After leading Miami to the 2013 NCAA Sweet 16 and winning the school's first ACC regular season and tournament championships, **Jim Larrañaga** was honored as the AP, Naismith, USBWA Henry Iba, Adolph Rupp Cup and ACC Coach of the Year. The Bronx, N.Y., native helped Miami to a No. 2 national ranking by both the AP and USA TODAY, and a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament. He is the 10th coach in the last 10 years to lead two top-10 programs.



THE GAME

Miami faces Boston College on Saturday, Feb. 22 at Noon in the BankUnited Center before hitting the road for three-straight games.

THE SERIES

Miami is 18-24 in the all-time series against Boston College, which dates back to the 1962-63 season. The Canes are 9-11 against the Eagles at home, 1-2 at neutral sites and 8-11 on the road. Miami has won seven-straight matchups against Boston College, including five-straight under Coach L.

LARRAÑAGA BY THE NUMBERS

1 - Coach Jim Larrañaga is one of four ACC coaches with a Final Four appearance to his credit.

4 - In 2006, Coach Jim Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the NCAA Final Four in 27 years.

7 - Larrañaga is no stranger to the ACC. In his seven seasons as an assistant coach at Virginia, the Cavaliers participated in the NCAA Final Four in 1981 and 1984, won three ACC Championships and finished in the Top 5 of the AP rankings.

14 - Larrañaga has made 14 postseason appearances in the past 23 years, including six NCAA tournaments.

30 - Larrañaga is in his 30th year as a head coach and has successfully transitioned three institutions into successful programs: Miami, Bowling Green and George Mason.

LARRAÑAGA - WHY MIAMI?

Along with returning to the best basketball conference in the country, Coach L had a few personal reasons for accepting the head coaching job at Miami. Coach's grandfather was from Cuba, where he produced the Larrañaga [lare-en-YAH-ga] cigar. Coach's father was raised in Key West before moving to The Bronx, N.Y., getting married and raising six children. Coach L was raised in The Bronx, but vacationed to Florida as a boy. He also has owned a house in Sarasota - which he bought from Dick Vitale's daughter - for eight years, and three of his siblings have retired to Florida.

- Six seniors in 2013-14, after having five seniors - who all earned their academic degree - last season.

• Miami is the only ACC team with zero returning starters. Additionally, Miami lost its six top players, who started 174 combined games. Rion Brown is the only Hurricane to start any games (6) last season, so the Canes return 6-of-180 starts, which is 3.3 percent.

- Miami returns 13.3 percent of points scored (9.3 ppg), 14.2 percent of rebounds (5.1 rpg) and 1.0 percent of assists (1.1 per game), all the lowest in the ACC.

• Coach Jim Larrañaga is one of five active ACC coaches with 400 or more wins.

• Miami's freshman class includes: Deandre Burnett - third in the nation in scoring as a senior with 37 ppg; Manu Lecomte - Belgium second division player; and Davon Reed - 2,000 point scorer who averaged 24 ppg as a senior.

• Two transfers joined the Canes this season in James Kelly, who averaged 17.9 ppg and 10.0 rpg in two JC seasons and Donnavan Kirk, who played 54 games for DePaul the past two seasons, leading the team in blocked shots.

• One year ago, Miami was selected fourth by the coaches and fifth by the media in preseason ACC polls, but finished the season as the regular season and tournament champion.

• Miami started the 2012-13 season unranked, but jumped to No. 2/2 in the nation by Feb. 18. The Canes ended the season No. 5/10.

• At that Operation Basketball, zero Hurricanes were selected for preseason All-ACC teams. At the end of the championship season, Jim Larrañaga was Coach of the Year, Shane Larkin was Player of the Year (coaches), and Durand Scott was Defensive Player of the Year while Larkin (1st & defensive), Kenny Kadji (2nd), and Scott (H.M. & defensive) were selected to ACSMA All-ACC teams. The coaches picked Scott for third team and Julian Gamble was listed on the Defensive Team with Scott and Larkin.

• Miami's top six players from the 2013 ACC Championship season combined for 5,399 career points, 2,744 rebounds, 966 assists, 480 steals, 369 blocked shots and 412 starts.

