Catcher Peter O'Brien guided the Canes to a win in the series finale with a 4-for-5 performance, including two homeruns and three RBI.

#### Veteran Leads the Charge

Sixth-year starter Eric Erickson made a successful return to the mound on Friday night in the season opener

#### **Scouting Florida Gulf Coast**

The Eagles finished their 2011 season 27-28 overall, including a 16-14 mark in the Atlantic Sun Conference. Though they finished only 10-12 away from Fort Myers, FGCU did manage a 17-16 home record at Hammond Stadium.

Sophomore starter Ricky Knapp will take the mound for FGCU in Wednesday's tilt against the Canes. Knapp earned his first win of the season in relief on Saturday against Bethune-Cookman (1.2 IP, 1 H, 2 SO). Outfielder Sean Dwyer led the charge in the Eagles' opening series, finishing the three-game set with a .364 average, including a homerun and three RBI.

#### Miami Against FGCU

The Hurricanes hold a flawless 7-0 all-time series advantage against the Eagles dating back to 2008. Miami won all three of its contests against FGCU in 2011.

#### Pitching Matchup for Wednesday

The Hurricanes will be throwing one of their more experienced arms on Wednesday against FGCU. Junior Steven Ewing, who finished the 2011 season with an 8-2 record and 2.66 ERA in 13 games (including 12 starts), will be making his second appearance of the year in Fort Myers. The Orlando, Fla. native came on in relief of Eric Whaley in Game Two against Rutgers, and finished the outing with three perfect innings and four strikeouts.

Ricky Knapp, a Atlantic Sun All-Freshmen team selection in 2011, will make his first start of the year Wednesday. He made teambests of 22 appearances and 10 starts last season, recording a 5-1 record and a 5.06 ERA.

#### UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI HEAD COACH JIM MORRIS - 19TH SEASON

In his 19th season at Miami, no other program, nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 39 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 18 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 27 years, 18 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 817-321-3 (.716) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,321-565-4 (.699) Division I record in 30 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 33 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,452-606-4 (.703)

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 19 years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

#### **MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR**

Jim Morris earned his 27th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2011 when he guided the 'Canes to the NCAA Gainesville Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 18 seasons (1994-2011), winning 15 of his last 18 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2011 Hurricanes to their 39th-straight NCAA Tournament. Three players from the 2011 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft. In 2008, the 'Canes reached the College World Series after winning the Atlantic Coast Conference, widely considered one of the toughest - if not the toughest - collegiate baseball conference in the country.

#### MORRIS IN HIS 34TH SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,321-565-4 (.699) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,452-606-4 (.704) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 18 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

#### JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

Over the last decade Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres, from 1997-99. Before Hill, it was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Mets. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and played for the Oakland A's in 2009.

O'Brien, selected to multiple Preseason All-American teams in 2012, hit the first two homeruns of his career in the series finale against Rutgers.

O'Brien was named Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Player of the Year in 2010 after his second season at Bethune-Cookman, where he hit .384 with 20 homeruns. He followed up his stellar sophomore year with an equally impressive junior campaign, where he hit .304 with 14 homeruns and 69 RBI.

#### Familiar Faces In the Dugout

This season, head coach Jim Morris will enjoy the return of two faces in particular: assistant coach Gino DiMare (13th season) and senior lefty Eric Erickson (sixth season). Both Coach DiMare and Erickson figure to play key roles for a talent-laden Hurricane team hoping to return to Omaha.

Catcher Peter O'Brien and righthander Eric Whaley were both named to the *Louisville Slugger* Preseason All-American Baseball teams in late December. O'Brien headlined the second team at catcher, while Whaley earned third team accolades after an impressive sophomore campaign.

#### **ALEX RODRIGUEZ PARK INFORMATION**

Renovations to Alex Rodriguez Park are thanks in large part to a \$3.9 million contribution by New York Yankees third baseman and 11-time MLB All-Star Alex Rodriguez. The gift the largest ever to the University of Miami baseball program - has assisted the program in continuing to develop first-class facilities. The official announcement of his gift was made on Oct. 10, 2002.

Alex Rodriguez Park has taken form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.
- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box – along with four VIP suites - have been built atop the grandstand. This past offseason, addition seating was added down both lines while a new scoreboard was constructed in left field.
