STORY LINES

- After capturing a series victory over No. 12 Clemson, the Miami Hurricanes will wrap up their five-game homestand Wednesday for the finale of a three-game season set with Florida Atlantic. First pitch for the series rubber match is set for 6 p.m.
- Boosted by their impressive series win over the Tigers, the Hurricanes are ranked No. 12 in the newest *WarrenNolan.com* Rating Percentage Index (RPI), while the team's 2013 schedule is currently ranked the second-toughest in the nation.
- In addition to its own impressive RPI rank, the Hurricanes have eight wins against teams rated in the top 20 RPI and 11 wins against teams ranked in the top 50 RPI - both important factors in postseason projections and consideration.
- In their final midweek game of the 2013 season, the Hurricanes will once again look to **Javi Salas** to wrap up the schedule in grand fashion. Salas, 2-0 in his last two midweek starts, has allowed just one earned run in his past 16 innings (0.56 ERA).
- Miami is 10-3 (.770) in midweek games in 2013. 12 of those 13 games have been played inside the confines of The Light.
- The Hurricanes own a 52-11 all-time series advantage over the Owls, including seven of the last 10 head-to-head matchups.
- Following its midweek contest with FAU, the Hurricanes will travel to Chestnut Hill, Mass., for an Atlantic Coast Conference series with Boston College. Miami will wrap up its non-conference schedule May 3-5 with a home series against St. John's.

Starting Pitcher Notes

- *Salas will be making his sixth consecutive start in the midweek role after opening 2013 on the weekend.*
- *The Coral Gables, Fla., native delivered Miami's second complete game of the season against Stetson (April 10), scattering seven hits in an 8-2 win.*
- *Salas ranks fourth on the team in strikeouts (33), fourth in ERA (3.14), tied for fourth in wins (four), and second in innings pitched (57.1). He also ranks No. 20 in the Atlantic Coast Conference in ERA.*

3 JIM MORRIS 2001, 1999 & 1994 COACH OF THE YEAR • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



In his 20th season at Miami, no other program nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 40 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 19 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

- Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 877-337-3 (.724) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,381-604-4 (.696) Division I record in 31+ years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 34 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,512-645-4 (.701) mark
- In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 19 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

- Jim Morris earned his 28th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2012 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host sites for the first round of the postseason. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 19 seasons (1994-2012), winning 15 of his last 19 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.
- Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2012 Hurricanes to their 40th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2012 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft: E.J. Encinosa, Eric Erickson, Steven Ewing, Peter O'Brien and Stephen Perez.

MORRIS IN 35th SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

- Morris currently has a 1,381-604-4 (.696) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,512-645-4 (.701) record over 30-plus years.
- Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.
- Morris entered 2013 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball history with 1,354 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division.
- Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.



JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 19 seasons and led the Canes to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

ENDING THE STAND...

- The Miami Hurricanes will wrap up their five-game homestand with a midweek match-up against FAU Wednesday, April 24. First pitch is set for 6 p.m. from The Light.
- After capturing its series with No. 12 Clemson this past weekend, Miami now boasts an impressive 21-9 (.700) mark at home in 2013, including a 9-3 (.750) record in midweek games.
- Miami will be looking to capture their second consecutive season series against the Owls, after sweeping them in 2012. The two teams split the first two games in 2013, each winning on the road.

BUILDING MOMENTUM...

- In the latest Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) calculations from *WarrenNolan.com* (April 23), Miami is ranked No. 12 in the nation. Additionally, the projection site ranks Miami with the second-toughest schedule of any team in Division I.
- The Hurricanes have eight wins against teams ranked in *WarrenNolan's* Top 20 RPI, and have 11 wins against Top 50 RPI teams.
- Miami's weekend set with No. 12 Clemson marked the team's fourth series against a ranked foe in the past five weeks of the regular season.

YOU'RE THE BEST AROUND...

- For his complete game shutout of No. 12 Clemson (April 21), sophomore Andrew Suarez was named ACC Pitcher of the Week.
- The southpaw went the distance for the first time in his career, scattering six hits across 9.0 innings while striking out five batters in the series-clinching victory.
- The complete game was the third this season for a Miami pitcher, while the Pitcher of the Week Award was the second in 2013 (Bryan Radziewski - March 25).

STARTING OFF STRONG...

- Sophomore Chris Diaz has impressed as Friday night starter, delivering a team-best eight quality starts in 10 chances this season. The Florida City, Fla., native ranks fourth in the ACC with an ERA of 1.70, and third in the conference with 68.2 innings pitched.
- Having surrendered just six earned runs all season, junior Bryan Radziewski boasts a team-best ERA of 1.13, good for second-best in the ACC. He has also recorded an eye-popping 65:14 strikeout-to-walk ratio through eight starts, while his 65 punchouts are the fourth-most in the conference. He has held opponents to a measly .148 batting average, the best mark of any pitcher in the ACC.
- Radziewski (1.29, second), Diaz (2.17, sixth) and Suarez (2.93, No. 11) all rank in the top 15 in ERA among ACC starters in conference competition this season.

CLOSING IT OUT...

- Senior Eric Nedeljkovic has been Miami's most reliable reliever out of the bullpen, and has allowed just two runs in 20.2 innings of work this season.
- Nedeljkovic recorded back-to-back saves in Miami's two wins against Maryland, setting the Terrapins offensive down in order to close out both games. He also recorded a save in Saturday's win over Clemson.
- The Folsom, Calif., native, who is tied for the most saves of any reliever in the conference (nine), has allowed only 14 hits in 19 appearances, and has a dominant 24:2 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

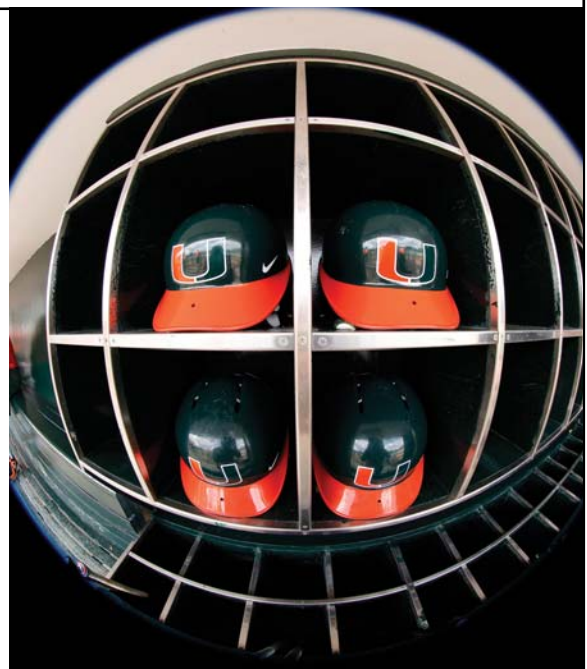
