FLORIDA STATE EARNS THIRD PLACE FINISH IN ACC

No. 17/17 Florida State, which has finished in third place in the ACC in a school record threeconsecutive years, will play the winner of Thursday's first round game between Miami and Georgia Tech in the quarterfinals of the 59th Annual Atlantic Coast Conference Championship on Friday, March 9, 2012 at approximately 9:30 p.m. at Philips Arena in Atlanta. The Seminoles are the No. 3 seed in the tournament and have earned a bye through the first round for the fourthconsecutive season. The Seminoles are one of only two teams in the ACC (also Duke) who have won at least 10 games and finished in the top four of the ACC standings in each of the last four seasons. The Seminoles enter the 2012 ACC Tournament with 21 overall wins marking the school record fourth-consecutive season Florida State has won at least 21 games. Florida State will face either Miami or Georgia Tech in the quarterfinal round of the tournament – the Seminoles are a combined 2-1 against the Hurricanes and the Yellow Jackets with wins over both teams during the regular season. The winner of the Florida State vs. Miami/Georgia Tech game will face the winner of Friday's Duke vs. Clemson/Virginia Tech game on Saturday, March 10 at 3:00 p.m. The championship game of the 2012 ACC Tournament game is set for Sunday, March 11, 2012.

THE LAST TOURNAMENT TIME IN ATLANTA

Florida State advanced to play in the championship finals of the 2009 ACC Tournament for the first time in school history the last time the tournament was played in Atlanta. The Seminoles defeated Georgia Tech (March 13, 64-62) and then No. 1 ranked North Carolina (March 14, 73-70) before falling to then No. 7 ranked Duke (March 16, 79-69) in the title game.

HAMILTON NAMED ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

Leonard Hamilton, who has guided the Florida State men's basketball team to 21 wins and a school record tying 12 wins in Atlantic Coast Conference play, was named the ACC Coach of the Year for the second time in his career in a vote by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association. Hamilton was also recognized as the ACC Coach of the Year in 2009 – he has earned the honor twice in the last four seasons. He has led Florida State to wins over four nationally ranked teams including then No. 3 ranked North Carolina (Jan. 14, 90-57) and then No. 4 Duke (Jan. 21, 76-73) at Cameron Indoor Stadium as well as wins over each of the four ACC teams from the state of North Carolina (Duke, UNC, NC State and Wake Forest) for the first time in the same season.

SNAER AND JAMES EARN ALL-ACC, ACC DEFENSIVE TEAM HONORS

Junior Michael Snaer, who has hit two of the biggest shots in college basketball this season, earned All-ACC Second Team honors while senior Bernard James earned All-ACC Honorable Mention honors. Snaer and James were both named to the ACC All-Defensive Team as voted on by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association. It marks the second time in his career that Snaer earned an ACC postseason honor – he was named to the ACC All-Freshmen Team in 2010. It is the first time Snaer and James have been named to the All-Defensive team.

SNAER NAMED TO USBWA ALL-DISTRICT IV TEAM

Junior Michael Snaer has been named by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) as one of 10 selections for its 2011-12 All-District IV Team.

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last five years (since the start of the 2007-08 season) in total games played with 109 wins. The Seminoles averaged 21.7 wins per season with records of 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09) and 22-10 (2009-10) and 23-11 (2010-11) in the last six seasons.

Florida State enters the 2012 ACC Tournament as the third winningest program in <u>ACC play</u> in the last six years with a 56-37 record in regular season ACC games. The Seminoles and Duke are the only two teams in the ACC who have won at least 10 games and finished in the top four of the ACC standings in each season since the start of the 2008-09 season.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE NATIONAL POLLS

Florida State is ranked No. 17 in this week's Associated Press poll and No. 17 in the ESPN/USA Today poll. It marks the seventh-consecutive week the Seminoles have been included in the AP poll and the sixth-consecutive week they have been in the ESPN poll. The Seminoles' current seven week run during the regular season in the Associated Press poll is their longest since a run of eight straight weeks in the poll during the 1997-98 season (from Dec. 1, 1997 through Jan. 18, 1998). Its current streak in the polls is its' longest since a 10 week run during the 1997-98 season (Nov. 24-Jan. 26). Florida State has been ranked in the nation's top 25 of the AP poll in nine of 16 weeks and in eight of 16 weeks in the ESPN poll. Under head coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have been included in at least one AP and one ESPN poll in each of the last four years.

