THE GAME

- Fresh off a 63-0 win over FCS foe Bethune-Cookman in their home opener, the Miami Hurricanes continue a five-game homestand on Sat., Sept. 21 against Central Michigan at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami Gardens, Fla. Kickoff for the game is set for 4 p.m. and will be broadcast on ACC Network.
- The game will be Miami's third straight broadcast on the new **ACC Network** with Chris Cotter (play by play), Mark Herzlich (color) and Kelsey Riggs (sideline) on the call. Joe Zagacki (pxp) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the **560 WQAM** radio booth for their 18th season together, while Josh Darrow will handle the sideline duty. Alfredo Alvarez (pxp) and Joe Martinez (color) will also carry the game live on **WMYM 990 AM**.
- The Hurricanes' game against the Chippewas is the second of a season-long five-game homestand; Miami's next road game is Oct. 26 at Pittsburgh.

THE SERIES

- Saturday's game against Central Michigan at Hard Rock Stadium marks the first head-to-head contest in the history of the two programs.

THE HURRICANES

- Miami returns 12 starters and 39 letterwinners from a 2018 team that finished with a trip to the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in New York, N.Y. **Mark Richt** announced his retirement at season's end, and **Manny Diaz** was named the 25th head coach in University of Miami program history on Jan. 2.
- The Hurricanes won their most recent game vs. Bethune-Cookman on Sept. 14, 63-0, in Miami's 2019 home opener at Hard Rock Stadium. The win was UM's first under Diaz and improved the Hurricanes to 12-0 at home openers at Hard Rock Stadium. UM has not lost a home opener since 2006.
- On Aug. 12, Diaz named redshirt freshman **Jarren Williams** Miami's starting quarterback for the season. Williams, who beat out redshirt sophomores **Tate Martell** and **N'Kosi Perry** in a three-man battle during training camp, made his third career start on Sept. 14 against the Wildcats. Williams is completing 73.1 percent of his passes (68-for-93) with 777 passing yards, six touchdowns and zero interceptions through three starts.
- In his first year as Miami's starting running back, **DeeJay Dallas** is averaging 103.0 yards per game and is averaging 8.4 yards per rush (309 yards).
- The Hurricanes have won 18 straight nonconference home games, a streak that dates back to Oct. 1, 2011; its last such loss came on Sept. 24, 2011.
- Miami had eight players earn major preseason accolades, including multiple players named to more than one major award watch list. Among them were LB **Shaq Quarterman** (Butkus Award, Bednarik Award), DL **Jonathan Garvin** (Bednarik, Walter Camp POY) and WR **K.J. Osborn** (Biletnikoff).
- Diaz, who spent the previous three seasons as defensive coordinator for the Hurricanes (2016-18), retooled Miami's offensive staff upon his hire, bringing **Dan Enos** from Alabama as offensive coordinator and hiring four other new coaches for offense. He hired longtime colleague **Blake Baker**, who spent the last four seasons at Louisiana Tech, as defensive coordinator and added **Todd Stroud** as assistant head coach / defensive line coach.

THE OPPONENT

- Central Michigan is under the direction of first-year head coach Jim McElwain, who was named the head coach of the Chippewas in December 2018.
- Last time out, the Chippewas won their MAC opener over Akron, 45-24. QB Quinten Dormady is completing 65.3 percent of his passes (32-for-49), while RB Kobe Lewis has totaled 203 rushing yards and three TDs. LB Troy Brown leads the CMU defense with 24 tackles and 5.5 tackles for loss.

QUICK HITS

UM CONTINUES HOMESTAND VS. CHIPS

- Miami plays its second home game under head coach **Manny Diaz** in a Sept. 21 matchup vs. Central Michigan at Hard Rock Stadium. Kickoff is set for 4 p.m.
- The Hurricanes have won 18 straight nonconference home games, a stretch that began on Oct. 1, 2011 with a 45-14 win over Bethune-Cookman.
- The Hurricanes finished 5-1 at home in 2018 and are 17-3 in 20 regular season home games since Diaz joined the UM staff as defensive coordinator in January 2016.
- Miami is in the midst of a five-game homestand; its longest single-season homestand for the Hurricanes since a stretch of five straight games at home in 1987 (November 6 - Dec. 5).

WILLIAMS FLASHING AS STARTING QB

- Redshirt freshman **Jarren Williams** has been impressive through the first three starts of his UM career. The quarterback is completing 73.1 percent of passes (68-for-93) with six TDs and zero interceptions.
- Williams made the first start of his career on Sat., Aug. 24 vs. Florida. He finished 19-for-30 for 214 yards and 1 TD.
- He followed that up with an even better performance at North Carolina on Sept. 7, throwing for 309 yards on 30-for-39 passing with two TDs and no picks.
- Williams beat out QBs **Tate Martell** and **N'Kosi Perry** in a three-man battle and was named starting QB on Mon., Aug. 12.
- Williams was ranked among the top-10 dual-threat passers in his class by every scouting site and No. 106 overall by ESPN.

