Canes Set for Another ACC Road Series at Maryland...

The 19th-ranked University of Miami (22-11, 11-3 Atlantic Coast Conference) baseball team is beginning the first of consecutive ACC road series this weekend, traveling to College Park for the first time since 2006 to face the University of Maryland (16-18, 3-12 ACC). After next weekend, it will be three away ACC series for the Canes in four weekends.

The Hurricanes enter the three-game series working on an eight-game winning streak, including conference sweeps of Boston College (doubleheader in a three-game set shortened due to weather) and NC State, respectively.

Miami is led offensively by two players batting above the .300 plateau, including junior infielder/outfielder Rony Rodriguez with a team-leading .313 average. The Miami native also leads the Canes in slugging percentage (.556) and collected his team-high fifth home run of the season on Wednesday night in a win over cross-county opponent Barry University.

Right behind Rodriguez is sophomore outfielder Zeke DeVoss. He is hitting at a .308 clip – the third time this year he has eclipsed the .300 mark for average. DeVoss also leads the ACC in stolen bases with 21 (0.64 per game), while heading up the Canes in runs (35), tied for the team lead in hits (36), tied for the high in triples (2) and fielding at 97.3 percent on the year. DeVoss enters the weekend working on a five-game hit streak.

Sophomore shortstop Stephen Perez made his debut back at short as a defensive replacement for Harold Martinez on Wednesday, seeing his first action at short since March 23. Perez had been injured with a deep thigh bruise resulting from a collision at the University of Florida, and eventually had to sit out a few games due to severe swelling in his thigh.

Also back in the lineup for the Hurricanes was second baseman Michael Broad. Broad had a pulled hamstring, and made a relief appearance for DeVoss – covering second in Broad's absence, in the late stages of the game against Barry.

Freshman Dale Carey continues to lift his average, now raising it 217 points since March 22 vs. UCF. The Georgia native now bats .267, and has started the last 11 games in the outfield.

Fellow freshman Brad Fieger is now batting .295 for the Canes, while junior Nathan Melendres is back near 100 percent after an injury to his wrist, and batting at .292 with 26 hits, seven doubles and a team-high matching two triples.

As a team, the Miami pitching staff is fourth in the league with a 3.23 ERA as a staff, led by the services of sophomore Steven Ewing, holding a 2.27 ERA and striking out a team-high 55 batters in 47 2/3 innings of work.

Miami Against Maryland...

Miami owns a 9-3 advantage in the all-time series against Maryland, in a series dating back to 2005. The Canes won the first two meetings against the Terrapins that season before dropping the finale in the three-game set. The two teams did not meet from 2007-10, until UMiami swept a three-game series against the Terps last season in Coral Gables. This is the first time Miami is traveling to College Park, Md., since 2006 – with the Canes taking two-of-three from the Terps that year.

Scouting the Maryland Terrapins...

The University of Maryland is led offensively by Ryan Holland with a .321 average at the dish, including a team-high 35 hits, eight doubles and 21 RBI. He slugs at a .440 average, and has swiped seven bases on nine attempts.

Behind him in the lineup is Charlie White with a .291 average, including a team-leading 21 runs scored on the campaign for the Terrapins. He also adds 30 hits and a team-high matching eight doubles to go along with 11 stolen bases on 11 attempts.

Friday night starter David Carroll enters the weekend working on a 5-2 record, and an ERA of 2.94. He has started in all eight games in which he has appeared, working 49 full innings and striking out 28 batters with a .258 average against.

The Terps come into the weekend having won two of their last three against Delaware State and Clemson (series finale), while dropping their last game against James Madison on Wednesday evening by a count of 13-12.

Going For Lucky Number 8...

With two more wins, University of Miami head baseball coach **Jim Morris** will capture his 800th win at the "U". While getting the win inside Alex Rodriguez Park would be special – two wins this weekend would mean a series victory and his 800th victory at UMiami.

Looking at the Pitchers for the Weekend...

UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI HEAD COACH JIM MORRIS - 18TH SEASON

2001, 1999, & 1994 National Coach of the Year • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



In his 18th season at Miami, no other program, nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 38 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 17 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 26 years, 17 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 798-309-3 (.719) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,302-553-4 (.700) Division I record in 29 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 32 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,433-594-4 (.706) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 18 years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the new stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 26th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2010 when he guided the 'Canes to the NCAA Coral Gables Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 17 seasons (1994-2010), winning 15 of his last 17 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris has led the 2010 Hurricanes to their 38th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2010 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft. In 2008, the 'Canes reached the College World Series after winning the Atlantic Coast Conference, widely considered one of the toughest - if not the toughest - collegiate baseball conference in the country.

MORRIS IN HIS 33RD SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,302-553-4 (.700) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,433-594-4 (.706) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 17 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- Guided the Miami Hurricanes to College World Series National Championship in 1999 and 2001.
- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 17 seasons and led Miami to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami, by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

SHORTSTOPS AND JIM MORRIS

Morris, who played shortstop during college at Elon and then in the Boston Red Sox organization, has had great success developing the position while a head coach. Over the last decade Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases. He currently works with sophomore Stephen Perez, a slick-fielding switch-hitter expected to bat near the upper-half of the order this year for the 'Canes.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres, from 1997-99. Before Hill, it was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Nationals. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and played for the Oakland A's in 2009.

Canes Headed to College Park on Short Rest...

After facing Barry on Wednesday evening, the Hurricanes had little time before hopping aboard a flight Thursday morning for a three-game series with league opponent Maryland, beginning Friday, April 15, at 7 p.m. The other two games will follow on Saturday (3 p.m.) and Sunday (Noon) – with all games played on the Maryland campus in College Park.

Miami Takes Two in Doubleheader Affair in Frigid Boston...

Harold Martinez had four hits in the first game of the series, his first game on the season with four base hits...The 'Canes pounded a season high 26 hits and 19 runs in the first game of the series... There previous high in hits was 14 against Illinois State...Every player who came to the plate against the Eagles recorded a hit for the Hurricanes, including nine different players with multiple hits...The 'Canes scored in every inning but the second in the first game of the doubleheader, including six innings where they scored more than one run...In the two game series, **Rony Rodriguez** was 4-5 with 5 runs scored and 4 RBIs...**Dale Carey** continued his hot hitting, going 4-8 in the series. In his last eight games, Carey has hit in seven of them, going 11-28 in the process, with three multi-hit games...Miami swept the doubleheader from Boston College...The last time the Hurricanes accomplished that feat was against Wake Forest on May 16, 2009...In the second game of the series, the 'Canes 3-4-5 hitters did the majority of the damage...**Nathan Melendres**, **Harold Martinez** and **Rony Rodriguez** went 5-8 with a double and a home run, five runs scored and four RBI's...**Daniel Miranda** picked up his seventh save of the season against Boston College in the second game...With the save, Miranda is now tied for 12th in the NCAA for saves, and is in sole possession of second in the ACC...With the sweep of Boston College, Miami improved to 5-0 on the road in the ACC...**Cade Kreuter**, the sophomore transfer from USC, finally showed his promised and erupted at the plate in the first game of the series...He went 3-3 with four RBI's, including a first-pitch towering homerun to straight away center field...**Chantz Mack** hit his first career homerun in the third inning of the first game of the series off BC pitcher Nate Bayuk.

Canes Storm Past FGCU for Second Time in as Many Weeks...

