After leading Miami to the 2013 NCAA Sweet 16 and winning the school's first ACC regular season and tournament championships, Larrañaga was honored as the AP, Naismith, USBWA Henry Iba, Adolph Rupp Cup and ACC Coach of the Year.

## THE COACH

Head coach Jim Larrañaga has a $585-388$ overall record in his 32 nd season as a head coach. He is $115-54$ in his fifth season at the University of Miami, with a $54-33$ mark in ACC play.

Miami's 15-consecutive weeks in the polls top the school record of 12 from 2001-02.
UM has been ranked in the AP's top 15 for 12 weeks this season, topping the previous school record of 10 in the 1959-60 season.
The Canes are ranked 12-or-better in the AP for the sixth time this season, 13th time under Coach L, 17th time since 1985-86 and 24th time since 1959-60.

## THE SERIES

Miami is $18-12$ in the all-time series against Virginia Tech, which dates back to the 2000-01 season. The Canes are 9-4 at home against the Hokies, 6-6 on the road and 3-2 at neutral sites. UM is 8-2 against VT under Coach L.

This season Miami defeated VT 65-49 on Feb. 17, its fifth-straight win over the Hokies. In that game, Angel Rodriguez notched 14 points, four assists and three steals, while Kamari Murphy grabbed 10 rebounds and scored six points.

## THE NOTE

Senior guard Sheldon McClellan is the second-most efficient offensive player in the country among players used in 20 percent of possessions, and 16th overall, according to KenPom.com on March 3. McClellan has posted the 13th-best shooting percentage (50.4\%) in the country among guards, and has the top shooting percentage among guards in the ACC, according to stats on NCAA.org on March 3. McClellan's 2-point shooting percentage is 57.3 percent this season.

## WITH A WIN...

With a victory over Virginia Tech, Miami would earn at least a share of the ACC Regular Season Championship. With a Miami win and a UNC loss to Duke, the Canes would win the championship outright.

## LARRANAGA BY THE NUMBERS

5 - Coach Jim Larrañaga is one of five ACC coaches with a Final Four appearance to his credit. In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the NCAA Final Four in 27 years.
$6-\ln 31$ years of coaching, Jim Larrañaga has a winning record in the NCAA Tournament, a 7-5 mark in six appearances.
7 - Larrañaga is no stranger to the ACC. In his seven seasons as an assistant coach at Virginia, the Cavaliers participated in the NCAA Final Four in 1981 and 1984, won three ACC Championships and finished in the Top 5 of the rankings.

10 - The 2015-16 marks the 10th anniversary of Larrañaga's Cinderella run to the 2006 NCAA Final Four with George Mason. Both associate head coach Chris Caputo and director of operations James Johnson were on that GMU staff.

15 - Larrañaga has made 15 postseason appearances in the past 26 years, including six NCAA tournaments.
32 - Larrañaga is in his 32nd year as a head coach and has successfully transitioned three institutions into successful programs: Miami, Bowling Green and George Mason.

500 - Coach L is one of five ACC coaches with 500 or more wins.

## LARRAÑAGA - WHY MIAMI?

Along with returning to the best basketball conference in the country, Coach L had a few personal reasons for accepting the head coaching job at Miami. Coach's grandfather was from Cuba, where he produced the Larrañaga [lare-en-YAH-ga] cigar. Coach's father was raised in Key West before moving to The Bronx, N.Y., getting married and raising six children. Coach L was raised in The Bronx, but vacationed to Florida as a boy. He also has owned a house in Sarasota - which he bought from Dick Vitale's daughter and three of his siblings have retired to Florida.

## EXCEEDING EXPECTATIONS

In the past four years, Coach Jim Larrañaga's Canes have exceeded preseason expectations every campaign. Larrañaga is the only coach in the ACC to finish above the preseason poll predictions every season, and has the largest margin of surpassing those expectations.

## MIAMI POSTS 20-WIN SEASON

Coach Jim Larrañaga has posted his fourth 20 -win season in five years at The U , and his 10th career 20 -win season. This is Miami's seventh 20 -win season since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 campaign. Larrañaga is just the second coach in Miami history with four 20 -win seasons, joining Bruce Hale (1954-67).

