#### RED HOT CANES TO FACE NC STATE ON THE ROAD

The University of Miami women's basketball team is heading to Raleigh to face NC State Thursday at 7 p.m. at historic Reynolds Coliseum.

The No. 6 Canes have won 11 consecutive games - the 10th-best streak in the nation - and have had recent success agaisnt the Wolfpack, winning the last three matchups. However, Miami has never won at Reynolds in six attempts.

#### STEPPING UP

When Miami's junior forward Morgan Stroman went down with a season-ending achilles injury, a huge void was left for the Canes. Not one member of the team can completely fill that void, but none has done more than Stefanie Yderstrom to help Miami since.

Before the Stroman injury. Yderstrom averaged 9.1 points per game and scored in double figures in nine of 19 games. In the six games since, the Swede has scored in double digits five times, twice setting her career high with 22 points vs. Virginia Tech and 26 at No. 8 Maryland, Over that span, the 5-8 guard has averaged 15.3 points and has connected on 15 threepointers.

#### CANES MATCH HIGHEST RANKING IN HISTORY

The Hurricanes, who finished the 2010-2011 season ranked tenth in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll, moved up three spots in anticipation of their 2011-12 season. The No. 7 ranking in the Coaches' Poll is the highest rank in program history to begin a season.

The Hurricanes were also ranked No. 7 in the preseason Associated Press Poll.

Miami is currently ranked 6th in both the AP and Coaches Polls - tied for the highest ranking in school history.

#### UM DUO HONORED ON WOODEN AND USBWA LISTS

Miami Hurricanes Shenise Johnson and Riguna Williams have been named to the Women's Midseason Nominee List for the 2011 John R. Wooden Award and the USBWA National Player of the Year Award. The Midseason Lists names the Top 20 candidates for each award.

#### SHENISE DAZZLES IN SCORING 2.000 POINTS

Miami's versatile senior guard Shenise Johnson became the fourth player in program history to reach the 2,000-point plateau. Needing 15 points to reach the milestone heading into UM's Jan. 15 contest at Florida State, Johnson started the game on fire, hitting seven of her first 10 shots. Her final bucket of the half, a lavup coming off of a Seminole turnover, proved to be her 15th point of the game. Johnson would finish the contest with a game-best 24 points, leading the Canes to victory - the first win in nearly 25 years at Florida State.

Johnson currently has 2,137 points and needs just 47 to pass Frances Savage (1988-92) for third place on the school all-time scoring list.

#### **RIOUNA JOINS THE GROUP**

The Canes are treated to a pair of offensively gifted guards. In UM's last game against Clemson on Feb. 5, Riguna Williams reached the 2.000-point milestone herself. The Pahokee, Fla. native needed six points to reach the mark and she did so quickly, hitting two firsthalf three-pointers. She ended the game with 15 points. Miami is the only team in the nation with two 2,000-point scorers

Williams currently ranks fifth in program history with 2.041 points.

#### PROTECTING THE BANKUNITED CENTER

With Miami's season-opening win over Texas-Pan American, the Canes won their 25th-consecutive home contest - setting a new program record.

Miami has extended that record to 38 games after its 61-37 victory over No. 22 North Carolina on Feb. 8. The streak is currently the third-longest active streak in the nation. Connecticut (98) and Stanford (75) are the two teams with longer active win streaks. Coincidentally, Stanford's Tara VanDerveer, Connecticut's Geno Auriemma and Miami's Katie Meier shared last season's AP National Coach of the Year Award.

The streak began with the team's final regular season home game of the 2009-10 season and continued with a perfect 20-0 home record last season.

The previous record of 24 straight wins at home was set from the 1990-91 through the 1992-93 seasons.

#### **ON THE VERGE OF GREATNESS**

With just 42 more rebounds, senior Shenise Johnson will become just the third player in NCAA Division I women's basketball history to score 2,000 points, pull down 1,000 rebounds and dish out 500 assists in a career.

After a nationwide survey, it was found that Stanford's Nicole Powell (2000-04) and Old Dominion's Nancy Lieberman (1976-1980) are the only other women to accomplish the feat.

#### SHOWTIME

Miami senior guard Riquna Williams has saved her best performances for the biggest games. Against No. 11 Rutgers, the 5-6 Pahokee, Fla, native poured in a careerhigh 36 points in the double-overtime victory. Then, against an undefeated and fifth-ranked Maryland team, Williams matched a career-best with eight three-pointers, leading her team to a 75-63 win.

## A PROGRAM FIRST

For the first time in the history of the program, the Hurricanes defeated a Top 5 team. Maryland visited the BankUnited Center on Jan. 12 with a perfect 16-0 record and a No. 5 national ranking.

Miami, behind 34 points from Riquna Williams, defeated the Terrapins 75-63. At the time, Maryland was the highest scoring team in the nation and were also ranked No. 1 nationally in rebound differential. The Canes held the Terps to 21 points below their season average and outrebounded them 48-40.

## APPLYING THE HEAT

At 14.1 steals per game, the Canes rank No. 2 in the nation. Shenise Johnson, with 3.8 thefts per contest, is No. 1 in the ACC and ranks 6th nationally. Riquna Williams isn't too far off, recording 2.3 steals per game. In all, UM forces 24.4 turnovers per game and scores 26.7 points per game off of them, 13.4 points per game more than its opponents.

## UM GREAT JAMES NAMED AN ACC LEGEND

The Atlantic Coast Conference announced its eighth annual class of ACC Women's Basketball Legends and Miami great Tamara James will be among the honorees. The Legends Class of 2012 will be honored at the 2012 ACC Women's Basketball Tournament. which will be held March 1-4 at the Greensboro Coliseum.

The all-time leading scorer in women's basketball for the Miami Hurricanes. Tamara James set a scoring record for men and women in her four-year career at Miami with 2,406 points. James was named first-team All-ACC in 2005 and 2006 and first-team All-Big East in 2004. She led the ACC in scoring both of years in the conference, averaging 22.3 in 2005 and 21.5 in 2006.

### MORE HARDWARE FOR THE TROPHY CASE

With back-to-back double-doubles in the Miami Holiday Tournament, Shenise Johnson led the Hurricanes to wins over Holy Cross and VCU. For her performance in the two-day event, the senior guard was named the Tournament's Most Outstanding Player. Earlier in the season, Johnson was named the Most Outstanding Player of the Great Alaska Shootout.

### A QUARTER CENTURY OF FUTILITY... OVER

For the first time since Ian, 29, 1987, the Hurricanes defeated Florida State in Tallahassee. Miami had lost its last nine meetings in the state capital prior to its Jan. 15 win. Miami raced to a 19-point lead early in the seond half. However, the Seminoles rallied late to tie the game at 57. Stefanie Yderstrom nailed a corner three with 17 seconds left that proved to be the game-winner.

#### SWEDISH THREE-BALLS

Junior Stefanie Yderstrom leads the ACC with 55 three-pointers this season. The Ostertalie. Sweden native now has 155 career three-point field goals - second in program history, However, Riguna Williams is far and away the school's most prolific three-point shooter, sinking 258 for her career.

## "EPIC" PERFORMANCE

After rolling her ankle in Miami's win at Michigan State on Dec. 1, it wasn't a guarantee that Riquna Williams would play against No. 11 Rutgers on Dec. 5. Not only did Williams play, she scored a career-best 36 points. Williams only had five points at halftime, but poured in 31 in the second half and two overtime sessions in helping the Canes erase a 16-point second-half deficit and defeat the Scarlet Knights, 92-81.

## MORE THAN ANY OTHER

After wins over Rutgers (12/5) - 36 points - and Ole Miss (12/10) - 17 points - Riquna Williams was voted the ACC Player of the Week for the seventh time in her career. No other active player has earned the award more than Williams. Second place on that list with six awards is Shenise Johnson.

### MORE TO COME

National Player of the Year candidate Shenise Johnson ranks in the Top 10 of many categories for UM career records including points (4th), assists (5th), rebounds (2nd), and steals (2nd). Johnson is the only player in Miami history to be ranked in the Top 10 of all four of those categories.

#### THE ACC KNOWS

Johnson, the ACC Preseason Player of the Year and a preseason All-American, scored a game-high 18 points in a 72-55 victory over Alaska Anchorage in the Great Alaska Shootout's first round, earning Player of the Game honors. In the tournament final against USF, Johnson nearly recorded a triple-double with 11 points, nine rebounds and nine assists. For her performance in the two games, Johnson was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

The Henrietta, N.Y., native amassed game-highs in points (22), rebounds (6), assists (8) and steals (7) against Longwood in a 92-43 victory to wrap up the week.

### HIGH PRAISE FOR THE CANES

After Miami defeated Michigan State in the Big Ten/ ACC Challenge, Spartan head coach Suzy Merchant said, "I'm not surprised. We knew what they were going to do. We practiced against six and seven guys on our scout team. But from 1 to 5, that's the fastest, most athletic team we've faced in my career. We've played Duke, and it's not even close."