Harold Martinez makes his fourth consecutive start at shortstop for the injured **Stephen Perez**... **David Villasuso** is back behind the plate after a day off on Sunday...**Chris Pelaez**, coming off a shoulder injury, makes his second start of the year – as he was slotted as the DH and hit sixth...**Zeke DeVoss** hit a two-out grand slam in the bottom of the fourth inning to give the Hurricanes a 10-0 lead... It was the second grand slam of the season for the 'Canes, as **Michael Broad** hit one exactly a week ago against UCF...For DeVoss, it was his first home run of the season, and his first since May 29, 2010, against Virginia in the ACC Tournament...It was also DeVoss' second career grand slam, last clearing the bases against Boston College on May 27 of last year – also in the ACC Tournament...Freshman outfielder **Dale Carey** recorded his first and second extra-base hits of his career when he doubled in the second and third innings, respectively...Carey's double in the second inning drove home a run – his third RBI in as many games...With a double in the eighth inning, **Brad Fieger** reached base four times in one game for the first time this season...Sophomore **Michael Broad** hit a deep home run over the left field fence in the fifth inning, his second blast of the season. This was the first game this season where the Hurricanes had hit two home runs in one game...**Cade Kreuter** pinch-hit for Rony Rodriguez in the bottom of the fifth, and took over for him at first base in the top of the sixth inning...It was the first time all season Kreuter saw action in the field, defensively.

Packing the Park...

Miami's 10th Anniversary of the 2001 NCAA College World Series Championship game against NC State on April 9, marked a season-high in attendance at Alex Rodriguez Park with a crowd of 3,908 on hand for the Canes dramatic win, as well as the honoring of the CWS title team.

Recapping the Last Game - vs. Barry (April 13)...

No. 19 Miami came away with its eighth straight win on Wednesday, defeating cross-county opponent Barry University by a score of 10-5 inside Alex Rodriguez Park. The Canes exploded for 16 hits – including three home runs – which is a season-high for Miami at home.

Miami was led offensively by center fielder Nathan Melendres who was 2-3 with two RBI; sophomore Zeke DeVoss (3-for-5) with three runs scored; and freshman outfielder Dale Carey who was 2-for-2 with a RBI.

Carey extended his hit streak to a career-high seven games after his two hits tonight.

The Canes (22-11) scored in the bottom of the first inning off a double from Melendres, driving in outfielder Chantz Mack. The run was immediately followed by a solo home run from first baseman Rony Rodriguez, who homered after Melendres was caught attempting to steal third.

The home run was Rodriguez's team-leading fifth of the season.

Miami tacked on four more runs on five hits in the second inning.

The first run came off an RBI single from Carey, scoring the designated hitter Chris Pelaez – who was 2-for-2 on the night at the plate. Starting catcher David Villasuso drove in the following two runs on his first round-tripper of the campaign, which he blasted well over the scoreboard in left center field.

The onslaught continued when DeVoss, who reached base on a single, scored on Melendres' second RBI in as many innings.

The Canes continued their impressive hitting in the fourth inning courtesy of Harold Martinez who hit a three run homer – his second of the year.

Sophomore shortstop Stephen Perez returned from injury tonight in the fifth inning, marking his first appearance in a game since March 23 against Florida Gulf Coast University. Perez finished the game 0-for-1 at the plate.

The Barry Buccaneers (27-11) scored their first run of the game in the fifth inning off a RBI double by left fielder Lyndon Coleman, who drove in catcher Chris Leon, and advanced Manny Pedrozo to third.

UMiami sophomore starting pitcher Steven Ewing had another quality weekday start, earning the win in six innings of work. Ewing scattered five hits – giving up only one earned run – while striking out seven. He is now tied for the team lead in wins with five (5-1).

Freshman relief pitcher Javi Salas made his 11th appearance of the season out of the Canes bullpen when he replaced Ewing in the top of the seventh. After pitching one scoreless inning, Salas was replaced by freshman AJ Salcines who delivered a scoreless inning of his own.

Barry made a late comeback attempt in the top of the ninth inning, plating five runs on four hits against freshman reliever Adam Sargent. Pedrozo led the charge for the Buccaneers with a one-out, two-run homer down the left field line.

The Canes brought in freshman Sam Abrams with two outs in the ninth to finish off the game. Abrams fanned the final batter of the game to finalize the win, giving UM its sixth straight nonconference victory.