## THIRTEEN ACC WINS FOR THE SECOND TIME UNDER COACH L

Miami has won 13 games in ACC play for just the second time in school history, along with 15 wins in 2012-13. In five seasons under Larrañaga, the Canes have won seven-or-more ACC games each season. Prior to the arrival of Coach L, Miami had never won 10 ACC games in a season.

## MIAMI AS A RANKED TEAM

Miami is one of seven schools in the country to win at least five games over top 25 teams this season: 8-Kansas; 7-Oklahoma, 6-Xavier, Texas; 5-Miami, Virginia, Wisconsin. Miami is one of five schools to start the season unranked and defeat at least two top 15 teams: 5-Texas; 3-lowa, Texas A\&M, Xavier; 2-Miami.

## TIED FOR MOST REGULAR-SEASON WINS

Miami is 24-5 this season, tied with the 24-6 record in 2012-13, for the most regular-season wins in Hurricanes history. In Larrañaga's five seasons, the Canes have the following records in the regular season: 2015-16: 24-5, 2014-15: 20-11, 2013-14: 16-15, 2012-13: 24-6, 2011:12: 18-11.

## JEKIRI A CANDIDATE FOR ACC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

"If Tonye Jekiri is not the ACC Defensive Player of the Year, I don't know who is. I don't know where we would even be without him. We wouldn't be one of those six teams vying for the regularseason title. We'd be at the bottom of this league. It is really hard to put a number on how much he impacts the game." - Coach Jim Larrañaga

## BEST FG SHOOTING PERCENTAGE IN 27 YEARS

The Canes are hitting 47.4 percent (759-1602) from the field, the best in Miami's history since the 1988-89 season when UM was hitting 49.2 percent (1024-2083) of its shots. Miami's 75.3 percent at the line is the best since 77.1 percent in 2001-02.

## McCLELLAN SECOND-MOST EFFICIENT PLAYER IN THE NATION

Sheldon McClellan is the second-most efficient offensive player in the nation, among players with 20 percent-or-more possessions used, according to KenPom.com. He is also the most efficient player in the ACC overall, and No . 16 in the nation. MCClellan is 11th in the ACC in 2-point field goal percentage (55.8), sixth in true shooting percentage (62.6) and seventh in free throw percentage (84.8). He is also fifth in the ACC in turnover rate (9.9).

## CANES 20TH IN NATION IN FT PERCENTAGE

Miami ranks 20th in the nation in free throw percentage, connecting on 481-of-639 (75.3\%) shots at the free throw line. UM averages 16.6 points per game at the line, and has posted a +10.2 scoring margin overall this season. The Canes have drawn 556 fouls, while committing only 469, which ranks UM No. 12 in the country in fewest fouls. Opponents have just 456 attempts at the charity stripe.

## NEWTON BEST SIXTH MAN IN THE COUNTRY

Dick Vitale has lauded Miami sophomore Ja'Quan Newton as the "best sixth man in the country." Newton has immensely improved his stats from last year, and has scored in double digits 18 times this season.

In the Canes' four losses he has put up 6.8 points and 1.3 assists per outing, knocking down 26.5 percent of his shots.

## REED NAMED TO ALL-ACC ACADEMIC TEAM

Davon Reed was named to the 2015-16 All-Atlantic Coast Conference Academic Men's Basketball team. The junior from Ewing, N.J., is majoring in sports administration.

## TONYE JEKIRI EYEING MIAMI'S REBOUNDING RECORDS

Senior center Tonye Jekiri has 869 rebounds in 133 career games at The U , good enough for fourth on the all-time rebounding list. Harry Manushaw is third with 914 career boards.

## McCLELLAN TOPS 1,000 POINTS AT MIAMI

Sheldon McClellan has tallied 1,003 points in 67 games at Miami. Added to his 843 points at Texas, he is also closing in on 2,000 career points.

