Opening Tips

• Illinois closes out its five-game home stand on Monday night, hosting Miami in the 21st annual Big Ten/ACC Challenge presented by Continental Tire (6 p.m. CT, ESPN2).

• Illinois is 8-12 all-time in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge and 5-3 at home. The Illini are aiming for its first Challenge victory since beating N.C. State in its last home game in the event in 2016 (*Challenge details, p. 3-4*).

• Illinois topped the 100-point marker in consecutive games for the first time since 2014 and also recorded its largest victory margin in the last five years during last Tuesday's rout of Lindenwood (*details, p. 2*).

• Illinois leads the nation in offensive rebound percentage (46.6%) and rebound margin (+18.6).

• Illinois ranks third in the nation in scoring, averaging 88.3 points.

• Illinois is currently fifth in the nation in defensive free throw rate (18.2) and 41st in free throw rate (40.5). These are dramatic early-season improvements compared to last year, when the Illini ranked 338th in defensive free throw rate (42.4) and 272nd in free throw rate (29.5).

• Illinois is the only team from the six major conferences with three players averaging 15+ points (*details p. 2*).

• **Kofi Cockburn** ranks seventh in the NCAA in rebounding – and No. 1 among freshmen – averaging 12.0 rpg. And he is second nationally in offensive rebounds with 4.6 offensive boards per game.

Balanced Scoring

Illinois' top three scoring leaders are within seven points of each other through seven games. Sophomore **Ayo Dosunmu** leads the Illini offense, averaging 16.3 points. Right behind him are freshman **Kofi Cockburn** and senior **Andres Feliz**, who are both at 15.3 ppg. The Illini are the only team from the six major conferences with three players averaging at least 15 points per contest (through Nov. 30). There are 10 teams with two players scoring at that clip:

Notes from the Last Time Out: Illinois Dominates Lindenwood

- Illinois scored 117 points in the win, eclipsing the century mark for the second straight game after totaling 120 vs. Hampton on Nov. 23. It marked Illinois' first time scoring 100+ points in back-to-back games since Nov. 16-21, 2014 when the Illini beat Coppin State (114-56) and Austin Peay (107-66).

- Illinois set a program record for points in back-to-back games with 237. The previous record was 229 set Dec. 11-18, 1993 against American (W, 108-84) and Chicago State (W, 121-52).

- The Illini scored 66 points in the first half, their most in a half since scoring 67 in the first half of a 105-66 win over Georgia Tech in Las Vegas on Nov. 23, 2001.

- The 52-point win marked Illinois' largest since beating Coppin State by 58 on Nov. 16, 2014 (114-56).

- Illinois' 11 three-pointers were its most since also draining 11 treys at Iowa last season (Jan. 20, 2019). The Illini's 13 steals were its most since also totaling 13 steals last season vs. Maryland (Jan. 26, 2019).

- Junior **Da'Monte Williams** scored a career-high 18 points, topping his previous high of 11.

- Sophomore **Ayo Dosunmu** scored 24 points on 8-of-12 shooting, one point short of his career high (25 vs. Georgetown Nov. 13, 2018). It marked the tenth 20-point game of his career, and third of the season.

- Junior **Trent Frazier** had a season-high 17 points, including a season-high five threes.

- Senior **Andres Feliz** nearly had a double-double, finishing with 16 points and a career-high nine assists.

ILLINOIS NOTES IN THE BIG TEN/ACC CHALLENGE

Big Ten/ACC Challenge Notes

- Illinois is 8-12 all-time in the Challenge. The Illini's eight victories are tied for the sixth-most wins by any Big Ten team in the event (*ranking excludes Maryland, whose 10 Challenge wins came as a member of the ACC*).

- After drawing back-to-back road games, Illinois is playing its first Challenge game at State Farm Center since 2016, an 88-74 win over N.C. State. Illinois is 5-3 all-time at home in the Challenge.

- Illinois and Miami meet for the second time in the Challenge. The 15th-ranked Hurricanes defeated the No. 24 Illini exactly five years ago in Coral Gables, 70-61.

- The ACC leads all-time in the Challenge, 12-5-3 over the Big Ten. The conferences split the series last year. The ACC has won the previous two Challenges after the Big Ten had held the Commissioners Cup for seven consecutive seasons. The Big Ten won three straight from 2009-11, the leagues split the event in 2012 and 2013, and the Big Ten was victorious in 2014 and 2015. The series began with 10 straight victories by the ACC from 1999-2008.

Here is a look back at Illinois' previous games in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge:

Nov. 30, 1999 // #17 Duke 72, #16 Illinois 69 // United Center, Chicago

No. 16 Illinois shot just 34 percent from the field in dropping a three-point decision to No. 17 Duke at the United Center. Duke's Chris Carrawell led all scorers with 21 points while Frank Williams and Cory Bradford led the Illini with 14 each.

