying two home runs and two doubles. Tucker has a team-best .727 slugging percentage. Nolan Fontana (.393), Brian Johnson (.333) and Josh Adams (.308) round out the top five hitters for UF.

#### Morris Surgery Update...

According to the 18th-year skipper for the 'Canes, Morris is not supposed to do anything with the team and remain recovering at his home for two weeks. He is progressing better each day, but no official date for his return to the Miami dugout has been given at this time.

Still recovering from gall bladder surgery a week ago, University of Miami head baseball coach Jim Morris will not travel with the 24th-ranked Hurricanes this weekend to Gainesville, Fla., for a three-game series with the top-ranked Florida Gators.

After an infection spread from the removal of his gall bladder on Friday, Feb. 25, Morris was released from University of Miami Hospital (UMH) on Thursday morning, and is resting comfortably at his home in Coconut Grove.

#### Miami Against Florida...

In the all-time series against the Gators, the 'Canes hold a 123-99-1 advantage. However, the Gators have taken six of the last seven games – including the last two series, respectively. In a rivalry that dates back to 1940, the 'Canes swept the Gators in a three-game set in Gainesville back in 2009. Florida countered by taking two-of-three from the 'Canes last year at Alex Rodriguez Park.

#### From Manager to Starter...

Sophomore infielder Joey Porro made his first collegiate start and played in his firstever game at the "U" over the weekend in the series finale against Appalachian State. In that game, Porro went 2-for-4 with three RBI. Last season, Porro was a student manager for the 'Canes, and is now living a dream and getting playing time.

#### Freshman Has His Day...

Freshman pitcher Bryan Radziewski has been solid in his first two starts at Miami. Last week he took the mound against Appalachian State in the series-opener, collecting his first collegiate win by going five innings and allowing three unearned runs while spreading out five hits and seven strikeouts.

#### Eric Whaley Stepping It Up...

Sophomore pitcher Eric Whaley is 2-0 after his first two collegiate starts, and is looking solid in his new role. The Pompano Beach native owns a 2.13 ERA with 12 2/3 frames on the mound, and went a career-long seven innings and staked a career-best nine strikeouts in his last outing against Appalachian State.

#### Catch Me If "U" Can...

The UMiami team is full of speed this year, and through the first seven games it is prevalent. Jim Morris has preached stealing bases throughout the year, and the 'Canes swiped 12-of-14 bases on the campaign. Nathan Melendres is 4-for-4 on the path, and Chantz Mack is 2-for-2 to lead the way for UMiami.

#### The First Father/Son Duo...

Freshman catcher Shane Rowland has stepped right into the UMiami starting lineup and taken charge. He belted his first home run over the weekend against Appalachian State. The Tampa native is the son of former UMiami second baseman and current international scout for the New York Yankees, Donny Rowland. They are the first father/son duo to ever play baseball at the "U".

#### Miami Predicted to Finish Third In Coastal Division...

Miami baseball has been predicted to finish third in the Coastal Division of the Atlantic Coast Conference Coaches Preseason Poll. The poll is voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. Capturing a 20-10 league record in 2010, the Hurricanes finished the year third in the Coastal Division behind Virginia and Georgia Tech, respectively. Miami posted a 43-20 overall record en route to claiming the NCAA Coral Gables Regional title, and advancing to the NCAA Gainesville Super Regional.

#### To Be the Best, Play the Best...

According to Boyd's World RPI [strength of schedule], the UMiami Hurricanes have the 33rd toughest schedule in the nation. The 'Canes not only play the top-ranked University of Florida Gators on the road in the third series of the year, but there is the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) schedule. #### **ALEX RODRIGUEZ PARK INFORMATION**

Renovations to Alex Rodriguez Park are thanks in large part to a \$3.9 million contribution by New York Yankees third baseman and 11-time MLB All-Star Alex Rodriguez. The gift the largest ever to the University of Miami baseball program - has assisted the program in continuing to develop first-class facilities. The official announcement of his gift was made on Oct. 10, 2002.

Alex Rodriguez Park has taken form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.
- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box – along with four VIP suites - have been built atop the grandstand. This past offseason, addition seating was added down both lines while a new scoreboard was constructed in left field.
