TIP-OFF: Butler and Miami (Fla.) will tangle for the Puerto Rico Tip-Off title Sunday evening in San Juan. The Bulldogs put their 3-0 record on the line after tournament wins against Missouri State and Temple.

FOLLOW ALONG: The game will be televised nationally on ESPN2, while Mark Minner and Nick Gardner can be heard on 1070 AM and 93.5 FM. Rich Hollenberg and LaPhonso Ellis will have the ESPN2 call. Information can also be found on Twitter at @ButlerMBB and @ESPNRPTipOff as well as ButlerSports.com.

THE SERIES: This is the first meeting between Butler and Miami (Fla.)

SHIP BACK THE TROPHY: Butler is looking for its first in-season tournament championship since the 2010 Diamond Head Classic in Honolulu (2010-11 season). Butler defeated Utah, Florida State and Washington State in that tournament. Those Bulldogs advanced to the national championship game. The Bulldogs also won the 2007 Great Alaska Shootout and 2006 NIT Season Tip-Off.

LAST TIME OUT: Butler used tough defense and solid free throw shooting Friday afternoon to push by Temple and advance to the championship game of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off in San Juan. The Bulldogs limited Temple to 38-percent shooting in the 74-69 win. Butler made 21 of 25 free throws. DOUBLING DOWN: Senior Roosevelt Jones has 10+ rebounds in all three contests this season, including the eighth and ninth double-doubles of his Butler career. Jones had 18 points and 11 rebounds in the opener against The Citadel and 12 points and 11 boards against Temple. He had 10 rebounds (and six points) against Missouri State. For his career, he has 13 games with double-digit rebounds.

(WIDE)MANNING THE MIDDLE: Tyler Wideman had a career-high four blocks against Temple, helping to hold the Owls to 38 percent shooting. The four swats also came in a career-high 33 minutes. Wideman has stepped into the starting post position vacated by the graduation of Kameron Woods. His biggest area of improvement has been at the free throw line where he is 8-of-10 this season after shooting 42 percent as a freshman in 2014-15.

While in Puerto Rico, Wideman has picked up his 100th career point and 100th career rebound.

CAREFUL CONSIDERATION: Tyler Lewis, including a 10-assist performance against Missouri State in the Puerto Rico opener, has 13 assists on the season against only one turnover. He is the first Butler player with 10 assists in a game since Ronald Nored against Indiana State on Feb. 18, 2012.

LARGE GAP: Despite a five-point win against Temple, Butler is seventh in the country in scoring margin at 37.3 points per game.

HIGH OCTANE: Butler is third in the country in scoring at 103.7 points per game. Butler is also shooting at a 54.1 percent clip, which is tenth in the country.

SHARING IS CARING: On the season, Butler has 63 assists against only 24 turnovers through three games. The Bulldogs rank third nationally in assist/turnover ratio (2.63 assists per turnover) and 13th in assists per game (21.0).

Butler's 8.0 turnovers per game are seventh in the country.

FIRST TIMER: With a career-high 10 rebounds to go along with 13 points Friday against Temple, junior Andrew Chrabaszcz posted his first double-double as a Butler Bulldog. He had a career-high eight assists in the season opener against The Citadel.

INSTANT OFFENSE: With eight points and nine rebounds against Temple, sophomore Kelan Martin just missed his second career double-double (his first came in the season opener against The Citadel). He had 31 points in just 37 minutes through the first two games of the season. While Martin is used to doing his work efficiently, he played a career-high 25 minutes against Temple.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS: Seniors Kellen Dunham and Roosevelt Jones continue to climb several lists in Butler's career rankings. Dunham is now 13th in scoring (1,462 points) and third in three-pointers (218). Jones is 31st in scoring (1,113) and eighth in assists (322).

RE-WRITE THE RECORD BOOKS: In the season-opener against The Citadel and their frantic pace, Butler set records for most points in a game (144; previously 128), made field goals (56; previously 53), most points in a half (73 and 71; respectively, which both broke the previous mark of 63), and margin of victory (73; bettering a 68-point win – 82-14 – over Indiana Law School during the 1921-22 season).

According to the ESPN Stats Department, it was the most points scored by a Division I team versus a Division I team since TCU beat UT-Pan American, 153-87, in 1997.

NOT A ONE-MAN SHOW: Butler had seven players in double figures against The Citadel, including all five starters. Those seven players all still average double-figures through three games. Kellen Dunham leads the way at 17 points per game.

All 12 Bulldogs who saw action The Citadel scored. Butler eclipsed the 100-point mark with 13:32 remaining in the second half.

ON THE DEFENSIVE: It's easy to get caught up in the offensive numbers, but Butler had a strong effort on the defensive side of the ball. The Bulldogs limited The Citadel to 27-percent shooting and forced 20 turnovers. Butler did not allow a fast break point.

'PAINT' OF EMPHASIS: Butler outscored The Citadel, 92-18, in the paint. The Bulldogs shot 77 percent (48-62) from two-point range.

'BOARD' OUT OF THEIR MINDS: Butler had a 63-28 advantage on the boards against The Citadel. Butler had 18 offensive rebounds compared to only 16 defensive rebounds for the visitors.

