NEWS & NOTES

#TOUGH20

Head coach Katie Meier announced the signing of three 2020 prospects to National Letters of Intent on Wednesday. The 2020 signing class features a group of immense talent in Nyayongah Gony, Paula Fraile Ruiz and Naomi Mbandu. The trio is made up of a Top-60 recruit (Gony), a junior college national champion (Mbandu) and an international standout (Fraile Ruiz).

RAINING THREES

The Caens have been particularly effective from beyond the arc, knocking down an average of 10.0 3-pointers per game this season. That number ranks 14th in the nation and second in the ACC, trailing only Syracuse (11.5 threes per game). Four Canes are shooting better than 40-percent from distance including forwards Beatrice Mompremier (.750, 3-of-4) and Brianna Jackson (.500, 1-of-2).

Miami ranks in the top five in the ACC in several statistical categories this season: scoring offense (4th - 80.5), field goal percentage (3rd - .496), 3-point field goal defense (2nd - .205), blocked shots (3rd - 6.0) and assists

PRESEASON HONORS

Beatrice Mompremier has already picked up some preseason accolades, not only earning ACC Preseason Player but she was also tabbed an Associated Press All-American. As a team, Miami was picked 18th in espnW's Preseason Top-25

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

The Hurricanes have always succeeded when playing in front of the home crowd. Miami is just eight wins away from the 500-home win mark, sitting at 492-185 (.715) all-time at home. Under Katie Meier, the Canes have historically dominated teams in Coral Gables, boasting a .732 win percentage (185-67). Over the past five years, Miami has lost just 16 games when playing at home.

the matchup

- The Hurricanes continue their non-conference homestand on Sunday, November 17 when they host the IUPUI Jaguars at the Watsco Center. Tipoff is slated for 1 p.m. and the game will air on ACC Network Extra with Alex Schwartz and Ruth Riely on the call. Fans can also listen to the game on WVUM 90.5.
- Miami and IUPUI have only met once before in program history, a Thanksgiving week contest in 2001. The Canes dominated the Jaguars, posting a 72-58 victory at home on November 23.

last time out

- The Hurricanes fed off the energy from the school kids and, for the second game in a row, junior guard Kelsey Marshall paced the Canes in scoring with 16 points in the contest. Redshirt senior Beatrice Mompremier joined Marshall with a co-game-high 16 points of her own, while seven other Canes tallied a bucket in the game.
- The Miami bench came to play on Wednesday, totaling 32 points in the game, including eight- and seven-point outings by Taylor Mason and Yasmeen Chang, respectively.
 Freshmen forwards Sydnee Roby and Brianna Jackson put in work on the defensive end, combining for a trio of blocks and nine rebounds.
- The game began as a back-and-forth battle, but Miami used a 12-2 run in the last three minutes of the first quarter to take a 25-14 lead. The Ospreys fought back in the second frame, outscoring the Canes 12-9, but it was all Miami in the second half. The Hurricanes totaled 22 points in both the third and fourth quarter to finish the game on top, 78-55.

scouting the jaguars

- The Jaguars are also 2-0 in 2019-20, coming off a 3-point win over Southern Illinois on Tuesday. Junior Morgan Allen recorded 24 points on 9-of-12 shooting, while two other Jags tallied double-figure outings.
- Four Jaguars are averaging double-digit outings this season led by redshirt Rachel McLimore (18.0 points per game). Junior Macee Williams paces IUPUI in rebounding, averaging 8.5 boards per game.
- The Jaguars are a consistent shooting team, pouring in 47.6 percent of their shots from the field this season. Beyond the 3-point arc, IUPUI holds a .385 mark.

