### MIAMI LOOKS FOR FIRST WIN AT KENAN MEMORIAL STADIUM

- ▶ The Miami Hurricanes will play in their second consecutive road game when they head to North Carolina's Kenan Memorial Stadium on Saturday. The game will start at 12:30 p.m. and will be televised on the ACC Network
- ▶ Miami's leading tackler Sean Spence has been named the College Football Performance Awards Honorable Mention Linebacker of the Week in three consecutive weeks. The senior first earned the honor in Miami's loss to Kansas State after he tied a career high with 14 tackles with a sack and 2.5 tackles for loss. His second honor came after recording a team-leading eight tackles against Bethune-Cookman. He again earned the distinction after his 13 tackle, 2.0 for loss at Virginia Tech. On the year, Spence has tallied a team-best 41 tackles, 22 of those solo. Nationally, Spence ranks 15th in tackles and is tied for fourth with 1.75 tackles for loss per game.
- ▶ For his performance against Virginia Tech, Spence was one of nine players named as the ACC Football Players of the Week, as announced by the Atlantic Coast Conference on Monday. The Co-Linebacker of the Week Award is the first conference award for the Canes this season.
- ▶ Senior Jacory Harris has passed for 837 yards this season with nine touchdowns and only three interceptions. He already has cemented his place in the Miami record books as he is likely to surpass everyone but Ken Dorsey in most statistical categories. Harris is also moving up the career charts among ACC quaterbacks. With his 267-yard passing performance against Virginia Tech, Harris passed the Hokies' Tyrod Taylor for 24th place in the conference with 7,177 for his career. Harris' 59 career touchdown passes put him in a 9th-place tie with NC State's Jamie Barnette. The Miami native ranks 10th nationally with a 169.57 pass efficiency.
- ▶ Redshirt sophomore running back Lamar Miller became the first Miami running back to reach 100 yards rushing in the first five games of a season after he recorded 166 against Virginia Tech. Miller currently ranks third nationally in rushing yards per game at 135.4.

- ▶ Miller leads the Atlantic Coast Conference with 135.4 rushing yards per game.
- ▶ Miller ranks third nationally in rushing yards per game, trailing only LaMichael James (Oregon) and Ray Graham (Pittsburgh).
- ▶ Through the first four games of the season, Miller was the only back in America with a rush of 40-yards or more in every game. He did not extend that streak at Virginia Tech, but did have runs of 37 and 30 yards.
- ▶ Of his 11 career rushes/receptions of 25-yards or more, nine have come after halftime.
- ▶ Miller recorded 166 rushing yards on 18 carries against Virginia Tech, posting his fifth-straight game with at least 100 yards rushing. Miller is the first Cane to open the season with five-straight 100-yard rushing games. Willis McGahee started the 2002 season with 100-plus in four of the first five games. The last time a Cane recorded five-straight 100-yard rushing games was Clinton Portis in 2001.
- ▶ Miller has nine plays of 25-yards or longer this season: seven rushes and two kick returns.
- ▶ Miller has enjoyed playing the Virginia Tech Hokies. He has 329 career rushing yards against VT. In 2010 he had 163 and in 2011 he had 166.
- ▶ Until the Ohio State game (184 yards), Miller's output against Tech was a career best. The Hokies' run defense came into the 2011 meeting ranked No. 4 nationally against the run, giving up only 58.20 yards on the ground.
- ▶ Miller joins former Cane Tyrone Moss (2003-06) with seven career 100-yard rushing games. Edgerrin James (1995-98) is the all-time leader with 15 games of 100 or more yards on the ground.

#### When IT COUNTS

▶ You can only bottle up the electric Lamar Miller for so long. His career shows that the second half is clearly Miller Time. Not only do his biggest plays (especially runs) come in the second half, but 60 percent of his career yards have come after intermission.

- ▶ Miami is looking for its first-ever win in Chapel Hill.
- ▶ The all-time series stands with the Canes trailing 8-6.
- ▶ The Hurricanes took the last meeting in a convincing 33-10 home victory in 2010.

#### A CANES WIN OVER THE TAR HEELS WOULD...

- ▶ Give the Hurricanes their first road victory of the season.
- ▶ Give Al Golden his first road victory as head coach of the Hurricanes.
- ▶ Give Al Golden his first Atlantic Coast Conference victory.

#### The **COACHES**

▶ Al Golden is in his first year as Miami's head coach and owns an overall record of 29-37. Interim Tar Heels head coach Everett Withers is currently in his first season overall with a record of 5-1.

