#### THE GAME

- Coming off a 28-21 overtime loss to Georgia Tech last time out on Oct. 19, the Miami Hurricanes play their first road game in 50 days on Oct. 26 vs. Coastal foe Pittsburgh at Heinz Field in Pittsburgh, Pa. Kickoff for the game - only Miami's second true road matchup of the year - is set for 12 p.m.
- The game will be broadcast on ESPN with Mark Jones (play by play), Dusty Dvoracek (color) and Olivia Dekker (sideline) on the call. Joe Zagacki (pxp) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the 560 WQAM radio booth for their 18th season together, while Josh Darrow will handle the sideline duty. Alfredo Alvarez (pxp) and Joe Martinez (color) will also carry the game on Unanimo Deportes 990AM live from Heinz Field.

#### THE SERIES

- Saturday's game versus the Panthers is the 39th all-time matchup in the series, which Miami leads, 26-11-1, including 12-6 in games in Pittsburgh.
- The Coastal foes have met every year since 2013 (Pittsburgh's first year in the ACC), and Miami has a 4-2 lead in those games, including a win in 2018.
- In last year's matchup in Miami Gardens, the Hurricanes upset No. 25 Pittsburgh, 24-3, in the regular season finale. Miami ran for 297 yards in the win.

#### THE HURRICANES

- Miami returned 12 starters and 39 letterwinners from a 2018 team that finished with a trip to the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in New York, N.Y. Mark Richt announced his retirement at season's end, and Manny Diaz was introduced as the 25th head coach in University of Miami program history on Jan. 2.
- Miami has played six one-possession games - tied for the most in all of FBS - and three games have come down to the final play of the game this year.
- The Hurricanes lost their most recent game vs. Georgia Tech on Oct. 19, 28-21, in a game that went to overtime at Hard Rock Stadium. RB Cam/Ron Harris rushed for a career-high 136 yards on 18 carries, while LB Shaquille Quarterman had 13 tackles, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery.
- On Aug. 12, Diaz named redshirt freshman Jarren Williams Miami's starting quarterback for the season. Williams, who beat out redshirt sophomores Tate Martell and N'Kosi Perry in a three-man battle during training camp, made his fifth career start on Oct. 5 but was replaced by Perry vs. Va Tech. Williams, who has battled an upper extremity injury, did not play vs. Virginia and did not start vs. Georgia Tech; Perry started both of those games.
- LB Shaq Quarterman has started all 46 games of his career since arriving on campus in January 2016; he has the second-longest start streak in FBS.
- Diaz, who spent the previous three seasons as defensive coordinator for the Hurricanes (2016-18), retooled Miami's offensive staff upon his hire, bringing Dan Enos from Alabama as offensive coordinator and hiring four other new coaches for offense. He hired longtime colleague Blake Baker, who spent the last four seasons at Louisiana Tech, as defensive coordinator and added Todd Stroud as assistant head coach / defensive line coach.

#### THE OPPONENT

- Pittsburgh is under the direction of fifth-year head coach Pat Narduzzi, who has led the Panthers to a 33-26 mark during his tenure at the helm.
- QB Kenny Pickett has thrown for 1,602 yards with eight touchdowns and four interceptions in six games, while WR Maurice Ffrench leads the way with 56 catches for 488 yard. Defensively, the Panthers are led by Paris Ford (51 tackles) and Jaylen Twyman (eight tackles for loss, seven sacks).

## QUICK HITS

#### UM PLAYS FIRST ROAD GAME IN 50 DAYS

- Miami plays its first road game in 50 days on Saturday, Oct. 26, when it battles the host Panthers at Heinz Field at 12 p.m.
- The Hurricanes have a 26-11-1 all-time series lead against the Panthers, including a 12-6 lead games played in Pitt. In Miami's last trip to Heinz Field, the Panthers snapped the nation's longest winning streak with a 24-14 win over No. 2 Miami.
- The Hurricanes returned the favor last season, upsetting the Coastal Division champion Panthers, 24-3, in the regular season finale for both teams at Hard Rock Stadium.
- The Canes have only one home game remaining; Miami hosts Louisville on Nov. 9 to close its schedule at Hard Rock Stadium.

#### JORDAN BALLING OUT IN SECOND YEAR

- Sophomore Brevin Jordan has been among Miami's top performers in his second season and leads the Canes with 28 receptions and 438 receiving yards.
- Jordan is ranked second nationally among Power-5 tight ends in receiving yards and, has already surpassed his freshman year total for receiving yards (287).
- The sophomore standout ranks fourth among all tight ends in FBS in yards.
- Jordan had a career-high 136 receiving yards and one touchdown against Virginia Tech on Oct. 5. He had three catches last time out vs. Georgia Tech.
- The Las Vegas native was high school teammates with Tate Martell and Bubba Bolden is ranked No. 58 in FBS in receiving yards this season.

