QUICK HITS

- The Canes return home this weekend to take on Duke and Wake Forest after being on the road the last five matches
- Miami has won its last 10 at home and 21 of the last 22 at the Knight Sports Complex
- Last weekend, UM defeated Virginia behind a balanced attack with Caitilin Donahoe registering 27 assists, six kills and seven digs in her first career start at setter
- The Hurricanes reached 22 points in each set, but fell at Virginia Tech to snap an eight-match winning streak over the Hokies
- The Canes won both home and away against the Blue Devils and Demon Deacons last season, only dropping one set to Wake Forest
- Duke made the NCAA Tournament in 2011
- Miami ranks in the top 10 nationally in both assists (sixth, 13.81) and kills (seventh, 14.75) per set
- NC State and Georgia Tech are both 3-0 in the ACC, while UM and three other teams are right behind at 2-1
- This is the second of 10 straight weekends in conference play, as the team went 8-2 against non-conference opponents
- UM is ranked first in the ACC in kills (14.75/set), digs (17.79/set) and assists (13.81/set) - also second in blocks (2.85/set)
- Emani Sims (45 kills, 15 total blocks) and Alexis Mourning (40 kills, 18 total blocks) were named to the all-tournament team in Louisville
- The Canes started ACC play with arguably the best regular win in program history over then-No. 6 Florida State, the highest ranked team it has ever defeated - the match set a new attendance record (1,129) at the Knight Sports Complex and was televised nationally on ESPNU
- The win over FSU was the 400th in program history
- Alex Johnson was named the ACC Player of the Week on Sept. 10 after posting 16 kills and 16 digs in the 3-1 win over FSU - she was also honored nationally as a Top Performer by the Collegiate Volleyball Update
- Taylor Hollins has 11 double-doubles in 13 matches this season and is sixth in the ACC with 3.56 kills/set (171 total)
- Nrithya Sundararaman and Ryan Shaffer are second in the ACC with 10.84 assists/set and 4.77 digs/set, respectively, while Alexis Mourning ranks third at 1.28 blocks/set
- The Hurricanes have won their last 14 neutral site contests, but are 1-3 in true road contests this season (UM went 10-4 on the road in 2011)
- UM is 40-24 (.625) all-time against teams from the state of North Carolina
- The Canes won two of three at the Redbird Classic, as Taylor Hollins (43 kills, 37 digs) and Ryan Shaffer (65 digs) were named to the all-tournament team
- Miami started the season winning all four matches at the Hurricane Invitational, including coming back to defeat Ole Miss after trailing 2-0
- Alex Johnson won MVP at the Hurricane Invitational after racking up 48 kills on a .421 hitting percentage; Taylor Hollins and Alexis Mourning were named all-tournament
- Miami was predicted to finish fifth by the ACC coaches in a preseason poll
- Alex Johnson and Emani Sims were selected Preseason All-ACC
- The recruiting class was ranked No. 27 in the nation according to PrepVolleyball.com
- Miami has received votes in every AVCA Coaches Poll this season, moving to as high as the first spot out of the Top 25

THE LAST TIME

NOV. 10, 2011: UM 3, DU 0

DURHAM, N.C. - The University of Miami volleyball team eclipsed the .300 hitting mark for the eighth time this season Thursday night as the Hurricanes took down homestanding Duke by a 3-0 count inside Cameron Indoor Stadium. UM took the win on scores of 25-12, 25-16 and 25-15.

Miami (22-3, 13-3 Atlantic Coast Conference) hit .333 in the match and limited the Blue Devils to just a .074 clip on the night. For the Blue Devils, the hitting percentage was a season-low mark in ACC play.

Duke (17-8, 11-5 ACC) did not put a single player in double figures for kills as it was Jeme Obeime leading the way for the Blue Devils with seven, followed by Amanda Robertson with six.

In earning their seventh consecutive win, the Hurricanes trailed for a total of four service points on the night, all of them early-on in the first and second set.

Senior middle blocker Ali Becker registered a team season-best .700 hitting percentage, also a career-high for the Katy, Texas native, in placing a match-high 15 kills on 20 swings against just a single error. She would go on to add two digs and three blocks. Senior All-America outside hitter Lane Carico posted a season-high .433 clip in collecting her team-high 19th double-double - and upping her career total to a school-best 89 double-double performances for her career - by putting down 14 kills and sprawling out for 13 digs.

Redshirt freshman middle blocker Emani Sims also eclipsed the .400 hitting mark for the Hurricanes, recording seven kills on 14 attacks for a .429 hitting percentage. Redshirt senior setter Katie Gallagher, this week’s Co-ACC Player of the Week, also notched a double-double effort with a match-high 34 assists and bringing in 10 digs.

