A LOOK AT MIAMI

• Last time out on Nov. 4, Miami extended its winning streak to 13 straight games dating to Oct. 29, 2016 with a 28-10 win over Virginia Tech.

• Miami's current 13-game winning streak is the longest nationwide at the FBS level, and the program's longest winning streak since the 2002 season, when Miami finished the tail end of a 34-game winning streak. Georgia (10) and Wisconsin (10) also have double-digit win streaks.

• For the first time since 2002, Miami has started 8-0 overall and for the first time since joining the ACC in 2004, Miami is 6-0 in conference play. With a perfect 8-0 record, Miami is one of just five remaining unbeaten teams at the FBS level and the only unbeaten team in the ACC.

• Miami ranks first nationally in tackles for loss (8.8 per game), fifth in team sacks (3.5) and third in team passing efficiency defense (98.33).

A LOOK AT NOTRE DAME

• Notre Dame is under the direction of eighth-year head coach **Brian Kelly**, whose team is ranked #3/#5 and has a 8-1 overall record.

• The Irish are led by QB **Brandon Wimbush** (1,286 passing yards, 639 rushing yards, 13 rushing TDs, 11 passing TDs) and RB **Josh Adams** (1,191 rushing yards, 9 TDs).

• Notre Dame's defense is led by LB **Te'Von Coney** (74 tackles, 9.0 tackles for loss) and DB **Julian Love** (14 PBU, 3 INT).

• Notre Dame ranks fifth nationally in rushing offense (324.8 yards per game) and seventh in scoring offense (41.3 points per game).

THE ALL-TIME SERIES

• The Hurricanes trail the all-time series with Notre Dame 18-7-1, but Miami has won five straight matchups against the Fighting Irish in Miami. The Irish have not won in Miami since 1977.

• Miami has lost four straight games overall to Notre Dame - including a 27-30 loss on Oct. 29, 2016. Miami's trip to Notre Dame last season marked the last loss for the Hurricanes overall; Miami has won 13 straight games since that matchup.

• The all-time series is tied in games played in Miami at 6-6-1. The Fighting Irish have not made the trip to South Florida since the 1989 season.

THE COACH

- Miami is in its second season under the direction of head coach **Mark Richt**; in his first season at the helm, the Hurricanes finished with a 9-4 record and won their first bowl game since 2006 with a 31-14 victory over West Virginia in the Russell Athletic Bowl.
- Richt, who grew up in nearby Boca Raton, Fla., played quarterback as a student-athlete at Miami and is a 1982 graduate of the university, was named the 24th head coach in the history of the Hurricanes football program on Dec. 4, 2015. He is 17-4 in his first 21 games at The U.

QUICK HITS

CANES HOST IRISH IN TOP-10 MATCHUP

- For the first time since 1989, the Miami Hurricanes welcome Notre Dame to south Florida for the latest installment of one of college football's most historic rivalries. Kickoff is set for 8 p.m. on ABC on Nov. 11.
- Though Notre Dame leads the all-time series 18-7-1, the Hurricanes have not lost to the Fighting Irish in Miami since 1977.
- In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), Miami has a 6-8 record against Notre Dame and a 5-0 home record.
- Mark Richt's lone game against Notre Dame as head coach came in last year's matchup, a 27-30 loss to the Irish in South Bend, Ind. on Oct. 29, 2016. That game was Miami's last overall loss; 377 days will have elapsed since when the game kicks off.

UM DOMINATES VT IN COASTAL CLASH

- Miami won its eighth straight game to open the season, topping #13/#13 Virginia Tech, 28-10, Nov. 4. at Hard Rock Stadium
- The win was Miami's most dominant of the season; the Hurricanes outgained Virginia Tech 429-299, besting a team that entered the game ranked #2 in the ACC in scoring offense and #1 in scoring defense.
- The Hurricanes recorded four turnovers in the victory while redshirt junior QB **Malik Rosier** totaled three touchdowns (two passing, one rushing).
- Virginia Tech's 10 points were the fewest it has scored in a game all season. Four Hurricanes wore the turnover chain: DB **Jaquan Johnson**, DL **Jonathan Garvin**, DB **Sheldrick Redwine** and DL **RJ McIntosh**.

DEFENSE DOMINATING UNDER DIAZ

- Miami's defense is delivering once again under the direction of second-year defensive coordinator **Manny Diaz**.
- UM entered the week ranked first nationwide in team tackles for loss per game (8.8), fifth in team sacks (3.5) and third in team passing efficiency defense (98.33).
- In one of the most important metrics for measuring a college football defense in 2017 - yards per play - the Hurricanes checked in at No. 10 nationwide (4.4 yards per play) for the second-best mark in the ACC.
- UM is one of just 10 teams in the country averaging fewer than 4.5 yards per play.
- Is it the power of the turnover chain? Miami's defense ranks fourth nationwide in team takeaways per game (2.6).