ULM's Mona Martin had even more praise to hand out, saying, "Last year we played Texas A&M, and they end up winning the thing [NCAA title], and I think this UM team could be a big contender for the national championship if they stay healthy," Martin said. "They have so much depth, play so hard. They're going to be way up there this year. I've watched a lot of film, lot of ballgames, and they run the floor better than any team I've watched from point guard to post. Their transition offense is unbelievable. I can't say we've ever played a team that runs the floor that well, and I've been in this business 36 years. There is a lot of desire and fight in those kids."

#### JOHNSON TABBED ACC PRESEASON POY

Shenise Johnson returns as the 2011-12 ACC Preseason Player of the Year. The senior was named the 2010-11 ACC Player of the Year, the first Hurricane player to win the award, and voted to last year's All-ACC First Team and All-ACC Defensive team.

#### MIAMI DUO NAMED PRESEASON ALL-ACC

The Preseason All-ACC Team is highlighted by the Miami senior guard tandem of Johnson and Williams. The two led the Canes to a 20-0 home record last season at the BankUnited Center.

Johnson, the first Associate Press Preseason All-American in team history, earned 2010-11 ACC Player of the Year honors and her second straight selection to the All-ACC First Team. Williams, who led the conference and finished 11th in the nation in scoring, is also coming off a selection to the All-ACC First Team.

#### CANE NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

University of Miami senior guard Shenise Johnson was one of five players named to the Associated Press Preseason All-America Team.

Johnson, who earned 25 of 40 potential votes, was joined on the preseason team by Baylor's Brittney Griner (40 votes), Notre Dame's Skylar Diggins (37), Stanford's Nnemkadi Ogwumike (37) and Tennessee's Shekinna Stricklen (21).

## 2010-11 Season Recap

#### MIAMI FINISHES MEMORABLE SEASON

The 2010-11 University of Miami women's basketball team finished one of the best seasons in program history with an 88-83 loss to 21st-ranked and sixth seeded Oklahoma in the second round of the NCAA Tournament at John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville, Va.

The Hurricanes finished 28-5, recording the most wins since the 1991-92 team tallied 30 victories.

#### STRONG NON-CONFERENCE RECORD

Miami took care of business in the non-conference portion of the schedule, going 15-2 outside the ACC. Their signature win was the 81-72 victory over No. 20/12 Georgetown on Dec. 7 to establish the Canes as a national contender.

#### 20-20

Miami won 20 games for the 10th time in program history. Following the 22-14 record in 2009-10, it was the first time the team had consecutive 20-win seasons since the 1988-89 season through the 1991-92.

#### DANCING

Miami earned a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament in the Dayton Region. It was the first time since 2004 that the program advanced to the "Big Dance."

The Canes won their first round match up 80-62 over No. 14 Gardner-Webb at John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville, Va. behind 18 points from junior Shenise Johnson to setup a second-round game against No. 6 Oklahoma. It was the first win in the NCAA Tournament for the Hurricanes since 1993.

#### WILLIAMS ALSO HONORED

Riquna Williams also picked up a number of accolades throughout the season, including being named to the All-ACC First Team. The guard was named ACC Player of the Week on four occasions throughout the year, and was a finalist for the WBCA/State Farm All-America team.

#### KATIE MEIER EARNS MAJOR AWARDS

Head coach Katie Meier picked up several high-profile postseason awards for her success on the year. Meier was tabbed by the Associated Press as its Coach of the Year, sharing the award with Connecticut's Geno Auriemma and Stanford's Tara VanDerveer.

In addition, she took home the Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year Award and RUSSELL ATHLETIC/ WBCA Region 2 Division I Coach of the Year honors, an award voted on by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

Meier also won the Babe Didrickson Zaharias award and gained entrance to UM's prestigious Iron Arrow Society – known as the highest honor attained at the university.

#### JOHNSON RECOGNIZED FOR SEASON

Shenise Johnson had one of the best seasons of any player in the country, earning a litany of awards for her efforts. Prior to the ACC Tournament, the junior was named ACC Player of the Year, the first Hurricane player to win the award, and voted to the All-ACC First Team and All-ACC Defensive team. In addition, the league honored her with Player of the Week on Jan. 3.

Johnson also earned spots on the Associated Press Third Team All-America, Full Court Press Second Team All-America, USBWA All-America and WBCA/State Farm All-America teams. She was also a finalist for the Wooden Award given to the top player in women's basketball.

#### ACC TOURNAMENT

Miami earned the No. 2 seed in the 2011 ACC Tournament at the Greensboro Coliseum in Greensboro, N.C., receiving a first-round bye. The Canes drew NC State in the quarterfinals, defeating the Wolfpack 93-85 with four players scoring at least 15 points. In the semifinals, North Carolina jumped out to a big lead and never looked back, routing Miami 83-57 to end the tournament for the Canes.

#### **100 HURRICANE VICTORIES**

Head coach Katie Meier won her 100th game at the helm of the Hurricanes with the team's March 20th victory over Gardner-Webb in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The sixth-year head coach is just the third coach in the program's 40-year history to reach the milestone.

#### UP AND DOWN THE COURT

Katie Meier's fast-paced offense averaged 79.9 points per game – fourth highest in the country. The Canes beat up on a number of opponents, with a +17.2 scoring margin – 12th-best in NCAA Division I out of 333 teams.

#### SCORING TITLE

Riquna Williams led the ACC in scoring last season, averaging 21.7 points per game. Williams also totaled the most overall points in the league with 717 on the year. Shenise Johnson finished the season right behind her in scoring, finishing second in the conference at 19.6 points per game.

#### HISTORIC WINNING STREAK

Miami won 17 straight games overall from Nov. 17-Jan. 24 - the second longest streak in program history and at one point the longest active streak in the country. The Hurricanes have only reached a winning streak of at least 10 games five times previously and it was the first such streak for the 'Canes since the 1992-93 season, in which they won 10 consecutive games. The longest winning streak in team history occurred during the 1991-92 season, when Miami won 30 straight games.

#### GIMME THAT

The Canes finished second in the nation with 13.7 steals per game. Morgan Stroman averaged the fifthmost steals per game, 3.7, with Shenise Johnson ranking tenth in the country at 3.2 per contest. Stroman, Johnson and Riquna Williams (2.8/game) were the top three stealers in the ACC. Miami grabbed a season-high 21 steals on three occasions – against Clemson, Lipscomb and Kennesaw State.

Bolstered by their steals, the Hurricanes also finished fourth in the nation in turnover margin (+7.97).

#### NOT CLOSE

## Head Coach Katie Meier

Katie Meier enters her seventh season as the head coach of the Hurricanes' women's basketball program in 2011-12. A well known and respected figure in women's basketball, Meier has worked tirelessly to put her mark on Miami's program and to build a winning tradition. All of her hard work was rewarded after the 2010-11 season as she was named the Associated Press National Coach of the Year - sharing the award with Connecticut's Geno Auriemma and Stanford's Tara VanDerveer.

Meier led the Hurricanes into the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2004 and its win over Gardner-Webb in the first round was the first tournament win for the 'Canes since 1993. Miami entered the 2010-11 season with high internal expectations, but were picked eighth in the Preseason ACC Poll and were coming off a season in which it was the No. 12 seed in the ACC Tournament.

However, the Hurricanes exceeded all of the outside expectations and at one point, won 17 straight games. They were a perfect 20-0 inside the BankUnited Center and finished 12-2 in ACC play - earning their first regular season conference title since joining the league in 2004. As a reward, Meier was named the

ACC Coach of the Year and later would be selected as the WBCA/RUSSELL ATHLETIC Region 2 Coach of the Year, as voted on by her peers.

Hired on April 19, 2005, then UM Athletics Director Paul Dee announced the appointment of Meier in front of national and local media, fans, alumni and support staff, signifying the beginning of a new era.

Following an unprecedented career as one of the greatest athletes to ever play in the Atlantic Coast Conference, Meier quickly established herself in the coaching ranks. Upon her appointment at UM, following an impressive four-year tenure as the head coach at Charlotte where she helped bring the 49er program into national prominence, Meier made it clear that her goal is to make Miami one of the premier women's basketball programs in the country.

In her first season, Meier wasted little time in making the first steps towards those goals. After receiving little attention in the ACC preseason polls, the Hurricanes posted an impressive overall record of 17-13. After fighting through a conference that would send nine teams to the postseason, including three to the NCAA Final Four. Miami finished with a sixth-place, 6-8 record in ACC play en route to earning a berth into the second round of the 2006 Women's National Invitation Tournament.

Throughout the season Miami posted wins over ranked teams such as Mississippi (No. 25), Boston College (No. 21) and Virginia Tech (No. 25)-and nearly knocked off then-No. 1 Duke in double-overtime. The Hurricanes also recorded wins over two eventual conference champions in Hartford (America East) and Oakland (Mid-Continent). Under her direction, standout Tamara James produced one of the greatest seasons ever seen by a UM player in 2005-06, including becoming the University's all-time leading scorer before being taken as the No. 8 overall pick in the 2006 WNBA Draft by the Washington Mystics.

