MIAMI CLOSES OUT FIRST SEASON UNDER GOLDEN

The Miami Hurricanes football team entered its first campaign under Head Coach Al Golden with high expectations. Led by their quartet of senior captains (Jacory Harris, Tyler Horn, JoJo Nicolas and Sean Spence) and returning All-ACC selections on both offense and defense, the Hurricanes prepared all summer for a schedule featuring two teams ranked in the Preseason Top-25 and marquee ACC match-ups against Georgia Tech and Florida State, among others.

Amidst preseason controversy and without key players due to both suspensions and injury, the team battled its way to a final record of six wins and six losses. Impressively enough, the Hurricanes won their six games by a combined total of 110 points and lost the other six by a combined total of 33 points.

Facing adversity in the season's early going, the team was led by the experience and talent of its 25-member senior class. After suffering a 32-24 loss in the season opener at Maryland, the Hurricanes returned home for a dominant 24-6 win over then-No. 17 Ohio State. After a four-point loss to Kansas State, who finished the season 10-2 and ranked eighth in the country, the Hurricanes rebounded with a 45-14 win at home over Bethune-Cookman and a strong showing on the road in Blacksburg, Va. where they fell just short against then-No.21 Virginia Tech.

The team had dominant wins at home, including a 24-7 win over then-No. 22 Georgia Tech and a 49-14 blowout victory over Duke, but struggled to maintain consistency throughout the season. After a disappointing 23-19 road loss in its rivalry game against Florida State, Jake Wieclaw kicked the team into the postseason with a 6-3 win on a last-second field goal at South Florida. The team and university opted to decline the postseason bid, however, amidst a pending NCAA investigation.



Led by their senior quarterback Jacory Harris, who enjoyed resurgence under new offensive coordinator Jedd Fisch, the Hurricane offense saw the emergence of two new stars: junior wide receiver Tommy Streater (811 yards, eight touchdowns) and second-team All-ACC running back Lamar Miller (1,272 yards, nine rushing touchdowns).

The Hurricanes defense, led by first-team All-ACC linebacker Sean Spence (106 tackles, 14.0 tackles for loss), was also anchored by two newcomers: freshman defensive end Anthony Chickillo (38 tackles, five sacks) and freshman linebacker Denzel Perryman (69 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss).

Though the Hurricanes will lose some of its key contributors to graduation and the NFL Draft, the team will use the offseason to build on the strong showings from many of its up-and-coming stars heading into 2012.

Miami OFFENSE

- ▶ Miami finished the season with one of the most efficient offenses in the country.
- ▶ Collegefootballoutsiders.com ranked Miami as the nation's third-most efficient team in the country. The ranking is based on the opponent-adjusted efficiency of the given team's offense.
- ▶ Miami was a strong second-half team, outscoring its opponents 156-102 during the second half.
- ▶ Miami had multiple options to generate offense for the season. Fifteen different players caught passes and eight players moved the ball on the ground.
- ▶ Miami converted 34 of its 41 red zone attempts into points, that's a conversion rate of 83 percent. Twenty-seven of those were touchdowns (66 percent). The Canes ranked fifth in the ACC in red zone offense.
- ▶ Miami faced three teams ranked among the top 25 nationally in total defense. In those three games, the Canes averaged 26.0 points.
- ▶ On the season, Miami running backs had 46 receptions for 385 yards.
- ▶ The Hurricanes were explosive on offense this season. They had 16 scoring drives that lasted two minutes or less and have 38 plays of longer than 25 yards.
- ▶ Miami produced a season-best 519 total yards of offense in a 38-35 loss to Virginia Tech. It was the best-production by a Canes offense since a 507-yard performance at Georgia Tech on Nov. 13, 2010.
- ▶ Jacory Harris or Lamar Miller had a hand in 29 of the 39 offensive touchdowns the Canes scored this season (74 percent).
- ▶ Quarterback Jacory Harris set two UM all-time career records and moved up the all-time list in several other statistical categories.
- ▶ Wide receiver Tommy Streater had a break-out season, closing out the 2011 campaign as the Canes leading receiver. Streater caught 46 passes for 811 yards and scored eight touchdowns.
- ▶ Running back Lamar Miller recorded seven games of 100 or more rushing yards enroute to 1,272 on the season on 227 carries.

