#### PRIMETIME MATCHUP

When Miami traveled to Tennessee last season, the game was televised on ESPN2 and was the network's highest-rated women's game of the season.

#### NO SOPHOMORE SLUMP FOR WOODS

In her first game of the 2012-13 season, sophomore Michelle Woods hit five three-pointers on her way to a career-best 19 points. In the very next game, the guard from Naples, Fla., scored a new career-best of 20 points in a 69-63 win at Richmond.

#### **GETTING OFF ON THE RIGHT FOOT**

After their rout of UNF, the Hurricanes are 32-9 in season-opening games and are a combined 24-3 when they open the season at home, including a perfect 8-0 record when opening the season at the BankUnited Center.

#### MEIER ENTERS EIGHTH SEASON AT MIAMI

In 2012-13, head coach Katie Meier and her staff will begin their eighth year at the helm in Coral Gables. The Hurricanes advanced to the NCAA tournament second round for the second consecutive season, finishing second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with a 14-2 record. Overall, Miami finished with a 26-6 record, the third straight 20-win season for Meier.

#### **HITTING THE BOOKS**

Stefanie Yderstrom has been named to the ACC All-Academic Team each of the last two seasons. The senior is a sports administration major, has earned an overall 3.28 GPA and a was named to the dean's list last semester with a 3.66 GPA.

#### **RETURNING ALL-ACC PERFORMERS**

Miami returns two All-ACC players for the 2012-13 campaign. Sharp-shooting point guard Stefanie Yderstrom earned third-team conference honors last season, leading the ACC with 68 3-pointers. Morgan Stroman was well on her way to earning conference honors for the second consecutive season. However, midway through the season, the 2009 McDonald's All-American tore her Achilles tendon, ending her junior campaign. As a sophomore, the forward earned thirdteam honors. #### 1,000 POINT CLUB

With just 19 more points, Miami senior Morgan Stroman will be the 22nd Hurricane to score 1,000 points in her career. Riquna Williams and Shenise Johnson were the last two Canes to surpass the milestone.

#### NOT IN THIS HOUSE

The Hurricanes enter the season with the nation's second-longest home win streak. Only Stanford (80) has more consecutive home wins than Miami's 41 inside the BankUnited Center. Defending national champs Baylor also has 41 consecutive home wins. Kentucky and Ohio State are next in line with at 20 straight wins.

#### A PREMIER SCHEDULE

In addition to the always exciting ACC schedule, Miami will welcome two top-ranked programs to the BankUnited Center. On Nov. 18, the Canes will face Tennessee for the second consecutive season. Then on Nov. 29 Penn State will make a trip to Coral Gables as part of the ACC/Big Ten Women's Basketball Challenge.

#### THE NEWCOMERS

The Canes welcome freshmen Caprice Dennis (G, 5-9) from Detroit, Keyona Hayes (F, 6-1) from Marietta, Ga., and Macy Keen (C, 6-6) from nearby Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., to the 2012-13 squad.

In their debuts, Dennis finished the night with five points, three assists and two steals. Hayes had four points and Keen added three rebounds and a free throw.

#### **BIG INSIDE PRESENCE**

The Hurricanes saw their 6-6 center, Shawnice Wilson in action for the first time last season after she transferred from Pitt. The Pittsburgh native started to come into her own late in the season and against NC State (Feb. 16), she secured her first double-double with 17 points and 17 rebounds. It was the first win for the Canes at Reynolds Coliseum.

#### **BIG-TIME TEAM ON THE SMALL SCREEN**

The Jan. 6 meeting with Virginia will be the first of nine regular season games that will be televised this season.

#### STEPPING UP

Before Stroman's injury last season, Yderstrom averaged 9.1 points per game and scored in double figures in nine of 19 games. In the final 13 games of the season, the Swede scored in double digits nine times, twice setting her career high with 22 points vs. Virginia Tech, then 26 at No. 8 Maryland. The guard averaged 13.5 points and connected on 28 3-pointers.

#### FORMER STARS IN THE WNBA

In April, Miami's Shenise Johnson and Riquna Williams were selected by the San Antonio Silver Stars and the Tulsa Shock with the fifth and 17th picks, respectively, in the 2012 WNBA Draft. Johnson and Williams became the third and fourth players in Miami's history to be selected in the WNBA Draft. Williams was named to the 2012 WNBA All-Rookie Team.

#### CANES AGAIN ENTER THE SEASON IN THE POLLS

For the second consecutive season, the Hurricanes enter their year with a spot in each the AP and the ESPN/ USA Today Coaches polls. Miami was ranked No. 23 in the coaches and No. 24 in the AP according to the voters. UM is currently ranked 23rd in both polls.

#### HISTORIC DEFENSIVE EFFORT

The Hurricanes held UNF to just 24 points on 14 percent shooting in the season-opening 77-24 victory. The 24 points allowed in UM history against an NCAA opponent.

