## STORY LINES

- After a successful trip to College Park, Md., where the Hurricanes took a key Atlantic Coast Conference series victory over the Terrapins by winning two of three games, Miami returns to Alex Rodriguez Park to open a five-game homestand.
- Miami boasts an $9-3$ record (. 750 winning percentage) in midweek games in 2013.11 of those 12 games have been played inside the friendly confines of The Light, although one of the team's losses came against Bethune-Cookman on April 3 (5-3).
- Despite their 8-10 record in Atlantic Coast Conference play, the Hurricanes are ranked No. 14 in the newest WarrenNolan.com Rating Percentage Index (RPI), while the team's 2013 schedule is currently ranked the third-toughest in the nation.
- In addition to its own impressive RPI score, the Hurricanes have five wins against teams ranked in the top 20 RPI and nine wins against teams ranked in the top 50 RPI - important factors in postseason projections and consideration.
- Javi Salas will be looking to follow up one of the strongest outings of his career this coming Wednesday. Last time out, the Coral Gables, Fla., native threw the second complete game of the season, scattering seven hits in an $8-2$ win over Stetson.
- David Thompson (five hits, one homerun, two doubles, four RBI's) and Chantz Mack (five hits, two doubles, five walks) paced Miami to a 3-1 record last week. Miami's four starting pitchers allowed just seven earned runs combined over the week.

## 3 JIM MORRIS 2001, 1999 \& 1994 COACH OF THE YEAR • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

In his 20th season at Miami, no other program nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 40 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 19 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

- Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 874-336-3 (.724) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,378-603-4 (.696) Division I record in $31+$ years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 34 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,509-644-4 (.701) mark
- In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 19 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.


## MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

- Jim Morris earned his 28th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2012 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host sites for the first round of the postseason. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 19 seasons (19942012), winning 15 of his last 19 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.
- Affectionately known as " 3 " by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2012 Hurricanes to their 40th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2012 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft: E.J. Encinosa, Eric Erickson, Steven Ewing, Peter O'Brien and Stephen Perez.


## MORRIS IN 35th SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

- Morris currently has a 1,378-603-4 (.696) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,509-644-4 (.701) record over 30-plus years.
- Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a $16-13$ win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a $7-3$ win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000 th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a $5-3$ win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.
- Morris entered 2013 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball history with 1,354 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division.
- Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500 th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.



## JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 19 seasons and led the Canes to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

## TAKE A STAND...

- The Hurricanes will open up a five-game homestand Wednesday when the Wildcats of Bethune-Cookman arrive in Coral Gables for a 6 p.m. matchup.
- Miami has an impressive 18.8 (.692) mark at home this season, including an $8-3$ (.727) record in midweek games at The Light.
- Though Miami has an all-time 24.4 series advantage, including a weekend sweep of Bethune-Cookman at home in 2012, the Hurricanes dropped their last matchup with B-CU (5-3) on April 3.


## BUILDING MOMENTUM...

- In the latest Ratings Percentage Index rankings from both Boyd's World and WarrenNolan.com, Miami is ranked No. 15 in RPI. Additionally, Warren Nolan has Miami with the second-toughest schedule of any team nationwide.
- The Hurricanes have six wins against teams ranked in the Top 20 in Boyd's World RPI, and have nine wins against Boyd's World Top 50 RPI teams.
- Miami's last home weekend series with fifth-ranked Florida State marked the team's fourth straight weekend against a ranked foe. Clemson (ranked No. 20 by Baseball America) will return to The Light for a weekend series beginning this Fri., April 19.


## STARTING OFF STRONG...

- Sophomore Chris Diaz has impressed as Friday night starter, delivering a team-best seven quality starts in nine chances this season. The Florida City, Fla., native ranks sixth in the ACC with an ERA of 1.78 , and third in the conference with 60.2 innings pitched.
- Having surrendered just five runs all season, junior Bryan

Radziewski boasts a team-best ERA of 1.11 , good for third-best mark in the ACC. He has also recorded an eye-popping 55:10 strikeout-to-walk ratio through seven starts, while his 55 punchouts are the fifth-most in the conference. He has held opponents to a measley .158 batting average, the best mark of any pitcher in the ACC.

- Radziewski (1.29, No. 2), Diaz ( 2.38, No. 8) and sophomore Andrew Suarez (3.71, No. 17) all rank in the top 20 in ERA among ACC starters in conference competition this season.


## CLOSING IT OUT...

- Senior Eric Nedeljkovic has been Miami's most reliable reliever out of the bullpen, and has allowed just two runs in 19.2 innings of work this season.
- Nedeljkovic recorded back-to-back saves in Miami's two wins against Maryland, setting the Terrapins offensive down in order to close out both games.
- The Folsom, Calif., native, who is tied for the most saves of any reliever in the conference (eight), has allowed only 12 hits in 18 appearances, and has a dominant 22:2 strikeout-to-walk ratio.


## SCOUTING THE WILDCATS...

- Bethune-Cookman, who took down the Hurricanes on April 3, used the win to jumpstart a seven-game winning streak. The Wildcats have won eight of their last nine, and have a 23-19 overall record.
- Starting for the Wildcats will be senior lefthander Ali Simpson. He has a 3.5 record in nine starts this season, and a 6.14 ERA.
- Offensively, B-CU is powered by Anthony Stokes $(.283$ average, four homeruns, 23 RBI's), Eros Modena (.315, 28 RBI's) and Matt Noble (12 doubles, 25 RBI's).