In Meier's second season in 2006-07, the Hurricanes got off to a strong start, winning seven of their first eight games--including a 79-70 win over Indiana to claim the UM Thanksgiving Tournament title. On Dec. 1, Meier picked up her 100th career victory as the Hurricanes defeated Jackson State, 77-50. However, with only eight healthy players to call upon by the start of the ACC schedule, Miami faced challenge after challenge competing in a league that ranked among the top-three strongest women's basketball conferences nationally and produced two of the NCAA Tournament's four No. 1 seeds in 2006-07.

Regardless, Renee Taylor emerged as the ACC's leading scorer-upholding Miami's streak of producing the league's leading scorer in all three years it had been a member. The AlI-ACC Second Team selection set school records in singlegame scoring with 42 points at Houston and became the 19th Hurricane to score at least 1,000 points-and just the sixth to do so in her first two seasons. In addition, transfer Maurita Reid emerged as a defensive threat, tying the school record with 10 steals versus Wake Forest and finishing among the ACC's leaders and NCAA's top 10 in steals per game.

The 2007-08 season, Meier's third with the Hurricanes, saw Maurita Reid continue her rise among the ACC elite. The senior was nothing short of impressive shooting beyond the arc and picking opponent's pockets. She hit four or more three-pointers on 10 different occasions and finished the season with 110 steals, good for second in the conference and fifth in the NCAA. The Queens, N.Y. native led the team in points (15.3 ppg) and rebounding (5.6 rpg) and was also named the ACC All-Defensive Team.

With a No. 21 incoming recruiting class, Meier and the Hurricanes saw significant improvement during the 2008-09 season. The freshman class was highlighted by McDonald's All-American Shenise Johnson - out of Henrietta, N.Y. and Riquna Williams - from nearby Pahokee, Fla.

Johnson lived up to the hype as she was the team leader on the season in points, rebounds, assists and steals. Under Meier's guidance, Johnson was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on three occasions and was named to the ACC All-Freshmen team as well as ACC Honorable Mention. The versatile guard/forward also led the U19 USA team to a gold medal finish in the 2009 World Championships in Bangkok, Thailand.

The 2009-10 season was one of the most successful in program history. Under Meier's vision, the Hurricanes advanced to the WNIT Championship game. Miami posted a 22-14 overall record - the first 20-win campaign since the 2002-03 season and just the eighth all-time.

In her sophomore season, Johnson was joined by a healthy Riquna Williams and the duo racked up accolades throughout the season. Johnson was named First Team All-ACC, while Williams garnered second-team honors. The tandem led Miami to a 5-1 WNIT record - the deepest postseason run in team history - with both earning all-tournament honors along the way.

Following the 2009-10 campaign, University of Miami Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt announced that Meier signed a contract extension through 2015.

"We are excited about the tremendous progress our women's basketball team achieved this past season," said Hocutt. "Coach Meier continues to assemble a special group of talented young women at the University of Miami and we look forward to the future success of our program."



# MIAMI 83, TEXAS-PAN AMERICAN - NOV. 11, 2011

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - Miami was leading by 20 points, and coach Katie Meier was steaming mad at halftime anyway

"You are plaving," she said, "as bad as my haircut."

OK, so Meier's locks were a bit out of place Friday. Maybe it was worth a bad hair day to see national player of the year candidate Shenise Johnson come within an assist of a triple-double, have nine different players score and the seventh-ranked Hurricanes open their season with an 83-37 win over Texas-Pan American.

Johnson finished with 20 points, 13 rebounds and nine assists, Riguna Williams scored 16 points and the Hurricanes (1-0) forced 35 turnovers on the way to winning their 25th straight game at home, a program record.

"Not quite sure exactly why we were so awkward to start the game," said Meier, who won the AP's national coach of the year award last season. "I don't know a better word. It just felt very awkward. There was no flow, there was no rhythm, there was no energy and that was really disappointing. ... I'm sure it had to do a lot with Texas-Pan Am.'

Say this for Texas-Pan American: The Broncs weren't intimidated early. Miami's lead was only 24-13 with less than 4 minutes left in the first half before the Hurricanes hit five straight shots, the last two by Stefanie Yderstrom.

The Hurricanes were shooting 23 percent late in the half then shot 54 percent the rest of the way. "We found out what you have to do and how hard to you have to play to play against a team like this," Broncs coach Denny Downing said. "I think we learned from their passion, because obviously they're very passionate about what they're doing."

LaQuita Garner scored 14 for the Broncs (0-1). Texas-Pan American played some of the Big 12's toughest teams last season - Baylor, Texas, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State - and lost them all by an average of 50.8 points.

This one didn't seem as though it would turn into one of those blowouts, not the way the Broncs hung around for much of the first half.

Yderstrom and Morgan Stroman scored 12 each for the Hurricanes, who visit No. 3 Tennessee on Tuesday

"We had it in mind." Yderstrom acknowledged afterward, when asked about the looming trip to Knoxville. "You can't overlook any competition. I think they gave us a good game, especially in the first half. We needed it."

Johnson was nearly perfect on the day. She shot 6 for 9 from the field, made all eight of her foul shots and controlled pace for the Hurricanes.

"The opponent is our opponent," Johnson said. "But if Miami does what Miami is supposed to do, we'll win. I don't think we were looking ahead. I think we were just worried about Miami.

And while it was the beginning of a season with Final Four hopes, Miami's start was more than a little rustv.

Miami was 6 for 26 from the field in the first 16 minutes, an uncharacteristic clip for a team that shot 43 percent last season. Here's a great example of how cold the Hurricanes were in the opener: There was one possession where four players all missed shots and Miami came away empty, a series that had Meier pivoting around and taking a somewhat purposeful walk a few steps down the sideline.

Eventually, the defending Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season co-champions got going, making their final five shots of the opening half. Yderstrom hit a 3-pointer with 1:22 left to push the lead to 33-13. and she converted a nifty reverse layup about a minute later to keep the margin at 20 points going into halftime

So while Miami couldn't have liked the offensive numbers in the first 20 minutes, the defense made up for at least some of the trouble at the other end. In the first half, Texas-Pan American had 21 shot attempts - and 20 turnovers, unable to handle Miami's pressure.

In the second half, the offensive surge just kept going. The Hurricanes made seven of their first 13 shots after intermission, capped by a three-point play by Pepper Wilson with 13:14 left that gave Miami a 54-28 lead.

"Our bench did a fantastic job of changing our rhythm," Meier said. "And that's fun."

# TENNESSEE 92, MIAMI 76 - NOV. 15, 2011

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP) - Pat Summitt has fielded plenty of questions about her health lately. Certainly nothing has changed about her ability to grill her players at halftime when she's disappointed in their performance.

The third-ranked Lady Vols came into halftime tied at 42 with seventh-ranked Miami after being manhandled on the boards. Summitt got onto them hard during her halftime speech, and they responded with a 92-76 victory on Tuesday night in the State Farm Tip-Off Classic.

"If you ever doubt if Pat Summitt is still coaching, look at how our team responds coming out in the second half," associate head coach Holly Warlick said. "She got on them pretty hard. We all did as a staff about our rebounding effort, our hustle plays that weren't there. We challenged them for 20 minutes, and I think they responded."

It was the first big test of the season for two veteran teams, and the matchup lived up to its billing in the first-ever meeting for the programs.

Though the game pitted preseason All-Americans Shekinna Stricklen and Shenise Johnson ag one another, the spotlight was stolen by Taber Spani and Meighan Simmons, who together hit 7 of 13 from 3-point range.

The Lady Vols (2-0) came out after intermission and unleashed an 18-4 run to take control. Glo Johnson, who struggled in the first half against Miami's inside defense, hit a layup that made it 60-46 with 16:19 to go.

The Lady Vols got sloppy, committing three turnovers that helped the Hurricanes charge back with nine unanswered points to cut the margin to seven, and with 7:31 to go, Shenise Johnson hit a jumper to cut the Lady Vols' lead to 73-68.

Miami (1-1) would get no closer. Two possessions later, Spani took an inbound pass with 10 seconds on the shot clock and launched a 3-pointer that hit nothing but net as the buzzer sounded.

"I thought that was the turning point of the game, as we were struggling kind of to get back in it," Miami coach Katie Meier said.

A couple of minutes later, Spani rebounded a missed 3-point attempt by Shenise Johnson and launched the ball across the court to Simmons, who charged to the basket for a layup to make it 84-68.

The basket capped an 11-0 run that began with Spani's trey and sent the orange-clad crowd into a frenzy. "I think it's more mental than anything else," said Spani, who played 39 minutes. "Obviously all of us have shot millions of shots throughout our careers, so it's just a mindset going in and knowing that you can knock down shots."

Simmons scored 18 points, Glory Johnson finished with 16 and nine rebounds, Stricklen added 15 points and Ariel Massengale had 11 points and nine assists.

"I thought across the board, everybody contributed in certain ways," Summitt said. "It's just a matter of who's coming in. At any given moment, we've got enough people that somebody's going to step up."

