- 3** **TIME TO TRAVEL**
Miami is playing three (3) straight road contests for the first time since January 2017 when it won game one and lost the next two.
- 4** **UNCOMMON OCCURRENCE**
Miami is 2-2 all-time in its four (4) prior Feb. 29 games, including 1-1 on the road, 0-1 in ACC play and 0-1 under Coach L.
- 10** **RARE AIR**
At Virginia Tech, Isaiah Wong became the first DI freshman in the last 10 seasons to post 25-plus points, 10-plus rebounds and 10-plus made free throws without a miss in a single game.
- 10** **STREAK SNAPPED**
From 2014-15 to 2017-18, Miami, Duke, North Carolina and Virginia were the only teams with 10-plus ACC wins each year.
- 14** **TOUGH TESTS**
The Hurricanes' strength of schedule ranks No. 14 per ESPN, through Feb. 26, good for the highest mark in the ACC.
- 18** **BEAST ON THE BOARDS**
With 18 boards at Virginia Tech, Keith Stone set a program record in ACC play and tied for the second-most in the ACC this season.
- 42** **WALKING WOUNDED**
Miami is 11-5 with nine scholarship players (7-2 with Keith Stone part of the group), but six Canes have totaled 42 missed games.
- 300** **MILESTONE MARK**
The game at Georgia Tech will make Jim Larrañaga the second coach to reach 300 outings at Miami, joining Bruce Hale (332).
- 659** **WINNING WAYS**
With a 659-444 career record, Jim Larrañaga ranks No. 10 in victories among active DI coaches and places No. 38 all-time (min. 10 years at DI school). *More on pages 9-10*

NEWS & NOTES

FRESHMAN PHENOM

Miami's Isaiah Wong, North Carolina's Coby White, Duke's RJ Barrett, Miami's Lonnie Walker IV and Duke's Marvin Bagley III are the only players to win consecutive ACC Freshman of the Week honors over the last three seasons. Walker (2017-18) and Tim James (1996-96 in the BIG EAST) are the only other Hurricanes to claim back-to-back conference weekly rookie plaudits, regardless of league. All aforementioned players went on to be first-round picks.

SIGNIFICANT STRIDES

As a sophomore in 2017-18, Rodney Miller, Jr., played in just 15 games and made zero starts. He averaged 1.2 points and 0.5 rebounds in 3.5 minutes per game, with high marks of four points and three boards. This year, he has made 26 appearances with 25 starts, averaging 7.6 points and 5.8 rebounds in 24.7 minutes per game, tallying 10-plus points 10 times and eight-plus rebounds seven times, notching highs of 16 and 13, respectively.

HELPING HANDS

On Jan. 2, DJ Vasiljevic created a GoFundMe account to raise money for the New South Wales Rural Fire Service to aid its bushfire crisis relief in his home country of Australia. It has already generated over \$9,500, including \$170 from Vasiljevic, who is donating \$5 for every 3-pointer he makes in ACC play (34 in 17 outings thus far).

THE U TO THE LEAGUE

Miami is one of nine schools—just two are in the ACC—with at least one player selected in the NBA Draft each of the last three years, along with Duke, Kentucky, Michigan, Oregon, Purdue, Texas, UCLA and Villanova. Miami is also one of 11 schools with at least four total players picked in the NBA Draft over the past three years, joining Duke, Florida State, Gonzaga, Kentucky, Michigan, North Carolina, Oregon, UCLA, Villanova and Virginia. The Hurricanes are one of only seven teams on both of those lists. More information can be found on page five.

HURRICANE HERO

Jim Larrañaga ranks second at Miami with 189 victories and third with a .632 winning percentage. His six 20-win seasons at The U are the most of any coach and a third of the program's total. Coach L has also led Miami to all three of its 25-win campaigns, two of its three Sweet 16 berths and half of its eight NCAA Tournament trips.

GEORGIA TECH

The Yellow Jackets, 14-14 (8-9 ACC) on the year, are paced by sophomore guard Michael Devoe's 16.0 points per game. Georgia Tech, picked No. 12 in the ACC preseason poll, finished the 2018-19 campaign at 14-18 (6-12).

