SEMINOLES TRAVEL TO PLAY MIAMI FOR SECOND TIME THIS SEASON

Florida State, which defeated Miami 55-54 earlier this season on January 19, 2015, travels to play the Hurricanes in the second meeting of the year between the two teams at the BankUnited Center in Coral Gables, Fla., on Wednesday, February 25, 2015 at 9:00 p.m. The Seminoles will look to gain a regular season sweep of the two-game series for the third time since the start of the 2010 season. Florida State's game at Miami is its final regular season road game of the season with its final two games of the regular season coming at home against nationally ranked Louisville (February 28) and Pittsburgh (March 7). The Seminoles' game against Pittsburgh is their final game of the regular season before beginning play in the ACC Tournament at the Greensboro Coliseum in Greensboro, N.C. Following Wednesday's game at Miami, the Seminoles play host to No. 15/17 Louisville on Saturday, February 28 in a match-up of former Metro Conference foes. The Cardinals' game in Tallahassee marks its first game at the Donald L. Tucker Center since January 12, 1991 when Florida State took a 77-66 decision at home. The game is the first time the Seminoles and the Cardinals will play since the 1991 Metro Conference Tournament - only four months before Florida State left the Metro to join the ACC.

FLORIDA STATE RECENTLY IN ACC PLAY

Florida State enters its game against Miami having won five of its last eight and six of its last 10 games in ACC play since defeating Clemson on January 19 at Littlejohn Coliseum in Clemson, S.C. The Seminoles are 8-7 in ACC play after beginning their conference slate with a 1-4 mark. Florida State was 9-9 overall and 1-4 in the ACC when it began play at Clemson and begins play against Miami with 15 overall wins and seven wins in ACC play.

HAMILTON ONLY THREE WINS FROM BECOMING FLORIDA STATE'S ALL-TIME WINNER

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton enters Wednesday's game against Miami in need of only three wins to become the all-time winningest coach in Florida State history - a standard currently held by J.K. Kennedy who was the second coach in the history of the Seminole basketball program. Hamilton is the fourth coach in FSU history to win at least 200 games. Hamilton also enters Wednesday's game only one win from tying the legendary Everett Case for 13th on the all-time ACC career victories list.

RATHAN-MAYES MAKING A STRONG CASE FOR ACC ALL ROOKIE TEAM

Freshman Xavier Rathan-Mayes enters Wednesday's game against Miami as one of only two freshmen in the ACC ranked in the top 25 of the ACC in scoring and is the only freshman in the ACC who leads his team in scoring (13.6 ppg / tied for 16th in the ACC), assists (4.4 apg / fourth in the ACC) and steals (1.1 spg). He scored his career-high of 35 points (the most by any ACC freshman this season), is ranked second among all freshman in scoring in the league statistics (13.6 ppg / Jahlil Okafor, Duke, 17.9 ppg), is ranked second among freshman in assists (4.4 apg / Tyus Jones, Duke, 5.6 apg) and earned his first career double double of 12 points and 11 assists in Florida State's win at Virginia Tech on February 7.

SEMINOLES TIED FOR THE LEAGUE LEAD

Florida State is tied for the league lead with six wins in games decided by four points or less or in overtime. The Seminoles are 6-3 (.667 winning percentage) and have won three of its last four games decided by that slim margin.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Miami and gain a regular season series sweep against Miami for the third time in the last six seasons. The Seminoles won the regular season series against the Hurricanes in both 2010 and 2011; ...Defeat Miami and gain its second regular season sweep of the 2014-15 season. The Seminoles defeated Virginia Tech (January 6, 86-75 and February 7, 73-65) to gain a sweep of the Hokies.

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 10 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played with 211 wins. The Seminoles average 21.7 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13) and 22-14 (2013-14).

FLORIDA STATE IN ACC PLAY IN THE LAST SEVEN SEASONS

In the last seven seasons (through February 3, 2015), Florida State is 67-46 (.592 winning percentage) and has finished in third place in the league standings three times in regular season ACC play. The Seminoles average 10.1 ACC regular season wins per season and have finished in the top four of the ACC standings four times in the last six seasons. Florida State is third in the ACC in conference wins with 67 and third in winning percentage at .593.

FLORIDA STATE FROM DISTANCE IN ACC PLAY

Florida State has greatly improved its 3-point shooting since ACC play began in earnest in January. The Seminoles enter Wednesday's game against Miami as the sixth-best 3-point shooting team in the ACC in its 15 conference games. The Seminoles average 5.3 made 3-point field goals in conference play as compared to 3.2 made 3-point field in its 13 non-conference games.