Nov. 28, 2000 // #1 Duke 78, #9 Illinois 77 // Greensboro (N.C.) Coliseum

Turnovers cost the No. 9 Fighting Illini a chance at knocking off No. 1 Duke as Illinois committed 26 turnovers in a one-point loss to the Blue Devils at Greensboro, N.C. Illinois controlled the glass, outrebounding Duke 42-27. Frank Williams led the Illini with 19 points while Jason Williams led Duke with a game-high 23 points and Mike Dunleavy scored 21.

Nov. 27, 2001 // #5 Maryland 76, #2 Illinois 63 // College Park, Md.

No. 5 Maryland won its 80th consecutive home game against non-conference opponents in the final season at Cole Field House, handing No. 2 Illinois its first loss of the season. Juan Dixon led all scorers with 25 points while Chris Wilcox scored 19. Blandon Ferguson scored 11 points off the bench to lead the Illini.

Dec. 3, 2002 // #25 Illinois 92, #12 North Carolina 65 // Champaign, Ill.

No. 25 Illinois won its first Challenge game with a 27-point rout of No. 12 North Carolina in Champaign. Seniors Brian Cook and Sean Harrington led the way for the Illini. Cook scored a game-high 22 points with eight rebounds and five assists. Harrington came off the bench to nail six 3-pointers and finish with 20 points and five steals. Sean May led UNC with 21 points.

Dec. 2, 2003 // #10 North Carolina 88, #11 Illinois 81 // Greensboro (N.C.) Coliseum

No. 10 North Carolina outlasted No. 11 Illinois to claim a seven-point victory at the Greensboro Coliseum. Illinois trailed by just one point late, 79-78, but could not stop Carolina down the stretch. Sean May scored a game-high 23 points while Rashad McCants added 20 for the Tar Heels. Deron Williams led the Illini with 22 points and Roger Powell added 20.

Dec. 1, 2004 // #5 Illinois 91, #1 Wake Forest 73 // Champaign, Ill.

No. 5 Illinois recorded its second win in school history over a top-ranked opponent, blowing past No. 1 Wake Forest in Champaign. Roger Powell was one of four Illini in double figures, scoring a game-high 19 points on 8-of-10 shooting. Dee Brown and Luther Head each scored 16 and Deron Williams dished out 11 assists to go along with eight points. Illinois came out of the game strong, was ahead 54-33 at halftime and led by as many as 32 points in the second half. Eric Williams led Wake Forest with 18 points. Following its victory, Illinois took over the No. 1 ranking in the polls and held that spot for the remainder of the regular season.

Nov. 29, 2005 // #12 Illinois 68, North Carolina 64 // Chapel Hill, N.C.

In a rematch of the 2005 NCAA Championship game, Illinois topped North Carolina to end the Tar Heels' 21-game winning streak at the Dean Smith Center. Dee Brown led the Illini with 14 points while James Augustine recorded a double-double with 14 points and game-high 13 rebounds, which included six offensive boards. Tyler Hansbrough scored a game-high 17 points for UNC.

Nov. 28, 2006 // #23 Maryland 72, Illinois 66 // Champaign, Ill.

No. 23 Maryland defeated Illinois by six points, breaking the Illini's 51-game home-court winning streak over non-conference opponents. Mike Jones had a game-high 19 points while Greivis Vasquez added 17 points off the bench. Shaun Pruitt led the Illini with a double-double of 18 points and 11 rebounds, while Warren Carter also had a double-double, tallying 13 points and 11 boards.

Nov. 28, 2007 // Maryland 69, Illinois 61 // College Park, Md.

In a back-and-forth game that featured nine ties and 15 lead changes, Maryland went on a key 10-2 run midway through the second half to open up a 49-44 advantage. Illinois cut it to two late, but the Terrapins made 7-of-8 from the free throw line in the final minute to seal the win. Eric Hayes scored a game-high 18 points while James Gist added 12 points and nine rebounds for the Terps. Calvin Brock led the Illini with 13 points and seven rebounds, and Shaun Pruitt finished with 10 points and eight boards.

Dec. 2, 2008 // Clemson 76, Illinois 74 // Champaign, Ill.

The Illini dropped a two-point heartbreaker at home to Clemson. After the Illini led at halftime and for much of the second half, Clemson went on a 9-1 run to go up by five with two minutes remaining. Illinois made it a one-possession game and had the ball with a chance to win or force overtime, but the Illini could not get a shot off before the buzzer. Mike Davis erupted for a career-high 28 points while Demetri McCamey scored 20. Many of the baskets came courtesy of Chester Frazier, who dished out a career-high 12 assists. Demontez Stitt was one of four Clemson players to score in double figures, leading the Tigers with 18 points. Trevor Booker added 16 points and eight rebounds.

Dec. 2, 2009 // Illinois 76, #18 Clemson 74 // Clemson, S.C.