FLORIDA STATE AGAINST TEAMS IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

Florida State enters the 2012 ACC Tournament 4-3 record against nationally ranked teams. It marks the second-consecutive season the Seminoles have defeated at least four nationally ranked teams and the sixth year in ten seasons under head coach Leonard Hamilton that the Seminoles have defeated multiple ranked teams in a season.

FLORIDA STATE AS A RANKED TEAM

Florida State is 12-5 as a ranked team this season, with wins over then No. 3/3 North Carolina (Jan. 14, 90-57), then No. 4 Duke (Jan. 21, 76-73), then No. 16/18 Virginia (Feb. 4, 58-55) and No. 24 Virginia (March 1, 63-60). Florida State (at Duke and at Virginia), Duke (at North Carolina and at Florida State), Miami (at Duke) and North Carolina (at Virginia) are the only four teams in the ACC with wins over ranked ACC teams on the road. Florida State is 10-8 against nationally ranked teams in the last three seasons with four wins over teams ranked in the top five in the nation at the time of the game.

FLORIDA STATE AND THE ACC STANDINGS

Head Coach Leonard Hamilton has guided the Seminoles to their school record third-consecutive third place finish in the ACC standings with an 12-4 record in ACC play. The Seminoles finished in a tie for third place in the ACC standings (and earned the No. 3 seed in the ACC Tournament) in 2010, finished in third place in the league standings in 2011 and will finish in third place in the standings in 2012. The Seminoles finished in a program best second place in the ACC standings in both the 1991-92 (11-5 record) and 1992-93 seasons (12-4 record).

FEB. 11. 2012 VS. MIAMI

Bernard James scored 15 of his 18 points in the second half and Florida State snapped Miami's five-game winning streak with a 64-59 victory on Feb. 11, 2012 at the Donald L. Tucker in Tallahassee. Michael Snaer had 12 points and Ian Miller finished with 11 for Florida State. The 6-foot-10 James went 7 for 8 from the field in the second half and matched his career scoring high. The 27-year-old Air Force veteran also had six rebounds, blocked four shots and added two steals while clamping down on Reggie Johnson, who managed only four points a week after scoring 27 points to lead the Hurricanes to a 78-74 overtime win at Duke. James' layup with 16:32 left gave the Seminoles a 32-31 lead. They never trailed again. Kenny Kadji led Miami with 14 points and Durand Scott added 12. Miller hit three crucial free throws in the final 50 seconds and Okaro White sank two more with just 2 seconds left to ice the win. The Seminoles had a 10-point lead on two occasions in the second half, the last at 53-43 with 6:51 left on James' threepoint play. Florida State shot 46 percent to Miami's 39.3 percent. Miami had a 35-29 rebound advantage and both teams committed 15 turnovers.

FEB. 26, 2012 VS. MIAMI

Durand Scott scored 17 points and Miami hit seven 3-pointers in the second half to beat Florida State 78-62 snapping a six-game losing streak to its in-state rival on Feb. 26, 2012 at the BankUnited Center in Coral Gables. The Hurricanes went seven of 13 from beyond the arc in the second half and 9 of 20 overall. Michael Snaer scored 20 points for Florida State which had won 11 of 12 against Miami. Kenny Kadji had 15 points for the short-handed Hurricanes. The Seminoles rallied from a 59-42 deficit with 5:07 remaining and got within 65-58 on Snaer's two free throws with 2:39 left. Scott, Kadji and Shane Larkin each hit two free throws in the next 58 seconds as Miami increased the lead to 71-58. Larkin finished with 13 points. The Hurricanes expanded a four-point halftime lead and outscored the Seminoles 14-8 in the first 5:15 of the second half. Rion Brown hit the fourth 3-pointer in Miami's early second-half spurt to increase the lead to 38-28. Okaro White scored four points during an 8-0 run for the Seminoles midway through the first half. White's basket with 5:37 remaining capped the spurt and gave Florida State an 18-11 lead. Miami was held scoreless for a 7:03 stretch until Scott made the second of two free throw attempts with 4:34 left.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE FIELD ENTERING THE ACC TOURNAMENT

Florida State, which is ranked first in the ACC in field goal shooting percentage (in ACC games only) with a .454 mark, shot better than 50 percent in its last two games and a combined .505 vs. Clemson and UVa.

Senior Deividas Dulkys has made at .412 least one 3-pont field goal in six straight games and is shooting .412 (seven of 17) from the 3-point line since Feb. 16 against Virginia Tech.