FLORIDA STATE PROTECTING THE RIM IN ACC PLAY

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Miami as the leader in overall blocked shots in conference play. The Seminoles have blocked a league leading 78 shots in 15 conference games and average 5.2 blocked shots per game in ACC play. The Seminoles have blocked at least nine shots in three difference ACC games (against Wake Forest, against Virginia Tech and at Georgia Tech) and have won all three games.

FLORIDA STATE VS. MIAMI – THE LAST GAME

Montay Brandon scored 18 points on 7-of-7 shooting, and Florida State rallied from a 16-point first-half deficit to beat No. 23 Miami 55-54 on February 1, 2015 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Hurricanes' Sheldon McClellan missed a floater in the lane as time expired. Brandon had 12 of his points in the second half to spark the rally for Florida State. Kiel Turpin added 10 points for the Seminoles, who shot 53.7 percent. Turpin put Florida State ahead for good with a baby hook with 1:41 left. McClellan led the Hurricanes with 13 points, and Davon Reed had 11 points and six rebounds. But Miami, which led 36-25 at the break, shot 6 of 19 in the second half and scored only 18 points. The Seminoles won despite committing 16 turnovers. But they had only five in the second half. Florida State went 10 minutes without a basket in the first half, and Miami's 19-1 run gave it a 30-14 lead with 3:12 left. Xavier Rathan-Mayes' 3-pointer at the end of the half pulled the Seminoles within 11. Brandon sparked the second-half comeback with a steal and a dunk, a 3-pointer and another steal and dunk to cut Miami's lead to 38-34 with 17:02 to go.

The Seminoles, though, have recovered from stiff halftime deficits to gain their wins over Wake Forest (January 28), Miami (February 1) and Boston College (February 18). The Seminoles trailed the Deacons by a 33-27 margin (-6) and outscored Wake Forest by a 38-32 margin the second half to send the game into overtime. Florida State outscored Wake Forest 17-11 combined in the two overtime periods. The Seminoles trailed by a 36-25 margin at the half against Miami before limiting the Hurricanes to 18 second half points and winning 55-54. The Seminoles held Miami scoreless over the final 3:46 of the game while outscoring the Hurricanes by a 2-0 margin to win the game. Florida State trailed Boston College by as many as 11 points in the first half and outscored the Eagles over 59-39 over the final 28:52 of the game to gain its seventh ACC win of the season. Florida State trailed Virginia by a 22-21 margin (-1) and outscored the Cavaliers by a 16-14 margin in the first 10 minutes of the second half to take a 37-36 lead on a jumper by Jarquez Smith at the 10:08 mark.

15 Junior Devon Bookert has scored in double figures 15 times in 23 games as a junior – he scored in double figures a career-high 16 times in 36 games as a sophomore. Bookert has scored in double figures in 40 games during his 93-game career as a Seminole.

15 Junior Montay Brandon has scored in double figures more times this season (15) than he did in his first two seasons combined (13).

Freshman Phil Cofer, who totaled his ACC career-high of 11 rebounds against Pitt on January 14, is Florida State's second leading rebounder with 134 rebounds and a 4.8 rebounds per game average. His 134 rebounds and his 4.8 rebounds per game averages are both currently the eighth highest single season totals/averages by a Seminole freshman in school history.

Seminole Signee Bacon Named To McDonald's All-American Team

Dwayne Bacon, one of the top high school basketball players in the nation, has been named to the prestigious McDonald's All-American Team. He has signed a National Letter of Intent to play for Head Coach Leonard Hamilton at Florida State beginning in the fall of 2015.

The McDonald's All-American Team is the best-known of the high-school basketball All-American teams. Having the designation of McDonald's All-American instantly brands a player as one of the top high school players in the United States or Canada.

"It is a tremendous honor for Dwayne to be named to the McDonald's All-American team," said Hamilton. "We are elated for him as the honor of being named a McDonald's All-American is a very prestigious one and defines how hard he has worked to become an outstanding player and an even better young man. The additions of Dwayne, Malik Beasley, Terance Mann and Chris Koumadje to the Seminole family raise the level of back to as a team of significance in the greatest basketball conference in the country and in all of college basketball."

Bacon (Lakeland, Fla.) has led Oak Hill to a 32-0 record while averaging 24.2 points, 4.4 rebounds and 3.1 assists. He scored 32 points and earned MVP honors against Cape Henry at the High School Winter Classic Basketball Challenge and totaled 33 points as he powered the Warriors past Villa Angela St. Joseph High School. Bacon has scored 30 or more points in three straight games, including 33 in the championship game at the Bass Pro Shops Tournament where he also earned MVP honors and scored 36 points in a win over Word of God. Oak Hill is the No. 2 ranked prep team in the nation.

Beasley (Alpharetta, Ga.) has led St. Francis High School to an 18-3 record while averaging 22.4 points, 7.7 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 2.0 steals per game. He totaled 24 points and eight rebounds against Pinecrest, scored 29 points to go along with six rebounds and five assists against Whitefield and totaled 17 points and seven rebounds in one half of play against Fellowship Christian School.