• All six of those six players have played professionally since graduating: Dallas Maverick Shane Larkin was selected No. 18 in the NBA Draft; Kenny Kadji (Cavaliers) and Trey McKinney Jones (Bucks) were with NBA teams during the preseason; Reggie Johnson was selected in the D-League Draft by the Delaware 87ers, Julian Gamble is playing in France and Durand Scott is in Spain.

• Shane Larkin was picked No. 18 overall in the 2013 NBA Draft. The ACC led all conferences with eight players selected in the Draft. Every ACC team has had at least one first round selection. With its four first-round selections, the ACC extends its streak of having at least one first-round draft pick to 25 consecutive years (1989-2013). Over the past five years (2009-13), the ACC leads all conferences with 27 first round picks.

• In 2013 Miami won the ACC regular season and tournament championships. The last team to win both titles outright was North Carolina in 2008. (Duke tied with Maryland in 2010 for regular season).

• Miami is the only school not from the state of North Carolina to win both the ACC regular season and tournament titles outright in the same season. (Georgia Tech was regular season tri-champion in 1985).

BROWN NOTCHES BACK-TO-BACK DOUBLE-DOUBLES

With 21 points and 11 rebounds against Notre Dame and 12 points and 10 rebounds at Virginia Tech, Rion Brown notched his second- and third-career double-doubles in ACC play. Brown put up 19 points and grabbed 10 boards in Miami's win over North Carolina on Jan. 8.

This season, Brown leads the team with four double-doubles, followed by a pair from Donnavan Kirk (vs. St. Francis and Georgia Southern) and one by Garrius Adams (Norfolk State).

CANES FROM DOWNTOWN

Against Notre Dame, the Hurricanes knocked down their first four shots from long distance, and their first seven of eight attempts from three. Miami ended 9-17 from distance after hitting only 7-34 at Virginia Tech the previous game.

MIAMI CONNECTS AT THE LINE

Miami connected on an ACC season-best 88.9 percent from the free throw line against Notre Dame, hitting 16-of-18 attempts. In its last seven games, Miami has attempted 17-or-more from the line, and in five-straight games (MD, NSU, Pitt, NCST & FSU) the Canes attempted 23-or-more from the line.

SENIOR STARTING FIVE

Coach Larrañaga started the oldest, most experienced and strongest lineup the last three games: The seniors. Garrius Adams manned the PG position, flanked by wings Rion Brown and Erik Swoope. Donnavan Kirk and Raphael Akpejiori started in the paint for Miami.

FORMER MAN-TO-MAN TEAM GETS IN THE ZONE

After playing man-to-man defense 95 percent of the time in his first 40 years of coaching, Jim Larrañaga's team is now playing zone 95 percent of the game. Throughout the season the Canes have played a mix of 1-2-2, 2-3, 1-3-1, box-and-one, triangle-and-two, and man-to-man.

HOLDING OPPONENTS TO LESS THAN 70 POINTS

While playing primarily zone, Miami has held 17 of its last 19 opponents to less than 70 points, and only four teams overall this season have scored more than 70 points on the Canes: 80-Georgia Southern, 71-George Washington, 74-Maryland, 73-Florida State.

OFFENSIVE UPS AND DOWNS

Miami has scored 70+ points three times in ACC play this season, all of which are in the last six outings. After scoring 77 points at Florida State, Miami recorded only 45 points at Virginia Tech, but rebounded with 71 against Notre Dame.

Miami has scored 40-49 points three times in ACC play, 50-59 five times, 60-69 twice and 70+ in three games.

DID YOU KNOW

Miami has only three players 6-foot-9 or taller, and six guys are between 6'5 and 6'7, while seven Canes are 5'11 to 6'2.

Miami men's basketball has graduated 30 of 31 players in the past nine years and in just two seasons under Larrañaga, the team has had all nine seniors earn their degree. All six seniors on the 2013 ACC Championship team earned their degree, including current senior Garrius Adams.

Coach L became the first Miami coach to win 20+ games in his first two seasons at UM and only the fourth of 12 UM coaches to post two 20-win seasons.

Former Cane Rick Barry was named one of the Greatest Players in NBA History.

Miami native and former Cane James Jones won the 2010-2011 NBA All-Star Weekend 3-Point Contest and the NBA Championship in the 2011-2012 season.

Six-time NBA All Star Amar'e Stoudemire enrolled at UM last year and is taking classes to earn his bachelor's degree.

UM is in its 10th season in the ACC.

