Coach Jim Larrañaga ranks in the top 60 on the list of winningest coaches all-time, and top 15 amongst active coaches vs. major schools. After leading Miami to the 2013 NCAA Sweet 16 and winning the school's first ACC regular season and tournament championships, Larrañaga was honored as the AP, Naismith, USBWA Henry Iba, Adolph Rupp Cup and ACC Coach of the Year.

Head coach Jim Larrañaga has a 576-386 overall record in his 32nd season as a head coach. He is 106-52 in his fifth season at the University of Miami, with a 45-31 mark in ACC play.

THE SERIES

Miami is 5-17 in the all-time series against Duke, which dates back to the 1962-63 season. The Canes are 3-7 at home against the Blue Devils, 2-8 on the road and 0-2 at neutral sites. Under Coach L, Miami is 3-2 against Duke, 1-1 at home and 2-1 on the road. Miami won the last matchup with Duke, defeating the Blue Devils, 90-74, on Jan. 13, 2015 at the Cameron Indoor Stadium.

Since Coach L's arrival at Miami in 2011-12 ...

\* Miami is one of two teams in the country to beat Duke three-or-more times (Notre Dame four times).

\* Duke has five losses by 16-plus - two of them are to Miami.

\* Duke is 2-5 when allowing its opponent to score 90 points. Miami has two of those victories: 90-63 on Jan. 23, 2013 at Miami, and 90-74 on Jan. 13, 2015 at Duke.

\* Miami (3) and Notre Dame (4) are the only ACC schools with three-or-more wins over Duke and one of seven ACC schools with multiple wins over the Blue Devils.

\* Miami (3-2) and Notre Dame (4-1) are the only ACC schools with a winning record over Duke after playing multiple games.

LARRAÑAGA BY THE NUMBERS

5 - Coach Jim Larrañaga is one of five ACC coaches with a Final Four appearance to his credit. In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the NCAA Final Four in 27 years.

6 - In 31 years of coaching, Jim Larrañaga has a winning record in the NCAA Tournament, a 7-5 mark in six appearances.

7 - Larrañaga is no stranger to the ACC. In his seven seasons as an assistant coach at Virginia, the Cavaliers participated in the NCAA Final Four in 1981 and 1984, won three ACC Championships and finished in the Top 5 of the rankings.

10 - The 2015-16 marks the 10th anniversary of Larrañaga's Cinderella run to the 2006 NCAA Final Four with George Mason. Both associate head coach Chris Caputo and director of operations James Johnson were on that GMU staff.

15 - Larrañaga has made 15 postseason appearances in the past 26 years, including six NCAA tournaments.

32 - Larrañaga is in his 32nd year as a head coach and has successfully transitioned three institutions into successful programs: Miami, Bowling Green and George Mason.

500 - Coach L is one of five ACC coaches with 500 or more wins.

LARRAÑAGA - WHY MIAMI?

Along with returning to the best basketball conference in the country, Coach L had a few personal reasons for accepting the head coaching job at Miami. Coach's grandfather was from Cuba, where he produced the Larrañaga [lare-en-YAH-ga] cigar. Coach's father was raised in Key West before moving to The Bronx, N.Y., getting married and raising six children. Coach L was raised in The Bronx, but vacationed to Florida as a boy. He also has owned a house in Sarasota - which he bought from Dick Vitale's daughter - and three of his siblings have retired to Florida.