The Tennessee coaches expected a strong rebounding effort by the Lady Vols, so they instead asked the players to focus on not turning the ball over. By halftime, Tennessee had just six turnovers but had 13 fewer rebounds than Miami.

By the end of the game, the Lady Vols had put enough an effort on the boards to trail the Hurricanes 45-38 in rebounding, and it was Miami that was strugging to hang onto the ball. The Hurricanes turned the ball over 21 times, leading to 23 points for the Lady Vols - 10 more than Miami got off giveaways.

Riquna Williams, who led the Atlantic Coast Conference in scoring a season ago, sank 24 points for Miami. Shenise Johnson added 17 and Morgan Stroman scored 11. The stingy defensive play by both teams forced the ball to the hands of the outside shooters during

the first half, leading four lead changes and two ties. Miami took an early edge after scoring eight unanswered points. Williams and Stefanie Yderstorm

each had a 3, while Stroman hit a pair of free throws to take an 8-2 lead, their largest margin of the first half.

A few minutes later. Tennessee went on an 8-0 run of its own, capped by a 3-pointer by Simmons off a dish by Massengale. The basket gave the Lady Vols an 18-16 lead - their first since the opening basket. They slowly built their margin to 38-31 on a jumper in the paint by Alicia Manning with 4:52 in the first half, but Miami scored the final five points of the half to tie it at the break.

"Our confidence was high," Shenise Johnson said. "(The score) was zero-zero."

The teams launched a flurry of long shots during their streaks, and the Lady Vols hit 7 of 13 and Miami 6 of 14 from behind the arc in the first half. Tennessee finished 11 of 22 from long range, while Miami missed all nine of its second-half attempts.

The Lady Vols have now won 38 straight games at home on the court named for Summitt, dating to a 62-54 loss to Duke on Feb. 16, 2009. They travel to Virginia on Sunday before hosting No. 1 Baylor at The Summitt on Nov. 27.

Tennessee outscored the Hurricanes by 16 in the second half and defeated Miami, 92-76. Meier praised her team's defensive effort against Prairie View.

"We didn't like having 92 points scored against us," Meier said. "So we had a mission we were going to shut down and play defense.

"Those veterans, the starters, set the tone. They were the teachers."

# MIAMI 72, ALASKA ANCHORAGE 55- NOV. 55, 2011

ANCHORAGE, Alaska (AP)- Shenise Johnson scored 18 points and No. 9 Miami beat Alaska-Anchorage 72-55 on Wednesday night in the opening round of the Carrs-Safeway Great Alaska Shootout.

The Hurricanes (3-1) shot just 27 percent in the first half against the Division II Seawolves (4-1) and trailed much of the period. Alaska-Anchorage's biggest lead of the half was four, but Johnson's 3-pointer just before the first-half buzzer gave Miami a 28-26 lead.

# MIAMI 92, LONGWOOD 43 - NOV. 27, 2011

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - A 20-hour trip from Alaska failed to affect No. 9 Miami. Still shaking off jet-lag from their return home early Saturday morning, the Hurricanes wore down Longwood in a 92-43 rout Sunday afternoon.

Shenise Johnson scored 22 points on 9-of-11 shooting and had six assists to lead the Hurricanes (5-1). Morgan Stroman finished with 20 points, shooting 8 of 10 from the field. "We handled a very difficult travel situation, getting home at 1:30 in the morning and having practice

later," Miami coach Katie Meier said. "Flying through the night, grabbing a nap wherever you could, I'm really in awe of the maturity of this team. I'm really proud of them for how they handled it.

The Hurricanes, who defeated Alaska Anchorage and South Florida in the Great Alaska Shootout Nov. 23 and 24, dealt with a return flight to Coral Gables that was plagued by delays before takeoff and subsequent flight connections.

"It was chaotic, we were on the plane for two hours figuring out when we were going to leave, Johnson said. "I thought we did a great job of not complaining. Coach did a great job of keeping us calm. We were going to get home at some point." Longwood (1-5) could not capitalize.

The Hurricanes kept the Lancers scoreless for a 7:54 stretch of the first half and built a 48-22 lead with 2:01 remaining. Stroman scored six consecutive points on fast-break lavups during the stretch.

"I knew once I had the ball I could beat my defender so I just ran out in front," Stroman said. Miami expanded a 50-28 lead at halftime with a 16-4 spurt in the first 5:08 of the second half. Stroman's two free throws with 8:34 remaining gave the Hurricanes their first 40-point lead at 76-35. Miami had 20 steals and forced 28 Longwood turnovers and increased its home winning streak to

"I challenged the team at halftime to get their legs underneath them a little bit on defense." Meier said. "We had a goal that we wanted to hold Longwood under 40. To regroup at halftime and lock down on a 15-point performance I was very impressed with my team."

Mina Jovanic scored 12 points to lead the Lancers.

"They were much better than us," Longwood coach Bill Reinson said. "We couldn't stop them in transition. We didn't quit and fought down to the end. We continued to make plays. I feel we can build from this game.

The Hurricanes enjoyed a 17-2 run early in the first half. Krystal Saunders' basket with 13:22 remaining capped the run and gave Miami a 25-8 lead. Longwood rallied and outscored Miami 14-5 in the next 5:43. Brittani Billups' layup with 8:39

remaining ended the run and got the Lancers within eight at 30-22.

# MIAMI 76, MICHIGAN STATE 60 - DEC. 1, 2011

EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP) - Morgan Stroman scored 20 points in a near-perfect shooting night to lead No. 9 Miami past Michigan State 76-60 Thursday night in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge

Stroman had 13 points at the break, hitting all four of her shots from the field and all five at the line for the much quicker Hurricanes (6-1). She finished 7 for 7 and 6 for 7, respectively. Shenise Johnson added 13 points and Stefanie Yderstrom had 11 in Miami's second-closest game this season.

Porsche Poole had 17 points for the foul-plagued Spartans (5-3), who played without starters Lykendra Johnson and Taylor Alton for most of the first half. Michigan State trailed 38-26 at halftime.

Courtney Schiffauer and Jasmine Hines each had nine points for Michigan State, while Becca Mills grabbed nine rebounds, all in the first 20 minutes.

Miami forced the Spartans into 19 turnovers and had 11 steals. That was more than enough when Michigan State shot just 3 for 16 on 3s.

The Hurricanes shot 45 percent from the field, 30 percent on 3s (6 for 20) and 75 percent (12 for 16) on free throws. They had 15 assists and just 10 turnovers while running at every opportunity

The Spartans shot 42 percent from the field and 78 percent (7 for 9) at the line, and had a 37-34 edge in rebounds.

Miami point guard Riquna Williams went down with a left knee injury and was helped off the court with 1:16 left before halftime. She returned briefly in the second half and finished with nine points

The Hurricanes built a 36-20 edge with pressure defense, drives to the basket and a steady procession to the foul line. The Spartans had 13 turnovers in the first 20 minutes, when they were outscored 11-3 at the line.

With Johnson and Alton back in the lineup, Michigan State pulled to 46-36 on an off-balance jumper by Poole and made it an eight-point game on a layup by Alton.

Miami kept the Spartans at bay with five of their six 3s in the second half, two from deep in the right corner and one from up top by Yderstrom.

But Michigan State rallied again behind Schiffauer's aggression and Hines' strength inside. Annalise Pickrel's jumper with 6:14 to go pulled the Spartans to 59-52 with 6:14 left.

Stroman finally missed a free throw but made her second attempt, then converted a layup on a pass from Shenise Johnson to make it a 10-point game. On the Hurricanes' next possession, Yderstrom con nected again from 21 feet to make it 65-52.

# MIAMI 92, RUTGERS 81, 20T - DEC. 5, 2011

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - Riquna Williams said her stomach was still burning nearly an hour after the final whistle. Shenise Johnson limped with every step. Miami coach Katie Meier said she was looking for some oxygen.

A comeback for the ages left No. 9 Miami drained - but still perfect at home.

Williams scored a career-high 36 points, Johnson added 25 points and 12 rebounds and the Hur-ricanes knocked No. 11 Rutgers from the ranks of the unbeaten with a 92-81 double-overtime win Monday night, Miami's 28th straight in its own building. The Hurricanes trailed by 16 points with 17 minutes left in the second half, then started a most improbable rally against one of the nation's top defensive clubs. "You've got to be really cocky and have some really confident kids to think that you're coming back

from that one," Meier said. "You really do. Especially when you look over on the other bench and it's Rutgers, one of the best defensive teams in the history of women's basketball.'

A clash of styles - Miami's offense vs. Rutgers' defense - was all Scarlet Knights for the first 25 minutes. Rutgers (8-1) was up 40-24 early in the second half, and Meier acknowledged afterward that she thought the Hurricanes were in real trouble.

Miami outscored Rutgers 68-41 the rest of the way.

"I don't think we played scared at all," Rutgers coach C. Vivian Stringer said. "I don't think we played very smart.'

The Scarlet Knights got a layup from Erica Wheeler with 1.5 seconds left in regulation to force overtime and another game-tying shot from Betnijah Laney just before the buzzer and sending it to send it to a second OT.

