REGIONAL STORYLINES & NEWS

- After finishing the 2019 season with a **39-18** record, Miami was selected to the NCAA Division I Baseball Championship.
- The second-seeded Hurricanes will join No. 1 **Mississippi State**, No. 3 **Central Michigan** and No. 4 **Southern** in the Starkville Regional.
- The Starkville Regional is paired with the Stanford Regional, hosted by **Stanford** and featuring **UCSB**, **Fresno State** and **Sacramento State**.
- Miami will play on the road in the regional round for the first time since 2013, when they were No. 2 at the Louisville Regional.
- The Hurricanes head to the Starkville Regional for the fourth time in history, playing there in 1973, 1974 and 1975.
- Miami has played made 18 of its 46 regional appearances away from Coral Gables, with just 11 of those 18 coming outside of Florida.
- Miami is in its first season under the direction of head coach **Gino DiMare**, who has the Canes ranked in all five major polls.
- DiMare has participated in 21 postseasons: four as a player from 1989-92 and 17 as an assistant coach (1997-2008, 2012-2016).
- Miami pitching coach **J.D. Arteaga** has participated in 18 postseasons: four as a player from 1994-97 and 14 as an assistant (2003-16).
- No player on Miami's 2019 roster has ever played in the NCAA Division I Baseball Championship tournament.
- UM is 126-46 (.733) all-time in the regional round. They are 38-29 (.567) in road regional games and 9-5 (.643) in Starkville Regional games.
- The Canes had four players earn All-ACC recognition: **Michael Amditis**, **Adrian Del Castillo**, **Brian Van Belle** & **Raymond Gil**.
- Miami wrapped up the regular season second in the Coastal Division, finishing a game behind division winner Georgia Tech.
- Sophomore 1B **Alex Toral** enters the postseason ranked second in the ACC and tied for sixth in Division I with 22 home runs.
- Miami ranks 14th in Division I with 75 home runs, which are more than the combined team home run totals from the previous two seasons (58, 35 in 2017 and 23 in 2018). Twelve different Hurricanes have hit at least one home run in 2019.
- Miami has qualified for the College World Series **25 times** - the second-most of any program nationwide, trailing only Texas (36). The Hurricanes' **four national championships** (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) are tied for fifth-most all-time.

Gino DiMare became the ninth head baseball coach in University of Miami history prior to the 2019 season.

DiMare previously served as associate head coach in charge of hitting, as well as the baseball program's recruiting coordinator. Overall, 2018 marked DiMare's 19th year as a member of the Hurricanes baseball staff. DiMare rejoined the University of Miami baseball program after three years away from the program in 2011. Prior to his exit in 2008, DiMare served as the Canes recruiting coordinator and hitting coach over his final nine seasons. He held the title of assistant head coach during the 2008 season - a year the Canes won the Atlantic Coast Conference championship before advancing to the College World Series.

The Hurricanes qualified for their second straight College World Series berth and 25th in program history in 2016. Under DiMare's guidance as hitting coach, five field players (Zack Collins - first round, Willie Abreu - sixth round, Brandon Lopez - 10th round, Jacob Heyward - 18th round, Johnny Ruiz - 28th round) were selected in the 2016 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Collins was named a first-team All-American by several publications, and became Miami's first first-round draft pick since Yasmani Grandal in 2010 when he was selected by the Chicago White Sox with the No. 10 overall pick.

In 2015, DiMare guided the Hurricanes to the No. 1 national ranking in offense. Miami scored 547 runs over the season, which ranked first nationally at an average of 8.16 runs per game. Miami's offense, which ranked No. 7 nationally in batting average (.307) and No. 2 in on-base percentage (.417), led the way to the team's 24th College World Series appearance in program history and second straight ACC Coastal Division title.

DiMare's impact on the program was felt immediately upon his return in 2012, as the first recruiting class under his watch was ranked among the top 10 by two national publications. Miami's incoming 2012 freshman class was ranked No. 10 by Baseball America, its first top-10 ranking from BA since 2006, and No. 9 by Collegiate Baseball. One of those newcomers, third baseman David Thompson, earned Freshman All-America honors from Perfect Game following the conclusion of the 2013 season.

Previously, DiMare helped recruit and coach players such as Yonder Alonso, Ryan Braun, Jon Jay, Gaby Sanchez, Danny Valencia and Jemile Weeks - all of whom have reached the big leagues in recent years. DiMare's accomplishments on the recruiting scene during his nine years in the capacity of recruiting coordinator are as impressive as the Hurricanes' annual postseason results. His 2001 class was rated among the top five nationally and his 2003 class was ranked among the top 15 nationally.

