## MIDWEEK STORYLINES & NEWS

- Miami's 25th and final season under the direction of **Jim Morris** continues with a midweek matchup at **FIU** (March 7).
- The Canes have a 93-27 all-time series lead against FIU, including a 27-8 lead in road games in the head-to-head series.
- Morris, the fifth-winningest coach in the history of college baseball, has compiled 1,571 wins as a Division I head coach.
- Last time out, the Hurricanes won a weekend series vs. **Maine** from March 2-4. UM fell in Game 1 but won Game 2 & 3.
- It took 15 innings and six hours, but the Hurricanes won Game 2 vs. the Black Bears, emerging with a 7-6 win on March 3.
- Miami handed No. 1 Florida its first and only loss of the season to date, capturing a 2-0 home shutout victory on Feb. 25.
- **Evan McKendry** was named ACC Pitcher of the Week after twirling six shutout innings vs. the Gators in the series finale.
- Senior lefthander **Michael Mediavilla** (0-2, 4.97 ERA) will oppose FIU's **Nick MacDonald** (2-0, 0.00 ERA) Wednesday.
- The Canes were ranked No. 24 in the preseason *USA TODAY* coaches' poll released in late January. Miami also picked up a No. 9 preseason ranking from Perfect Game and a No. 20 preseason ranking from *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper*.
- UM added a recruiting class ranked as the eighth-best nationwide by *Baseball America* to a group of 15 returning players.
- Miami has qualified for the College World Series **25 times** - the second-most of any program nationwide, trailing only Texas (35). The Hurricanes' **four national championships** (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) are tied for fifth-most all-time.

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans, University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams entering his 25th and final season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in 2008, 2014 and 2016.

In his 24-season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament on 45 occasions, has made it to Omaha in 13 of Morris' 24 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2016, when Miami was awarded the No. 3 national seed for the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 17 of 23 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13 straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams qualified for NCAA Regionals for a streak of 32 straight years, beginning with his final nine seasons (1985-1993) at Georgia Tech and his first 23 seasons at Miami (1994-2016).

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 1,067-452-3 (.703) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,571-696-4 (.693) Division I record in 36 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 40 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,702-735-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 24 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

Two Hurricanes were selected in the 2017 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft; junior outfielder Carl Chester was selected in the 12th round by Tampa Bay and junior righthander Jesse Lepore was drafted in the 24th round by Colorado. The Hurricanes finished sixth in the overall ACC standings in 2017 and advanced to the semifinals of the ACC Championship in Louisville, Ky.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in 2016, as he led the program to its 25th College World Series appearance in history, its third straight ACC Coastal Division title and the program's second ACC Regular Season Championship in a three-year span.

Morris became just the sixth coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500-win plateau when Miami topped Louisville 8-4 in dramatic fashion on March 18, 2016. Eight days later, Miami topped Clemson 5-4 in 11 innings - also in walk-off fashion - to send Morris to his 1,000th win at the helm of the Hurricanes.

Under his direction, the Hurricanes set the program record for fielding percentage with a sparkling .983 mark in 2016, a figure that ranked best nationwide. Seven Hurricanes were selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, including the program's first first-round selection since 2010 in catcher Zack Collins (No. 10, Chicago



White Sox). Morris also helped guide two Hurricanes to a pair of major awards: Collins became the first Hurricane to win the Johnny Bench Award as the nation's top collegiate catcher in 2016, while Bryan Garcia set the program saves record and became the first Hurricane to win the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award.

Morris entered 2015 as among the winningest active coaches in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole possession of eighth place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers and then seventh place with a 9-5 win over Louisville on March 7 (1,445).

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history. Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that have gone on to play in the Major Leagues are Peter O'Brien (Kansas City), Chris Hermann (Arizona), Yasmani Grandal (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jemile Weeks (Boston), Danny Valencia (Oakland), Jon Jay (Chicago), Yonder Alonso (Oakland), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Pat Burrell (Philadelphia), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston), among many others. From his days at Georgia Tech include Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles), Jay Payton (Oakland) and Jason Varitek (Boston).

### MIAMI TO PLAY CROSSTOWN OPPONENT FIU

- The University of Miami will continue its 25th and final season under the direction of head coach **Jim Morris** with a midweek matchup against host FIU at FIU Baseball Stadium on March 7.
- Miami lost three of four games to the Panthers in 2017, but own a commanding 93-27 all-time series lead in 120 matchups. The Hurricanes lead in road games in the series, 27-8.
- The Hurricanes will host the Panthers on April 25 at Mark Light Field; the two teams will play just twice this year compared to four games during the 2017 season. Miami is 0-2 in midweek games so far.
- Senior lefthander and 2016 ace **Michael Mediavilla** (0-2, 4.97 ERA) will start the matchup opposite FIU's sophomore RHP **Nick MacDonald** (1-0, 0.00 ERA). First pitch is set for 7 p.m.