## THE LAST TIME OUT AGAINST VIRGINIA TECH

Feb. 17, 2016 -- No. 11 Miami overcame a seven-point first-half deficit and held Virginia Tech to a season-low 29.6 percent shooting in the Hurricanes' $65-49$ victory. A 14-2 surge to start the second half put the Hurricanes ahead 35-24. Virginia Tech went without a field goal for the first seven minutes of the half and finished 16 for 54 . Angel Rodriguez scored 14 points for the Hurricanes (21-4, 10-3 Atlantic Coast Conference), who will take a five-game winning streak into its toughest stretch of the season. Miami plays four consecutive games against ranked teams beginning Saturday at No. 5 North Carolina. Virginia Tech (13-13, 5-8) lost to Miami for the fifth time in a row. For the second game in a row, the Hokies had their worst shooting game of the season. Their point total tied a season low. They were outscored 44-27 in the second half. Sheldon McClellan, Miami's leading scorer this season, played only 24 minutes because of foul trouble. His first field goal came more than three minutes into the second half, and he finished with 11 points. Tech's leading scorers this season, Zach LeDay and Seth Allen, also had foul problems. LeDay scored six points and Allen five, and they shot a combined 3 for 15. Reserve Justin Robinson scored 12 points for the Hokies. Hurricanes reserve guard Ja'Quan Newton missed the game because of an unspecified medical condition. He was under the care of team doctors, a school official said. Miami shot 30 percent in the first half but trailed only 22-21 because Tech shot 29 percent. The Hurricanes scored on the first shot of the second half to take the lead for good.

## JEKIRI ON THE BOARDS

In 133 games at Miami senior Tonye Jekiri has grabbed 869 rebounds, fourth-most in Miami history. He has improved his rebounds per game from 1.6 as a rookie to 9.2 as a senior. He also has grabbed double-digit rebounds in 37 games over the past two seasons ( 66 games played), after doing so just three times in his first 67 outings.

Junior guard Davon Reed shot 73.3 percent (11-15) from the field, 80.0 percent ( $8-10$ ) from three and 88.9 percent ( $8-9$ ) at the line in Miami's two wins over top 15 teams last week. He averaged 19.0 points and 3.5 rebounds in 33.0 minutes per outing. Reed scored a career-high 21 points against No. 3 Virginia on ESPN's Big Monday, while matching up defensively against Malcolm Brogdon. Reed was 6-8 from the field and 5-6 from three against the Cavaliers. He also hit all four of his shots at the line and grabbed three rebounds in 31 minutes. In the Canes' win over №. 11 Louisville, Reed was 5-7 from the field and 3-4 from long range, while knocking down 4-5 at the line, for 17 points. He also grabbed four rebounds and tallied an assist, a block and a steal in 35 minutes.

## BACK-TO-BACK VICTORIES OVER TOP 15 TEAMS

With wins over No. 3 Virginia and No. 11 Louisville, Miami has earned consecutive wins over top 15 opponents for the first time in school history. The Canes have defeated top 25 teams consecutively twice: Nov. 20, 2015 - No. 16 Utah and Nov. 22, 2015 - No. 22/20 Butler, and Jan. 7, 2006-14/12 Maryland and Jan. 14, 2006-No. 20 at North Carolina.

Since the arrival of Coach L in 2011-12, the Canes have won at least two games over ranked teams in all but one season (2013-14). Miami has five wins over ranked teams this season, topping the previous high of four, in 2006-07 and 1998-99.
This is also the second-straight year and the fourth time in Coach L's five seasons that the Canes have defeated two top 15 teams. 2015-16: No. 3 Virginia, No. 11 Louisville. 2014-15: No. 8/7 Florida, No. 4 Duke.

## CANES HAVE HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

With the BankUnited Center sold out for every game this season, the Canes were 15-1 overall and 9-0 in ACC play this year at home. The 15 wins are the most in school history, topping 14 in 2012-13, $2011-12$ and 2007-08. The Hurricanes posted a 13 -game home winning streak which is tied with the 2012-13 season for the second longest in school history, trailing only the 15-game streak between Dec. 15, 1964 and Dec. 1, 1965.

Miami and Virginia (8-0) are the only two ACC schools with perfect conference records at home this season. UVa still has one home game to play, against Louisville on March 5 .

## THE U AGAINST RANKED TEAMS

In seven games against ranked teams, Miami is 5-2 with wins over No. 3 Virginia, No. 11 Louisville, No. 16 Utah, No. 20/22 Butler and No. 24/20 Duke, and losses to No. 13/11 Virginia and No. 5/4 North Carolina. In those games, Sheldon McClellan averages 14.7 points per game, hitting 49.2 percent from the field. Angel Rodriguez averages 13.7 points and 4.6 assists while Tonye Jekiri records 9.6 points and 8.4 rebounds per game. Complete stats against ranked teams are on page eight.