Junior All-ACC Second team .425 selection Michael Snaer is shooting .425 (34 of 80) from the 3-point line during the last 18 games. He has made at least one 3-ponit field goal in 16 of those 18 games since December 30 against Princeton.

.727 Senior Xavier Gibson is shooting .727 from the free throw line (eight of 11) in the last four games. He was a perfect two of two in the Seminoles' win over Clemson on March 4.

.800 Senior Jon Kreft is shooting .800 from the free throw line in the Seminoles' last seven games - he has made four of five free throws since Feb. 11 against Miami.

0 Graduate student Luke Loucks is expected to play in his school record $132^{\mbox{\scriptsize nd}}$ career game in the quarterfinal round of the ACC Tournament. He has played in 131 consecutive career games and has never missed playing in a game during his Florida State career.

2 The Seminoles and Duke are the only two teams in the ACC to finish in the top four of the ACC standings AND with double digit ACC wins in each of the last four seasons.

2 Florida State's Leonard Hamilton is the second longest tenured head coach in the ACC – he is in his 10th season in Tallahassee - and is ranked behind only Duke's Mike Krzyzewski in terms of longevity in the ACC.

Florida State enters the ACC Tournament having shot 50 percent or better from the field in two consecutive games - in wins over Virginia (.511) and Clemson (.500). The Seminoles longest streak of the season, 3 games at 50 percent or better, came against UCF (.509), Stetson (.571) and South Alabama (.521) during the month of November.

Three different Seminoles - Bernard 3 James (Nov. 21), Deividas Dulkys (Jan. 16) and Michael Snaer (Jan. 23) - have earned ACC Player of the week honors this season. It's the most ACC Player of the Week honors in one season in Florida State basketball history.

Florida State defeated each of the four ACC teams from the state of North Carolina this season -- North Carolina (Duke, North Carolina, NC State and Wake Forest) - the first time in school history the Seminoles defeated all four Tobacco Road teams in one season.

FEBRUARY 1, 2012 VS. GEORGIA TECH

Florida State bounced back from a poor shooting performance in the first half and beat Georgia Tech, 68-55, on Feb. 1, 2012 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee to capture its school-record tying sixth consecutive Atlantic Coast Conference win. By extending their winning streak to six games, the Seminoles remain atop the league standings via tie-breakers. Down 25-24 at the break, Florida State's spark this time was a halftime regrouping. The Seminoles opened the second period with back-to-back Xavier Gibson and Luke Loucks buckets and a Deividas Dulkys 3-pointer. Not too long after that, Okaro White's tomahawk slam gave Florida State a 41-32 lead -- its fifth double-digit advantage in seven ACC games -- and the team never led by less than seven the rest of the evening. Michael Snaer had his own record-setting night as his five made 3-pointers tied his career best. Snaer's 21 points -- 16 of which were posted in the second half -on 7-for-10 shooting led all scorers. Snaer also had a game-high and career-best five steals as the 'Noles forced 24 turnovers. Bernard James added 13 points and eight rebounds and White connected for 11 points. Loucks had nine points and seven of the 'Noles' 15 assists. Brandon Reed scored 18 points for the Yellow Jackets but Georgia Tech couldn't overcome another terrific second half by the 'Noles.

Florida State Men's Basketball By The Numbers

5 Junior All-ACC Second team selection Michael Snaer made a career-high tying five 3-ponit field goals in the Seminoles' win over Clemson on March 4 – he was a perfect four of four from the bonusphere in the first half.

5 Senior Deividas Dulkys enters the 2012 ACC Tournament with 195 career 3-point shots – he needs only 5 more to become only the fourth player in school history with 200 or more career 3-point shots made.

7 Senior Bernard James has a single season career high seven double doubles this season (against UCF, Stetson, UConn, at Michigan State, against Loyola Marymount, at Virginia Tech and against Clemson).

8 Senior Bernard James has led (or been tied for the team lead) in rebounding in eight consecutive games – each game since Feb. 8 at Boston College.

9 The Seminoles are 9-0 this season when they shoot 50 percent or better from the field – including three wins (at Duke, at Wake Forest and at Virginia) in ACC play.

12 Senior Bernard James is looking to become only the 12^{th} player in school history to lead the Seminoles in rebounding in consecutive years. He led Florida State with 201 rebounds and a 5.9 rebounds per game average as a junior and enters the 2012 ACC Tournament as the Seminoles' leader with 249 rebounds and an 8.3 rebounds per game average. The last player to lead the Seminoles in rebounding in two consecutive seasons was Adam Waleskowski in 2004 and 2005.