#QueenBea

- Beatrice Mompremier returns for her redshirt senior season in 2019-20. Ahead of the season, Mompremier was named not only the 2019 ACC Preseason Player of the Year, but also an Associated Press All-American. She is just the second Hurricane in program history to earn both honors, following in the footsteps of Miami great Shenise Johnson, who received the honor as a senior in 2011-12.

knock 'em down

- Through two games, the Hurricanes are shooting 49.6 percent from the field, which ranks 23rd in the nation (third in the ACC) for field goal percentage. Six Canes are shooting above .500 this season (min. five attempts) led by freshman Brianna Jackson (.800, 4-of-5).
- The Canes are shooting .408 from 3-point range this season with junior Kelsey Marshall pacing Miami in threes made at eight. Miami has knocked down 9-plus threes in back-to-back games for the first time since Dec. 2018.

horizon league

- The Canes have squared-off with a Horizon League opponent 13 times in program history, holding a 7-6 record. Miami is 5-2 when playing a team from the Horizon League under head coach Katie Meier. Both losses during Meier's tenure were one-possession games.
- Miami's last game against a Horizon League team came on Nov. 27, 2015 when the Hurricanes tallied a 77-38 victory over Milwaukee. The Canes will be looking for their fourth straight victory over the Horizon League on Sunday.

november nuggets

- Since the beginning of the 1979-80 season, Miami has historically been successful in November games. The Hurricanes boast a .717 win-percentage in November games with a 114-45 record.
- In Meier's 14 years with the Canes, Miami holds a 73-19 record (.793) in games in November. The Hurricanes have posted two undefeated Novembers since Meier took the reins of the program going 7-0 in 2009 and again in 2015.

ciao dall'italia

- The Canes spent 10 days abroad this summer, visiting cities all across Italy. Miami played a trio of games while in Italy, posting a 2-1 record against foreign opponents.
- The Hurricanes began their trip in Rome before venturing north to Florence and then over to Venice. The trip was a mix of basketball and sightseeing as several of the Canes were abroad for the first time in their lives.
- One of the highlights of the trip was the opportunity to play against recent Miami graduates Emese Hof and Laura Cornelius, as the duo were playing for the Netherlands national team.

#tough20

- Head coach Katie Meier signed three 2020 prospects to NLIs on Wednesday:
- Nyayongah Gony: A 6-foot, 3-inch forward from Lincoln, Nebraska, Gony is ranked as the No. 56 overall player in the class of 2020 by espnW HoopGurlz. The forward comes in at No. 13 among forwards in the 2020 class and is considered the top recruit in the state of Nebraska.
- Paula Fraile Ruiz: Standing tall at 6-feet, 4-inches, Fraile Ruiz has a wealth of international experience, most recently competing at the FIBA U18 Women's European Championship – Division B in Sarajevo, Bosnia.
- Naomi Mbandu: Mbandu is currently playing basketball at Gulf Coast State College and is considered the No. 2 junior college prospect in the nation by ASGR Basketball. A native of Tobes, France, Mbandu represented her country at the 2019 FIBA U20 Women's European Championship in August.

USA basketball

- USA Basketball was full of the Canes this summer as Beatrice Mompremier represented Miami at the Pan American Games in Lima, Peru. Mompremier was one of 12 players on the U.S. team and the only ACC representative.
- The U.S. took home the silver medal from Lima after posting a 4-1 record during the competition, falling to Brazil in the gold medal game, 79-73. Mompremier started all five games, averaging 12.2 points and 7.6 rebounds across the five outings.
- Mompremier and junior Mykea Gray also had the opportunity to train with USA Basketball during their training camp in Coral Gables ahead of the AmeriCup in Puerto Rico. Training camp attendees included Sue Bird, Diana Taurasi and Tina Charles.

meier's miami

- In 14 seasons at Miami, Katie Meier has led the team to a 279-172 mark, including a 207-88 mark since 2010-11. She is one of only two coaches in Hurricane program history with over 250 career wins. Additionally, she leads all Miami women's basketball coaches in winning percentage at The U (.618).
- On June 14, 2019, UM Director of Athletics Blake James announced a one-year contract extension for Katie Meier through the 2024-25 season.