BEATING THE BLUE BLOODS

During Jim Larrañaga's eight seasons at Miami, the Hurricanes have an 11-16 combined record against Duke (5-7) and North Carolina (6-9), good for the third-most wins—trailing only Duke (12) and Virginia's (13)—by any school against those two programs since 2011-12. They defeated at least one of the two in each of Coach L's first seven years, topping both in 2012-13 (four total wins) and 2016-17 (two). Prior to Jim Larrañaga's arrival, Miami was 4-31 all-time against the Blue Devils and Tar Heels. The Hurricanes are the only school with at least five victories over those teams by double digits, posting six. Miami and Duke are the only teams in the country with five road wins against those two schools since 2011-12. Additionally, Miami is the lone team with at least four triumphs by 15-plus—only Louisville even has three—and joins Ohio State as the only schools with two decisions by 20-plus. Duke's most lopsided loss of the last eight years is to Miami (90-63 on 1/23/13) and North Carolina's second-most lopsided loss of that stretch is to the Hurricanes (87-61 on 2/9/13). In 2012-13, Miami became the first team to top both schools by 20-plus since Maryland in 1974-75.

QUITE THE COACH

Jim Larrañaga is one of 20 active coaches with 650 career wins, including one of 11 at the DI level. He is the 64th of 66 NCAA coaches all-time to reach 650, including the 39th of 40 with DI experience and the 38th of 39 with at least 10 years at that level. Coach L ranks No. 16 all-time in ACC victories (regular season and ACC Tournament) with 95, including fifth among active coaches. He is also No. 20 all-time in total victories while serving as an ACC coach with 189, good for fifth-most among active coaches. In addition, Larrañaga is one of 17 coaches with 100-plus wins at three DI schools and one of just four such active coaches, alongside Nevada's Steve Alford, Kentucky's John Calipari and Oklahoma's Lon Kruger.

HEART OVER HEIGHT

Chris Lykes is one of just 13 recruited scholarship players under 6'0 at a high-major program (Power Five and BIG EAST), five of whom are in the ACC. Only 11 of them are competing in 2019-20 and just nine began college at a high-major school. Standing 5'7, Lykes is the shortest of the bunch, with 5'9 Kihei Clark of Virginia the lone other one under 5'10. At 16.2 points per game, Lykes was the second-leading scorer in 2018-19 of high-major players under 6'0, trailing only 5'11 Markus Howard of Marquette (25.0), and No. 12 among all DI players under 6'0. Of the six high-major starters under 6'0 last season, Lykes and Howard are the lone returnees.

Four Hurricanes have been selected in the NBA Draft over the past three years. In 2017, Davon Reed went No. 32 to the Suns. In 2018—the third time Miami has had two players picked (1968 and 1970)—Lonnie Walker IV went No. 18 to the Spurs and Bruce Brown, Jr., went No. 42 to the Pistons. Most recently, in 2019, Dewan Hernandez went No. 59 to the Raptors.

TOP TOTALS

On Dec. 21, Hurricanes set program records in both 3-pointers made and attempted in their 91-60 victory over Coppin State at the Watsco Center. Miami went 18-of-38 from long range in the triumph, good for a stellar 47.4 shooting percentage.

PRIME PROGRAM

Through Jim Larrañaga's first eight seasons at Miami (2011-19), the Hurricanes had the fifth-most victories (175) of any team in the ACC for that full stretch. In addition, Miami matched Duke for the third-most road victories (47) and had the fourth-most wins away from home (97) of any such program. In ACC play only, the Hurricanes tied for the fourth-most victories (80) and registered the fourth-most road triumphs (31).

SHORT BENCH

With Deng Gak out for the remainder of the 2019-20 campaign, Miami has only nine available scholarship players. The Hurricanes had just eight to start 2018-19 and then played with only seven in the final 24 games, following Gak's previous injury. The last time Miami used double-digit scholarship players in the same game was Dec. 23, 2017, against New Mexico State in the Diamond Head Classic semifinals in Honolulu. Miami has had just seven scholarship players twice this season, while it had only six in another.

MAJOR MINUTES

In Miami's OT victory at Clemson (12/31), four Hurricanes played 40-plus minutes. It marked the first time since Miami joined the ACC that a quartet of Hurricanes reached that mark and the first time even three did so since Jan. 3, 2015, in an 89-80 2OT loss at third-ranked Virginia. DJ Vasiljevic played a then-career-high 43 minutes, Chris Lykes logged a then-career-high-tying 41 minutes, Kameron McGusty posted a then-season-best 41 minutes and Sam Waardenburg notched a career-high 40 minutes.