#### CHAIN RETURNS, TD RINGS DEBUT IN 2019

- One of the most recognizable sights in all of college football over the previous two seasons, the latest version of the turnover chain was revealed in Miami's opener vs. Florida on Aug. 24 in in Orlando.
- The new chain, sporting a 10-inch '305' charm that contains more than 2,000 white sapphire stones, was worn four times vs. the Gators, including the first-ever appearance when DL Scott Patchan recovered a fumble.
- The season opener vs. the Gators also served as the debut for Miami's offensive reward: the two touchdown rings, which combine to spell out "Hurricanes".
- Seven different Hurricanes have worn Turnover Chain 3(05); Miami has totaled 66 turnovers since the 2017 inception of the chain - an average of two per game.

## BY THE NUMBERS

The Hurricanes have won five national championships in program history (1983, 1987, 1989, 1991, 2001) – tied for the sixth-most in the history of Division I college football.

No team in FBS has played more one-possession games than Miami, who is tied with North Carolina for the most games decided by eight points or fewer this year.

Miami's defense is ranked No. 25 in FBS in scoring defense, having allowed opponents to score an average of just 19.2 points per game through six games.

Senior linebacker Shaquille Quarterman, a first-team All-ACC selection a season ago, has the second-longest active start streak of any player in FBS, having started all 46 games of his entire collegiate career.

Miami's stout rushing defense has allowed an average of just 96.1 rush yards per game this season - the 15th-best mark in all of FBS.

Miami ranks No. 19 in FBS in total defense, surrendering an average of 298.0 yards per game through its first seven games of the season.

## MIAMI HEADS NORTH TO STEEL CITY FOR FIRST ROAD GAME IN 50 DAYS

- After the longest single-season homestand in more than 30 years, the Miami Hurricanes play their first road game in 50 days when they travel to Pittsburgh to battle host Pitt on Sat., Oct. 26 (ESPN).
- Entering Saturday's game, the Hurricanes had played five straight home games dating to Sept. 14. Miami's last road game was a Sept. 7 matchup at North Carolina; UM is 0-2 away from home this year.
- The Hurricanes have a commanding 26-11-1 all-time series lead over the Panthers, including a 12-6 mark in road games. As ACC counterparts, the two teams have met six times (Miami leads, 4-2).
- The two teams have traded similar results in the last two years; as ACC Coastal champions in 2017, the #2 Hurricanes were upset by the Panthers to snap the nation's longest winning streak. Last year, UM upended the Coastal champion Panthers, 24-3, at Hard Rock Stadium in the regular season finale.
- Miami's lone remaining home game is a Nov. 9 game vs. Louisville on Homecoming Weekend.
- The game will also be carried by 560 WQAM The Joe and Unanimous Deportes 990 AM (Spanish radio).

## A LOOK BACK: HURRICANES DROP OVERTIME GAME TO JACKETS, 28-21

- QB **N'Kosi Perry**, making the eighth start of his career and second straight start, accounted for three touchdowns - two passing and one rushing - but Miami fell, 28-21, in overtime to Georgia Tech Oct. 19.
- The Jackets recorded one defensive touchdown and one special teams touchdown, scoring on a strip-sack in the end zone and a fake punt pass play. The Hurricanes were stopped inches short of covering a first down in overtime; it was Miami's first loss in overtime since a home game vs. Clemson in 2009.
- RB **Cam'Ron Harris** recorded a game-high 136 rushing yards in a dazzling performance, averaging 7.6 yards per rush on a career-high 18 carries. Harris added a 19-yard receiving touchdown in the loss.
- Perry hit WR **K.J. Osborn** for a 13-yard touchdown pass for Osborn's team-leading fourth TD grab.
- Defensively, the Hurricanes were led by LB **Shaq Quarterman**, who made his 46th straight start and posted 13 tackles, two tackles for loss, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and two QB hurries.

## HARRIS PUTS TOGETHER BIG GAME VS. GA TECH, RUSHES FOR 136 YARDS

- Seeing significant action due to an in-game injury to RB **DeeJay Dallas**, RB **Cam'Ron Harris** had the best performance of his young career last time out in a loss to Georgia Tech at Hard Rock Stadium.
- Harris rushed for a career-high 136 yards on a career-high 18 carries and added his first receiving touchdown of the season in a three-catch game. Harris' previous career high for rush yards was 77.
- Harris' 136 yards were the most by a Hurricane running back since Travis Homer rushed for 168 yards on eight carries in a win over Pittsburgh in November 2017. Harris averaged 7.56 yards per carry vs. GT.
- The Miami native has a team-high five PBUs this year and has totaled 16 tackles (12 solo) in six games.
- A consensus four-star prospect by every major scouting service, Harris - who went by Cam'Ron Davis last year but changed his last name to match his father's last name this past offseason, was ranked as the No. 9 running back in his high school class and No. 167 overall prospect in his class by ESPN.com.
- Harris picked Miami over offers from Georgia, Oregon and Wisconsin, among others.

