STORYLINES:

TAR HEELS TO FACE MIAMI FOR ACC TITLE

◆ North Carolina (24-9) will try to win its 18th Atlantic Coast Conference championship when it faces Miami (26-6) on Sunday afternoon at 1 p.m. in the Greensboro Coliseum.

◆ The Tar Heels are the tournament's No. 3 seed and hope the third time is the charm against the top-seeded Hurricanes after losing two regular season meetings to Miami this year.

◆ The ACC Network will televise the game in the ACC region, and ESPN will broadcast the game live nationally. The game will also be available online via WatchESPN.

◆ A win on Sunday would be the 700th in the head coaching career of UNC's **Roy Williams**.

◆ A victory against Miami also would be Carolina's 91st all-time ACC Tournament victory, tying Duke for most in conference history.

◆ The Tar Heels have won eight of their last nine games. UNC has gone 14-4 since starting ACC play 0-2 in early January.

◆ UNC is seeking its 18th ACC Tournament title and its first since winning consecutive championships in 2007 and 2008. Carolina has won ACC Tournament championships in 1957, 1967, 1968, 1969, 1972, 1975, 1977, 1979, 1981, 1982, 1989, 1991, 1994, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008.

◆ Carolina is 8-4 in ACC championship games played in Greensboro, winning the tournament here in 1967, 1972, 1975, 1977, 1979, 1982, 1997 and 1998 and losing in 1971, 1988, 1995 and 2011.

WILLIAMS NEEDS ONE WIN FOR 700

◆ Carolina head coach **Roy Williams** enters Sunday's game with a career record of 699-178 in his 25th season. A win on Sunday would make Williams the fourth active Division I coach in the nation to win 700 games and the 21st in NCAA history.

ROY WILLIAMS RADIO SHOW

MONDAYS AT 7 P.M.: Coach **Roy Williams'** weekly radio show will air from the Top of the Hill restaurant in Chapel Hill on Mondays at 7 p.m. (schedule subject to change due to team travel).

◆ **Dean Smith** won 13 Tournament titles, tied with Duke's Mike Krzyzewski for most in history. Smith's teams were 58-23 and played in the championship game 21 times.

◆ **Roy Williams** has won two ACC titles (2007, 2008).

CAROLINA'S HISTORY IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

◆ The Tar Heels have an all-time record of 90-41 in Tournament play. With a win on Sunday, Carolina will tie Duke (91-41) for most wins and the best winning percentage (.689) in ACC Tournament history.

◆ Carolina's current all-time ACC Tournament winning percentage of .687 is second-best in conference history behind Duke's .689.

◆ UNC is making its 32nd appearance in the ACC Tournament final, most all-time. UNC is 17-14 in its 31 previous championship game appearances.

◆ The Tar Heels have won the ACC Tournament 17 times, second in league history behind Duke's 19.

◆ Carolina has won ACC Tournament championships in 1957, 1967, 1968, 1969, 1972, 1975, 1977, 1979, 1981, 1982, 1989, 1991, 1994, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008.

◆ The Tar Heels have played in the ACC Tournament finals in 17 of the last 27 seasons.

◆ **Roy Williams** is aiming for his third ACC championship as a head coach after capturing the 2007 title in Tampa and the 2008 title in Charlotte. While the head coach at Kansas, Williams won four Big 8/12 Tournament titles (1992, 1997, 1998 and 1999). Williams was an assistant coach under **Dean Smith** for three ACC championships at UNC (1979, 1981, 1982).

CAROLINA IN GREENSBORO

◆ Carolina has an all-time record of 117-30 in the city of Greensboro.

◆ That 117-30 figure includes a 6-1 record at Guilford College between 1913 and 1941 and an 0-2 record in the city prior to the construction of War Memorial Coliseum in 1959. The arena was later renamed the Greensboro Coliseum.

◆ Carolina is 111-27 in the building now known as the Greensboro Coliseum.

◆ Williams' next win will join him with Mike Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim and Bob Huggins in the active 700-win club.

◆ Among active coaches, Boeheim was the fastest to 700 wins, reaching the milestone in 939 games. Williams will be coaching his 878th career game on Sunday against Miami.

◆ Among all coaches in NCAA history, Adolph Rupp reached 700 wins the fastest, doing so in 836 games. Jerry Tarkanian won his 700th game in his 876th outing. **Dean Smith** was third-fastest (904 games).

