Friars Versus Miami: Monday's game will mark the 21st all-time meeting between the Friars and Miami. The Friars have posted a 15-15 mark all-time versus the Hurricanes, including an 8-7 record at home, 6-7 away and 1-1 on neutral courts. The two teams last met on March 18, 2009, when the Hurricanes defeated the Friars, 78-66, in the First Round of the NIT in Providence. The Friars' last win over Miami was on February 21, 2004, when Providence earned a 70-57 victory at the Dunkin' Donuts Center.

Scouting The Hurricanes: The nationally ranked Hurricanes have posted a 9-2 record this season. In the team's most recent game, the Miami was defeated by Eastern Kentucky, 72-44, on December 19. Junior guard Sheldon McClellan (Houston, Texas) leads the team in scoring (16.0 ppg). Junior center Tonye Jekiri (Hialeah, Fla.) leads the squad in rebounding (9.4 rpg).

Providence vs. ACC: Providence has posted a 2-1 mark this season against ACC teams. All-time the Friars hold a 131-191 record against Atlantic Coast Conference teams, with 122 of those wins coming against former BIG EAST Conference members Boston College, Louisville, Miami (Fla.), Notre Dame, Pittsburgh, Syracuse, and Virginia Tech. PC holds a record of 122-177 against those seven schools. Against other ACC members, the Friars are 8-12. They are 3-3 against Virginia, 2-1 versus Florida State, 1-4 versus NC State, 1-3 against North Carolina, 0-1 versus Wake Forest and have a 1-1 record versus two schools: Clemson, and Duke. The only ACC school Providence has not played is Georgia Tech.

Colgate in his first collegiate game on December 18, 2012. In his most recent game, Dunn recorded 11 assists versus UMass on December 20. Through 11 games this season, Dunn is averaging 6.5 assists per game, which is tops on the team and in the BIG EAST.

Dunn Scores A Career High: Sophomore Kris Dunn (New London, Conn.) scored a career-high 24 points when he shot 10-13 from the field and registered 24 points in the team's loss at Boston College on December 5. He added 22 points in the team's game versus URI on December 10. He is averaging 13.1 ppg.

Cartwright Posts First Double-Double: Freshman guard Kyron Cartwright (Compton, Calif.) registered his first career double-double with 10 points and 10 assists in the team's victory over Stony Brook on December 13. His 10 points and his 10 assists were both career highs. Cartwright is second on the team in assists (4.3 apg) and fifth in the BIG EAST.

Lindsey Has A Big Game: Freshman Jalen Lindsey (Murfreesboro, Tenn.) recorded 15 points in the team's win over Florida State on November 22. Lindsey shot 5-6 from three point territory for the Friars. For the season, he has made 14 of his 33 attempts (.424) from behind the arc.

Cooley Wins 150th Game: Ed Cooley recorded his 150th win as a head coach with the Friars' 64-60 victory over Albany on November 15. Cooley, who is in his fourth season as the head coach of the Friars, has recorded a 158-116 mark in nine seasons as a head coach. He has posted a 66-47 mark at Providence. In five seasons as the head coach at Fairfield, Cooley posted a 92-69 record.

Henton Climbs The Career Scoring List: Senior LaDontae Henton (Lansing, Mich.) scored his 1,000th career point in the Friars' win over Fairfield on November 29, 2013. Henton has recorded 1,625 points in 113 games (14.4 ppg). He ranks 11th all-time in scoring at Providence.

Henton All-Time Double-Doubles: Senior LaDontae Henton (Lansing, Mich.) recorded his second double-double of the season in the team's win over Florida State on November 22 when he had 22 points and 10 rebounds. He registered five double-doubles last season. For his career, he has posted 28 double-doubles.

Henton Could Exceed 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds: This season, senior LaDontae Henton (Lansing, Mich.) will try to become the seventh player in Friar basketball history to score more than 1,000 points and grab more than 1,000 rebounds. Henton has registered 1,625 points and recorded 896 rebounds in 113 career games. The six Friars that have accomplished the feat are Ryan Gomes '05 (2,138 pts, 1,028 rebs.); Marvin Barnes '74 (1,839 pts, 1,592 rebs.); John Thompson '64 (1,520 pts, 1,061 rebs.); Jim Hadnot '62 (1,467 pts, 1,299 rebs.); Geoff McDermott '09 (1,122 pts, 1,055 rebs.); and Michael Smith '94 (1,110 pts, 1,038 rebs.).