## SOPHOMORE JORDAN DAZZLING, CONTINUING TIGHT END U TRADITION

- For the second straight year, TE **Brevin Jordan** has been among Miami's top contributors on offense.
- Jordan has the second-most receiving yards (438) of any Power 5 tight end this season, and has surpassed his freshman total for receiving yards. He leads UM in catches (28) and receiving yards.
- Playing his first season of college football in 2018, Jordan emerged as a go-to target in the Miami offense; Jordan was second on Miami in receptions (32) and was second in touchdowns (four).
- Jordan was named to the All-ACC Second Team after a standout first year, starting 12 of 13 games.
- He has been even better in 2019, and is on pace for 48 catches and 750 yards by regular season end.
- In a win vs. Virginia Tech on Oct. 5, Jordan had a career-high 136 receiving yards with one TD.
- Jordan enjoyed a strong opener vs. Florida (Aug. 24), starting the game and finishing with a team-high five-catches for 88 yards and one TD. He has at least five catches in three of six games this year.
- A Las Vegas native and high school teammate of QB **Tate Martell** and S **Bubba Bolden**, Jordan was named to the Mackey Award preseason watch list (nation's top tight end) and preseason All-ACC.
- Jordan was named a Midseason Freshman All-America by ESPN in 2018. The talented sophomore was rated the No. 1 tight end in the country by ESPN and 247Sports.com and No. 2-rated TE by Rivals.

## A RAY GUY AWARD NOMINEE, HEDLEY PAYING DIVIDENDS ON SPECIALS

- Miami's punting unit struggled in 2018 with a 34.48 net punting average - ranking 117th in FBS.
- The addition of Australian punter **Lou Hedley** - who arrived to Miami after two years at City College of San Francisco and who is a former Australian Rules Football player - has been a key for the Hurricanes.
- Hedley was selected to the Ray Guy Award watch list after a standout first half of the season at The U.
- Hedley is averaging 45.4 yards per punt - which would be tied for the 14th best mark in FBS (lack of attempts). Last time out vs. Georgia Tech, Hedley boomed a career-long 67-yard punt on Oct. 19.
- Thanks largely to Hedley's stellar play, Miami's unit now ranks 26th in FBS in net punting (41.35 / punt).
- Standing 6-foot-4 and tattooed from the neck down, Hedley used to own a tattoo shop in Bali, Indonesia before moving to San Francisco from Melbourne, Australia where he was at ProKick Australia.

## OSBORN STEPPING UP IN FINAL SEASON, HAS BEEN KEY ADDITION AT WR

- One of Miami's most important additions of the offseason was transfer **K.J. Osborn**, who joined the Hurricanes for his final year of eligibility after an impressive four-year career at Buffalo with the Bulls.
- The 6-foot Osborn has started all seven games at wide receiver this season and ranks second in receptions (27) and leads Miami in TD catches (4). He has totaled 324 receiving yards (second-most).
- Last time out vs. Georgia Tech (Oct. 19), Osborn tied for the team lead with four catches and a 13-yd TD.
- Osborn was selected as one of two players to represent Miami at ACC Kickoff, the conference's annual media day, despite not having played a down at that point. Osborn has been cited by coaches and teammates as a key locker room influence. He was selected one of four captains for the season opener.
- Making his second start on offense, Osborn tied for the team lead with seven receptions at UNC (Sept. 7), including a six-yard TD reception. He also scored TDs vs. Bethune (Sept. 14) and CMU (Sept. 21)
- In three seasons of playing time at Buffalo, Osborn totaled 1,490 yards and 12 touchdown receptions.

## ROUSSEAU SHINING AFTER MISSING MOST OF FIRST SEASON TO INJURY

- After missing all but one full game during his true freshman season of 2018 due to a right ankle fracture, DL **Gregory Rousseau** has shined in his first major action through the first part of 2019.
- Rousseau is tied for the UM lead with 7.5 tackles for loss and ranks first on Miami with five sacks in 2019.
- The Coconut Creek, Fla., native was rewarded with his first career start in a win over Virginia (Oct. 11) and made the most of it with a career-high seven tackles, two tackles for loss, one sack and a forced fumble.
- Rousseau has a sack in five of UM's seven games and is one of just 10 ACC players with five sacks.
- In a dominant game vs. Central Michigan (Sept. 21), the 6-foot-6 standout recorded his first strip-sack, recovering his own forced fumble to wear the turnover chain for the first time in his career.
- Rousseau was ranked as a four-star prospect by Rivals coming out of high school; as a senior at Champagnat Catholic, he had 80 tackles and 10 sacks, with three sacks in the state title game.

## HILL PLAYING BIG ROLE IN FIRST SEASON AS MEMBER OF HURRICANES 'D'

- Another one of Miami's big additions this past offseason was DE **Trevon Hill**, who spent the first part of his career at Virginia Tech before arriving at Miami as a grad transfer prior to the 2019 season.
- Hill, who earned the first start of his Miami career last time out against Georgia Tech (Oct. 19), has totaled three sacks - tied for second-most on the Hurricanes - and has compiled 5.0 tackles for loss.
- The Virginia native is one of just four players on Miami with at least five tackles for loss this season.
- In 30 games with Virginia Tech, Hill made 16 starts and finished with 20 tackles for loss and 11.5 sacks.