Taylor Mason's brother, Nate, was a First Team All-Big Ten pick at Minnesota in 2016-17. Beatrice Mompremier's brother, Wadly, played at Ohio for three years and at Arkansas-Little Rock for one.
- Parents: Four other Miami players have direct relatives who play(ed) basketball. Jacaira Allen's sister, Alicia Mardis, is on the team at Arkansas Tech after spending two years at Kilgore College. Brianna Jackson's father played semi-pro basketball while Sydnee Roby's mother played collegiate ball at Grambling State and Howard University. Roby's mom, Essie Washington, also played professional basketball for the Virginia Wave of the WABA.
- Cousins: Roby's cousin, Ericka Haney, started on Notre Dame's 2001 national championship team.

where we work

- After 13-plus years as the BankUnited Center, Miami's on-campus arena was renamed the Watsco Center prior to the 2016-17 season.
 Watsco has provided funding to Miami since the 1990s through its "Watsco's Kids" program, giving children in the community free access to performance arts, sports and other events at UM.
- The Miami basketball facility has undergone a multimillion-dollar renovation over the past two-plus years. The project featured upgrades to the locker rooms, student-athlete lounges, office spaces, weight room, practice facility hallways and concourse.
- Also on display are large-scale images of UM's ProCanes, as well as the newest Miami adidas gear. The players' lounge has a gaming center with couches and televisions. The walls of the practice facility show photos of celebrity Canes fans throwing up the U.

Katie Meier completed her 14th season at the helm of the Hurricanes' women's basketball program in 2018-19. A well-known and respected figure in women's basketball with 18 years of head coaching experience, Meier has worked tirelessly to put her mark on Miami's program and to build a winning tradition.

In 2018-19, Meier guided her team to a 10th consecutive postseason appearance, including an eighth trip to the NCAA Tournament in the last nine years and fifth straight NCAA Tournament bid. Miami also reached 20-plus wins for the ninth time in 10 years and double-digit ACC victories for the seventh time in nine years.

Through the 2017-18 campaign, Meier has a career record of 353-217, including a 277-172 mark at Miami.

Honors and Accolades

Meier has been recognized for her coaching success numerous times throughout her career. From being named a co-recipient of the 2013 USA Basketball National Coach of the Year award following a 9-0 record and gold medal at the 2013 FIBA U19 World Championship, to being inducted into the University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame in 2017, Meier's name has become synonymous with elite basketball.

One of the most prestigious honors bestowed on Meier came at the conclusion of the 2010-11 season when she was named the Associated Press National Coach of the Year - sharing the award with Connecticut's Geno Auriemma and Stanford's Tara VanDerveer. That season, Meier led the Hurricanes into the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2004 and coached the Canes to their first NCAA Tournament win since 1993.

The Canes entered the 2010-11 season with high internal expectations, but were picked eighth in the Preseason ACC Poll. Miami exceeded all outside expectations posting a perfect 20-0 record inside BankUnited Center and finished conference play with a 12-2 record, earning their first regular season conference title since joining the league in 2004. As a result, Meier was named the ACC Coach of the Year and later would be selected as the WBCA/RUSSELL ATHLETIC Region 2 Coach of the Year, as voted on by her peers.

During the 2011-12 season, Meier coached the Canes to their highest ranking in program history at No. 5. Miami went undefeated at home for the second consecutive season, pushing the home win streak to 40 games.

Five people who have been assistants for Meier during her head coaching career have gone on to earn Division I head coaching positions: Lynn Bria (Stetson), Amanda Butler (Florida and Clemson), Darrick Gibbs (North Florida), Carolyn Kieger (Marquette) and Stephanie McCormick (Western Carolina). Additionally, 22 of Meier's players at Miami have gone on to play professionally after their college careers.

A New Era

Hired April 19, 2005, Meier was appointed by then-Miami AD Paul Dee in front of national and local media, fans, alumni and support staff, signifying the beginning of a new era.

Following an unprecedented career as one of the greatest athletes to ever play in the Atlantic Coast Conference, Meier quickly established herself in the coaching ranks. Following an impressive four-year tenure as the head coach at Charlotte where she helped

bring the 49er program into national prominence, Meier made it clear that her goal was to make Miami one of the premier women's basketball programs in the country.