Bucs starting pitcher Jordan Wellander took the loss for Barry, allowing six earned runs on 10 hits in just three innings pitched. Pedrozo led the Buccaneers on offense tonight with two hits, including one home run and two RBI.

The Hurricanes will look to improve on their 11-3 conference record when they travel to College Park, Md., this weekend for a three-game set against University of Maryland (15-17, 3-12 Atlantic Coast Conference).

Athletics Gets a Changing of the Guard...

On April 12, 2011, the University of Miami officially announced the hiring of Shawn Eichorst as the new Director of Athletics for the Hurricanes. He took over for Interim Director of Athletics, Tony Hernandez, who was serving in the position vacated by former AD Kirby Hocutt who left in March for a similar position at Texas Tech University. Eichorst comes to UMiami from the University of Wisconsin, having also served in the Department of Athletics at the University of South Carolina.

Rony Rodriguez Picks Up Weekly ACC Award for Canes...

After hitting .750 and producing his team-leading fourth home run in helping the University of Miami to a perfect 3-0 week, junior infielder Rony Rodriguez has been selected as the Atlantic Coast Conference Baseball Co-Player of the Week for the week of March 28 – April 3. He shares the award with Clemson infielder Richie Shaffer for the week of April 4. On the week, Miami defeated Florida Gulf Coast and Boston College, respectively.

Rodriguez, who started all three games last week for the Hurricanes at first base, led Miami in batting average with a .750 clip, producing six hits in eight official at-bats – including two walks and scoring seven runs. His 80.0 percent on-base percentage is the best for any Hurricanes performer in a week at this point on the campaign.

The Sunset High alum and former Miami Dade College product, now in his second year as a UMiami student-athlete, helped keep the Hurricanes perfect on the road in ACC play at 5-0 – using a doubleheader sweep of Boston College on Sunday in 19-4 and 7-6 (5 innings) wins in Chestnut Hill, Mass. His slugging percentage for the week was 1.125, and he was perfect defensively with 14 putouts and an assist, all coming at the first base position.

Against Boston College, Rodriguez was 2-for-2 with three runs scored and two walks in the doubleheader opener, only to follow with a 2-for-3 performance in the nightcap – registering a solo home run in the fifth, which proved to be the game-winning RBI for the 7-6 decision in the curfew rule enforced five inning affair.

Last Time vs. Maryland (5/2/10)...

The 11th-ranked University of Miami baseball team completed its three-game sweep of Maryland this weekend, winning 9-1 Sunday afternoon at Alex Rodriguez Park. Four Miami pitchers combined to allow just one unearned run, with Travis Miller picking up the win in four innings of relief work.

Miami improved to 34-11 overall and 18-6 in Atlantic Coast Conference play, winning its 14th straight home game and 11th straight home game against a conference foe.

With Miami up 4-1 in the bottom of the seventh, Chris Pelaez broke the game open with his first career grand slam. Pelaez finished the day 2-for-4 with four RBI and three runs scored. Michael Broad recorded his fourth multi-hit game in his last five, going 3-for-4 with two RBI and a run scored. Nathan Melendres, who went 1-for-2 with a walk, drove in what

Melendres' bases-loaded, two-out single through the left side in the fourth scored Yasmani Grandal and Pelaez for the first two runs of the game.

Broad singled home Pelaez in the sixth to make it 3-0 Miami before a wild pitch, a passed ball and another wild pitch brought Broad around to plate UM's fourth run.

After Pelaez's grand slam in the seventh made it 8-1, a double by Martinez was followed by an RBI single off the bat of Broad, bringing the score to 9-1.

Game 2: With the win, head coach **Jim Morris** earned his 1,300th Division I victory...At four hours and five minutes (4hr, 5 mins) – tonight's game was the longest for the Hurricanes this season...**David Villasuso's** game-winning double was his sixth of the season and his first game-winning hit of the year...Miami's 14-runs scored are the fifth double-digit outpour in winning-fashion on the year for the Hurricanes...UM has scored an amazing 65 runs in its last six games dating back to the conclusion of the Georgia Tech series...Starting pitcher **Eric Whaley** has gotten out every first batter he's faced this season. came with two outs...The 12 runs by the Yellow Jackets are the most allowed by the Hurricanes this year.