#7/#6 MIAMI HOSTS #3/#5 NOTRE DAME FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 1989

- #7/#6 Miami (8-0) will be in search of its 14th straight win when it hosts #3/#5 Notre Dame (8-1) in a matchup of historic college football rivals. Kickoff for the matchup is set for 8 p.m. on ABC.
- The Hurricanes have opened the season with an 8-0 overall record for the first time since 2002.
- Miami sits in first place in the ACC Coastal and its 'magic number' to clinch the division is one.
- UM's current 13-game winning streak is its longest since 2001-02 (Jan. 3, 2002 - Dec. 7, 2002) and the longest FBS winning streak. Georgia (10) and Wisconsin (10) both have double-digit streaks.
- Miami has not won 14 in a row since the tail end of a stretch when it won 34 games from 2000-2002. UM's last loss came more than a year ago (Oct. 29, 2016); 377 days will have elapsed since.
- The University of Miami and the University of Notre Dame are the only two programs nationwide ranked in the Coaches Poll of college football, men's basketball and women's basketball.

LAST TIME OUT: UM VANQUISHES VT, 28-10, IN COASTAL MATCHUP

- Miami secured the first 6-0 start to ACC play in program history with a 28-10 win over Virginia Tech last time out at Hard Rock Stadium. The win was UM's 13th in a row dating to Oct. 29, 2016.
- Prior to 2017, UM's best start in ACC play was 3-0 which happened three times: 2004, 2012 & 2013.
- Miami's defense put on a dominant performance against the Hokies, holding one of the ACC's top scoring offenses to a season-low 10 points and 299 total yards, forcing four turnovers in the win.
- Junior DB **Jaquan Johnson** delivered an impressive game, finishing with a team-best seven total tackles, one interception and one forced fumble. He was named ACC Defensive Back of the Week.
- Redshirt junior **Malik Rosier** improved to 9-0 as starting quarterback at Miami with 202 passing yards and three total touchdowns. Rosier added a career-best 84 rushing yards in the victory.
- The Hurricanes compiled 429 total yards of offense, including 210 rushing yards on just 34 carries.

DEFENSE DAZZLING UNDER THE DIRECTION OF DIAZ

- University of Miami defensive coordinator **Manny Diaz** has helped direct the Hurricanes' defense into one of the more dominant units in college football for the second straight season.
- Miami's defense ranks 10th nationally in yards per play allowed (4.4), one of the most important metrics when measuring a college football defense in 2017. In 2016, Miami ranked #16 (4.7).
- Miami ranks first in the nation in tackles for loss (8.8 per game), fifth nationally in team sacks (3.50), third nationally in team passing efficiency defense (98.33) and fourth nationwide in turnover margin (1.38). The Hurricanes rank seventh nationally and first in the ACC in passes intercepted (13).
- Last time out on Nov. 4, Miami held one of the ACC's top scoring offenses in the Virginia Tech Hokies to its fewest yards of total offense (299) and its fewest points scored (10) of any game this season.
- The Canes rank No. 12 nationally in scoring defense, allowing an average of 17.6 points per game.

ROSIER AIMING TO IMPROVE TO 10-0 AS MIAMI'S STARTING QB

- QB **Malik Rosier** will be making the 10th start of his career and sixth home start when he lines up versus Notre Dame on Nov. 11. He has perfect career marks of 5-0 at home and 4-0 on the road.
- Rosier is fourth in the ACC in passing efficiency (143.5) with 19 touchdowns and seven interceptions.
- Rosier ranks second in the ACC in passing yards per game (283.0) and third in total offense per game (319.9). His three 300-yard passing games this season are tied for second among ACC QBs.
- In five career starts at Hard Rock Stadium, Rosier has compiled a 62.7% completion rate (104-of-166), 1,393 passing yards, 11 touchdown passes and four picks to go along with 201 rushing yards.
- Rosier's only start prior to 2017 came on Oct. 31, 2015, when he played in place of injured **Brad Kaaya** in a 30-27 win at Duke. Rosier finished 20-for-29 for 272 yards with two touchdowns.
- Rosier was announced as Miami's starting quarterback by head coach **Mark Richt** on Aug. 22 during the final week of Hurricanes fall camp, winning a four-man quarterback race for the job.
- Rosier redshirted the 2014 football season and served as back-up in Kaaya's final two seasons (2015, 2016). Rosier was a member of the 2015 Miami Hurricanes baseball team that made it to the College World Series, though he did not travel to Omaha, Neb., with the team.