A WIN AWAY FROM 25

◆ Carolina has won 24 games in 2012-13 and needs one more victory for the 34th 25-win season in school history.

◆ The Tar Heels have won 25 or more games in a season 33 times in 102 varsity seasons, including five in the last six years (2007, 2008, 2009, 2011 and 2012) and six in the previous eight seasons under head coach **Roy Williams** (2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2011 and 2012).

◆ **Williams**-coached teams have won 25 or more games 18 times in 24 seasons as a head coach at Kansas and UNC.

ACC TOURNAMENT FAST FACTS

◆ North Carolina has won 17 Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament championships and will be playing in the championship game for a record 32nd time on Sunday.

◆ The Tar Heels have been the ACC Tournament No. 3 seed nine times (1958, 1963, 1974, 1986, 1992, 1996, 1997, 1999, 2013) and won the event as the No. 3 seed in '97.

◆ A Tar Heel has won the ACC Tournament Most Valuable Player award 18 times. The MVPs include: **Lennie Rosenbluth** (1957), **Larry Miller** (1967, 1968), **Charles Scott** (1969), **Lee Dedmon** (1971), **Robert McAdoo** (1972), **Phil Ford** (1975), **John Kuester**

◆ Carolina is 36-15 in ACC Tournament games played in Greensboro and has won eight of its 17 ACC Tournament championships in the city. The Tar Heels have won ACC Tournament titles in Greensboro in 1967, 1972, 1975, 1977, 1979, 1982, 1997 and 1998.

◆ UNC is 7-0 in NCAA Tournament games played in Greensboro, most recently going 2-0 in the opening two rounds against Vermont and Creighton in 2012.

◆ Head coach **Roy Williams** is 5-4 as a head coach in ACC Tournament games in Greensboro (0-1 in 2004, 1-1 in 2006, 0-1 in 2010, 2-1 in 2011 and 2-0 in 2013).

TAR HEELS AS NO. 3 SEED IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

◆ This is the ninth time Carolina has been the No. 3 seed in the ACC Tournament — 1958, 1963, 1974, 1986, 1992, 1996, **1997**, 1999, 2013 — and won the event as the third seed in 1997.

◆ UNC has gone 13-7 as the No. 3 seed and is making its first appearance as the third seed since 1999.

ROY WILLIAMS IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

◆ Carolina is making its 10th ACC Tournament appearance under head coach **Roy Williams**. The Tar Heels are 15-7 (.682) in ACC Tournament play under Williams' tutelage.

◆ Williams' ACC Tournament winning percentage of .667 is tied as the fifth-best in ACC history with Everett Case of NC State.

◆ Williams is aiming for his third ACC championship as a head coach after capturing the 2007 title in Tampa and the 2008 title in Charlotte.

THE SERIES VS. THE HURRICANES

◆ Carolina leads the series with the Hurricanes, 18-4, including a 9-2 advantage in Chapel Hill, a 7-2 edge on the road and a 2-0 edge at neutral sites.

◆ Despite a Miami sweep of the season series this season, Carolina has won 10 of its last 12 games against Miami, including 10 in a row prior to this year.

◆ Carolina is 1-0 against Miami in ACC Tournament play, with the lone prior meeting coming two years ago in Greensboro. The Tar Heels beat the Hurricanes 61-59 on a last-second layup by **Tyler Zeller** off a **Kendall Marshall** assist as time expired (see more details below). That bucket capped a 19-point comeback in the final 9:51 of the game and marked UNC's biggest comeback in ACC Tournament history.

◆ **Roy Williams** is 14-4 as a head coach against the Hurricanes, including a 12-3 mark at UNC and a 2-1 record at Kansas. At Carolina, Williams has a 6-2 mark against Miami in Chapel Hill, a 5-1 record in Coral Gables and a 1-0 mark in the ACC Tournament.

EARLIER THIS SEASON IN CHAPEL HILL

◆ **Kenny Kadji** had 18 points and nine rebounds, **Julian Gamble** had 14 points and **Shane Larkin** and **Durand Scott** each scored 11 as Miami pulled away to defeat Carolina 68-59 on Jan. 14, 2013, in Chapel Hill.

◆ UNC shot 33.3 percent in the second half and 40.0 percent overall in the game while Miami shot 47.2 percent in the game and hit nine three-pointers.