LAST TIME OUT - #15/14 MIAMI 77, WAKE FOREST 63

Ja'Quan Newton scored 18 points and No. 15 Miami overcame a flurry of misses in the paint to beat Wake Forest 77-63 on Saturday. Miami missed 11 layups and two dunks but pulled away by clamping down defensively and making 14 of 15 free throws in the final 10 minutes. The Hurricanes (15-3, 4-2) won despite shooting only 36 percent. Wake Forest (10-9, 1-6) shot 39 percent and lost its fourth straight. While the Hurricanes struggled inside, they shot 24 for 28 (86 percent) from the free throw line, outscoring the Demon Deacons there by 13 points. Sheldon McClellan had 14 points, six rebounds, five assists and three steals for Miami. Backcourt mate Angel Rodriguez added 14 points and five steals. Newton played only 25 minutes. But his jumper with 9:36 left put the Hurricanes ahead to stay, 50-48, and his three-point play during a 9-0 run helped Miami surge to a 65-51 lead. Devin Thomas had 12 points and nine rebounds for Wake Forest. Bryant Crawford had 12 points and six assists, but also had six of the Deacons' 16 turnovers. The Hurricanes held their largest lead of the first half at 31-20 before Wake Forest outscored them 13-4 in the final 3 1/2 minutes to trail only 35-33 at halftime.

Notes: Miami's 12 steals tied a season-high, set previously against Syracuse on Jan. 2 ... It was the seventh time in Miami's 10 home games this season that the Hurricanes trailed for fewer than 5 minutes. Out of 400 minutes played at home this season, Miami has trailed for only 73 minutes, 4 seconds, or 18 percent of the time ... The seven-game home winning streak is Miami's second-longest under coach Jim Larrañaga. Miami won 13 straight at home from Nov. 9, 2012 through Feb. 27, 2013 ... Miami improved to 34-3 under coach Jim Larrañaga when scoring at least 72 points at home, and 60-5 overall in that span when scoring at least 72 ... The 15-3 record matches Miami's best through 18 games since the 2001-02 season. The 2009-10 and 2012-13 teams also started 15-3 ... Miami has now won nine consecutive games that immediately precede the Hurricanes facing Duke. Miami plays host to Duke on Monday ... Miami pulled down 20 offensive rebounds, the most of the 2015-16 season. Previous high was 15 against UTRGV ... Angel Rodriguez is now one of only three active Division I players with at least 1,200 career points, 450 assists, 180 steals and 150 3-pointers. It was the 15th time in Angel Rodriguez's Miami career that he recorded at least three steals in a game. Miami is a perfect 15-0 in those games. Miami did not have a double-digit scorer until Angel Rodriguez's layup with 8:57 remaining. The Hurricanes had eight players in the scoring column at that point, six of them with at least six points.

**THE SERIES BETWEEN MIAMI AND DUKE**

Since the arrival of Jim Larrañaga at Miami, the Hurricanes have posted a 3-2 mark against Duke, earning three of UM's five all-time wins against the Blue Devils.

Miami has outscored Duke 380-357 in those five games. The Canes have made 46.1 percent (135-293) of their shots while the Blue Devils have hit only 40.4 percent (127-314). From distance, Miami is 34-93 (36.6%) and Duke is 38-123 (30.9%). The Canes have out-rebounded Duke 196-194 and scored more points in the paint (164-152).

**MIAMI VS. DUKE IN THE LARRAÑAGA ERA**

Miami has posted a 7-5 combined record against Duke (3-2) and North Carolina (4-3). In the four years prior to Coach L, the Canes were 1-12 against Duke (1-6) and North Carolina (0-6).

Miami has the most lopsided win of any ACC team over Duke (27 points) and second-most lopsided wins over Boston College (27 points), North Carolina (26 points) and Florida State (24 points).

Miami has won eight ACC games by 20 or more points: Boston College (27, 22, 22 and 21), Duke (27), North Carolina (26), Florida State (24) and Virginia Tech (24).

**McCLELLAN ONE OF TOP SHOOTING GUARDS IN THE NATION, TOP IN ACC**

Senior guard Sheldon McClellan has posted the eighth-best shooting percentage (52.0%) in the country among guards, and has the top shooting percentage among guards in the ACC, according to stats on NCAA.org on Jan. 23. McClellan's 2-point shooting percentage is 59.6 percent this season.

McClellan is currently on three national player of the year early-season watch lists: Naismith Trophy Men's College Player of the Year, Oscar Robertson Trophy for Men's National Player of the Year and Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award.

**RODRIGUEZ AMONG THE BEST**

Angel Rodriguez is now one of only three active Division I players with at least 1,200 career points, 450 assists, 180 steals and 150 3-pointers.

