MIAMI FACES BLUE DEVILS IN HOMECOMING GAME

► The Miami Hurricanes will play in their third and final game of a three-game home stand when they welcome Duke to Sun Life Stadium on Saturday for Homecoming. The game will start at 3:09 p.m. and will be televised on RSN.

► Miami wide receiver Tommy Streater had a career game against Virginia and for his efforts, he was named the ACC Wide Receiver of the Week. The junior recorded career highs in receptions and yards, with seven and 176 respectively. The Miami native caught two touchdown passes on the night, giving him a team-leading seven this year. On the season, Streater has 28 catches, 12 of them have gone for 25 yards or more and seven have been for a touchdown. His 21.57 yards per catch ranks third nationally.

► The Hurricane offense has been led by the stellar play of senior quarterback Jacory Harris. In seven games this season, the Miami native has completed 111-of-175 passes for 1,555 yards to go with 15 touchdowns and only four interceptions. His 161.78 pass efficiency on the year ranks 10th nationally among NCAA quarterbacks.

► Miami's leading tackler Sean Spence once again led the Canes with 10 takedowns on Saturday against Virginia, six of them solo and half a tackle for a loss. The Miami native ranks 12th nationally in tackles per game and is tied for 18th in tackles for loss (eighth among linebackers). He ranks second in the ACC in tackles. Spence has been named the ACC Linebacker of the Week three times this season and on three occasions has been recognized as the College Football Performance Awards Honorable Mention Linebacker of the Week. On the year, Spence has tallied 75 tackles, 41 of those solo.

► With 45 more receiving yards, Miami's senior wide receiver Travis Benjamin will become just the sixth player in program history to join the 2,000-yard plateau. The Belle Glade, Fla. native is on verge of joining former UM and NFL greats Santana Moss, Reggie Wayne, Michael Irvin, Lamar Thomas and Leonard Hankerson.

► Since the Golden Era began, the Hurricanes have improved in several key statistical categories that speak to Coach Golden's brand of football—smarter, tougher and disciplined. Since a season ago, the Canes have improved 47-plus spots among the nation's FBS schools in turnover margin, fewest penalties per game and fewest yards penalized per game. The chart below is a breakdown of where the Canes stand.

► Senior wide receiver Travis Benjamin is on the verge of becoming just the sixth player in program history to reach 2,000 career receiving yards. The Belle Glade, Fla. native currently has 1,955 yards on 120 receptions, averaging 16.3 yards per catch.

► Lamar Miller now has seven career games of 100 or more rushing yards.

► Miller is second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with 114.1 rushing yards per game, ranking 14th nationally.
 ► Through the first four games of the season, Miller was the only back in America with a rush of 40-yards or more in every game. He did not extend that streak at Virginia Tech, but did have runs of 37 and 30 yards.

► Of his 11 career rushes/receptions of 25-yards or more, nine have come after halftime.
 ► Miller recorded 166 rushing yards on 18 carries against Virginia Tech, posting his fifth-straight game with at least 100 yards rushing. Miller is the first Cane to open the season with five-straight 100-yard rushing games. Willis McGahee started the 2002 season with 100-plus in four of the first five games. The last time a Cane recorded five-straight 100-yard rushing games was Clinton Portis in 2001.

► Miller has nine plays of 25-yards or longer this season: seven rushes and two kick returns.
 ► Until the Ohio State game (184 yards), Miller's output against Tech was a career best. The Hokies' run defense came into the 2011 meeting ranked No. 4 nationally against the run, giving up only 58.20 yards on the ground.
 ► Miller joins former Cane Tyrone Moss (2003-06) with seven career 100-yard rushing games. Edgerrin James (1995-98) is the all-time leader with 15 games of 100 or more yards on the ground.

When **IT COUNTS**

► You can only bottle up the electric Lamar Miller for so long. His career shows that the second half is clearly Miller Time. Not only do his biggest plays (especially runs) come in the second half, but nearly 60 percent of his career yards have come after intermission.

