Game Nine

THE GAME

- Coming off a 16-12 win last time out on the road at Pittsburgh, the Miami Hurricanes play their second straight road game on Nov. 2 in a matchup against longtime rival Florida State at Doak Campbell Stadium in Tallahassee, Fla. Kickoff for the contest is set for 3:30 p.m. from the state capital.
- The game will be broadcast on ABC with Bob Wischusen (play by play), Dan Orlovsky (color) and Allison Williams (sideline) on the call. Joe Zagacki (pxp) and Don Bailey. Jr. (color) are in the 560 WQAM radio booth for their 18th season together, while Josh Darrow will handle the sideline duty. Alfredo Alvarez (pxp) and Joe Martinez (color) will also carry the game on Unanimo Deportes 990AM live from Doak Campbell Stadium.

THE RIVALRY

- The Hurricanes carry a 33-30 all-time series lead against the Seminoles into Saturday's game, but trail by a 20-17 mark in games in Tallahassee.
- Miami has won back-to-back rivalry matchups against the Seminoles, including a thrilling 24-20 victory in its last trip to Doak Campbell in 2017.
- In last year's matchup at Hard Rock Stadium, the Hurricanes overcame a 20-point second-half deficit to capture a 28-27 win over the Noles.
- The Hurricanes have not won three straight against Florida State since a stretch of winning six straight games over their rivals from 2000-2004.

THE HURRICANES

- Miami returned 12 starters and 39 letterwinners from a 2018 team that finished with a trip to the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in New York, N.Y. Mark Richt announced his retirement at season's end, and Manny Diaz was introduced as the 25th head coach in University of Miami program history on Jan. 2.
- Miami has played seven one-possession games tied for most in all of FBS and three games have come down to the final play of the game this year.
- The Hurricanes won their most recent game at Pittsburgh on Oct. 26, 16-12, for Diaz's first road win as head coach. WR K.J. Osborn caught the gamewinning touchdown from QB Jarren Williams with less than a minute remaining in the game, and Miami's defense held Pitt to just four field goals. On Aug. 12, Diaz named Williams Miami's starting quarterback for the season. Williams, who beat out redshirt sophomores Tate Martell and N'Kosi
- Perry in a three-man battle during training camp, started the first five games of the season; Perry has started the last three games at guarterback.
- LB Shaq Quarterman has started all 47 games of his career since arriving on campus in January 2016; he has the second-longest start streak in FBS.
- Diaz, who spent the previous three seasons as defensive coordinator for the Hurricanes (2016-18), retooled Miami's offensive staff upon his hire, bringing Dan Enos from Alabama as offensive coordinator and hiring four other new coaches for offense. He hired longtime colleague Blake Baker, who spent the last four seasons at Louisiana Tech, as defensive coordinator and added Todd Stroud as assistant head coach / defensive line coach.

THE OPPONENT

- Florida State is under the direction of second-year head coach Willie Taggart, who has led the Seminoles to a 9-11 record in his first 20 games as coach.
- RB Cam Akers (917 yards, 12 touchdowns) and WR Tamorrion Terry (606 yards, six touchdowns) lead the Florida State offense, while QB James Blackman has thrown for 1.340 vards with 11 touchdowns, FSU's defense is led by Hamsah Nasrildeen (58 tackles) and DL Marvin Wilson (41 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss, five sacks). Last time out, the Seminoles snapped a two-game losing streak with a 35-17 win over Syracuse at Doak Campbell Stadium.

QUICH HITS

RIVALRY RENEWED IN STATE CAPITAL

• The Miami Hurricanes renew their longtime rivalry with Florida State on Sat., Nov. 2 in a matchup at Doak Campbell Stadium in Tallahassee, Fla. (3:30 p.m.) • The Hurricanes have a 33-30 all-time

series lead over their rivals, but trail, 20-17, in games played in Tallahassee.

In its last trip to Doak Campbell Stadium in 2017 a last-minute touchdown pass from QB Malik Rosier to WR Darrell Langham snapped Miami's seven-game losing streak to Florida State in a thrilling 24-20 victory. Saturday marks Miami's second straight road game as part of a season-closing stretch of four road matchups in its final five games: Miami's home finale is Nov. 9 vs.