Vasiljevic and Waardenburg played all 40 minutes in Miami's victory over Pittsburgh (1/12). Before that, the last time even one Hurricane played a full game was McClellan's 50 minutes of action on Jan. 3, 2015. Two Hurricanes—Vasiljevic and Harlond Beverly—repeated the feat Feb. 5, 2020, in a setback versus NC State.

From the final 7:51 of the first half at No. 13/11 Louisville (1/7) through the full 40 minutes against Pittsburgh (1/12) and the first 5:54 versus NC State (1/15), Vasiljevic played 73 minutes and 45 seconds of consecutive action. In the contests against the Panthers and Wolfpack, he also became the first Hurricane to log 79 minutes in a two-game, non-OT stretch since Shane Larkin did so March 16-17, 2013, against NC State and North Carolina in Miami's ACC Tournament semifinal and championship wins.

Miami again had four players go 40-plus minutes in its 3OT win at Virginia Tech (2/19), as Keith Stone (47), DJ Vasiljevic (44) and Isaiah Wong (42) all set career highs and Kameron McGusty (44) tied his top mark.

WELCOME TO THE CLUB

Two Hurricanes have eclipsed 1,000 points during the 2019-20 season. DJ Vasiljevic did so in Miami's 78-77 triumph over Temple Dec. 17 in Brooklyn, N.Y., while Chris Lykes did so Dec. 31 in the win at Clemson. They are the 40th and 41st quadruple-digit scorers in program history, including the ninth and 10th to reach 1,000 in Jim Larrañaga's nine-year tenure. Lykes is the 26th Hurricane to hit that mark in fewer than four seasons.

STANDING ALONE

Miami was home to the ACC's only candidate for the Senior CLASS Award in both men's (DJ Vasiljevic) and women's basketball (Beatrice Mompremier).

BALLIN' ABROAD

Former Miami star Shane Larkin set the EuroLeague scoring record (49) on 11/29/19 on just 19 shots (10-of-12 on 3-pointers) in Anadolu Efes' 103-75 win over FC Bayern Munich. He also owns the EuroLeague title game scoring record (29), set 5/19/19 in Anadolu Efes' 91-83 loss to CSKA Moscow. In addition, he holds the EuroLeague record for most points in a Final Four (59), as he tallied 30 in his team's 92-73 semifinal win over Lokomotiv Kuban Krasnodar two days before posting 29 in the championship, both in Spain.

A 6-foot-6, 225-pound forward from Beverly, Mass., Cross attends Brewster Academy in Wolfeboro, N.H., the alma mater of Miami freshman Anthony Walker. The consensus four-star recruit is No. 84 in the 247Sports Composite rankings. Cross chose Miami over schools such as Butler, Florida, Indiana, Iowa and Texas A&M.

10 COMMITMENTS OF MIAMI BASKETBALL

Prior to each practice, 10 poster boards are placed on the baseline, each featuring one commitment of Miami basketball. The 10 are as follows:

- ~ We will set our defense every time.
- ~ We will pressure the man with the ball.
- ~ We will pack the lane to prevent penetration.
- ~ We will contest all shots, hands high. Without fouling.
- ~ We will block out, rebound and run.
- ~ We will run for layups and open threes.
- ~ We will share the ball.
- ~ We will penetrate the defense.
- ~ We will create good shots both inside and outside.
- ~ We will attack the offensive boards.

PERFECTION

The Miami men's basketball team posted its first perfect Graduate Success Rate (GSR) in 2018 and then repeated the feat in 2019. The Hurricanes' 100 score was 12 points above the national average in 2019 (88) and 13 above it in 2018 (87). In addition, University of Miami student-athletes as a whole tallied a 92 in 2019, the top mark of any DI school in Florida and tied for No. 20 of all Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) schools.

HURRICANES GO ABROAD

Miami went on a 10-day, eight-night foreign tour to Italy this past summer. From Aug. 9-18, the Hurricanes spent time sightseeing and exploring in Rome, Florence and Como, while also stopping in cities such as Lucca and Pisa. The team went 3-0 on the court during the trip, winning by an average of 18.0 points per game. DJ Vasiljevic led Miami in scoring (16.3), while Sam Waardenburg paced Miami in rebounding (10.0), Kameron McGusty did so in assists (4.3) and Chris Lykes did so in steals (3.0).