Miami DEFENSE

- ▶ Miami finished the season starting eight underclassmen, including two true freshmen.
- ▶ Miami started four first-year players who did not take part in spring football.
- ▶ Miami finished ranked in the top 25 in several categories despite five projected starters missing 38 of 60 possible games.
- ▶ Miami held Ohio State, Georgia Tech, Florida State, and South Florida to a combined 22 points below scoring average.
- ▶ For the first seven games of the season, the UM defense gave up 121 total points for an average of 20.16 per game.
- ▶ In the last five games of the season, the Canes held opponents to 13.5 points per game (81 total points).
- ▶ Miami's defense held opponents to only 8-of-19 conversions on short yardage for the last five games of the season, stopping them 57 percent of the time. During the first seven games, opponents converted on 18-of-21 short-yardage opportunities.
- ▶ Miami finished the season ranked 21st in the nation in scoring defense, holding opponents to 20.08 points per game.
- ▶ The Hurricanes tied for ninth nationally in red zone defense, as opponents only scored at a 72 percent clip inside Miami's red zone.
- ▶ Senior Linebacker Sean Spence was named a 2011 Butkus Award semifinalist. Spence was the Canes leader on defense all season.
- ▶ Sean Spence was named ACC Linebacker of the Week for three consecutive weeks after his performances against Virginia Tech, North Carolina and Georgia Tech.
- ▶ Sean Spence was honored by the College Football Performance Awards three times during the season. Freshman linebacker Denzel Perryman was twice recognized during the season.

Golden FOOTBALL

▶ Since the Golden Era began, the Hurricanes have improved in several key statistical categories that speak to Coach Golden's brand of football--smart, tough and disciplined. Since a season ago, the Canes have improved 19-plus spots among the nation's FBS schools in turnover margin, fewest penalties per game and fewest yards penalized per game. The chart below is a breakdown of where the Canes stand.

- Miller finished second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with 106.0 rushing yards per game, ranking 19th nationally.
- Through the first four games of the season, Miller was the only back in America with a rush of 40-yards or more in every game. He did not extend that streak at Virginia Tech, but did have runs of 37 and 30 yards.
- Of his 12 career rushes/receptions of 25-yards or more, nine came after halftime.
- Miller recorded 166 rushing yards on 18 carries against Virginia Tech, posting his fifth-straight game with at least 100 yards rushing. Miller was the first Cane to open the season with five-straight 100-yard rushing games. Willis McGahee started the 2002 season with 100-plus in four of the first five games. The last time a Cane recorded five straight 100-yard rushing games was Clinton Portis in 2001.
- Miller had 12 plays of 25-yards or more this season: 11 rushes and one reception.
- Until the Ohio State game (184 yards), Miller's output against Virginia Tech was a career best. The Hokies' run defense came into the 2011 meeting ranked No. 4 nationally against the run, giving up only 58.20 yards on the ground.
- Miller surpassed former Cane Frank Gore (2001-04) with nine career 100-yard rushing games. Edgerrin James (1995-98) is the all-time leader with 15 games of 100 or more yards on the ground.
- Miller ranks third all-time in UM season history with 227 carries, only Willis McGahee (2002, 282) and Edgerrin James (1998, 242) had more in a single season.

When **IT COUNTS**

► You can only bottle up the electric Lamar Miller for so long. His career shows that the second half was clearly Miller Time. Not only do his biggest plays (especially runs) come in the second half, but more than half of his career yards came after intermission.

More **ON LAMAR**

► Lamar Miller became the eighth player in program history to surpass the 1,000-yard mark in the Canes loss to Florida State on Nov. 12. Miller rushed for 92 yards on 22 carries against the Seminoles. The redshirt-sophomore ranks third in UM history with 1,272 rushing yards in a season as only Willis McGahee (2002, 1,753) and Edgerrin James (1998, 1,416) had more rushing yards during a season.

