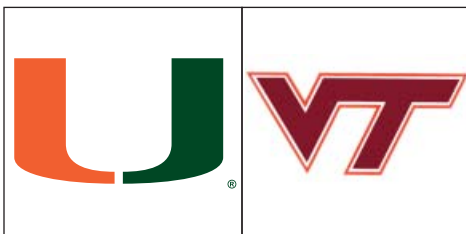

'Canes Begin ACC Play Hosting Virginia Tech...

Miami (5-8) has yet to string together consecutive wins on the year, but is looking forward to opening ACC play with the visiting Hokies of Virginia Tech (10-4). Last year in Blacksburg, Va., the Hokies took two-of-three from the Hurricanes, winning their first-ever series against Miami. From that point, UM went on to score seven consecutive wins on its schedule.

The Hurricanes are batting just .236 as a team, though holding opponents to just .223 overall with the help of the starting pitching staff and bullpen. Junior reliever Daniel Miranda leads the bullpen production with a 1-0 record and a clean ERA through six appearances (7 2/3 innings).

The Miami pitchers are holding a combined 3.23 ERA on the campaign, highlighted by sophomore right-hander Eric Whaley – scheduled to start Sunday's contest – with a 3.00 ERA and 15 strikeouts in a team-high 18 innings worked in three starts. Friday night's starter, Bryan Radziewski, will make his third consecutive start as a rookie, working 14 1/3 frames with a team-high 19 strikeouts and a 3.77 ERA. Sophomore E.J. Encinosa has a 3.94 ERA, but has the team's second-lowest average against with opponents batting just .182 against the right-hander.

Radziewski is 2-1 on the year, with a loss at Florida coming in his last start, while Encinosa is 0-2, and Whaley sits at 2-1.

UM junior Rony Rodriguez leads the offense, entering the series with a .333 average with 12 hits, six RBI and a team-leading two home runs. Freshman first baseman Brad Fieger is second on the team, carrying a .265 average on a team-high tying 13 hits and three RBI.

Not the Miami Harold...

Through the first 13 games of the year, junior Preseason All-American third baseman Harold Martinez is not having the type of year Coach

Morris, scouts - or even Harold, thought he would have. Martinez is batting a career-low .163 at this stage of the season, and fielding at just 88.9 percent with a team-leading five errors. After leading the Atlantic Coast Conference

in home runs a season ago, Martinez has just one so far on the campaign. Thus, showing this is not the Miami Harold the city really knows.

Scouting Virginia Tech...

Virginia Tech enters the weekend with a record of 10-4, picking up a 14-2 win over Florida Atlantic in its last contest on Tuesday night. The Hokies are batting .293 as a squad, with a pitching staff that holds opponents to just .221. Virginia Tech has slugged a league-best 20 home runs this season with a league second-best .494 slugging percentage, led by redshirt sophomore outfielder Andrew Rash with 20. Rash holds a .380 batting average, and mustered 21 RBI on 19 hits, to go along with eight doubles. Senior Tony Ballisteri is the team-leader in hits (20) and bats .357 with a team-high matching 18 runs. Ballisteri ties for third in the ACC in hits and

In his 18th season at Miami, no other program, nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 38 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 17 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 26 years, 17 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 776-298-3 (.721) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,280-542-4 (.701) Division I record in 29 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 32 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,411-583-4 (.706) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 18 years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the new stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 26th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2010 when he guided the 'Canes to the NCAA Coral Gables Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 17 seasons (1994-2010), winning 15 of his last 17 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris has led the 2010 Hurricanes to their 38th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2010 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft. In 2008, the 'Canes reached the College World Series after winning the Atlantic Coast Conference, widely considered one of the toughest - if not the toughest - collegiate baseball conference in the country.

MORRIS IN HIS 33RD SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,279-540-4 (.703) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,410-581-4 (.708) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 17 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- Guided the Miami Hurricanes to College World Series National Championship in 1999 and 2001.
- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 17 seasons and led Miami to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami, by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

SHORTSTOPS AND JIM MORRIS

Morris, who played shortstop during college at Elon and then in the Boston Red Sox organization, has had great success developing the position while a head coach. Over the last decade Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases. He currently works with sophomore Stephen Perez, a slick-fielding switch-hitter expected to bat near the upper-half of the order this year for the 'Canes.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres, from 1997-99. Before Hill, it was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Mets. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and played for the Oakland A's in 2009.

Last Meeting With VTech: Hokies Clinch Series Win for First Time vs. Miami...

After opening the 2010 season with four straight series wins in Atlantic Coast Conference play, the ninth-ranked University of Miami baseball team lost Sunday's rubber game at No. 25 Virginia Tech, 4-2, at English Field.

Miami (23-9, 11-4 ACC) jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the second inning, but Virginia Tech (23-11, 8-7) responded with a run in third, two more in the fifth and another in the eighth to claim the two-run victory.

Jason Santana (3-2) turned in his fifth straight quality start for the 'Canes but suffered the loss, allowing three runs on six hits while walking one and striking out four in six innings.