UM A TOP-TEN TEAM FOR SECOND STRAIGHT SEASON UNDER RICHT

- After a 28-10 win last time out on Nov. 4, Miami jumped two spots to No. 7 in the Associated Press rankings (No. 9). UM remained at No. 6 in the Amway Coaches Poll for the second straight week.
- UM has been ranked in the top 10 of both polls for the last four weeks (Oct. 15, Oct. 22, Oct. 29)
- It's the second straight year head coach Mark Richt has Miami ranked in the top 10 after UM had not ascended to such a poll position since Oct. 27, 2013 (No. 7 in AP / No. 6 in the Coaches Poll).
- Miami was ranked No. 10 in both the AP and Coaches Polls on Oct. 2, 2016 after starting 4-0.



WHO'S ROCKING THE TURNOVER CHAIN?

- The University of Miami "turnover chain" made its debut Sept. 2 vs. Bethune-Cookman, when sophomore DB **Malek Young** was rewarded for his interception with an oversized sparkling "U" chain on the sidelines at Hard Rock Stadium. 15 different players have worn "the chain."
- UM has forced 20 turnovers through eight games; the Canes forced 19 turnovers all of last season.
- Four Hurricanes wore the chain, designed by famed Miami icon "A.J. the Jeweler," against Virginia Tech: DB **Jaquan Johnson**, DB **Sheldrick Redwine**, DL **RJ McIntosh** and DL **Jonathan Garvin**.
- Miami has recorded 20 turnovers on defense so far, and the 15 different student-athletes who have worn the chain are: Young, Johnson (two interceptions, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery), Redwine (one recovered fumble, two interceptions), McIntosh, Garvin, DB **Amari Carter** (forced fumble vs. Bethune-Cookman), DL **Ryan Fines** (recovered fumble vs. Bethune-Cookman), LB **Michael Pinckney** (interception vs. Duke), DL **Pat Bethel** (forced fumble, fumble recovery vs. Duke), DB **Michael Jackson** (four interceptions), DB **Dee Delaney** (interception vs. Florida State), LB **Shaquille Quarterman** (fumble recovery vs. Georgia Tech), DL **Demetrius Jackson** (interception vs. Syracuse), LB **Charles Perry** (interception vs. UNC), DL **Joe Jackson** (forced fumble vs. UNC).
- Is it the chain? Miami is first in the ACC and sixth nationally with a turnover margin of +10 (1.43 / game). Miami's four interceptions vs. Syracuse were the most picks by a Hurricanes defense in a single game since recording four against Savannah State at home on Sept. 21, 2013.

THE NATION'S LONGEST ACTIVE WINNING STREAK

- The Miami Hurricanes have won 13 games in a row dating back to Oct. 29, 2016, and have not lost since a 27-30 defeat at Notre Dame in South Bend, Ind. The 13-game winning streak is FBS' longest.
- Miami's average margin of victory during its current 13-game winning streak is 15.7 points.
- Since taking over, **Mark Richt** has guided Miami to a 17-4 record and Miami's 17 wins have come by an average of 20.5 points. The four losses have come by an average of just 8.0 points.

BALLHAWKING IN THE SECONDARY

- Miami ranks third in the nation and second in the ACC in team passing efficiency defense (98.33).
- The Hurricanes rank first in the ACC and fourth nationally with an average turnover margin of +1.38 per game (+11 for the season), and a big reason is standout play in the Hurricanes secondary.
- Miami's 20 gained turnovers are the most in the ACC and its 13 are tied for the most in the league.
- A week after matching Syracuse QB Eric Dungey's entire season interception total in a single game (four), Miami had three more interceptions on Oct. 28 in a 24-19 win over North Carolina.
- UM has forced 20 turnovers through eight games; the Canes forced 19 turnovers all of last season
- DB **Michael Jackson** leads the Hurricanes with four interceptions, three of which have come in the last three games. His four picks are the most by a Hurricane since **Artie Burns** had six in 2015.
- Miami's four interceptions vs. Syracuse on Oct. 21 were the most picks by a Hurricanes defense in a single game since recording four against Savannah State at home on Sept. 21, 2013.

THE QUARTERBACK WHISPERER

- Under the watchful eye of head coach and quarterback guru **Mark Richt**, play at the QB position has been instrumental during Miami's 13-game winning streak - the longest active win streak in FBS.
- Miami's quarterbacks have thrown 33 touchdowns compared to just eight interceptions over the 13-game winning streak and have thrown for 3,837 yards - an average of 295.2 yards per game.
- In 21 games since taking over as head coach at The U, Richt has helped his quarterbacks compile a touchdown-to-interception ratio of 46:14 and 5,853 passing yards - an average of 278.7 per game.