A Game of Firsts - BOSTON COLLEGE RECAP

- ▶ Senior wide receiver LaRon Byrd scored his first touchdown of the 2011 campaign on a 7-yard pass from Jacory Harris.
- ▶ Senior fullback John Calhoun made his first career start.
- ▶ Four different receivers finished the game with 40 or more yards. Tommy Streater (47), Allen Hurns (42), Eduardo Clements (40) and Travis Benjamin (75). It was the first time this season for the feat.
- ▶ Freshman Denzel Perryman recorded 14 tackles, including nine solo for career highs in both categories. The 14 tackles tied for the game high (Sean Spence, 14).

Twenty-five SENIORS CLOSE OUT UM CAREER

▶ The 2011 senior class included the following student-athletes. Travis Benjamin (WR), Ben Bruneau (WR), LaRon Byrd (WR), John Calhoun (FB), Lee Chambers (DB), Joel Figueroa (OL), Chase Ford (TE), Jordan Futch (LB), Nate Gholston (DB), Sean Goldstein (LB), Harland Gunn (OL), Jacory Harris (QB), Tyler Horn (OL), Chris Ivory (LS), Miles Levine (LB), Erik Lichter (LB), JoJo Nicolas (DB), Micanor Regis (DL), Marcus Robinson (LB), Andrew Smith (DL), Sean Spence (LB), David Thompson (RB), Spencer Whipple (QB) and Mike Williams (DB). Gridiron REGULARS

- ▶ Four Canes added their names to the records book in career games played. Former Cane Brandon Meriweather holds the UM all-time record with 52 appearances from 2002-2006.
- ▶ Seniors LaRon Byrd (51), JoJo Nicolas (50), Travis Benjamin (49) and Chris Ivory (49) and have played in a combined 199 games since 2008.
- ▶ Byrd's 51 career games ties him for second-place all-time with Jon Peattie (2002-06). Nicolas joins three other Canes tied for third all-time with 50 games played. Benjamin and Ivory are among the nine Canes tied for sixth all-time with 49 appearances.

▶ Twenty-seven Hurricanes earned their first playing time in 2011. Canes SCHEDULE AMONG THE TOUGHEST

- ▶ According to Phil Steele's College Football Preview, Miami faced the 10th-toughest schedule of any FBS school this season. Only Colorado, Iowa State, Baylor, Oregon State, LSU, Boston College, USC, Washington and Auburn faced a tougher road according to the publication.
- ▶ The Canes faced nine teams who played in bowl games in 2010.
- ▶ Ten of their 2011 opponents were ranked among the nation's top 25 at some point during the season.
- ▶ UM was only one of six FBS programs to play its first three games against BCS-conference opponents. The others were USC, FAU, Rice, Notre Dame and BYU.

Only working press will be admitted to the Sun Life Stadium press box. Seats will be issued according to the following criteria:

1. State newspapers by circulation, wire services, national publications, newspapers from opponent's area, and student newspapers from UM and opponent's schools.
2. Other daily newspapers, with preference to those that regularly cover UM.
3. Radio and television personnel not broadcasting, but considered reporting.
4. Non-daily newspapers, with preference to those which regularly cover UM.
5. Scouts. Freelance and/or non-daily writers may be asked to produce copies of actual publications in which their work has appeared. In some cases, these materials will be required as verification of the writers' status.

Jacory SOARING

► Under the tutelage of offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Jedd Fisch, Miami quarterback Jacory Harris recorded career highs in 2011 in several key statistical categories. Harris' QB rating (150.6), completion rate (65.0%), yards per attempt (8.3) and longest pass (77 yards) are all career highs.



J12 AMONG THE BEST

► With his 245-yard performance against Boston College on Nov. 25, Jacory Harris finished in second place in Miami's all-time records book with 8,826 career passing yards, surpassing Gino Torretta and trailing only Ken Dorsey (9,565).