Creating a Winning Program

In her first season, Meier wasted little time in making the first steps towards those goals. After receiving little attention in the ACC preseason polls, the Hurricanes posted an impressive overall record of 17-13. Under Meier, Miami earned a berth into the second round of the 2006 Women's National Invitation Tournament and standout Tamara James produced one of the greatest seasons ever seen by a UM player, becoming Miami's all-time leading scorer. James was selected with the eighth overall pick in the 2006 WNBA Draft by the Washington Mystics.

Over the next two years, the Hurricanes continued to develop under Meier's direction. Miami's Renee Taylor emerged as the ACC's leading scorer in 2006-07, while Maurita Reid finished the 2007-08 campaign with 110 steals, good for second in the ACC and fifth in the NCAA.

With the No. 21-ranked incoming recruiting class, Meier and the Hurricanes saw significant improvement during the 2008-09 season. The freshman class was highlighted by McDonald's All-American Shenise Johnson of Henrietta, N.Y., and Riquna Williams from nearby Pahokee, Fla. Under Meier's guidance, Johnson was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on three occasions and was named to the ACC All-Freshmen team as well as ACC Honorable Mention. The

versatile guard/forward also led the U19 USA team to a gold medal finish in the 2009 World Championships in Bangkok, Thailand.

The 2009-10 season was one of the most successful in program history. Under Meier's vision, the Hurricanes advanced to the WNIT Championship game. Miami posted a 22-14 overall record - the first 20-win campaign since the 2002-03 season and just the eighth all-time in history. In her sophomore season, Johnson was named first team

All-ACC, while a healthy Riquna Williams garnered second-team honors. The tandem led Miami to a 5-1 WNIT record - the deepest postseason run in team history, with both earning all-tournament honors along the way.

Following the success of the 2009-10 campaign, Meier signed a contract extension through 2015 and the Hurricanes continued their rise in the ACC. Miami earned a conference regular season title in 2010-11 and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in seven seasons. Johnson was named to four different All-America squads and became the second player in program history to be named the conference player of the year (Frances Savage - BIG EAST - 1992). Williams, along with Johnson, was named First Team All-ACC and was the conference scoring leader, posting 21.7 points per game.

Miami's dominance continued into the 2011-12 season. The Canes finished second in the conference standings with a record of 14-2 and were 26-6 overall, earning a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament. UM also defeated the eventual conference tournament champion, Maryland, both times they played in the regular season.

Seniors Shenise Johnson and Riquna Williams continued to shine in the ACC as the duo were second and third in the league in scoring and each were again named First Team All-ACC. Johnson was also named to the All-ACC Defensive Team for the third consecutive season and earned a place on five different All-America teams, including the WBCA squad for the second straight year. Williams earned AP All-America third team recognition in her final collegiate campaign as well.

The Hurricanes went to a school record third straight NCAA Tournament in 2012-13, earning a No. 8 seed. Meier's Hurricanes defeated two top-10 opponents during the season, besting No. 6/7 Penn State and knocking off No. 5/4 Duke on senior day, marking the first win over a team in the top four of either poll in program history and the school's first win over the Blue Devils, who went 20-1 against ACC opponents that season, including winning the ACC Tournament.

After reaching the WNIT in 2014, Meier guided the Hurricanes back to the NCAA

Tournament in 2015 and the 11th-seeded Hurricanes defeated No. 6 seed Washington in the first round, before dropping their second round matchup against third-seeded lowa, the host school.

Earlier in the 2014-15 season, Meier also led the Hurricanes to the program's first win over a team in the top four of the AP Poll. They defeated No. 4/4 Notre Dame, 78-63, the Fighting Irish's only loss in their first two years in the ACC. Sophomore guard Adrienne Motley went on to be named a consensus First Team All-ACC pick after averaging 16.9 points on 49.2 percent shooting. Meier also earned her 250th career win during the season.