CHAIN RETURNS, TD RINGS DEBUT IN 2019

- One of the most recognizable sights in all of college football over the last two seasons, the latest version of the turnover chain was on full display in Miami's opener vs. Florida.
- The new chain, sporting a 10-inch '305' charm that contains more than 2,000 white sapphire stones, was worn four times vs. the Gators, including the first-ever appearance when DL **Scott Patchan** recovered a fumble.
- The season opener vs. the Gators also served as the debut for Miami's offensive reward: the touchdown rings, which combine to spell out "Hurricanes".
- Miami did not record any turnovers vs. UNC on Sept. 7, snapping a streak of 13 straight games with at least one turnover - then one of the top-10 longest FBS streaks. UM had one turnover vs. B-CU on Sept. 14.

MIAMI CONTINUES HOMESTAND WITH FIRST GAME VERSUS CHIPPEWAS

- After two games away from home to start the season - one at a neutral site, and one on the road - the Miami Hurricanes continue their longest single-season homestand since 1987 with a matchup versus Central Michigan on Sept. 21. Kickoff for the game is set for 4 p.m. from Hard Rock Stadium.
- The game between the Hurricanes and the Chippewas is the first in the history of the two schools.
- Miami is coming off a 63-0 win over FCS foe Bethune-Cookman in its home opener on Sept. 14. In its last game, Central Michigan knocked off Akron, 45-24, in its MAC opener in Mount Pleasant, Mich.
- After its current five-game home stretch, the Hurricanes' next road game comes Oct. 26 at Pitt.
- The last time the Hurricanes had five home games in a row during a single regular season was 1987 - a year Miami won the national championship. The Hurricanes played the final five games of their 1987 season at home beginning on Nov. 7 vs. Miami (Ohio) and finishing Dec. 5 vs. South Carolina
- Saturday's game will represent the Hurricanes' third straight broadcast on the newly minted ACC Network; UM dropped its first game on the channel, 28-25, on the road at North Carolina (Sept. 7).
- The game will also be carried by 560 WQAM, WMYM 990 AM and student radio WVUM 90.5 FM.

WILLIAMS SHINING THROUGH FIRST THREE STARTS OF CAREER AT QB

- QB **Jarren Williams** was announced as Miami's starting quarterback by head coach **Manny Diaz** on Monday, Aug. 12 after winning a quarterback battle that started in spring ball and lasted into camp.
- Williams impressed in two outings in difficult environments to start the year vs. Florida and at UNC; he ranks fifth in the ACC at 259.0 yards per game with six touchdowns and zero interceptions.
- Williams ranks No. 12 in completion percentage in all of FBS and ranks first in the ACC. at .731
- In his first start as quarterback vs. Florida on Aug. 24, Williams finished 19-for-30 for 214 yards and the first passing TD of his career. He became UM's seventh freshman QB to start a game since 2008.
- He was even better at North Carolina on Sept. 7, throwing for a career-best 309 yards on 30-for-39 passing with two touchdowns. The 30 completions were the most by a Miami QB since **Brad Kaaya** vs. Pitt in 2016, while the 300-yard passing game was UM's first since **Malik Rosier** at UNC in 2017.
- Williams beat out QBs **Tate Martell** and **N'Kosi Perry** for the starting spot. Williams will make the fourth start of his career on Sept. 21 vs. Central Michigan; he was the first freshman to start a season opener since **Brad Kaaya** started as a true freshman against Louisville on Labor Day weekend 2014.
- Williams saw action in one game as a substitute during his true freshman year; he finished 1-for-3 with one 17-yard pass and a one-yard rushing touchdown against Savannah State on Sept. 8, 2018.
- A consensus four-star prospect, Williams was ranked as the No. 6 dual threat quarterback by ESPN.
- Williams chose Miami over Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia and Ohio State, among other schools.

TURNOVER CHAIN 3.0 UNVEILED; CHAIN'S IMPACT MEASURABLE ON 'D'

- When DL **Scott Patchan** pounced on a Gators fumble in the first quarter of Miami's game on Aug. 24, fans inside the stadium and across the country awaited the unveil of the newest Turnover Chain.
- The chain, which previously featured a charm in the shape of the iconic 'U' (2017) and Sebastian the Ibis (2018), features a 10-inch charm with the famous '305' Miami area code with more than 2,000 white sapphires; the charm weighs 500 grams. The chain took roughly three months to complete.
- Since the unveiling of the Turnover Chain in 2017, no Power-5 school has more turnovers than Miami; the Hurricanes have compiled 61 turnovers in 29 games since, an average of 2.9 turnovers per game. rounding out the top-five are Washington St., (60), Boston College (59), Iowa (59) & Wisconsin (58).
- In addition to Patchan, LB **Shaq Quarterman** (fumble recovery), S **Amari Carter** (interception) and striker **Romeo Finley** (interception) each wore the turnover chain in Miami's opener vs. the Gators.
- UM did not have a turnover on defense vs. North Carolina on Sept. 7, snapping a streak of 13 straight games with at least one; S **Rob Knowles** recovered a fumble on Sept. 14 to wear his first chain.