COACHING CONTINUITY

Miami's three assistant coaches are in the 35th combined season working for Jim Larrañaga. Associate head coach Chris Caputo is in his 18th year (nine at Miami, nine at George Mason), Bill Courtney is in his 10th (one at Miami, eight at George Mason, one at Bowling Green) and Adam Fisher is in his seventh (all at Miami). That is the second-highest total in the ACC, behind only the 40-year tally from North Carolina's three assistants. Florida State (31) is the lone other ACC school at the three-decade mark.

PRESEASON PICK

Chris Lykes earned 2019-20 Preseason Second Team All-ACC accolades. He is the fourth ACC preseason honoree in program history, joining fellow guards Jack McClinton (2008-09), Malcolm Grant (2011-12) and Bruce Brown, Jr., (2017-18) on the list.

ATTENDANCE INCREASE

Miami has sold over 5,400 season tickets at the Watsco Center in each of the past four years, fulling selling out the season ticket allotment in three of them (noted with asterisks). The 22,962 season tickets sold over the last four years (2015-19) is good for a 95.9 percent increase over the 11,724 sold in Coach L's first four seasons (2011-15).

COACHING COORDINATORS

Jim Larrañaga's assistant coaching staff is set up in a coordinator system. Associate head coach Chris Caputo, in his ninth year with the Hurricanes, is the defensive coordinator. Adam Fisher, in his seventh season at Miami (fifth as a coach) is the offensive coordinator. Bill Courtney, in his first year with the Hurricanes, handles the scout for every opponent.

20-GAME SLATE

This season, 2019-20, is the first of the 20-game ACC schedule. Miami still has the same two primary rivals (Florida State and Virginia Tech) it plays twice each year, while its other repeats are Duke, Louisville, NC State and Pittsburgh. Four of those six were picked top-six in the ACC preseason poll, including two in the top three. Next year, in 2020-21, the Hurricanes' repeat foes will be Boston College, Clemson, Florida State, North Carolina, Notre Dame and Virginia Tech.

FAMILIAR FACES

Associate head coach Chris Caputo is in his 18th year on Jim Larrañaga's coaching staff, dating back to 2002-03 at George Mason. Only three assistants in the ACC have worked for their current head coach longer: North Carolina's Steve Robinson (25), Florida State's Stan Jones (23) and Notre Dame's Rod Balanis (20). In addition, Caputo and Larrañaga are both New York natives and graduates of Archbishop Molloy High School, where they played for the legendary Jack Curran. The only other DI staffs in the country with two coaches who attended the same high school are East Tennessee State, Southern Illinois and St. Mary's. The Salukis, with brothers Bryan and Brendan Mullins, are the lone other team with the head coach a part of the duo.

VICTORIOUS AT VT

On 2/19, in the first 3OT game in program history and first by any teams in ACC play since 12/20/03, Miami won, 102-95, at Virginia Tech. In regulation, the Hurricanes trailed by seven with 4:26 before Isaiah Wong went on a personal 11-2 run to put Miami ahead by two with 1:39 to go. They trailed by three in the closing seconds before a three-point play by Kameron McGusty with 5.0 on the clock sent the game to OT. Miami trailed by four in the final minute of that session, but Wong hit shots with 51 ticks and six ticks on the clock to force another session. He made another shot with 16 seconds remaining in 2OT to force the final frame, in which Miami posted a 12-5 margin. Wong logged a 27-point, 12-rebound outing, setting career highs in both, to become the first Miami freshman with a double-double since Bruce Brown, Jr., on 12/22/16. He went 14-of-14 at the line to also become the first DI freshman with 25-plus points, 10-plus boards and 10-plus made free throws without a miss in the past 10 seasons and the first Power Five player with 27-plus points, 12-plus rebounds and 14-plus made free throws since USC junior Nikola Vucevic did so on 12/29/10. Miami had three 20-point scorers for the first time since 1/25/09 and logged 100-plus points against a DI team for the third time since 2000, including the first versus an ACC foe. Wong's 14-of-14 mark from the stripe tied the second-best total in program history and matched the best ledger in the ACC this season. The Hurricanes hit their first 25 free throws and did not miss until 3OT, finishing 29-of-32 (90.6 percent) for their third-best tally ever in an ACC game with 20-plus attempts. Miami also grabbed 55 rebounds to set the top mark in the league this season and tie the program record in an ACC contest. Keith Stone, who logged his first double-double, had a career-high 18 boards to set the Miami record for an ACC contest and tie for the second-most by any ACC player in a game this season.