But Williams took over for Miami in the second OT, hitting a pair of 3-pointers to get the Hurricanes going, and they survived. It was the first time Rutgers allowed 90 points since Jan. 2, 2003, and given the way the first 25 minutes of the game went, no one would have figured that was happening Monday night. Of course, the next 25 minutes were the ones that told the story.

"Awesome game," Johnson said. "My heart rate is still pumping. Credit goes to Rutgers. It was just a fun, fun game,'

April Sykes scored 19 points and grabbed 10 rebounds for Rutgers, Erica Wheeler scored 13 and Khadijah Rushdan added 10.

Miami trailed for all but 2:35 of regulation, and still had plenty of chances to win before the overtimes. Johnson went 2 for 4 from the foul line in the final 38 seconds of regulation, so the Hurricanes' lead

was never larger than two - giving Rutgers life. The Scarlet Knights took advantage. Taking possession with 10.7 seconds left in regulation, Rutgers got the ball down low to Oliver. She missed a layup, but Wheeler was there for the putback with 1.5

seconds to play in regulation, tying the game at 63. "We made a couple mistakes down the stretch," Wheeler said. "But it's a learning experience. We definitely are getting better from this situation."

Stefanie Yderstrom's 3-pointer gave the Hurricanes the lead with 1:47 left in the first overtime. She appeared to cramp up on the next possession, so Williams simply waited for her chance, connecting from beyond the arc to push the Miami lead to 71-67. And once again, Rutgers rallied - Sykes' 3 with a halfminute to play got the Scarlet Knights to 73-72, and when Laney knotted it, the Rutgers bench leaped for joy.

It was the Scarlet Knights' final celebration of the night.

"They've got to grow up - yesterday," Stringer said, unhappy that the chance was wasted. Rutgers came into the game having allowed only 70 points once - in the season opener - and on

a six-game streak of not allowing any more than 52 points. Opponents were shooting 31 percent and committing more than 20 turnovers a game against the Scarlet Knights through eight games, so the Hurricanes knew exactly what to expect.

So predictably, Rutgers' man-to-man gave Miami fits.

But the Hurricanes did little to help their own cause, missing at least nine shots near the rim in a 9-minute span of the first half alone, falling behind 31-22 going into the locker room - after the Scarlet Knights held them to 27 percent shooting. And when Rutgers started the second half on a 9-2 run, capped by a jumper from Sykes, the lead was 40-24 with 17:23 left.

With that, Meier called timeout, and something clicked, just in time.

"Gutsy," Meier said. "How are you gutsy when you're down 16? ... They were missing free throws they never miss, missing layups they never miss, and somehow still had the confidence. That's beyond me. That's them.'

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - Louisiana Monroe absorbed an early blow and never recovered against Miami. Riquna Williams, Shenise Johnson and Krystal Saunders each scored 16 points, and the No. 7 Hurricanes opened with a 22-0 run to rout the Warhawks 103-39 on Friday night.

"I had a lot of babies out there - seven freshmen - I played them all, what the heck," Louisiana Monroe coach Mona Martin said. "We only have three seniors. It's been a very tough season so far.

The 16 points was a career best for Saunders, who went 6 of 8 from the field, including 2 of 3 from 3-point range. Through the Hurricanes' first nine games, the sophomore was shooting 27 percent from the field and was just 1 of 19 from beyond the arc.

"My teammates always have had confidence in me," Saunders said. "They told me to keep shooting." Morgan Stroman added 14 points and Michelle Woods had 13 for the Hurricanes in their 30th straight home win.

Johnson scored eight points, including two 3-pointers, during an opening 22-0 run by Miami (9-1), which was never threatened.

The Warhawks broke the scoring drought on Larrie Williams' jumper 4:53 into the game, but Miami scored the next 11 points and took a 33-2 lead on Jessica Capers' jumper with 9:26 to go in the half.

Williams scored 11 points to lead Louisiana Monroe (1-10). "They are very impressive, they run the ball so well," Martin said. "I've been in this business for 36 years and they run the floor better than any team I've ever seen."

The Hurricanes shot 12 of 16 from the field in the first 9 minutes, while the Warhawks converted only one of 13 shots. Miami used mostly reserves over the second 10 minutes of the first half and built a 55-19 lead at halftime.

"There are a lot of people in our second wave that would be starters somewhere else," Meier said. "It's very hard to break into a starting lineup that brought back every starter.

The Hurricanes also outscored the Warhawks 25-6 in fast break points and forced 30 turnovers "They've got so much depth and they play hard," Louisiana Monroe coach Mona Martin said. "They run the ball so well from point guard to post.

Miami, which surpassed 90 points for the fifth time this season and topped 100 for the second time, outscored Louisiana Monroe 17-0 in the final 7:18.

WASHINGTON, D.C. (AP) - Seventh-ranked Miami and its high-powered offense finally met its match. No. 17 Georgetown held the nation's highest-scoring team to nearly half its average and 21 percent shooting in a 71-46 rout Wednesday night.

"(Georgetown) smacked us in the face and we ran and called our moms and asked for help instead of turning to each other," said coach Katie Meier.

Sugar Rodgers scored 24 points - including a trio of 3-pointers - to lead the Hoyas (10-2), who stifled the Hurricanes (9-2) from the start. Miami had averaged 87 points per game, and its worst offensive outing had been a 92-76 loss at Tennessee on Nov. 15.

"Credit to Georgetown," Shenise Johnson said. "They did a great job of dismantling us."

The Hoyas led 34-21 at halftime while holding Miami to just one field goal in the last six minutes while going on an 11-5 run, and maintained a double-digit lead the rest of the way.

"I think we rattled them a little bit, showed them that we were serious this year, and we got em," Alexa Roche said.

With just over seven minutes remaining, Suriya McGuire hit a 3-pointer to bring Miami within 15. But the Hoyas answered with a 12-0 run, highlighted by Tia Magee's three-point play, to take a 66-39 lead, their largest of the game.

Johnson led Miami with 10 points - her fewest of the season - on 1-for-13 shooting. Georgetown also limited the Hurricanes' second-leading scorer, Riquna Williams, to a season-low six points.

"Every time I got the ball there were two defenders running at me - when I did get the ball," Johnson said. "A lot times I had to just go get the rebound and try to go back up with it." Magee scored 13, Rubylee Wright added 10, and Sydney Wilson grabbed 12 rebounds for George-

town, which snapped a seven-game losing streak to Miami since 2000. "They handed us a huge lesson," Meier said. "I'm regretful that it happened but I'll be more regretful

if we don't take it and learn from it."

## UNC 65, MIAMI 63 - JAN. 2, 2011

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. (AP) - Sylvia Hatchell spent all Monday night telling her North Carolina players to keep believing they could win despite yet another key injury, a bevy of turnovers and the struggle to find any rhythm offensively

At least her Tar Heels proved they'll still listen to their coach on a rough night Chay Shegog hit the go-ahead free throws with 1:11 left, helping No. 25 North Carolina rally past No. 12 Miami 65-63 in the Atlantic Coast Conference opener for both teams.

Shegog finished with 20 points to lead the Tar Heels (11-2, 1-0 ACC), who won despite finishing with a season-high 31 turnovers. North Carolina trailed by eight with about 5 1/2 minutes left before fighting back to take its first lead on Shegog's free throws. Freshman Brittany Rountree added 14 points for the Tar Heels, including two free throws with 16.7 seconds left to push UNC's lead to four.

The Tar Heels held on from there, surviving a missed layup by Miami's Riquna Williams that would've tied it with 2 seconds left as well as Morgan Stroman's hurried heave that fell way short as the horn sounded

"About the only thing I can say is they never gave up and they played with a lot of heart," Hatchell said. "It wasn't pretty and we had a lot of turnovers, but they kept fighting and playing hard."

It was a victory that's sure to give the Tar Heels some confidence, not to mention show Hatchell that she's got a bunch of fighters despite a rough start.

Williams knocked down 3-pointers on the first two possessions for the Hurricanes (11-3, 0-1) while the Tar Heels missed a pair of layups on their first two trips down the floor. An irate Hatchell had seen enough by that point, calling a timeout 68 seconds in to have an animated discussion with her players in the huddle.

"I said, `Look, y'all are playing like you're afraid of them," Hatchell said. "We're in a battle out here, vou know? You've got to be aggressive.

But things got worse. First North Carolina fell behind by 11 points. Then senior guard She'la White rolled her left ankle while driving to the basket in the latest blow to a roster already depleted by injuries. White tried to return later in the half, but her departure looked crippling when freshmen Rountree and Shannon Smith were left as the only true ballhandlers against Miami's pressure - not to mention when Rountree picked up her fourth foul less than a minute into the second half.

