THE 2016-17 HURRICANES

Miami has nine scholarship players, led by a trio of captains in seniors Davon Reed and Kamari Murphy, along with junior Ja'Quan Newton. Sophomores Anthony Lawrence and Ebuka Izundu also returned for the Hurricanes.

This season, a group of four newcomers comprising Miami's top recruiting class in program history donned a UM jersey for the first time. The Canes' coaching staff reeled in four freshmen in McDonald's All-American Dewan Huell, Jordan Brand Classic All-American Bruce Brown, Australian standout Dejan "DJ" Vasiljevic and Rodney Miller from national powerhouse Oak Hill Academy (Va.). The four-man group was named one of the top 2016 classes in the country, with a No. 9 ranking from 247Sports, No. 10 from Scout, No. 13 from ESPN and No. 13 from Rivals.

CANES SIGN A TRIO OF TOP-100 PLAYERS

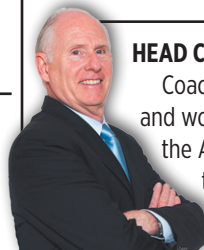
Jim Larrañaga has signed three ESPN Top 100 players for the 2017 class in guard Lonnie Walker (No. 19), guard Chris Lykes (52) and forward Deng Gak (93).

This marks the second straight Miami recruiting class with at least two ESPN Top 100 players, following last year's signing of Bruce Brown (26) and Dewan Huell (28).

Walker is a 6-foot-5-inch shooting guard from Reading, Pa., with great ball handling skills and is Miami's highest-ranked recruit in program history. Lykes is a 5-foot-6-inch explosive do-it-all point guard from Bowie, Md., who plays at Gonzaga College (D.C.) High School. Gak is a 6-foot-11-inch forward playing his prep ball at Blair Academy in New Jersey.

HEAD COACH JIM LARRAÑAGA

Coach Jim Larrañaga has led the Hurricanes to a pair of NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and won the 2013 ACC regular season and ACC Tournament titles. He has been named the AP, Naismith, USBWA and Henry Iba National Coach of the Year, twice was both the ACC and USBWA District Coach of the Year (2013, 2016), and was the 2013 NABC District Coach of the Year.

LARRAÑAGA BY THE NUMBERS

5 - Coach Jim Larrañaga is one of five ACC coaches with a Final Four appearance to his credit. In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the NCAA Final Four in 27 years.

7 - In 32 years of coaching, Jim Larrañaga has a winning record in the NCAA Tournament, a 9-6 mark in seven appearances.

7 - Larrañaga is no stranger to the ACC. In his seven seasons as an assistant coach at Virginia, the Cavaliers participated in the NCAA Final Four in 1981 and 1984, won three ACC Championships and finished in the top five of the rankings.

16 - Larrañaga has made 16 postseason appearances in the past 27 years, including reaching seven NCAA Tournaments.

33 - Larrañaga is in his 33rd year as a head coach and has successfully transitioned three institutions into winning programs: Miami, Bowling Green and George Mason.

500 - Coach L is one of five ACC coaches with 500 or more wins.

LARRAÑAGA - WHY MIAMI?

Along with returning to the best basketball conference in the country, Coach L had a few personal reasons for accepting the head coaching job at Miami. Coach's grandfather was from Cuba, where he produced the Larrañaga [lare-en-YAH-ga] cigar. Coach's father was raised in Key West, Fla., before moving to The Bronx, N.Y., getting married and raising six children. Coach L was raised in The Bronx, but vacationed to Florida as a boy. He also owns a house in Sarasota, Fla., and three of his siblings have retired to Florida.

THE MATCHUP BETWEEN MIAMI AND IOWA STATE

This is the first meeting between Miami and Iowa State. The game with Iowa State is just the second time in school history the Canes will face a Division I opponent from the state of Iowa (Beat Northern Iowa, 78-69, on 11/27/98).

The matchup is Coach L's first meeting with a Big 12 team since he arrived at Miami in 2012.

In 2013-14 as a sophomore at Oklahoma State, Kamari Murphy had seven points and six rebounds in the first matchup against Iowa State, then tallied six points and nine rebounds in the second meeting.

MIAMI DEFENSE IS STINGY IN THE FIRST HALF

The Hurricanes have held their first four opponents to 88 total first-half points (22.0 ppg) through four games, and forced opponents to shoot just 20 percent (9-45) from three. Miami also has forced opponents to cough up the rock, averaging 9.0 forced turnovers in the first stanza.