► Harris was among the nation's best quarterbacks with a passing efficiency of 150.61 -- ranking 20th nationally. Harris connected on 195-of-300 passes with 20 touchdowns and nine interceptions.

► Harris entered the season ranked among Miami's top signal callers, appearing in six different career records categories.

► Harris ranks second all-time in passing yardage, pass completions, pass attempts, touchdowns thrown and total offense, while ranking third in completion percentage. Harris upended Ken Dorsey in pass attempts in his final game against Boston College.

► He moved into sole possession of second place all-time in career passing TDs on Oct. 23, 2010, when he threw touchdown passes to LaRon Byrd, Travis Benjamin and Leonard Hankerson against the Tar Heels.

► With his TD pass against Boston College, Harris moved into fourth-place surpassing Darian Durant (North Carolina, 2001-04) on the ACC's Career TD passes list with 70.

► Harris passed North Carolina's Darian Durant (2001-04; 8,755), with his 245-yard performance against Boston College, for 12th place on the ACC's career passing yardage stats, as he finished his tenure with 8,826 career passing yards.

Three EARN ALL-ACC HONORS

► Sean Spence (first team), Tyler Horn (second team) and Lamar Miller (second team) were all honored by the Atlantic Coast Conference for their outstanding play in 2011.

► After his selection to the second team as a junior, Sean Spence earned First-Team All-ACC recognition for his spectacular 2011 season. The senior captain, who tied for fifth place in the Atlantic Coast Conference with 106 total tackles in 2011, ended the year second among all NCAA players with 47 career tackles for loss, including 14.0 in 2011. A semi-finalist for the Butkus Award, Spence averaged 9.64 tackles per game (fourth in conference) and 1.27 tackles for loss per game (third in conference) in 2011. The Miami, Fla. native also finished the season with three sacks, one pass break-up and one forced fumble.

► Senior captain Tyler Horn earned Second-Team All-ACC recognition for his play at center for the Hurricanes. As the anchor of the offensive line, Horn, who played 750 snaps in 2011 and only allowed two sacks, led the Hurricane line-men with a grade of 90 percent for the season. A two-year starter for Miami at center, the Memphis, Tenn. native made only 22 mental errors on the season and recorded a finish grade of 96 percent.

► Sophomore running back Lamar Miller, who completed one of the most prolific seasons in program history in 2011, also earned recognition on the All-ACC Second Team. Miller, whose 1,272 yards ranked third in program history for a single season, finished the year with nine rushing touchdowns and one receiving TD. The Miami, Fla. native finished second in the conference with 106 rushing yards per game, recording seven 100-yard games and averaging 5.6 yards per carry.

Miami FOOTBALL RECOGNIZED FOR OUTSTANDING GSR

- The University of Miami was one of only 17 institutions recognized for an outstanding NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of over 90 percent for their football student-athletes in the latest six-year window, as announced by the American Football Coaches Association.
- The GSR is based on a six-year graduation window for student-athletes which is a change from the five-year window used by the CFA and AFCA. The GSR was developed by the NCAA as part of its academic reform initiative to more accurately assess the academic success of student-athletes. The GSR holds institutions accountable for transfer students, unlike the federal graduation rate. The GSR also accounts for midyear enrollees.
- Only sixteen other institutions -- Air Force, Army, Boise State, Boston College, Central Florida, Duke, Florida, Iowa, Miami (Ohio), Navy, Northern Illinois, Northwestern, Notre Dame, Penn State, Rice, Stanford -- achieved a rate of 90 percent or better.

Miami FOOTBALL RANKED EIGHTH NATIONALLY IN APR

► When the NCAA's Academic Progress Report (APR) was announced in May, the Canes' football program headlined an outstanding academic showing by the University of Miami for the 2010-11 year. The football team (along with baseball, men's basketball and men's tennis) improved upon its APR score for an impressive seventh straight season. In fact, the UM football program's APR score (978) ranked eighth among all FBS schools.