The selection of Bacon to the McDonald's All-American team marks the fourth elected to the team who have been recruited by Hamilton to play at Florida State. Hamilton also recruited Michael Snaer (2009), Chris Singleton (2008) and Von Wafer (2003) -- three players who enjoyed stellar careers as Seminoles.

Also joining the Seminoles' top-five ranked recruiting class is center Jean Marc Christ Koumadje (7-4, 220) and versatile forward Terance Mann (6-5, 210) who are also enjoying stellar high school seasons.

Mann (Tilton, N.H.) has led Tilton to a 20-1 record while averaging 21 points and 9 rebounds a game. Mann scored his 1,000th career point for during Tilton's recent trip to Manchester, England where he was named the MVP of the Haris Memorial Tournament. He recently totaled 13 points, 12 rebounds and four assists in a 76-58 win over Marianapolis High School on January 24.

Mann was the Seminoles' first signee of their 2015 recruiting class. He pledged his commitment to Hamilton and his staff prior to his official visit during the fall of 2014. Mann is incredibly smart both on and off of the court who's very high basketball IQ and incredible versatility has allowed him to become very skilled at playing four positions on the court.

Koumadje (Chad, Nigeria), who will become the tallest player in school history when he enrolls for the fall 2015 semester, is a member of the nation's No. 1 prep team at Montverde Academy in Montverde, Fla. Koumadje is averaging 7.0 points and 4.0 blocked shots per game as a senior.

SMITH DISPLAYING HIS 3-POINT SHOOTING ABILITIES

Sophomore Jarquez Smith, who is ranked fourth among his Seminole teammates with six made 3-point shots, has made one 3-point shot in four of the last five games and is shooting .500 from the 3-point line (four of eight) in that span of five games. He made one 3-point shot in wins over Virginia Tech (February 7), at Georgia Tech (February 14) and against Boston College (February 18) and was a perfect one of one from distance against Duke in Tallahassee on Feb. 9.

SMITH ALSO DRAWING PRAISE ON THE DEFENSIVE ENDS OF THE COURT

Sophomore Jarquez Smith is ranked second on the team in blocked shots with 32 and a career-high of 1.1 blocked shots per game. He has blocked 19 shots in the last 15 games (1.3 bpg) including tying his ACC career high of three blocked shots at North Carolina (January 24) and at Georgia tech (February 14) and blocked his career high of six shots in the Seminoles' victory over USF on December 20 at the Orange Bowl Classic in Sunrise, Fla.

RATHAN-MAYES APPROACHING FLORIDA STATE FRESHMAN RECORD

Freshman Xavier Rathan-Mayes enters Wednesday's game against Miami with 367 total points and a 13.6 points per game scoring average. He is on the verge of becoming the all-time leading freshman scorer in school history and setting a school record for points in a game by a freshman. He is currently chasing Seminole great and All-American Bob Sura who scored a Florida State freshman standard 380 points (Rathan-Mayes needs 14 points to surpass Sura) and is averaging a Seminole freshman record 13.6 points scored per game. Sura is Florida State's all-time scoring leader with 2,130 points.

Freshman Xavier Rathan-Mayes earned the first double double of his career with a 12 point and 11 assist performance in the Seminoles' 73-65 victory over Virginia Tech on February 7. His assists set a school record for assists by a freshman and were the most by a Seminole player since Luke Loucks totaled an ACC Tournament championship game record of 13 assists against North Carolina on March 11, 2012. CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. -- Anthony Gill had 13 points and nine rebounds, Darion Atkins scored 11 and Malcolm Brogdon 10 to lead No. 2/3 Virginia to a 51-41 win over Florida State in a game which was close throughout. The Seminoles took the lead for the only time in the second half at 37-36 on a jumper by Jarquez Smith with 10:33 to go, then did not make another field goal as the Cavaliers' nation-leading scoring defense (50.8 PPG) tightened. Once Florida State went ahead, seldom-used guard Devon Hall, in the game in place of London Perrantes, put Virginia back ahead with a reverse layup on the Cavaliers' next possession, and while the game stayed close, Virginia didn't trail again. Xavier Rathan-Mayes scored 13 to lead the Seminoles. Florida State shot just 32.6 percent. The game figured to be low scoring with Virginia leading the nation in scoring defense at 50.8 points per game and the Seminoles also defense-minded, and both teams had long scoring droughts by halftime. The Seminoles went 5:50 without a point in falling behind 12-4 after eight minutes. Virginia managed only six points during the stretch, and after Mike Tobey's free throw gave them a 13-6 lead, the Cavaliers went cold, failing to score for the next 6:19. Florida State used a 10-0 run to take a 16-13 lead.
