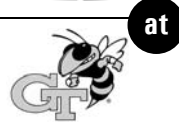

## STORY LINES

- Miami will face Georgia Tech in the Canes' third road contest in four games. Kickoff is scheduled for 3:09 p.m. EDT on several Regional Sports Networks. It will be the 18th all-time meeting between the programs, with the Yellow Jackets owning a 10-7 series edge. However, the Canes have won in each of the last three meetings.
- After defeating Bethune-Cookman, the Hurricanes are 7-0 following loss with in the Al Golden era.
- Since joining the ACC in 2004, the Hurricanes are a 34-31 in conference play and are 4-4 against GT during that span.
- Freshman RB Duke Johnson has 638 all-purpose yards through three games, putting him on pace for 2,552 yards in 12 games. The single-season all-purpose mark at Miami is 2,102 by Willis McGahee in 2002.
- True freshman DE Tyriq McCord collected the first two sacks of his career against Bethune-Cookman, giving him the team lead in that category and placing him in a fourth-place tie among ACC student-athletes.
- Miami has 14 different players that have at least one reception in the first three games of the season.
- Six of Miami's 14 scoring drives this season have needed less than two minutes.
- Senior PK Jake Wieclaw has converted on all five FG attempts and has made seven consecutive field goals overall — tied for the fifth longest FG streak at Miami. He has also connected on all 11 of his PAT attempts and had converted on 50 straight in his career — the seventh-longest PAT streak in school history.
- Nearly 70 of Miami's 2012 roster hails from Florida (67 players), including 21 that hail from Miami-Dade County.
- Four Miami Hurricanes are among 312 seniors named to the 2013 Senior Bowl Watch List, the nation's premier all-star game announced August 23. Senior RB Mike James, DB Brandon McGee, DT Darius Smith and S Vaughn Telemaque represent the Hurricanes on the Senior Bowl's inaugural watch list.

- Saturday's meeting with Georgia Tech will be broadcast regionally in several markets, including: FS Carolinas, FS South, Sun Sports, Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, NESN, FS Tennessee, FS San Diego, FS Arizona, FS Prime Ticket, FS Houston, FS North Plus, FS Southwest and FS Wisconsin will each carry the 3 p.m. EDT contest.
- Miami's Oct. 6 game against Notre Dame in Chicago will be televised nationally at 7:30 p.m. EDT on NBC.

## QUICK HITS

- Through three games, 17 freshmen have seen action for the Miami Hurricanes, including 14 true freshmen.
- Five freshmen have started at least one game for the Miami Hurricanes — true freshman RT **Ereck Flowers**, true freshman RB **Duke Johnson**, true freshman WR **Malcolm Lewis**, true freshman S **Deon Bush** and redshirt freshman LB **Eddie Johnson**.
- In the first 15 games of the **AI Golden** era, Miami has used 11 different defensive starting lineups.
- Notable Miami ACC statistical rankings: 2nd in kickoff returns (28.86), 4th in rushing offense (154.33), 5th in net punting (38.85), 5th in turnover margin (.00) and 6th in scoring offense (30.67).
- Notable Miami NCAA statistical rankings: 15th in kickoff returns, 41st in net punting, t54th in turnover margin, 58th in scoring offense and 68th in rushing offense.
- **Duke Johnson** ACC statistical rankings: 1st amongst all-purpose runners (212.67); 1st in scoring (12.00); 2nd in kickoff returns (33.89) and 4th in rushing (82.67)
- **Duke Johnson** NCAA statistical rankings: 2nd amongst all-purpose runners; t9th in scoring; 11th in kickoff returns and 57th in rushing.
- Freshman DE **Tyriq McCord** is tied for fourth in the ACC and tied for 58th nationally in sacks per game (.67).
- Senior PK **Jake Wieclaw** is tied for third in the ACC and tied for 15th nationally in FG per game (1.67).
- Senior P **Dalton Botts** ranks fifth in the ACC and 51st nationally in punting (41.38).
- Sophomore WR **Phillip Dorsett** ranks fifth in the ACC and tied for 57th nationally in punt return average (6.33).

## GEORGIA TECH SERIES HISTORY

- Saturday will mark the 18th series meeting, which dates back to 1955.
- In last season's meeting, then-freshman LB **Denzel Perryman** recorded his career-first sack, a three-yard loss for the Yellow Jackets. In the fourth quarter, Perryman forced a fumble, also the first of his career. Perryman tied his then-career high of seven tackles.
- Miami has won the last three meetings by a combined score of 92-34.

## A WIN BY MIAMI WOULD...

- Give the Hurricanes their fourth consecutive victory over Georgia Tech, taking the three meetings by a combined score of 92-34.
- Give the Hurricanes a 2-0 record in ACC play, with both coming on the road.
- Give the Hurricanes their first 2-0 ACC start since 2009.
- Give the Hurricanes their first 3-1 start to the season since 2010.