## Scouting THE TAR HEELS

- ▶ North Carolina enters Saturday's game with an overall record of 5-1 and a brand new coach at the helm in interim head coach Everett Withers. The Tar Heels walked away with a 14-7 victory in last week's slugfest with Louisville.
- ▶ The Tar Heels are sporting the third-most efficient passing game in the nation with sophomore quarterback Bryn Renner completing 74.4% of his passes for 1,305 yards and 12 scores.
- ▶ Freshman running back Giovani Bernard leads the ACC in rushing touchdowns with eight while averaging 109.5 yards per game.
- ▶ Bryn Renner's favorite target, senior wide receiver Dwight Jones, has the second-most touchdown grabs in the nation with seven on 37 catches for 605 yards.
- ▶ North Carolina's leader on defense is the menacing senior linebacker Zach Brown who leads the team with 42 takedowns, five for a loss, with 2.5 sacks along with an interception and a forced fumble.

#### Up NEXT...

▶ The Hurricanes return to Coral Gables for a two-game home stand at Sun Life Stadium. First up are the Yellow Jackets of Georgia Tech (10/22), followed by a matchup under Thursday night lights against the Virginia Cavaliers (10/27).

#### Streak **CONTINUES**

- ▶ Former Hurricanes and current proCanes Santana Moss (Washington), Jimmy Graham (New Orleans), Devin Hester (Chicago), Greg Olsen (Carolina) and Frank Gore (San Francisco) all scored touchdowns in Week 4 of the NFL season.
- ▶ At least one former Cane has now scored a touchdown every NFL week since Week 15 of the 2002 season a span of 143 straight weeks.

#### Welcome **BACK**

- ▶ Junior safety Ray-Ray Armstrong made his presence felt immediately in his first game since returning from a four-game suspension at Virginia Tech. In the first half, Armstrong recorded six tackles and recovered a Logan Thomas fumble in the second quarter. For the game, Armstrong was in on seven tackles.
- ▶ DL Olivier Vernon will be required to sit out one more contest.

#### Spence, WALFORD AND MILLER EARN WEEKLY AWARDS

- ▶ Miami's Sean Spence, Clive Walford and Lamar Miller have garnered national honors for their performances in Miami's tough 38-35 loss to Virginia Tech Saturday at Lane Stadium.
- ▶ Spence, who had team-best 13 tackles, was recognized among his peers at the linebacker position for the third time this season. He now has a team-best 41 total tackles this year despite missing the opener, also recorded 2.0 tackles for a loss against the Hokies. Spence ranks second in the ACC with a 10.6 tackles per game average.
- Walford earned praise after recording a team-high four catches for 66 yards from his tight end position. The redshirt freshman, came into Saturday's game with just three career receptions, more than doubling that total by game's end. His 66 yards receiving also was a career-best, surpassing his previous high of 11 yards against Bethune-Cookman.
- ▶ Miller racked up 166 rushing yards on 18 carries while also catching his first career touchdown. Miller eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the fifth consecutive game, becoming just the fourth Hurricane in program history to accomplish the feat. The Miami native now leads the conference with 135.4 rushing yards per game ranking third nationally.

- **913**—Total rushing yards by Miami to rank third in the ACC behind Georgia Tech (2163) and Virginia Tech (1152).

#### Travis BENJAMIN STEPPING UP

- ▶ Senior WR/PR/KR Travis Benjamin is putting up some gaudy numbers this season. The Belle Glade, Fla. native is currently ranks fifth nationally in punt return yardage with 18.40 yards per return.
- ▶ Benjamin only recorded one catch against Virginia Tech, but he made it count, as he caught a Jacory Harris pass on the left sideline and raced 77 yards into the endzone. The reception was the longest of his career.
- ▶ His all-purpose yards are also on the rise. Benjamin is third on the squad with 170 receiving yards and leads all players with 85 punt return yards and 173 kick return yards. In all, he averages 145.7 yards per game, trailing only Lamar Miller's 166.2

#### A GAME OF FIRSTS - VIRGINIA TECH RECAP

- ▶ Junior safety Ray-Ray Armstrong saw his first action of the season after returning to the lineup after a four-game suspension. Armstrong recorded seven tackles and recovered a fumble.
- ▶ Freshman wide receiver Phillip Dorsett threw his first career touchdown pass, connecting with Lamar Miller on a trick play in the fourth quarter.
- ▶ Redshirt-sophomore Lamar Miller caught first career touchdown on a trick play from freshman wide receiver Phillip Dorsett.
- ▶ Redshirt-freshman tight end Clive Walford finished the game with a team-high 66 receiving yards. It's the first time a tight end finished with the most receiving yards this season.
- ▶ With his fifth-straight 100-yard rushing game, Lamar Miller became the first Cane to open a season going over the century mark five straight games.