Louisville on Homecoming weekend.

ROUSSEAU EXPLODING IN YEAR TWO

• After missing nearly all of his freshman season with an ankle fracture, DE Greg Rousseau has been among Miami's top perfomers on defense this season.

• Rousseau leads the Hurricanes with 10.5 tackles for loss and eight sacks this season; last time out at Pitt (Oct. 26), Rousseau had a career-best three sack performance.

• The Coconut Creek, Fla., native, who has started the past three games at defensive end, leads the ACC and ranks ninth nationally in sacks this year (one per game).

 Rousseau's three-sack game against Pittsburgh was only the seventh three-sack game by a Hurricane since 2000.

Rousseau also tied a career high with seven tackles in Miami's win over Pitt.

THE POWER OF TURNOVER CHAIN 3(05)

• One of the most recognizable sights in college football over the last two years, the latest version of the turnover chain was revealed in Miami's opener vs. Florida.

• The new chain, sporting a 10-inch '305' charm that contains more than 2,000 white sapphire stones, was worn four times vs. the Gators, including the first-ever appearance when DI Scott Patchan recovered a fumble

. The season opener vs. the Gators also served as the debut for Miami's offensive reward: the two touchdown rings, which combine to spell out "Hurricanes".



CANES HEAD TO TALLAHASSEE FOR ANNUAL RIVALRY MATCHUP VS. FSU

- After capturing a 16-12 win on the road over Pittsburgh at Heinz Field last time on Oct. 26, the Miami Hurricanes renew their longtime rivalry with Florida State on Nov. 2 in Tallahassee, Fla. (ABC).
- The rivalry is the longest running consecutive series for the Hurricanes, with Saturday's matchup representing 51 consecutive seasons where the two programs have met at least once, dating to 1969.
- The Hurricanes have a slight 33-30 all-time series lead, aided by wins in the last two meetings (2017, 2018). Miami has not won three straight versus FSU since a stretch of six straight from 2000-2004.
- In Miami's last trip to Tallahassee in 2017, QB Malik Rosier hit WR Darrell Langham for a touchdown on a 23-yard pass with six seconds left to pull off a 24-20 win - Miami's first over FSU since 2009.
- Miami's lone remaining home game is a Nov. 9 game vs. Louisville on Homecoming Weekend; four of UM's final five games of the year are on the road after a season-long five-game homestand early on.
- The game will also be carried by 560 WQAM The Joe and Unanimo Deportes 990 AM (Spanish radio).

A LOOK BACK: HURRICANES PULL OFF WIN OVER PITTSBURGH AT HEINZ

- QB **Jarren Williams**, who entered off the bench in the fourth quarter, hit WR **K.J. Osborn** for the game-winning score on a 23-yard pass with less than a minute left to topple Pitt, 16-12, on Oct. 26.
- Led by a three-sack game from DL Gregory Rousseau and a two-interception game from CB DJ Ivey, Miami's defense held Pittsburgh to four field goals, as Manny Diaz won the first road game as coach.
- Osborn was among Miami's top performers Saturday, hauling in a team-high six catches for a gamehigh 94 yards and a touchdown. WR **Mike Harley** finished with four receptions totaling 31 yards.
- Rousseau finished with three sacks, marking the first three-sack game by a Hurricane since DL Marcus Robinson in 2011 and only the seventh such performance by a Hurricane since the 2000 season.
- LB Zach McCloud likely played his fourth and final game of the year to preserve a redshirt for 2020.
- LB Shaq Quarterman started his 47th straight game and had a game-high 12 tackles in the victory.