- Despite falling behind late and dropping Game 1, Miami rebounded with back-to-back wins in Games 2 and 3 to capture its weekend series with Maine at Mark Light Field from March 2-4.
- The series win was Miami's second in three weekends in 2018.
- The Hurricanes won a 15-inning marathon to even the series Saturday night, playing a six-hour affair and emerging as 7-6 victors. The Hurricanes led 4-2 in the 9th, fell behind 5-4 in the 14th and 6-5 in the 15th and managed to come back for a victory. **Alex Toral's** game-winning single scored **Freddy Zamora** to end it at 12:02 a.m.
- Sophomore **Evan McKendry** tied a career mark with 10 strikeouts and helped lead UM to a 7-1 win in the finale. Freshmen combined to drive in six of seven runs, including four from **Isaac Quinones**.

### McKENDRY, REYES AMONG ACC HONOREES

- Sophomore RHP **Evan McKendry** was named ACC Pitcher of the Week on Feb. 26 after helping Miami hand No. 1 Florida its first loss of the season on Feb. 25. McKendry tossed six shutout innings with eight strikeouts. He did allow a hit until the fifth in a dominant outing.
- The honor was the first of McKendry's career and second straight week a Hurricane was selected; junior outfielder **Danny Reyes** was named ACC Co-Player of the Week on Feb. 19.
- Reyes powered Miami to a series victory on opening weekend, batting .727 over the course of three games vs. the Scarlet Knights.
- Reyes had the fifth-highest average of any player in Division I over the opening weekend of college baseball. His series included four doubles and one home run - a two-run shot on Opening Day.

### MORRIS TO CAP LEGENDARY 25-YEAR CAREER

- Head coach **Jim Morris** - the fifth-winningest coach in the history of Division I baseball and second-winningest active coach - begins his 25th and final season at the helm in Coral Gables in 2018.
- Morris has led the Hurricanes to 13 appearances in the College World Series - more than any other program since his arrival in 1994 - and won national championships in 1999 and 2001.
- Morris has 180 more wins than the next active coaching wins leader, **Mike Fox** of North Carolina, and is one of just two coaches who ranks in the top five for career wins and is still an active coach.
- The "Jim Morris Final Season" logo will be painted behind home plate for all home games at The Light, and a jersey patch with the logo will adorn every one of the Hurricanes' uniform combos.

- Freshman shortstop **Freddy Zamora** had a big week at the plate to nearly double his season batting average from Feb. 28 - March 4.
- Zamora batted a team-best .438 for the week (7-for-12) and had multi-hit performances in all three games against Maine. he finished with two doubles, two RBI and raised his average from .136 to .263.

**'FAB-5' FRESHMEN A BIG PART OF UM INFIELD**

- Four true freshmen and one redshirt freshman comprised the University of Miami's starting infield during the opening weekend against Rutgers, marking the first time in Jim Morris' 25 years that such a young group started in the field.
- 1B **Alex Toral**, 2B **Willy Escala**, SS **Freddy Zamora**, 3B **Raymond Gil** and C **Michael Amditis** all started in each of the three games against Rutgers. All four also started on the road at FAU on Feb. 28.
- Toral crushed a three-run home run for his first collegiate hit on Feb. 17, while Escala, Zamora and Gil each recorded the first hits of their careers vs. Rutgers. Amditis batted .417 vs. the Scarlet Knights.

**PEREZ EMERGING IN FINAL SEASON AT THE U**

- Senior designated hitter **Michael Perez** clubbed a two-run homer against FAU on Feb. 28, continuing an impressive stretch at the plate.
- Making his first start of the season at third base in the series opener vs. Florida on Feb. 23, Perez swatted his first home run as a Hurricane in the game's first inning against projected MLB Draft first round pick Brady Singer.
- Perez batted .300 against the Gators (3-for-10) and has been a maintstay in the lineup ever since. Over the last five games, Perez is batting .333 (6-for-18) with a team-high four RBI and 11 total bases.