Sophomore right side Alex Johnson sparked the UMiami defense with 14 digs as classmates Ryan Shaffer (12) and Taylor Hollins (11) also added solid defensive performances from the back row.

NOV. 12, 2011: UM 3, WF 1

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. - Five University of Miami players reached double figures in kills to help lead the Hurricanes past homestanding Wake Forest, 3-1, inside Reynolds Gymnasium in an Atlantic Coast Conference volleyball matchup on Saturday.

Miami (23-3, 14-3 Atlantic Coast Conference) picked up its eighth consecutive win with scores of 22-25, 25-16, 25-23, 25-17 and its fourth consecutive victory on the road.

Wake Forest (7-20, 4-13 ACC) took the opening set before the Hurricanes rolled off three straight set wins to retain sole possession of second place in the ACC standings behind in-state rival Florida State.

UMiami senior All-America outside hitter Lane Carico picked up her 20th double-double of the year - eighth consecutive - while hitting at a season-high .457 clip. For Carico, it marked the second consecutive match in which the Manhattan Beach,

Calif. native has secured a plus-400 hitting percentage, also doing so against Duke on Friday night.

Carico, a finalist for the Lowe’s Senior CLASS Award, led all performers on the night with a match-high tying 16 kills on 35 attacks without committing an error. She also brought in 13 digs while serving out an ace. Redshirt senior outside hitter Christine Williamson registered double digit kills for the fourth time on the campaign with 14, also managing four blocks and two digs.

Sophomore right side Alex Johnson recorded her sixth double-double of the year as she placed 10 kills and sprawled out for 11 digs, all while adding four assists, two service aces and three blocks for the Canes. Also touching double figures were redshirt freshman middle blocker Emani Sims and senior middle blocker Ali Becker each staking 10. Redshirt senior setter Katie Gallagher picked up the third double-double of the night for UMiami with a match-high 52 assists and 11 digs.

For Gallagher, the match represented the fifth time on the year the Winter Park, Fla. native has produced 50-plus assists. Sophomore libero Ryan Shaffer led all players for the Canes with 18 digs. Sims would go on to add a match-high five blocks.

Wake Forest was led by Andrea Beck’s 16 kills and three blocks, while teammate Kadija Fornah added 15 kills, 10 digs and two blocks. Carlin Salmon also had 11 kills for the Demon Deacons. Libero Dani Thompson collected 19 digs and teammate Kylie Hargreaves brought in 22 digs.

ALMA MATER: MARYLAND '94

Nicole Lantagne Welch is in her 12th season as head coach of the University of Miami volleyball program. Under her guidance since 2001, the team has posted winning records in nine of the last 11 seasons, including ending the 2010 campaign ranked No. 26 in the RPI polls and No. 28 in the Pablo rankings.

Last season Lantagne Welch guided the Hurricanes to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-4 league mark to finish second in the Atlantic Coast Conference. The Canes spent several weeks in the AVCA Top 25. UM qualified for the NCAA Tournament for the third-straight year, defeating Northern Illinois to advance to the Second Round of the Ames [Iowa] Regional. At the end of the campaign, numerous players earned recognition, including Lane Carico becoming the first Hurricane to win ACC Player of the Year. The senior also earned AVCA All-America honors to cap one of the best careers in Miami history.

This past summer, Lantagne Welch traveled to Ohio to work with the A2 program as part of development for Team USA. In addition, two players associated with the program - Ciara Michel and Savannah Leaf - both competed in the Olympic Games for Team GB.

In 2010, Lantagne Welch helped guide the Canes to their second 20-win season in the last three years, and the second consecutive year in which UMiami advanced to the NCAA Tournament. Miami ended the season with a 23-9 overall mark (13-7 Atlantic Coast Conference) and finished third in the conference regular season standings. Along the way, the Hurricanes defeated NCAA Tournament participants Florida State, Middle Tennessee State, Georgia Southern, Wichita State and North Carolina. At the end of the year, Lantagne Welch saw her first-ever AVCA All-American honored in the form of Carico, collecting third team accolades following a record-breaking year. Carico became the first player in school history with 1,000 kills and 1,000 digs in a career, as well as leading the ACC in double-doubles - and later being the only player in the league to amass at least 400 kills and 400 digs on the campaign. Carico and teammate Katie Gallagher each claimed AVCA All-East Region Team honors, while freshman libero Ryan Shaffer set a new school record for digs by a freshman (539 / 4.53 per set). As for Carico, she would also earn her third consecutive All-ACC Team nod and All-East Region honor.