ROUSSEAU SHINING IN SECOND SEASON, IS CONFERENCE SACK LEADER

- After missing all but one full game during his true freshman season of 2018 due to a right ankle fracture, DL **Gregory Rousseau** has shined in his first season as a major contributor on defense.
- Rousseau leads the ACC with eight sacks this year and is one of only 11 players in FBS with eight sacks.
- Last time out in a win over Pittsburgh (Oct. 26), Rousseau finished with a career-best three sacks, becoming the first Hurricane since Marcus Robinson in 2011 with three sacks in a game. He also tied a career high with seven tackles (six solo) and was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week.
- The Coconut Creek, Fla., native was rewarded with his first career start in a win over Virginia (Oct. 11) and made it count with a career-high seven tackles, two tackles for loss, one sack and a forced fumble.
- Rousseau has at least one sack in five of UM's eight games and is first among all freshmen nationally in sacks, averaging one per game; no other freshman in FBS has more than six sacks this season.
- In a dominant game vs. Central Michigan (Sept. 21), the 6-foot-6 standout recorded his first strip-sack, recovering his own forced fumble to wear the turnover chain for the first time in his career.
- Rousseau was ranked as a four-star prospect by Rivals out of high school; he had 10 sacks as a senior.

OSBORN LEADING THE WAY ON OFFENSE AFTER TRANSFER TO THE U

- One of Miami's most important additions of the offseason was transfer **K.J. Osborn**, who joined the Hurricanes for his final year of eligibility after an impressive four-year career at Buffalo with the Bulls.
- The 6-foot Osborn has started all eight games at wide receiver this season and ranks second in receptions (33) and leads Miami in TD catches (5). He has totaled 418 receiving yards (second-most).
- Last time out vs. Pittsburgh (Oct. 26), Osborn had a career-high 94 yards and the game-winning 23yard touchdown with less than a minute left. He led Miami with six catches in the win over Pittsburgh.
- Alongside LB Shaq Quarterman, Osborn was selected as one of two players to represent Miami at ACC Kickoff, the conference's annual media day, despite not having played a down and arriving in January.
- In three seasons of playing time at Buffalo, Osborn totaled 1,490 yards and 12 touchdown receptions.

SOPHOMORE TE JORDAN DAZZLING AS A MACKEY AWARD CANDIDATE

- For the second straight year, TE **Brevin Jordan** has been among Miami's top contributors on offense.
- Jordan has the third-most receiving yards (447) of any Power 5 tight end this season, and has surpassed his freshman total for receiving yards. He is second on UM in catches (29) and leads in yards.
- Playing his first season of college football in 2018, Jordan emerged as a go-to target in the Miami offense; Jordan was second on Miami in receptions (32) and was second in touchdowns (four).
- Jordan was named to the All-ACC Second Team after a standout first year, starting 12 of 13 games.
- In a win vs. Virginia Tech on Oct. 5, Jordan had a career-high 136 receiving yards with one TD.
- Jordan enjoyed a strong opener vs. Florida (Aug. 24), starting the game and finishing with a team-high five-catches for 88 yards and one TD. He has at least five catches in three of eight games this year.
- A Las Vegas native and high school teammate of QB **Tate Martell** and S **Bubba Bolden**, Jordan was named to the Mackey Award preseason watch list (nation's top tight end) and preseason All-ACC.
- Jordan was named a Midseason Freshman All-America by ESPN in 2018. The talented sophomore was
 rated the No. 1 tight end in the country by ESPN and 247Sports.com and No. 2-rated TE by Rivals.

TURNOVER CHAIN PART 3(05); CHAIN'S IMPACT MEASURABLE ON 'D'

- When DL **Scott Patchan** pounced on a Gators fumble in the first quarter of Miami's game on Aug. 24, fans inside the stadium and across the country awaited the unveil of the newest turnover chain.
- The chain, which previously featured a charm in the shape of the iconic 'U' (2017) and Sebastian the Ibis (2018), features a 10-inch charm with the famous '305' Miami area code with more than 2,000 white sapphires; the charm weighs 500 grams. The chain took roughly three months to complete.
- Since the unveiling of the turnover chain in 2017, the Hurricanes have compiled 69 turnovers in 34 games, an average of 2.03 turnovers per game; Miami had 19 takeaways the season before the chain.
- In addition to Patchan, LB Shaq Quarterman (fumble recovery), S Amari Carter (interception) and striker Romeo Finley (interception) each wore the turover chain in Miami's opener vs. the Gators.
- In a 17-12 win over Central Michigan on Sept. 21, Miami had three turnovers and two first-time chain wearers - CB AI Blades, Jr. (interception) and DL Gregory Rousseau (fumble recovery) both wore it.