#### Canes ROCK-TOBER

- ▶ The Canes are 194-97-8 all-time during the month of October. The Canes kicked off the month of October with a 45-14 win over Bethune-Cookman, but fell 38-35 to Virgina Tech on Saturday.
- ▶ Last year UM finished the month with a 3-2 record with wins at Clemson, at Duke and home against North Carolina. The Canes dropped a pair of contests to Florida State at home and at Virginia.

#### Honoring A LEGEND

- ▶ UM honored Russell Maryland in an on-field ceremony in the Sept. 17 contest against Ohio State to commemorate the defensive tackle's upcoming induction into the College Football Hall of Fame in December.
- ▶ Maryland finished his college career with 279 tackles, 25 tackles for losses and 20.5 quarterback sacks. He was the Jack Harding Most Valuable Player Award winner in 1990 and led the Hurricanes to four consecutive bowl berths, two national championships and an overall record of 45-3 during his career.

#### Canes OPEN NEW ERA UNDER HEAD COACH AL GOLDEN

- ▶ First-year head coach Al Golden won his second game as a Hurricane when Miami defeated Bethune-Cookman, 45-14, at Sun Life Stadium on Oct. 1.
- ▶ Golden owns an overall record of 29-37 and is in his sixth season as a head coach.
- ▶ Golden arrived in Coral Gables after spending the last five seasons as the head coach at Temple University. Over five seasons at Temple, Golden took the Owls to unprecedented heights. Before his arrival, TU had just two winning seasons over its previous 26 years and had only won 22 percent of its games over the previous 30 years. Quickly, Golden made the Owls a contender, leading the team to a combined record of 17-8 his last two years there. The 2009 season marked Temple's first winning season since 1990, and Golden was rewarded with MAC Coach of the Year honors.

#### Canes SCHEDULE AMONG THE TOUGHEST

- ▶ According to Phil Steele's College Football Preview, Miami will face the 10th-toughest schedule of any FBS school this season. Only Colorado, Iowa State, Baylor, Oregon State, LSU, Boston College, USC, Washington and Auburn face a tougher road according to the publication.
- ▶ After traveling to Maryland for the season-opener, the Canes returned home to host non-conference foes Ohio State and Kansas State and Bethune-Cookman in three consecutive weeks at Sun Life Stadium. After a tough loss at Virginia Tech, Miami will travel to North Carolina (Oct. 15). The yearly rivalry game with Florida State will also come on the road, as the Canes will travel to Tallahassee to face the Seminoles on Nov. 12.
- ▶ UM was only one of six FBS programs to play its first three games against BCS-conference opponents. The others are USC, FAU, Rice, Notre Dame and BYU.

Harris' 59 career touchdown passes rank second in school history and 9th all time among ACC passers. His career TD-to-Int ratio is 1.40-to-1.

The numbers above show that Harris is a slow starter as his TD-to-Int ratio in the opening half is just 0.93-to-1. However, in the second half, his numbers improve dramatically to 2.58-to-1.

Beyond that increase, Harris' red zone numbers are outstanding. When inside the opponent's 20-yard and facing a more condensed defense, the senior has:

That equates to an impressive 7.2-to-1 TD-to-Int ratio.

When the game is on the line and points are necessary in the red zone, Harris has proven to come through in the clutch.

#### J12 AMONG THE BEST

- ▶ Jacory Harris is among the nation's best quarterbacks with a passing efficiency of 169.57 ranking 10th nationally. Harris has connected on 62 of 92 passes with nine touchdowns and three interceptions.
- ▶ Harris entered the season ranked among Miami's top signal callers as he appears in six different career records categories.
- ▶ Harris is ranked second all-time in pass completions and touchdows thrown, while ranking third in completion percentage, attempts, passing yardage and total offense. Harris is on track to upend Ken Dorsey in two categories, needing to complete 89 passes and attempt 192 passes to surpass Dorsey as the record holder. Last season he connected on 148 passes and attempted 270.
- ▶ He moved into sole possession of second place all-time in career passing TDs on Oct. 23, 2010 when he threw touchdown passes to LaRon Byrd, Travis Benjamin and Leonard Hankerson against the Tar Heels.
- ▶ With his three TD passes against Virginia Tech, Harris moved into a tie for 9th place on the ACC's Career TD passes list with 59. The senior is now tied with Jamie Barnette (NC State 1996-99). NC State's Phillip Rivers is the all-time leader with 95.
- ▶ Harris passed Virginia Tech's Tyrod Taylor (2007-10; 7,017), with his 267-yard performance against the Hokies, for 24th place on the ACC's career passing yardage stats, as he now has 7,177 career passing yards.