DALLAS OFF TO BLAZING START IN FIRST YEAR AS STARTING BACK

- After playing behind current Seattle Seahawks RB **Travis Homer** the last two years, RB **DeeJay Dallas** was listed as the Hurricanes' starting running back after an impressive offseason and fall camp.
- Through the first three games, Dallas ranks fifth in the ACC with an average of 103.0 yards per game and ranks third in all of FBS among backs with 35-plus carries with an 8.5 yards-per-rush average.
- In his first career start vs. Florida on Aug. 24, Dallas had a game-high 131 all-purpose yards, including a game-high 94 rushing yards. He had a career-high four catches and scored on a 50-yard TD run.
- Dallas delivered the fourth 100-yard rushing performance of his career at North Carolina (Sept. 7), totaling 107 yards on 14 carries. He rushed for a career-high three touchdowns last time out vs. Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 14), the first such performance for a UM player since QB **Malik Rosier** did it at Toledo in 2018. Dallas rushed for a season-high 108 yards out against the Wildcats in a 63-0 victory.
- Dallas is one of just five running backs in the ACC averaging more than 100 yards per game (103.0).
- Though he was not a starter last season, Dallas was all over the field for the Hurricanes. The Georgia native had the longest rush of any player (83 yards), the longest kick return of any player (53) and the longest punt return (65). He ranked first on the Hurricanes in all-purpose yards (1,260).
- Dallas ended the year second in rushing yards (617) and tied for the team lead with six rushing TDs.
- In 28 career games, Dallas has found the end zone 11 times (10 rushing TDs) despite starting two games.
- Dallas became a father this offseason; though his own name is Demetrius, he named his son DeeJay.

HOME SWEET HOME OPENERS - MIAMI WINS BIG VERSUS WILDCATS

- The Miami Hurricanes opened their 12th season at world-class Hard Rock Stadium on Sept. 14 with a 63-0 win vs. Bethune-Cookman; UM holds a 12-0 all-time mark in home openers at the stadium, having outscored opponents 563-69 for an average margin of victory of 41.2 points in those games.
- The Hurricanes have not lost a home opener since 2006, when they fell to Florida State 13-10 at the Orange Bowl on Sept. 4, 2006. Miami has won 13 straight home openers since - each one since 2007.
- In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), UM has opened the season at home 17 times and is 15-2 in those games. Miami is 29-11 in regular season openers dating to 1979.

MIAMI'S RUSHING DEFENSE, THIRD DOWN DEFENSE IMPRESSING IN 2019

- One of Miami's top-performing units this season has been its rushing defense, which has allowed an average of 69.3 yards this season - the eighth-lowest mark in FBS and lowest mark in the entire ACC.
- Miami's third-down defense is ranked similarly highly; the Hurricanes are allowing teams to convert only 20.0 percent of third-down chances, the fifth-best mark in FBS and the top mark in the conference.
- The Hurricanes have not allowed any of its three opponents - including top-25 ranked Florida and North Carolina - to rush for 100 yards in any game this season. The Gators rushed for just 50 yards in the season opener on Aug. 24, while the Tar Heels rushed for 97 yards on Sept. 7. Last time out on Sept. 14, Miami held the Bethune-Cookman Wildcats to just 61 rushing yards and a long rush of 11 yards.
- Only three other schools in the ACC are holding opponents to under 100 rushing yards per game.

HURRICANES PROTECTING THE BALL, RANK 15TH IN TURNOVER MARGIN

- While Miami has earned national acclaim for its penchant for takeaways, its offense is impressing in 2019 with its ability to maintain possession of the football. The Hurricanes offense have totaled one lost fumble and zero interceptions, good for the 15th-best turnover margin in all of FBS (+1.33 per game).
- The Hurricanes ability to maintain possession of the ball have helped the team rank seventh in FBS and second in the ACC in time of possession (35:44) - a category where Miami struggled in 2018 (86th).

UM ONE OF THREE WITH OFFENSE & DEFENSE RANKED IN ACC'S TOP FIVE

- Miami ranks No. 4 in total defense (276.7 yards per game) and No. 5 in total offense (459.7). The only two other teams ranked in the top-five of both categories are defending national champion Clemson (first in offense, first in defense) and North Carolina State (third in offense, third in defense).

TOUCHDOWN RINGS UNVEILED IN OPENER, JORDAN FIRST TO WEAR

- After QB **Jarren Williams** hit TE **Brevin Jordan** for a touchdown pass in the second quarter, the newest reward was showcased: the Touchdown Rings. Made mostly of orange and green sapphires, the Touchdown Rings weigh 100 grams and contain close to 500 stones between the pair. The rings were designed by Miami's own "A.J. the Jeweler" - the same man responsible for all three Turnover Chains.
- RB **DeeJay Dallas** also wore them in the opener, while WR **K.J. Osborn** and TE **Will Mallory** wore them after receiving TDs at North Carolina. RB **Cam/Ron Harris** rocked the rings after his rushing TD vs. UNC.
- TE **Larry Hodges** wore the touchdown rings twice last time out, while RB **Jimmy Murphy** did so once.