BRAXTON BALLING IN FINAL SEASON AT THE U

- Senior WR **Braxton Berrios** has been Miami's top offensive threat in the first eight games of 2017. Berrios leads all Hurricanes pass catchers with 36 catches, 474 yards and seven TDs this year.
- Berrios' stat line in 2017 exceeds his combined stat line from the past two seasons (2015-16), when he totaled three starts, 24 catches, 264 yards and two touchdowns in 24 games.
- Berrios has started every game in 2017 and ranks 10th in the ACC in receptions per game (4.4).
- The North Carolina native was a CBS Sports Midseason All-American as an "all-purpose player."
- Last time out vs. Virginia Tech, Berrios had a team-high four catches for 59 yards with one TD.
- Berrios came up big against Florida State on Oct. 7, starting and hauling in a career-high eight receptions for 90 yards with two scores. He was named ACC Receiver of the Week on Oct. 9.
- Berrios posted his first and only career 100-yard receiving game in a win over Toledo on Sept. 23, catching five passes, including a career-long 55-yarder, for 105 yards with one receiving score.

"BADG-O-MATIC" ON THE VERGE OF MAKING HISTORY AT THE U

- Senior K **Michael Badgley**, is on the verge of making Miami history in his final season at The U.
- Badgley, who was named a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award last week, ranks second in Miami history in career made field goals (72). He hit a Miami-record 25 field goals in 2015.
- Badgley needs just one field goal to tie **Carlos Huerta's** (1988-91) Miami career record of 73.
- The New Jersey native, who earned third-team All-ACC honors for the second straight year in 2016, has enjoyed a strong start to 2017, going 12-for-14 on field goals and 30-for-30 on PATs.
- Badgley ranks second in the ACC and 18th nationally with a field goal percentage of 85.7 this year; his 1.50 field goals made-per-game average is 24th-best nationally and fourth-best in the ACC.
- Badgley connected on a game-winning field goal with four seconds remaining against Georgia Tech (Oct. 14), his fourth of the game. He has scored 62 points for Miami this season
- Badgley 371 career points are the second-most in UM history; Huerta (397) owns the UM record.

CLOSING IT OUT: MIAMI IMPRESSING IN SECOND HALVES UNDER RICHT

- Since **Mark Richt's** arrival as head coach, Miami has outscored its opponents in the second half in 17 of 21 games, but a streak of 11 straight games ended in a win over Syracuse on Oct. 21 (14-16).
- Miami has a second-half point differential of +206 in 21 games under Richt, good for an average of 9.8 points in second halves. UM has lost the second-half battle just three times under Richt.
- Miami's only three games on the wrong end of second-half scoring came vs. Florida State (-11) and at Virginia Tech (-14) in 2016, and against Syracuse at Hard Rock Stadium on Oct. 21 (-2).
- The Hurricanes have outscored opponents 390-184 in the second half in 21 games under Richt, and have held an opponent to 10 points or fewer in the second half in 15 of 21 games.

HERNDON KEEPING #TIGHTENDU TRADITION ALIVE

- The Hurricanes were expecting a big year from senior tight end **Christopher Herndon IV**, and he has delivered, including two catches for 61 yards with a 43-yard touchdown last time out (Nov. 4).
- Herndon has already set career marks in catches (32), receiving yards (392) and receiving touchdowns (four) in eight games, besting his previous highs set as a junior in 2016 (28, 334, 2).
- Herndon recorded career-high totals of 10 catches and 96 yards with one TD vs. Syracuse on Oct. 21.
- The Georgia native, who has started all eight games this year, ranks second on the team with 32 receptions for 392 yards. He was named ACC Receiver of the Week on Oct. 23 for his game vs. Cuse.
- In 40 career games, Herndon has made 23 career starts and totaled 78 receptions, 963 yards and seven touchdowns. He started 12 of 13 games in 2016, when he set career marks in every category.
- Herndon's 2016 tight end partner, David Njoku, was selected in the first round of the 2017 NFL Draft by the Cleveland Browns. He has 18 catches for 195 receiving yards with three TDs this season.
- Njoku (2017) became the fifth Miami tight end drafted in the first round since 2000, joining **Bubba Franks** (2000), **Jeremy Shockey** (2002), **Kellen Winslow** (2004) and **Greg Olsen** (2007).

RICHT OFF TO SIZZLING START IN COACHING CAREER AT ALMA MATER

- Head coach Mark Richt's 17-4 start to his head coaching career at Miami is the third-best mark through 21 games in the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979).