14 Junior All-ACC Second team selection Michael Snaer has led (or been tied) for the team lead in scoring a career high 14 times this season entering the ACC Tournament.

15 Florida State's 15 blocked shots against Virginia Tech on Jan. 10, 2012 is tied for the school record for blocked shots in a single game and is tied for the most in the ACC this season. The Seminoles blocked 15 of the Hokies 59 shots – more than one quarter of their shots (.254) during the game.

21 Florida State is undefeated, 21-0, when it outscores its opponent.

23 All-ACC Second team selection Michael Snaer led Florida State with a career high 23 points in the Seminoles' win over Clemson on March 4 – off the bench. He came off the bench as head coach Leonard Hamilton started five seniors including Jeff Peterson for Snaer.

49 Florida State scored 49 points in the first half of its victory over Clemson on march 4. It marked the third time this season – all in wins – that the Seminoles had scored 49 or more points in a first half. The Seminoles scored 50 points in the first half of their win over Auburn and 51 in in their win over South Alabama.

SEMINOLES' JAMES TO RECEIVE USBWA MOST COURAGEOUS AWARD

Florida State's Bernard James, who completed a six-year term in the United States Air Force (2003-06), will be honored by the United States Basketball Writers Association at the 2012 NCAA Final Four in New Orleans as he is presented with the USBWA Most Courageous Award. He will be honored along with Tennessee's legendary basketball coach Pat Summitt. As written by Dana O'Neil of ESPN.com: "This year, the USBWA honors Florida State's Bernard James and University of Tennessee coach Pat Summitt as recipients of the 2012 Most Courageous Awards, two people who defined the word differently but lived it fully. James served three deployments to Middle East in both Qatar and Iraq and ascended to the rank of Staff Sergeant in the Air Force.

LOUCKS NAMED TO ALL-ACC ACADEMIC TEAM

Luke Loucks, a graduate student on the Florida State men's basketball team, has been named to the 2011-12 All-ACC Academic Men's Basketball Team by the league office. Loucks currently ranks fourth in the ACC with a career-high 4.0 assists per game average and has led the Seminoles to the precipice of earning their fourth-consecutive NCAA Tournament bid. It marks the third-consecutive season Loucks has been named to the All-ACC Academic team.

SEMINOLES RANKED THIRD IN THE ACC IN SCORING DEFENSE

Florida State – which handed Virginia its first loss of the season when the Cavaliers scored at least 60 points in a game on March 1, enters the 2012 ACC Tournament ranked third in the ACC in scoring defense as it allows a scant 62.1 points per game. The Seminoles have allowed 65 points or less in 20 of 30 games games this season and are 17-3 in those games. Florida State has allowed more than 65 points in only five of its 15 ACC games and allowed an average of 59.3 points per game in winning 10 of 11 ACC games from Jan. 10 against Virginia Tech through Feb. 18 against NC State.

FLORIDA STATE'S SCORING DEFENSE IN THE LAST THREE SEASONS

Florida State has proven to be the second most difficult ACC team to score on in the last four seasons – during the careers of the Florida State's senior class. The current seniors have allowed an average of 64.7 points in the last 130 games played by the Seminoles. Only Virginia – which has allowed an average of 62.7 points per game in 119 games since the beginning of the 2008-09 season, has allowed fewer points per game than Florida State. The Seminoles, though, have ranked in the ACC's top three in each of the last four seasons, while Virginia ranked 12th in the ACC in allowed an average of 72.5 points per game during the 2008-09 season.

A GOOD SHOOTING TRIFECTA

Florida State shot a combined .505 from the field (49 of 97), a combined .514 from the bonusphere (18 of 35) and .771 from the free throw line in its final two games of the regular season – both wins over Virginia and Clemson.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Florida State defeated Clemson, 80-72, in its final regular season game with a barrage of 11 made 3-point shots from the 3-point line. The Seminoles were eight of 11 from beyond the arc in the first half alone en route to their second highest total of the season for 3-point shots made – they made a season high 12 shots from the bonusphere in their victory over North Carolina, 90-57, on Jan. 14, in Tallahassee. Not coincidently, the Seminoles' 90 points scored against North Carolina is their highest point total in all ACC games this season while their 80 points against Clemson is their third highest in a conference game this season.