MURPHY LIVING THE HURRICANE DREAM, SCORES FIRST TD VS. BETHUNE

- Redshirt senior RB **Jimmy Murphy** was rewarded for his hard work last time out, scoring a touchdown and celebrating with an enthusiastic front flip on the first score of his University of Miami career.
- Murphy, a fan favorite, has been among Miami's top special teams performers for the last two years and was voted a team captain in 2018. He plans to attend medical school once his Miami career is finished.

OSBORN FIRST AMONG PASS-CATCHERS, HAS BEEN VETERAN LEADER

- One of Miami's most important additions of the offseason was transfer **K.J. Osborn**, who transferred to Miami for his final year of eligibility after an impressive four-year career at Buffalo with the Bulls.
- The 6-foot Osborn has started all three games at wide receiver this season. Last time out, Osborn caught four passes for 58 yards and his second touchdown as a Hurricane. This season, Osborn leads Miami in receptions (15), receiving yards (175) and receiving touchdowns (two). His long catch is 29.
- Making his second start on offense, Osborn tied for the team lead with seven receptions at North Carolina (Sept. 7), including a six-yard TD reception - his first as a Hurricane player. He had 12 at Buffalo.
- Osborn was selected as one of two players to represent Miami at ACC Kickoff, the conference's annual media day, despite not having played a down at that point. Osborn has been cited by coaches and teammates as a key locker room influence. He was selected one of four captains for the Florida game.
- In his first ever game at The U, Osborn started and caught four passes for 41 yards - both second-most on Miami. He had a long catch of 18 yards and tied for third-most catches of any player in the game.
- In three seasons of playing time at Buffalo, Osborn totaled 1,490 yards and 12 touchdown receptions.

JORDAN STARTING HOT IN YEAR 2, SETTING STANDARD AT TIGHT END U

- Playing his first season of college football in 2018, TE **Brevin Jordan** emerged as a go-to target in the Miami offense; Jordan was second on Miami in receptions (32) and was second in touchdowns (four).
- Jordan was named to the All-ACC Second Team after a standout first year, starting 12 of 13 games.
- Jordan enjoyed a strong opener vs. Florida on Aug. 24, starting the game and finishing with a team-high five-catches for a career-best 88 yards and one TD, on a 25-yard pass from QB **Jarren Williams**.
- The 6-foot-3 sophomore enjoyed another strong game at North Carolina on Sept. 7, hauling in six passes for 73 yards. Through two games, Jordan is second on UM with 173 receiving yards (57.6/game).
- A Las Vegas native and high school teammate of QB **Tate Martell** and S **Bubba Bolden**, Jordan was named to the Mackey Award preseason watch list (nation's top tight end) and was preseason All-ACC.
- Jordan was named a Midseason Freshman All-America by ESPN. The talented sophomore was rated the No. 1 tight end in the country by ESPN.com and 247Sports.com and was the No. 2-rated TE by Rivals.
- Jordan and fellow sophomore **Will Mallory** are playing major roles in their first years under offensive coordinator **Dan Enos**. Jordan missed most of spring to an injury, allowing Mallory to earn major reps.

STARTING OFFENSIVE LINE INCLUDED TWO TRUE FROSH ONCE AGAIN

- UM's starting offensive line vs. Florida (Aug. 24) included two freshman - true freshman LT **Zion Nelson** and redshirt freshman RT **John Campbell, Jr.** - and got even younger for the next two games.
- Joining Nelson on the offensive line and making his University of Miami debut was true freshman **Jakai Clark**, who started at right guard vs. both North Carolina (Sept. 7) and Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 14).
- According to research from *The Athletic*, the Hurricanes were one of only three programs in the country to start a true freshman at left tackle in their opener. Tennessee and UCLA also started a true frosh LT.
- According to the same research, Miami was also one of just three programs in the country to start freshmen at both tackle spots in the opener; Duke and Michigan started two redshirt freshmen tackles.

ROUSSEAU SHINING AFTER MISSING MOST OF FIRST SEASON TO INJURY

- After missing all but one full game during his true freshman season of 2018 thanks to a right ankle fracture, DL **Gregory Rousseau** has shined in his first major action through the first part of 2019.
- Rousseau leads UM with 3.5 tackles for loss and is the only Cane who had a sack in the first two games.
- Through three games, Rousseau is one of only 12 players in the ACC with more than 3.0 tackles for loss.
- Rousseau was ranked as a four-star prospect by Rivals coming out of high school; as a senior at Champagnat Catholic, he had 80 tackles and 10 sacks, with three sacks in the state title game.