◆ **James Michael McAdoo** led Carolina with 14 points and six rebounds despite shooting 5 for 14. **Reggie Bullock** had 11 points, six rebounds and five assists but shot 4 for 16 from the floor.

◆ **Marcus Paige** (10 points and five assists) and **Brice Johnson** (10 points on 5 of 8 shooting) both also reached double figures in points for the Tar Heels.

◆ After **P.J. Hairston** hit a three-pointer to pull UNC within one point at 56-55 with 5:00 to play, UM scored eight consecutive points in less than two minutes to build the lead back to nine points.

◆ Hairston's three-pointer marked Carolina's only points in a span of 7:24 late in the game as Miami went on a 13-3 run to seal the game. **J.P. Tokoto** hit a field goal off a pass from Bullock with 9:08 to play. Carolina didn't score again until Hairston's three-pointer at the 5:00 mark, then didn't score again until McAdoo scored with 1:44 left and the Tar Heels trailing by nine points.

- ◆ The loss dropped the Tar Heels to 0-2 in ACC play for the fourth time in its history.
- ◆ Tar Heel junior guard **Leslie McDonald** sat out the game due to a sore right knee.

EARLIER THIS SEASON IN CORAL GABLES

◆ The Hurricanes hit 15 of 26 three-point attempts and 54.4 percent of their overall shot attempts as Miami beat Carolina 87-26 on February 9 in Coral Gables, Fla.

◆ The 26-point margin of defeat was UNC's largest of the season.

◆ Miami's 15 three-pointers were a season high by a UNC opponent, as was its three-point percentage of 57.7. It was the most threes Carolina has given up since William & Mary hit 16 in the 2010 NIT in Carmichael Auditorium.

◆ Miami shot 54.4 percent from the floor, a season high for UNC opponents, becoming the first Tar Heel opponent to shoot 50 percent in 2012-13.

◆ The Hurricanes shot over 50 percent in both halves. UNC opponents had shot 50.0 percent or better only twice in 18 previous halves this season.

◆ Miami out-rebounded Carolina, 38-29. UNC's 10 assists were its second-fewest of the season and fewest since having eight at Indiana on Nov. 27.

◆ Carolina trailed by 17 points at halftime and by as many as 28 points late in the game. It was the fifth game this season in which UNC has trailed by 19 or more (vs. Butler in Maui, at Indiana, at Texas, at NC State and at Miami) and the fourth time it's trailed by 28 or more (Butler, at Indiana, at NC State and at Miami).

◆ Carolina trailed by double digits at halftime for a fourth time this season.

◆ **Reggie Bullock** led Carolina with 14 points and seven rebounds, shooting 5 for 8 from the floor. The other four Carolina starters combined to shoot 6 for 26 from the floor as UNC shot 38.5 percent as a team.

◆ UNC attempted only six free throws and made five FTs.

◆ Carolina scored 18 points in the paint, its fewest against an ACC opponent in two seasons.

LAST TIME IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

◆ **Tyler Zeller** took a pass from Kendall Marshall and hit a layup as the buzzer sounded to give top-seeded Carolina a 61-59 win over ninth-seeded Miami on March 11, 2011, in the ACC Tournament quarterfinals in Greensboro.

◆ Carolina's comeback win was its largest in ACC Tournament history. The Tar Heels trailed Miami by 19 points with 9:51 to play in the second half. Carolina closed the game on a 27-6 run over the last 9:51 of play.

◆ Miami led 31-22 at the half. That equals UNC's largest halftime deficit overcome in an ACC Tournament game. In the 1969 ACC championship game, Duke led Carolina 43-34 but the Tar Heels rallied for an 85-74 win behind **Charles Scott's** 40 points.

◆ The 19-point comeback is Carolina's largest in any game since Feb. 15, 2006, when freshman **Tyler Hansbrough** scored 40 points in an 82-75 UNC win over Georgia Tech in Chapel Hill. The Yellow Jackets led 50-30 with four minutes left in the first half. Carolina's previous best comeback this season was 16 points against Virginia Tech in Chapel Hill (the Hokies led 28-12 and 31-15 in the first half before UNC came back to win 64-61).

◆ The 19-point deficit in the second half is the largest overcome by Carolina to win since Jan. 27, 1993, against Florida State. In that game, UNC trailed by 21 in the second half and by 19 (73-54) with under 9:00 to play. The Tar Heels outscored the Seminoles 28-4 over the last nine minutes to win.