Illinois trailed by as many as 23 points early in the second half before pulling off the biggest comeback in school history to defeat 18th-ranked Clemson on its homecourt. The Illini trailed 60-41 with 14:35 left but then went on a remarkable 22-1 run in less than six minutes to take a 63-61 lead with 8:47 remaining. Mike Tisdale hit a driving layup to put the Illini up 75-74 with 41 seconds left. Tisdale then blocked a shot on the defensive end and Brandon Paul hit one free throw with :8.4 remaining to make it a 2-point lead. Demontez Stitt missed a runner on Clemson's final possession. Mike Davis led the Illini with a game-high 22 points on 9-of-11 shooting and nine rebounds while Brandon Paul scored 20. Stitt led the Tigers with 15 points.

Nov. 30, 2010 // #20 Illinois 79, North Carolina 67 // Champaign, Ill.

Illinois played well from start to finish in a 12-point victory over North Carolina in Champaign. The Illini had five players score in double figures, led by Mike Davis, who tallied a double-double with 20 points and 10 rebounds. Demetri McCamey

added 17 points and eight assists. Illinois shot 50.8 percent overall and was effective from long distance, hitting 8-of-12 three-pointers. John Henson led the Tar Heels with 16 points. The biggest difference in the game was Illinois' ability to capitalize off of turnovers. North Carolina had 18 turnovers, which the Illini converted into 26 points. UNC, meanwhile, scored just eight points off of Illinois' 14 turnovers.

Nov. 30, 2011 // Illinois 71, Maryland 62 // College Park, Md.

Illinois improved to 7-0 on the season with a nine-point road win over Maryland. Illinois trailed by as many as nine points and faced its first halftime deficit of the year. But the Illini outscored the Terps 40-27 in the second half to secure the victory. Sam Maniscalco scored 24 points, hitting 5-of-8 from 3-point land. Brandon Paul had 17 points, 13 of which came in the first half. Maryland's Terrell Stoglin led all scorers with 25 points on the night.

Nov. 28, 2012 // #22 Illinois 75, Georgia Tech 62 // Champaign, Ill.

Illinois won its fourth-straight Big Ten/ACC Challenge game, and recorded its seventh Challenge win overall, defeating Georgia Tech by 13 points. With the Illini trailing 58-54 late in the second half, Joseph Bertrand went on a solo 10-0 run to put the the Illini in control. Dec. 3, 2013 // Georgia Tech 67, Illinois 64 // Atlanta

Illinois was unable to maintain a late lead, suffering its first loss of the season at Georgia Tech. The Illini led by as many as 12 points in the second half, but the Yellow Jackets ended the game on a 19-4 run over the final 6:22 to claim the 3-point win. Rayvonte Rice led the Illini in scoring, pouring in a game-high 24 points. Robert Carter had 21 points and nine boards for Georgia Tech.

Dec. 2, 2014 // #15 Miami 70, #24 Illinois 61 // Miami

Illinois suffered its first loss of the season at No. 15 Miami. After falling behind by as many as 13 points, the Illini opened the second half with a 10-0 run. Later on, Kendrick Nunn scored eight straight to pull Illinois within two. But Miami answered with a 7-0 run of its own, putting the game out of reach. Rayvonte Rice registered a double-double with 22 points and career-high 12 rebounds to lead the Illini, while Malcolm Hill added 13 points. Deandre Burnett had 19 points for Miami.

Dec. 2, 2015 // Notre Dame 84, Illinois 79 // Champaign, Ill.

A key 25-9 second-half run pushed Notre Dame to a road victory, snapping the Illini's 36-game home court non-conference winning streak. Illinois had just three turnovers on the night, equaling the school record for fewest turnovers at State Farm Center. That helped the Illini own a 14-to-4 edge in points-off-turnovers. But Notre Dame shot 57.1 percent in the second half, scoring 51 points after the break. Malcolm Hill led the Illini with 19 points, while Demetrius Jackson and Steve Vasturia had 21 points apiece for the Irish.

Nov. 29, 2016 // Illinois 88, N.C. State 74 // Champaign, Ill.

Illinois snapped its three-game skid in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge, using a strong second half to defeat N.C. State in the dedication game of renovated State Farm Center. Illinois shot 67.9 percent after intermission, outscoring the Wolfpack 56-41. Malcolm Hill led all scorers with 22 points and nine rebounds while Tracy Abrams had 17 points on 6-of-10 shooting and Leron Black came off the bench to record 15 points and eight boards. Torin Dorn had 17 points and seven boards for N.C. State.

Nov. 28, 2017 // Wake Forest 80, Illinois 73 // Winston-Salem, N.C.

Illinois' six-game winning streak to open the season came to an end at Wake Forest. The Illini trailed by 10 early in the second half before clawing their way to within two points. Illinois also made in a one-possession game twice down the stretch but could not get over the hump. Illinois drained 12 three-pointers but struggled from 2-point range, making just 12-of-39 inside the arc. The Illini also had 19 turnovers leading to 28 Wake Forest points. Aaron Jordan led the way with a career-high 20 points, while Kipper Nichols added 14. Bryant Crawford led Wake with 20 as well.

Nov. 27, 2018 // Notre Dame 76, Illinois 74 // South Bend, Ind.