A RAY GUY AWARD NOMINEE, HEDLEY PAYING DIVIDENDS ON SPECIALS

- Miami's punting unit struggled in 2018 with a 34.48 net punting average, ranking 117th in all of FBS.
 The addition of Australian punter Lou Hedley who arrived to Miami after two years at City College of
- San Francisco and who is a former Australian Rules Football player has been a key for the Hurricanes.
 Hedley was selected to the Ray Guy Award watch list after a standout first half of the season at The U.
- Hedley is averaging 45.5 yards per punt ranking as the 14th best mark in FBS. In a game vs. Georgia Tech back on Oct. 19, Hedley boomed a career-long 67-yard punt. He has totaled 1,456 yards on punts.
- Thanks largely to Hedley's stellar play, Miami's unit now ranks 16th in FBS in net punting (42.27 / punt).
- Standing 6-foot-4 and tattooed from the neck down, Hedley used to own a tattoo shop in Bali, Indonesia before moving to San Francisco from Melbourne, Australia where he was at ProKick Australia.

YOUNG O-LINE HAD ONE OF ITS BEST GAMES LAST TIME OUT VS. PITT

- UM's starting offensive line vs. Florida (Aug. 24) included two freshman true freshman LT **Zion Nelson** and redshirt freshman RT **John Campbell, Jr.** and has gotten even younger as the season moves on.
- Last time out against Pitt (Oct. 26), Miami held the nation's number one sacks defense to a season-low two sacks in a 16-12 win. The Panthers entered the game against UM averaging an FBS-best 5.14 sacks.
- Joining Nelson on the offensive line and making his University of Miami debut was true freshman Jakai Clark, who has started at right guard each of the next seven games after the season opener vs. Florida.
- OL **Navaughn Donaldson** was the only returning starter on the offensive line with at least 10 starts.
- According to research from *The Athletic*, the Hurricanes were one of only three programs in the country to start a true freshman at left tackle in their opener. Tennessee and UCLA also started a true frosh LT.
- According to the same research, Miami was also one of just three programs in the country to start freshmen at both tackle spots in the opener; Duke and Michigan started two redshirt freshmen tackles.

HARRIS ENJOYS BIG GAME VS. GT, EARNS FIRST CAREER START AT PITT

- Seeing significant action due to an in-game injury to RB DeeJay Dallas, RB Cam'Ron Harris had the best performance of his young career in a loss to Georgia Tech on Oct. 19 at Hard Rock Stadium.
- Harris rushed for a career-high 136 yards on a career-high 18 carries and added his first receiving touchdown of the season in a three-catch game. Harris' previous career high for rush yards was 77.
- Harris was rewarded with his first career start vs. Pitt (Oct. 26); he finished with 60 yards and a rush TD.
- Harris' 136 yards vs. GT were the most by a Hurricane back since Travis Homer rushed for 168 yards on eight carries in a win over Pittsburgh in November 2017. Harris averaged 7.56 yards per carry vs. GT.
- A consensus four-star prospect by every major scouting service, Harris who went by Cam'Ron Davis last year but changed his last name to match his father's last name this past offseason was ranked as the No. 9 running back in his high school class and No. 167 overall prospect in his class by ESPN.com.
- Harris picked Miami over offers from Georgia, Oregon and Wisconsin, among others.

HILL PLAYING BIG ROLE IN FIRST SEASON AS MEMBER OF HURRICANES 'D'

- Another one of Miami's big additions this past offseason was DE Trevon Hill, who spent the first part of
 his career at Virginia Tech before arriving at Miami as a grad transfer prior to the 2019 season.
- Hill, who earned the first start of his Miami career in a game against Georgia Tech (Oct. 19), has totaled three sacks - tied for second-most on the Hurricanes - and has compiled 6.0 tackles for loss.
- The Virginia native is one of just four players on Miami with at least six tackles for loss this season.
- In 30 games with Virginia Tech, Hill made 16 starts and finished with 20 tackles for loss and 11.5 sacks.