In 2015-16, Meier led Miami to a 24-9 record to tie for the fifth-most wins in a season in program history. Miami received a No. 5 seed the NCAA Tournament and made its fifth appearance in the field in the past six years. The 2015-16 campaign also saw the Hurricanes beat both Duke and North Carolina in the same year for the first time. The victory at North Carolina was good for the 200th of Meier's tenure at Miami. Adrienne Motley was also tabbed as a consensus First Team All-ACC honoree for the second straight year, in addition to garnering WBCA All-America Team Honorable Mention recognition.

In 2016-17, Meier guided the Hurricanes to a second straight 24-9 record. In the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament, Miami again defeated a Florida State team ranked in the top 10, downing the No. 8/12 Seminoles, 56-54, to earn back-to-back semifinal appearances for the first time. The Hurricanes beat four top-25 teams, defeating three ranked teams – two of which were in the top 10 – away from home for the first time in the ACC era. Miami earned a No. 4 seed in the NCAA Tournament, hosting the first two rounds of play, and reached the second round for the fourth time in seven years.

Adrienne Motley and Jessica Thomas were both Second Team All-ACC picks in 2016-17, with Motley becoming Miami's fifth WNBA Draft pick. In addition, Motley, Thomas and Keyona Hayes formed the second Miami teammate trio to all reach 1,000 points and each signed a WNBA contract, the first time three Hurricanes in the same class did so.

Despite losing many talented players to graduation and injuries, Meier led the Hurricanes to a 21-11 finish in 2017-18 and surpassed 250 wins in her tenure with the program. Erykah Davenport, a Second Team All-ACC honoree, and Keyanna Harris became the first Miami seniors to make four straight NCAA Tournaments. Miami had two freshman all-league honorees for the first time since 1992-93 in the BIG EAST, as Mykea Gray and Kelsey Marshall both made the cut.

Establishing Her Legacy as a Player

Meier's success as a coach is a direct reflection of her playing career as a standout at Duke University. A four-year letter winner for the Blue Devils under head coach Debbie Leonard from 1986-90, Meier's name is scattered throughout the Duke record books.

She currently ranks among the school's all-time career leaders in scoring average (16.2 points per game), steals (232), free throws made (447) and free throws attempted (624). She is also listed among Duke's leaders in career points (1,761), field goals made (653), field goals attempted (1,283), assists (409) and rebounding average (6.1 rebounds per game).

Meier wasted no time making her mark at Duke, earning ACC Rookie of the Year and Basketball Yearbook Freshman All-America honors in 1986. Meier injured her knee in 1988 during her junior season and ultimately missed the entire 1988-89 campaign while recovering.

Meier returned to Duke for her senior season in 1990 without missing a beat, earning Kodak/WBCA District 2 All-America and All-ACC first team accolades while being named the Blue Devils' most valuable player.

In 2002, Meier was honored by Duke for her efforts as a player when she was named to the inaugural induction class in the Blue Devils' Hall of Honor. That same year, Meier was named to the ACC's 50th Anniversary Team. In 2006, she was once again honored by the conference when she was named an ACC Legend at the 2006 ACC Women's Basketball Tournament.

Meier's success on the court was only outdone by her accomplishments in the classroom. She was named to the Dean's List from 1986-88. In 1988 she also earned GTE Academic All-America Second Team honors.

After receiving a bachelor's degree in English literature with cum laude honors in 1989, Meier went on to earn a master's degree in teaching English from Duke in 1990. Following her career at Duke, Meier moved overseas to play three seasons with BBC Mini-Flat Waregem in Belgium from 1990-93. There, she helped lead her team to three First Division regular season titles and one Belgian Cup Championship. While in Belgium, Meier also spent time teaching classes of conversational English while coaching teams of 15- to 17-year-olds.

A native of Wheaton, Ill., Meier graduated from Wheaton Central High School in 1985 and in October 2009 was inducted into her high school's athletic hall of fame.