GSR SCORES SHOW CONTINUED SUCCESS OF MIAMI ATHLETICS

► In what has become an annual upward trend, student-athletes at the University of Miami continue to excel in the classroom at a record pace. According to the NCAA's Graduation Success Rates (GSR), Miami established a new athletics

department-wide record with a GSR of 89 percent.

► Last year, the athletics department-wide GSR was at its then-record high of 86 percent.

► The athletics department has exceeded the NCAA average for GSR in each of the last seven years.

Wieclaw **NAMED LOU GROZA SEMIFINALIST**

► The Palm Beach County Sports Commission has released its 20 semi-finalists for the 2011 Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award presented by the Orange Bowl Committee and Miami's Jake Wieclaw is among those receiving recognition.

► The New Lenox, Ill. native has converted on all 29 of his extra point attempts and has made 8-of-10 field goal attempts, with a season-long 43-yarder coming at North Carolina.

1—The number of freshmen ranked among the ACC's top sack leaders in UM's Anthony Chickillo. The rookie defensive end has 3.5 sacks on the season.

2—Rank among all ACC players for Lamar Miller (rushing), Jacory Harris (pass efficiency) and Sean Spence (tackles, tackles for loss).

2—True freshman who have started for the Canes this season. Defensive end Anthony Chickillo has made five starts while linebacker Denzel Perryman earned his first start of the season vs. Georgia Tech.

5—Number of QBs in the country, including Jacory Harris, with a least 120 attempts and no more than 1 interception during the month of October.

5—Games in which linebacker Sean Spence has recorded double-digit tackles. Spence had 10 vs. Virginia and Georgia Tech, 14 vs. North Carolina and Kansas State and 13 at Virginia Tech.

7—Number of years that UM Athletics has exceeded the NCAA average for Graduation Success Rate (GSR) since 2005.

10—Players on the Duke roster that hail from the Sunshine State.

12—Number of receptions by Tommy Streeter that have gone for 25-yards or more, including catches of 57, 51 and 26 against Virginia. Streeter has 28 receptions on the season.

47—Miami's improvement from a season ago in turnover margin. Last year the Canes finished 104th in the nation and currently rank 57th. One of the key statistical categories that speaks to Coach Golden's brand of football—smarter, tougher and disciplined.

89—Miami's department-wide Graduation Success Rate score. This is UM's highest ranking, besting the previous high of 86 percent.

130—Kick return yards by Travis Benjamin to surpass the century mark for the second time in his career. Benjamin gained 130 yards on four kick returns against Virginia. He recorded his first 100-yard return game against Florida State in 2008 when he returned six kicks for 185 yards.

170.0—Jacory Harris' passing efficiency during the month of October to rank 7th nationally.

176—Receiving yards in the game vs. Virginia that Tommy Streeter collected to move into ninth place in UM's records book for a single-game performance.

311—Total passing yards by Jacory Harris in UM's loss to Virginia to move him into second on the career passing yards list. Harris now has 7,584 yards.

347—Total passing yards by Miami's quarterbacks in the loss to Virginia. It was the best output of the season.

A GAME OF FIRSTS - VIRGINIA RECAP

▶ Travis Benjamin recorded his first game of 100 or more yards on kick return of the season. Benjamin collected 130 yards on four kick returns, passing the century mark for the second time in his career. The first came on Oct. 4, 2008 against Florida State (185 yds, six returns).

▶ Junior Davon Johnson returned the opening kickoff 24 yards, his first-career kickoff return.

▶ Dalton Botts' first punt of the game was 58 yards, tying his career-long which he has done twice this season.

▶ Miami suffered its first loss at home for an ESPN Thursday Night game. Canes are now 10-1 in that series.

Streak CONTINUES

▶ Former Hurricanes and current proCanes Jon Vilma (New Orleans), Jeremy Shockey (Carolina) Greg Olsen (Carolina) and Frank Gore (San Francisco) scored touchdowns in Week 8 of the NFL season.