Friars Versus New England Opponents: With the Friars win over Yale on November 28, the team earned its first victory of the season over a New England opponent. On December 5, Providence was defeated at Boston College, 69-60, as the Friars fell to 1-1 on the season versus New England opponents. On December 8, the Friars were defeated by Brown for their second loss to a New England opponent this season. PC improved to 2-2 versus New England opponents this season with a 68-60 victory over Rhode Island on December 10. The Friars earned their third win versus a New England opponent when they defeated UMass, 85-65, on December 20. The Friars have registered a 660-298 (.689) mark all-time against New England opponents.

Friars Defeat Notre Dame To Capture Hall of Fame Tip Off: The Friar men's basketball team defeated Notre Dame, 75-74, on Sunday, Nov. 23 at the Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Conn. to capture the Dave Gavitt Cup by winning the Hall of Fame Tip-Off. With the win, the Friars improved to 85-59 all-time in in-season tournaments and captured their first in-season tournament title outside of Providence since 1984. The Friars also posted wins in the Hall of Fame Tip Off versus Binghamton, Navy, and Florida State.

Henton Named BIG EAST Player Of The Week On Nov. 24: It was announced on Nov. 24 that senior forward LaDontae Henton (Lansing, Michigan) was named BIG EAST Player of the Week. It marked the first time that Henton earned BIG EAST Player of the Week accolades. Henton led the Friars to a 5-0 record by averaging 23.4 points and 5.8 rebounds, while shooting 56.4 percent from the field (44-78), including 9-21 from three-point territory (42.9 percent). Henton scored 21 or more points in four of the five games, including a career-best 38-point effort in a win versus Notre Dame on Nov. 23. The victory over ND helped the Friars claim the Dave Gavitt Cup as the champions of the Hall of Fame Tip-Off at Mohegan Sun. Henton scored 38 of the team's 75 points, while shooting

14-19 from the field (73.6 percent) and 4-8 from three-point territory against Notre Dame. He hit what proved to be the game-winning free throws to put the Friars up by one point with 14 seconds remaining in the contest. He also recorded 21 points and 11 rebounds versus Albany (11/15), 22 points versus Navy (11/20), and 24 points and 10 rebounds versus Florida State (11/22).

Friars All-Time Versus No. 1 Ranked Teams: On Sunday, November 30, the Friars played No. 1 ranked Kentucky at Rupp Arena in Lexington, Ky. With the 58-38 loss, the Friars have now posted a 2-13 mark all-time versus No. 1 ranked teams. The Friars' two victories over top-ranked teams were an 82-81 double overtime win over Michigan on December 29, 1976 at the Dunkin' Donuts Center and an 81-73 win over Pittsburgh on February 24, 2009 at the Dunkin' Donuts Center.

Friars All-Time Versus Top-25 Teams: The Friars have posted a 105-239 (.305) mark all-time versus top-25 teams, including a 0-1 record this season. In the Friars' only game versus a ranked squad this season, Providence was defeated at No. 1/1 Kentucky on November 28. The Friars posted a 2-5 mark last season versus ranked opponents with both wins coming versus Creighton.

Friars Capture 2014 BIG EAST Title, Make 16th Appearance In NCAA Tourney: The Providence College Friars earned an automatic bid to their 16th NCAA Tournament after capturing the 2014 BIG EAST Tournament title on March 15 with a 65-58 win over No. 14/14 Creighton at Madison Square Garden in New York. Providence, which was a No. 4 seed in the BIG EAST Tourney after finishing the conference season with a 10-8 mark, defeated 5th seed St. John's (79-74) in the Quarterfinals and 8th seed Seton Hall (80-74) in the Semifinals. The Friars entered the BIG EAST Tournament on "the bubble" for the NCAA Tournament with a RPI of 52. The Friars earned the three wins and the automatic bid and had a RPI of 40. The Friars, a No. 11 seed, were defeated in the Second Round of the 2014 NCAA Tournament by No. 6 seed North Carolina, 79-77, at the AT&T Center in San Antonio, Texas.