## #ROOKIECANES

- In Miami's third game of the season, 16 freshmen (14 true freshmen) played against Bethune-Cookman.
- True freshman OL **Ereck Flowers** made his third consecutive start at right tackle, while RB **Duke Johnson** started for the second time in three games. On the defensive side of the ball, redshirt freshman LB **Eddie Johnson** made his second start and redshirt freshman **Deon Bush** made his career-first start.
- WR **Malcolm Lewis** recorded two catches against B-CU and also returned a kick 39 yards.
- RB **Duke Johnson** is the first Miami player to score four TDs in a game since Tyrone Moss did in 2005 against North Carolina. Entering Week 3, only four players in the NCAA had recorded four TDs in a game in 2012.
- In the second quarter vs. B-CU, true freshman DE **Tyriq McCord** collected his first-career sack, a three-yard loss for the Wildcats. He added a second sack in the fourth quarter, a 12-yard setback to end the game. McCord ended the contest with five tackles.
- In his first start, S **Deon Bush** made three solo tackles and had a pass break-up.

## A GAME OF FIRSTS

- True freshman S **Deon Bush**, former quarterback **A.J. Highsmith** (now S) and true freshman WR **Malcolm Lewis** each made their career-first starts against Bethune-Cookman.
- In the second quarter, true freshman DE **Tyriq McCord** collected his first-career sack, a three-yard loss for the Wildcats. He added a second sack in the fourth quarter, a 12-yard setback to end the game.

## #DUUKE NOT SLOWING DOWN

- True freshman RB **Duke Johnson** is the first Miami player to score four TDs in a game since **Tyrone Moss** in 2005 against North Carolina. Only four players in the NCAA had recorded four TDs in a game in 2012. Johnson is now averaging 14.5 yards per play.
- In the first quarter against B-CU, Johnson returned a kickoff 95 yards for Miami's first score of the game. The return tied **Tremain Mack** (at Syracuse, 1996) for the eighth-longest kickoff return in Hurricanes history. It was Miami's third kickoff returned for a touchdown since 2005. In 2005 against Temple, **Devin Hester** had a 100-yard kickoff return and **Lamar Miller** notched an 88-yard kickoff return at Ohio State, Sept. 11, 2010.
- Johnson ranks second nationally with 212.67 all-purpose yards per game. That total is 67 yards per contest more than Maryland's **Stefon Diggs**, who ranks second in the Atlantic Coast Conference.
- Johnson's 643 yards on the season account for 40 percent of the Canes' 1,602 total all-purpose yardage. In FBS football so far this season, 833 players have at least one touchdown. Of those, only two have scored more than Miami's **Duke Johnson**.
- In FBS football so far this season, 833 players have at least one touchdown. Of those, only two have scored more than Miami's Johnson. Oregon's **De'Anthony Thomas** Fresno State's and **Robbie Rouse** each have seven.\*
- Johnson is the second player to have a receiving, rushing and return TD in a game this season. **Giovani Bernard** (UNC) also did.\*
- The 2011 Hurricanes' offense/special teams scored a total of four touchdowns from 50 or more yards. After only three games, Johnson already has four 50-plus yard TDs.\*
- Against Boston College in the season-opener, Johnson became the first UM freshman RB to rush for 100 or more yards in first college game since **Clinton Portis** in 1999.

- Junior **Allen Hurns** leads all receivers with 113 receiving yards on the season, while WR **Phillip Dorsett** leads UM with 12 receptions.

**TURN 'EM OVER**

- Through three games, the Canes have forced five turnovers — three interceptions and two fumble recoveries — and are on pace for 20 on the season. In 2011, Miami forced on three turnovers through the season's first three games and ended the season with only 15 takeaways.

**FOUR CANES NAMED TO SENIOR BOWL WATCH LIST**

- Four Miami Hurricanes are among 312 seniors named to the 2013 Senior Bowl Watch List, the nation's premier all-star game announced August 23. Senior RB **Mike James**, DB **Brandon McGee**, DT **Darius Smith** and S **Vaughn Telemaque** represent the Hurricanes on the Senior Bowl's inaugural watch list.
- The top 100 seniors in the nation will be invited to participate in the 2013 Senior Bowl, which is set for Sat., Jan. 26 at Mobile's Ladd-Peebles Stadium. Appearing on the watch list is not a requirement for a player to earn a Senior Bowl invitation.
- The SEC led all conferences with 71 players on the list. The Big Ten had the second-highest amount of honorees with 46, followed by the ACC with 43.

**TRIO ON PRESEASON WATCH LISTS**

- Junior WR **Allen Hurns** is one of 49 college receivers on 2012 Biletnikoff Award Preseason Watch List — given to the nation's top receiver. Hurns, a native of Carol City, Fla., had a breakout season as a sophomore recording 31 receptions for 415 yards in 2011.
- Senior P **Dalton Botts** is one the Ray Guy Award Watch List (nation's best punter) and senior PK **Jake Wieclaw** earned placement on the Lou Groza Award Watch List (nation's best placekicker).
- Botts, who served as the Hurricanes' punter in all 12 games in 2011 as a junior, finished second in the ACC with a 42.7 yards-per-punt average. Wieclaw converted on 11-of-14 field goals and all 29 PATs in his first season as the starting placekicker to merit status as a Lou Groza Award Semifinalist in 2011.

