## *Jack Harding*

was a great all around athlete at University of Pittsburgh and then went on to successful football coaching careers at University of Scranton and University of Miami. He took over the rapidly expanding University of Miami athletic program as full time athletic director in 1948, after having served for a number of years both as head grid coach and as athletic director. Under his guidance, the University of Miami athletic program has expanded to great heights and the Hurricanes have opened athletic relationships with teams from coast to coast. Miami now maintains varsity teams in basketball, football, baseball, track, cross country, tennis, golf and swimming. Harding's wide acquaintanceships have helped Miami schedulewise and his experience in building has proven to be just what young University of Miami has needed.

## The Coaching Staff

### Varsity Basketball

**BRUCE HALE**, head basketball coach at Miami, has



broken even in three years of coaching at the University of Miami as his teams have turned in 36 wins and suffered as many defeats in that period. However he expects his building job to start paying off this season when Miami should have its best team in some years. He was All America in college at Santa Clara

where he was graduated in 1941. He was a captain in the U. S. Army Air Force, playing on the Five by Five team at Miami Beach and later coaching the Wright Air Field Base to the service championship. He played professional basketball for 10 years and was on the All World pro team of 1945. He coached the Chicago America Gears to the pro championship in 1946 and later played and coached the Indianapolis team in professional play.

### Freshman Coach

**SY CHADROFF**, freshman coach, ranks as one of the all time great basketball players at University of Miami. Sy was a good player as a sophomore when he made 240 points and as a junior when he added 268, but he was a great player as a senior when he made 459 points and, scoring 99 points on free throws, topped the nation in free throw accuracy that year. He tried 123. His percentage was .805. His 1952 scoring average of 20.9 points per game is still a UM varsity record. He had 12 twenty point games in 1952, a record at that time.

## Basketball Outlook

**A**LL THREE centers and one reserve guard are missing from the 1956-57 University of Miami basketball team which won 13 and lost 13 games—but as center was the weak spot of that squad and two towering sophomores up from the freshman squad are available to take over, Miami looks for one of its best basketball teams ever this season.

Seniors Marty Burdette and Ed Morris will be the starting forwards. Marty, improving each season, should be a real star this year. Morris did not hit his sophomore form until the final weeks of 1957. He is a potential 20 point a game man. Joe Gardner, a slick shooting veteran, is very much to be reckoned with, however.

Gene Stage, captain and playmaker, scored 461 points last year, most ever for a junior at Miami and is the team's balance wheel. Joe Munley, a mid-season discovery, will fight it out with veteran Bill Talbot for the other guard spot.

Seven foot Dick Berghoff, who broke all Miami freshman scoring records last year, has All America potentialities. Bill Rankin, 6 foot 8, can swing between center and forward as needed. He is a great floor man and rebounder.

Ed Contreareas hasn't realized his possibilities as yet but gives experienced depth up front. Sophomores Bob Leidy and Norm Nebel, a pair of 6 foot 4 inch shot-makers up front, and Dave Landis, fleet 6 foot guard, are other Miami newcomers.

Miami retains its top four point makers from 1956-57, adds powerful new talent—and won't have to play mighty Kentucky, Louisville or Dayton this year.

A five game road trip early in the season may be the make or break week for this team. Loyola of the South, Louisiana State, Kentucky Wesleyan and the Birmingham Classic contenders must be met. If Miami can win two or more of these games, look out for the Hurricanes!

Miami retains its four leading scorers, three of its four leading rebounders. Berghoff and Rankin are counted on to give Miami an edge in rebounds—they were outrebounded an average of five per game last year. The same pair will be counted on to cut down the number of enemy shots and disturb their accuracy. Last year, Miami foes had about three shots more per game than did Miami—and had a near 40% accuracy rating against 36½% for Miami.

Ind. Earned a regular berth at the start of his sophomore year and has held it since. In his first year, he scored 419 points, made 322 rebounds and hit on .427 of his field goal tries. The two latter marks were one season records for Miami, the former was the highest point total ever recorded by a Miami sophomore. Ed had trouble getting going last year, and not until his 23rd game did he score over 14 points—he had averaged 16.1 as a sophomore. However, he regained his touch in the final three weeks of play, should be a whiz this year. He is a good rebounder and has a strong one handed shot from the side. His high school coach—John Ward.