◆ North Carolina scored its fewest points (61) in an ACC Tournament victory since a 57-51 semifinal win over NC State on March 9, 1985, in

◆ The comeback win avoided Carolina's first-ever three-game losing streak in ACC Tournament history.
◆ Carolina made 10 of its 22 field goals from three-point range in the game. UNC made 45.5 percent of its baskets from three-point range, easily its best percentage of the season. UNC made 11 of 29 field goals (.379) against Rutgers from three-point range on Dec. 28.

◆ Zeller scored each of UNC's last four field goals and finished with 13 points and nine rebounds. Zeller's game-winning basket as time expired was Carolina's first winning shot with no time remaining since **Ty Lawson** hit a running three-pointer at Florida State on Jan. 28, 2009.

◆ **Leslie McDonald** scored all 11 of his points in the second half, hitting three three-pointers. He hit two three-pointers to start the 19-point comeback.

◆ **Harrison Barnes** led all scorers with 18 points. It was the ninth time in the last 15 ACC games Barnes has led UNC in scoring and he tied his season high with four three-pointers (also against Hofstra and at Boston College). UNC is 11-0 in games when Barnes scores 17 points or more this season.

◆ **John Henson** had 10 points, 13 rebounds and five blocked shots.

◆ The game was **Roy Williams's** 800th game as a collegiate head coach.

◆ Miami scored 59 points and shot 36.7 percent from the floor in the game, marking the 21st game in a row that UNC has held its opponents to under 80 points and under 50 percent.

◆ Carolina is 6-0 this season against ACC opponents in games decided by five points or fewer.

◆ UNC walkons **Patrick Crouch, Daniel Bolick, Van Hatchell, D.J. Johnston** and **Stewart Cooper** (known collectively as "Blue Steel" to UNC fans along with **David Dupont**) played in the first half as a group for the first time this season and played approximately two minutes.

ACC SEMIFINAL: UNC 79, MARYLAND 76

◆ **Reggie Bullock** led Carolina in points (15), rebounds (nine) and assists (four) to lead third-seeded Carolina to a 79-76 win over seventh-seeded Maryland on Saturday afternoon in the ACC semifinals in Greensboro. Bullock has led the Tar Heels in rebounding in each of the last seven games and 13 times this season.

◆ Carolina tied its season low by committing just seven turnovers against Maryland. With seven miscues also in Friday's quarterfinal win over Florida State, the Tar Heels have had their best two games protecting the ball of the season (along with seven in the home win over Virginia).

◆ UNC held a 16-8 advantage in points off turnovers in the game and won despite a 24-4 Terrapin edge in second-chance points off 13 offensive rebounds.

◆ Carolina improved to 32-14 in ACC Tournament semifinal games and 14-3 against Maryland in ACC Tournament play.

◆ The Tar Heels are 13-7 all-time as a No. 3 seed in the ACC Tournament.

◆ **Roy Williams** improves to 15-7 in ACC Tournament action as a head coach.

◆ Strickland scored 11 first-half points, his highest output in a half all season, and tied Bullock for team honors with 15. He hit 7 of 12 shots in 34 minutes of extended playing time due to point guard **Marcus Paige's** foul trouble.

◆ Paige hit two big late-game buckets with the game very much in question, including a baseline drive over Maryland seven-footer Alex Len with UNC ahead by one with 36 seconds to play.

◆ **P.J. Hairston** took eight stitches on his left hand following Friday night's win over Florida State after suffering a laceration to the webbing between his ring and middle fingers late in the game. Hairston started and played 36 hard minutes against Maryland with heavy padding and tape protecting the hand injury on his non-shooting hand. He scored 13 points despite 3 of 10 shooting.

◆ **James Michael McAdoo** was limited by foul trouble to 29 minutes, finishing with 13 points and eight rebounds on 4 of 12 shooting.

◆ Carolina led by as many as 13 points midway through the second half but Maryland had a chance to tie the score with under 10 seconds to play. Logan Aronhalt's 30-footer to tie was off the mark and Carolina won.

ACC QUARTERFINAL: UNC 83, FLORIDA STATE 62

◆ **P.J. Hairston** scored a game-high 21 points, hitting 5 of 6 three-point attempts, and **Reggie Bullock** scored 17 points as third-seeded UNC beat sixth-seeded Florida State 83-62 on Friday in the ACC Tournament quarterfinals in Greensboro.