HODGES FOLLOWS MALLORY'S LEAD, FIRST CATCH OF SEASON IS A TD

- For the second straight season, TE **Will Mallory** made the most of his first grab of the year, scoring a touchdown on the play. Mallory's 11-yard TD put the Hurricanes ahead late at North Carolina (Sept. 7).
- Mallory recorded his first career TD on his very first catch, a 2-yarder vs. Savannah State (Sept. 8, 2018.)
- Freshman TE **Larry Hodges** doubled Mallory's feat, scoring touchdowns on both of the very first two grabs of his career vs. Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 14). Hodges made his debut at UNC on Sept. 7.

FIVE MORE HURRICANES DEBUT IN GAME VERSUS BETHUNE-COOKMAN

- Nine Hurricanes made their debuts in Miami's season opener vs. the Gators, including two players who started: LT **Zion Nelson** and WR **K.J. Osborn**. Nelson was one of just four freshmen to debut vs. Florida.
- Joining Nelson as true freshmen were DL **Jahfari Harvey**, DB **Te' Cory Couch** & DB **Christian Williams**.
- Osborn was among five players who transferred to Miami this offseason and made their debuts; the other who debuted were P **Louis Hedley**, DL **Trevon Hill**, QB **Tate Martell** and DL **Chigozie Nnoruka**.
- Three Hurricanes debuted at UNC (Sept. 7): STRK **Ryan Ragone**, OL **Jakai Clark** and TE **Larry Hodges**.
- The five freshmen to debut vs. Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 14) last time out were LB **Sam Brooks, Jr.**, DL **Jason Blissett, Jr.**, DL **Jared Harrison-Hunte**, DL **Jalar Holley** and S **Keontra Smith**.

QUARTERMAN AN IRON MAN AT THE U, HEADS SENIOR LINEBACKER TRIO

- Miami's three-headed monster - senior trio **Zach McCloud**, **Michael Pinckney** & **Shaq Quarterman** - has started nearly every game together since arriving to University of Miami as early enrollees in 2016.
- McCloud has started 31 of 42 games in his career. He has totaled 133 tackles and 12.5 tackles for loss.
- One of Miami's most instinctive players, Pinckney started all 12 of the games he played in last season and finished with 74 total tackles and 11.0 tackles for loss. He was named All-ACC Honorable Mention.
- Quarterman, who has started all 42 games for the Hurricanes in three-plus seasons at The U, ranked second on UM with 82 total tackles. An All-ACC first-team pick in 2018, he has over 250 career tackles. Quarterman's 42-game start streak is the second-longest in FBS, trailing Ethan Reed of Louisiana Tech, who has started 43 straight. He is one of 13 FBS players to have started 40 or more straight games.
- All three linebackers elected to return for their senior seasons after Manny Diaz, their coordinator for all three seasons, was named head coach. The trio cited the importance of their collective legacy at Miami and a disappointing 2018 as key reasons for the return. Both Pinckney and Quarterman are on track to earn their undergraduate degrees; McCloud has begun work towards a master's degree.

HURRICANE FOOTBALL'S 94th SEASON OPENED WITH TRIP TO O-TOWN

- The Hurricanes kicked off their 94th season of football in 2019, road tripping to Orlando - their first trip there since the 2016 Russell Athletic Bowl. It was the earliest season opener in Miami history.
- Miami's first season of football came in 1926 and its 100th year of football is currently set for 2025.
- In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), Miami has compiled a 30-11 record in season openers - UM's streak of three straight wins in openers came to an end in 2018 against LSU.

FIVE MORE PROCANES SELECTED, #NFLU TRADITION ROLLS ON

- Five Hurricanes were selected in the 2019 NFL Draft: **Sheldrick Redwine** (fourth round, Cleveland), **Michael Jackson, Sr.**, (fifth round, Dallas), **Joe Jackson** (fifth round, Dallas), **Jaquan Johnson** (sixth round, Buffalo) and **Travis Homer** (sixth round, Seattle). Multiple others signed free agent deals.
- For 45 consecutive years, the Hurricanes have had at least one player selected in the NFL Draft.
- Miami leads all programs in the ACC in draft picks since 2000; 115 Hurricanes have been selected.

DEFENSE WAS NATION'S BEST ON THIRD DOWN A SEASON AGO

- Miami ranked No. 4 in total defense in FBS last season, but no other defense performed better on third down. Miami's unit allowed opponents to convert on just 25.3% of their chances (47 / 186).
- Prior to 2018, then-defensive coordinator **Manny Diaz** said an offseason emphasis for his defense was performing better in the category. In 2017, Miami ranked No. 75 in third down defense (39.5%).