SNAER SURPASSES 1,000 CAREER POINTS

Junior All-ACC Second Team selection Michael Snaer reached the 1,000 point mark in Florida State's win over Clemson on March 4 in Tallahassee. He enters the 2012 ACC Tournament ranked 41st in school history and has moved up 58 positions (from 99th to begin the 2011-12 season to his current position of 41st) in the Seminoles' scoring list with his career best scoring year. In reaching 1,000 career points by the end of his junior season, Snaer is only the ninth junior in school history to reach the 1,000 point plateau. A total of six players including Sam Cassell and Tim Pickett surpassed the 1,000 point mark in two seasons as Seminoles.

Florida State's 2011-12 Recruiting Class

In continuing an annual tradition that has now reached its 10th consecutive season, Leonard Hamilton and the Florida State men's basketball team have signed a top 25 nationally ranked recruiting class with the addition of four outstanding recruits who will become Seminoles in 2012: Devon Booker (Anchorage, AK./West), Monday Brandon (High Point, N.C./Wesleyan Christian), Robert Gilchrist (London, England/Polk State College) and Aaron Thomas (Cincinnati, Ohio/Brewster Academy).

Florida State's class is ranked as high as No. 17 nationally by Rivals.com and Hamilton is not done yet. With two graduate students and four seniors on the Seminoles' current roster, Hamilton is still looking to add two more players to his already bountiful recruiting class.

"We are very excited about the recruits in our incoming class," said Hamilton.

"Our staff has done another tremendous job of identifying and cultivating four players who we know will have a tremendous impact on our program during their entire careers. We have added everything we were looking for - ball handling skills, shooting ability, size and strong basketball knowledge.'

Booker (6-2, 165) was named the 2011 Gatorade Player of the Year in the state of Alaska as he averaged 25.0 points, 8.5 assists, 7.1 rebounds and 3.6 steals per game as a senior at Anchorage West High School. He has graduated from high school and is currently spending a prep season at the Impact Basketball Academy in Las Vegas.

Brandon (6-7, 195) is currently ranked as the 59th best player and the 11th best guard in the nation by Rivals.com. He is a four-star recruit who averaged 19.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists per game as a junior. Considered a natural for Hamilton's system at Florida State, Brandon can play the one, two or three spots on the floor and is comfortable both handing the ball and playing on the wing.

Gilchrist (6-9, 210) is a junior college transfer from Polk State College in Winter Haven, Fla., who will have two years of eligibility remaining when he joins the Florida State program for the 2012-13 season. Ranked as the 16th best junior college player in the nation, he led Polk to the Sun coast Conference championship in 2011 as he earned all-conference first team honors as a freshman. Gilchrist averaged 9.0 points, 6.9 rebounds and 2.7 blocks per game while shooting .481 from the field as a freshman.

Thomas (6-4, 195) is the No. 56 ranked prospect by Rivals.com and was the No. 13 ranked shooting guard and the No. 71 ranked overall player in the nation as a senior at WI throw High School in Cincinnati. He is considered to be one of the top scorers and most athletic players in the class of 2012. Thomas is one of the top players at Brewster who will have at least four players accept Division I scholarships during the 2011 signing period.

DULKYS CLOSING IN ON 200 3-POINT SHOTS MADE

Senior Deividas Dulkys enters the 2012 ACC Tournament with 195 career 3-point shots made – he currently ranks fourth in school history in career 3-point field goals made and needs only five to become the fourth player in school history with 200 or more career made 3-point shots.



TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - The Florida State men's basketball team opened its 2011-12 season in much the same way that it played last year during a run to the Sweet 16. FSU picked up right where it left off late last March with a strong defensive performance in a 79-67 win over Jacksonville. JU didn't score a basket until 14:50 left in the first half and never recovered on the scoreboard despite a late-game rally. FSU -- the nation's leader the last two seasons in defensive field goal percentage -- held Jacksonville to 36.4 percent shooting in the first half but that mark increased to 42.4 percent for the game because of the visitors' 20-10 run after the 'Noles had built their largest lead of the night (22) with 7:49 remaining on the clock. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Leonard Hamilton said before the season ever started that his Florida State men's basketball team "would win games by committee." Three games into the 2011-12 campaign and the head coach's sentiments have proved true. The No. 24 Seminoles defeated visiting Stetson 79-66 at the Donald L. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - South Alabama may have been the first out-of-state opponent to face the No. 24 Florida State men's basketball team at the Donald L. Tucker Center this season but the 'Noles' recipe for success was the same that it's been in wins over Sunshine State schools Jacksonville, UCF and Stetson. In an 80-39 triumph over the Jaguars FSU rode its defense to victory while also getting double-digit scoring from multiple players on the offensive end. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Okaro White scored a career-high 20 points and added seven rebounds as Florida State halted a three-game losing streak with a 76-51 win over Charleston Southern. Michael Snaer scored 13 points, placing him in double figures in scoring for the fifth straight game. Bernard James and Xavier Gibson each had 12 points and seven rebounds for Florida State. Saah Nimley and Kelvin Martin had 13 points each for Charleston Southern, which started three freshmen and shot just 17 of 57 (29.8 percent) from the floor, Martin added eight rebounds. Florida State went on an early 20-2 run to grab a 25-7 lead on Charleston Southern with 10:13 left in the first half. Game No. 13 -- Princeton 75 Florida State 73 (3 OT)