FRESHMAN PHENOM: THOMAS SHOWCASING ABILITY IN FIRST YEAR

- Over three games from Oct. 14-28, no player was a bigger contributor on offense than WR **Jeff Thomas**, who exploded for 240 yards and two touchdowns over those three games.
- Thomas has been on the receiving end of the two longest pass plays of the season: a 70-yard reception against Georgia Tech on Oct. 14 and a 78-yard touchdown vs. North Carolina on Oct. 28.
- The former four-star recruit and Under Armour All-America Game MVP had just four catches for nine receiving yards in his first four games but caught multiple passes in his next four games.
- Thomas was rewarded for his play by making his first career start at North Carolina (Oct. 28).



DEFENSIVE LINE PLAYING IT "KOOL" UNDER ONE OF NATION'S BEST

- Assistant head coach and defensive line coach **Craig Kuligowski**, widely regarded as one of the best line coaches in America, has made an immediate impact in his first two seasons at Miami.
- The Hurricanes rank first in the nation in tackles for loss per game (8.8) and fifth in sacks (3.5).
- Miami finished the 2016 season fifth in the nation in tackles for loss per game (8.3) and ranked 22nd in sacks per game (2.85). UM finished 2016 with 108 tackles for loss and 38 sacks.
- Led by 3.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks from sophomore LB Michael Pinckney, Miami finished with 9.0 tackles for loss and four sacks in a win over Syracuse at Hard Rock Stadium on Oct. 21.
- The Hurricanes posted season-high marks of six sacks & 11 tackles for loss vs. Duke on Sept. 29.
- The Hurricanes defense posted 9.0 tackles for loss for 27 yards, including 4.0 sacks, in a 52-30 win over Toledo on Sept. 23. Senior DL **Trent Harris** tied a career mark with two (2.0) sacks.
- Following the 2016 season, Kuligowski was promoted to Assistant Head Coach/Defensive Line.

HOMER DAZZLES IN FIRST FEW GAMES AS STARTING RUNNING BACK

- RB **Travis Homer** delivered a dominant 170-yard rushing game in the first start of his career vs. Georgia Tech (Oct. 14) - no back has had more rushing yards in his first UM start since at least 2000.
- Homer had 95 rushing yards and a career-long 64-yard rushing score vs Virginia Tech (Nov. 4).
- Homer recorded a career-best 57 receiving yards in a win on the road at North Carolina (Oct. 28).
- The Palm Beach native became the eighth Miami tailback to have recorded a 100-yard game in his first career start since 2000, and the fourth to do it in an Atlantic Coast Conference game.
- Homer's performance was just the 22nd game of 170 yards or more by a Miami back since 1980.
- Homer assumed starting duties when RB **Mark Walton** suffered a season-ending injury Oct. 7.

CONSISTENT CANES

- Of the 22 field positions, 12 Hurricanes have been starters in every game this season: QB **Malik Rosier**, TE **Christopher Herndon IV**, WR **Braxton Berrios**, LT **Kc McDermott**, LG **Trevor Darling**, C **Tyler Gauthier**, RT **Tyree St. Louis**, DL **Chad Thomas**, DL **Kendrick Norton**, DL **RJ McIntosh**, LB **Shaquille Quarterman** and DB **Jaquan Johnson**.
- McDermott's 29-game consecutive start streak is the longest on the team.
- Returnees OL **Kc McDermott**, OL **Mark Walton**, **RJ McIntosh**, **Kendrick Norton**, **Shaquille Quarterman** and **Michael Pinckney** were the only Miami players to start in every game in 2016.
- Sophomore LB **Shaquille Quarterman** has started every game of his Hurricanes career (21).
- Freshman WR **Mike Harley** has four starts and grad transfer newcomer DB **Dee Delaney** has started four of seven games. Freshman WR **Jeff Thomas** made the first start of his career vs. North Carolina on Oct. 28, while freshman DB **Trajan Bandy** started his first game as a Hurricane against Syracuse on Oct. 21.

- Miami has had eight players recognized by the ACC with weekly honors this season: Jaquan Johnson, who was named ACC Defensive Back of the Week on Nov. 6, joined Braxton Berrios (Receiver of the Week, Oct. 9), Darrell Langham (Co-Receiver of the Week, Oct. 16), Michael Badgley (Specialist of the Week, Oct. 16), Christopher Herndon (Receiver of the Week, Oct. 23), Michael Pinckney (Linebacker of the Week, Oct. 23) and RJ McIntosh (Defensive Lineman of the Week, Oct. 30) as Miami honorees through the first 10 weeks of the season.