## HALL, JR. IMPRESSIVE AS FIRST-YEAR STARTER IN MIAMI SECONDARY

- The Hurricanes lost two-year starting safeties to the NFL Draft in 2019 when **Sheldrick Redwine** (Cleveland Browns) and **Jaquan Johnson** (Buffalo Bills) were both selected after standout careers.
- Sophomore **Gurvan Hall, Jr.**, who totaled eight tackles as a freshman playing mostly on special teams, has been a key member of the Hurricanes' secondary and ranks second on UM with 44 tackles.
- Hall, Jr., has been credited with 3.5 tackles for loss, two sacks and two PBUs and has started five games.
- A West Palm Beach native, Hall, Jr., picked Miami over Alabama, Georgia, Ohio State and others.

## SOUTHRIDGE TRIO PLAYING BIGGER ROLE IN OFFENSE AS SOPHOMORES

- Miami added three former Miami Southridge high teammates in the 2018 recruiting class who saw limited action as true freshman last season: WR **Mark Pope**, OL **DJ Scaife, Jr.** and WR **Dee Wiggins**.
- Scaife finished with seven starts on the o-line, while Pope and Wiggins combined for eight catches.
- This season, Scaife has started all seven games on the offensive line (six at right tackle, one at right guard), while Wiggins (eight catches) and Pope (10 catches) have both seen playing time increase.
- Wiggins caught a career-long 50-yard pass last time out vs. Georgia Tech (Oct. 19), while Pope had the first touchdown of his career on a 'hail mary' pass to end the first half vs. Virginia Tech (Oct. 5).

TURNOVER CHAIN PART 3(05); CHAIN'S IMPACT MEASURABLE ON 'D'

- When DL **Scott Patchan** pounced on a Gators fumble in the first quarter of Miami's game on Aug. 24, fans inside the stadium and across the country awaited the unveil of the newest turnover chain.
- The chain, which previously featured a charm in the shape of the iconic 'U' (2017) and Sebastian the Ibis (2018), features a 10-inch charm with the famous '305' Miami area code with more than 2,000 white sapphires; the charm weighs 500 grams. The chain took roughly three months to complete.
- Since the unveiling of the turnover chain in 2017, the Hurricanes have compiled 66 turnovers in 33 games, an average of two turnovers per game; Miami had 19 takeaways the season before the chain.
- In addition to Patchan, LB **Shaq Quarterman** (fumble recovery), S **Amari Carter** (interception) and striker **Romeo Finley** (interception) each wore the turnover chain in Miami's opener vs. the Gators.
- In a 17-12 win over Central Michigan on Sept. 21, Miami had three turnovers and two first-time chain wearers - CB **Al Blades, Jr.** (interception) and DL **Gregory Rousseau** (fumble recovery) both wore it.
- CB **Trajan Bandy**, DL **Pat Bethel** and S **Rob Knowles** have worn the chain on fumble recoveries in 2019.

MIAMI DEFENSE RANKS AMONG BEST IN FBS SEVEN GAMES INTO 2019

- The Hurricanes have posted some impressive defensive numbers; UM ranks No. 19 in FBS and No. 3 in the ACC in total defense (298.0 yards per game) and No. 19 nationally in tackles for loss (7.6 per game).
- Miami's scoring defense is No. 27 in the nation at just 20.4 points per game - third-best in ACC.
- One of Miami's top-performing units this season has been its rushing defense, which has allowed an average of 96.1 yards this season - the 15th-lowest mark in FBS and third-lowest in the ACC.
- The Hurricanes have allowed two of its seven opponents - Virginia Tech (Oct. 5) and Georgia Tech (Oct. 19) to surpass the 100-yard rushing mark this season. The Gators rushed for just 50 yards in the opener.
- Miami's defense has recovered seventh fumbles - the 12th-most in FBS and tied for the ACC lead.
- The Hurricanes are averaging 3.0 sacks per game, which is the 21st-best total in FBS, headlined by **Gregory Rousseau**, who is one of just 10 players in the ACC with at least five sacks so far this season.

BANDY HAS BIG GAME VS. VIRGINIA, HONORED AS ACC DB OF THE WEEK

- Miami's lone returner in the secondary to start the season, junior CB **Trajan Bandy** had one of his best games of the season in a victory vs. Virginia (Oct. 11) and was named ACC Defensive Back of the Week.
- Bandy, who made his sixth straight start this season and 22nd of his career vs. UVA, was third on Miami with six tackles and wore the turnover chain for the first time this year with a fumble recovery vs. UVA.
- Bandy added a solo sack, his third of the season, and finished with a season-high six tackles in the win.
- The Miami native has a team-high five PBUs and has totaled 17 tackles (12 solo) in seven games.

PERRY ENJOYS BIG GAME VERSUS HOKIES, THROWS FOR 400+ YARDS

- QB **N'Kosi Perry** was ready when his number was called in a loss to Virginia Tech (Oct. 5), entering in place of QB **Jarren Williams** in the first half; Perry set career marks in nearly every stat category.
- Perry set personal bests in completions with 28 (previous high was 21), attempts with 47 (previous high was 35), passing yards with 422 (previous high was 224) and longest pass with 51 (previous was 42).
- Perry also tied a career mark with four touchdown passes and threw just one interception vs. VT.