**JEKIRI ON THE BOARDS**

In 122 games at Miami, senior Tonye Jekiri has grabbed 781 rebounds, 10th-most in Miami history. He has improved his rebounds per game from 1.6 as a rookie to 10.0 as a senior. He also has grabbed double-digit rebounds in 33 games over the past two seasons (55 games played), after just three times in his first 67 outings.

**McCLELLAN IN THE SECOND HALF**

Sheldon McClellan averages 6.8 points per game on 47.1 percent shooting from the field and 27.3 percent from long range in the first half of games, then improves to 9.3 points in the second stanza, hitting 60.3 percent from the field and 56.7 percent from distance.

After just 6.2 ppg on 40.7 percent shooting in the first half of ACC games, McClellan averages 11.6 ppg in the second, hitting 58.6 percent of his shots.

**CANES HAVE STINGY 3-POINT DEFENSE**

In 10 of the last 11 games, Miami has held each of its opponents to less than 33.3 percent shooting per game from long range - holding them to a combined 24.0 percent mark in those 10 games - with Clemson's 43.8 percent the exception. In the first seven games, Miami averaged 41.4 percent 3-point defense. Opponents shot better than 32 percent from three in six of the first seven games. The Canes held in-state opponents Florida and Florida State to 8.3 percent and 10.5 percent from long range, respectively.

**DEWAN HUELL NAMED 2016 McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICAN**

Miami signee Devan Huell has been named a 2016 McDonald's All-American, as announced on ESPNU Jan. 17. Huell will become the fourth McDonald's All-American to play at Miami, joining Darius Rice (2000 McDonald's All-American), Steve Edwards (1992) and Tito Horford (1985). Since the inception of the McDonald's All American Game in 1977, only 38 players have hailed from the state of Florida, 11 of which were from 'The State of Miami' - Broward, Dade and Palm Beach counties. ## RECAPPING MIAMI AT DUKE, JAN. 13, 2015

\* With Miami's 16-point win at Cameron on Jan. 13, UM ended Duke's 41-game home winning streak, the longest active streak in Division I. The last team to defeat Duke at home was North Carolina on March 3, 2012, with an 18-point victory.

\* Miami also snapped Duke's 19-game ACC home game winning streak.

\* According to the Associated Press, Duke's loss to unranked Miami marked just the seventh home loss the Blue Devils have sustained in the last 242 games against unranked teams.

\* Miami's 90 points scored against Duke are the most points scored by an unranked opponent in a regulation win in Cameron Indoor Stadium since NC State's 96 points on Feb. 23, 1983.

\* Miami has dealt Duke its last two regular-season losses by 16-or-more points: 27 (90-63) on Jan. 23, 2013 at Miami, and 16 (90-74) on Jan. 13, 2015 at Duke.

\* In a span of six days, Miami's men's and women's basketball teams both beat teams ranked No. 4 in the country with the men defeating Duke by 16 points, and the women taking down Notre Dame by 15 points.

### With back-to-back wins over Duke by NC State and Miami ...

\* Duke was beaten in back-to-back regular season games for the first time since 2009 (Feb. 11, 101-87 to UNC; Feb. 15, 80-74 to Boston College).

\* Duke was defeated in back-to-back games by 12+ for the first time since 1995-96 (March 8, 82-69 to Maryland; March 14, 75-40 to Eastern Michigan).

\* Coach K lost consecutive conference games by 12+ for the first time since 1982-83. That same season, Duke lost its last two games by 12+ points, including a 43-point loss in the ACC Tournament to No. 2 Virginia, where Coach Jim Larrañaga was an assistant coach.

### Miami's 16-point win over Duke ...

\* is the most lopsided loss an unranked visitor has handed to a ranked Duke team in the ACC era.

\* is the third time in the past 25 years Duke has lost a home game by more than 16 points. The other two were 88-70 vs. UNC on March 3, 2012 and 77-60 vs. NC State on Jan. 18, 1995.