**TORAL JOINS ELITE COMPANY WITH HOME RUN**

- Freshman 1B **Alex Toral** joined elite company when he swatted his first hit as a Hurricane over the fence for a three-run home run in a 7-5 win over Rutgers on Sat., Feb. 17.
- Toral became the first Hurricane to connect on a home run for his first collegiate hit since Chicago White Sox' first-round draft pick **Zack Collins** did so in 2014. Before Collins, the last Hurricane to homer for their first hit was Cleveland Indians All-Star **Yonder Alonso**.

**JEB! SOUTHPAW PITCHING ON FRIDAYS**

- Senior lefthander **Jeb Bargfeldt**, an All-ACC Second Team selection a season ago, picked up where he left off in his first start of the season, tossing five strong innings to pick up a win against Rutgers on Opening Day.
- In 18 career starts at The U, Bargfeldt has allowed two or fewer total runs in 14, including against Rutgers and Maine this season.
- The Owasso, Okla., native did struggle in his start against Florida on Feb. 23, allowing a career-high nine hits and five runs vs. the Gators. He rebounded with 7.1 dominant innings against Maine on March 2, but earned a no decision.
- Bargfeldt was one of the best pitchers in the conference in 2017, earning second-team All-ACC recognition and finishing with a 6-2 record and 1.63 ERA in conference play across 10 starts.

### CABEZAS PICKS UP SECOND SAVE OF YEAR

- Junior righthander **Andrew Cabezas** assumed closer responsibilities entering the year and earned his first save of the year in an 8-5 win over Rutgers on Feb. 17. He earned his second save with three innings against Florida in the series finale on Feb. 25.
- The junior struck out five batters and threw 64 pitches vs. UF.
- Cabezas has five career saves and 144 career strikeouts.

### MIAMI RETURNS ACC'S TOP TWO ERA LEADERS

- The Miami Hurricanes return the top two ACC ERA leaders from the 2017 season: junior reliever **Andrew Cabezas** (2.15 ERA in 2017) and senior ace lefthander **Jeb Bargfeldt** (2.28 ERA in 2017).
- Cabezas, who opens the season as the team's closer, recorded three saves in 2017 and struck out 80 batters compared to 23 walks. Sophomore rightander **Greg Veliz**, who has started on Saturdays, ranked 14th in the ACC in ERA (3.38) in 2017. Those three pitchers also ranked among the top 10 in the ACC in batting average: Veliz was No. 1 (.188), Bargfeldt No. 6 (.198) and Cabezas No. 9 (.221).

### RETURNING ARMS APLENTY

- Head coach Jim Morris and pitching coach J.D. Arteaga will enjoy the return of Miami's top nine pitchers from 2017 ranked by ERA.
- Redshirt senior **Cooper Hammond** (0.00), redshirt junior **Daniel Epstein** (2.08), junior **Andrew Cabezas** (2.15), senior **Jeb Bargfeldt** (2.28), sophomore **Greg Veliz** (3.38), junior **Frankie Bartow** (3.60), sophomore **Albert Maury, Jr.** (3.62), sophomore **Evan McKendry** (4.10) and senior **Michael Mediavilla** (4.45) all returned for 2018.

### YOUNG LINEUP PRODUCES IN EARLY SEASON

- Miami has started five true freshman, one redshirt freshman and six newcomers to the roster in the early season, and the results have been impressive. The Hurricanes have also battled early injuries.
- Redshirt freshman **Michael Amditis** batted .417 (5-for-12) and scored three runs vs. Rutgers, while freshman **Willy Escala** led Miami with a .429 average in three games vs. Florida.
- Freshman OF **Tony Jenkins** leads Miami with five walks this year.

### FEDERMAN IMPRESSING IN FIRST YEAR

- Freshman righthander **Daniel Federman** has delivered an impressive start to his Miami career, allowing just two earned runs in 12.0 innings spanning a team-high seven appearances for a 1.50 ERA.
- The freshman posted one scoreless inning vs. Mizzou (Feb. 21).
- Federman, a righthander from Pembroke Pines, Fla., was in the mix for Miami's fourth and final rotation spot during the spring. He struck out three batters and allowed two hits in 4.2 IP vs. Rutgers

### GONZALEZ LOOKING FOR BIG JUNIOR YEAR

- After powering the Miami offense as a sophomore, **Romy Gonzalez** returns for a junior year where he will lead the UM offense.
- A Cape Cod League All-Star Game selection this past summer, Gonzalez leads all returning hitters in nearly every offensive category, including at bats (223), runs (37), hits (59), doubles (nine), home runs (11), RBI (38), total bases (103), slugging percentage (.462), walks (27) and steals (13).