JA'QUAN NEWTON CONTINUES TO IMPROVE

Junior point guard Ja'Quan Newton has tremendously improved his stats over his first three seasons at Miami. With 20 points against Stanford (11/24), Newton was the first Cane this season to score 20-or-more points in a game.

SOPHOMORE SURGE BY LAWRENCE

Sophomore Anthony Lawrence, Jr., has recorded 12 steals through four games (3.0 spg) this season after just tallying 17 total steals (0.5) as a rookie. He's also improved his points per game from 4.1 as a rookie to 9.0 this season and his minutes have increased from 12.0 to 27.8 mpg.

MURPHY CLEANING UP THE BOARDS

Redshirt senior Kamari Murphy is cleaning up the boards for Miami, pulling down 8.0 per game this season. He has at least seven in each of the Canes' four games. A year ago, Murphy grabbed seven-or-more rebounds in 11 outings.

RECAPPING MIAMI AT PUERTO RICO LAST SEASON

Miami defeated Mississippi State, 105-79, then downed No. 16 Utah, 90-66, and dropped No. 22/20 Butler, 85-75, to win the 2015 Puerto Rico Tip-Off. The Canes outscored their opponents by 20.0 points per game, and outrebounded opponents by 8.7 rebounds per game. Miami also won the event in 2007-08. Senior guard Angel Rodriguez was named the Puerto Rico Tip-Off Most Valuable Player. He averaged 13.7 points and 4.0 assists, including 19 points in the championship game. The native of Cupey, P.R., just 20 minutes from San Juan, was greeted by many friends and family at each game. Sheldon McClellan, Rodriguez and Tonye Jekiri were named to the Puerto Rico Tip-Off All Tournament Team.

MILESTONES FOR THE CANES

1,000 Games - Coach Larrañaga opened the 2016-17 season just 21 shy of 1,000 career games coached. Miami's 21st game of the season is vs. Florida State on Feb. 1. He has coached 53 games at American International, 314 at Bowling Green, 437 at Geoge Mason and now 178 at Miami.

1,000 Program Wins - The University of Miami men's basketball program has won 994 of its 1,721 games.

600 Victories - Coach Larrañaga is just eight wins shy of 600 career victories. With 600 wins, he will be one of five ACC coaches with 600 victories, and the other four men are in the Basketball Hall of Fame.

100 Blocks - Redshirt senior Kamari Murphy has recorded 94 career blocks, with 61 at Oklahoma State and 33 at Miami.

1,000 Points - Senior Davon Reed has scored 895 points in 102 career games at The U.

100 Games - Seniors Kamari Murphy and Davon Reed each played in their 100th career game at North Florida on Nov. 16, 2016. Murphy, a redshirt senior, played in 66 games at Oklahoma State before coming to Miami as a junior. All of Reed's games played are at UM.

RECAPPING MIAMI VS. STANFORD

• Ja'Quan Newton finished the game with 20 points to tie his career high and lead the team in scoring. The Philadelphia native added two rebounds, a pair of assists and a steal in 37 minutes played.

• Following three consecutive scoreless halves - zero points against Penn and zero in the first half against Stanford - Anthony Lawrence caught the hot hand, matching a career-high for points in a game with 18. His last game with 18 was vs. Notre Dame on Feb. 3, 2016.

• While recording four steals, Lawrence, the St. Petersburg, Fla., native surpassed his total amount of made three pointers on the season (2) shooting 3-5 from behind the arc, 3-3 from the free-throw line and 6-8 from the field in the second half.

• Senior Kamari Murphy led the team with both seven rebounds and two blocks.

• For the second consecutive game, freshman Bruce Brown finished with double-digit points, 10, while adding six rebounds, two assists and a steal.

• At the end of the first half, Newton led the way for the Hurricanes with 12 points, as the Hurricanes trailed the Cardinal, 27-23.

• The Hurricanes have held their first four opponents to 88 total first-half points (22.0 ppg), and forced opponents to shoot just 30.8 percent (36-117) from the field and 20.0 percent (9-45) from three. Miami has also forced opponents to cough up the rock, averaging 9.0 forced turnovers in the first stanza.