\* is the Blue Devils' worst defeat since the 18-point loss to Louisville on March 31, 2013 in the NCAA Tournament.

\* is the fifth-largest home margin of defeat of Coach K's Duke career. In 526 home games (as of Jan. 13, 2015), his worst home losses are: 24 to D. Smith ('83), 20 to D. Smith ('89), 18 to R. Williams ('12), 17 to Valvano ('83), 16 to Larrañaga ('15).

## QUICK HITS

- Miami is 14-1 this season in games decided by 10-or-more points, and Coach L is 64-18 all-time at Miami in games decided by more than 10 points.

- Miami's bench has scored 25.8 points per game, including 50 against Mississippi State, 47 at La Salle, 39 vs. Charleston and 35 vs. Charlotte.

- The Canes have scored 32.9 points per game in the paint, including 50 paint points against Northeastern and La Salle, and 46 against Mississippi State.

He has knocked down at least one free throw in every game but at LaSalle.

- Davon Reed has a steal in five-straight games and six of the last seven outings. He has grabbed at least three rebounds in every game but two - vs. Charleston and at Clemson. He has hit three-or-more free throws in all but six games.

### COACH L TIES TO THE ACC

Coach Jim Larrañaga was an assistant coach at Virginia from 1979-1986, under the leadership of Terry Holland. In those seven seasons, Larrañaga helped the Cavaliers to five NCAA appearances: Final Four twice, Elite Eight once, Sweet 16 once and Round of 64 once, as well as two NIT appearances, including the Championship and Quarterfinal round.

### MIAMI HOLDS THE LEAD

In Miami's 15 victories, the Canes have led for all but 49 minutes and 45 seconds combined. The Canes trailed 19:49 to Syracuse, 12:00 vs. Princeton, 4:59 vs. UTRGV 4:14 at Boston College and 3:59 to Nebraska, added to 2:09 vs. Wake Forest, 1:21 vs. Louisiana, 0:39 vs. Charleston, 0:22 vs. Mississippi State and 0:13 vs. Florida. Miami hasn't trailed in five games - against Utah, Butler, Charlotte, La Salle and Florida State.

In Miami's 15 wins, the Canes have only trailed after the first half against Syracuse, Nebraska and Princeton. The Cornhuskers held a lead with 3:39 left in overtime, the Orange led by one with 7:07 left in regulation and the Tigers led with 6:02 left in regulation.

### LARRAÑAGA AMONG THE BEST IN COLLEGE BASKETBALL

Entering the 2015-16 season, Coach Larrañaga was tied for 12th on the list of Winningest Active Coaches at Major Schools and is tied for 57th on the NCAA's list of All-Time Winningest Coaches. See page 10 of the notes for a complete listing.

### JAN. 13, 2015 - MIAMI 90, NO. 4 DUKE 74

Angel Rodriguez scored 24 points and Miami shot 67 percent after halftime to upset No. 4 Duke 90-74 on Tuesday night, snapping the Blue Devils' 41-game home winning streak. Manu Lecomte had a career-high 23 points for the Hurricanes (12-4, 2-1 Atlantic Coast Conference), who dominated the final 20 minutes with their pesky defense and attacking dribble penetration that the Blue Devils just couldn't defend. Trailing 35-34 at the break, Miami shot 18-for-27 after halftime and hit 6 of 9 3-pointers - a stunningly one-sided show starring a team that lost by 28 points at home to Eastern Kentucky on Dec. 19. Duke (14-2, 2-2) hadn't lost at Cameron Indoor Stadium since March 2012 and hadn't lost consecutive regular-season games since February 2009. But much like Sunday's loss at against North Carolina State, the Blue Devils were unable to slow a hot-shooting team nor keep up at their own offensive end. Yet Miami offered up another harsh lesson for a team that was looking dominant only a few weeks ago. Miami led by as many as 20 late and scored 56 second-half points. Duke hadn't trailed by more than six in a game before the past two games.