SO CLOSE

- Miami's four losses in 2016 came by a combined 32 points (8.0 points per game average). Two of Miami's four losses came by three points or fewer (vs. FSU, 20-19, at Notre Dame, 30-27).
- Only one loss last season came by more than one score - a 16-37 defeat at Virginia Tech on Oct. 20. On the flip side, 13 of Miami's 17 wins under Mark Richt have come by 14 points or more.

ROAD REGULARS

- Miami opened ACC play on the road for the eighth time in the past nine seasons (at Duke, Sept. 29) and with back-to-back road games for the fourth time ever and first time since 2012.
- Since becoming head coach, Mark Richt has led Miami to a 8-2 record in games played outside of Hard Rock Stadium, including UM's first bowl win since 2006 (2016 Russell Athletic Bowl).
- Since joining the conference in 2004, the Hurricanes are now 8-6 all-time in ACC openers.
- When opening ACC play on the road, the Hurricanes have an all-time record of 5-4.
- Miami's two road losses under Richt came at Virginia Tech and at Notre Dame in 2016.

KEEPING IT IN THE "U FAMILY"

- As is often the case at the University of Miami, a number of Canes have family ties to 'The U'
- Four Hurricanes had fathers who suited up in orange and green: sophomore TE **Michael Irvin II** (father is Michael I), DL **Scott Patchan** (Matt), DL **Pat Bethel** (Randy) & P **Zach Feagles** (Jeff).
- WR **Evidence Njoku** is the younger brother of David, who was taken by Cleveland in the 2017 NFL Draft, while OL **Kc McDermott** is the younger brother of OL **Shane McDermott** (2010-2014).

OFFENSIVE LINE NAMED TO JOE MOORE AWARD HONOR ROLL

- Miami's offensive line was one of 22 named to the Joe Moore Award Honor Roll on Oct. 9, honoring the men up front who displays qualities of the best offensive lines in the country.
- The Hurricanes' offensive line has consisted of four starters who have started every game - LT Kc McDermott, LG Trevor Darling, C Tyler Gauthier and RT Tyree St. Louis.

ALMOST PERFECT 10

- Teams rarely beat Miami when scoring 10-or-fewer points.
- The Hurricanes are 163-2 in their last 165 games when holding opponents to 10 points-or-fewer, after winning 28-10 vs. Virginia Tech on Nov. 4, 2017.
- That run goes back to Oct. 1, 1977 - a season that began with Miami holding its first two opponents to exactly 10 points apiece and still lost both of those games. The only 10 points allowed-or-fewer losses: Nov. 8, 2003 to Tennessee (10-6) & Sept. 5, 2005 to Florida State (10-7).
- Head coach Mark Richt and defensive coordinator Manny Diaz have helped Miami hold opponents to 10 or fewer points in five games since the staff arrived prior to the 2016 season.

WELCOME BACK, AHMMON

- After missing the first two games of 2017 with a hamstring injury suffered during training camp, WR **Ahmmmon Richards** returned vs. Duke on Sept. 29, starting and totaling 106 receiving yards.
- It was the fifth career 100-yard receiving game for Richards, who added a 49-yard TD in the win.
- Richards caught four passes for 68 yards with a long of 32 in UM's win at Florida State on Oct. 7.
- Richards warmed up but didn't play in a win over Georgia Tech Oct. 14 at Hard Rock Stadium.
- Richards returned against Syracuse (Oct. 21), starting and finishing with six catches for 99 yards.

DIAZ, DEFENSE DELIVER DOMINANT DISPLAY VS. YELLOW JACKETS

- Georgia Tech entered the Sat., Oct. 14 matchup at Hard Rock Stadium ranked sixth nationwide in total defense (260 yards per game) and 20th nationwide in total offense (479.3 yards per game).
- The Hurricanes outgained the Yellow Jackets 481-281 in the 25-24 win, marking just the ninth time Georgia Tech has been outgained by 200 or more yards since the 2004 season.
- DC **Manny Diaz** & Miami held GT to 226 rushing yards - 170 below its average entering the game.

OFFENSE LOSES WALTON TO SEASON-ENDING INJURY VS. NOLES

- The only returning running back in the ACC who posted a 1,000-yard rushing season in 2016, RB **Mark Walton** was off to a sizzling start to 2017 before suffering an ankle injury at Florida State.
- Walton started and recorded 25 rushing yards against the Noles before what coach Mark Richt deemed a “season-ending” right ankle injury - Walton was carted off the field in Tallahassee.
- Walton was averaging 107.0 rushing yards per game through four games and 7.6 yards per carry.
- Sophomore RB **Travis Homer**, who has served as Walton’s backup since the first game of the season, has 472 yards on 65 carries. He is averaging 7.3 yards per carry with five rushing TDs.
- Homer has caught 11 passes out of the backfield for 116 yards, averaging 19.3 yards per catch. He recorded the first receiving touchdown of his career at home on Oct. 14 against Georgia Tech.