◆ Late in the game, Hairston suffered a laceration to the webbing between the middle and ring fingers on his left hand. He received eight stitches after the game to seal the wound.

◆ Hairston hit 4 of 5 first-half three-point attempts after shooting 3 for 13 from long range in his last two games prior to Friday (2 for 7 at Maryland and 1 for 6 vs. Duke).

◆ **James Michael McAdoo** scored 12 points despite fouling out in just a season-low 14 minutes of action. **Dexter Strickland** had 10 points, seven assists and one turnover. **Marcus Paige** had nine points, 10 assists and one turnover.

◆ Paige (10 & 1) and Strickland (7 & 1) combined for 17 assists and 2 turnovers in the win.

◆ UNC swept three games from the Seminoles this season and have won 26 of the last 33 meetings in the series, including 15 of the last 19. Carolina is 5-2 all-time in ACC Tournament play against FSU.

◆ Carolina has won seven consecutive ACC Tournament quarterfinal games (last losing in the quarters in 2004 to Georgia Tech).

◆ Carolina out-rebounded Maryland 16-9 in the second half and 33-30 in the game.

◆ The Tar Heels committed just seven turnovers as a team and forced 18 Maryland miscues. Carolina held a 27-7 edge in points off turnovers in the game.

VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

◆ Miami is ranked No. 9 in the Associated Press poll and No. 10 in the ESPN/USA Today coaches poll this week. The Hurricanes will be the seventh ranked foe to face the Tar Heels this season.

◆ Carolina is 1-5 against AP-ranked opponents so far this season. The Tar Heels have lost to top-ranked Indiana (Nov. 27), 18th-ranked NC State (Jan. 26), eighth-ranked Miami (Feb. 9), second-ranked Duke (Feb. 13) and third-ranked Duke (March 9). UNC beat No. 20 UNLV (Dec. 29).

#1 DEXTER STRICKLAND

Career: Has 327 career assists and an assist-error ratio of 1.8 to 1 • Played in 125 games • Only scholarship senior on the squad • Has made 92 starts, including 88 of his last 89 games • Scored 884 points (7.1 per game) • Scored his 800th point at Duke on Feb. 13th • Has played at both guard positions in his career • Has scored in double figures 34 times with a career-high 19 against William and Mary in Dec. 2010 • Career-high 10 assists against East Carolina on Dec. 15, 2012 • Is fifth among active ACC players with 327 assists.

Played in five career ACC Tournament games • Did not play in the 2012 ACC Tournament due to a knee injury • Posted personal scoring bests in ACC Tournament play in each of the last two games (10 vs. Florida State and 15 vs. Maryland) • Made 7 of 12 shots from the floor en route to 15 points and was UNC's defensive player of the game against the Terps in the semifinals • Scored 11 in the first half, his highest scoring effort in any half this season • Shared UNC game-scoring honors with Reggie Bullock.

Had no points and no assists in home loss to Miami and two points and three assists in road loss • Made 1 of 5 shots from the floor in the two games against the Canes.

Leads the ACC in assist-error ratio (3.2) and is fifth in assists • No other player in the ACC has an assist-error ratio better than 2.3 • Started all 33 games • Averaging a career-high 8.1 points and 4.1 assists per game • Scored in double figures 12 times with a high of 16 against UNLV and at Clemson • Has 135 assists and only 42 turnovers • Has more assists than turnovers in 26 games • Has six or more assists 11 times • Averaged a turnover every 29.8 minutes in conference action • Third on the team with 39 steals • Scored in double figures six times in ACC play (16 at Clemson, 15 vs. Maryland in ACC Semifinals, 14 at BC and at Duke, 12 at home against Virginia and 10 against FSU in the ACC Quarterfinals) • Has attempted two three-pointers in the last 14 games • Made four three-pointers, the last one against East Carolina on Dec. 15th • Has 44 assists and nine turnovers in the last nine games • Shot 37 for 75 from the floor in the last nine games (.493) after making 17 of 54 (.314) in the first 10 ACC games • Has made 22 of his last 25 free throw attempts (.880).