DALLAS PUTS TOGETHER STRONG FIRST HALF AS MIAMI'S STARTING RB

- After playing behind current Seattle Seahawks RB **Travis Homer** the last two years, RB **DeeJay Dallas** has served as Miami's starting running back in 2019 put together a strong first half of the season.
- Through Miami's first six games, Dallas ranked sixth in the ACC with an average of 78.7 yards per game and ranked 12th in FBS among running backs and second in the ACC with a 6.7 yards-per-rush average.
- Dallas started but was injured in Miami's game versus Georgia Tech (Oct. 19); he had just three carries.
- In his first career start vs. Florida on Aug. 24, Dallas had a game-high 131 all-purpose yards, including a game-high 94 rushing yards. He had a career-high four catches and scored on a 50-yard TD run.
- Dallas delivered the fourth 100-yard rushing performance of his career at North Carolina (Sept. 7), totaling 107 yards on 14 carries. He rushed for a career-high three touchdowns vs. Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 14), the first such performance for a UM player since QB **Malik Rosier** did it at Toledo in 2018. In a game vs. Virginia Tech on Oct. 5, Dallas had a season-long 62-yard rushing touchdown in the loss.
- Though he was not a starter last season, Dallas was all over the field for the Hurricanes. The Georgia native had the longest rush of any player (83 yards), the longest kick return of any player (53) and the longest punt return (65). He ranked first on the Hurricanes in all-purpose yards (1,260).
- Dallas ended 2018 ranked second in rushing yards (617) and tied for the team lead with six rushing TDs.
- In 32 career games, Dallas has found the end zone 16 times with 15 of them being rushing scores.
- Dallas became a father this offseason; though his own name is Demetrius, he named his son DeeJay.



## WILLIAMS HAS IMPRESSED THROUGH EARLY GOING OF CAREER AS QB1

- QB **Jarren Williams** was announced as Miami's starting quarterback by head coach **Manny Diaz** on Monday, Aug. 12 after winning a quarterback battle that started in spring ball and lasted into camp.
- Williams impressed in difficult environments to start the year vs. Florida in Orlando and at UNC.
- Injured during Miami's game vs. Virginia Tech on Oct. 5, he has not started the last two games.
- In his first start as quarterback vs. Florida on Aug. 24, Williams finished 19-for-30 for 214 yards and the first passing TD of his career. He became UM's seventh freshman QB to start a game since 2008.
- He was even better at North Carolina on Sept. 7, throwing for a career-best 309 yards on 30-for-39 passing with two touchdowns. The 30 completions were the most by a Miami QB since **Brad Kaaya** vs. Pitt in 2016, while the 300-yard passing game was UM's first since **Malik Rosier** at UNC in 2017.
- Williams beat out QBs **Tate Martell** and **N'Kosi Perry** for the starting spot. Williams will make the sixth start of his career on Oct. 11 vs. Virginia; he was the first freshman to start a season opener since **Brad Kaaya** started as a true freshman against Louisville on Labor Day weekend 2014 - a 13-31 loss to UofL.
- Williams saw action in one game as a substitute during his true freshman year; he finished 1-for-3 with one 17-yard pass and a one-yard rushing touchdown against Savannah State on Sept. 8, 2018.
- A consensus four-star prospect, Williams was ranked as the No. 6 dual threat quarterback by ESPN.
- Williams chose Miami over Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia and Ohio State, among other schools.

## DALLAS HAS ROCKED TOUCHDOWN RINGS MORE THAN ANY OTHER CANE

- After QB **Jarren Williams** hit TE **Brevin Jordan** for a touchdown pass vs. Florida, the newest team reward was showcased: the Touchdown Rings. Made mostly of orange and green sapphires, the Touchdown Rings weigh 100 grams and contain close to 500 stones between the pair. The rings were designed by Miami's own "A.J. the Jeweler" - the same man responsible for all three Turnover Chains.
- RB **DeeJay Dallas** also wore them in the opener, while WR **K.J. Osborn** and TE **Will Mallory** wore them after receiving TDs at North Carolina. RB **Cam'Ron Harris** rocked the rings after his rushing TD vs. UNC.
- No one has worn them more than Dallas, who has six rushing touchdowns and one receiving score.
- TE **Larry Hodges** wore the touchdown rings twice vs. Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 14), while WR **Jeff Thomas** wore them twice in a game vs. Virginia Tech back on Oct. 5 at Hard Rock Stadium.

## MIAMI WEARS SPECIAL "PARLEY FOR THE OCEANS" UNIS VS. CAVALIERS

- Determined to keep their surrounding oceans clean, and as a nod to the University of Miami's renowned Rosenstiel School of Marine and Atmospheric Science, adidas and the Hurricanes' alternate uniforms for Miami's game vs. Virginia (Oct. 11) were created through adidas' collaboration with Parley for the Oceans. The environmentally-conscious unis were crafted from repurposed and upcycled materials.
- The adidas Primeknit A1 football uniform is composed of over 70% regenerated ECONYL® yarn; a raw material transformed from fishing nets and other nylon waste intercepted in marine environments.
- The special-edition uniform jerseys have been auctioned off, with the proceeds benefitting first-year students at RSMAS who will take part in a research cruise; this also happened with the 2018 uniforms.