Virginia Tech starter Jesse Hahn (5-2) allowed two early runs but settled in, striking out nine, walking two and allowing five hits in seven innings of work to earn the win. Ben Rowen came on in the eighth to toss the final two shut-out innings to earn his fourth save of the season.

Harold Martinez was the lone 'Cane with multiple hits, going 2-for-4 with his team-leading ninth homer of the season. Tim Smalling went 3-for-4 with two RBI to lead

the Hokies offensively.

The Hurricanes scored their only two runs in the top of the second, plating runs on Martinez's solo homer to left to lead off the inning before a bases loaded fielder's choice grounder by Frankie Ratcliff scored Nathan Melendres.

Smalling cut UM's lead to 2-1 in the bottom of the third with a solo homer to left before the Hokies took the lead two innings later with two more runs. A UM throwing error brought the game to a tie in the fifth before a double to left-center by Smalling proved to be the game-winner, putting Virginia Tech up 3-2.

The Hokies added an insurance run in the eighth when pinch-hitter Chris Kay homered to left-center.

No Ordinary Joe...

Last weekend in Gainesville, UMiami assistant coach Joe Mercadante returned to his old stomping grounds where he earned varsity letters in baseball for the University of Florida during the 2002 and '03 seasons. The former Gators catcher and Gainesville native appeared in 37 games for UF, holding a .312 (10-for-32) batting average and 19 runs batted in. Mercadante is in his seventh year with the Hurricanes program, coaching at P.K. Yonge High School (also his alma mater) prior to his arrival in Coral Gables.

Recapping the 'Canes Last Game - vs. Illinois State (3/9/11)...

Illinois State University scored seven runs over the course of the sixth and seventh innings in order to break away from the University of Miami, earning a 9-2 victory in baseball action inside Alex Rodriguez Park on Wednesday night. With the win, the Redbirds and Hurricanes split the two-day affair after Miami collected a 5-4 decision in 11 innings on Tuesday, March 9 in Coral Gables, Fla.

Miami (5-8) trailed 1-0 in the home-half of the fourth inning before scoring two men with the help of Harold Martinez – registering his first double of the season – bringing around Rony Rodriguez and Michael Broad for the go-ahead runs.

Hurricanes' starting pitcher Steven Ewing kept his team within striking distance for the second consecutive outing on the hill, as the Orlando native tossed five full frames, allowing just one run on a single hit and recording a career-high seven strikeouts.

In the sixth inning, freshman Javi Salas toed the rubber for the Hurricanes, but he was unable to stop the Illinois State (8-4) bats that would come alive down the stretch. Salas would give up three runs in the inning, as the Redbirds used an error and three hits – highlighted by second baseman Bryan Huff's two-run scoring single down the left field line that allowed Hollenbeck and Zach Amrein to put ILSU on top for good, 5-2.

ILSU scored four more times in the seventh as two Hurricanes errors and four Redbirds hits pushed the lead out to 8-2.

Another run in the ninth by Ryan Court on a bases-loaded walk issued by Adam Sargent brought in catcher-turned-pitcher Zach Robinson from the UMiami bullpen. Zach Robinson, seeing his first action of the year for the 'Canes, drew a double-play and fanned one to get out of the jam.

Robinson finished with an inning of work and a strikeout in his collegiate pitching debut.

Illinois State was led at the plate by Hollenbeck's three-hit performance, driving in two runs and scoring twice. Huff recorded four RBI with a hit in three official at-bats. Tyler McNeely went long for the Redbirds, posting his second home run of the year with a leadoff solo shot to left in the third inning.

Miami got a solid performance offensively from Zeke DeVoss and Chantz Mack, each finishing 2-of-3 on the night. Martinez and Michael Broad each collected a hit to round-out the Hurricanes offense on the night.

The winning pitcher from ILSU was starter Dan Savas, keeping his record clean at 2-0 on the campaign in a full six innings tossed, allowing two earned runs on five hits

ALEX RODRIGUEZ PARK INFORMATION

Renovations to Alex Rodriguez Park are thanks in large part to a \$3.9 million contribution by New York Yankees third baseman and 11-time MLB All-Star Alex Rodriguez. The gift - the largest ever to the University of Miami baseball program - has assisted the program in continuing to develop first-class facilities. The official announcement of his gift was made on Oct. 10, 2002.

Alex Rodriguez Park has taken form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.
- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box – along with four VIP suites – have been built atop the grandstand. This past offseason, addition seating was added down both lines while a new scoreboard was constructed in left field.

Morris Signs Contract Extension...

On Sept. 20, 2009, University of Miami Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt announced that head baseball coach Jim Morris signed a contract extension through 2015. Morris, who is in his 17th season at the helm of the Miami baseball program, has led the Hurricanes to the College World Series in 11 of his 16 seasons in Coral Gables - including National Championship runs in 1999 and 2001.

Miami Gets Them Drafted...

Over the last three years, Miami has produced four first round MLB draft picks, more than any other school in the nation.