## MIAMI AND ACC TEAMS IN KENPOM RANKINGS

As of March 3, Miami is one of four ACC teams that rank in the KenPom top 10. Seven ACC teams are in the KenPom top 50.

Five ACC teams are in the top 12 of KenPom.com's offensive efficiency ratings. Three ACC teams are in the top 35 of KenPom.com's defensive efficiency ratings.

The Canes are one of 12 teams in the country to rank in the top 35 in both offensive and defensive efficiency.

## MCCLELLAN AND JEKIRI ON NATIONAL AWARD WATCH LISTS

Senior Sheldon McClellan is currently on three national player of the year watch lists: Naismith Trophy Men's College Player of the Year, Oscar Robertson Trophy for Men's National Player of the Year and Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award.

Senior Tonye Jekiri is one of 11 college basketball players selected as semifinalists for the sixth Eddie Sutton Tustenugee Award. The award singles out a player who exhibits the traits of tenacity and unselfishness that Sutton advocated during his 36 -year career.

## DEWAN HUELL NAMED 2016 MCDONALD'S ALL-AMERICAN

Miami signee Dewan Huell has been named a 2016 McDonald's All-American, as announced on ESPNU Jan. 17. Huell will become the fourth McDonald's All-American to play at Miami, joining Darius Rice (2000 McDonald's All-American), Steve Edwards (1992) and Tito Horford (1985). Since the inception of the McDonald's All American Game in 1977, only 38 players have hailed from the state of Florida, 11 of which were from 'The State of Miami' - Broward, Dade and Palm Beach counties. Just six of those players have been from Dade County, the most recent before Huell being Corey Louis in 1994.

## BODY CHANGES FOR CRUZ UCEDA AND JEKIRI

Seniors Ivan Cruz Uceda and Tonye Jekiri spent the summer in the weight room. Cruz Uceda dropped 20 pounds from 237 to 217, and his body fat has slimmed down from 24 percent to nine percent in just a year in Miami. Jekiri added 20 pounds to his 7 -foot frame, now weighing 250 pounds.

## COACH L TIES TO THE ACC

Coach Jim Larrañaga was an assistant coach at Virginia from 1979-1986, under the leadership of Terry Holland. In those seven seasons, Larrañaga helped the Cavaliers to five NCAA appearances: Final Four twice, Elite Eight once, Sweet 16 once and Round of 64 once, as well as two NIT appearances, including the Championship and Quarterfinal round.

## MIAMI'S STARTERS SHOW EXPERIENCE

Miami starts two redshirt seniors, one true senior, a redshirt junior and a true junior. Those players combine for 389 starts and 577 games played. Sheldon McClellan has started 90 games playing in 135 , Tonye Jekiri has 82 starts in 133 games, Angel Rodriguez is at 98/126, Davon Reed 60/92 and Kamari Murphy 59/92.

Those five players have been on a Division I team a combined 21 seasons, as McClellan and Rodriguez are both in their fifth year on the court, Jekiri and Murphy are each in their fourth season, and Reed is a true junior. The average age of that starting five is 21.8 years old: Rodriguez - 23; McClellan-23; Murphy - 22; Jekiri - 21; Reed - 20.

- is one of two Miami coaches to post three 20 -win seasons. Larrañaga has recorded three 20 -win seasons in four years at Miami.
.647 winning percentage is the best mark since Bruce Hale posted a .663 mark from 1955-67, including three seasons led by Rick Barry.
- has led the Canes to 41 ACC wins in just four seasons. Miami won 43 ACC games the previous seven seasons.

Under Coach L, Miami has posted three of the Canes' top five finishes in ACC play, including the 2013 championship, tied for fourth in 2012 and tied for sixth in 2015. In 2008, Miami tied for fifth in league play, and in 2005, tied for sixth.

- In four seasons under Coach L, Miami has tallied six wins in the ACC Tournament. In the previous seven seasons, Miami went 6-7.