#### The BUCK STOPS HERE

- ▶ Coming into the Sept. 17 game, Ohio State had not allowed a sack in any of its last 90 pass attempts, the third-longest active FBS streak at the time. The Hurricanes ended that streak at 95, as Canes defensive lineman Darius Smith sacked OSU QB Braxton Miller to end the first quarter, then freshmen defensive end Anthony Chickillo recorded his first career sack in the second half.
- ▶ The UM defense held the Ohio State quarterbacks to 4-for-18 passing, marking the lowest number of completed passes against a UM defense since the Canes held Wake Forest to just three completions in 2008. Ohio State had only four passing yards in the first half and ended the night with 35 yards.
- ▶ The Hurricanes didn't allow Ohio State to score a touchdown in the game, a feat last accomplished by Penn State in 2008.

#### UM LEADS STATE & NO. 38 IN U.S. NEWS & WORLD REPORT RANKINGS

- ▶ In the 2012 edition of the U.S. News & World Report's annual "Best Colleges" issue, released today, the University of Miami has risen to number 38 - up from 47 last year, a nine point rise. UM remains the highest ranked school in the state of Florida.
- ▶ In an impressive ascent, UM has moved up 29 slots in the last 10 years, making it one of the fastest-rising institutions among national universities in recent times. UM is the only school currently in the top 50 to move up nine spots in one year and 29 spots in the past 10 years.

#### Home SWEET SUNSHINE STATE HOME

- ▶ This Saturday's game will be the last of three games that the Canes will play outside of the Sunshine State this sea-
- ▶ Miami traveled to Maryland to open the season and will travel to North Carolina the next week.
- ▶ Nine games this season will be played in Florida, including a trip to Tallahassee to face Florida State on Nov. 12 and to Tampa for a tilt with USF on November 19.

#### Miami FOOTBALL RANKED EIGHTH NATIONALLY IN APR

▶ When the NCAA's Academic Progress Report (APR) was announced in May, the Canes' football program headlined an outstanding academic showing by the University of Miami this past school year. The football team (along with baseball, men's basketball and men's tennis) improved upon its APR score for an impressive seventh straight season. In fact, the UM football program's APR score (978) ranked eighth among all FBS schools.

#### Eight CANES GO IN 2011 NFL DRAFT

- ▶ The University of Miami's success in the NFL Draft continued this past spring, as eight Canes were selected in 2011. Orlando Franklin (2nd round to Denver), Brandon Harris (2nd round to Houston), Leonard Hankerson (3rd round to Washington), DeMarcus Van Dyke (3rd round to Oakland), Allen Bailey (3rd round to Kansas City), Colin McCarthy (4th round to Tennessee), Richard Gordon (6th round to Oakland) and Matt Bosher (6th round to Atlanta) were all taken off the board in the Top 200 picks.
- ▶ Miami's eight draftees trailed only USC (9) and North Carolina (9) for the most in the country in 2011.
- ▶ Since 2000, only Ohio State (78) and USC (77) have had more players drafted than the Canes (75).
- ▶ Miami continues to comfortably lead the nation in first round draft picks in recent years, as 26 Canes have been selected in the first round since 2000. Ohio State (17) remains a distant second.

#### Four TO ENTER UM HALL OF FAME

▶ The University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame announced on Sept. 22 that four former Hurricane football players will be among those to be enshrined in its Class of 2012. Current Baltimore Ravens Ed Reed and Bryant McKinnie as well as Rich Mercier and Ray Bellamy - the university's first African-American football player - will be enshrined into the hall on March 29, 2012.

#### ▶ Ed Reed (1998-2001)

Consensus First Team All-America and All-BIG EAST selection in 2000 and 2001... Set UM career records for interceptions (21) and interception return yards (389)... His nine interceptions in 2001 is the second-highest single-season total in UM history... Recorded eight interceptions in 2000 (third-best in UM history).

#### ▶ Bryant McKinnie (2000-2001)

Outland Trophy winner as college football's outstanding interior lineman in 2001... Named a First Team All-American by *The Football News* in 2000 and a consensus first team All-American by every national service in 2001, including the Associated Press, Football Writers Association, *The Football News*, *The Sporting News* and the Walter Camp and the National Football Foundations... The 2001 National Player of the Year by CNNSI.com... The 2001 College Football Offensive Player of the Year by The Football News... Did not allow a quarterback sack during his entire UM career.

#### ▶ Ray Bellamy (1967-1970)

Miami's first African-American football player... Endured hardships and led the way for future African-American athletes... In 1968, had 37 receptions for 549 yards and two touchdowns... Had eight receptions for 121 yards vs. Auburn in 1968... In 1969, caught 45 passes for 712 yards... Near-fatal auto accident limited his career... Was voted Miami's first African-American student body president in 1971.