UM's 2008 recruiting class, which was targeted primarily by DiMare, was ranked second by Collegiate Baseball and fifth by Baseball America prior to the 2007 season. That includes Braun, the 2005 ACC Player of the Year and Cesar Carrillo, the ACC's Pitcher of the Year that same season. Braun and Carrillo were also Miami's two first-round draft picks in 2005. DiMare has also kept Florida's top talent home, including 2006 first-round pick Chris Perez (Holmes Beach) and second-round pick Jay (Miami).

DiMare's offensive teams also proved to be some of the best in the history of the Hurricanes program. UMich's offense ranked among the top 10 in school history in eight of DiMare's nine seasons as the club's hitting instructor. The 2005 team hit .321, the seventh-best team batting average in school history and the 2004 squad finished the season with a .330 batting average, which ranks fourth in school history. UM's .310 average in 2006 was only bested by five teams that were not under the guidance of DiMare, dating back 62 years.



The 1999 Hurricanes posted the third-best batting average in school history with a .333 mark, while the 2000 team finished with a .323 batting average that ranks sixth all time. Miami batted .315 in 2003 and .314 in 2002 (10th). The 2008 team that advanced to the College World Series and spent much of the season atop the national collegiate baseball polls finished the year hitting at a school eighth-best .320 average, while also ranking tied for second in home runs (106), fourth in slugging percentage (.541), eighth in total bases (1,202) and RBI (517), tied for ninth in doubles (135) and 10th in hits (711).

DiMare has long been associated with the Miami baseball program. First, he was a fan as a kid growing up in South Florida. Then, DiMare was a player for the Hurricanes following a stellar career at Miami Westminster Christian. He was a standout outfielder for the Canes from 1989-92, with a career batting average of .290. He currently ranks among UM's leaders in career games played (243), career stolen bases (93) and total sacrifices (36). In 1991, DiMare led the Hurricanes with a .353 batting average.

Following his career in Coral Gables, he was signed as a free agent by the Boston Red Sox. He played the 1992-93 seasons in the Red Sox minor league system in Winter Haven and Ft. Lauderdale. Upon returning to Miami, DiMare spent the 1996 season as an assistant coach at Westminster - the 1996 High School National Champions. DiMare then returned to UM in 1997 and was a volunteer coach for three seasons, in charge of outfielders and base running.

DiMare currently resides in Miami with his wife Denise and four daughters: Nicolette, Gianna, Giselle and Gina.



ACC BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP NEWS & NOTES**HURRICANES RETURN TO NCAA TOURNAMENT**

- The University of Miami will continue its first season under the direction of head coach **Gino DiMare** with their first trip to the NCAA postseason under DiMare's leadership.
- Second-seeded Miami (39-18) will join host and first-seeded Mississippi St. (46-13), third-seeded Central Michigan (46-12) and fourth-seeded Southern (32-22) in the Starkville Regional.
- The Hurricanes will face Central Michigan in their first game of the Starkville Regional, beginning Friday at 8 p.m. ET.
- With their selection to the Starkville Regional, the Canes return to the postseason for the first time since 2016.
- Miami will play outside of the state of Florida in the regional round for the first time since 2013, when they were the No. 2 seed in the Louisville Regional.
- The Hurricanes are 38-29 (.567) in road regional games and 9-5 (.643) in Starkville Regional games, having played there in 1973, 1974 and 1975.

HURRICANES ENTER POSTSEASON IN TOP 20

- The University of Miami baseball program is ranked for the seventh consecutive week and in all five major polls for the fifth straight week in 2019.
- The Hurricanes (39-18, 18-12 ACC) held steady in the D1Baseball Top 25 at No. 17. Miami came in at No. 18 in Collegiate Baseball's NCAA Div. I Baseball Poll and No. 19 in the Baseball America Top 25. The Canes were ranked No. 20 in both the USA Today Coaches Poll and the NCBWA Top 25.

FOUR CANES RECEIVE ALL-ACC HONORS

- Four Miami players were among those recognized by the Atlantic Coast Conference Monday for their outstanding performances during the 2019 season.
- Redshirt sophomore C **Michael Amditis**, freshman DH/UT **Adrian Del Castillo** and redshirt junior SP **Brian Van Belle** were selected to the All-ACC Second Team, while sophomore 3B **Raymond Gil** was named to the All-ACC Third Team. Del Castillo was also one of 12 players picked for the 2019 ACC All-Freshman Team.