THE BUC IS SOLD OUT

In just his fifth season in Coral Gables, Jim Larrañaga and Miami have SOLD OUT the season ticket allotment for all home games this year at the BankUnited Center. This is the first time in Miami athletics history a team has sold out their season. Due to the season ticket sales, seats will not be available on a single-game basis. In Coach Larrañaga's fifth season at The U, fans have bought 5,500 season tickets, more than doubling the total number of season tickets sold in his first season in Coral Gables. When Coach L began his reign in Miami, fans bought 2,251 season tickets for the 2011-12 campaign. After a record-breaking season on the court in 2012-13, season tickets peaked at 3,674 for 2013-14.

CRUZ UCEDA FOR THREEEE

Senior Ivan Cruz Uceda is knocking down 50 percent of his shots from long range, hitting 30-60 in 18 games. Due to his limited made shots, he does not hit the minimum of 2.5 made per game for NCAA rankings, but his 50 percent would place him tied for fifth in the nation. He is also knocking down 53.6 percent of his shots from the field. Cruz Uceda hit just 37.4 percent from the field and 33.9 percent from three as a junior.

BODY CHANGES FOR CRUZ UCEDA AND JEKIRI

Seniors Ivan Cruz Uceda and Tonye Jekiri have spent the summer in the weight room. Cruz Uceda has dropped 20 pounds from 237 to 217, and his body fat has slimmed down from 24 percent to nine percent in just a year in Miami. Jekiri has added 20 pounds to his 7-foot frame, now weighing 250 pounds.

LARRAÑAGA WINS 100TH AT MIAMI

The Canes' victory over Charleston marked win No. 100 for Head Coach Jim Larrañaga at the University of Miami. Needing only 150 games, Coach Larrañaga is the fastest to accomplish the feat in program history. Bruce Hale was previously the Miami coach who won 100 games the quickest, earning 100 victories in just 159 games. Hart Morris took 163 games, Frank Haith 174 and Leonard Hamilton took 230 games.

COACHING COORDINATORS FOR MIAMI

Miami's assistant coaching staff is set up in a coordinator system, with Jamal Brunt as the offensive coordinator, Chris Caputo manning the defense and Adam Fisher handling the scout for every opponent. James Johnson is the Dean of Discipline.

**AMONG UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI COACHES, LARRAÑAGA ...**

- has the highest winning percentage of a Miami coach in the NCAA Tournament, a .667 mark with a 2-1 record.
- is one of two Miami coaches to post three 20-win seasons. Larrañaga has recorded three 20-win seasons in four years at Miami.
- .647 winning percentage is the best mark since Bruce Hale posted a .663 mark from 1955-67, including three seasons led by Rick Barry.
- has led the Canes to 41 ACC wins in just four seasons. Miami won 43 ACC games the previous seven seasons.
- Under Coach L, Miami has posted three of the Canes' top five finishes in ACC play, including the 2013 championship, tied for fourth in 2012 and tied for sixth in 2015. In 2008, Miami tied for fifth in league play, and in 2005, tied for sixth.
- In four seasons under Coach L, Miami has tallied six wins in the ACC Tournament. In the previous seven seasons, Miami went 6-7.
- In two NIT appearances under Coach L, Miami is 5-2 for a .714 winning percentage. In Miami's other 10 NIT appearances combined, the Canes went 6-10 for a .375 winning percentage.