MIAMI DEFENSE RANKS AMONG BEST IN FBS EIGHT GAMES INTO SEASON

- The Hurricanes have posted some impressive defensive numbers; UM ranks No. 15 in FBS and No. 4 in the ACC in total defense (301.0 yards per game) and No. 18 nationally in tackles for loss (7.5 per game)
- Miami's scoring defense is No. 21 in the nation at just 19.4 points per game second-best in ACC.
- One of Miami's top-performing units this season has been its rushing defense, which has allowed an
 average of 106.1 yards this season the 17th-best mark in FBS and second-lowest in the ACC.
- The Hurricanes have allowed just three of eight opponents Virginia Tech (Oct. 5), Georgia Tech (Oct. 19) and Pitt (Oct. 26) to surpass the 100-yard rushing mark this season. Florida rushed for just 50 yards.
- Miami's defense has recovered eight fumbles the 11th-most in FBS and the most in the ACC.
- The Hurricanes are averaging 3.13 sacks per game, which is the 18th-best total in FBS, headlined by Gregory Rousseau, who is atop the ACC leaderboard and 10th in FBS with eight sacks this season.

HALL, JR. IMPRESSIVE AS FIRST-YEAR STARTER IN MIAMI SECONDARY

- The Hurricanes lost two-year starting safeties to the NFL Draft in 2019 when **Sheldrick Redwine** (Cleveland Browns) and **Jaquan Johnson** (Buffalo Bills) were both selected after standout careers.
- Sophomore Gurvan Hall, Jr., who totaled eight tackles as a freshman playing mostly on special teams, has been a key member of the Hurricanes' secondary and ranks second on UM with 47 tackles.
- Hall, Jr., has been credited with 3.5 tackles for loss, two sacks and two PBUs and has started five games.
- A West Palm Beach native, Hall, Jr., picked Miami over Alabama, Georgia, Ohio State and others.

SOUTHRIDGE TRIO PLAYING BIGGER ROLE IN OFFENSE AS SOPHOMORES

- Miami added three former Miami Southridge high teammates in the 2018 recruiting class who saw limited action as true freshman last season: WR Mark Pope, OL DJ Scaife, Jr. and WR Dee Wiggins.
- · Scaife finished with seven starts on the o-line, while Pope and Wiggins combined for eight catches.
- This season, Scaife has started all eight games on the offensive line (seven at right tackle, one at right guard), while Wiggins (nine catches) and Pope (11 catches) have both seen playing time increase.
- Wiggins caught a career-long 50-yard pass in a game vs. Georgia Tech (Oct. 19), while Pope had the first touchdown of his career on a 'hail mary' pass to end the first half vs. Virginia Tech (Oct. 5).

BANDY HAS BIG GAME VS. VIRGINIA, HONORED AS ACC DB OF THE WEEK

- Miami's lone returner in the secondary to start the season, junior CB Trajan Bandy had one of his best games of the season in a victory vs. Virginia (Oct. 11) and was named ACC Defensive Back of the Week.
- Bandy, who made his sixth straight start this season and 22nd of his career vs. UVA, was third on Miami
 with six tackles and wore the turnover chain for the first time this year with a fumble recovery vs. UVA.
- Bandy added a solo sack, his third of the season, and finished with a season-high six tackles in the win.
- The Miami native has a team-high five PBUs and has totaled 20 tackles (14 solo) in eight games.

PERRY READY WHEN NUMBER HAS BEEN CALLED, IS 6-3 AS STARTING QB

- QB N'Kosi Perry was ready when his number was called in a loss to Virginia Tech (Oct. 5), entering in place of QB Jarren Williams in the first half; Perry set career marks in nearly every stat category.
- Perry set personal bests in completions with 28 (previous high was 21), attempts with 47 (previous high was 35), passing yards with 422 (previous high was 224) and longest pass with 51 (previous was 42).
- Perry also tied a career mark with four touchdown passes and threw just one interception vs. VT.