HALL CALL

In 2020, Johnny Hemsley (1996-00) will become the 22nd Miami men's basketball player in the UM Sports Hall of Fame, joining a group that includes standouts such as Rick Barry, James Jones and John Salmons.

ELITE EIGHT SEASONS

In his first eight seasons, Jim Larrañaga has led Miami to 20 more wins (175) than it had in any prior eight-year stretch (155 from 1958-66). The six 20-win campaigns in Coach L's tenure are over half of the program's previous total (11) and match the full prior total since the reberth (1985-86). Miami's four NCAA Tournament trips under Larrañaga are two shy of its previous total and one short of its prior post-reberth total. The Hurricanes' six postseason trips under Coach L are one shy of their record for an eight-year stretch (seven from 1994-02 and 2010-18), the latter of which features Coach L's first seven years.

In his eight seasons at the University of Miami, head coach Jim Larrañaga has led the Hurricanes to four NCAA Tournament appearances, including two trips to the Sweet 16, and won the 2013 ACC regular-season and tournament titles. He has been named the Associated Press, Naismith, USBWA and Henry Iba National Coach of the Year, twice was both the ACC and USBWA District Coach of the Year and was the 2013 NABC District Coach of the Year.

Larrañaga has posted three 25-win seasons at UM – the only Miami coach to do so – and five in his career. He also has recorded six 20-win campaigns at Miami and 12 in his career. In conference action, the Canes have won nine or more league games in six of eight seasons, while prior to Larrañaga's arrival, Miami had never won more than eight ACC games in a season. Larrañaga has helped the Canes to 18 postseason victories, including four in the NCAA Tournament (three appearances), nine in the ACC Tournament (eight) and five in the NIT (two).

Miami's 47 total road wins in the past seven seasons are tied for the third-most among league teams and in that time the Canes are tied for fourth in conference wins (80), fourth in ACC road victories (31) and fifth in ACC home victories (49). In the six years prior to Larrañaga's arrival, when the ACC had only 12 teams, Miami was tied for ninth in ACC victories (36) and won just 10 total ACC road games.

Miami has seen unprecedented fan interest in the program under Larrañaga. For the third straight season in 2017-18, Miami sold out its season-ticket allotment at the Watsco Center. The 2015-16 season marked the first time in Miami Hurricanes' history that any team sold out of season tickets.

Miami played in its fourth NCAA Tournament in the past six years in 2017-18, claiming a No. 6 seed in the South Region. The Hurricanes tied for third in the ACC and finished the season with a 22-10 mark, including an 11-7 record in conference play. The Canes were nationally ranked for 15 weeks, reaching as high as No. 6 in the polls.

Freshman Lonnie Walker IV was named Honorable Mention All-ACC, becoming the first freshman all-conference honoree in program history. He also was named to the ACC All-Freshman Team. Miami earned road wins over then-No. 12 Minnesota and then-No. 9 North Carolina, the fourth straight year and the sixth time in Larrañaga's seven seasons that the Canes defeated two or more top-15 teams.

The 2015-16 Hurricanes played their way into the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 for the second time in four seasons, and just the third time in school history.

In 2012-13, Larrañaga helped Miami to a No. 2 national ranking by both the AP and USA TODAY and a No. 2 seed in the NCAA tournament. At the time, he was the 10th coach in the last 10 years to lead two top-10 programs, as Miami was No. 2 on Feb. 18, 2013, and George Mason was No. 8 in the final Top 25 poll in 2006.

Individually, Shane Larkin earned the ACC Player of the Year and Lute Olson National Player of the Year awards, as well as All-American status and finalist nods for the Bob Cousy, John Wooden and James Naismith player of the year honors before declaring early for the 2013 NBA Draft. Larkin was also the ACC Tournament MVP, on the ACC All-Defensive Team and a Defensive All-American. Durand Scott was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year.