## YOUNG O-LINE STARTS TWO TRUE FRESHMEN AND TWO SOPHOMORES

- UM's starting offensive line vs. Florida (Aug. 24) included two freshman - true freshman LT **Zion Nelson** and redshirt freshman RT **John Campbell, Jr.** - and got even younger over the next six games.
- Joining Nelson on the offensive line and making his University of Miami debut was true freshman **Jakai Clark**, who started at right guard each of the next six games after the season opener vs. Florida.
- OL **Navaughn Donaldson** was the only returning starter on the offensive line with at least 10 starts.
- According to research from *The Athletic*, the Hurricanes were one of only three programs in the country to start a true freshman at left tackle in their opener. Tennessee and UCLA also started a true frosh LT.
- According to the same research, Miami was also one of just three programs in the country to start freshmen at both tackle spots in the opener; Duke and Michigan started two redshirt freshmen tackles.

## QUARTERMAN AN IRON MAN AT THE U, HEADS TALENTED DEFENSE

- Miami's three-headed monster - senior trio **Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney & Shaq Quarterman** - had started nearly every game together since arriving to University of Miami as early enrollees in 2016.
- McCloud, who may redshirt 2019 - according to coaches - after moving back to inside linebacker prior to this season, has started 31 games in his career. He has totaled 133 tackles and 12.5 tackles for loss.
- One of Miami's most instinctive players, Pinckney started all 12 of the games he played in last season and finished with 74 total tackles and 11.0 tackles for loss. He was named All-ACC Honorable Mention.
- Quarterman, who has started all 46 games for the Hurricanes in three-plus seasons at The U, ranked second on UM with 82 total tackles. An All-ACC first-team pick in 2018, he has over 250 career tackles. Quarterman's 46-game start streak is the second-longest in FBS, trailing Ethan Reed of Louisiana Tech.
- All three linebackers elected to return for their senior seasons after Manny Diaz, their coordinator for all three seasons, was named head coach. The trio cited the importance of their collective legacy at Miami and a disappointing 2018 as key reasons for the return. Both Pinckey and Quarterman are on track to earn their undergraduate degrees; McCloud has begun work towards a master's degree.

## HURRICANES BOLSTERED BY MIDSEASON DEBUTS OF SILVERA, BOLDEN

- Miami was bolstered by the Oct. 5 debuts of S **Bubba Bolden**, who missed the first four games due to NCAA eligibility issues, and DL **Nesta Jade Silvera**, who suffered a leg injury during fall training camp.
- Nine Hurricanes made their debuts in Miami's season opener vs. the Gators, including two players who started: LT **Zion Nelson** and WR **K.J. Osborn**. Nelson was one of just four freshmen to debut vs. Florida.
- Osborn was among five players who transferred to Miami this offseason and made their debuts; the other who debuted were P **Louis Hedley**, DL **Trevon Hill**, QB **Tate Martell** and DL **Chigozie Nnoruka**.
- The five true freshmen who debuted vs. Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 14) were LB **Sam Brooks, Jr.**, DL **Jason Bissett, Jr.**, DL **Jared Harrison-Hunte**, DL **Jalar Holley** and S **Keontra Smith**.

## MURPHY LIVING THE HURRICANE DREAM, SCORES FIRST TD OF CAREER

- Redshirt senior RB **Jimmy Murphy** was rewarded for his hard work vs. Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 14), scoring a touchdown and celebrating with an enthusiastic front flip on the first score of his career.
- Murphy, a fan favorite, has been among Miami's top special teams performers for the last two years and was voted a team captain in 2018. He plans to attend medical school once his Miami career is finished.

## HODGES FOLLOWS MALLORY'S LEAD, FIRST CATCH OF SEASON IS A TD

- For the second straight season, TE **Will Mallory** made the most of his first grab of the year, scoring a touchdown on the play. Mallory's 11-yard TD put the Hurricanes ahead late at North Carolina (Sept. 7).
- Mallory recorded his first career TD on his very first catch, a 2-yarder vs. Savannah State (Sept. 8, 2018.)
- Freshman TE **Larry Hodges** doubled Mallory's feat, scoring touchdowns on both of the very first two grabs of his career vs. Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 14). Hodges made his debut at UNC on Sept. 7.

## HURRICANE FOOTBALL'S 94th SEASON OPENED WITH TRIP TO O-TOWN

- The Hurricanes kicked off their 94th season of football in 2019, road tripping to Orlando - their first trip there since the 2016 Russell Athletic Bowl. It was the earliest season opener in Miami history.
- Miami's 100th year of football is slated for the 2025 season, when UM hosts Florida and Notre Dame.
- In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), Miami has compiled a 30-11 record in season openers - UM's streak of three straight wins in openers came to an end in 2018 against LSU.

- Five Hurricanes were selected in the 2019 NFL Draft: **Sheldrick Redwine** (fourth round, Cleveland), **Michael Jackson, Sr.**, (fifth round, Dallas), **Joe Jackson** (fifth round, Dallas), **Jaquan Johnson** (sixth round, Buffalo) and **Travis Homer** (sixth round, Seattle). Multiple others signed free agent deals.
- For 45 consecutive years, the Hurricanes have had at least one player selected in the NFL Draft.
- Miami leads all programs in the ACC in draft picks since 2000; 115 Hurricanes have been selected.
- Just this year, TE **Jimmy Graham** caught the first TD pass of the league's 150th season and RB **Frank Gore** eclipsed 15,000 career yards - just the fourth running back in NFL history to top the mark.