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Playing to a third overtime for the first time in program history, the Seminoles were upset by Princeton, 75-73. Despite scoring just 10 points in the first half, Florida State outscored the Tigers 37-20 in the second to force the first of the three extra periods. The Seminoles were ultimately doomed by a poor performance from the free-throw line as they made just 11 of 22 attempts from the charity stripe. Junior Michael Snaer posted a team-best 20 points and sophomore Ian Miller, who played his first game of the season last week at Florida, added 17 points. Bernard James and Xavier Gibson added nine points in the post. The Seminoles finished the game shooting 42 percent from the field and the Tigers connected on 41 percent of their shots. Despite committing 19 turnovers, Princeton was paced by 25-point efforts by both Douglas Davis and lan Hummer. After shooting just 4-for-24 in the first half, Florida State battled back in the second half and Gibson's dunk with 46 seconds to go tied the game at 47-47 before Princeton missed a potential game-winning put-back attempt. Miller's near steal drew a foul and he went to the line where he made just one to tie the score at 60-60. With 24 seconds left, the Seminoles' defense then prevented Princeton from getting off a quality shot to force the record-setting third overtime. Davis' second 3-pointer

in the third overtime gave Princeton a 68-65 lead with 1:11 and then Hummer's dunk in transition pushed FSU's deficit to 70-65. Snaer was then able to hit a clutch 3-pointer to make it a one-possession ballgame but Princeton answered with two free throws and a steal off Luke Loucks' pass to hang on to the victory.

BLACKSBURG, Va. - Florida State received a strong defensive performance and Bernard James put the team on his broad shoulders as the Seminoles earned a 63-59 win at Virginia Tech. By tying his career high with 18 points and setting a new career best with 15 rebounds (nine of which occurred on the offensive glass), James made sure that Florida State picked up its first ACC win of the year and in the process generate some much-needed momentum as college basketball fans across the country prepared to turn their attention to Tallahassee. The Seminoles also achieved a new season high and tied the school record with 15 blocks. Ian Miller and Okaro White made sure to shoulder some of the load, too. Miller continued his impressive offensive play off the bench as the sophomore added 15 points in the win. White finished with just four points but none were more important than the two he scored off a pair of successful freethrow attempts with under six seconds let to play at Cassell Coliseum. White's clutch free throws sealed the win.Florida State looked more like its typically dominant self on that side of the basketball court against Virginia Tech. In addition to halting over a dozen Virginia Tech shots, the 'Noles held their opponents to just 30.5 percent from the field and 16.7 percent from 3-point range. Michael Snaer contributed nine points before fouling out of the ballgame in the final moments for an FSU team that shot 41.2 percent. Luke Loucks added seven points and five assists. Erick Green led the Hokies with 21 points but he wishes his total would have reached 23. Green had an opportunity to tie the game at 61-61 with 10 seconds remaining but Deividas Dulkys' defensive pressure forced him to miss a driving shot attempt before White snagged the rebound and was fouled. Dulkys registered a career-best five blocks. Miller also set a new career high for blocks with four and James and Xavier Gibson had three blocks each. For the game, the Seminoles won the rebounding battle 36-29.