Illinois' late-game comeback fell just short, as Trent Frazier's potential game-winning 3-pointer spun out at the buzzer. The Illini responded from a 13-point second-half deficit with a 15-4 run and had a chance to win it on the final possession, but Frazier's three would not fall despite. Aaron Jordan scored a career- and game-high 23 points while Giorgi Bezhanishvili recorded his first 20-point game with 22 to lead the Illini. D.J. Harvey and T.J. Gibbs scored 19 apiece for the Irish.

Cockburn Sweeps Weekly Big Ten Awards Nov. 25

Kofi Cockburn was named Big Ten Player of the Week and Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Nov. 25. He took home both honors after registering three double-doubles in three Illini wins from Nov. 18-24, averaging 17.7 points and 14.7 rebounds while shooting nearly 58% from the field.

He became the first player to sweep the league's weekly player and freshman award since Nick Ward of Michigan State on Feb. 27, 2017.

Cockburn opened the week with a team-high 15 points and game-high 14 rebounds vs. Hawaii.

He next set the Illini freshman single-game rebounding record vs. The Citadel, grabbing a career-high 17 boards to go along with a team-high 18 points. Along with it being the most rebounds ever by a UI freshman, his 17 boards also marked the highest rebounding total by an Illini in the last 10 years.

Cockburn then recorded his second 20-point game of the season, scoring a team-high 20 points to go along with a game-high 13 rebounds vs. Hampton. Cockburn made 8-of-10 shots, the best FG percentage by an Illini on the season, and all four free throw attempts.

Game 6 Notes: Illinois Blows Out Hampton

- Illinois' 120 points and 45 field goals were its most since Dec. 18, 1993, when it scored 121 and had 46 baskets vs. Chicago State.
- Illinois' 64.3 field goal percentage (45-70) was its highest since setting the school record with 70.5% accuracy on Jan. 6, 2011 vs. Northwestern.
- Illinois' 29 assists were its most since March 11, 2000, when it recorded 30 assists vs. Penn State in the Big Ten Tournament Semifinals.
- Illinois eclipsed 100 points with 7:31 to play in the game. It was Illinois' first time reaching the century mark since Coach Underwood's first game leading the program, a 102-55 win over Southern on Nov. 12, 2017.
- Illinois played the entire first half without committing a turnover, a significant achievement by a UI team that entered the night ranked 337th in turnover average.
- Illinois' 3.22 assist-to-turnover ratio was its best since racking up 28 assists compared to six turnovers (4.67) on Nov. 15, 2016 vs. McKendree.
- Freshman **Kofi Cockburn** recorded his fifth double-double in six games with 20 points and 13 rebounds.
- Sophomore **Alan Griffin** set a career high with 19 points and tied his career high with six rebounds.
- **Griffin** surpassed his previous career best of 11 points in the first half alone, when he scored 17 of his 19.
- Sophomore **Ayo Dosunmu** finished with 20 points on 9-of-13 shooting.
- Junior **Tyler Underwood** recorded a career-high six points.
- Freshman **Benjamin Bosmans-Verdonk** set seasons highs in assists (4) and steals (2).

- Illinois grabbed 55 rebounds, its highest total in 19 years (55 vs. No. 6 Maryland, 11/21/2000 in Maui).

• Illinois also held The Citadel to just 28.4 percent from the field (21-74), the lowest shooting percentage by a UI opponent since Kennesaw State made 24.6 percent (15-61) on Dec. 27, 2014.

• **Kofi Cockburn** had 18 points and grabbed 17 rebounds, breaking the Illinois freshman single-game rebounding record set by Deon Thomas (16 at Memphis, Dec. 29, 1990) and equaled by Damir Krupalija (16 at Indiana, Jan. 3, 1999) and Michael Finke (16 at Minnesota-OT, Jan. 23, 2016).

• **Cockburn's** 17 rebounds were the most by an Illini since Mike Davis also grabbed 17 boards in an overtime win over Northwestern on Dec. 30, 2009.

• **Cockburn** is just the third power conference player this season to have 17+ points and 17+ rebounds in a game. He had 10 rebounds in the first 10:34 of game time on his way to his fourth double-double in the first five games.

• Sophomore **Giorgi Bezhnashvili** had a season-high 16 points on 7-of-11 shooting and tied his season-high with nine rebounds, his second straight game finishing one rebound short of a double-double.

• Junior **Da'Monte Williams** tied his career high with nine rebounds and also had three steals.

• Junior **Trent Frazier** dished a season-high five assists.

• Freshman **Jermaine Hamlin** scored his first-career points on a dunk late in the game.

• Junior walk-on and former team manager **Zach Griffith** scored his first career point with a free throw in the final seconds.

Game 4 Notes: Illini Surge Past Hawaii

• Leading 52-47 with seven minutes remaining, the Illini went on a 14-2 run over the next four-plus minutes to open up its largest lead of the night at 66-49 and seal the win.

• After totaling 13 turnovers in the first 22+ minutes, Illinois went nearly 15 consecutive minutes of the second half without a turnover (17:35-2:44).

• Taking better care of the ball allowed the Illini to outscore Hawaii 40-27 in the second half after the game was tied 26-all at intermission.