GSR SCORES SHOW CONTINUED SUCCESS OF MIAMI ATHLETICS

- In what has become an annual upward trend, student-athletes at the University of Miami continue to excel in the classroom at a record pace. According to the NCAA's Graduation Success Rates (GSR), Miami established a new athletics department-wide record with a GSR of 89 percent.
- Last year, the athletics department-wide GSR was at its then-record high of 86 percent.
- The athletics department has exceeded the NCAA average for GSR in each of the last seven years.

UM LEADS STATE & NO. 38 IN U.S. NEWS & WORLD REPORT RANKINGS

- In the 2012 edition of the *U.S. News & World Report's* annual "Best Colleges" issue, the University of Miami rose to number 38 -- up from 47 last year, a nine-point rise. UM remains the highest ranked school in the state of Florida.
- In an impressive ascent, UM moved up 29 slots in the last 10 years, making it one of the fastest rising institutions among national universities in recent times. UM is the only school currently in the top 50 to move up nine spots in one year and 29 spots in the past 10 years.

UM PASSES ON BOWL CONSIDERATION

► Hurricanes' director of athletics Shawn M. Eichorst announced following the USF game that UM had made the decision to withhold the football team from bowl consideration following the 2011 regular season in response to the ongoing NCAA inquiry and informed both the NCAA and the Atlantic Coast Conference of its decision. Miami became bowl-eligible with a 6-3 win over USF on Nov. 19.

NFL TOUCHDOWN STREAK ENDS

▶ Dating back to Week 15 of the 2002 NFL season, a Miami Hurricane had scored a touchdown for 149 consecutive regular season weeks. The streak, which encompassed more than 600 touchdowns spread amongst more than 30 players, ended Week 11 of the 2011 NFL Season.

Eight CANES GO IN 2011 NFL DRAFT

▶ The University of Miami's success in the NFL Draft continued this past spring, as eight Canes were selected in 2011. Orlando Franklin (2nd round to Denver), Brandon Harris (2nd round to Houston), Leonard Hankerson (3rd round to Washington), DeMarcus Van Dyke (3rd round to Oakland), Allen Bailey (3rd round to Kansas City), Colin McCarthy (4th round to Tennessee), Richard Gordon (6th round to Oakland) and Matt Boshier (6th round to Atlanta) were all taken off the board in the Top 200 picks.

▶ Miami's eight draftees trailed only USC (9) and North Carolina (9) for the most in the country in 2011.

▶ Since 2000, only Ohio State (78) and USC (77) have had more players drafted than the Canes (75).

▶ Miami continues to comfortably lead the nation in first round draft picks in recent years, as 26 Canes have been selected in the first round since 2000. Ohio State (17) remains a distant second.

Five CANES ELECT TO FOREGO SENIOR SEASON

▶ Juniors Marcus Forston (DL), Lamar Miller (RB), Tommy Streater (WR), Olivier Vernon (DL) and Brandon Washington (OL) have elected to forfeit their final season of eligibility to enter the 2012 NFL draft.

▶ Forston saw action in three games before a season-ending injury sidelined the 6-3, 300-pound defensive lineman. He finishes his career with 60 career tackles, seven sacks and 17 tackles for loss in 31 games.

▶ Miller finished the season with UM's third-best single-season total in program history with 1,272 rushing yards. For his career, Miller tallied 1,918 rushing yards on 335 carries and 15 touchdowns in 23 games.

▶ Streater had a breakout season for the Canes, leading the team in receptions (46) and receiving yards (811). He averaged 67.6 yards per game to finish fifth in the ACC. He closed out his career with 52 receptions, 967 yards and nine touchdowns in 31 games.

▶ Vernon played in six games in 2011, starting the final three of the season. He recorded a season-high five tackles, including a tackle for loss, against Florida State. Vernon saw action in 30 career games and totaled 82 stops, 21 tackles for loss and nine sacks.

▶ Washington, a 2010 All-ACC first team selection, started all 12 games in 2011 and finished the season grading out at 86 percent. The 6-4, 320 lineman played in every game of his career, starting 27 of the 38 contests.