Newcomers: Head Coach Ed Cooley and his staff brought in another strong freshman class. These six newcomers were ranked as the 26th-best recruiting class in the nation, according to ESPN.com. Newcomers Ben Bentil (Wilmington, Del.), Paschal Chukwu (Westport, Conn.), Jalen Lindsey (Murfreesboro, Tenn.), Kyron Cartwright (Compton, Calif.), Tyree Chambers (Bayreuth, Germany), and Tom Planek (Oak Park, Ill.) are entering their first season with the Friars. Bentil is a 6-foot-8-inch power forward from St. Andrew's High School in Wilmington, Del., who was ranked 86th overall according to Scout.com, No. 89 by Rivals.com, and No. 106 by CBS 247. Chukwu was another highly regarded high school player. Chukwu, a 7-foot-2-inch center, averaged 14.3 points, 11.0 rebounds and 5.0 blocks for Fairfield Prep in 2014. He was ranked No. 64 by Scout.com, No. 61 by Rivals.com, No. 85 by CBS 247, and No. 61 by ESPN. Lindsey attended Huntington Prep in 2014. He shot 52 percent from the field, including 43 percent from three-point territory at Huntington Prep. Lindsey was ranked No. 84 by Scout.com, No. 69 by Rivals.com, No. 100 by CBS 247, and No. 84 by ESPN. Cartwright is a quick, left-handed point guard, who came to Providence from Compton (Calif.) High School. He will provide depth in the backcourt. Chambers also will provide depth in the backcourt. The 6-foot-2-inch guard played for Medi Bayreuth in Bayreuth, Germany last season. Planek is a 6-foot-6-inch walk-on from Fenwick High School in Oak Park, Ill. He averaged 13 pts and 10 rebounds last season to help Fenwick capture the regional title.

Henton Named Second Team Preseason All-BIG EAST: It was announced on October 22 that senior forward LaDontae Henton (Lansing, Mich.) was named to the Preseason All-BIG EAST Second Team. The All-BIG EAST Teams and the Preseason Coaches Poll were announced at the league's media day at Madison Square Garden in New York City. The Friars, who won the 2014 BIG EAST Championship, were picked fifth out of 10 teams in the Coaches Poll. Henton earned 2014 All-BIG EAST Tournament Team honors after averaging 17.0 points and 12.7 rebounds in three games while leading the Friars to the BIG EAST title. He ranked second in the league in rebounding last season, averaging 7.9 boards per game. As a junior, Henton finished second on the team in scoring (14.9 ppg) and first in rebounding. The senior forward has led the Friars in rebounding each of his three seasons at Providence.

Friars Have Three New Players Arriving In 2015: Head Coach Ed Cooley announced on November 20, 2014 that student-athletes Alex Owens (Orlando, Fla.), Drew Edwards (Perry Hall, Md.) and Ryan Fazekas (Chesterton, Ind.) each have signed a National Letter of Intent to attend Providence College beginning in September 2015. Owens, a 6-foot-8-inch, 240-pound forward attends Oak Ridge High School in Orlando, Fla., and plays for Head Coach Alex Jackson. He is ranked as the No. 90 top recruit in the nation, according to ESPN.com. He also is ranked No. 88 by CBSSports.com (247 sports.com) and No. 109 by Rivals.com. ESPN.com has him ranked No. 19 by position, while CBSSports.com ranks Owens as the 23rd-best power forward in the country, and Scout.com ranks him as the 28th-best power forward. Owens averaged 17.0 points, 15.3 rebounds and 2.8 blocks in 2013-14 playing in Class 8A. He also shot 64 percent from the field as a junior. Owens recorded 27 double-doubles in the 29 games he played last season. In recognition of his efforts, he earned First Team All-City of Palms, First Team All-County and Second Team All-State accolades in 2013-14. Owens played for Each 1 Teach 1 AAU team under coaches Edward Francis and Steve Reece Jr. Edwards, a 6-foot-3-inch, 175-pound combo guard attends Calvert Hall College High School in Baltimore, Md., and plays for Head Coach John Bauersfeld. As a junior, he averaged 15.0 points, 5.9 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game. Edwards helped lead Calvert Hall to a 28-6 record in 2013-14 and a berth in the Baltimore Catholic League championship game. The team also participated in the prestigious Alhambra Catholic Invitational Tournament at Frostburg State. Edwards earned First Team All-Maryland Interscholastic Athletic Association A Conference and All-Baltimore Catholic League honors. He played for MD 3D AAU Team under Head Coach Dave Thurston. Fazekas, a 6-foot-8-inch, 190-pound shooting guard attends Marquette Catholic High School in Michigan City, Ind., and plays for Head Coach Donovan Garletts. Last season, he helped Marquette Catholic capture the Division 1A state title and post an 18-6 record. Fazekas scored 34 points and registered seven three pointers in the championship game. His seven three pointers established an Indiana High School championship record. As a junior, he led the team in scoring (15.0 ppg) and rebounding (8.0 rpg). Fazekas shot 56 percent from the field and 81 percent from the free-throw line in 2013-14. He earned Indiana Junior All-Star honors and First Team All-Conference accolades in 2013-14. He has scored 985 career points and is a top-5 candidate for Mr. Indiana Basketball honors. Fazekas played for the Mean Streets AAU team under coaches Tai Streets and Chris Buggs.