### Game No. 17 -- Florida State 90 North Carolina 57

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - The Seminoles upset visiting North Carolina, 90-57, at the Donald L. Tucker Center capping off a day that started before the sun ever rose when fans began lining up outside the arena for a chance to be in the crowd during ESPN's live College Gameday broadcast. North Carolina found itself in that peculiar and unfamiliar position because of Florida State's stifling defense and Deividas Dulkys' couldn't-miss shooting effort. The Lithuanian-born senior had the best game of his career, scoring 32 points on 12-of-14 shooting from the floor -- including an 8-of-10 mark from 3-point range. The Florida State defense didn't hurt either. UNC -- the nation's leader in scoring prior to Saturday's upset -- was held to a season-low scoring total of 57. The Tar Heels also shot a season-worst 37.3 percent from the field and their bench players were outscored by Florida State reserves 24-8. FSU also out-rebounded UNC, 41-33, and forced 21 Carolina turnovers while notching 12 steals. The Seminoles' stout defense set up what was the team's best offensive performance of the season. En route to a season-high 90 points, FSU shot 48.4 percent overall and 44.4 percent from 3-point range. Michael Snaer added 17 points and five rebounds while Okaro White came off the bench with a double-double effort in scoring 12 points and grabbing 10 rebounds. Bernard James had eight points and nine rebounds and Luke Loucks registered six points and six assists. Loucks and Dulkys also added eight of Florida State's 16 total assists. The Seminoles started the game on a 9-2 run and led by as many as 12 in the first half before taking a 36-28 lead into the break.

### Game No. 18 -- Florida State 84 Maryland 70

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - It's said that all good things come to an end but in the case of the Florida State men's basketball team, that logic only proved true for a few seconds in Tuesday night's 84-70 win over visiting Maryland. After not trailing for a total of 102 minutes and 37 seconds dating back to the start of the their game at Virginia Tech last week, that streak briefly ended for the Seminoles after Terrapins guard Terrell Stoglin hit back-to-back 3-pointers to start the second half at the Donald L. Tucker Center and Alex Len's five-footer found the bottom of the net. ### Game No. 19 -- Florida State 76, Duke 73

DURHAM, N.C. - Michael Snaer's buzzer-beating 3-pointer,le the Florida State men's basketball team to a 76-73 win over No. 4 Duke -- a win that snapped the Blue Devils' 45-game winning steak at Cameron Indoor Stadium. After Duke's Austin Rivers hit a lay-up to tie the game at 73-73 with less than five seconds left on the game clock and with no timeouts to use, Luke Loucks took FSU's inbounds pass hastily across mid court where Bernard James' well-placed screen gave him the necessary room to find the game's soon-to-be hero. By beating Duke Florida State capped off what could be considered one of -- if not the -- greatest regular-season weeks in the program's history. Exactly seven days after giving the Tallahassee crowd a reason to rush the court after upsetting then-No. 3 North Carolina, the 'Noles players had a reason to rush the court in Durham following Snaer's big shot. Not only did FSU defeat two top-five teams in a span of one week while also sandwiching a victory over Maryland in between those two games but the Seminoles also moved into a tie for first place in the competitive ACC. It was also Duke's first home loss to an unranked opponent since 2007 when Florida State came into Cameron Indoor and did the same thing. Xavier Gibson's 16 points led Florida State while Bernard James added 12 points and five rebounds. Deividas Dulkys finished with 12 points and Loucks posted eight of his own. The Seminoles held Duke to just 39.7 percent shooting as Rivers scored a game-high 19 points. Andre Dawkins added 14 points and Seth Curry had 12. Ryan Kelly -- one of just three bench players to participate for the Blue Devils -- contributed 10 points.

### Game No. 20 -- Florida State 75, Wake Forest 72

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. . - Florida State defeated Wake Forest, 75-52, at the Lawrence Joel Veterans Coliseum for its fifth consecutivye win -- a streak that is the team's longest since 1993. The Seminoles have now scored at least 75 points in four consecutive games and have defeated Wake Forest in four consecutive times -- a feat that has not occurred since the 1993-94 season. The ACC's reigning player of the Week, Michael Snaer, led the Seminoles in scoring with 18 points. The junior guard was a perfect 4-for-4 from 3-point range and 6-for-9 overall from the field. Snaer's excellence from long range helped FSU shoot 50 percent from 3-point distance and 50.9 percent in total. One game after shooting 67 percent in the second half against Duke, the 'Noles shot 68 percent in the final period against the Demon Deacons. Just like that buzzer-beating victory over the Blue Devils, Xavier Gibson had another strong game. Gibson scored 10 points while adding three rebounds. Bernard James scored seven points and grabbed nine rebounds and Okaro White came off the bench to add 11 points. Florida State coach Leonard Hamilton said earlier in the week that Demon Deacons center Ty Walker presented a unique challenge because of his ability to alter games defensively. But Walker proved to be a non-factor after he left the game late in the first half with what was announced as a concussion. Walker still managed four blocks in his limited time on the floor but FSU scored 40 points in the paint and won the rebounding battle 32-25. The Demon Deacons were also held to just 34.9 percent shooting. Demon Deacons star Travis McKie -- the ACC's fourth-leading scorer before Wednesday night with a per-game average of 17.2 points -- was limited to just three points. The Seminoles led 29-23 at the half before Wake Forest cut that advantage to just two points early in the second period. But Florida State answered with a 18-2 run and never trailed by less than double digits the rest of the game.