• Following a 3-pointer by sophomore Anthony Lawrence Jr., with 16:59 remaining in the second half, Miami cut the Cardinal lead to five. Senior Davon Reed added a layup before Lawrence received a dump off pass from Newton at the basket which he laid in for the and-one to even the score at 33. This was the first time since the 5:25 (7-7) minute mark in the first half that the Miami and Stanford were tied. The run continued after a jumper by Dorian Pickens, with Reed drilling a three to give Miami its first lead since 14:56 remained in the half (7-4 Miami).

• In the second half, the Hurricanes shot 62.5 percent (15-24) from the field and 44.4 percent (4-9) from downtown, and outscored Stanford, 44-26.

• The Hurricanes held the Cardinal to shoot 21-51 (41.2%) from the field and 3-12 (25.0%) from three.

• Since 2011-12, the Canes are now 12-3 in regular season tournaments.

• The Hurricanes evened the all-time series with the Cardinal at 2-2.

HIGH-OCTANE CANES

Miami has scored 90+ points 11 times under the leadership of Coach L, and twice already this season, with 92 against Western Carolina and 94 at North Florida. Three times, those 90-point games were wins against ranked teams: No. 1 Duke, 90-63, in 2013; No. 4 Duke, 90-74, in 2015; and No. 16 Utah, 90-66, in 2015.

MIAMI EARNING VOTES IN BOTH NATIONAL POLLS

Miami is garnering votes in both the AP (44) and the USA TODAY Coaches (37) polls. The Canes are three places out of the Top 25 in both the AP poll and USA TODAY poll.

CANES ARE YOUNG, BUT LED BY EXPERIENCED SENIORS

Miami is No. 297 out of 351 teams in experience in the nation, according to KenPom.com. The Canes are led by a pair of seniors who have each played in 102 games, but Miami also has six players who have appeared in less than 40 games in their careers. Four freshmen have played in just three games apiece, while starting center Ebuka Izundu has played in 18 games and starting guard Anthony Lawrence has played just 37 games.

McCLELLAN MAKES FIRST NBA START

Former Cane and current Washington Wizards rookie Sheldon McClellan made his first NBA start on Nov. 12 vs. Chicago, in just his fifth professional game played. Against the Bulls, he scored 15 points in 35 minutes played. His second career start was Nov. 16 against Philadelphia, when Mac had six points, two rebounds and two steals in 20 minutes.

MURPHY AND REED PLAY 100TH GAME

At North Florida, seniors Kamari Murphy and Davon Reed each suited up for their 100th career game. Murphy played in 66 games at Oklahoma State before playing at Miami. All of Reed's games played are at UM.

SELLING OUT THE WATSCO CENTER

In just his fifth season in Coral Gables, Jim Larrañaga and Miami SOLD OUT the season ticket allotment for all home games last year at the Watsco Center. It was the first time in Miami athletics history a team sold out their season. And now, the arena is sold out in back-to-back seasons.

For two straight years, fans have bought over 5,500 season tickets, more than doubling the total number of season tickets sold in Larrañaga's first season in Coral Gables. When Coach L began his reign in Miami, fans bought 2,251 season tickets for the 2011-12 campaign. After a record-breaking season on the court in 2012-13, season tickets peaked at 3,674 for 2013-14, prior to this year's 5,750 mark.

FACILITY UNDERGOING \$1.7 MILLION RENOVATION

The basketball facility is in the process of a \$1.7 million renovation that will include upgrades to the locker rooms, student-athlete lounges, office spaces, weight room and practice facility hallways.

The project is being split into two phases, beginning with the \$1.7 million remodel. The second phase will begin following the 2016-17 season.

The coaches' offices and hallways of the facility will feature highlights from great moments in Miami basketball history, as well as photos of select stars from both the men's and women's teams. Also on display will be large-scale images of UM's ProCanes as well as the newest Canes adidas gear.

The players' lounge will feature a gaming center complete with couches and televisions.

The walls of the practice facility will showcase photos of celebrity Canes fans throwing up the U and images of the sold-out student section.

The overall concept will be produced by ZeDesign. The wallpaper-style graphics will be printed on Dreamscape material. Office flooring will be provided by Southeastern Surfaces and Equipment while furniture will be from DreamSeat, Apricot and ZeDesign.

Student-athletes will have custom lockers from Longhorn Lockers and ProSound will upgrade the sound system in the locker room, lounges and coaches' offices.