#2 LESLIE McDONALD

Career: Played in 97 games and scored 569 points • Sat out the 2011-12 season due to an injured right knee • Has made 102 three-pointers, third-most among active players • Scored in double figures 19 times • Career highs include 24 points against UAB on Dec. 1, 2012, and six three-pointers against Mississippi State on Nov. 19, 2012 • Has made multiple threes in 24 games, including three or more 13 times • Made first career start against UAB.

Played in six ACC Tournament games • Scored 11 (all in the second half) against Miami as the Tar Heels rallied from a 19-point deficit in the 2011 quarterfinals • Hit three three-pointers against the Hurricanes • Had eight second-half points against Florida State in the 2013 quarterfinals and nine against Maryland in the semifinals • Made his 100th career three-pointer against the Seminoles • Made a career-high six free throws (in six attempts) in win over Maryland • Hit a key three-pointer against Maryland that gave UNC a six-point lead with 8:33 to play.

Did not play against Miami in the home loss and had 10 points in the loss in Coral Gables.

2012-13: Is sixth on the team in scoring at 7.5 points per game • Shooting 36.0 percent from 26-point range (40 of 111) • Has made a three-pointer in 17 of his 27 games • Scored in double figures seven times • Is 25 for 86 from the floor in his last 13 games • Has 34 assists and 20 turnovers (had six more turnovers than assists in his first two seasons) • Has made 40 of his 67 field goals from three-point range.

#5 MARCUS PAIGE

2012-13: Named to the ACC's All-Academic team and All-Freshman team • Averaged 6.0 assists over the last seven games • Made 13 of 29 (.448) from three-point range in the last nine games after making 12 of 43 in the first 11 conference games (.279) • Scored in double figures in consecutive games for the first time this year with 14 against NC State and 10 at Clemson • Averaging 9.4 points in the last nine games.

Scored all eight of his points in the ACC semifinal against Maryland in the second half, including five in the final 2:50 • Hit a pair of huge shots that helped the Tar Heels hang on for the win • With UNC leading 71-70, he hit a baseline jumper • Hit a floater over 7-foot center Alex Len with 36 seconds to play to give Carolina a 77-72 advantage.

Set a personal best with 10 assists and also scored nine points in the ACC Quarterfinal against Florida State • Had just

one turnover • Helped the Tar Heels shoot 61.3 percent from the floor in the second half and score 83 points, the second-most the Seminoles have allowed all season • Was the third time in his last six games he had eight or more assists (eight against NC State, nine against FSU in Chapel Hill and 10 last night) • Won UNC's defensive player of the game honors for the fourth time in as many games.

Had nine assists and three turnovers combined in the two losses to the Hurricanes • Scored 10 points at home, but was just 1 for 9 from the floor at Miami.

Averaging 7.7 points and 4.7 assists for the season • Started 31 games at the point • Has 149 assists and 78 turnovers • Is third in the ACC in assists per game and fifth in assist-error • Has more assists than turnovers in 23 games, including 14 of the last 17 games • Connected on multiple threes in 11 games with a high of four against Virginia Tech • Is 44 for 53 from the free throw line for a team-high percentage of .830 • Tied for first on the team with seven defensive player of the game honors, including four of the last five games • Leads all ACC freshmen in assists • Scored in double figures 10 times, including six times in ACC play • Has a season-high 19 points against Virginia Tech and 10 assists against Florida State in the ACC Tournament.

#14 DESMOND HUBERT

2012-13: Started 18 of the first 23 games but has come off the bench primarily for defensive purposes in the last 10 games • Playing well despite the limited minutes • Is 19 for 34 from the floor (.559) • Leads the team in blocked shots with 30 • Has five blocks in his last four games • Carolina's top defender against Mississippi State, ECU, Virginia, Maryland, Georgia Tech, Boston College and Clemson • Tied for the team lead with seven defensive player of the game honors.

#15 P.J. HAIRSTON

Career: Averaging 9.4 points in 68 games • Made 113 three-pointers • Three-point percentage is 10.8 percent higher as a sophomore compared to his freshman season (38.1 to 27.3) • Has scored in double figures 31 times with a high of 29 against Virginia on Feb. 16, 2013 • Shooting 80 percent from the free throw line.