▶ At least one former Cane has now scored a touchdown every NFL week since Week 15 of the 2002 season - a span of 147 straight weeks.

Honoring A LEGEND

▶ UM honored Russell Maryland in an on-field ceremony in the Sept. 17 contest against Ohio State to commemorate the defensive tackle's upcoming induction into the College Football Hall of Fame in December.

▶ Maryland finished his college career with 279 tackles, 25 tackles for losses and 20.5 quarterback sacks. He was the Jack Harding Most Valuable Player Award winner in 1990 and led the Hurricanes to four consecutive bowl berths, two national championships and an overall record of 45-3 during his career.

Canes OPEN NEW ERA UNDER GOLDEN

▶ Golden owns an overall record of 31-38 and is in his sixth season as a head coach.

▶ Golden arrived in Coral Gables after spending the last five seasons as the head coach at Temple University. Over five seasons at Temple, Golden took the Owls to unprecedented heights. Before his arrival, TU had just two winning seasons over its previous 26 years and had only won 22 percent of its games over the previous 30 years. Quickly, Golden made the Owls a contender, leading the team to a combined record of 17-8 his last two years there. The 2009 season marked Temple's first winning season since 1990, and Golden was rewarded with MAC Coach of the Year honors.

Canes SCHEDULE AMONG THE TOUGHEST

▶ According to Phil Steele's College Football Preview, Miami will face the 10th-toughest schedule of any FBS school this season. Only Colorado, Iowa State, Baylor, Oregon State, LSU, Boston College, USC, Washington and Auburn face a tougher road according to the publication.

▶ After traveling to Maryland for the season-opener, the Canes returned home to host non-conference foes Ohio State and Kansas State and Bethune-Cookman in three consecutive weeks at Sun Life Stadium. After a tough loss at Virginia Tech, Miami will travel to North Carolina (Oct. 15). The yearly rivalry game with Florida State will also come on the road, as the Canes will travel to Tallahassee to face the Seminoles on Nov. 12.

▶ UM was only one of six FBS programs to play its first three games against BCS-conference opponents. The others are USC, FAU, Rice, Notre Dame and BYU.

GAME DAY PRESS POLICIES

Only working press will be admitted to the Sun Life Stadium press box. Seats will be issued according to the following criteria:

1. State newspapers by circulation, wire services, national publications, newspapers from opponent's area, and student newspapers from UM and opponent's schools.
2. Other daily newspapers, with preference to those that regularly cover UM.
3. Radio and television personnel not broadcasting, but considered reporting.
4. Non-daily newspapers, with preference to those which regularly cover UM.
5. Scouts. Freelance and/or non-daily writers may be asked to produce copies of actual publications in which their work has appeared. In some cases, these materials will be required as verification of the writers' status.

Jacory IN THE CLUTCH

Harris' 65 career touchdown passes rank second in school history and 8th all time among ACC passers. His career TD-to-Int ratio is 1.51-to-1.

The numbers above show that Harris is a slow starter as his TD-to-Int ratio in the opening half is just 1.07-to-1. However, in the second half, his numbers improve dramatically to 2.54-to-1.

Beyond that increase, Harris' red zone numbers are outstanding. When inside the opponent's 20-yard and facing a more condensed defense, the senior has:

That equates to an impressive 7.8-to-1 TD-to-Int ratio.

When the game is on the line and points are necessary in the red zone, Harris has proven to come through in the clutch.

Jacory SOARING

▶ Under the tutelage of offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Jedd Fisch, Miami quarterback Jacory Harris' completion rate (63.4%), QB rating (161.78), yards per attempt (8.9) and longest pass (77 yards) this season are all career highs.

J12 AMONG THE BEST

▶ With his 311-yard performance against the Virginia on Oct. 27, Jacory Harris moved into second place in Miami's all-time records book with 7,895 career passing yards, surpassing Gino Torretta and trailing only Ken Dorsey (9,565).