Larrañaga came to Miami after serving as the head coach at George Mason for 14 seasons. He guided the program to five NCAA Tournament appearances (1999, 2001, 2006, 2008, 2011), including an unprecedented run to the 2006 Final Four that captured the nation's attention, as the Patriots defeated Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and UConn along the way. Following that run, Larrañaga was selected the 2006 Clair Bee National Coach of the Year.

into a perennial contender in the highly-regarded Colonial Athletic Association, winning more games than any other coach in program and conference history (273) en route to three conference titles (1999, 2001, 2008).

In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the Final Four in 27 years and earned the CAA's first NCAA tournament at-large berth in 20 years. Along the way, he led Mason to a school record in wins, its first-ever national ranking, its first-ever appearance in the Top 10 and its first wins over Top 10 teams.

Larrañaga served as the head coach at Bowling Green for 11 seasons (1986-1997) and at Division II American International for two seasons (1977-79).

At Bowling Green, he made an immediate impact in his first season. In 1986-87, the Falcons were the nation's most improved team under a first-year head coach that took over a program with a losing record, posting a 15-14 record for an eight-game improvement over the previous season. Larrañaga went on to record a 170-144 mark in 11 years at Bowling Green, earning 1997 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year honors after leading Bowling Green to a 22-10 record, a conference regular season co-championship and a berth in the NIT. The 22 victories were the most by a Bowling Green team in 47 years and the 13 conference wins were the second-highest total in BGSU history.

Larrañaga's 170 victories at Bowling Green ranked second all-time on the Falcons' coaching list and he was only the second coach to record consecutive postseason appearances. Larrañaga led his squad to NIT berths in 1990 (18-11) and again in 1991 (17-13), the first time the Falcons enjoyed back-to-back postseason appearances since the early '60s. Bowling Green won better than 60 percent of its games in Larrañaga's last four years, recording a 70-44 mark during that stretch. The Falcons finished fourth or better in the MAC in five of Larrañaga's 11 seasons and he is among the winningest coaches in MAC history.

Larrañaga received his first head coaching position in 1977 when he was named to the post at American International, a Division II program in Springfield, Mass. Taking over a team that had suffered through five consecutive losing seasons prior to his arrival, Larrañaga turned AIC into a winning program in his first year and compiled a 28-25 mark in two seasons.

Larrañaga's first coaching opportunity came at Davidson College from 1971-76, serving as an assistant coach to Terry Holland. Davidson captured three Southern Conference regular-season championships and an NIT berth in his five years there, and he compiled a 47-12 record doubling as the freshman team coach. In 1976, he left Davidson and spent one season as player-coach for the Geronimo Basketball Club in Belgium.

After his two-year stint at American International, Larrañaga was reunited with Holland at the University of Virginia in April 1979. An assistant coach under Holland at UVA for seven seasons from 1979-86, he helped the Cavaliers reach the NCAA Final Four on two occasions (1981 and 1984), finish in the top five of the AP and UPI polls and average more than 24 victories per season. The Cavaliers were 169-62, won three regular-season Atlantic Coast Conference championships and made four NCAA Tournament appearances in that span. Virginia also made a pair of NIT appearances, winning the NIT Championship in 1980. Larrañaga was on the staff during the careers of three-time National Player of the Year Ralph Sampson and NBA first-round draft choice Olden Polynice.

A 1971 graduate of Providence College with a degree in economics, Larrañaga was a four-year letterman for the Friars. As the team captain in his senior season, he led Providence to a 20-8 record and an NIT appearance. He graduated as the school's fifth all-time leading scorer with 1,258 points and was selected in the sixth round of the draft by the Detroit Pistons of the National Basketball Association. He was the team's top scorer as a sophomore and junior and was named New England's Division I Sophomore of the Year in 1969. He was inducted into the Providence College Hall of Fame in 1991.

Larrañaga and his wife, Liz, have two sons and four grandchildren. Their son, Jay, played for his father at Bowling Green, was the head coach of the NBDL's Erie Bayhawks and is now an assistant coach with the Boston Celtics. Jon was a member of his father's George Mason teams from 1999-2003, earning first team Academic All-America honors for NCAA Division I-AAA schools.