In 2009, Lantagne Welch helped the Hurricanes to their second NCAA Tournament appearance, competing in the Gainesville [Fla.] Regional. UM earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament after holding the 33rd toughest schedule in the nation according to the end-of-year RPI rankings. Earlier in the season, Lantagne Welch guided the Hurricanes to the Hampton Inn & Suites Northern Colorado Classic championship. She would add to her growing list of All-Atlantic Coast Conference student-athletes, as well as All-America honorable mention performers, seeing senior libero Cassie Loessberg and sophomore outside hitter Lane Carico named to both lists. Carico and Loessberg each collected AVCA All-America Hon-

orable Mention selections, while both were tabbed to the AVCA All-East Region Team. During the 2008 campaign, Lantagne Welch led the Hurricanes to a tie for third place in the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) standings, and the team's best regular season record since 2002.

During the year, Lantagne Welch collected her 150th career victory when the Canes defeated NC State, 3-0, on November 21, 2008. It was just two seasons ago that she posted her 100th career victory in the 2006 season-opener for UM with a 3-2 win over Alabama. The 2008 season was special for UM as the team posted a record of 26-6 overall (14-6 ACC), finishing just one match shy of tying for an ACC Championship. Not to be overlooked was Lantagne Welch leading the Canes to three in-season tournament titles, including a tournament title at NCAA Tournament participant University of San Francisco as part of the Asics/Coca-Cola Invitational in San Francisco, Calif. For those achievements and more, Lantagne Welch was tabbed ACC Coach of the Year, as well as American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) East Region Coach of the Year. It was her first ACC coaching honor, while being the second AVCA Regional honor, collecting the award in 2002 during Miami's historic run to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament.

Under her guidance, Lantagne Welch would later see freshman Lane Carico named ACC Freshman of the Year, as well as AVCA East Region Freshman of the Year. Carico would go on to be named to the All-ACC Second Team, as well as teammates Angelica Ellis and Genny Mayhew. Carico would represent the first-ever ACC Freshman of the Year coached by Lantagne Welch, while Ellis and Mayhew would become the seventh and eighth players in school history to be named to the All-ACC Volleyball Team. Overall, her career at UM is highlighted in part by four seasons with at least 20 wins (2003-04, '08, '10) and a trip to the "Sweet 16" in the Hurricanes' first-ever appearance at the NCAA Tournament in 2002. In her 10 years at the helm in Coral Gables, Lantagne Welch has averaged 19.2 wins per seasons with a career record of 192-109.

PIONEERING THE FIRST SEASON

On Feb. 28, 2000, then University of Miami Athletic Director Paul Dee proclaimed the return of women's volleyball as the Hurricanes newest fully funded varsity sport at UM. On Sept. 12, 2000, Dee took the next major step in the evolution of the program by announcing the hiring of Lantagne Welch as head coach of the Hurricanes.

A WINNING HISTORY

A native of Encinitas, Calif., Lantagne Welch grew up in a family where volleyball had been a major part of their livelihood. Her parents, Joe and JoAnn, owned and operated a highly regarded volleyball scouting service that evaluated high school players, covering the regions of California, Nevada and Arizona. Lantagne Welch's sister, Jenelle Duvall, was an All-American at the University of Pittsburgh and served as an assistant coach at Northern Arizona and Northern Illinois. She also served as head coach at Metro State College of Denver.

Lantagne Welch played at the University of Maryland from 1990-1993. In her role as a four-year starting setter, she guided the Terrapins to their first-ever At-

lantic Coast Conference Championship (ACC) title and an automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament in 1990. As a top collegiate setter, Lantagne Welch garnered First Team All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors in 1992 and '93, and earned Second Team All-ACC accolades in 1991. She would also be named AVCA National Player of the Week (Oct. 12, 1993) following an upset victory over Florida State.

Serving as a team captain through her final two seasons, Lantagne Welch finished her outstanding collegiate career as Maryland's all-time assists, digs and matches played leader. Throughout her career in College Park, Lantagne Welch accumulated various academic honors including ACC Honor Roll and district academic All-America as a senior. She graduated in 1994 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Marketing. For her accomplishments as a student-athlete, Lantagne Welch was named to the Atlantic Coast Conference 50th Anniversary Volleyball Team along with five other Terrapins from teams of the 1990s.