At times, the Tar Heels were struggling to get the ball across midcourt against Miami's fullcourt trap. Smith had nine turnovers and repeatedly heard frustrated streams both from the UNC sideline or her own teammates

Yet the Tar Heels played enough defense to hold Miami to 35-percent shooting, including 6-for-26 from 3-point range. They also took a 41-34 rebounding advantage and finished with a 16-7 edge in secondchance points, including when the 5-foot-7 Smith somehow managed to grab her own miss and score to tie the game at 60 with 1:53 left.

Meanwhile, the Hurricanes were going in the wrong direction

"We just didn't have that fight that we normally have," said Stroman, who had 13 points. "It's like, I guess, we're depending on everyone to make the big shots at the end of the game and at that time, we just need to step up and ... play with our chest out and play with confidence. And we weren't playing like that

Miami led 58-50 on Stefanie Yderstrom's third 3-pointer with 5:19 left, but the Hurricanes missed eight of their last 10 shots. The teams were tied on the boards with about 7 1/2 minutes left before the Tar Heels pushed ahead there late.

Williams finished with 16 points, including a driving layup while drawing a blocking foul from Smith for a three-point play that brought Miami to within 64-63 with 11.1 seconds left. Yderstrom added 15 points, though preseason ACC player of the year Shenise Johnson had 11 on 4-for-13 shooting

That defense helped negate all the turnovers that led to 25 points for Miami - though the Tar Heels didn't have a turnover in the final 4 1/2 minutes.

"You've got to finish games on the road in the ACC," Miami coach Katie Meier said, "and we didn't."

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - Celebrating yet another 3-pointer, Riquna Williams hopped along the sideline, faced the stands and waved to coax more cheers from a crowd eager to witness a milestone win for the Miami Hurricanes.

"I've never done that before," the senior guard said.

It was a night of firsts. Williams scored 34 points and No. 13-ranked Miami defeated a top-five team for the first time ever, rallying past No. 5 Maryland 75-63 Thursday.

- Williams tied a career high by sinking eight 3-pointers, the last coming with two minutes left to put Miami ahead by 11 points.
- "The difference was we had no answer for Riguna," Maryland coach Brenda Frese said. "She was unstoppable. She was definitely in a zone."
- The Hurricanes (14-3 overall, 3-1 Atlantic Coast Conference) won despite missing 21 consecutive shots in the first half, when they went 10 minutes without a basket to squander an early 12-point lead. Miami extended its home winning streak to 34 games.
- "There's something magical that happens at home we just have these moments," coach Katie
- Meier said. "The crowd is in a frenzy, and we're an emotional team. The crowd totally helped." Maryland (16-1, 3-1) was held 21 points below its scoring average of 84.4 points per game, best in
- the nation Miami outscored the Terrapins by 33 points from 3-point range and won even though Shenise Johnson shot 2 for 15 and had just six points, 10 below her average. That ended her streak of scoring in double

figures in 87 consecutive games.

Johnson didn't seem to mind.

"We won. Period," the senior said. "I feel like I'm in some way responsible. This is a great win for our program, and I'm happy to be a part of it.

- Williams shot 12 for 24, including 8 for 14 from 3-point range. Stefanie Yderstrom went 4-for-7 beyond the arc and scored 12 points. Morgan Stroman added 10 points and eight rebounds for the Hur-ricanes, who enjoyed an eight-rebound edge despite Maryland's height advantage.
- Alyssa Thomas had 18 points for the Terrapins but committed eight turnovers. Laurin Mincy was held
- to six points, nearly nine below her average. The Terrapins went 2 for 11 from 3-point range, while Miami shot 13 for 28. The loss was the first for Maryland since it was beaten in the second round of the NCAA tournament last year.

"We remember how it felt last time," Thomas said. "I know we're going to come back strong." Miami trailed by seven points early in the second half but regained the lead when a 3-pointer by Williams made it 47-46. She sank back-to-back 3-pointers during a 10-0 run that put the Hurricanes up 64-56 with less than four minutes left.

That prompted her celebration along the sideline as she encouraged the fans' cheers.

"I wanted to let them know, `You guys are helping us," she said. "It was a great emotional feeling,

like, `We want to win, and we're going to go get it."' Williams scored 15 points in the first 8 1/2 minutes to help the Hurricanes take a 22-10 lead. They then went cold, and a 15-1 run by the Terrapins put them ahead.

Meier described the Hurricanes' offense in the first half as "horrible "

"I said, `If our offense is the problem, we're fine,"' she said. "We knew we would click at a certain

# MIAMI 60, FLORIDA STATE 57 - JAN. 15, 2012

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - It came down to the final seconds before 13th-ranked Miami finally ended a 25-year jinx in Tallahassee

The Hurricanes watched a 19-point lead disappear before escaping with a 60-57 win Sunday at Florida State on Stefanie Yderstrom's 3-pointer from deep in the corner with 17 seconds remaining.

"A lot of demons ... were still on our back a little, bit but she exorcised the demons with that big shot," said Miami coach Katie Meier, who was a freshman at Duke when the Hurricanes last won here on Jan. 29, 1987. "They make it very, very hard to get a bucket. That shot by Stefanie was big.

Miami (15-3, 4-1 Atlantic Coast Conference) led 41-22 a minute into the second half, but Florida State fought back to tie the game at 57 when Cierra Bravard made the second of two tries at the free throw line with 37 seconds left.

Shenise Johnson led Miami with 24 points and became just the fourth player in Miami history to reach 2,000 career points. Morgan Stroman and Riquna Williams added 11 points for the Hurricanes.

Vderstrom finished with 9, all on treys. Yderstrom and Williams – the ACC's top two 3-point shooters – each made three 3-point shots for Miami, which hit 8 of 22 of its long distance tries compared to Florida State's 1 of 5 from behind the arc. The two Hurricanes guards have each made 38 field goals from long range this season. Sophomore forward Natasha Howard led Florida State (10-9, 2-3) with 22 points and a career-high

17 rebounds, getting 14 points and 10 rebounds in the second half to spark the Seminoles' late rally.

"Seventeen rebounds hasn't been had against a top-25 team here in years," Florida State coach Sue Semrau said. In fact, it was just the third time since 1993 that it had happened.

"We didn't give up at all," the 6-foot-3 Howard said. "That's the best thing that ever happened. We

didn't give up at the end.

Miami was able to hold on for the win despite shooting 36.5 percent compared to Florida State's

43.1 percent, and the Seminoles won the rebound battle 39-32 led by Howard's dominating presence. Chasity Clayton added 12 points and Bravard 10 for Florida State, which was hurt by 22 turnovers. Johnson scored 15 points in the first half and keyed a 23-6 run that propelled the Hurricanes into the locker room with a 35-20 lead.

"Shenise did a great job of setting the tone very early for us." said Meier said, adding, "Two thousand points ... that's an amazing accomplishment."

Semrau, however, was frustrated with her team's start.

"I hope that after this, we play more grown up in the first half," she said..

A pair of Howard layups sparked an early 8-0 Florida State burst that gave the Seminoles a quicklived 10-7 lead, but disappeared quickly in the wake of the Hurricanes' 23-6 run capped by a Johnson layup for a 30-16 lead with 4:44 left in the half.

The Seminoles' women weren't able to pull off a second home-floor upset in as many days. Florida State's unranked men's team clobbered No. 3 North Carolina 90-57 just 24 hours earlier.

Semrau's team visits Boston College on Thursday, while Miami is at Virginia that night.

# MIAMI 56, VIRGINIA 53 - JAN. 19, 2012

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. - Miami coach Kate Meier typically does not flash a smile after her team turns the ball over 27 times in a contest. Life in the ACC, the coach noted, is merely about surviving and stealing as many victories as possible For that reason the cheers that billowed out of the visitor's locker room were fitting for the 11th-ranked Hurricanes after

they outlasted Virginia, 56-53, on Thursday night in front of a crowd of 3,161 at John Paul Jones Arena.

"I understand that we return every starter from last year, but the margin for error in this league is so small. That's just how it goes," Meier said. "You come out with any road victory and we are going to celebrate it. That's a heck of a win and a big time RPI win for us.

"We knew we were in for a fight."

Miami (16-3, 5-1 ACC) sealed the win as guard Shenise Johnson nailed two free throws with 18.2 seconds remaining. Virginia (14-6, 2-4) had a chance to force overtime in the final six seconds, but three attempts at a game-tving 3-pointer did not come to fruition

Lexie Gerson had a 3-pointer blocked out of bounds by Johnson with 5.4 seconds left, Ariana Moorer missed a 3-pointer wildly a second later and forward Jazmin Pitts could not muscle a desperation 3-pointer from the corner all the way to the basket as the final horn sounded.

"We just ran a play, kind of like an elevator play to kind of run [Gerson] through a double screen and close that off and I don't know, I'll have to go back and look at it, but I don't know if we got the defense off enough to give her time," Virginia coach Joanne Boyle said. "But I thought she had a good look early, but she hesitated.

"You have to be able to come off that elevator screen and just catch and shoot. I thought there was a little bit of a hesita-

Pitts did not hesitate on her final 3-pointer but admitted that she was trying to make sure she beat the final buzzer and rushed her attempt.