In two NIT appearances under Coach L, Miami is 5-2 for a .714 winning percentage. In Miami's other 10 NIT appearances combined, the Canes went 6-10 for a .375 winning percentage.

## DID YOU KNOW ...

Coach L became the first Miami coach to win 20+ games in his first two seasons at UM and only the third of 12 UM coaches to post three 20-win seasons.

Former Cane Rick Barry was named one of the Greatest Players in NBA History.

Miami native and former Cane James Jones won the 2010-2011 NBA All-Star Weekend 3-Point Contest and the NBA Championship in the 2011-2012 and 2012-13 seasons.

Six-time NBA All Star Amar'e Stoudemire enrolled at UM in 2013 and took classes to earn his bachelor's degree.

UM is in its 12 th season in the ACC.
Coach L led the George Mason Patriots to the 2006 Final Four with big wins over some of basketball's elite teams such as Michigan State, UNC and UConn. He was the first coach to take a mid-major to a Final Four in 27 years (Penn '79) when his team advanced in 2006.

In 14 years at George Mason, Larrañaga led the Patriots to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999), including the 2006 Final Four.

Miami basketball received APR (Academic Progress Rate) Public Recognition Awards for being among the top 10 percent in APR in its sport. Miami ranks in the top 10 percent NCAA men's basketball with a 990 APR.

The Miami Department of Athletics recorded a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 89 percent. Miami's department-wide GSR is 16 th overall among FBS programs. UM has exceeded the NCAA average GSR in each of the last 10 years.

The Canes have averaged 20.0 wins over the last 11 seasons.
The Hurricanes have made at least one trey in 932 of 938 games since the NCAA adopted the 3-point shot in 1986. The last time Miami was held without a 3-pointer was Feb. 26, 2014 at Virginia.

Miami has held 791 of its last 792 opponents to less than 100 points. North Carolina was the last team to score 100+, defeating UM 105-64 on Jan. 31, 2007.

## MIAMI BASKETBALL - THE EARLY YEARS

The University of Miami basketball program was dormant for 14 years from 1971-1985. In 1983 Director of Athletics Sam Jankovich announced the resurrection of men's basketball at Miami, with the reinstatement vote by the UM Board of Trustees on Oct. 12, 1983. Head coach Bill Foster was hired March 21, 1984, adding assistants Clint Bryant, Seth Greenberg and Cesar Odio by July 1. Tim Harvey was the staff's first recruit, a 6-10, 240-pound center from Plainfield, N.J., who transferred from Georgia Tech. On 0ct. 15, 1984 the first men's basketball practice in 12 years was held on the patio in the center of campus, viewed by more than 200 students. Miami defeated The Citadel, 85-77, on Nov. 22, 1985, in the first game of the new era of UM basketball.

## HOMECOMING FOR RODRIGUEZ, EARNS MVP

Senior guard Angel Rodriguez was named the Puerto Rico TipOff Most Valuable Player. He averaged 13.7 points and 4.0 assists, including 19 points in the championship game. The native of Cupey, P.R., just 20 minutes from San Juan, was greeted by friends and family at each game.

## FOUR PLAYERS BOAST NCAA TOURNAMENT EXPERIENCE

Senior Tonye Jekiri returns from Miami's 2012-13 ACC Championship and NCAA Sweet 16 team. Sheldon MCClellan (Texas), Kamari Murphy (Oklahoma State) and Angel Rodriguez (Kansas State) also have played in the NCAA Tournament, each with their previous schools.

## LARRANAGA CONTRACT EXTENDED THROUGH 2022

The University of Miami extended Coach Jim Larrañaga's contract through May 31, 2022, Director of Athletics Blake James announced in September 2014. Larrañaga first signed a five-year contract in April 2011, then was granted a three-year extension in 2012.

## MIAMI PREDICTED TO FINISH FIFTH IN ACC

Miami was predicted to finish fifth out of 15 teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season, as announced by the league during Operation ACC Basketball in Charlotte, N.C., Oct. 28. North Carolina was picked to win the league, followed by Virginia, Duke and Notre Dame.

In 2012-13, the Canes were picked to finish fifth, then won the league's regular season and tournament championship. In all four of Larrañaga's seasons at Miami, the Canes have finished the season better than predicted at ACC media day.