• Illinois' defense allowed only 53 points on 37.5 percent opponent shooting. Hawaii entered the game shooting 40 percent from 3-point range but made just 3-of-22 threes (13.6%).

• The Rainbows also attempted just three free throws, marking the UI's lowest opponent free throw rate (4.5) in more than 10 years, since Wisconsin in the 2008 Big Ten Tournament title game (3.9).

• **Kofi Cockburn** recorded his third double-double with 15 points and 14 rebounds.

• **Cockburn** scored 12 of his points in the second half on 5-of-8 shooting after going 1-for-7 in the first half.

• **Trent Frazier** had another efficient game, scoring 13 on just five field goal attempts.

• **Giorgi Bezhnashvili** tallying 10 points and nine rebounds, one board shy of his career high.

• **Kipper Nichols** had a season-high nine points, breaking out for his highest scoring total in the last 15 games dating back to last year's 18-point performance vs. Nebraska (Feb. 2, 2019).

Tough Start

Illinois has scheduled aggressively during Underwood's tenure, and the opening week of the season was the latest example as the Illini played back-to-back road games at Grand Canyon and at No. 21 Arizona.

Florida State (at Pitt, at Florida) was the only other team from among the six major conferences to play two road games during the first week, while FSU and Georgia Tech (at N.C. State, at Georgia) joined the Illini as the only teams from the six majors playing two of its first three games on the road. The ACC starting the season with conference games had the Seminoles and Yellow Jackets joining Illinois with two early road tests.

Dosunmu on Wooden Award & Naismith Trophy Watch Lists

Preseason accolades have continued to pile in for sophomore guard **Ayo Dosunmu**. The Chicago native is on watch lists for the prestigious Wooden Award and Naismith Trophy, which will be awarded at the end of the season to the national player of the year.

Dosunmu had a stellar rookie season with the Fighting Illini, including these highlights:

- Big Ten All-Freshman Team & honorable mention All-Big Ten (coaches & media)
- First true freshman in school history to lead the Illini in scoring for the season (13.8 ppg)
- Recorded the fourth-best scoring average by a freshman in Illini history

- Led team in assists (3.3 apg), second in steals (1.3 spg) and third in rebounds (4.0 rpg)

Season Outlook

Expectations are high in Champaign entering the 2019-20 college basketball season. After two years establishing the culture and identity of his program, head coach **Brad Underwood** is looking for his third Illini squad to take the next step forward on the hardwood.

Illinois was a young team last year and faced one of the most difficult schedules in the country. The Illini saw 58 percent of its scoring come from newcomers as seven players in the rotation were new to the lineup. The growing pains early in the season paid dividends later, when the Illini defeated a pair of top-15 ranked teams and went on to double their win total against Big Ten opponents from the previous season.

Illinois now has continuity for the first time during Underwood's tenure. The Fighting Illini welcome back eight of their top nine leading scorers from last season, returning a robust 85% of the points, 82% of the minutes, and 79% of the rebounds from a year ago.

Returning Illini

• Leading a talented backcourt is sophomore point guard **Ayo Dosunmu**. A heralded recruit a year ago, Dosunmu burst on to the scene and recorded one of the best rookie seasons in program history. He became the first true-freshman ever to lead the Illini in scoring on the season, averaging 13.8 points to earn Big Ten All-Freshman Team honors. Electric in the open court, Dosunmu also showed an improved outside shooting stroke, knocking down 35.2 percent from 3-point range. He impacted every area of the game, also leading the team in assists (3.3 apg) while averaging 4.0 rebounds and 1.3 steals.

Dosunmu elected not to test the NBA Draft waters, returning for a sophomore season and "unfinished business" as announced on his social media accounts. A tireless worker, Dosunmu has had another strong off-

season in the weight room and on the court. He was dominant during the team's August trip to Italy, averaging 24 points. Dosunmu is a preseason All-Big Ten honoree and preseason All-American by Athlon Sports.

- Dynamic scoring guard **Trent Frazier** returns for his junior season. Frazier was edged out by a total of just three points for the team scoring lead last year, averaging 13.7 points. He did much of his damage from long distance once again, draining 80 threes while shooting 40.6 percent from behind the arc. In addition to his scoring, Frazier excels with the principles of the Illini defensive system, affecting the game on both ends of the court.
- Strengthening the backcourt is senior **Andres Feliz**. The former junior college All-American made great strides last season after adjusting to the Division I game. The team's sixth-man award winner started just four games but was always on the court during crunch time, ranking fourth on the team in scoring at 8.3 ppg. He came up big in a number of critical moments last year and also stood out in summer practices. Feliz has a determined attitude and is a rugged, physical competitor.
- One of the most exciting stories in the Big Ten last season was the emergence of **Giorgi Bezhaniashvili**. A virtually unknown recruit as a prep school senior, he had no high-major scholarship offers until Underwood saw him for the first time in February 2018. Bezhaniashvili jumped at the opportunity to join the Illini, and became an instant fan favorite with students and the community. His enthusiasm and passion ignited the State Farm Center, and his play backed it up. He averaged 12.5 points and led the Illini in rebounding with 5.2 boards per game.

