Bring Out the Brooms

The Hurricanes won all three games for the second consecutive weekend, earning another series sweep to kick off 2012. The Canes, who outscored the visiting Great Danes of Albany by a combined margin of 38-10 over three contests, scored the most runs in a three-game set since a weekend battle with North Carolina in 2005 (42).

Eric Erickson (2-0) impressed in his second start, throwing six full innings and striking out nine while allowing only four hits. The lefty, who guided the Canes to a 15-4 win, has a 16:0 K:BB ratio through his 13 innings of work.

Eric Whaley's six innings of three-hit ball helped the Canes to an 11-1 win in Game Two. Captain Peter O'Brien finished the game 2-for-4 with three RBI.

Sophomore Bryan Radziewski rebounded from a disappointing first start in earning his first win of the season in the series finale. "B-Rad" threw six innings, allowing two earned runs and striking out four, in a 12-5 Canes win.

Veteran Presence in 2012

The Canes received a big boost in the offseason when transfer catcher Peter O'Brien and graduate student lefthander Eric Erickson were both declared eligible by the NCAA. True to their elections, the team's two captains for the 2012 season have played key roles through the team's first stretch.

Through seven games, O'Brien is currently the team leader in a number of key hitting categories: batting average (.519), runs (10), hits (14), homeruns (3), RBI (9), slugging percentage (1.000) and on-base percentage (.576).

Erickson has impressed in his two starts early on in 2012; the Sarasota native has struck out 16 batters (team-high) in his 13 innings of work. He is sporting a 2-0 record, a 0.00 ERA, and a .170 BAA.

Moving On Up

With their 7-0 start, the Canes have climbed upwards in a number of college baseball's most prominent polls.

As of Feb. 27, Miami is ranked No. 8 in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches' Poll, No. 8 by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper, No. 10 in NCBWA's weekly poll, No. 12 by Baseball America and No. 12 by Perfect Game.

Opening Series Sweep

The University of Miami opened the season against Rutgers for the fourth time in as many years, and marked the beginning of its 2012 campaign with a sweep of the Scarlet Knights. It was the second time in four tries the Canes have swept Rutgers to begin their season.

UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI HEAD COACH JIM MORRIS - 19TH SEASON

2001, 1999, & 1994 National Coach of the Year • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



In his 19th season at Miami, no other program, nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 39 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 18 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 27 years, 18 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 821-321-3 (.717) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,325-565-4 (.700) Division I record in 30 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 33 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,456-606-4 (.705) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 19 years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 27th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2011 when he guided the 'Canes to the NCAA Gainesville Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 18 seasons (1994-2011), winning 15 of his last 18 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2011 Hurricanes to their 39th-straight NCAA Tournament. Three players from the 2011 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft. In 2008, the 'Canes reached the College World Series after winning the Atlantic Coast Conference, widely considered one of the toughest - if not the toughest - collegiate baseball conference in the country.

MORRIS IN HIS 34TH SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,325-565-4 (.700) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,456-606-4 (.705) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 18 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- Guided the Miami Hurricanes to College World Series National Championship in 1999 and 2001.
- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 18 seasons and led the Canes to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami, by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and

2001.

- Sent 150 players to the Pro's, including Yonder Alonso (Cincinnati Reds), Pat Burrell (Rays), Ryan Braun (Brewers), Danny Graves (Astros), Alex Cora (Mets), Nomar Garciaparra (Dodgers), Jon Jay (St. Louis Cardinals), Gabby Sanchez (Florida Marlins), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins) and Jason Varitek (Red Sox).
- Has served three stints with the U.S. National Team: Assistant Coach for 1987 Pan American Games (Silver), Head Coach for 1989 Presidential Cup (Silver) and Head Coach for 1990 Goodwill Games (Bronze).

SHORTSTOPS AND JIM MORRIS

Morris, who played shortstop during college at Elon and then in the Boston Red Sox organization, has had great success developing the position while a head coach. Over the last decade Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres, from 1997-99. Before Hill, it was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Mets. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and played for the Oakland A's in 2009.

Scouting the Owls

The Owls are off to a hot start so far in 2012, sporting a 6-1 record out of the gates to begin their season. On opening weekend, visiting FAU swept traditional SEC power Alabama during a three-game set in Tuscaloosa.

The Owls followed up their sweep by taking three-of-four games during a weekend series with Manhattan. FAU is led offensively by catcher Mike Albaladejo (.536) and outfielder Alex Hudak (.462, four homeruns, 11 RBI). The Sun Belt Conference representatives will be pitching junior RHP Jake Meiers (1-0, 1.04 ERA) on Wednesday.

Miami Against FAU

The Hurricanes hold an impressive 48-10 all-time series advantage against their in-state foes from Boca Raton.

The Canes fell in two of three contests against the Owls last season, including their most recent 7-4 defeat last May.

Starter Steven Ewing went 1-2 against FAU last season. He picked up his first win of the season against the Owls on March 15 last season, going six innings and allowing three runs (all unearned) in a 7-3 win.

Miami Predicted to Finish Third In Coastal Division

Miami baseball has been predicted to finish third in the Coastal Division of the Atlantic Coast Conference Coaches Preseason Poll. The poll is voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. Capturing a 19-10 league record in 2011, the Hurricanes finished the year fourth in the Coastal Division. Miami posted a 38-23 overall record en route to their 39th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance in the Gainesville Regional.

Encinosa Returns to the Bullpen

Junior right-hander E.J. Encinosa, who served as a starter for the 2011 season, will return to the bullpen for the upcoming campaign. The righty earned *Louisville Slugger* Freshman All-America honors for his work in the pen in 2010, where he posted an impressive ERA of 2.20 in 29 appearances on the hill.

Encinosa recorded the first save of his season in the series finale against Rutgers, pitching a scoreless ninth inning. He needed only 11 pitches to record the final three outs of the game.

New Era Behind the Plate

After receiving full clearance from the NCAA in early January, senior catcher Peter O'Brien began a highly anticipated final collegiate campaign behind the plate at Alex Rodriguez Park. O'Brien, selected to multiple Preseason All-American teams in 2012, hit the first two homeruns of his career in the series finale against Rutgers.

O'Brien was named Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Player of the Year in 2010 after his second season at Bethune-Cookman, where he hit .384 with 20 homeruns. He followed up his stellar sophomore year with an equally impressive junior campaign, where he hit .304 with 14 homeruns and 69 RBI.

Familiar Faces In the Dugout

This season, head coach Jim Morris will enjoy the return of two faces in particular: assistant coach Gino DiMare (13th season) and senior lefty Eric Erickson (sixth season). Both Coach DiMare and Erickson figure to play key roles for a talent-laden Hurricane team hoping to return to Omaha.

Catcher Peter O'Brien and righthander Eric Whaley were both named to the *Louisville Slugger* Preseason All-American Baseball teams in late December. O'Brien headlined the second team at catcher, while Whaley earned third team accolades after an impressive sophomore campaign.

ALEX RODRIGUEZ PARK INFORMATION

Renovations to Alex Rodriguez Park are thanks in large part to a \$3.9 million contribution by New York Yankees third baseman and 11-time MLB All-Star Alex Rodriguez. The gift - the largest ever to the University of Miami baseball program - has assisted the program in continuing to develop first-class facilities. The official announcement of his gift was made on Oct. 10, 2002.

Alex Rodriguez Park has taken form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.
- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box – along with four VIP suites – have been built atop the grandstand. This past offseason, addition seating was added down both lines while a new scoreboard was constructed in left field.