HURRICANES FLEXING MUSCLE AT THE PLATE

- After hitting two homers in the ACC Tournament, the Canes have hit 75 home runs over 57 games in 2019.
- UM, which ended the regular season third in the ACC with 73 homers, matched its 2018 season total of 23 home runs after just 15 games in 2019.
- Miami's 75 homers are the most since they hit 106 in 2010 and more than the combined team home runs from the previous two seasons (58, 35 in 2017 and 23 in 2018).
- 1B **Alex Toral** is tied for sixth in Division I with a team-best 22 home runs, while 3B **Raymond Gil** is second on the team with 11 homers.
- Twelve different Hurricanes have hit at least one home run in 2019.

AMDITIS & MCKENDRY LEADING THE WAY

- The University of Miami players and coaches combined to select junior RHP **Evan McKendry** and redshirt sophomore C **Michael Amditis** as team captains for the 2019 season.

ACC BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP NEWS & NOTES

WELCOME BACK, EVAN, CHRIS AND FREDDY!

- The Hurricanes got a trio of key players back in the final week of the regular season, as ace **Evan McKendry**, No. 2 starter **Chris McMahon** and standout shortstop **Freddy Zamora** all returned to action after missing extended time due to injury.
- McMahon, who missed a month with a shoulder injury, has allowed just one run on four hits while striking out nine over 7.2 IP since his return.
- Zamora missed 11 games with a shoulder injury, but returned to action on May 16 and turned in a three-hit performance to help Miami beat Duke, 4-3. He went 4-for-9 with two doubles, three runs scored and five RBI at the ACC Baseball Championship.
- On May 17, McKendry pitched for the first time since April 19 and tossed 3.1 strong innings, allowing two runs on one hit vs. Duke. He held UNC to three runs over 4.1 innings in his ACC tournament start.

TORAL TORCHING THE COMPETITION

- Sophomore 1B **Alex Toral** is second in the ACC and tied for sixth in Division I with a team-best 22 home runs.
- Toral has been especially hot over the last 10 games, batting .429 (15-for-35) with five homers, a double and a team-leading 11 RBI to go with an impressive 1.386 OPS.
- One of three Hurricanes to start all 57 games this season, Toral has hit safely in nine of the last 10 games and posted five multi-hit performances in that span.
- Toral's 17 multi-RBI games are the most by a Hurricane in 2019.

"EL CABALLO" DEL CASTILLO DELIVERING

- Freshman **Adrian Del Castillo** opened his career with a 15-game hit streak and has reached base in 50 of 57 games in 2019.
- Del Castillo has been entrenched in the middle of Miami's lineup, batting third 13 times and cleanup 44 times.
- Del Castillo's 72 hits, 65 RBI and 20 doubles lead the Hurricanes. He has a team-high 20 multi-hit games and 16 multi-RBI outings.
- His 65 RBI are the most by any Hurricane since Zack Collins had 59 in 2016 and are the most by a UM freshman since Yonder Alonso's 69 in 2006.
- Del Castillo's 16 multi-RBI games are the most by a Hurricane freshman since Zack Collins posted 15 in 2014.
- A versatile player, Del Castillo has started double-digit games at catcher (12), right field (27) and designated hitter (16) and made two starts at third base.

FOUR FANTASTIC FRESHMEN FLOURISHING

- Four freshmen have started at least 25 games for Miami, with **Adrian Del Castillo** (57), **Anthony Vilar** (57) and **Jordan Lala** (56) all making over 40 starts and **JP Gates** starting 34 games.
- As a group, the four freshmen are batting .307 and combining for 236 hits, 181 runs, 50 doubles, 4 triples, 21 homers and 149 RBI.

LALA IN THE LEADOFF SPOT

- In 48 games as a leadoff hitter, freshman OF **Jordan Lala** has 49 hits with a .461 OBP, eight doubles, four homers, 57 runs scored, 52 walks, 24 stolen bases and 16 RBI.
- Lala's 27 stolen bases in 2019 are the most by a Hurricane since Zeke DeVoss stole 32 bags in 2011.

ACC BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP NEWS & NOTES

JP GATES: PITCHER WHO RAKES

- Freshman **JP Gates** came into the season as a late-inning option in the Miami bullpen, but emerged as a big-time bat for the Canes.
- Gates had a memorable debut as a hitter, going 2-for-3 with a 2B and an RBI vs. UMBC (3/3), and crushed a pinch-hit two-run HR vs. NC State on March 23. He's been Miami's regular DH ever since.
 - In the Bethune-Cookman series, Gates hit .615 (8-for-13) with a triple, a homer, seven RBI and three runs scored.
 - On May 5, Gates had three hits and a career-best four RBI vs. Bethune-Cookman finishing a double shy of the cycle.
 - He also threw a scoreless inning of relief to become the first Hurricane to homer and throw a scoreless inning in the same game since Dennis Raben in 2007.