#### WELCOME BACK

In her first game on the court since an Achilles' tendon tear midway through the 2011-12 season, senior forward Morgan Stroman scored 17 points on 7-of-11 shooting and led her team with eight rebounds.

#### MIAMI STUDENT-ATHLETES SET GSR RECORD

The University of Miami recorded a department-wide school-record Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 93 percent, according to the rates released Oct. 25 by the NCAA.

As a department, Miami's 93 percent GSR ranks fourth among ACC schools and is eighth overall among FBS schools. Overall, the University of Miami athletic department has improved from 77 to 93 percent from 2005 to 2012, a year after UM student-athletes posted a then-record 89 percent GSR in 2011. UM has exceeded the NCAA average GSR in each of the last eight years.

Six UM teams compiled GSR marks of 100 percent; men's diving and golf posted its eighth consecutive perfect GSR mark, while women's tennis recorded its fifth straight GSR score of 100 percent. Also adding perfect GSR scorers were women's rowing, women's golf, women's swimming and volleyball.

The most recent Division I Graduation Success Rates are based on the four entering classes from 2002-2003 through 2005-06.

Head coach Katie Meier officially announced the program's signees on Nov. 15. The group. comprised of three high school standouts, is Adrienne Motley (Newport News, Va.), Nigia Greene (Atlanta, Ga.) and Jessica Thomas (Gainesville, Fla.). The trio will join the Hurricanes for the 2013-14 academic year.

Motley, a 5-9 guard from Woodside High School, has been ranked the No. 27 overall prospect and the seventh best point guard in the nation by ESPN HoopGurlz.

Greene is a four-star prospect according to ESPN HoopGurlz. She is ranked No. 41 overall, and the ninth-best guard in the nation.

Thomas is ranked the 48th best point guard in the nation by ESPN HoopGurlz. In 2011, the 5-6 guard led the Buchholz High School Bobcats to the semifinals of the Florida Girls State Basketball Playoffs. She is the younger sister of Hurricane legend Lamar Thomas

#### Head Coach Katie Meier

Katie Meier enters her eighth season as the head coach of the Hurricanes' women's basketball program in 2012-13. A well known and respected figure in women's basketball, Meier has worked tirelessly to put her mark on Miami's program and to build a winning tradition.

All of her hard work was rewarded after the 2010-11 season as she was named the Associated Press National Coach of the Year - sharing the award with Connecticut's Geno Auriemma and Stanford's Tara VanDerveer.

Meier led the Hurricanes into the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2004 and its win over Gardner-Webb in the first round was the first tournament win for the 'Canes since 1993. Miami entered the 2010-11 season with high internal expectations, but were picked eighth in the Preseason ACC Poll and were coming off a season in which it was the No. 12 seed in the ACC Tournament.

However, the Hurricanes exceeded all of the outside expectations and at one point, won 17 straight games. They were a perfect 20-0 inside the BankUnited Center and finished 12-2 in ACC play - earning their first regular season conference title since joining the league in 2004. As a reward, Meier was named the ACC Coach of the Year and later would be selected as the WBCA/RUSSELL ATHLETIC Region 2 Coach of the Year, as voted on by her peers.

Hired on April 19, 2005, then UM Athletics Director Paul Dee announced the appointment of Meier in front of national and local media, fans, alumni and support staff, signifying the beginning of a new era.

In her first season, Meier wasted little time in making the first steps towards those goals. After receiving little attention in the ACC preseason polls, the Hurricanes posted an impressive overall record of 17-13. After fighting through a conference that would send nine teams to the postseason, including three to the NCAA Final Four. Miami finished with a sixth-place, 6-8 record in ACC play en route to earning a berth into the second round of the 2006 Women's National Invitation Tournament.

Throughout the season Miami posted wins over ranked teams such as Mississippi (No. 25). Boston College (No. 21) and Virginia Tech (No. 25)-and nearly knocked off then-No. 1 Duke in double-overtime. The Hurrisanes also recorded wins over two eventual conference champions in Hartford (America East) and Oakland (Mid-Continent). Under her direction, standout Tamara James produced one of the greatest seasons ever seen by a UM player in 2005-O6, including becoming the University's all-time leading scorer before being taken as the No. 8 overall pick in the 2006 WNBA Draft by the Washington Mystics.

In Meier's second season in 2006-07, the Hurricanes got off to a strong start, winning seven of their first eight games-including a 79-70 win over Indiana to claim the UM Thanksgiving Tournament title. On Dec. 1, Meier picked up her 100th career victory as the Hurricanes defeated Jackson State, 77-50. However, with only eight healthy players to call upon by the start of the ACC schedule, Miami faced challenge after challenge competing in a league that ranked among the top-three strongest women's basketball conferences nationally and produced two of the NCAA Tournament's four No. 1 seeds in 2006-07.

