### La Salle Explorers (6-5) at Miami Hurricanes (6-5)

#### NOTEWORTHY

• This is the seventh meeting this season of teams from last year's Sweet 16. The others were Duke-Kansas, Duke-Arizona, Duke-Michigan, Michigan-Arizona, Florida-Kansas and Indiana-Syracuse.



• La Salle is beginning and ending the 2013 calendar year at the University of Miami. That unique scheduling has happened just once before in program history. The Explorers started 1972 on January 5 vs. Saint Joseph's and ended it on December 30 vs. the Hawks.

• The Blue and Gold are 14-3 in December since 2011 including 7-0 at Gola Arena.

• Tyreek Duren has an impressive starting streak going. Duren has started all but three games in his career. The 83 game streak is second in the A-10 behind Dwayne Evans of Saint Louis (96) and ranks fourth nationally.

• La Salle guard Sam Mills played high school basketball in South Florida. A Sunrise, Fla. native, Mills played at Cardinal Gibbons HS (45 minutes north of Miami).

• Steve Zack had a career-high 17 rebounds vs. Wagner on December 19, the most by an Explorers since Rasual Butler had 20 on November 18, 2001 vs. Morris Brown University.

• La Salle's three turnovers vs. Wagner were the second most committed in a game in Division I this season.

#### THE OPPONENT

Miami enters Sunday's game with a 6-5 record after a 68-51 victory at Savannah State on Thursday. The Hurricanes, the defending ACC Champions and Sweet 16 participants, are led by Rion Brown, who averages 13.3 ppg. and 6.0 rpg. Garius Adams is the only other Hurricane player in double-figures at 11.1 ppg. Miami allows just 61.6 ppg. defensively which ranks 21st nationally.

#### LAST TIME OUT

The La Salle men's basketball sprinted to a 21-7 lead right out of the gate and cruised to an 80-54 victory over Wagner on Thursday evening at Tom Gola Arena. The frontcourt tandem of junior Jerrell Wright (17 points, 7 rebounds) and junior Steve Zack (12 points, 17 rebounds, four blocks) paced the Explorers, who outrebounded the visitors 50-29. "The big guys that we've recruited and coach get the message very clearly that we want them to be true big guys. It's one of the things that helps our role definition and our guys embrace being big guys and they embrace being tough." - Coach Giannini

Record breaking success and consistent winning. Those two phrases can sum up the career of La Salle head coach Dr. John Giannini, who completed his ninth season at the school in 2012-13.

Giannini is La Salle's all-time winningest coach in Atlantic 10 play and has produced the program's only winning A-10 records since joining the league in 1995-96. He is also the winningest coach in the University of Maine's history. When he left Rowan University, Giannini was the winningest active NCAA Division III head coach.

This past season, Giannini guided the Explorers to a NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 appearance with three wins in five days and a #24 national ranking in the final USA Today/Coaches Poll. La Salle's 24 wins were the seventh most in the program's rich 82-year history and the most since 1990.

The Blue and Gold knocked off three nationally-ranked teams during the 2012-13 season, including #9/9 Butler, #19/16 VCU and #12/14 Kansas State. A program-record 11 Atlantic 10 wins tied for third in the nation's seventh-best conference.

Giannini was named the Big 5 Coach of the Year in 2013 after leading the Explorers to a share of the Big 5 title.

In 2011-12, Giannini led La Salle to its first postseason appearance in 20 years with an appearance in the NIT. The 21 wins were the most in 22 years.

The recent back-to-back 20-win seasons, however, have not been the only success for the Explorers during Giannini's tenure. After accepting what most observers believed would be a major rebuilding job, Giannini's Explorers have finished in the top half of the Atlantic 10 five of the past eight years. This established a new level of consistent success for a program that previously had experienced no winning A-10 records since joining the highly-regarded league.

Academic success is also a major emphasis of Giannini's coaching philosophy. La Salle's Yves Mekongo was a two-time Academic All-American and 2010 NACDA I-AAA Scholar Athlete of the Year. Steve Weingarten also earned Academic All-District recognition in 2009-10. Mekongo and Weingarten were also the A-10 Student-Athletes of the Year in 2010 and 2011, respectively. The team's APR (Academic Progress Rate) has improved each season under Giannini and 100% of seniors recruited by the head coach have graduated.

Giannini is involved in many leadership activities. He is a member of the board of trustees at his alma mater, North Central College, and served on the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Congress and on the NABC Committee for Recruiting Rules and Access. At Rowan University, he was a member of the faculty senate.

He authored Court Sense: Winning Basketball's Mental Game, published by Human Kinetics in 2008 and published articles for academic research journals and practical coaching publications. He has also taught courses at the University of Maine and Rowan University.

Giannini was introduced as the 18th head coach in the history of Explorer men's basketball on August 23, 2004.

He came to Philadelphia after an impressive eight year run at the University of Maine where he built the Black Bears into a perennial force in the America East Conference. During his tenure, Giannini compiled the best record of any coach in UMaine history. His teams made five

trips to the America East semifinals or better in his final six seasons and made appearances in the AEC's championship in game two of his last three seasons in Orono. Giannini's two 20-win campaigns are the only two in program history.