Game 3: Junior Harold Martinez Martinez started at shortstop every game of this series, and has started all 25 games this season... Freshman catcher **Shane Rowland** made his first start of the series behind the plate and batted eighth in the lineup...Starting pitcher **Eric Whaley** continues to pitch brilliantly, striking out a career-high 10 batters through seven innings... Whaley only gave up one run on two hits, but did not factor in the decision...For Whaley, it was his third consecutive start with eight-or-more strikeouts, and his fourth of the season... Collecting their 15th straight win, Sunday marked the first time the Yellow Jackets of Georgia Tech ever swept the Hurricanes in Coral Gables, and the first sweep overall by Georgia Tech since 1967...The last time the 'Canes were swept by anyone at home was Clemson in 2006...Reliever **Sam Robinson** gave up a run in the top of the ninth inning...For Robinson, it was his first earned run given up after 17 2/3 innings this season... Today's match-up was the 78th all-time meeting between the two schools in a series that dates back to 1958...After committing a combined 10 errors in games on Wednesday (Florida Gulf Coast) and Friday (Georgia Tech), the Miami defense responded with back-to-back error-free performances on Saturday and Sunday against the Rambling Wreck.

Canes Overwhelm Eagles in Battle of the Birds (March 23)...

Zeke DeVoss started in center field tonight in place of **Nathan Melendres** – who served as designated hitter – and **Chantz Mack** suited up in left field with **Rony Rodriguez** over

in right field...Late in the game, head coach **Jim Morris** made defensive substitutions with Martinez playing shortstop; Rodriguez moving to first base; **Dale Carey** going to center and Mack moving to right...DeVoss recorded his team-high tying fifth double of the night in the fourth inning, before swiping his team-leading 11th steal of the season – reaching safely at third...Junior pitcher **Travis Miller** saw action in his second game this year, picking up his first win since May 2, 2010...Miller toed the rubber in the fifth inning in relief of starter **AJ Salcines**...Miller's only other action came against Illinois State (March 8)...**Daniel Miranda** picked up his team-best sixth save of the year – sitting second-best in the ACC in that category...Miranda earned his fifth save in the last six games – and his fifth consecutive when toeing the rubber in relief...For the sixth consecutive game, the UMiami bullpen did not allow a single run, this time using the combination of **Travis Miller** – who earned the win, **Adam Sargent**, **Sam Robinson** and **Daniel Miranda** for the final five frames in relief of starter **AJ Salcines** who tossed the first four frames...**Harold Martinez** recorded a hit in his eighth straight game tonight, using a single to right in the sixth inning...Since making the move to first base in the series-opener against Virginia Tech on March 11, Martinez has a team-high .467 average at the plate – adding a team-leading 14 hits and a slugging percentage of .533 during that span.

Rodriguez Is Burnt Orange and Money Green...

After a blistering fall campaign, leading the Hurricanes in batting average and hits, junior infielder/outfielder **Rony Rodriguez** has burst out of the gates quickly as a team leader in the spring as well. Rodriguez was selected as the ACC Co-Player of the Week (April 4-10), and now leads the Canes in batting average (.313), home runs (5) and slugging percentage (.556).

Position Change...

In the second game of the series against Virginia Tech, Miami head coach **Jim Morris** elected to move All-American third baseman **Harold Martinez** to first, in a straight switch with freshman **Brad Fieger**. Since the move, Martinez has a .964 fielding percentage and has a .550 batting average. Fieger has also embraced the change well, committing just a single error in six games at the hot corner.

One Whale of a Game...

Sophomore pitcher **Eric Whaley** picked up his team-best third win of the year in Miami's series finale win (and series sweep) of Virginia Tech on Sunday, March 13, going a season-long tying seven innings — allowing just three hits and striking out three with zero walks issued to the Hokies. The Pompano Beach native has earned wins in all three home series finales on the campaign.