His high school coach, John Frenberger.

**NORM NEBEL**, sophomore, from Brooklyn, is 6 feet 4 inches tall. He is one of the more promising newcomers and has an excellent chance of taking over if one of the veterans falters. He has an effective one hand shot and is extremely accurate from the free throw line. He is able to get off the floor plenty and can outrebound players who have several inches advantage in height. High school coach, Jack Krugman.

**JOE GARDNER**, junior in Business Administration, is from Chattanooga, Tenn. Joe has a good two hand set shot and also a neat one hand jump shot from any position. Most of his action last year, when he lettered, was at guard but he is equally at home at forward. He is one of the team's most accurate shots and played key roles in wins over the Texas Aggies and Florida State. His high school coach, J.R. Osteen.

Ed lettered in baseball last spring, shattered the UM home run record.

**BOB LEIDY**, sophomore from Coral Gables, is 6 feet 4. He was the top forward on the 1956-57 freshman team and has an excellent shot with either hand. He fights well for the rebounds and is a clutch player. Bob may not be able to dislodge any of the veterans but he is a good man to insert into the lineup in the pinch and this year will get the varsity experience he now lacks. High school coach, Ed Stoeckel.

## CENTERS

**DICK BERGHOFF**, sophomore, from Ft. Wayne, Ind., is Miami's first 7 foot athlete. With his equipment, Berghoff can make All America if he realizes his potentialities 100%. He set a net scoring record for freshmen last year with 328 points in 15 games, an average of 21.8 points per game. The points per game average tops the varsity mark. He made 35 points in one game. He is durable, a fine rebounder and with his two way hook shot, picks up lots of points. High school coach, Don Bruck.



**BILL RANKIN**, sophomore, from Terre Haute, Ind., is 6 feet 8 inches tall. He is fast and extremely mobile in every respect and so will be used at forward and center. He has tremendous spring and can challenge the tallest players on the rebounds. He has an excellent one hand shot and can hook either way from the pivot. He did not do too much shooting as a freshman, yet picked up 136 points in 14 games including one 21 point effort. High school coach, Willard Kehert.

## GUARDS

**GENE STAGE**, senior, in Education, 6 feet, hails from Elwood, Ind. Is team captain. Was a regular as a sophomore but came into his own last year as a brilliant field general, a heady defensive player and a combination of a fine jump shot and two hand set from the outside. His 461 point total last year was the highest ever made by a Miami junior and he is likely to wipe almost every scoring record off the Miami books. He made 20 points or more in 13 games last year. Is a definite All America candidate. His high school coach, John Ward.

Lloyd Bennett this year fields his eighth swimming team at the University of Miami. He has put together some powerful teams in the past, going undefeated in several campaigns. One of his swimmers, Gaither Rosser, was on the U.S. Olympic team of 1952—and this year, Sophomore Jack Nelson was a member of the 1956 team.

Bennett's 1952 team won 10 of 13 meets while in 1954 and 1955, the Hurricanes went undefeated in dual competition. Florida and Southeastern AAU titles were also won by Miami in those years.

During 1956 and 1957, the Hurricanes were woefully undermanned and the team had poor years but this year's outlook is somewhat brighter.

## Swimming Outlook For 1958

The Hurricanes will be stronger this year except in diving where Coach Loyd Bennett is still attempting to uncover some as yet undiscovered material. At press time, there are no divers listed on the roster. New material plus two returning veterans—Martin Redlich and Dick Joseph—make up the squad.

Marty Redlich, sensational in the 220 and 440 free style last year, is being groomed to fill the void in the free style sprints and Bennett believes he will fill the bill.

Olympic star Jack Nelson, a sophomore, is virtually unbeatable in the butterfly while Sophomore William Lahde already has covered most of the backstroke distances faster than any previous Hurricane.

Teaming with this trio to make a strong medley relay team will be another sophomore, Kenneth Kline.

Sophomore Eduardo Carrera and Letterman Dick Joseph will give the team strength in the middle distances and will swim with Redlich and Nelson in the 400 yard relay.