Lantagne Welch began her coaching career in 1994 as an assistant coach on the Maryland staff before becoming a graduate assistant coach at Ohio University in 1995. At Ohio, she developed training sessions for setters and assisted in the scouting of opponents and in the development of game plans. Lantagne Welch arrived at Miami after serving as an assistant coach at Texas A&M. During her three seasons there, the Aggies finished ranked in the top 20 and qualified for the NCAA Tournament each season (1997-99). In 1999, Texas A&M advanced to the elite eight of the NCAA Tournament, compiling a 28-6 record and a No. 9 final ranking. Under Lantagne Welch's training, Aggie setter Jenna Moscovic was named the 1999 Big 12 Conference Freshman of the Year and named to the All-American Freshman Team by Volleyball Magazine. As a sophomore, Moscovic was selected to the 2000 All-Big 12 Team and All-District 5 Team. Lantagne Welch also played a major role in bringing the Aggies back-to-back Top 10 recruiting classes. The 1999 class was ranked in the Top 10 by Student Sports Magazine and the 1998 class was ranked sixth by Volleyball Magazine.

In 2002, she married Wesley Paul Welch of Denver City, Texas, in her hometown of Encinitas, Calif. On Dec. 7, 2004, the couple celebrated the birth of their daughter, Riley Jaye and on April 8, 2007, son Ayden Fletcher was born. Lantagne Welch and her family reside in Miami.

MIAMI SEASON PREVIEW

The Hurricanes, who are receiving votes in the Preseason AVCA Division I Coaches Poll, return 10 letterwinners, including three starters and the libero, from a team that went 26-5 with a 16-4 mark in the Atlantic Coast Conference a season ago. Miami qualified for the NCAA Tournament for the third-straight season, defeating Northern Illinois to advance to the Second Round of the Ames Regional.

“Although many outsiders see that we have lost several starters from our team a year ago, we know that our current team is strong, has depth, and we have very capable players ready to step in and have a strong season. Every position is a battle right now and this team has a lot of depth, which will really help us.”

The Canes were predicted to finish fifth in the ACC in a preseason vote of the league’s head coaches.

The 2012 schedule is expected to be challenging once again with nine matches against teams that made last season’s NCAA Tournament and 20 contests within the ACC. After hosting the Hurricane Invitational, UM will take part in two other weekend tournaments at Illinois State and Louisville.

“Tournaments are a great chance to showcase yourself nationally in comparison to other conferences,” Lantagne Welch continued. “It becomes an important factor in earning bids into the NCAA Tournament. We need to take care of business and treat every match with the utmost importance.”

The first home conference match will take place against Florida State in a contest that will be televised nationally on ESPNU. Overall, there will be nine home league matches and 11 on the road. Lantagne Welch commented on the how the competitiveness of the ACC has risen in recent years.

“Over the last few years the ACC has really taken a step up,” she remarked. “There are a lot of strong players in our conference. There are a lot of seniors on the Preseason All-ACC Team so you can tell there are a lot of returning impact players around the league. Many freshman classes were ranked, so there is a lot of great young talent around as well. Every match matters and you have to be on top of your game each match to win in the ACC.”

UM had two players earn nods on the Preseason All-ACC team, with junior Alex Johnson and sophomore Emani Sims selected. Johnson, who has started every match of her career, led all returning players with 390 kills a season ago while also recording 108 assists and 340 digs. Sims emerged in her rookie season with 105

blocks in the middle, finishing with the ninth-best hitting percentage in the ACC (.316).

Johnson, along with senior Nrithya Sundaraman and junior Taylor Hollins, have been named team captains for the season.

“All three are new to this role but they have been embracing it and we hope they will continue to develop and grow to help lead our team on and off the court,” Lantagne Welch said.

In addition to the experienced returning talent on the roster, the program is excited to see the impact of the five newcomers on the team. The recruiting class was ranked No. 27 in the nation according to PrepVolleyball.com and features four freshmen and one transfer. The transfer, Savannah Leaf, joins UM after spending her summer competing for Great Britain at the Olympics in London.

“The newcomers are a very hard-working group and are very serious about volleyball,” Lantagne Welch pointed out. “They all came in ready to go and are pushing for spots at all positions. We are excited about seeing what they can do this season and how they develop throughout the year.”

In addition to the home FSU match, the Hurricanes were selected for six other broadcast matches by ACC rights-holders. UM was chosen more than any other program in the league.

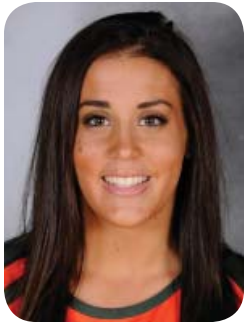

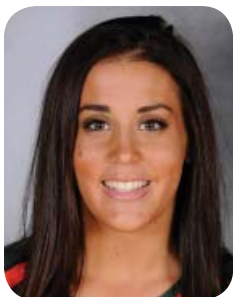