Miami claimed its the sixth consecutive conference win with a sweep of the Demon Deacons on the road. Canes Sweep Hokies in Much-Anticipated Rematch...

The 'Canes opened up ACC play last Friday night with a win against the Virginia Tech Hokies. Miami has dominated Virginia Tech in Coral Gables, winning six of the seven match-ups on its home field. The 'Canes are now 5-3 all-time in ACC-opening games...**Nathan Melendres** returned to the lineup as well, playing center field after a four-game absence due to a hand injury...Playing Small Ball — Miami looked to manufacture runs against the Hokies, bunting six different times throughout the game — with four resulting in bunt singles and one in a sacrifice...UM also had three steal attempts on the night, with two successful tries by sophomore **Stephen Perez**...As a team, Miami improved to 17-22 with stolen bases on the season...Runners left on base plagued the Hurricanes once again in the opening game of the series, as they left 11 men on the base paths in tonight's game...The 'Canes left the bases loaded in three different innings, and two on in another, with each four of the innings ending in a strikeout...Freshman starting pitcher **Bryan Radziewski** tossed a gem in the series-opener, going seven shutouts innings to earn his second career victory...It was the longest start of his career; the second time he has gone 5-plus innings without giving up a run; and his third quality start of the season...Junior **Sam Robinson** pitched a perfect eighth, and has yet to give up a run on the season...**Daniel Miranda** came in and pitched a bumpy ninth, allowing his first run of the season, before closing the door on the Hokies...Freshman **Dale Carey** made a diving catch in the top of the ninth inning to rob shortstop Tim Smalling of a potential extra-base hit...The hit would have brought the tying run to the plate with nobody out...Carey was inserted into the game in the bottom of the eighth as a pinch-runner and later on **Stephen Perez's** RBI double...He stayed in the game as the right fielder, where he proceeded to make his clutch play...Sophomore right-hander **E.J. Encinosa earned his first win of the season and now stands at 1-2...On Saturday, **Harold Martinez** and **Brad Fieger** swapped positions at the corners Friday night and were back at the positions tonight...It's Fieger's second career start at third and Martinez's second start of the season at first...Martinez played 10 games at first base during the 2009 season...**Harold Martinez** recorded two singles in tonight for his second multi-hit game this season...Southpaw hurler **Sam Robinson** earned his second save of the season, throwing only two pitches to seal Miami's 2-1 win over Virginia Tech...**Sam Robinson** made his 10 appearances to date, including a string of the last six of eight contests this month...Sunday's 11 runs scored was the highest runs production for the Hurricanes all season. The previous high was 10 against Appalachian State in the series finale on February 26...Sunday's Starters — Six of today's starters collected hits, while all nine starters reached base safely. **Harold Martinez** posted multiple hits for the second time in as many games (third time this year), knocking in a season-high four RBI...**Nathan Melendres** registered a season-high three hits, adding a RBI and scoring twice...**Rony Rodriguez** and **Stephen Perez** both tallied multiple RBI in the series finale...Sophomore right-hander **Eric Whaley** had another solid production in his fourth start of the year...Whaley went seven innings on the hill, spreading out three hits with no runs, no walks and striking out eight batters...Whaley has a team second-best 23 strikeouts on the year...Scoring 11 runs on nine hits meant Miami scored runs with guys on base, moving them over with bunts and driving them in with timely hits...Miami began the game with three consecutive bunt singles...UMiami has tallied five-plus hits in each of the last six games, including 14 against Illinois State (March 8)...The Canes showed great plate awareness on Sunday, drawing 10 walks from six Virginia Tech pitchers...The 10 walks taken was a season-high for UM.

Catch Me If "U" Can...

This year's UMiami team is full of speed from all areas of the lineup, and through 33 games, it is quite prevalent. Head coach **Jim Morris** has preached aggressive base running throughout his illustrious career, with the Canes swiping 56-of-71 bases this season. **Zeke DeVoss** leads the way with an ACC-best 21 steals, followed by **Nathan Melendres** (9) and **Stephen Perez** (6).