DIAZ RETOOLS COACHING STAFF, HIRES DAN ENOS TO RUN OFFENSE

- In one of his first moves as head coach, **Manny Diaz** overhauled the Hurricanes' entire offensive staff. Diaz hired **Dan Enos** away from Alabama to serve as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.
- Diaz added two former colleagues of Enos during his time as head coach of Central Michigan (2010-14): offensive line coach **Butch Barry**, most recently with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, and wide receivers coach **Taylor Stubblefield**, most recently with Air Force. Both worked for Enos at CMU.
- Stephen Field**, who worked at Oregon last year, was hired to coach tight ends and **Eric Hickson**, who worked at Kansas State, was brought in to coach running backs. Both are south Florida natives.
- One of Diaz's most important additions was director of strength & conditioning **David Feeley**, who was hired from Temple. Feeley has been credited by players and staff for UM's successful offseason.

SEVERAL HURRICANES EARN MAJOR PRESEASON RECOGNITION

- Several Hurricanes on both sides of the ball were selected as players to watch for major awards entering 2019, including some who earned preseason All-America and all-conference recognition.

MASTERING "THE PORTAL" IN THE OFFSEASON WILL PAY DIVIDENDS

- Miami head coach Manny Diaz was able to successfully address areas of concern for the Hurricanes through the NCAA transfer portal this past offseason, adding several key players entering 2019.
- The Hurricanes added WR **K.J. Osborn**, who impressed in spring practices and during summer workouts. Osborn, who totaled over 1,400 yards in his career at Buffalo, represented Miami at ACC Kickoff - the conference's annual media day in Charlotte, N.C. He had 12 career TDs with the Bulls.
- Like Osborn, QB **Tate Martell** joined the Hurricanes in January and is listed as a co-backup at QB.
- Another key addition for Miami was DL **Trevon Hill**, who totaled 94 tackles, 20 tackles for loss and 11.5 sacks in two-plus seasons of playing time at Virginia Tech. Hill will play a major role on the d-line.
- Joining Hill on the line will be tackle **Chigozie Nnoruka**, who spent three seasons at UCLA.
- Former Southern Cal safety **Bubba Bolden** was added to the roster in the middle of fall camp, while former five-star recruit **Jaelan Phillips** - who played two years at UCLA - will sit out the 2019 season.

BLAKE BAKER, A FAMILIAR FACE, WILL LEAD HURRICANES DEFENSE

- Miami head coach **Manny Diaz** announced the hiring of longtime colleague **Blake Baker**, who spent the past four seasons as defensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech, to run the Miami unit in January 2019.
- Baker worked under Diaz at Louisiana Tech, serving as safeties coach when Diaz was the Bulldogs' defensive coordinator. He was also a two-year grad assistant under Diaz during his career at Texas.
- Baker's unit ranked No. 4 nationally in team sacks and No. 12 nationally in tackles for loss last season.
- In Baker's first game as coordinator, Miami's defense held Florida to just 50 rushing yards on Aug. 24. The Hurricanes forced four turnovers on two interceptions and two fumble recoveries vs. the Gators.

THOMAS BRINGS EXPLOSIVENESS, DEEP THREAT ABILITY INTO YEAR 3

- WR **Jeff Thomas** was among Miami's top offensive performers in his first two seasons at The U, racking up 2,132 all-purpose yards in just 24 games - an average of 88.83 yards per contest.
- Though he did not qualify due to having just nine returns last year, Thomas' average of 24.6 yards per punt return would have ranked No. 1 in all of FBS. He totaled 221 yards and had one touchdown.
- Thomas had the longest reception of any Hurricane last year - a 67-yard touchdown vs. Savannah State - and was involved in four plays of 50 yards or more, the most of any Hurricane in 2018.
- As a true freshman in 2017, Thomas had the two longest receptions of any Hurricane (78-yard TD, 70-yard catch). He has six career plays of 50-or-more yards (four catch, one punt return, one kick return).
- Thomas has three career 100-yard receiving games; his yardage high is 132 vs. LSU on Sept. 2, 2018.
- A four-star recruit out of high school, Thomas has led the Hurricanes in 'long plays' (20 yards or more) in both of his two seasons at The U. He had 22 such plays as a true freshman in 2017 and 22 last year.

KEEPING IT IN THE "U FAMILY"

- As is often the case at the University of Miami, a number of Canes have family ties to 'The U'
- Four Hurricanes had fathers who suited up in orange and green: TE **Michael Irvin II** (father is Michael II), DL **Scott Patchan** (Matt), DL **Pat Bethel** (Randy), and DB **Al Blades, Jr.** (Al, Sr.)

JON "NEO" GARVIN BUILDING ON BREAKOUT SOPHOMORE SEASON

- Miami led all of FBS in tackles for loss last season, and one of the most important factors in the equation was defensive end **Jonathan Garvin**, who wreaked havoc in his first season as a starter.
- Garvin ranked fourth in the ACC and second on the Hurricanes with 17 tackles for loss last season.
- Garvin goes by the nickname "Neo" - his middle name and the name of his grandfather - and is one of only five returning Power-5 players to have totaled at least 17 tackles for loss in the 2018 season.
- The Lake Worth, Fla., native was ranked a four-star defensive end by both ESPN and 247Sports.

