EXHIBITION STORY LINES & NEWS

- . No. 6 Miami makes the trip to Jupiter, Fla., and Roger Dean Stadium for an exhibition against the Miami Marlins Tuesday.
- Miami is ranked in the top 10 of every major college baseball poll. The Hurricanes check in at No. 5 in Collegiate
 Baseball Newspaper, No. 5 in NCBWA and No. 6 in the USA Today Coaches Poll, Baseball America & No. 10 by D1Baseball.
- Freshman Andrew Cabezas will make his first start Tuesday; he was picked by Cleveland in the 34th round in the 2015 Draft.
- The Hurricanes made their 24th trip to the College World Series in 2015, finishing with a 50-17 record and a 22-8 mark
 in ACC play. Miami was the No. 5 national seed for the postseason, and won its second straight ACC Coastal Division title.
- The Hurricanes fell 7-1 in in last year's exhibition on March 3, 2015; the Marlins lead the all-time series 11-2-1.
- Miami handed top-ranked Florida its first loss of the season Saturday, but UF won the series by taking Games 1 & 3.
- Miami returns several hitters from an offense that ranked No. 1 nationwide in runs scored in 2015, including Preseason All-America Zack Collins, two-time All-ACC outfielder Willie Abreu and CWS All-Tournament selection Jacob Heyward.
- Head coach Jim Morris entered 2016 with the sixth-most wins in Division I history (1,485) and the fourth-most among
 active skippers. With 19 more wins in 2016, Morris will move into fifth place in all-time Division I wins (Larry Hays, 1.508).
- In a preseason poll of ACC head coaches, the Hurricanes were picked to win the ACC Coastal Division in 2016.



THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans, University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams in his 23rd season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in both 2008 and 2014.

In his 22-season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 43 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 12 of Morris' 22 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2015, when Miami was awarded the No. 5 national seed heading into the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 16 of 22 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13-straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 31 years - 22 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 986-407-3 (.706) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,490-651-4 (.694) Division I record in 33 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 37 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,621-692-4 (.698) mark.


In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 22 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

In 2015, Morris led the Hurricanes to their second straight ACC Coastal Division title, the 24th College World Series appearance in program history, and reached the 50-win mark for the 12th time in his 22 seasons.

Morris entered 2015 as among the winningest active coaches in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole possession of eighth place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers and then seventh place with a 9-5 win over Louisville on March 7 (1,445).

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history. The conference win total set a new record for the program and tied the ACC's all-time single-season win total.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22. The Hurricanes, who have never missed the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship since joining the ACC in 2004, qualified for their 10th straight conference tournament under Morris and earned a Regional host spot for their 42nd consecutive postseason trip.



Morris has reached a number of other coaching milestones in his time in Coral Gables. His 1,000th Division-I game on April 4, 2004, at his old stomping grounds at Georgia Tech. He also achieved another milestone during the 2004 season, winning his 500th game at the helm of the Miami program. Morris' 500th win came just a few weeks following his 1,000th overall win as a Division-I head coach by beating Florida State 7-3 on April 17.

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.


Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), and Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston). Several more Hurricanes during the Morris tenure are right on the cusp of making the show, including Mike Rodriguez (Houston), David Gil (Cincinnati) and Jon Jay (St. Louis). Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta.

EXHIBITION MATCHUP NEWS & NOTES

CANES OPEN MARLINS SEASON IN JUPITER

- The Hurricanes are the **first team** on the **Marlins' 2016 spring training schedule,** with an exhibition set for Roger Dean Stadium Tuesday at 1:05 p.m.
- Miami fell 7-1 in last year's exhibition at Roger Dean; the Marlins own an 11-2-1 all-time lead in the exhibition series history.
 - UM freshman Andrew Cabezas (0-0) will be making his first start.

LAST TIME OUT

- Miami dropped two of three in its weekend series with No. 1 Florida at Mark Light Field; the Hurricanes won Saturday's Game 2 by a final score of 5-3, but dropped Game 1 (5-0) and Game 3 (7-3).
- Saturday's win was played in front of a sellout crowd of 4,999.