DALLAS PUTS TOGETHER STRONG FIRST HALF, MISSED GAME AT PITT

- After playing behind current Seattle Seahawks RB Travis Homer the last two years, RB DeeJay Dallas
 has served as Miami's starting running back in 2019 put together a strong first half of the season.
- Through Miami's first six games, Dallas ranked sixth in the ACC with an average of 78.7 yards per game and ranked 12th in FBS among running backs and second in the ACC with a 6.7 yards-per-rush average.
- Dallas started but was injured in Miami's game versus Georgia Tech (Oct. 19); he had just three carries.
- Dallas missed last week's game at Pitt (Oct. 26) to injury only the second missed game of his career.
- In his first career start vs. Florida on Aug. 24, Dallas had a game-high 131 all-purpose yards with a TD.
- Dallas delivered the fourth 100-yard rushing performance of his career at North Carolina (Sept. 7), totaling 107 yards on 14 carries. He rushed for a career-high three touchdowns vs. Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 14), the first such performance for a UM player since QB Malik Rosier did it at Toledo in 2018.
- Though he was not a starter last season, Dallas was all over the field for the Hurricanes. The Georgia native had the longest rush of any player (83 yards), the longest kick return of any player (53) and the longest punt return (65). He ranked first on the Hurricanes in all-purpose yards (1,260).
- Dallas became a father this offseason; though his own name is Demetrius, he named his son DeeJay.

QUARTERMAN HAS AN IRONMAN STREAK AT THE U, HEADS TALENTED 'D'

- Miami's three-headed monster senior trio Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney & Shaq Quarterman had started nearly every game together since arriving to University of Miami as early enrollees in 2016.
- McCloud, who will redshirt 2019 according to coaches after moving back to inside linebacker prior to this season, has started 32 games in his career. He has totaled 133 tackles and 12.5 tackles for loss.
- One of Miami's most instinctive players, Pinckney started all 12 of the games he played in last season and finished with 74 total tackles and 11.0 tackles for loss. He was named All-ACC Honorable Mention.
- Quarterman, who has started all 47 games for the Hurricanes in three-plus seasons at The U, ranked second on UM with 82 total tackles. An All-ACC first-team pick in 2018, he has over 250 career tackles. Quarterman's 47-game start streak is the second-longest in FBS, trailing Ethan Reed of Louisiana Tech.
- All three linebackers elected to return for their senior seasons after Manny Diaz, their coordinator for all three seasons, was named head coach. The trio cited the importance of their collective legacy at Miami and a disappointing 2018 as key reasons for the return. Both Pinckey and Quarterman are on track to earn their undergraduate degrees; McCloud has begun work towards a master's degree.

WILLIAMS IMPRESSED THROUGH EARLY GOING OF CAREER AS QB1 AT UM

- QB Jarren Williams was announced as Miami's starting quarterback by head coach Manny Diaz on Monday, Aug. 12 after winning a quarterback battle that started in spring ball and lasted into camp.
- Williams impressed in difficult environments to start the year vs. Florida in Orlando and at UNC.
- Injured during Miami's game vs. Virginia Tech on Oct. 5, he has not started the last three games, but came off the bench in the fourth quarter at Pitt (Oct. 26) and orchestrated the game-winning touchdown drive.
- In his first start as quarterback vs. Florida on Aug. 24, Williams finished 19-for-30 for 214 yards and the first passing TD of his career. He became UM's seventh freshman QB to start a game since 2008.
- He was even better at North Carolina on Sept. 7, throwing for a career-best 309 yards on 30-for-39 passing with two touchdowns. The 30 completions were the most by a Miami QB since Brad Kaaya vs. Pitt in 2016, while the 300-yard passing game was UM's first since Malik Rosier at UNC in 2017.
- Williams beat out QBs Tate Martell and N'Kosi Perry for the starting spot. Williams will make the sixth start of his career on Oct. 11 vs. Virginia; he was the first freshman to start a season opener since Brad Kaaya started as a true freshman against Louisville on Labor Day weekend 2014 a 13-31 loss to UofL.
- Williams played in one game as a reserve during his true freshman year Savannah State (Sept. 8, 2018).
- A consensus four-star prospect, Williams was ranked as the No. 6 dual threat quarterback by ESPN.
- Williams chose Miami over Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia and Ohio State, among other schools.

- RB DeeJay Dallas also wore them in the opener, while WR K.J. Osborn and TE Will Mallory wore them
 after receiving TDs at North Carolina. RB Cam'Ron Harris rocked the rings after his rushing TD vs. UNC.
- No one has worn them more than Dallas, who has six rushing touchdowns and one receiving score.
- TE Larry Hodges wore the touchdown rings twice vs. Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 14), while WR Jeff Thomas wore them twice in a game vs. Virginia Tech back on Oct. 5 at Hard Rock Stadium.