Friars Won 23 Games In 2014: The Friars registered a 23-12 record last season. It marked the most victories by a Friar squad since the 1996-97 team posted a 24-12 mark and advanced to the Elite Eight. Providence has recorded 20 or more wins in 24 of its 87 seasons of basketball.

Friars Capture BIG EAST Tournament Title With Win Over Creighton: The Providence College men's basketball team was crowned the BIG EAST Tournament Champion by defeating No. 14 Creighton, 65-58, in the Championship Game, on Saturday, March 15 at Madison Square Garden. Senior Bryce Cotton (Tucson, Ariz.) was named the BIG EAST Championship's Most Outstanding Player. Cotton recorded a team-high 23 points and added five rebounds. It is Providence's second BIG EAST Tournament Championship in the 35-year history of the BIG EAST. The Friars also captured the title in 1994, when the Friars defeated Georgetown, 74-64, on March 13, 1994. With 1:17 remaining in the game, senior All-American Doug McDermott hit a three-pointer to bring Creighton within two points (58-56). Junior LaDontae Henton (Lansing, Mich.) then hit Providence's second field goal since the nine minute mark to give PC a four-point lead (60-56, 00:45). McDermott followed with a missed three-pointer, but Henton responded for the Friars with two free throws. The Friar defense then forced McDermott to miss a layup. PC continued to make free throws as sophomore Josh Fortune (Hampton, Va.) hit two free throws of his own. McDermott scored one more time (2-pointer) to make the score 64-58. Then sophomore Tyler Harris (Dix Hills, N.Y.) further sealed the victory with a free throw and brought the final score to 65-58. Providence (23-11, 10-8) had three separate 12-point leads in a back-and-forth scoring second half. The Friars held Creighton scoreless through five minutes in the first half (11:07-5:49) to gain a 17-11 advantage. Providence rattled off nine-straight points in the run. The Friars closed out the frame with a 26-17 lead. Harris led the Friars in scoring with nine points in the half. Henton pulled down eight rebounds. McDermott tallied nine points for the Bluejays. Providence edged Creighton, 36 percent to 35 percent, in shooting from the floor. The Bluejays did not attempt a free throw in the half. Harris and Fortune both finished the game with 10 points. Henton led the team with 13 rebounds. The PC defense held Creighton to 27 percent three-point shooting in the game. On the season, the Bluejays averaged 42 percent from beyond the arc. McDermott led all scorers with 27 points and had a team-high five rebounds. Junior Avery Dingman reached double figures in scoring with 10 points. Three different Friars led in scoring in each of the three games in the BIG EAST Tournament (Fortune-Game 1, Henton-Game 2, Cotton-Game 3). Henton was named to the BIG EAST All-Tournament Team.

Ed Cooley Brings Friars To His First NCAA Appearance: Friar Head Coach Ed Cooley is in his fourth season with the Friars and ninth season overall as a head coach. Last season, he led the team to the NCAA Tournament. It was the first time he coached a team to the NCAA Tournament. Cooley has posted a 149-112 mark, including a 4-3 record in post-season tournaments (1 NCAA, 2 NITs, CIT). In 2013, he guided the Friars to the Quarterfinals of the NIT. He has brought his teams to four post-season appearances in eight years.