CAREER NIGHT: In addition to the team records, several Bulldogs posted personal-bests against The Citadel. Tyler Wideman had 18 points on 8-of-8 shooting. Tyler Lewis had 17 points, one better than his previous career-high set during his time at North Carolina State. Jackson Davis had 19 points and eight rebounds (both career-highs). Kelan Martin (10) and Austin Etherington (7) had new bests for rebounds. Andrew Chrabaszcz set a new mark with eight assists.

BACK AT IT: Kellen Dunham led the Bulldogs in scoring against The Citadel with 24 points. Either Dunham or Roosevelt Jones led the team in scoring in 25 of the 34 games during the 2014-15 season.

NATIONAL ATTENTION: Butler is ranked #20 nationally in the USA TODAY Sports coaches poll and #22 in the preseason AP poll. During the 2014-15 season, Butler was among teams receiving votes or ranked in

the "Top 25" in 16 of the final 17 weeks of the season. The Bulldogs climbed to as high as No. 15 in the AP national poll and No. 18 in the USA Today national poll. Butler finished the campaign ranked #23 in the final coaches poll and #24 in the final AP poll.

Including 2015-16, Butler has been ranked in the "Top 25" in eight of the past 10 seasons.

BIG (EAST) EXPECTATIONS: In a vote of the conference's 10 coaches, Butler was picked to finish third in the BIG EAST Preseason Poll. The Bulldogs came in just behind Villanova and Georgetown. Butler finished in a tie for second in the BIG EAST a season ago after being picked to finish in a tie for seventh in the preseason poll.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES: Seniors Kellen Dunham and Roosevelt Jones were both named to the five-member Preseason All-BIG EAST First Team. Butler was the only team to have two selections.

The Bulldogs are the only BIG EAST team to return its three top scorers from a season ago (Dunham, Jones, Chrabascz).

A QUICK LOOK BACK: Butler finished the season with a 23-11 record, matching the 11th-highest single season win total in school history. Butler's climb from 4-14 in the BIG EAST in 2013-14 to 12-6 in the conference this season tied the fourth-best turnaround (+8) in BIG EAST history.

TOURNAMENT TESTED: Butler advanced

to the NCAA Tournament for the 13th time. Butler's second-round win over Texas was the 20th NCAA Tournament win in program history. The 2015 bid was Butler's 12th in the last 19 years.

FILLING THE VOID: Alex Barlow and Kameron Woods have graduated. Both players started all 34 contests a season ago. Barlow finished his Butler career ranked third in career steals with 187. Woods led the BIG EAST in rebounding the past two seasons and finished with 956 career rebounds, second in program history. Reserve guard Jackson Aldridge also exhausted his eligibility.

TOP TWENTY: The 2014-15 Bulldogs became the 20th Butler team to record 20 victories in a season. Butler has won at least 20 games in nine of the past 10 campaigns, including a school-record 33 victories in 2009-10. Chris Holtmann became the fourth head coach in Butler history to win 20 games in his first season.

NOTHING JUNIOR ABOUT THAT: Kellen Dunham scored 561 points a season ago, the sixth-highest single-season scoring production by a Butler junior. Dunham scored in double-figures in 30 games last season.

Dunham has scored in double figures in 73 games in a Butler uniform. He has made at least one three-pointer in 19 straight games, dating back to last season.

TOP OF THE CHART: Kellen Dunham finished third in the BIG EAST in scoring in

2014-15 (16.5), and is the league's top returning scorer. Dunham is the first Butler player to lead the team in scoring in consecutive seasons since Brandon Polk in 2004-05 and 2005-06. Jon Neuhouser is the last Bulldog to lead the team in scoring in three consecutive seasons (1995-96, 1996-97, 1997-98).

RECORD CLIMB: Kellen Dunham stands in 14th place on Butler's all-time scoring list with 1,435 career points, four points shy of Bobby Plump (1954-58) in the No. 13 position. Jones is 33rd on the all-time list with 1,095 career points, five points behind Joel Cornette (1999-2003). Plump is the "real-life" Jimmy Chitwood from the movie Hoosiers. The movie is based off the shot he made for Milan High School in the state tournament ("Jimmy" played for Hickory in the movie). The actual game was played at (then) Butler Fieldhouse and the movie was filmed at Hinkle. Plump played for Butler after graduating from Milan.

1,000-POINT CLUB: Kellen Dunham and Roosevelt Jones both scored their 1,000th career point in 2014-15. The last time Butler had two players score their 1,000th career point in the same season was in 2006, when both Avery Sheets and Bruce Horan topped the mark.

ALL-AROUND GREAT GUY: Roosevelt Jones led the Bulldogs in assists in 2014-15 after also leading the team in that category in 2012-13. Jones was second on the team in scoring and rebounding a season ago. He led the team in rebounding as a freshman in 2011-12.

BE THE MATCH: Former Bulldog standout Andrew Smith had a bone marrow transplant procedure in early November as he battles a

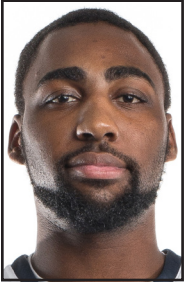