### Game No. 21 -- Florida State 68 Georgia Tech 54

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Florida State bounced back from a poor shooting performance in the first half and beat Georgia Tech, 68-55, at the Donald L. Tucker Center to capture its school-record sixth consecutive Atlantic Coast Conference win. By extending their winning streak to six games, the Seminoles remain atop the league standings via tie-breakers. Down 25-24 at the break, Florida State's spark this time was a halftime regrouping. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Michael Snaer's 3-pointer with 2.6 seconds left boosted No. 20 Florida State to a 48-47 victory over Virginia Tech, capping an improbable finish that kept the Seminoles in a first-place tie in the Atlantic Coast Conference. ### Game No. 26 -- Florida State 76, NC State 62

RALEIGH, N.C. - Ian Miller scored 17 points, Bernard James had 12 and Okaro White and Michael Snaer each finished with 10 to help Florida State improve to 4-0 against North Carolina's four highest-profile programs with a 76-62 win over NC State, Florida State never trailed, shot 49 percent,

led by double figures for the entire second half, held NC State to 29 percent shooting -- its worst of the season, by far -- and forced 17 turnovers. That helped Florida State win its third straight and remain atop the league standings. C.J. Leslie scored 21 points to lead the Wolfpack but the rest of the team combined to shoot 9 of 44 in their second straight loss with both coming to nationally ranked teams in the span of fewer than 48 hours. The Seminoles, who haven't lost in Raleigh since 2006, have their defense largely to thank for their latest win here, They entered allowing teams to shoot just 37 percent -- second-best in the NCAA -- and clamped down on an NC State team that makes nearly 47 percent of its shots. Much of the Wolfpack's offense came from the free throw line, where they were 25 of 31. Florida State outscored NC State 18-9 during an 81/2-minute stretch of the second half, with White's tip-in with 10 minutes to play making it a 20-point game for the first time at 57-37. The Wolfpack cut it to 12 three times, the last on Leslie's free throw with 4:25 left. Florida State then re-established its comfortable lead by reeling off seven quick points, with Miller's layup making it 70-51 with  $3\frac{1}{2}$  minutes to play. The win was especially sweet for Miller, a native of Charlotte who finished one point shy of a career high.

### Game No. 29 -- Florida State 63, Virginia 60

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. - Ian Miller hadn't made a buzzer-

beater to win a game since high school. When he shot from the right wing in the final second Thursday night, he didn't need to look. "When it left my hand, I knew it was good," the sophomore said about the 3-pointer with a hand in his face and 0.8 seconds left that gave No. 22 Florida State a stunning 63-60 victory over No. 24 Virginia. The Seminoles rallied from 11 points down in the last 41/2 minutes for the victory. Miller matched his career high with 18 points, and had 15 after halftime. On the final play, he dribbled time off the clock until darting from near midcourt on the left side to the right wing with Virginia guard Sammy Zeglinski just far enough behind to allow Miller to set, step back and let fly. "He smacked my left hand and everything, but I was locked in," Miller said after making five of six shots in the second half and scoring nine in a game-ending 16-2 burst. It was Miller's fifth 3-pointer and the seventh for the Seminoles who won their seventh straight in the series. Mike Scott scored 28 points, his career high in an ACC game, for the Cavaliers who lost for the first time in 18 games this season when scoring 60 points, Jontel Evans added 10 points for Virginia, which played with only seven scholarship players available to coach Tony Bennett, Michael Snaer and Xavier Gibson added 12 points each for the Seminoles, and Snaer said a turning point that looked like it might help Virginia mightily wound up driving Florida State's rally. After a steal by Zeglinski, he turned it over at the other end and the Seminoles tried a deep pass down court. Joe Harris gave chase and ran into Bernard James, sending both to the floor hard, with Harris on top of James' foot. He pulled it out and kicked Harris, and the crowd went wild. After watching the replay and consulting, the officials ejected James, and Scott made a pair of free throws for the flagrant foul, making it 56-47. He then drew a fifth foul on Okaro White, disqualifying White, and made both ends of a one-and-one to give Virginia a 58-47 lead with 4:33 left. Virginia didn't score another basket.