Friars In Overtime: The Friars played six overtime games last season (3-3), including four double overtime contests. It was the first time in the history of Friar basketball that the team played four double overtime games in one season. It also was the first time in the history of the BIG EAST that a team had four league games go into double overtime. The consecutive overtime games versus UMass on December 28 and Seton Hall on December 31 marked the first time the Friars played consecutive overtime games since the 1996-97 season. The Friars have never played three consecutive overtime games. On November 8, the Friars defeated Boston



College, 82-78, in overtime. On January 16, the Friars defeated St. John's, 84-83, in double overtime to earn their first double overtime win ever in BIG EAST play. It also marked their first double overtime win since 1991. On March 4, the Friars defeated Marquette, 81-80, in double overtime. The Friars have registered a 56-61 mark all-time in overtime games.

Bullock To Miss Season With Leg Injury: Providence College freshman forward Rodney Bullock (Hampton, Va.) will miss the season after sustaining a leg injury in October.

Dunn Back After Missing Most Of Last Season: Sophomore Kris Dunn (New London, Conn.) had surgery in late December of 2013 to repair an injured shoulder and missed the remainder of the season. Dunn injured his shoulder during the team's exhibition game on November 2, 2013 versus Rhode Island College. Dunn, who was in his second season with the Friars, missed the first three games after the injury and then returned and played in four games before determining that the injury was too severe to continue playing the season. The athletic department applied for a medical hardship waiver with the BIG EAST Conference office in order to get back Dunn's season of eligibility. It was approved and Dunn has three years of eligibility remaining, beginning with the 2014-15 season. Dunn missed the first nine games of his freshman season after having surgery on his shoulder in July of 2012. In 25 games in 2012-13, Dunn averaged 5.7 points, 4.8 rebounds and 3.2 assists per game.

Cooley Served As An Assistant For USA Basketball: Head Coach Ed Cooley was one of two assistant coaches for the 2014 USA Basketball Men's U18 National Team at the FIBA Americas U18 Championship. The team captured the gold medal. Cooley worked under former Friar and current Florida Head Coach Billy Donovan, who served as the Head Coach of the U18 team. University of Arizona Head Coach Sean Miller was the other assistant coach. It was Cooley's second time working with USA Basketball. He was a bench coach in 2013 for the U19 Team.

Providence College Basketball: The 2014-15 campaign marks the 88th season of basketball at Providence College. Since the program started in 1926-27, Providence has posted a 1,367-918 mark, good for a .598 winning percentage. The Friars have made the NCAA Tournament 16 times and the National Invitation Tournament on 19 occasions.



On March 22, 2011, Ed Cooley became the 15th head coach at Providence College. He came to Providence College after spending five seasons as the head coach at Fairfield University.

"When Bob and I sat down with Mike Traghese and we talked about what we were looking for in our next coach, we quickly agreed that the No. 1 candidate for Providence College is Ed Cooley," Providence College President Fr. Brian Shanley, O.P. said. "I wanted a coach that could teach our players about the game of life. I also wanted a relationship builder and Ed is a relationship builder. He will connect with our players, our fans and the entire state of Rhode

Island. I could not be more thrilled to have Ed Cooley as our basketball coach."

Now in his ninth season as a head coach, Cooley has posted an impressive **158-116 mark (.577)**. Most importantly, he guided the Friars to the 2014 BIG EAST Tournament title and their 16th appearance in the NCAA Tournament (2014).

In each of Cooley's eight seasons as a head coach his teams have shown improvement, which is a tribute to his ability to recruit and build a program. His 2014 team was picked to finish sixth in the Preseason BIG EAST Coaches Poll, but overcame losses of personnel during the season to finish 10-8 and fourth overall. The Friars went on a run in the league tournament, posting three straight wins, including a thrilling 65-58 victory over No. 14 Creighton in title game. With the win, the Friars earned the league's automatic berth in the NCAA Tournament and made their first trip to the Tournament since 2004.

His 2014 squad was led by senior All-American Bryce Cotton (Tucson, Ariz.). Cotton had an amazing senior season in which he led the BIG EAST in assists (5.8) and finished second in scoring (21.8). He also led the nation in minutes played (39.9). He earned BIG EAST Tournament Most Outstanding Player honors and garnered his second consecutive First Team All-BIG EAST accolade. He finished his career ranked fourth overall in scoring at Providence with 1,975 points. His teammate, senior Kadeem Batts (Boston, Mass.) also was recognized for his stellar play as he was named All-BIG EAST Second Team.