Efficient in the post with the ability to use either hand, Bezhaniashvili had a number of great offensive performances. There was none bigger, however, than on Feb. 9 when he broke the Illinois single-game scoring record by a freshman, exploding for 35 points on 14-of-18 shooting in a victory over Rutgers. Bezhaniashvili is a good passer and solid ball handler, and will have the opportunity to show those abilities this season as he expands his game by playing the four in addition to the five.

The lone four-year scholarship senior in the Illini program is **Kipper Nichols**. He averaged 5.7 points last year and had strong performances in spurts, highlighted by a season-high 18 points on 7-of-8 shooting in the Feb. 2 win over Nebraska. Nichols made 54.4 percent of his two-pointers but struggled from three after shooting it well as an underclassman. Illinois is looking for consistency from Nichols during his final campaign.

One of the most dependable players night-in and night-out is junior **Da'Monte Williams**. He started 18 games last season, including each of the last 17, and averaged 3.4 points and 3.5 rebounds. Always in the right spot offensively and defensively, Williams is a lengthy defender who can disrupt opponents and plays exceptionally hard every time out.

A pair of intriguing sophomore wings will have the opportunity to expand their role this season after showing bright spots as rookies. **Alan Griffin** has worked relentlessly in the weight room to add strength and gain weight. Already a great 3-point shooter, Griffin improved his game during the offseason and it showed during the team's Italy trip, where he averaged 16.8 points and was relentless on the offensive glass.

Tevian Jones had a breakout performance last year at Madison Square Garden, pouring in 18 points with four treys to lead the Illini to an upset win over Maryland. The versatile Jones can shoot it and soar in transition, and is continuing to make strides at both ends in the halfcourt.

Frontcourt Heavy Freshman Class

Illinois inked a top-50 player for the second consecutive recruiting class with the addition of four-star center **Kofi Cockburn**. The Kingston, Jamaica native has only played organized basketball for four years, but he has the opportunity to make a big impact in the paint. One of the largest players ever to suit up for the Orange and Blue, Cockburn measures 7-feet, 290 pounds with a 7-6 wingspan. He is a tenacious rebounder who can score in the post and alter shots. The former track and soccer athlete has great balance and feet with his frame.

Bolstering the four and five spots are two additional freshmen. **Benjamin Bosmans-Verdonk** is a skilled forward from Belgium. He has impressive size for a newcomer at 6-8, 235-pounds. Bosmans-Verdonk was limited during the summer and fall while recovering from a leg injury.

Illinois added **Jermaine Hamlin** to the roster prior to the start of fall semester classes. A 6-10, 235-pound center from Lincoln, Illinois, he originally planned to go the prep school route before changing course and signing with the Illini. Hamlin has talent and potential and will focus on skill development during his freshman campaign while battling with the bigs.

Illinois has two transfers who are sitting out this season and will increase the competition in practice. Junior **Jacob Grandison** is a versatile 6-6 player who can play on the wing or at the four. He led Holy Cross in scoring (13.9 ppg) and 3-pointers while ranking second on the Crusaders in rebounding (5.0 rpg). Junior **Austin Hutcherson** is a 6-6 guard who was a dynamic scorer at Division III Wesleyan in Connecticut, averaging 20.0 points while shooting nearly 40 percent from 3-point land.

Brad Underwood is in his third season at Illinois as the Richmond Family Endowed Men's Head Basketball Coach following his hiring as the 18th head coach in program history in March 2017. Underwood has won more than 67 percent of his games through his first six years as a Division I head coach, recording four 20-win seasons while making four NCAA Tournament appearances.

Illinois was one of the most inexperienced teams in the country last season, with Underwood meshing seven newcomers into his 11-player rotation. Despite that youth, and facing the No. 3-ranked regular season schedule by kenpom, the Illini doubled their win total against conference foes in 2019, winning eight games against Big Ten competitors.

The Illini recorded nine wins against teams rated in the top-80 (kenpom), with four victories coming against eventual NCAA Tournament teams. The improvement was highlighted by marquee wins over two top-15 ranked teams. Illinois defeated No. 13 Maryland at Madison Square Garden and knocked off No. 9-ranked and eventual Big Ten champion and Final Four participant Michigan State at home, leading to a court rush celebration by Orange Krush students at the buzzer.

Illinois had 58 percent of its scoring come from newcomers, which was the highest percentage of any team in the Big Ten. For the first time in school history, a true-freshman led Illinois in scoring on the season as rookie Ayo Dosunmu averaged 13.8 points. And in conference play, Illinois had true-freshmen as its top two leading scorers for the first time ever in Dosunmu (14.8 ppg) and Giorgi Bezhaniashvili (13.5 ppg).