## DIAZ RETOOLS COACHING STAFF, HIRES DAN ENOS TO RUN OFFENSE

- In one of his first moves as head coach, **Manny Diaz** overhauled the Hurricanes' entire offensive staff. Diaz hired **Dan Enos** away from Alabama to serve as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.
- Diaz added two former colleagues of Enos during his time as head coach of Central Michigan (2010-14): offensive line coach **Butch Barry**, most recently with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, and wide receivers coach **Taylor Stubblefield**, most recently with Air Force. Both worked for Enos at CMU.
- **Stephen Field**, who worked at Oregon last year, was hired to coach tight ends and **Eric Hickson**, who worked at Kansas State, was brought in to coach running backs. Both are south Florida natives.

## TURNOVER CHAIN HAS BECOME ICONIC IN COLLEGE FOOTBALL

- When DB **Trajan Bandy** pounced on a loose ball of Miami's home opener vs. Savannah State in 2018, the crowd turned to observe a familiar sight from 2017: the now-famous "Turnover Chain."
- But instead of that 2017 chain, which was modeled in the shape of the iconic "U" logo, Bandy was presented a brand new turnover chain to wear featuring a charm in the model of Sebastian the Ibis.
- Turnover Chain 2.0 was comprised of more than 4,000 stones (compared to 900 in 2017), weighed roughly three kilograms (compared to two in 2017) and had an 8.5-inch charm (compared to 5.5).
- The Hurricanes defense totaled only 19 turnovers gained in 13 games in 2016 - the season before the turnover chain's inception. Since, UM has compiled 66 in just 33 games, averaging two per game.
- No Hurricane wore the 2018 chain more often than Bandy, who wore it five times in a breakout year.
- adidas and other apparel providers launched a special line of turnover chain-branded t-shirts, and the first two chains remain in a display case in the Schwartz Center lobby on the athletics campus.
- Rapper 'Solo D' performed his song 'Turnover Chain' in front of the Hurricanes at the team's annual awards banquet, and the chain was the focal point of Miami's ACC Network-branded commercial.

## BLAKE BAKER, FAMILIAR FACE FOR D STAFF, LEADS HURRICANE DEFENSE

- Miami head coach **Manny Diaz** announced the hiring of longtime colleague **Blake Baker**, who spent the past four seasons as defensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech, to run the Miami unit in January 2019.
- Baker worked under Diaz at Louisiana Tech, serving as safeties coach when Diaz was the Bulldogs' defensive coordinator. He was also a two-year grad assistant under Diaz during his career at Texas.
- Baker's unit ranked No. 4 nationally in team sacks and No. 12 nationally in tackles for loss last season.
- Baker also previously worked with defensive coaches **Ephraim Banda** and **Jonathan Patke** at Texas.

## ZAGACKI AND BAILEY RETURN TO THE BOOTH FOR YEAR 18

- "Voice of the Hurricanes" Joe Zagacki and color commentator Don Bailey, Jr. are in the booth for their 18th year on the radio - the duo has broadcast 257 straight games together.

## HURRICANES A REGULAR PARTICIPANT ON ESPN'S COLLEGE GAMEDAY

- Early in August, ESPN announced it would host its famous College GameDay show at Disney's Magic Kingdom the morning of Miami's game against Florida at Camping World Stadium in Orlando.
- The game vs. Florida marked the 21st time a game involving the Hurricanes has been selected for College GameDay; prior, its most recent was the 2017 ACC Championship Game in Charlotte, N.C.
- The Hurricanes and Gators have matched up for a College GameDay site clash just two other times, with the two teams splitting the other results 1-1. Prior to 2019, its most recent College GameDay matchup vs. UF was 9/6/2008 - a 3-26 loss in Gainesville. The other - on 9/7/2002 - was a 41-16 win at Florida.

## CAROL SOFFER INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY OPEN FOR BUSINESS

- On August 17, 2018, history was made at the University of Miami, as the Miami Hurricanes practiced inside the Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility for the very first time during fall camp.
- In September 2016, Miami announced the largest donation in the history of the athletics department as the lead gift for a state-of-the-art football indoor practice facility. In honor of their mother Carol, Jeffrey Soffer and Carol's other children made a \$14 million commitment to Miami.
- Former coach Mark Richt pledged \$1 million towards the facility and football alumnus and linebacker great Jon Beason was among those alumni to donate. Beason's gift was \$250,000, as Miami alumni and former players teamed up to contribute more than \$2 million for the project.
- The 81,800-square-foot facility features two field-turf fields - one 90 yards long and an additional 40-yard field directly connecting to the Squillante Strength and Conditioning Center. The facility features interconnectivity to the Hecht Athletic Center and Schwartz Center for Athletic Excellence.

## MIAMI IN YEAR 5 OF 12-YEAR DEAL WITH ADIDAS

- In January of 2015, adidas & the University of Miami announced a landmark 12-year partnership making adidas the official footwear, apparel and accessory brand of UM through June 2027.
- The partnership, which then made Miami one of adidas' 13 licensed NCAA programs at the time, began on Sept. 1, 2015 and includes investment, product and uniform development for all 18 UM programs.