"It just came out and I knew there was like 1 or 2 seconds left so I just kind of had to shoot it," said Pitts, who played 23 minutes as a host of Virginia starters battled foul trouble.

As Boyle noted, the contest would not have had the late drama had the Cavaliers executed better at the free-throw line Virginia missed eight of its 10 free-throw attempts in the second half, including three in the final 3:12.

"We just don't have a lot of margin for error." Boyle said.

Despite shooting just 45.8 percent (11 for 24) from the charity stripe in the game, the Cavaliers still led 53-51 after Moorer drove to the basket and connected on a runner off the glass

Trailing by two and with 12 seconds on the shot clock. Meier called a timeout with 1:12 remaining to set up a play for Johnson.

"I usually have [timeouts]," Meier said. "When I had four left with 4 minutes I thought, 'We won't turn it over. I can prevent that.'"

The decision by Meier worked brilliantly as Johnson drove to the basket, hit a lay up and drew the fifth foul of the game on Virginia forward Telia McCall.

Johnson hit the free throw, pushing the Hurricanes in front, 54-53.

Virginia gave the ball back to the Hurricanes, however, as Moorer was called for traveling near the free-throw line with 47.4 seconds left Boyle promptly called a timeout prior to Miami's possession. The decision was made not to foul Miami, but a wild

3-pointer from Johnson was collected under the basket by reserve center Shawnice Wilson and Meier signaled for another timeout with 22 seconds left

Meier said it was by design that Wilson was positioned for the potential missed free throw.

Successful on the second attempt to get the inbounds in, Virginia fouled Johnson as she attempted to dribble away from pressure with 18.2 seconds left.

Johnson nailed both free throws, pushing the score to the final margin.

"I thought we were in major trouble because what they do is what we struggle with," Meier said. "Virginia was playing people tough and played tough at Duke and up at Maryland." Moorer paced the Cavaliers with 18 points and three assists, but missed six free throws while playing all 40 minutes.

Miami was led by a 20-point effort from Johnson, who also added 13 of the team's 45 rebounds Virginia, which led 33-29 at halftime, forced the 27 turnovers by Miami, but managed just 20 points off the miscues.

# MIAMI 79, VIRGINIA TECH 48 - JAN. 23, 2012

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - The Miami Hurricanes were forced to use a new lineup, and ended up with the same old result

Stefanie Yderstrom scored a career-high 22 points to lead the No. 10 Hurricanes, who didn't miss a beat in a 79-48 win over Virginia Tech on Monday night despite injury and personal issues altering the lineup Miami had started the previous 52 games.

Miami lost starting forward Morgan Stroman for the season with a torn Achilles tendon in the Hurricanes' 56-53 win at Virginia last Thursday. Riquana Williams, the team's second-leading scorer, also missed extensive practice before the game against Virginia Tech because of a family issue, according to Miami coach Katie Meier.

Williams came off the bench against the Hokies and played 10 minutes.

"We had a tough week with losing Morgan and Riquana had some family issues that kept her away from practice," Meier said. "We're making adjustments."

The Hurricanes (17-1, 6-1 ACC) had little difficulty doing so against the Hokies. Miami was neve threatened after opening the game on a 15-1 run in the first 4:10. Shenise Johnson led Miami's early scoring surge with nine points.

Later in the first half, Miami scored 11 unanswered points during a 3:15 span and increased the lead to 38-11. Maria Brown's basket with 4:51 remaining ended the spurt.

"It was strange not having her there," Johnson said of Stroman, who averaged 12 points a game. "She brings energy. But we had a lot of people step up tonight." The Hokies (6-14, 2-5) were held without a field goal for an 8:15 stretch until Aerial Wilson scored

consecutive layups within an 18 second-span that reduced Miami's lead to 40-18 with 59 seconds remaining.

"I couldn't be more proud of how much composure we played with." Meier said, "I thought it was one of our best team games of the year.'

Yderstrom shot 7 of 10 from the field, including 4 of 6 on 3-pointers. Johnson finished with 18 points and Shawnice Wilson, who replaced Stroman, scored 12 points for Miami,

"I'm just happy that we won and how we won as a team," Yderstrom said. "I had some open shots and I made them."

Miami won its 35th consecutive home game, hours after returning to the top 10 national rankings for the first time since the week of Dec. 19.

Monet Tellier scored 18 points to lead the Hokies, who lost their fifth straight and third consecutive game against a Top 25 team after previous losses against then-No. 5 Duke and then-No. 25 North Carolina last week.

"I know they were a little discombobulated with the injury and with whatever went on with Williams, but I was very impressed with them," Virginia Tech coach Dennis Wolff said. "Conversely, I was very disappointed in our guys, particularly with how we started the game."

Wilson's put-back basket with 27 seconds left gave Miami a 42-18 lead at halftime. Jessica Capers' basket with 14:11 remaining in the second half gave the Hurricanes their first 30-point lead at 55-25.

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - Miami was able to overcome its subpar shooting to pull out another convincing

victory. Stefanie Yderstrom and Riquna Williams scored 14 points each to help the 10th-ranked Hurricanes overcome 37-percent shooting in a 64-39 win over Wake Forest on Thursday night.

Shenise Johnson added 10 points and 12 rebounds as Miami (18-3, 7-1 Atlantic Coast Conference) got its seventh straigth win overall and 36th straight at home.

"This wasn't a momentum win at all," Miami coach Katie Meier said. "I'm complimenting Wake For est when I say it was an ugly win. That's a compliment to their staff and how well they prepare for you. "It was kind of disjointed, gritty, grimy and scrummy. We had to play it."

Miami led by 13 at halftime and stretched the advantage to 37-20 on consecutive baskets by Shenise Johnson and Svlvia Bullock in the first 1:17 of the second half.

Sandra Garcia's jumper with 7:01 remaining got Wake Forest to 52-39. Johnson and Yderstrom ved with consecutive 3-pointers and extended the Hurricanes' lead to 58-39.

"I try to let the shot come to me and not rush it." said Yderstrom, who hit three 3-pointers Williams' layup with 1:59 remaining gave Miami its first 20-point lead at 60-39, and the Hurricanes

# MIAMI 88, BOSTON COLLEGE 57 - JAN. 29, 2012

CHESTNUT HILL, Mass. (AP) - Miami coach Katie Meier knows how lucky she is to have a pair of talented players like Shenise Johnson and Riquna Williams. Johnson scored 16 of her 22 points in the opening half to lead the 10th-ranked Hurricanes to their

eighth straight win, an 88-57 rout of Boston College on Sunday.

Williams had 15 of her 18 in the opening 20 minutes, and moved to six points away from joining Johnson as the fifth in school history with 2,000 points.

The high scoring pair of seniors dominated during stretches early in the game, but it was their leadership skills and rebounding that had Meier especially happy afterward. "I'm blessed. I know it," she said. "Tonight they wanted to hit the boards early. I could even hear them

ng, `Hit the boards guys. Hit the boards. They're teaching and they're mentoring. And they're helping carry the Hurricanes on a solid run.

Miami (19-3, 8-1 Atlantic Coast Conference) never trailed and pulled to a double digit lead on Williams' basket in the lane 5:44 into the game. The advantage never dropped into single digits the rest of the wav

"It starts on the defensive end," said Williams, who was unsure how many points she needs for 2.000.

"It would be great to achieve something so big," she said after learning how many she's away. Her coach was smiling next to her.

"We know," joked Meier. On very likely soon having another member of her exclusive club, Johnson said: "I think it's just going to be a result of our hard work.

Stefanie Yderstrom added 15 points for Miami, which hasn't lost since dropping its conference opener at North Carolina on Jan. 2.

Tessah Holt paced Boston College (5-16, 0-8) with 12 points. The Eagles have lost eight straight. "They trigger their offense from their defense, from transition baskets," BC coach Sylvia Crawley said. "We talked about, `Even if we have to eat the ball don't turn it over."

The Eagles shot just 36 percent in the game (18 of 50) and many times had trouble getting off

decent shots. They had 20 turnovers that led to 29 points. Williams also grabbed eight rebounds. Johnson, who had a team-leading nine boards, became the fourth to reach the 2,000-point mark earlier this season.

Miami missed its first two shots from the floor before its superior tandem of Johnson and Williams combined with its pressure defense to take charge.

Johnson missed the first shot of the game - a short jumper in the lane - but hit six of her next eight during the first half. She scored eight of her team's initial 16 points as the Hurricanes pulled to a 13-point lead on her 3-pointer.

After Johnson's offensive surge, Williams dominated, scoring 11 straight Miami points and 13 of 16

as the Hurricanes pushed their lead to 27-11 midway into the half. Johnson's two free throws gave the Hurricanes a 41-16 edge, their largest lead in the opening half. Miami, which forced 15 turnovers in the opening 20 minutes, led 48-27 at intermission.

The Hurricanes pushed their lead over 30 points (61-29) on Williams' basket early into the second half. They came out after intermission and scored 13 of the initial 15 points, making sure the Eagles wouldn't give them any threat.

Williams came down awkwardly after a basket late in the first half and walked to the bench gingerly. but she started the second half and wasn't affected by the fall.