Year one saw Underwood lay the foundation for the Illini program. Playing at the second-fastest tempo in the Big Ten, Illinois topped 80 points in 12 games and averaged 75.8 points on the season. That marked the UI's highest scoring average in 13 years, since the 2005 national runner-up season. The offense was aggressive in all phases, recording the team's best offensive rebounding rate (.340) in the last 10 years while also posting the squad's highest free throw rate (.331) since 2008 and making the most free throws (478) since 2002.

Defensively, Illinois ranked fourth nationally in turnover rate, forcing turnovers on 23.2 percent of opponent possessions. The UI defense created its most turnovers (543) in the last 18 years while collecting its most steals (240) since 2005.

Fans have come out to State Farm Center in big numbers to watch the style of play of Underwood's teams at both ends of the floor. Illinois' improvement in average home attendance from 2017 to 2018 ranked 13th nationally. The average increase of 1,231 fans, meanwhile, marked the largest jump for the program in nearly 40 years (1979). Illinois' attendance average increased by an additional 321 fans last season, with the average State Farm Center crowd of 12,935 ranking 23rd nationally while marking the highest mark for the program in the last four years.

Underwood and his staff have also made waves on the recruiting trail during their time in Champaign, signing Ayo Dosunmu, the program's highest-rated guard recruit since 2002, landing a national top-20 class in 2019, and inking Kofi Cockburn, the program's highest-rated center recruit since 2010.

Underwood came to Illinois from Oklahoma State, where he led OSU to a 20-win season and NCAA Tournament appearance. The Cowboys had one of the most exciting and prolific offenses in the country, ranking eighth in the NCAA in scoring (85.7 points per game) and leading the nation in adjusted offensive efficiency (kenpom). The Cowboys ranked eighth nationally in 3-point field goal percentage (.402) and fourth in the country in offensive rebounding percentage (.383).

Oklahoma State finished fifth in the Big 12 with a 9-9 conference record in a season where the Big 12 was rated as the top conference in the nation. That was a dramatic improvement for the Cowboys, who went 3-15 in league play the year prior. Oklahoma State came on strong during the second half of the season, winning 10 of 11 games from Jan. 21-Feb. 25, 2017, which included a pair of five-game winning streaks.

Following that successful turnaround at OSU, he accepted the Illinois job owning a four-year total of 109 wins, third-most ever by a NCAA Div. I head coach.

Underwood arrived in Stillwater following a dominant run at Stephen F. Austin where he led the Lumberjacks to Southland Conference regular season and tournament titles in each of his three seasons. Underwood compiled an 89-14 record at SFA, tied with Brad Stevens (Butler, 2008-10) for the most wins by a head coach in his first three seasons at an NCAA school.

He led SFA to a 28-6 overall record and NCAA Round of 32 appearance in 2016. The Lumberjacks rolled past No. 3 West Virginia in the first round, 70-56, before narrowly missing a trip to the Sweet 16 with a 76-75 defeat to No. 6 Notre Dame in the second round.

That Stephen F. Austin squad was efficient on both sides of the ball, ranking 57th nationally on offense and 38th on defense. The Lumberjacks averaged 80.2 points accompanied by high-pressure defense that forced the highest turnover rate in the country (.259).

Underwood's second SFA team went 29-5 in 2015, also advancing to the NCAA Tournament. The Lumberjacks ranked seventh in the nation in field goal percentage (.487) and led the NCAA in assists (18.7 apg).

His debut season in Nacogdoches in 2014 included a 29-game winning streak and culminated in a 32-3 record and NCAA Round of 32 appearance after a victory over No. 5 seed VCU in the opening round. Underwood earned the Joe B. Hall award, given to the nation's top first-year coach.

Prior to taking over at Stephen F. Austin, Underwood served the 2013 season as associate head coach at South Carolina under Frank Martin. He went to Columbia with Martin after serving on his bench for five seasons as an assistant at Kansas State, with his final season elevated to associate head coach. Underwood spent his first year at K-State in the role of director of operations for then-head coach Bob Huggins.

Underwood had two head coaching stints in the junior college ranks, compiling a 70-24 record in three seasons at Daytona Beach (2004-06) and a 57-63 mark in four years at Dodge City (1990-93). In between those opportunities, Underwood was entrenched in the state of Illinois for 10 seasons, as an assistant coach for Jim Kerwin at Western Illinois from 1994-2003.

Underwood is a December 1986 graduate of Kansas State. He played in Manhattan for the legendary Jack Hartman, K-State's all-time winningest coach. Former Illinois head coach Lon Kruger also played and coached for Hartman at Kansas State.

Underwood began his college career at Hardin-Simmons, where he later worked as a graduate assistant. Hardin-Simmons was the first college job for Lou Henson, the Fighting Illini's all-time winningest coach, and whose name permanently adorns the court at State Farm Center.

Brad and his wife, Susan, have a son, Tyler, and two daughters, Katie and Ashley. Tyler is a member of the Fighting Illini basketball team and Katie also is a U of I student.

Game 3 Recap – #21 Arizona 90, Illini 69

An even game for 28 minutes turned in favor of the hosts midway through the second half, as No. 21 Arizona broke open a 1-point game with a pivotal 15-0 run to pull away from the Illini.