Miami Jumps 12 Spots in Latest NCAA RPI Rankings...

Sitting at No. 37 just a week ago in the RPI standings, the University of Miami made a giant leap 12 spots this week to No. 25. In all, seven (7) Atlantic Coast Conference teams are ranked in the Top 50 of the latest NCAA RPI rankings.

The First Father/Son Duo...

Freshman catcher **Shane Rowland** has stepped right into the UMiami starting lineup and taken charge. He belted his first home run over the weekend against Appalachian State. The Tampa native is the son of former UMiami second baseman and current international scout for the New York Yankees, Donny Rowland. They are the first father/son duo to ever play baseball at the "U".

Miami Predicted to Finish Third In Coastal Division...

Miami baseball has been predicted to finish third in the Coastal Division of the Atlantic Coast Conference Coaches Preseason Poll. The poll is voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. Capturing a 20-10 league record in 2010, the Hurricanes finished the year third in the Coastal Division behind Virginia and Georgia Tech, respectively. Miami posted a 43-20 overall record en route to claiming the NCAA Coral Gables Regional title, and advancing to the NCAA Gainesville Super Regional.

Top-Ranked Gators Bite Back in Tough Gainesville Series...

Sophomore **E.J. Encinosa** came into Gainesville and pitched the game of his life...Facing the number one team in the country on the road, Encinosa went 7+ innings, allowing just five hits and one run to go along with three K's...Encinosa was the tough luck loser, as the Canes were unable to push a run across...**Sam Abrams**, a walk-on, saw his first action of the season when he came in the game in the bottom of the fourth after relieving freshman **Bryan**

Radziewski...Abrams went 3 2/3 innings without giving up a run, giving a Miami a chance to claw their way back into the game...**Dale Carey** was the only man to reach base for the Hurricanes in game two of the series, as reached twice with a hit and hit by pitch...He also stole his first base of the season, but no 'Cane was able to drive him home...Despite the 'Canes struggles offensively, **Shane Rowland** quietly had himself a nice series against the Gators...Although just batting at a .222 average, Rowland posted an impressive .400 on base percentage, and had one of the six RBI's for the Hurricanes...Yet again, **Sam Robinson** pitched brilliantly out of the 'pen...In 2 2/3 innings, Robinson did not yield a run, while giving up three hits... On the season, he has not allowed a run in 7.2 innings pitched, and those three hits are the only three hits he's allowed...As the rest of the Hurricanes struggle to find their groove at the plate, **Rony Rodriguez** has been the only Canes player to hit with consistency...Through the first eleven games, he leads the team in batting average with a .286 mark, slugging percentage with a .536 mark, and doubles, with 4.

Encinosa Has a Career Day in Gainesville...

Sophomore starting pitcher **E.J. Encinosa** went a career-long seven innings against top-ranked Florida (March 5). In a 1-0 loss to the Gators, Encinosa allowed just the one run on five hits and struckout three in a pitchers' duel with UF's Hudson Randall. Though not giving up the game-winning hit, Encinosa walked the first batter he faced in the eighth frame before being relieved out of the bullpen.

The 40-40 Club in Miami...

Once again, the Hurricanes achieved a 40-win season, finishing 43-20 and a spot in the NCAA Super Regional. All-time at UMiami, the 'Canes have achieved at least 40 wins 32 seasons – including 13 times under **Jim Morris**. In fact, UM has claimed 50-plus wins 19 times in school history, and 60-plus wins on three occasions. Miami posted at least 40 wins from 1973-1986, marking one of the longest streaks in NCAA history with a school collected 40 or more wins in consecutive years.

Miami Defeats Appalachian in Three-Game Home Affair...