Had 13 points in semifinal win over Maryland, playing a career-high 36 minutes despite a large bandage on his left hand due to the laceration he suffered in the quarterfinal against FSU • Hit his first three-point attempt to extend his game streak of games with a three to 30 • Led all scorers with 21 points against Florida State in the 2013 ACC Quarterfinals • Made 7 of 11 shots from the floor, including five of six from three-point range • Three-point percentage of .833 was the best by a Tar Heel this season • Made four three-pointers in the first half that helped UNC to an eight-point lead at the break • It was the third time this year he made at least five three-pointers (six vs. Virginia, five at NC State) • Suffered a tear in his left hand with 4:13 to play that led to eight stitches after the game between his middle and ring fingers.

Totaled 16 points in two games against Miami this year (five at home, 11 at Miami) • Combined to shoot 6 of 18 from the floor, 4 of 12 from three-point range.

2012-13: Averaging 13.8 points and 4.2 rebounds per game • Third on the team in scoring, rebounding and offensive rebounds (58) • Leads UNC with six 20-point games this season • Has scored in double figures 24 times, including his last 15 games • Averaged 12.1 points in the first 10 ACC games and a team-leading 17.1 points in the last 10 games • Is second on the team with 75 three-pointers • Made multiple threes in 22 of his last 29 games • Has made a three-pointer in 30 straight games, the longest streak in the ACC and the fourth-longest in UNC history • Third on the team in free throw percentage (.777) • Is fourth in the ACC in three-pointers and fifth in percentage • Averaged 5.5 rebounds over the last 10 games • Leads UNC with 28 offensive rebounds in the last 10 games • Has three or more offensive rebounds nine times • Defensive player of the game against Virginia and Georgia Tech • Has four turnovers in the last nine games (in 269 minutes).

#35 REGGIE BULLOCK

Carolina: Scored 958 points in 97 games, an average of 9.9 per game • Scored his 900th career point at Maryland on March 6th • Has made 181 three-pointers at 38.8 percent • Moved past Raymond Felton into 10th place on the UNC career list for three-point field goals • Has made three or more three-pointers 29 times (three 3FGs 16 times, four 3FGs nine times, five 3FGs three times and six 3FGs one time) • Career-high 24 points against Maryland on Jan. 19, 2013 • Hit a career-high six three-pointers against Tennessee State on Nov. 22, 2011 • Scored in double figures 52 times and has six point/rebound double-doubles • Has made 181 of his 350 field goals from beyond the three-point line (51.7 percent) • Has six 20-point games, five this season.

Led UNC in scoring (15), rebounds (9) and assists (4), but it was his one steal of the game that will most be remembered in Carolina's 79-76 win over Maryland in the ACC quarterfinal • With UNC leading by three with 2:22 to play, Bullock stole an entry pass to Alex Len and passed ahead to James Michael McAdoo, who was fouled and made both free throws • Did

not commit a turnover in 38 minutes and led the Tar Heels in rebounding for the seventh consecutive games.

Scored a personal best 17 points in ACC Tournament play against Florida State in the quarterfinals • Made 7 of 11 shots from the floor and added a game-high nine rebounds.

Averaged 12.5 points and 6.5 points in the two losses to Miami this year • Shot 9 of 24 from the floor, including 4 of 11 from three-point range.

2012-13: Second-team All-ACC and USBWA All-District selection • Carolina's second-leading scorer at a career-best 14.3 per game • Leads UNC in three-pointers with 81, is second in rebounding at 6.6 and steals with 41 and is third in assists with 92 • Has assist-error ratio of 92 to 36 • Shooting 44.0 percent from behind the arc (81 for 184) • Has the eighth-highest percentage in UNC single-season history • Is second in the ACC in three-point percentage, third in three-pointers made, eighth in steals and 11th in scoring and 14th in rebounding • Has four or more assists in 14 games • Made at least one three in all but two games (at Indiana and the home game vs. Duke) • Has hit at least three three-pointers in 16 games and four or more nine times • Scored in double figures 26 times, including 22 of the last 25 games • UNC's defensive player of the game four times (Gardner-Webb, Butler, ETSU and Wake Forest) • Averaging 9.4 rebounds over the last eight games • Has led UNC in rebounding in each of the last seven games and nine of the last 11 • Has 27 assists and only seven turnovers in the last nine games.

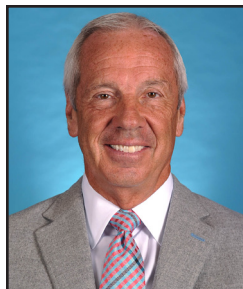