NEW FACES ABOUND IN TALENTED BUT YOUNG SECONDARY GROUP

- 75% of Miami's starting secondary of the past two seasons was selected in the 2019 NFL Draft, leaving three open jobs entering 2019, including both starting safety roles and one cornerback spot.
- Preseason Thorpe Award watch list pick **Trajan Bandy** is the only returning starter in the group. Joining Bandy in the starting lineup for Miami's season opener vs. Florida were safeties **Amari Carter** and **Gurvan Hall, Jr.**, and cornerback **Al Blades, Jr.** Both Hall and Blades were making their first starts.
- Hall had a career-high eight tackles in the opener while Carter had the first interception of his career.
- Last season, the Hurricanes surrendered the fewest passing yards per game of any team in FBS (135.6).
- Head coach Manny Diaz listed sophomores **Al Blades, Jr.**, and **DJ Ivey** as co-starters at the cornerback position opposite Bandy. Ivey missed the opener due to a violation of team rules while Blades started.
- Two players who saw action in the opener were freshman DBs **Te'Cory Couch** and **Christian Williams**.

HURRICANES A REGULAR PARTICIPANT ON ESPN'S COLLEGE GAMEDAY

- Early in August, ESPN announced it would host its famous College GameDay show at Disney's Magic Kingdom the morning of Miami's game against Florida at Camping World Stadium in Orlando.
- The game vs. Florida marked the 21st time a game involving the Hurricanes has been selected for College GameDay; prior, its most recent was the 2017 ACC Championship Game in Charlotte, N.C.
- The Hurricanes and Gators have matched up for a College GameDay site clash just two other times, with the two teams splitting the other results 1-1. Prior to 2019, its most recent College GameDay matchup vs. UF was 9/6/2008 - a 3-26 loss in Gainesville. The other - on 9/7/2002 - was a 41-16 win at Florida.

CAROL SOFFER INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY OPEN FOR BUSINESS

- On August 17, 2018, history was made at the University of Miami, as the Miami Hurricanes practiced inside the Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility for the very first time during fall camp.
- In September 2016, Miami announced the largest donation in the history of the athletics department as the lead gift for a state-of-the-art football indoor practice facility. In honor of their mother Carol, Jeffrey Soffer and Carol's other children made a \$14 million commitment to Miami.
- Former coach Mark Richt pledged \$1 million towards the facility and football alumnus and linebacker great Jon Beason was among those alumni to donate. Beason's gift was \$250,000, as Miami alumni and former players teamed up to contribute more than \$2 million for the project.
- The 81,800-square-foot facility features two field-turf fields - one 90 yards long and an additional 40-yard field directly connecting to the Squillante Strength and Conditioning Center. The facility features interconnectivity to the Hecht Athletic Center and Schwartz Center for Athletic Excellence.

ZAGACKI AND BAILEY RETURN TO THE BOOTH FOR YEAR 18

- "Voice of the Hurricanes" Joe Zagacki and color commentator Don Bailey, Jr. are in the booth for their 18th year on the radio - the duo has broadcast 253 straight games together.

TURNOVER CHAIN HAS BECOME ICONIC IN COLLEGE FOOTBALL

- When DB **Trajan Bandy** pounced on a loose ball of Miami's home opener vs. Savannah State in 2018, the crowd turned to observe a familiar sight from 2017: the now-famous "Turnover Chain."
- But instead of that 2017 chain, which was modeled in the shape of the iconic "U" logo, Bandy was presented a brand new turnover chain to wear featuring a charm in the model of Sebastian the Ibis.
- Turnover Chain 2.0 was comprised of more than 4,000 stones (compared to 900 in 2017), weighed roughly three kilograms (compared to two in 2017) and had an 8.5-inch charm (compared to 5.5).
- The Hurricanes defense totaled only 19 turnovers gained in 13 games in 2016 - the season before the turnover chain's inception. Since, UM has compiled 60 in just 27 games, averaging 2.22 per game.
- No Hurricane wore the 2018 chain more often than Bandy, who wore it five times in a breakout year.
- adidas and other apparel providers launched a special line of turnover chain-branded t-shirts, and the first two chains remain in a display case in the Schwartz Center lobby on the athletics campus.
- Rapper 'Solo D' performed his song 'Turnover Chain' in front of the Hurricanes at the team's annual awards banquet, and the chain was the focal point of Miami's ACC Network-branded commercial.

MIAMI IN YEAR 5 OF 12-YEAR DEAL WITH ADIDAS

- In January of 2015, adidas & the University of Miami announced a landmark 12-year partnership making adidas the official footwear, apparel and accessory brand of UM through June 2027.
- The partnership, which then made Miami one of adidas' 13 licensed NCAA programs at the time, began on Sept. 1, 2015 and includes investment, product and uniform development for all 18 UM programs.