HURRICANES BOLSTERED BY MIDSEASON DEBUTS OF SILVERA, BOLDEN

- Miami was bolstered by the Oct. 5 debuts of S Bubba Bolden, who missed the first four games due to NCAA eligibility issues, and DL Nesta Jade Silvera, who suffered a leg injury during fall training camp.
- Nine Hurricanes made their debuts in Miami's season opener vs. the Gators, including two players who started: LT Zion Nelson and WR K.J. Osborn. Nelson was one of just four freshmen to debut vs. Florida.

HURRICANE FOOTBALL'S 94th SEASON OPENED WITH TRIP TO O-TOWN

- The Hurricanes kicked off their 94th season of football in 2019, road tripping to Orlando their first trip there since the 2016 Russell Athletic Bowl. It was the earliest season opener in Miami history.
- Miami's 100th year of football is slated for the 2025 season, when UM hosts Florida and Notre Dame.

- Five Hurricanes were selected in the 2019 NFL Draft: Sheldrick Redwine (fourth round, Cleveland), Michael Jackson, Sr., (fifth round, Dallas), Joe Jackson (fifth round, Dallas), Jaquan Johnson (sixth round, Buffalo) and Travis Homer (sixth round, Seattle). Multiple others signed free agent deals.

- Diaz added two former colleagues of Enos during his time as head coach of Central Michigan (2010-14): offensive line coach **Butch Barry**, most recently with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, and wide receivers coach **Taylor Stubblefield**, most recently with Air Force. Both worked for Enos at CMU.
- **Stephen Field**, who worked at Oregon last year, was hired to coach tight ends and **Eric Hickson**, who worked at Kansas State, was brought in to coach running backs. Both are south Florida natives.

- Early in August, ESPN announced it would host its famous College GameDay show at Disney's Magic Kingdom the morning of Miami's game against Florida at Camping World Stadium in Orlando.
- The game vs. Florida marked the 21st time a game involving the Hurricanes has been selected for College GameDay; prior, its most recent was the 2017 ACC Championship Game in Charlotte, N.C.

CAROL SOFFER INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY OPEN FOR BUSINESS

- On August 17, 2018, history was made at the University of Miami, as the Miami Hurricanes practiced inside the Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility for the very first time during fall camp.
- In September 2016, Miami announced the largest donation in the history of the athletics department as the lead gift for a state-of-the-art football indoor practice facility. In honor of their mother Carol, Jeffrey Soffer and Carol's other children made a \$14 million commitment to Miami.
- Former coach Mark Richt pledged \$1 million towards the facility and football alumnus and linebacker great Jon Beason was among those alumni to donate. Beason's gift was \$250,000, as Miami alumni and former players teamed up to contribute more than \$2 million for the project.
- The 81,800-square-foot facility features two field-turf fields one 90 yards long and an additional 40yard field directly connecting to the Squillante Strength and Conditioning Center.

MIAMI IN YEAR 5 OF 12-YEAR DEAL WITH ADIDAS

- In January of 2015, adidas & the University of Miami announced a landmark 12-year partnership making adidas the official footwear, apparel and accessory brand of UM through June 2027.
- The partnership, which then made Miami one of adidas' 13 licensed NCAA programs at the time, began on Sept. 1, 2015 and includes investment, product and uniform development for all 18 UM programs.

HEAD COACH | FIRST SEASON AT MIAMI (FIRST OVERALL) | 4-4 (.500)

Manny Diaz, who has deep roots in the Miami community and catapulted the Hurricane's defense to elite status during his three years as the team's defensive coordinator from 2016-2018, was announced as the 25th head coach of the University of Miami football program on Sun., Dec. 30.

"Manny is one of the nation's elite coaches and the Canes Family has already embraced him and his incredible work ethic over the past three years," said UM Director of Athletics Blake James upon his hiring. "He is absolutely the passionate and innovative leader that our program needs, and we will work together to build an incredible staff to move our program back into championship contention."