# MANNY DIAZ

HEAD COACH | FIRST SEASON AT MIAMI (FIRST OVERALL) | 3-4 (.429)

Manny Diaz, who has deep roots in the Miami community and catapulted the Hurricane's defense to elite status during his three years as the team's defensive coordinator from 2016-2018, was announced as the 25th head coach of the University of Miami football program on Sun., Dec. 30.

"Manny is one of the nation's elite coaches and the Canes Family has already embraced him and his incredible work ethic over the past three years," said UM Director of Athletics Blake James upon his hiring. "He is absolutely the passionate and innovative leader that our program needs, and we will work together to build an incredible staff to move our program back into championship contention."

Diaz, who has an impressive resume during nearly two decades as a defensive specialist coaching several collegiate programs, accepted his dream job of leading a Hurricanes team he believes is destined to return to the top echelon of collegiate football in the years to come.

"Miami is home. The University of Miami is home. The U has truly been 'the job' for me since I first got into coaching," said Diaz. "Having worked here over the past three years, I came to understand what it means to be part of 'The U' and came to appreciate the passion and commitment to excellence of all who proudly call themselves Canes. We will restore the football program to its place among the nation's elite and we will do it with hard work, dedicated coaches, and outstanding student-athletes. I'm excited about working with Blake and his team to make that happen."

During his 19-year coaching career, Diaz, the son of a former Miami mayor, also named Manny Diaz, has coached in 18 bowl games, amassing a 13-5 record in bowls, and has coached numerous all-conference and NFL players at six collegiate institutions.

Miami delivered another stellar season on defense in 2018. The Hurricanes ranked No. 4 in the nation in total defense and ranked No. 1 in several categories, including tackles for loss, third down conversion percentage and passing yards allowed. Defensive tackle Gerald Willis earned All-American honors from several outlets while linebacker Shaq Quarterman was named to the All-ACC First Team - one of eight all-conference picks.

Continuing the impressive trends from Diaz's first year running the defense, the Hurricanes ranked among the nation's leaders in several defensive categories in 2017, including first nationally in team sacks, third nationally in tackles for loss and ninth nationally in opponent yards per play. Five Hurricanes on the defensive side of the ball earned 2017 All-ACC honors while another three picked up Honorable Mention recognition.

Thanks in large part to his dominating unit, Miami also ranked No. 5 nationally in turnover margin, No. 8 nationally in fumbles recovered and No. 15 nationally in passes intercepted.

Miami's defense enjoyed vast improvements under Diaz' watch and served as one of the top units both in the ACC and nationally in his first season in 2016.

At the conclusion of the 2016 season, Miami was ranked No. 20 nationally in total defense (up from No. 69 the previous season), No. 9 in yards per play (No. 86 in 2015), No. 12 in scoring defense (No. 77 in 2015), No. 5 in tackles for loss (No. 105 in 2015), No. 22 in team sacks (No. 70 in 2015) and tied for No. 8 in defensive touchdowns allowed (No. 61 in 2015).

Miami was the only team in the country to start three true freshmen linebackers, and the Hurricanes' trio of Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney and Shaquille Quarterman helped anchor the unit. Three defensive players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors - senior defensive backs Corn Elder (second team) and Rayshawn Jenkins (honorable mention) and Quarterman at linebacker (honorable mention).

In 2015, Diaz's defensive unit helped Mississippi State to a 9-4 record and a victory over NC State in the Belk Bowl. His defensive unit held opponents to just 23.2 points per game and ranked in the nation's top 10 in red zone defense and tackles for loss.

Diaz spent one season, 2014, at Louisiana Tech and his impact was felt in a big way. The Bulldogs led the nation in turnovers gained (42) with 16 fumble recoveries and 26 interceptions. Before his stop at Louisiana Tech, Diaz coached three seasons at Texas (2011-13). His 2011 defensive unit ranked ninth in total yards per play.

In 2010, during his first stint at Mississippi State, Diaz guided a defense that ranked No. 22 in the nation in scoring defense (19.9 ppg), No. 17 in rushing defense (214.9 ypg) and No. 17 in tackles for loss (7.0 pg).

Before his first stop at Mississippi State, Diaz spent four seasons as defensive coordinator at Middle Tennessee State. Diaz coached linebackers for two years after mentoring the safeties during his first two years. Before joining Middle Tennessee, Diaz played a significant role for one of the country's top-ranked defenses by coaching safeties in 2004-05 and handling the linebackers in 2002-03 for NC State.

Diaz spent the 2000 and 2001 seasons at NCSU as a graduate assistant working primarily with the linebackers. During that time, the Wolfpack went to two bowl games and became the first ACC team to beat Florida State in Tallahassee. Diaz began his coaching career at Florida State in 1998. In his two years as a graduate assistant, he was on the same coaching staff as former Miami head coach Mark Richt and was part of the Seminoles' national title-winning coaching staff in 1999.

Diaz and his wife Stephanie have three sons: Colin, Gavin and Manny.