HEAD COACH | FIRST SEASON AT MIAMI (FIRST OVERALL) | 1-2 (.333)

Manny Diaz, who has deep roots in the Miami community and catapulted the Hurricane's defense to elite status during his three years as the team's defensive coordinator from 2016-2018, was announced as the 25th head coach of the University of Miami football program on Sun., Dec. 30.

"Manny is one of the nation's elite coaches and the Canes Family has already embraced him and his incredible work ethic over the past three years," said UM Director of Athletics Blake James upon his hiring. "He is absolutely the passionate and innovative leader that our program needs, and we will work together to build an incredible staff to move our program back into championship contention."

Diaz, who has an impressive resume during nearly two decades as a defensive specialist coaching several collegiate programs, accepted his dream job of leading a Hurricanes team he believes is destined to return to the top echelon of collegiate football in the years to come.

"Miami is home. The University of Miami is home. The U has truly been 'the job' for me since I first got into coaching," said Diaz. "Having worked here over the past three years, I came to understand what it means to be part of 'The U' and came to appreciate the passion and commitment to excellence of all who proudly call themselves Canes. We will restore the football program to its place among the nation's elite and we will do it with hard work, dedicated coaches, and outstanding student-athletes. I'm excited about working with Blake and his team to make that happen."

During his 19-year coaching career, Diaz, the son of a former Miami mayor, also named Manny Diaz, has coached in 18 bowl games, amassing a 13-5 record in bowls, and has coached numerous all-conference and NFL players at six collegiate institutions.

Miami delivered another stellar season on defense in 2018. The Hurricanes ranked No. 4 in the nation in total defense and ranked No. 1 in several categories, including tackles for loss, third down conversion percentage and passing yards allowed. Defensive tackle Gerald Willis earned All-American honors from several outlets while linebacker Shaq Quarterman was named to the All-ACC First Team - one of eight all-conference picks.

Continuing the impressive trends from Diaz's first year running the defense, the Hurricanes ranked among the nation's leaders in several defensive categories in 2017, including first nationally in team sacks, third nationally in tackles for loss and ninth nationally in opponent yards per play. Five Hurricanes on the defensive side of the ball earned 2017 All-ACC honors while another three picked up Honorable Mention recognition.

Thanks in large part to his dominating unit, Miami also ranked No. 5 nationally in turnover margin, No. 8 nationally in fumbles recovered and No. 15 nationally in passes intercepted.

Miami's defense enjoyed vast improvements under Diaz' watch and served as one of the top units both in the ACC and nationally in his first season in 2016.

At the conclusion of the 2016 season, Miami was ranked No. 20 nationally in total defense (up from No. 69 the previous season), No. 9 in yards per play (No. 86 in 2015), No. 12 in scoring defense (No. 77 in 2015), No. 5 in tackles for loss (No. 105 in 2015), No. 22 in team sacks (No. 70 in 2015) and tied for No. 8 in defensive touchdowns allowed (No. 61 in 2015).

Miami was the only team in the country to start three true freshmen linebackers, and the Hurricanes' trio of Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney and Shaquille Quarterman helped anchor the unit. Three defensive players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors - senior defensive backs Corn Elder (second team) and Rayshawn Jenkins (honorable mention) and Quarterman at linebacker (honorable mention).

In 2015, Diaz's defensive unit helped Mississippi State to a 9-4 record and a victory over NC State in the Belk Bowl. His defensive unit held opponents to just 23.2 points per game and ranked in the nation's top 10 in red zone defense and tackles for loss.

Diaz spent one season, 2014, at Louisiana Tech and his impact was felt in a big way. The Bulldogs led the nation in turnovers gained (42) with 16 fumble recoveries and 26 interceptions. Before his stop at Louisiana Tech, Diaz coached three seasons at Texas (2011-13). His 2011 defensive unit ranked ninth in total yards per play.

In 2010, during his first stint at Mississippi State, Diaz guided a defense that ranked No. 22 in the nation in scoring defense (19.9 ppg), No. 17 in rushing defense (214.9 ypg) and No. 17 in tackles for loss (7.0 pg). MSU also finished ranked No. 13 in red-zone defense (.730) and No. 22 in turnovers forced (28) nationally in 2010.

Before his first stop at Mississippi State, Diaz spent four seasons as defensive coordinator at Middle Tennessee State. Diaz coached linebackers for two years after mentoring the safeties during his first two years. Before joining Middle Tennessee, Diaz played a significant role for one of the country's top-ranked defenses by coaching safeties in 2004-05 and handling the linebackers in 2002-03 for NC State.

Diaz spent the 2000 and 2001 seasons at NCSU as a graduate assistant working primarily with the linebackers. During that time, the Wolfpack went to two bowl games and became the first ACC team to beat Florida State in Tallahassee. Diaz began his coaching career at Florida State in 1998. In his two years as a graduate assistant, he was on the same coaching staff as former Miami head coach Mark Richt and was part of the Seminoles' national title-winning coaching staff in 1999.

Diaz and his wife Stephanie have three sons: Colin, Gavin and Manny.