POWER IN A PINCH

- Sophomore C **Isaac Quiñones** crushed a pinch-hit two-run homer in the bottom of the ninth inning on May 8 against UCF that marked the fourth pinch-hit home run hit by a Cane this season.
- Sophomore INF **Raymond Gil** belted a pinch-hit solo homer in the top of the ninth inning on March 30 at Pitt. Sophomore OF **Dylan Cloonan** (B-7, 3/9 vs GT) and freshman UT **JP Gates** (B-9, 3/23 vs NC State) also have hit pinch-hit home runs for Miami in 2019.

EXPERIENCED YOUTH

- Miami's roster features 25 underclassmen, tied for most in the ACC with Notre Dame.
- The Canes have zero seniors and seven juniors on the 2019 roster.
- Nine sophomores on the 2019 roster appeared in 20+ games in 2018, with eight on the current roster starting at least 21 games a year ago.

DiMARE'S HISTORIC HOT START

- After starting the season 12-3, head coach **Gino DiMare** has the most wins over the first 15 games by a first-year head coach in UM history.
- **Perry Moss** ('55) and **Jim Morris** ('94) both won 11 of their first 15 games in their debut seasons at Miami.
- **Whitey Campbell** ('58) and **Ron Fraser** ('63) went 10-5 over the first 15 games of their first season at the helm of the program.

MIAMI BASEBALL ENTERS 75TH SEASON

- The 2019 season is the 75th in Miami Hurricanes baseball history.
- The Hurricanes enter the season with a new leader, as **Gino DiMare** embarks on his first season at the helm of the Canes after spending 19 years as a coach and four years as a player at Miami.
 - DiMare, who is the ninth head coach in program history, follows the footsteps of legendary head coaches **Ron Fraser** and **Jim Morris**.
 - The Hurricanes have accomplished a lot in advance of their 75th season: national championships in 1982, 1985, 1999 and 2001, 25 trips to the College World Series, an NCAA record 44 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and an NCAA record 30 NCAA Regional titles.
 - Miami's program has also produced 49 All-Americans, while 61 different Hurricanes have gone on to play Major League Baseball.

- Miami has 13 newcomers on the 2019 roster, with 10 freshmen and three JUCO transfers joining the 18 letterwinners from a year ago.
- Freshmen **Slade Cecconi**, **JP Gates**, **Adrian Del Castillo**, **Jordan Lala** and **Anthony Vilar** have been key players, along with JUCO transfer OF **Chad Crosbie** and RHPs **Tyler Keysor** and **Mark Mixon**.

THREE FRESHMEN AMONG NATION'S BEST

- Baseball America rated three Miami freshmen among the Top 50 for the 2019 season: RHP **Slade Cecconi** was #12, LHP/UT **JP Gates** ranked #16 and C **Adrian Del Castillo** came in at #31.
- Cecconi, who was drafted by the Baltimore Orioles in the 38th round, is Miami's midweek starter.
- Gates is a late-inning reliever and will also get at-bats as a designated hitter and pinch hitter.
- Del Castillo, who was a 36th round pick of the White Sox, projects as a middle of the order bat that can play a variety of positions.

THE DESTINATION IS THE SAME: OMAHA

- Miami made its second straight trip to the **College World Series in 2016**, marking the program's 25th all-time trip to Omaha, Neb.
- Miami's **25** College World Series trips are the **second-most of any program** in the country. The Hurricanes have won **48 games** in the College World Series, the **fourth-most** of any program; Miami's **four national championships** rank **fifth-most**.
- Since the NCAA began award national seeds prior to 1999, Miami has been **among the top eight seven seasons: 1999** (#1), **2001** (#2), **2003** (#8), **2004** (#3), **2008** (#1), **2015** (#5) and **2016** (#3).

- The University of Miami's recruiting class was ranked among the nation's best by a number of publications heading into 2019.
- Miami's class was ranked as the No. 8 class by DI Baseball and the 10th-best group nationwide by Baseball America in their yearly rankings.

THREE CANES PICK 'THE U' OVER 'THE SHOW'

- Freshmen **Adrian Del Castillo** (36th round, White Sox), **Anthony Vilar** (37th round, Cubs) and **Slade Cecconi** (38th round, Orioles) all spurned professional overtures for a career at Miami after being selected in the 2018 MLB Draft.
- Cecconi (#2), Del Castillo (#8) and Vilar (#48) were among the Top 50 Impact Freshmen in the ACC according to D1Baseball.com. Freshman LHP/UT **JP Gates** was ranked 10th among ACC freshmen.

MIAMI IS #MLBU

- No school in the ACC has had **more players drafted than Miami**, which has seen **288** players picked into the professional ranks - including six in 2018. Since 1991, UM has produced **185 draft picks** - 22 more than the next-highest ACC total (163, Clemson).