OPENING WEEKEND SWEEP

- Led by dominant performances from the starting rotation, Miami opened its 2016 season with a sweep of visiting Rutgers.
- Lefthanders **Thomas Woodrey** (5 IP, 1 ER), **Michael Mediavilla** (6 IP, 0 R, 7 K) and **Danny Garcia** (7 IP, 0 R, 4 K) combined for a 0.50 ERA with two walks and 15 strikeouts in 18 innings of work.
- Junior **Johnny Ruiz** led the offense with a .667 (6-for-9) average against the **Scarlet Knights**.

HIGH EXPECTATIONS

- Miami was ranked in the top 10 in preseason polls from nearly every major college baseball outlet, including a No. 4 ranking from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and a No. 6 ranking from Baseball America, D1Baseball.com, NCBWA and the USA Today Coaches Poll.
- The Hurricanes, who have won back-to-back ACC Coastal Division titles, were projected to once again win the division in 2016 in a preseason poll of ACC head coaches.
- Miami's preseason ranking of No. 4 from *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* was its **highest from the publication since 2005**; its No. 6 ranking from *Baseball America* was its highest from BA since **2007**.

DESTINATION: OMAHA

- Miami made its return to the College World Series in 2015, marking the program's first trip to Omaha, Neb., since 2008. Miami's 24 College World Series trips are the second-most of any program in the country.
- The Hurricanes have won **48 games** in the College World Series, the **fourth-most** of any program nationwide; Miami's **four national championships** (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) rank **fifth-most**.

LOOKING FOR A THREE-PEAT

- Miami won its **second straight ACC Coastal Division title** in 2015, posting a **22-8 record in ACC play** to earn the division crown.
- The Hurricanes, who were picked to win the ACC Coastal Division once again in 2016, have won 46 ACC games over the past two seasons - the second-best two-year stretch by any program since ACC expanded to a 30-game conference schedule prior to 2005.
- Miami has won the ACC Regular Season Championship twice, most recently in 2014 when the Canes finished 24-6; the Hurricanes won the ACC regular season crown & ACC Tournament in 2008.

EXHIBITION MATCHUP NEWS & NOTES

CLIMBING UP THE RECORD BOOKS

- Miami closer Bryan Garcia entered the year with the fifth-most saves in Miami history (25), and recorded saves in back-to-back games vs. Rutgers to open the year. He added one vs Florida on Feb. 27.
- Garcia is chasing the all-time record for saves in a career, which is 39 - held by George Huguet (2001-2004). Garcia's 15 saves as a freshman in 2014 tied for the seventh-most in a single season.
- Garcia needs one more save to tie Danny Graves (1992-94 for fourth (29), six more to tie Robbie Morrison (1996-98) for third (34), nine more to tie Rick Raether (1984-86) for second (37) and is 11 behind **Huguet** for first.

ONES TO WATCH

- Two Hurricanes have picked up 2016 Preseason All-America honors: junior catcher Zack Collins and junior closer Bryan Garcia.
- Collins, a unanimous Preseason All-America candidate, was among the 50 players named to the initial watch list for the Golden Spikes Award by USA Baseball. He was also named to last year's list.
- · Garcia, who was recognized by Louisville Slugger and Perfect Game, was named to the watch list for the **Stopper of the Year Award** by NCBWA for the second straight year.
- Both players have earned All-America recognition in their two-year Hurricane careers; Collins was a third-team ABCA/Rawlings All America choice last season, while Garcia was a NCBWA third-team All American after his freshman year in 2014.
- UM had three All-Americans in 2015: David Thompson (unanimous), George Iskenderian (NCBWA) & Collins (ABCA).

MIAMI ADDS ANOTHER MAJOR LEAGUER

- Arizona Diamondbacks slugger Peter O'Brien became the 53rd former University of Miami player to play in Major League Baseball when he was called up late in 2015.
- O'Brien joined a 2015 group that included now Oakland A's teammates Yonder Alonso and Danny Valencia, new San Diego Padres outfielder Jon Jay, Dodgers All-Star catcher Yasmani Grandal, new D-Backs catcher/outfielder Chris Herrmann, infielders Ryan Jackson and Jemile Weeks and Milwaukee All-Star Ryan Braun.
- Miami had five players selected in the 2015 MLB Draft: lefthander Andrew Suarez, third baseman David Thompson, infielder George Iskenderian, catcher Garrett Kennedy and outfielder Ricky Eusebio.