Illinois was strong out of the gate, making seven of its first eight shots and leading by as many as seven points in the first half. The Wildcats offense also was clicking, as the lead exchanged hands five times to go along with four ties.

Arizona led by one point at the half and extended its lead to eight before the Illini pulled within 53-52 at the 12-minute mark.

But the Orange and Blue went scoreless over the next four minutes and committed four turnovers while the Wildcats reeled off 15 unanswered, making it 68-52 with less than eight minutes remaining.

Illinois struggled with turnovers throughout the night, totaling a season-high 22 that Arizona turned in to 20 points. And while the Illini offense cooled off after intermission, Arizona continued to roll, scoring 51 second-half points.

The starting guard trio of **Ayo Dosunmu**, **Trent Frazier** and **Andres Feliz** all scored in double figures, combining for 42 of Illinoi's 69 points (61%).

Dosunmu led the Illini with 15 points, **Frazier** had 14, and **Feliz** recorded his third career double-double, and second of the season, finishing with 13 points and game-high 10 rebounds.

Game 4 Recap – Illini 66, Hawaii 53

Illinois was strong defensively and used a late-game surge to pull away from Hawaii, 66-53, in its first home game in nearly two weeks.

It was a rough first half as both teams struggled from the field and the Illini offense was also limited by 10 turnovers. The teams went into the locker room tied at 26.

The Illini turnover tally reached 13 by the 17:35 mark of the second half, but from there the hosts settled in and played the next nearly 15 minutes without a turnover.

That ball security allowed the offense to heat up. Leading 52-47 with seven minutes remaining, the Illini went on a 14-2 run over the next four-plus minutes to open up its largest lead of the night at 66-49 and seal the win.

Illinois' defense allowed only 53 points on 37.5 percent shooting. Hawaii entered the game shooting 40 percent from 3-point range but made just 3-of-22 threes (13.6%). The Rainbows also attempted just three free throws for the game, marking the UI's lowest opponent free throw rate (4.5) in more than 10 years, since Wisconsin in the 2008 Big Ten Tournament championship (3.9).

The Illini outrebounded the Rainbows 44-26. Illinois grabbed 11 offensive boards and capitalized with a 12-4 advantage in second-chance points.

Kofi Cockburn led the Illini, recording his third double-double in four games with 15 points and a career-high tying 14 rebounds.

Trent Frazier had another efficient game, scoring 13 points on just five field goal attempts.

Giorgi Bezhnashvili, meanwhile, just missed a double-double, tallying 10 points and a season-best

Illinois was strong on both ends of the floor, leading nearly the entire way in an 85-57 route of The Citadel.

Illinois went on a 13-0 run midway through the first half to open up a 17-point lead at 24-7. The Illini defense held the Bulldogs to just 10 points over the first 17 minutes of the game, before the visitors doubled that output in the closing three minutes of the half.

The Illini scored the first six points after intermission to open up a 20-point lead, and The Citadel got no closer than 14 the rest of the way.

Illinois dominated inside, scoring 52 points in the paint and 30 second-chance points off of 22 offensive rebounds. Illinois outrebounded The Citadel by 20, with its total of 55 boards its biggest night on the glass since 2000.

Illinois also held The Citadel to just 28.4 percent from the field (21-74), the lowest shooting percentage by a UI opponent since 2014.

Sophomore **Giorgi Bezhanishvili** scored a season-high 16 points and equaled his season-high with nine rebounds. And fellow sophomore **Ayo Dosunmu** had 16 points on 7-of-15 shooting (6-of-9 on 2s).

Junior **Da'Monte Williams** also pitched in on the boards, tying his career high with nine rebounds He also had three steals, the most by an Illini on the season.

Game 7 Recap – Illini 117, Lindenwood 65

The Illini offense rolled once again, racking up 117 points on nearly 62 percent shooting in a rout of Div. II foe Lindenwood.

The 52-point win marked Illinois' largest margin in five years, since Nov. 16, 2014.

The Illini blew the game open with an early 21-0 run and led by double figures the rest of the way. After scoring 62 first-half points the last time out vs. Hampton, Illinois topped that effort against Lindenwood, totaling 66 in the opening stanza against Lindenwood to mark the program's most points in a half since Nov. 23, 2001.

Illinois shot 61.9 percent on the night, topping 60 percent in both halves. The Illini offense was efficient in every area, scoring 54 points in the paint and registering season highs of 11 three-pointers and 28 free throws.

Illinois also grabbed a season-high 13 steals while forcing 24 turnovers, converting those extra opportunities into 33 points off turnovers.

Six Illini scored in double figures in a balanced effort. **Ayo Dosunmu** had 24 points – just one shy of his career high – and set a career best with four steals.

Da'Monte Williams erupted for a career-high 18 points, topping his previous high of 11. **Trent Frazier** scored a season-high 17 while draining five treys. And **Andres Feliz** nearly had a double-double with 16 points and a career-high nine assists, the most by an Illini on the season.