WALTON AMONG TOP BACKS IN MIAMI’S STORIED HISTORY AT RB

- With 1,995 career rush yards, Walton now sits in 11th place all-time at Miami; he entered the season No. 21 in all-time rush yards. His eight 100-yard rush games are tied for eighth-most.
- With 25 yards against Florida State last time out, Walton moved from No. 12 to No. 11 in the record books, leapfrogging UM legend **Frank Gore** (2001-04), who totaled 1,975 career yards.
- Walton opened 2017 with a bang, recording 148 yards and two rushing touchdowns in Week 1. He followed that up with the seventh 200-yard rushing game ever in Week 2 vs. Toledo. Walton now has 28 career TDs in 30 career games and is tied for fifth in rushing TDs at Miami (26).
- In 2016, Walton became just the 10th running back in Miami history to rush for over 1,000 yards.
- The impressive feat marked the 11th 1,000-yard rushing season in Miami’s and the third straight year the Hurricanes had a 1,000-yard rusher; **Duke Johnson** rushed for 1,652 yards in 2014 while **Joe Yearby** finished with 1,002 yards on the ground in 2015.

17 TRUE FRESHMEN PLAY IN THE OPENER VS. BETHUNE-COOKMAN

- The Hurricanes tied for the national lead with 17 true freshmen playing against Bethune-Cookman on Sept. 2. Both Georgia and LSU also had 17 true freshmen also play in their openers.
- In addition to starts by WR **Mike Harley** and OL **Navaughn Donaldson**, DL **Jonathan Garvin**, DL **DJ Johnson**, DL **Jonathan Ford**, WR **Jeff Thomas**, WR **DeeJay Dallas**, P **Zach Feagles**, OL **Corey Gaynor**, OL **Kai-Leon Herbert**, LB **Bradley Jennings, Jr.**, DB **Amari Carter**, DB **Trajan Bandy**, DB **Derrick Smith**, TE **Brian Polendey**, LB **De’Andre Wilder** and WR **Marshall Few** also saw time.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

- Under defensive coordinator **Manny Diaz**, the Hurricanes held opponents to just 4.75 yards per play in 2016 - a figure that ranked ninth among teams at the FBS level.
- The Hurricanes ranked in the top 25 nationally in four different defensive categories: scoring defense (No. 12/18.5), team sacks (No. 22/2.85), tackles for loss (No. 5/8.3) and total defense (No. 20/345.5). Miami held 11 of its 13 opponents under their 2016 scoring average, including West Virginia in the Russell Athletic Bowl on Dec. 28.
- Miami started and finished games strong in 2016, as it outscored opponents by a combined 166-95 count in the first and fourth quarters of games.
- In 2016, nine Miami Hurricanes had at least 5.0 tackles for loss on defense. In 2015, just four players finished the season (13 games) with at least 5.0 tackles for loss.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

- Miami’s offensive unit has proven to be an explosive unit over the previous four years. The Hurricanes’ 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016 offensive units all rank among Miami’s top 10 for total yards.
- Head coach Mark Richt resumed responsibilities as play caller after joining as head coach in 2015.
- The 2016 Hurricanes’ offensive attack ranked third in program history for most total yards.
- Miami also scored 446 points last year - a figure that ranks fourth in school history.

RICHARDS A RECORD RECEIVER IN FRESHMAN SEASON

- Wide receiver **Ahmmmon Richards** led the Hurricanes in 2016 with 934 yards receiving - the most ever by a freshman wide receiver at Miami and the sixth-most by any Hurricane ever.
- Richards missed the first two games of 2017 but recorded 106 yards on three receptions with one TD in his return vs. Duke on Sept. 29 - the fifth 100-yard receiving game of his career. He had 68 receiving yards vs. Florida State (Oct. 14), but did not play vs. Georgia Tech (Oct. 21).
- Richards' 934 yards broke **Michael Irvin's** 31-year-old record of 840, set in 1985.
- Richards' 19.06 yards per reception were tops among all FBS freshman nationally. Richards' 19.06 yards per reception ranked 18th nationally overall, while his 934 receiving yards led all FBS freshmen nationally. Richards was honored as the ACC Rookie of the Week twice in 2016.
- After the year, Richards was named to the All-ACC Second Team and a Freshman All-American.