Coach L led the George Mason Patriots to the Final Four with big wins over some of basketball's elite teams such as Michigan State, UNC, and UConn. He was the first coach to take a mid-major to a Final Four in 27 years when his team advanced in 2006.

In 14 years at George Mason, Larrañaga led the Patriots to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999), including the 2006 Final Four.

Miami basketball received APR (academic progress rate) Public Recognition Awards for being among the top 10 percent in APR in their sport. Miami ranks in the top 10 percent NCAA men's basketball with a 990 APR.

The University of Miami Department of Athletics recorded a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 92 percent. Miami's department-wide GSR is tied for third among ACC schools and 10th overall among FBS programs. UM has exceeded the NCAA average GSR in each of the last nine years.

According to latest US News & World Report rankings, the University of Miami is the top academic institution in the state of Florida and ranks 47th nationally.

The Hurricanes have made at least one trey in 861 of 866 games since the NCAA adopted the 3-point shot in 1986.

Miami has held 719 of its last 720 opponents to less than 100 points. UNC was the last team to score 100+, defeating UM 105-64 on Jan. 31, 2007.

The Canes have averaged 20+ wins in each of the last eight seasons.

UM has played in the postseason 14 of the past 19 years, six of which were in the NCAA Tournament. The Hurricanes have advanced to the postseason seven times in nine seasons, with five NIT appearances and two NCAA appearances.

RECORD WATCHING RION BROWN

Rion Brown is currently No. 10 on Miami's all-time list of 3-point shots made in a career. His 163 trail No. 9 Johnny Hemsley (164) and No. 8 Kevin Presto (170). Jack McClinton holds the record with 286 made from distance.

Brown is also closing in on 1,000 career points, as he currently has notched 993. Only 34 previous Canes have scored at least 1,000 points for UM, including Durand Scott and Reggie Johnson from last year's team, and Malcolm Grant from Coach L's first season at the U.

Brown has played 129 career games, which is tied for third-most in the in UM history. Durand Scott played in 132, Brian Asbury in 130 and Julian Gamble in 129 games.

BROWN AMONG MOST IMPROVED IN THE ACC

Rion Brown has improved his scoring 8.3 points per game from a season ago, tied for the fifth-best improvement in the ACC this season. T.J. Warren (+10.9) leads the ACC, Trevor Cooney (+9.9) is second, followed by Marcus Paige (+9.0), Jerami Grant (+8.5) and Ian Miller (+8.3).

2013-14 SIGNING CLASS

A consensus Top 60 player, **Ja'Quan Newton** of Neumann-Goretti High in Philadelphia, is a 6-2, 180-pound guard listed as the No. 55 player in ESPN's Top 100 list. **James Palmer**, a senior at St. John's College High, is a 6-foot-4, 180-pound guard from Washington, D.C., who helped his squad to a 20-win season by averaging 12 points, five rebounds and two assists as a junior. **Omar Sherman**, out of Duncanville, Texas, is a 6-foot-8, 220-pound forward who is a four-star prospect, according to ESPN and Scout.com. **Ivan Cruz Uceda** is a 6-foot-10, 240-pound forward originally from Madrid, Spain, ranked No. 55 overall by ESPN. Cruz Uceda will be available to play a pair of seasons for Miami following his two years at Harcum College in Pennsylvania.

The four newcomers will join an already talented 2014-15 class, which includes redshirt-freshman Deandre Burnett, who is out this season with an injury, and transfers Sheldon McClellan and Angel Rodriguez, who are currently sitting out due to NCAA transfer rules.

SEASONS OF CHANGE

Miami will face back-to-back seasons with roster turnover after losing six players from the 2012-13 ACC Championship season, then six more seniors (5 scholarship) after this 2013-14 campaign.

COACHING COORDINATORS FOR MIAMI

Miami's assistant coaching staff is set up in a coordinator system, with Eric Konkol as the offensive coordinator, Michael Huger

managing the defense and Chris Caputo handling the scout for every opponent.

MIAMI IN NATIONAL STATS

As of Feb. 17, Miami is ranked No. 11 in the country in scoring defense, holding opponents to just 59.6 points per game. The Canes are also ranked No. 33 in field goal percentage defense, at just 39.9 percent. UM is No. 13 in personal fouls per game, No. 15 in fewest fouls, No. 26 in fewest turnovers, No. 28 in turnovers per game.