**DID YOU KNOW ...**

- Coach L became the first Miami coach to win 20+ games in his first two seasons at UM and only the third of 12 UM coaches to post three 20-win seasons.
- Former Cane Rick Barry was named one of the Greatest Players in NBA History.
- Miami native and former Cane James Jones won the 2010-2011 NBA All-Star Weekend 3-Point Contest and the NBA Championship in the 2011-2012 and 2012-13 seasons.
- Six-time NBA All Star Amar'e Stoudemire enrolled at UM in 2013 and took classes to earn his bachelor's degree.
- UM is in its 12th season in the ACC.
- Coach L led the George Mason Patriots to the 2006 Final Four with big wins over some of basketball's elite teams such as Michigan State, UNC and UConn. He was the first coach to take a mid-major to a Final Four in 27 years (Penn '79) when his team advanced in 2006.
- In 14 years at George Mason, Larrañaga led the Patriots to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999), including the 2006 Final Four.
- Miami basketball received APR (Academic Progress Rate) Public Recognition Awards for being among the top 10 percent in APR in its sport. Miami ranks in the top 10 percent NCAA men's basketball with a 990 APR.
- The Miami Department of Athletics recorded a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 89 percent. Miami's department-wide GSR is 16th overall among FBS programs. UM has exceeded the NCAA average GSR in each of the last 10 years.
- The Canes have averaged 20.0 wins over the last 11 seasons.
- The Hurricanes have made at least one trey in 921 of 927 games since the NCAA adopted the 3-point shot in 1986. The last time Miami was held without a 3-pointer was Feb. 26, 2014 at Virginia.
- Miami has held 780 of its last 781 opponents to less than 100 points. North Carolina was the last team to score 100+, defeating UM 105-64 on Jan. 31, 2007.

**MIAMI BASKETBALL – THE EARLY YEARS**

The University of Miami basketball program was dormant for 14 years from 1971-1985. In 1983 Director of Athletics Sam Jankovich announced the resurrection of men's basketball at Miami, with the reinstatement vote by the UM Board of Trustees on Oct. 12, 1983. Head coach Bill Foster was hired March 21, 1984, adding assistants Clint Bryant, Seth Greenberg and Cesar Odio by July 1. Tim Harvey was the staff's first recruit, a 6-10, 240-pound center from Plainfield, N.J., who transferred from Georgia Tech. On Oct. 15, 1984 the first men's basketball practice in 12 years was held on the patio in the center of campus, viewed by more than 200 students. Miami defeated The Citadel, 85-77, on Nov. 22, 1985, in the first game of the new era of UM basketball.

**McCLELLAN ON THREE NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LISTS**

Senior shooting guard Sheldon McClellan is turning heads across the country, earning nods on a trio of watch lists for national player of the year awards. He is one of 50 players on the Naismith Trophy Men's College Player of the Year early season watch list, one of 33 players on the watch list for the Oscar Robertson Trophy for Men's National Player of the Year and is among the 20 players named to the watch list for the 2016 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award.

**MIAMI'S STARTERS SHOW EXPERIENCE**

Miami starts two redshirt seniors, one true senior, a redshirt junior and a true junior. Those players have now combined for 329 career starts and 517 games played. Sheldon McClellan has started 78 games playing in 123, Tonye Jekiri has 70 starts in 121 games, Angel Rodriguez is at 86/114, Davon Reed 48/80 and Kamari Murphy 47/80. Those five players have been on a Division I team a combined 21 seasons, as McClellan and Rodriguez are both in their fifth year on the court, Jekiri and Murphy are each in their fourth season, and Reed is a true junior. The average age of that starting five is 21.8 years old: Rodriguez - 23; McClellan - 23; Murphy - 22; Jekiri - 21; Reed - 20.

**HOMECOMING FOR RODRIGUEZ, EARNS MVP**

Senior guard Angel Rodriguez was named the Puerto Rico Tip-Off Most Valuable Player. He averaged 13.7 points and 4.0 assists, including 19 points in the championship game. The native of Cupey, P.R., just 20 minutes from San Juan, was greeted by friends and family at each game.

**MIAMI LANDS HUELL, BROWN AND MILLER**

The Miami men's basketball team landed a pair of top-30 players in Dewan Huell and Bruce Brown, and top 100 player Rodney Miller. With the addition of these three players, Miami would have six top 100 players next season: Huell (25), Brown (44), Ja'Quan Newton (52), Miller (90), James Palmer (98). Huell, at 6-10 and 218 pounds, is a five-star, top-25 power forward from Miami Norland High School. Nationally, he is ranked the No. 21 player by ESPN, No. 23 by Rivals and No. 25 by Scout. ESPN and Scout rank him fifth at his position, and Scout says he's the top player in the state of Florida, while ESPN and Rivals have him second in the state. Brown, from Wakefield, Mass., is a four-star shooting guard at Vermont Academy in Saxton's River, Vt. At 6-4 and 205 pounds, Brown is ranked No. 30 by ESPN, No. 44 per Scout and No. 49 by Rivals. Miller is a 6-foot-11-inch, 245-pound center playing prep ball at Oak Hill Academy in Virginia. A native of Laurelton, N.Y., Miller is a consensus four-star recruit, ranked No. 90 overall by Scout.com and No. 114 by Rivals.com. As a center, he is ranked No. 17 by Scout.com and No. 15 by ESPN.