## CANES SIGN TOP 10 RECRUITING CLASS

The 2016 recruiting class of Dewan Huell, Bruce Brown and Rodney Miller is being named a top-10 recruiting class in the country, with 247Sports ranking the class No. 7, Scout at No. 8, ESPN at №. 9 and Rivals at No. 10. The 2016 class rankings top Miami's best mark from 2005, when the Canes signed four four-star recruits - Jimmy Graham, Brian Asbury, Adrian Thomas and Denis Clemente - in a class that was ranked No. 12 in the nation by Scout. In 2009, Miami's signing class was nationally ranked No. 19 by Scout and No. 24 by ESPN. That Hurricanes' heralded 2009 class was comprised of ESPNU 100 picks Durand Scott, Garrius Adams and Donnavan Kirk, in addition to May signee Antoine Allen. Since 2002, Miami has signed 16 Scout.com top 100 players, including three five-star, top-25 players in DeQuan Jones (22, 2008), Huell (25) and Durand Scott $(25,2009)$. Since Larrañaga's arrival, his staff has signed five top-100 players in Huell (25), Brown (44), Ja'Quan Newton (52, 2014), Rodney Miller (90) and James Palmer $(98,2014)$. Huell is the most lauded signee for Miami since Scott in 2009, Jones in 2008, No. 32 Guillermo Diaz in 2003 and McDonald's All-American Darius Rice in 2000.

## MIAMI LANDS HUELL, BROWN AND MILLER

The Miami men's basketball team landed a pair of top30 players in Dewan Huell and Bruce Brown, and top 100 player Rodney Miller.

With the addition of these three players, Miami would have six top 100 players next season: Huell (25), Brown (44), Ja'Quan Newton (52), Miller (90), James Palmer (98).

Huell, at 6-10 and 218 pounds, is a five-star, top25 power forward from Miami Norland High School.

Nationally, he is ranked the No. 21 player by ESPN, No. 23 by Rivals and No. 25 by Scout. ESPN and Scout rank him fifth at his position, and Scout says he's the top player in the state of Florida, while ESPN and Rivals have him second in the state. Brown, from Wakefield, Mass., is a four-star shooting guard at Vermont Academy in Saxton's River, Vt. At 6-4 and 205 pounds, Brown is ranked No. 30 by ESPN, No. 44 per Scout and No. 49 by Rivals. Miller is a 6 -foot-11-inch, 245-pound center playing prep ball at Oak Hill Academy in Virginia. A native of Laurelton, N.Y., Miller is a consensus four-star recruit, ranked No. 90 overall by Scout.com and No. 114 by Rivals.com. As a center, he is ranked No. 17 by Scout.com and No. 15 by ESPN.

## COACHING COORDINATORS FOR MIAMI

Miami's assistant coaching staff is set up in a coordinator system, with Jamal Brunt as the offensive coordinator, Chris Caputo manning the defense and Adam Fisher handling the scout for every opponent. James Johnson is the Dean of Discipline.

## LARRAÑAGA AMONG THE BEST IN COLLEGE BASKETBALL

Entering the 2015-16 season, Coach Larrañaga was tied for 12th on the list of Winningest Active Coaches at Major Schools and is tied for 57th on the NCAA's list of All-Time Winningest Coaches. See page 10 of the notes for a complete listing.

## ACC LEGEND - JOHN SALMONS

The ACC and Miami Director of Athletics Blake James are proud to announce Miami's John Salmons as a member of the 2016 ACC Men's Basketball Legends Class. Salmons was a two-time All-BIG EAST player, and was a 2002 NABC All-District 6 player for the Canes. He also won the 2002 BIG EAST Sportsmanship Award. From 1998 to 2002, Salmons played in four-straight postseason tournaments, including three NCAA Tournament appearances. Salmons is listed No. 19 on the all-time scoring list at Miami, and is third in career assists, third in steals and tied for fifth in games started.

## COACH L REUNITED WITH JAMES JOHNSON

James Johnson is the team's director of basketball operations. Johnson, who was on Larrañaga's staff for two seasons at George Mason University, including the historic NCAA Final Four run in 2006, came to Miami after seven seasons on staff at fellow ACC school Virginia Tech, where he was the head coach for two seasons after five years as an assistant coach.