- In September 2016, the University of Miami announced the largest donation in the history of the athletics department as the lead gift for a state-of-the-art football indoor practice facility.
- In honor of their mother Carol, Jeffrey Soffer and Carol's other children made a \$14 million commitment towards the Carol Soffer Football Indoor Practice Facility.
- Head coach Mark Richt pledged \$1 million towards the facility and football alumnus and linebacker great Jon Beason was among those alumni to give to the project. Beason's gift was \$250,000.
- Miami had its groundbreaking ceremony for the \$34 million facility in May 2017.
- The 81,800-square-foot facility will feature two field-turf fields – one 80 yards long and an additional 40-yard field directly connecting to the Squillante Strength and Conditioning Center.

MARK RICHT

HEAD COACH | SECOND SEASON AT MIAMI (17TH OVERALL) | 162-55 (.747)

Hurricane alumnus Mark Richt was named the 24th head football coach at The University of Miami on Dec. 4, 2015, by Director of Athletics Blake James.

Richt's 2016 season in Coral Gables was one to remember as he helped guide Miami to its first bowl victory in 10 years, as the Hurricanes captured the 2016 Russell Athletic Bowl, defeating nationally-ranked West Virginia 31-14.

Miami had 10 players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors in 2016, while quarterback Brad Kaaya became Miami's all-time passing yards leader under his tutelage. Freshman wide receiver Ahmmon Richards broke the 31-year-old freshman receiving record at Miami originally set by Michael Irvin, while sophomore running back Mark Walton became the 11th 1,000-yard rusher in program history.

In addition, four Hurricanes earned freshman All-America honors under Richt's watchful eye.

At the conclusion of the regular season, Miami was ranked No. 20 nationally in total defense (up from No. 69 a season ago), No. 9 in yards allowed per play (No. 86 in 2015), No. 12 in scoring defense (No. 77 in 2015), No. 5 in tackles for loss (No. 105 in 2015) No. 22 in offensive yards per play (No. 48 in 2015), No. 37 in offensive touchdowns (No. 80 in 2015), No. 37 in scoring offense (No. 71 in 2015) and No. 22 in team sacks (No. 70 in 2015).

Richt, born in Omaha, Neb., and raised in Boca Raton, Fla., returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Georgia football program for the previous 15 years. He compiled a 145-51 overall record and an 85-40 mark in Southeastern Conference play, won two SEC championships, six SEC East titles and nine bowl games and finished the season in the Associated Press Top-10 rankings seven times.

Richt's .736 winning percentage ranks fifth-best among active FBS head coaches. Richt is one of only seven head coaches in SEC history to record four straight 10-win seasons (2002-05).

During his tenure on the sidelines in Athens, 77 of Richt's players were selected in the NFL Draft over the last 14 years, including eight chosen in the 2002 and 2013 NFL Drafts – the most Georgia players ever selected in a single year.

Off the field, Richt places a strong emphasis on academics and 292 Georgia players earned their degrees during his tenure.

Richt was the 2013 recipient of the Stallings Award given for commitment to humanitarian and community service efforts, and in 2010, he was named to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees.

Before his arrival at Georgia, Richt spent seven seasons as the offensive coordinator at Florida State. In his time in Tallahassee, the Seminoles finished in the nation's top five in scoring offense on five occasions, top 12 in total offense five times and top 12 in passing offense five times.

The 2000 team, which played in the National Championship game against Oklahoma, finished the regular season ranked first nationally in total offense (549.0 ypg), first in passing offense (384.0 ypg), and third in scoring offense (42.4 ppg).

Richt sent six FSU quarterbacks into the NFL between 1987 and 2000. In 2000, Richt coached Chris Weinke to the Heisman Trophy, and in 1991, he coached Casey Weldon to the runner-up for the Heisman. Brad Johnson (now Richt's brother-in-law), was a Pro Bowl selection for Washington in 2000 and led the Tampa Bay Bucs to the Super Bowl title in 2003. Other Richt pro protégés include Danny Kanell (New York Giants), Danny McManus (Kansas City Chiefs) and Peter Tom Willis (Chicago Bears).

Richt played quarterback for the Miami Hurricanes under legendary head coach Howard Schnellenberger.

He spent most of his career at Miami as a backup to Pro Football Hall of Famer and former Buffalo Bills star Jim Kelly. In one of Richt's years at Miami, his teammates included Kelly, Vinny Testaverde and Bernie Kosar and quarterbacks coach Earl Morrall.

Richt is married to the former Katharyn Francis of Tallahassee. The couple has four children – Jonathan, David, Zach, and Anya. Jon, the Miami quarterbacks coach, was married to the former Anna Cearley, in May 2010.