**FLORIDA-GROWN TALENT**

- Nearly of 70 of the Miami Hurricanes' 2012 roster hails from the Sunshine State (67 players), including 21 that hail from Miami-Dade County.

**JAMES NOMINATED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM**

- Senior RB **Mike James** is one of 52 nominees for the 2012 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. As one of college football's most prestigious off-the-field honors, the award recognizes a select group of college football players committed to making a difference in their communities.
- James has played in every game for the Hurricanes the past three seasons (38) and was named Miami's 2011 Strength Training Athlete of the Year. The Haines City, Fla., native was second on the team with eight total touchdowns in 2011, and has reached the end zone 13 times in his career.
- James is working toward a degree in sport administration with a minor in sociology.
- Since coming to Coral Gables in 2009, James has been involved with several community service groups and initiatives, including the Annual University of Miami Marrow Donor Drive, Empowered Youth, The Ronald McDonald House, The Miami Rescue Mission, Rushing the Community and Canes on Patrol.
- In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved and committed to working with a charitable organization, service group or community service while maintaining a strong academic standing.

**MIAMI FOOTBALL RECOGNIZED FOR OUTSTANDING GSR**

- The University of Miami was one of only 17 institutions recognized for an outstanding NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of over 90 percent for their football student-athletes in the latest six-year window.
- The GSR is based on a six-year graduation window for student-athletes which is a change from the five-year window used by the CFA and AFCA. The GSR was developed by the NCAA as part of its academic reform initiative to more accurately assess the academic success of student-athletes. The GSR holds institutions accountable for transfer students, unlike the federal graduation rate. The GSR also accounts for midyear enrollees.
- Only sixteen other institutions — Air Force, Army, Boise State, Boston College, Central Florida, Duke, Florida, Iowa, Miami (Ohio), Navy, Northern Illinois, Northwestern, Notre Dame, Penn State, Rice, Stanford — achieved a rate of 90 percent or better.

**GSR SCORES SHOW CONTINUED SUCCESS OF MIAMI ATHLETICS**

- In what has become an annual upward trend, student-athletes at the University of Miami continue to excel in the classroom at a record pace. According to the NCAA's Graduation Success Rates (GSR), Miami established a new athletics department-wide record with a GSR of 89 percent.
- In 2010-11, the athletics department-wide GSR was at its then-record high of 86 percent.
- The athletics department has exceeded the NCAA average for GSR in each of the last seven years.

## KENNEDY ENSHRINED IN PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

- Former All-American **Cortez Kennedy** was officially enshrined into the Pro Football Hall of Fame on August 4. The defensive tackle is the fifth Hurricane to earn the honor, joining **Jim Otto** (1980), **Ted Hendricks** (1990), **Jim Kelly** (2002) and **Michael Irvin** (2007) in Canton.
- Kennedy registered 58 sacks and scored one touchdown on a fumble recovery in his 11-season career with the Seattle Seahawks. The No. 3 overall pick in the 1990 NFL Draft, Kennedy had a streak of 116 games played, earned selection to eight Pro Bowls (1992-97, 1999, 2000) and missed just nine games out of a possible 176 in his career.
- As a senior defensive tackle in 1989, he emerged as a dominant force on what many considered to be the nation's top defensive line unit. Kennedy started all 12 games and his tenacious defense helped lead UM to a 11-1 season, a victory in the Sugar Bowl over Alabama and the 1989 National Championship. He earned second team AP All-American honors.

## 'MAD STORK' ON ACC LEGENDS CLASS OF 2012 ROSTER

- Former Hurricanes DE and Pro Football Hall of Fame DE **Ted Hendricks** is a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference's Class of 2012 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game Legends.
- Hendricks, known as the "Mad Stork" for his tall (6-7), angular build and his dominating defensive play, started three seasons at defensive end for the Miami Hurricanes under coach Charlie Tate. A three-time All-America for the Hurricanes, he earned consensus, first-team All-America honors in 1967 and 1968, and led Miami to a 20-11-1 record. He ended his collegiate career as Miami's all-time leading tackler with 318 hits in 1968. That year, he was named UPI National Lineman of the Year and finished 5th in the Heisman Trophy balloting.
- He went on to a spectacular 15-year NFL career as an outside linebacker playing in 215 consecutive games with the Baltimore Colts, Green Bay Packers, Oakland and L.A Raiders. During his time in the NFL, he helped lead his teams to four Super Bowl championships, was an eight-time Pro Bowl selection, four times selected as an All-Pro and five times named second-team All-Pro. He was inducted into the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame in 1987 and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1990. He was named to the NFL's 75th Anniversary All-Time team and to the NFL's All-Decade team of the 1970's.
- He was inducted into the University of Miami Hall of Fame in 1980, to its Ring of Honor in 1997 and had his jersey number—number 89—retired, also in 1997.