▶ Harris is among the nation's best quarterbacks with a passing efficiency of 161.78 - ranking 10th nationally. Harris has connected on 111 of 175 passes with 15 touchdowns and four interceptions.

▶ Harris entered the season ranked among Miami's top signal callers as he appears in six different career records categories.

▶ Harris is ranked second all-time in passing yardage, pass completions, pass attempts, touchdowns thrown and total offense, while ranking third in completion percentage. Harris is on track to upend Ken Dorsey in two categories, needing to complete 40 passes and attempt 109 passes to surpass Dorsey as the record holder. Last season he connected on 148 passes and attempted 270.

▶ He moved into sole possession of second place all-time in career passing TDs on Oct. 23, 2010 when he threw touchdown passes to LaRon Byrd, Travis Benjamin and Leonard Hankerson against the Tar Heels.

▶ With his three TD passes against Virginia, Harris moved into sixth-place tie with Joe Hamilton (Georgia Tech, 1996-99) on the ACC's Career TD passes list with 65. The senior is now only two touchdown passes shy of Thaddeus Lewis (Duke - 2006-09). NC State's Phillip Rivers is the all-time leader with 95.

▶ Harris passed Florida State's Drew Weatherford (2005-08; 7,567), with his 311-yard performance against the Cavaliers, for 19th place on the ACC's career passing yardage stats, as he now has 7,895 career passing yards.

Four TO ENTER UM HALL OF FAME

► The University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame announced on Sept. 22 that four former Hurricane football players will be among those to be enshrined in its Class of 2012. Current Baltimore Ravens Ed Reed and Bryant McKinnie as well as Rich Mercier and Ray Bellamy - the university's first African-American football player - will be enshrined into the hall on March 29, 2012.

► Ed Reed (1998-2001)

Consensus First Team All-America and All-BIG EAST selection in 2000 and 2001... Set UM career records for interceptions (21) and interception return yards (389)... His nine interceptions in 2001 is the second-highest single-season total in UM history... Recorded eight interceptions in 2000 (third-best in UM history).

► Bryant McKinnie (2000-2001)

Outland Trophy winner as college football's outstanding interior lineman in 2001... Named a First Team All-American by *The Football News* in 2000 and a consensus first team All-American by every national service in 2001, including the Associated Press, Football Writers Association, *The Football News*, *The Sporting News* and the Walter Camp and the National Football Foundations... The 2001 National Player of the Year by CNNI.com... The 2001 College Football Offensive Player of the Year by *The Football News*... Did not allow a quarterback sack during his entire UM career.

Miami FOOTBALL RANKED EIGHTH NATIONALLY IN APR

▶ When the NCAA's Academic Progress Report (APR) was announced in May, the Canes' football program headlined an outstanding academic showing by the University of Miami this past school year. The football team (along with baseball, men's basketball and men's tennis) improved upon its APR score for an impressive seventh straight season. In fact, the UM football program's APR score (978) ranked eighth among all FBS schools.

Eight CANES GO IN 2011 NFL DRAFT

- ▶ The University of Miami's success in the NFL Draft continued this past spring, as eight Canes were selected in 2011. Orlando Franklin (2nd round to Denver), Brandon Harris (2nd round to Houston), Leonard Hankerson (3rd round to Washington), DeMarcus Van Dyke (3rd round to Oakland), Allen Bailey (3rd round to Kansas City), Colin McCarthy (4th round to Tennessee), Richard Gordon (6th round to Oakland) and Matt Boshier (6th round to Atlanta) were all taken off the board in the Top 200 picks.
- ▶ Miami's eight draftees trailed only USC (9) and North Carolina (9) for the most in the country in 2011.
- ▶ Since 2000, only Ohio State (78) and USC (77) have had more players drafted than the Canes (75).
- ▶ Miami continues to comfortably lead the nation in first round draft picks in recent years, as 26 Canes have been selected in the first round since 2000. Ohio State (17) remains a distant second.