It did not take long for Cooley to turn the Friar fortunes around. In his second season, he led the Friars to a 19-15 record overall and a 9-9 mark in league play. Included in the 9-9 BIG EAST record in 2012-13 was a 7-2 mark over the last nine games of the conference season. That impressive record marked the second best turnaround over the second half of the season in BIG EAST history. He then guided the Friars to the NIT where the squad posted a 2-0 record before losing in the quarterfinals to eventual NIT Champion Baylor.

Leading the way for the Friars in the 2012-13 season were Cotton and Batts. Cotton was named All-BIG EAST First Team after he led the league in scoring. His teammate, Batts was recognized as a co-winner of the league's Most Improved Award and earned All-BIG EAST Honorable Mention accolades.

In his first season at Providence, Cooley led the Friars to a 15-17 mark overall. The team posted an impressive 11-3 mark in non-conference action, which included an 8-0 record at home. In league action, the Friars defeated No. 14/15 Louisville, 90-59. The 31-point win marked the Friars' largest margin of victory ever over a ranked team. The squad also posted a 72-70 win over defending national champion Connecticut.

Two of Cooley's players earned BIG EAST honors in his first season. Point guard Vincent Council was named All-BIG EAST Third Team and one of his first recruits, forward LaDontae Henton earned BIG EAST All-Rookie Team accolades.

Cooley also has been involved with USA Basketball the last two years. In 2013, he served as a court coach during the USA U19 Training Camp for the World Championships. In 2014, Cooley served as an assistant coach for the USA U18 Team which captured a Gold Medal at the FIBA Americas Championship.

Prior to coming to Providence, Cooley guided Fairfield to a school-record 25 wins and a Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference regular season title in 2010-11. He was named the 2011 MAAC Coach of the Year. He also earned United States

Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District I Coach of the Year honors. His 2011 squad finished the season with a 25-8 mark (15-3 MAAC) and advanced to the second round of the NIT.

In five seasons at Fairfield, Cooley's teams posted a 92-69 mark, including a 58-32 record in MAAC action. Cooley became the first Fairfield head coach to guide the team to a .500 or better mark in MAAC action in each of his first five seasons. In 2009-10, he led the Stags to a 23-11 mark and the team's first post-season berth since 2003. In that win, Fairfield set a NCAA Division I post-season record as the team overcame a 27-point, second-half deficit to defeat George Mason in overtime. For his efforts in 2010, Cooley was the first recipient of the Ben Jobe Award, presented annually to the top minority men's basketball coach in the nation. Prior to taking the Fairfield position, Cooley spent 10 seasons as an assistant coach for Al Skinner. He coached for one season at Rhode Island under Skinner (1996-97) and nine seasons as an assistant at Boston College (1997-06), where the Eagles posted a 175-108 mark and advanced to five NCAA Tournaments and one NIT. Cooley also helped lead the Eagles to the 2001 BIG EAST Tournament title and three BIG EAST regular season titles (2001, 2003 and 2005). In 2004-05, Boston College started the season with a school-record 20 consecutive wins. In 2005-06, the Eagles advanced to the Atlantic Coast Conference championship game against Duke. At BC, Cooley was instrumental in the recruitment of Troy Bell, a two-time BIG EAST Player of the Year. Bell also went on to play professional basketball after leaving Boston College, which included a stint in the NBA with the Memphis Grizzlies.

A 1994 graduate of Stonehill College, where he was a three-time captain for the basketball team, Cooley began his coaching career at UMass-Dartmouth. He helped lead UMass-Dartmouth to a 25-4 mark and a No. 3 national ranking (1994-95). He returned to his alma mater, Stonehill, and served as an assistant coach for one season (1995-96) before joining Skinner's staff at URI. Cooley, a native of Providence, attended Central High School and earned two Rhode Island High School Player of the Year honors. He also did a post-graduate year (1988-89) at New Hampton Prep. before attending Stonehill. He and his wife, Nurys, have one daughter, Olivia, and one son, Isaiah.