Regardless, Renee Taylor emerged as the ACC's leading scorer-upholding Miami's streak of producing the league's leading scorer in all three years it had been a member. The All-ACC Second Team selection set school records in single-game scoring with 42 points at Houston and became the 19th Hurricane to score at least 1,000 points-and just the sixth to do so in her first two seasons. In addition, transfer Maurita Reid emerged as a defensive threat, tying the school record with 10 steals versus Wake Forest and finishing among the ACC's leaders and NCAA's top 10 in steals per game.

The 2007-08 season, Meier's third with the Hurricanes, saw Maurita Reid continue her rise among the ACC elite. The senior was nothing short of impressive shooting beyond the arc and picking opponent's pockets. She hit four or more three-pointers on 10 different occasions and finished the season with 110 steals, good for sectond in the conference and fifth in the NCAA. The Queens, N.Y. native led the team in points (15.3 ppg) and rebounding (5.6 rpg) and was also named the ACC All-Defensive Team.

With a No. 21 incoming recruiting class, Meier and the Hurricanes saw significant improvement during the 2008-09 season. The freshman class was highlighted by McDonald's All-American Shenise Johnson - out of Henrietta, N.Y. and Riquna Williams from nearby Pahokee, Fla.

Johnson lived up to the hype as she was the team leader on the season in points, rebounds, assists and steals. Under Meier's guidance, Johnson was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on three occasions and was named to the ACC All-Freshmen team as well as ACC Honorable Mention. The versatile guard/forward also led the U19 USA team to a gold medal finish in the 2009 World Championships in Bangkok, Thailand.

The 2009-10 season was one of the most successful in program history. Under Meier's vision, the Hurricanes advanced to the WNIT Championship game. Miami posted a 22-14 overall record - the first 20-win campaign since the 2002-03 season and just the eighth all-time.

In her sophomore season, Johnson was joined by a healthy Riquna Williams and the duo racked up accolades throughout the season. Johnson was named First Team All-ACC, while Williams garnered second-team honors. The tandem led Miami to a 5-1 WNIT record - the deepest postseason run in team history - with both earning all-tournament honors along the way.

Following the 2009-10 campaign, then University of Miami Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt announced that Meier signed a contract extension through 2015.

"We are excited about the tremendous progress our women's basketball team achieved this past season," said Hocutt. "Coach Meier continues to assemble a special group of talented young women at the University of Miami and we look forward to the future success of our program."

Miami's success proved to be immediate, as it earned a conference regular season title in 2010-11 and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in seven seasons.

Johnson and Williams proved to be the All-America candidates that they were expected to be. In fact, Johnson was named to four different All-America squads, including the prestigious WBCA/State Farm Coaches' All-America Team. She also earned AP, USBWA and Full Court Press honors and became the second player in program history to be named the conference player of the year (Frances Savage - BIG EAST - 1992). Johnson also garnered All-ACC Defensive Team honors for the second straight season and was named to the ACC Tournament Team. Williams, along with Johnson, was named First Team All-ACC and was the conference scoring champion, pouring in 21.7 points per game.

The duo combined for seven ACC Player of the Week accolades on the season as Williams took home the award on four occasions. No other team in the league was recognized more than twice for the weekly honor.

The season also saw the emergence of sophomore forward Morgan Stroman. The 6-1, 2009 McDonald's All-American matched Johnson for the team lead with 11 double-doubles on the season, as she scored 13.6 points and grabbed 8.2 rebounds per game. For her efforts she was named Third Team All-ACC.

Miami's success continued into the 2011-12 season. The Canes finished second in the conference standings with a record of 14-2 and were 26-6 overall. UM also defeated the eventual conference tournament champion - Maryland - both times they faced in the regular season.

Seniors Shenise Johnson and Riquna Williams continued to live up to the hype of them being one of the best backcourt duos in the nation, as they were second and third in the league in scoring and each were again named First Team All-ACC. The accolade was the third straight honor for Johnson and the second for Williams. Johnson was also named to the All-ACC Defensive Team for the third consecutive season. Johnson earned a place on five different All-America teams, including the WBCA squad for the second straight year. Williams eanred AP All-America Third Team recognition in her final collegiate campaign as well.

Unfortunately, Morgan Stroman suffered a season-ending injury midway through the conference schedule, leaving a seemingly insurmountable void in the lineup. However, junior guard Stefanie Yderstrom stepped up to the occasion. The native of Sweden ended the season with more three-pointers than any other player in the league as was rewarded with a Third Team AlI-ACC selection.

Miami once again advanced to the NCAA tournament as a No. 3 seed. The Canes traveled to Spokane, Wash. and defeated the No. 14 seed, Idaho State in the first round but fell to host Gonzaga in the second.

Though the departure of Williams, Johnson and Sylvia Bullock cannot be ignored, there is plenty of talent returning for the Canes for the 2012-13 season, including four players that have started a significant amount of games and AlI-ACC performers in Yderstrom and Stroman. Pepper Wilson, the 6-6 center, also entered her name into the fray of players that will look to gamer conference and even national recognition with her play late in the 2011-12 campaign.