Brad Fieger had a career series against Appalachian State, going 6-13 for in the series, scoring three runs and doubling in the Canes series win...Sophomore **Stephen Perez** went 5-11, but slugged a robust .818 with nine total bases, as he doubled twice and tripled...In the rubber match of the three game set, **Eric Whaley** pitched seven innings of shutout ball with nine strikeouts to lead the Canes to a much needed 10-0 win...It was Whaley's second win of the season, and dropped is ERA to 2.13...**Joey Porro**, who was the student-manager for the Hurricanes last year, made his first career start on Sunday as he started at

second base...He singled twice and drove in three runs for his first career hits and RBI...The Miami offense, which had struggled through the first part of the season, woke up on Sunday, when the Canes banged out a season-high 10 runs on 10 hits...They scored all their runs in three different innings, as they put up three in the fourth and eighth innings, and four in the sixth...The UMiami bullpen pitched brilliantly during the series, allowing just two earned runs over 8 2/3 innings during the series...**Adam Sargent** and **Daniel Miranda** each appeared in two games and allowed zero runs, while Miranda had a save in the first game of the series...Freshman catcher **Shane Rowland**, who had made his first career start against Rutgers on a Sunday, started all three games over the course of the weekend...Rowland took over for **David Villasuso**, who recorded one start at DH.

Miami in the ACC...

The 2011 season marks the seventh season the Canes have played in the Atlantic Coast Conference, and last year's 20-10 regular season mark in league play was the program's second-best behind the 2008 ACC championship squad that won 23 regular season league games.

Three catchers will be battling for playing time behind the plate this year, including junior **David Villasuso**. A season ago, Villasuso batted .245 with 20 RBI and five home runs while serving as a backup to MLB First Round Draft selection and 2010 ACC Player of the Year, Yasmani Grandal.

Others battling for playing time this season will be freshmen **Corey Janson** and **Shane Rowland**. After the fall season, Villasuso will probably make the start to begin the season, but don't be surprised if and when Rowland takes the spot behind the dish with improved confidence and skill.

Canes Start the 2011 Campaign with Series Win Over Rutgers...

The Canes trotted out **Brad Fieger** at first, **Michael Broad** at second, **Stephen Perez** at short, **Harold Martinez** at third and **David Villasuso** for the opening game...In the outfield, **Nathan Melendres** played center, while he was flanked by **Zeke DeVoss** in left and **Chantz Mack** in right...**Bryan Radziewski** started on the hill...Freshman infielder **Brad Fieger** started all three games at first base for the Canes in the season-

opening series, the only freshman position player to start on Opening Day this season for Miami...Freshman hurler **Bryan Radziewski** became the first rookie starter in more than 18 years to pitch on Opening Night for the Miami Hurricanes...**Zeke DeVoss** started off the season hot, as he started in the leadoff slot for each of the opening series games against the Scarlet Knights...He posted a .533 on base percentage, a .727 slugging percentage, and scored two runs in the three game set...**Bryan Radziewski** became just the latest Hurricane starter to hurl a gem on opening night...With Radziewski's line of one run allowed in six innings while striking out eight, he became the fifth straight opening day starter to go at least five innings and give up just one run or less...Projected eighth and ninth inning men **Sam Robinson** and **Daniel Miranda** started the season off in style, as they both appeared in two games and gave up zero runs. Combined, they went 6 1/3 innings while striking out 9 and giving up just two hits and one walk...With the 'Canes 5-3 win on Sunday, Miami won their opening weekend series for the third consecutive season...They beat Rutgers two out of three last season, and swept Cincinnati in the 2008 campaign.

ALEX RODRIGUEZ PARK INFORMATION

Renovations to Alex Rodriguez Park are thanks in large part to a \$3.9 million contribution by New York Yankees third baseman and 11-time MLB All-Star Alex Rodriguez. The gift - the largest ever to the University of Miami baseball program - has assisted the program in continuing to develop first-class facilities. The official announcement of his gift was made on Oct. 10, 2002.

Alex Rodriguez Park has taken form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.
- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box – along with four VIP suites – have been built atop the grandstand. This past offseason, addition seating was added down both lines while a new scoreboard was constructed in left field.