Giannini's knack for winning began much closer to the Philadelphia area, however, having spent seven seasons as head coach at Rowan University in nearby Glassboro, NJ. During his run as the Profs head coach, he amassed a 168-38 record and a Division III National Championship in 1996 with a team that went 28-4. He left Rowan with the best winning percentage in the nation (.814) among all active NCAA coaches. He was inducted into the Rowan Sports Hall of Fame in 2004.

Before becoming the head coach at Rowan, Giannini served on Lou Henson's staff at the University of Illinois from 1987-89. In his two seasons as a graduate assistant, the Illini made two trips to the NCAA Tournament including a Final Four appearance in 1989 with a team that went 31-5 in the regular season. He also assisted at Parkland Community College (Champaign, IL) and North Texas.

The Chicago, IL native (Fenwick High) earned his bachelor of arts degree in psychology from North Central College (Naperville, IL) in 1984 and his master of science degree in physical education with a specialization in sports psychology from North Texas in 1986. "Dr. John" also earned a Ph.D. in kinesiology with a specialization in sports psychology from Illinois in 1992.

Giannini was a two-time all-conference player at North Central and remains sixth on the school's all-time rebounding list. He is the all-time leader in games played and his 21 rebounds in a game remain fifth in program history.

"Johnnie is a high character person who brings a high level of energy and toughness," Giannini said. "He has outstanding quickness and instincts. He fits our style of play and our philosophy of winning with chemistry and character. We are very excited about Johnnie joining us." Shuler (6-0, 160) averaged 11.6 ppg. in leading Roosevelt High School to a 26-4 record and a spot in the DCIAA championship game last season. He was named to Second Team All-Met as a junior and spent his sophomore year at DeMatha Catholic High School.

## BIG 5 CHAMP = NCAA?

"I think being able to win the Big 5 in the best college basketball city in America will always be a big deal. I like it as a measuring stick — because the champion of the Big 5 is going to go to the NCAA tournament almost all of the time." - head coach Dr. John Giannini

Since the full round robin format was revived in 1999-00, every Big 5 champion has gone to the NCAA Tournament (13 straight years). In three of those seasons, the title was shared and at least one of the co-champions made the NCAA Tournament.

Since the creation of the Big 5 in 1955-56, the Big 5 champion (shared or outright) advanced to the NAAs in all but 10 seasons. Only one of those years (1998) was in the past 32.

## WINNINGEST ACTIVE A-10 COACHES

Dr. John Giannini is first among active A-10 coaches in career wins with 446 (Rowan, Maine and La Salle).

## GIANNINI ON GARLAND

"Tyrone's a born scorer. If you see Tyrone score a lot of points, it's not because he was good offensively. It's because he was good enough on defense and ball handling to stay in the game. His offense is a lock."

## CLOSE CALLS

La Salle was 7-1 last season in games decided by three points or less.



## **COUSY WATCH LIST, AGAIN**

La Salle junior Tyreek Duren has been named to the Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award Watch List for the third straight year, the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame announced. Duren is one of two Big 5 point guards (Ryan Arcidiacono, Villanova) and two A-10 guards (Chaz Williams, UMass) on the list.

## **MAKING HIS MARK**

With 65 Atlantic 10 wins Dr. John Giannini has more Atlantic 10 Conference wins than any other La Salle coach.

## **COACH'S SON**

Junior Taylor Dunn is the son of long-time college coach Jerry Dunn, who was the head coach at Penn State from 1995-03. He was an assistant coach at George Mason, PSU, West Virginia and Michigan. Dunn now is an assistant with the New York Knicks.

## **TRIPLE-DOUBLE?**

The last La Salle triple-double was on January 4, 1992 when Randy Woods had 30 points, 14 assists and 11 rebounds versus Iona.

## **DOCTORS OF BASKETBALL**

Head coach Dr. John Giannini is one of two Division I head basketball coaches to own doctorates joining Lehigh's Brett Reed (Ph.D., instructional technology). Giannini earned his doctorate in kinesiology with a specialization in sports psychology from Illinois in 1992.

## **WHY ARE WE THE EXPLORERS?**

La Salle University's nickname—the Explorers—was announced by *the Collegian* in March 1932 as the winning entry to a student contest. However, in the fall of 1931, a Baltimore sportswriter covering the La Salle/St. John's (Md.) football game erroneously alluded to La Salle as being named for the French explorer La Salle, not St. John Baptist de La Salle. Were the two events related? We'll never know for sure.

## **GIANNINI AUTHORS BOOK**

*Court Sense*, written by Explorers head coach Dr. John Giannini, was released by Human Kinetics, the worldwide leader in publishing books on sports and fitness. HK's catalogue also features other titles from the likes of John Wooden, Pete Newell and others. The book has been released worldwide. The impetus for the book grew from a series of conversations Giannini had with Human Kinetics Vice President Ted Miller, about the poor performance of United States national teams in international competition and the general decline of fundamentals and team play. Notre Dame's Mike Brey wrote the foreword.

La Salle will have nearly two week lay-off before its next game, a Big 5 contest at Penn on January 4.

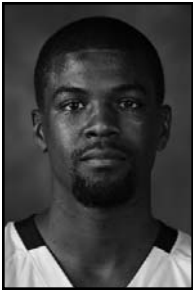