The Hurricanes entered the game leading the conference averaging 14.3 steals per game. They finished with seven.

# MIAMI 68, CLEMSON 47 - FEB. 5, 2012

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - Miami's 37th consecutive home win perhaps came at a big expense. Shenise Johnson scored 19 points to lead the No. 7 Hurricanes to a 68-47 victory over Clemson Sunday afternoon. But the Hurricanes could be missing guard and second leading scorer Riguna Williams for Wednesday's game against No. 23 North Carolina.

Williams, who averages 15.6 points, left the game with 14:53 in the second half after she hit her head as she collided with teammate Michelle Woods while chasing a loose ball. Williams stayed on the floor for three minutes then walked gingerly toward the locker room and didn't return.

"They're going to take some precautionary looks on her because anytime it's a head and neck..," Miami coach Katie Meier said in a post-game news conference. "We had three doctors in the locker room right now. We'll know more. They're concerned."

Meier isn't sure about Williams' status on Wednesday

Johnson picked up the void for Williams, who scored 15 points before her injury - including the 2,000th of her career. Johnson scored 12 points in the second half and finished with 15 rebounds

"Coach told us in the locker room that we need to be tougher (in the second half)," Johnson said. "I had to change my whole mindset and shots started going in."

The Hurricanes (20-3, 9-1 ACC) broke the game open with a 17-1 run midway through the first half. Williams hit two 3-pointers and Johnson and Shawnice Wilson scored five points each during the Miami surge

Williams' second 3-pointer with 11:09 remaining gave her 2,000 points in her Hurricanes' caree Johnson's 3-pointer with 6:24 remaining ended the spurt and increased the Miami lead to 26-8. The Hurricanes held Clemson without a basket for a 9:29 stretch.

"We had really nice ball movement," Meier said. "We played a decent game but there were some individual things that you've got to finish."

"Our one consistent thing has been Shenise Johnson. She absolutely made sure that we won tonight."

Clemson (6-15, 2-8) got to within single digits after an 8-0 spurt late in the first half. Ouinvotta Pettaway's put back basket with 1:00 ended the run and cut Miami's lead to 27-18.

Nikki Dixon scored 16 points to lead Clemson, which has lost five of their last six. "They pressed us and bothered us in the first half," Clemson coach Itoro Coleman said. "In the second half we handled their pressure better than the first half."

Williams' 3-pointer with 15:24 remaining in the second half gave the Hurricanes their first 20-point lead at 44-24.

The Tigers got no closer than 46-31 after a 5-0 run capped by Shaniqua Pauldo's free throw with 9:57 remaining in the second half.

"There were different points of the game that we fought," Coleman said "I felt Miami was very physical and we were able to withstand some of that. We were able to get some shots that we were looking for. We just didn't knock them down."

# MIAMI 61, MIAMI 37 - FEB. 8, 2012

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - Shenise Johnson and Riquna Williams helped Miami avenge its lone ACC loss. Johnson scored 19 points and Williams added 17 to lead No. 6 Miami to a 61-37 win over No. 22 North Carolina. The Tar Heels beat the Hurricanes 65-63 in Chapel Hill on Jan. 2.

"We felt like we lost it (the last time) and something we could change," Johnson said. "We wanted to make sure we came out and played Miami basketball, and do what we do well for 40 minutes. We didn't do that up in Carolina.'

Miami (21-3, 10-1 ACC) forced North Carolina (17-7, 7-4) into a season-high 35 turnovers and scored 39 points off turnovers.

"They've got great guards," North Carolina coach Sylvia Hatchell said. "They come at you, are extremely physical. That was basically the bottom-line.

Stefanie Yderstrom chipped in 10 points and had seven steals for the Hurricanes, who won their 38th straight home game.

The 38-game home streak is the third-longest active streak in the nation. Only Connecticut (98) and Stanford (74) have longer streaks. North Carolina did not have a player score in double figures as Laura Bloomfield led the Tar Heels

with seven points and six rebounds. Miami did not have a great shooting night at 37.3 percent (22 of 59) from the floor and had 23

turnovers of their own, but they still outshot North Carolina, which was held to 26.8 percent (15 of 56). "It's never going to always be pretty in February, but gritty is better than pretty right now," Miami coach Katie Meier said.

After North Carolina scored the game's first four points, the Hurricanes went on a 17-0 run sparked by three 3-pointers by Williams. Johnson and Shawnice Wilson each scored four during the run. During the pivotal run, the Tar Heels missed nine consecutive shots and had seven turnovers.

"I've got great upperclassmen," Meier said. "What I love about them is they have that wisdom, besides the talent and capability, that they know how we're going to get this team and when our moment is going to come.

Waltiea Rolle ended the six-minute scoring drought for the Tar Heels with a basket.

However, Miami maintained a steady lead throughout the half, but it was cut to 27-20 after a jumper by Tierra Ruffin-Pratt. However, Miami countered with a pair of field goals including a 3-pointer by Yderstrom from the right wing.

"We didn't play particularly well at North Carolina," Meier said. "We were in control of the game and then they took the lead with a minute to go. That was something that we never do, so we weren't going to let the lead dwindle and I thought we responded at huge times.

Miami led 32-22 at the break

Yderstrom connected again from long range early in the second half forcing North Carolina to take a timeout down by 15 points. The Hurricanes led by double digits the rest of the way.

# MIAMI 76, MARYLAND 74 - FEB. 14, 2012

COILLEGE PARK, Md. (AP) - Stefanie Yderstrom is giving Miami another threat on offense. The junior guard scored a career-high 26 points and Shenise Johnson added 20 points and seven steals to help the sixth-ranked Hurricanes rally to beat No. 8 Maryland 76-74 on Sunday.

"Stef had an awesome performance today," Miami coach Katie Meier said. "She was incredible and focused. You've got to talk about her when you talk about the Miami guards being so good."

Miami seniors Johnson and Riquna Williams were already on the top of every opponent's scouting report having scored over 2,000 points apiece in their illustrious careers. Now the Hurricanes have a third option with Yderstrom.

"She's having a tremendous season," Maryland coach Brenda Frese said. "We came into the game anting to defend the `Big 3'. We call it the `Big 3' because she's having a sensational junior campaign. She played a pretty flawless game.

Yderstrom set her previous career-high of 22 three weeks earlier against Virginia Tech and has been in double figures in five of the last six games

"I feel it's been a few weeks and I've been getting up extra shots with assistant coaches." Yderstrom said. "I want to be aggressive."

The Hurricanes (22-3, 11-1) have won 11 straight games since falling to North Carolina by two points on Jan. 2. They remained a game behind Duke for the Atlantic Coast Conference lead.

Trailing 66-60 with 6 minutes left, Miami rallied behind Johnson. The preseason All-America's jumper from the corner with 2:07 left gave the Hurricanes their first lead since early in the first half and set up a tense finish.

"Just another typical Miami-Maryland game," Meier said. "This was round three or four.

Anjale Barrett's layup with 54 seconds to go put Maryland (21-4, 8-4) ahead 72-71. But the Hur-ricanes took the lead for good on Sylvia Bullock's jumper 15 seconds later. After two missed shots by the

Terrapins, Johnson hit two free throws to make it 75-72. Laurin Mincy missed a 3-pointer that would have tied the game, and Williams hit a free throw to seal

the win. Tianna Hawkins scored 18 points and Lynetta Kizer added 16 to lead Maryland, which had a seasonhigh 11,000 fans at the game.

Leading by five points at halftime, Maryland was able to extend the advantage to 50-42. The Terrapins had chances to make it a double-digit lead but kept missing layups and free throws that allowed

Miami to stay in the game. Maryland missed six layups and seven free throws in the second half. "Late-game free throws, layups, turnovers, those are costly to put a team away in your building," Frese said.

Yderstrom started the Hurricanes' rally hitting consecutive jumpers. Williams' hit a 3-pointer to get Miami within 50-49.

The teams traded baskets, but Miami couldn't pull ahead. A layup by Hawkins and a free throw by Alyssa Thomas gave Maryland a 66-60 lead with 6:05 left before the Hurricanes' late rally. It was an entertaining back-and-forth first half with neither team able to build more than a six-point

lead. Thomas kept the Terrapins in the game early, scoring eight of the team's first 10 points before Kizer took over. The 6-foot-4 senior's strong three-point play tied the game at 13. She scored four points over the final 1:42 of the half to help Maryland take a 38-33 lead. Kizer finished the half with 14 points and nine rebounds.

Miami won the first meeting between the teams on Jan. 12, handing Maryland its first loss of the season. In that game Kizer had just four points and four rebounds in 16 minutes.

"We felt we gave everything pretty much, it definitely hurts," Kizer said. "This is one we will keep in our back pocket and come out stronger.

Meier was dressed in a pink top and wore pink sneakers in support of the Play4Kay foundation that honors former N.C. State coach Kay Yow, who died of cancer three years ago. The Miami players wore pink sneakers while the Terrapins were dressed in pink uniforms.