**CANES SIGN TOP 10 RECRUITING CLASS**

The 2016 recruiting class of Dewan Huell, Bruce Brown and Rodney Miller is being named a top-10 recruiting class in the country, with 247Sports ranking the class No. 7, Scout at No. 8, ESPN at No. 9 and Rivals at No. 10. The 2016 class rankings top Miami's best mark from 2005, when the Canes signed four four-star recruits – Jimmy Graham, Brian Asbury, Adrian Thomas and Denis Clemente – in a class that was ranked No. 12 in the nation by Scout. In 2009, Miami's signing class was nationally ranked No. 19 by Scout and No. 24 by ESPN. That Hurricanes' heralded 2009 class was comprised of ESPN 100 picks Durand Scott, Garrus Adams and Donnavan Kirk, in addition to May signee Antoine Allen. Since 2002, Miami has signed 16 Scout.com top 100 players, including three five-star, top-25 players in DeQuan Jones (22, 2008), Huell (25) and Durand Scott (25, 2009). Since Larrañaga's arrival, his staff has signed five top-100 players in Huell (25), Brown (44), Ja'Quan Newton (52, 2014), Rodney Miller (90) and

James Palmer (98, 2014). Huell is the most lauded signee for Miami since Scott in 2009, Jones in 2008, No. 32 Guillermo Diaz in 2003 and McDonald's All-American Darius Rice in 2000.

**FOUR PLAYERS BOAST NCAA TOURNAMENT EXPERIENCE**

Senior Tonye Jekiri returns from Miami's 2012-13 ACC Championship and NCAA Sweet 16 team. Sheldon McClellan (Texas), Kamari Murphy (Oklahoma State) and Angel Rodriguez (Kansas State) also have played in the NCAA Tournament, each with their previous schools.

**MIAMI PREDICTED TO FINISH FIFTH IN ACC**

Miami was predicted to finish fifth out of 15 teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season, as announced by the league during Operation ACC Basketball in Charlotte, N.C., Oct. 28. North Carolina was picked to win the league, followed by Virginia, Duke and Notre Dame. In 2012-13, the Canes were picked to finish fifth, then won the league's regular season and tournament championship. In all four of Larrañaga's seasons at Miami, the Canes have finished the season better than predicted at ACC media day. Miami's ACC preseason poll breakdowns (votes) and finishes: 2014-15 - 10th (442) – t-6th 2008-09 - 4th (344) – t-7th 2013-14 - 12th (224) – 10th 2007-08 - 12th (153) – t-5th 2012-13 - 5th (436) – 1st 2006-07 - 11th (173) – 12th 2011-12 - 5th (455) – t-4th 2005-06 - 7th (540) – t-7th 2010-11 - 8th (305) – 9th 2004-05 - 11th (146) – t-6th 2009-10 - 10th (135) – 12th

**COACH L REUNITED WITH JAMES JOHNSON**

James Johnson is the team's director of basketball operations. Johnson, who was on Larrañaga's staff for two seasons at George Mason University, including the historic NCAA Final Four run in 2006, came to Miami after seven seasons on staff at fellow ACC school Virginia Tech, where he was the head coach for two seasons after five years as an assistant coach.

**LARRAÑAGA CONTRACT EXTENDED THROUGH 2022**

The University of Miami extended Coach Jim Larrañaga's contract through May 31, 2022, Director of Athletics Blake James announced in September 2014. Larrañaga first signed a five-year contract in April 2011, then was granted a three-year extension in 2012.