SHARING THE LEAD

Jim Larrañaga was named the 12th head coach of the University of Miami men's basketball program on April 22, 2011.

After leading UM to the 2013 NCAA Sweet 16, and winning the school's first ACC regular season and tournament championships, Larrañaga was honored as the AP, Naismith, USBWA Henry Iba and ACC Coach of the Year. The Bronx native helped Miami to a No. 2 national ranking by both the AP and USA TODAY, and a No. 2 seed in the NCAA tournament. He is the 10th coach in the last 10 years to lead two top-10 programs, as Miami was No. 2 on Feb. 18, 2013, and George Mason was No. 8 in the final Top 25 poll in 2006.

Larrañaga, who earned his 500th win during the season, directed the Canes to a 27-point win over No. 1 Duke and three other 20+ point wins over ACC opponents this season, including North Carolina (+26), Florida State (+24) and Boston College (+22). UM's 29 overall and 15 ACC wins in 2012-13 were program-bests, as was the 14-game winning streak and 13-0 start in conference play. Other program firsts include defeating all three teams in the North Carolina Triangle in the same season, beating a trio of teams in the Top 20 since joining the ACC and hosting five home sellouts at the BankUnited Center.

Individually, Coach L saw Shane Larkin earn the ACC Player of the Year and Lute Olson National Player of the Year awards, as well as All-American status and finalist nods for the Bob Cousy, John Wooden and James Naismith player of the year honors before declaring early for the 2013 NBA Draft. Larkin was also the ACC Tournament MVP, on the ACC Defensive team and a defensive All-American. Durand Scott was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year, three players - Larkin, Scott and Kenny Kadji - were listed on all-conference teams and four were on the ACC All-Tournament Team - Larkin, Scott, Julian Gamble and Trey McKinney Jones. All six seniors on the Sweet 16 team earned academic degrees from the University of Miami and one player was listed on the All-ACC Academic Team.

Larrañaga came to Miami after serving as the head coach at George Mason for 14 seasons. He guided that program to five NCAA Tournament appearances (1999, 2001, 2006, 2008, 2011) - including an unprecedented run to the 2006 Final Four that captured the nation's attention, defeating Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and UConn along the way. Following that run, he was selected the 2006 Clair Bee Coach of the Year. Larrañaga built the GMU Patriots' program into a perennial contender in the highly-regarded Colonial Athletic Association, winning more games than any other coach

in program and conference history (273) en route to three conference titles (1999, 2001, 2008). A two-time CAA Coach of the Year honoree, Larrañaga earned the accolade in 2011, leading the Patriots to a 27-7 overall record and 16-2 conference mark en route to the CAA regular-season title and their fifth NCAA Tournament appearance under his leadership. Seeded a program-best eighth in the NCAA Tournament, George Mason rallied from a double-digit deficit to defeat ninth-seeded Villanova, 61-57, before falling to overall No. 1 seed Ohio State in the third round. In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the Final Four in 27 years and earned an at-large berth for a CAA team for the first time in 20 years. Along the way, he led Mason to a school record in wins, the school's first national ranking, George Mason's first appearance in the Top 10 and the school's first wins over Top 10 teams.

With 29 years of head coaching experience, the native of Bronx, N.Y., previously served as the head coach at Bowling Green for 11 seasons (1986-1997) and at Division II American International for two seasons (1977-79). His first coaching opportunity came at Davidson College, where he served as an assistant coach to Terry Holland. Davidson captured three Southern Conference regular-season championships and an NIT berth in his five years there, and he compiled a 47-12 record doubling as the freshman team coach. In 1976, he left Davidson and spent one season as player-coach for the Geronimo Basketball Club in Belgium. A 1971 graduate of Providence College with a degree in economics, Larrañaga was a four-year letterman for the Friars. As the team captain in his senior season, he led Providence to a 20-8 record and an NIT appearance. He graduated as the school's fifth all-time leading scorer with 1,258 points and was selected in the sixth round of the draft by the Detroit Pistons of the National Basketball Association. He was the team's top scorer as a sophomore and junior and was named New England's Division I Sophomore of the Year in 1969. He was inducted into the Providence College Hall of Fame in 1991.

Larrañaga, 64, and his wife, Liz, have two sons - Jay, who played for his father at Bowling Green and is an assistant coach with the Boston Celtics, and Jon, who was a member of his father's George Mason teams from 1999-2003 - and four grandchildren.