Diaz, who has an impressive resume during nearly two decades as a defensive specialist coaching several collegiate programs, accepted his dream job of leading a Hurricanes team he believes is destined to return to the top echelon of collegiate football in the years to come.

"Miami is home. The University of Miami is home. The U has truly been 'the job' for me since I first got into coaching," said Diaz. "Having worked here over the past three years, I came to understand what it means to be part of 'The U' and came to appreciate the passion and commitment to excellence of all who proudly call themselves Canes. We will restore the football program to its place among the nation's elite and we will do it with hard work, dedicated coaches, and outstanding student-athletes. I'm excited about working with Blake and his team to make that happen."

During his 19-year coaching career, Diaz, the son of a former Miami mayor, also named Manny Diaz, has coached in 18 bowl games, amassing a 13-5 record in bowls, and has coached numerous all-conference and NFL players at six collegiate institutions.

The Hurricanes ranked No. 4 in the nation in total defense and ranked No. 1 in several categories, including tackles for loss, third down conversion percentage and passing yards allowed. Defensive tack-le Gerald Willis earned All-American honors from several outlets while linebacker Shaq Quarterman was named to the All-ACC First Team - one of eight all-conference picks.

Continuing the impressive trends from Diaz's first year running the defense, the Hurricanes ranked among the nation's leaders in several defensive categories in 2017, including first nationally in team sacks, third nationally in tackles for loss and ninth nationally in opponent yards per play. Five Hurricanes on the defensive side of the ball earned 2017 All-ACC honors while another three picked up Honorable Mention recognition.

Thanks in large part to his dominating unit, Miami also ranked No. 5 nationally in turnover margin, No. 8 nationally in fumbles recovered and No. 15 nationally in passes intercepted.

Miami's defense enjoyed vast improvements under Diaz' watch and served as one of the top units both in the ACC and nationally in his first season in 2016.

At the conclusion of the 2016 season, Miami was ranked No. 20 nationally in total defense (up from No. 69 the previous season), No. 9 in yards per play (No. 86 in 2015), No. 12 in scoring defense (No. 77 in 2015), No. 5 in tackles for loss (No. 105 in 2015), No. 22 in team sacks (No. 70 in 2015) and tied for No. 8 in defensive touchdowns allowed (No. 61 in 2015).

Miami was the only team in the country to start three true freshmen linebackers, and the Hurricanes' trio of Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney and Shaquille Quarterman helped anchor the unit. Three defensive players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors - senior defensive backs Corn Elder (second team) and Rayshawn Jenkins (honorable mention) and Quarterman at linebacker (honorable mention).







In 2015, Diaz's defensive unit helped Mississippi State to a 9-4 record and a victory over NC State in the Belk Bowl. His defensive unit held opponents to just 23.2 points per game and ranked in the nation's top 10 in red zone defense and tackles for loss.

Diaz spent one season, 2014, at Louisiana Tech and his impact was felt in a big way. The Bulldogs led the nation in turnovers gained (42) with 16 fumble recoveries and 26 interceptions. Before his stop at Louisiana Tech, Diaz coached three seasons at Texas (2011-13). His 2011 defensive unit ranked ninth in total yards per play.

In 2010, during his first stint at Mississippi State, Diaz guided a defense that ranked No. 22 in the nation in scoring defense (19.9 ppg), No. 17 in rushing defense (214.9 ypg) and No. 17 in tackles for loss (7.0 pg).

Before his first stop at Mississippi State, Diaz spent four seasons as defensive coordinator at Middle Tennessee State. Diaz coached linebackers for two years after mentoring the safeties during his first two years.Before joining Middle Tennessee, Diaz played a significant role for one of the country's top-ranked defenses by coaching safeties in 2004-05 and handling the linebackers in 2002-03 for NC State.

Diaz spent the 2000 and 2001 seasons at NCSU as a graduate assistant working primarily with the linebackers. During that time, the Wolfpack went to two bowl games and became the first ACC team to beat Florida State in Tallahassee. Diaz began his coaching career at Florida State in 1998. In his two years as a graduate assistant, he was on the same coaching staff as former Miami head coach Mark Richt and was part of the Seminoles' national title-winning coaching staff in 1999.

Diaz and his wife Stephanie have three sons: Colin, Gavin and Manny.
