

- No. 17 Miami will play a midweek home-and-home with nearby FIU from March 7-8, with Game 1 set in Coral Gables.
- Miami leads the all-time series with the Panthers by a 92-24 margin; the most recent meeting between the two teams
- came in the 2015 NCAA Coral Gables Regional, when the Hurricanes won 6-2. UM has won eight of the last nine games. The first 2017 game between the Canes and Panthers was slated for Wed., Feb. 22 at FIU, but was postponed due to rain.
- . Miami is ranked in the top 25 of two major college baseball polls; UM checks in at No. 17 in the USA TODAY Coaches
- Poll and No. 21 by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. Miami was ranked in four major preseason polls entering 2017. •
- Miami finished last week 2-2, winning its midweek on the road at FAU (5-2) but dropping two of three to Dartmouth.
- The Hurricanes made their 25th trip to the College World Series in 2016, finishing with 50-14 and a 21-9 record in ACC. Head coach Jim Morris has the fifth-most wins in Division I history (1,539), the third-most wins among active coaches, a
- .698 winning percentage (sixth among active coaches), and 194 more wins than the next active coach (Mike Fox, UNC).
- The Hurricanes had four different players earn Preseason All-America recognition; Michael Mediavilla, Jesse Lepore and
- Johnny Ruiz were recognized by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper while Carl Chester was honored by Baseball America. The Canes had seven players selected in the 2016 MLB Draft, including Chicago White Sox' first-round pick Zack Collins.

THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

1999 & 2001 National Coach of the Year (*Collegiate Baseball*) 1999 & 2001 National Coach of the year (*ABCA*) 1994 Coach of the Year (*Baseball America*) 2008 ACC Coach of the Year

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans, University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams entering his 24th season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in 2008, 2014 and 2016.

In his first 23 seasons at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 44 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 13 of Morris' 23 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2016, when Miami was awarded the No. 3 national seed for the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 17 of 23 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13 straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 32 years - all 23 at Miami and his final nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 1,035-425-3 (.710) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,539-669-4 (.697) Division I record in 35 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 39 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,670-710-4 (.702) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 23 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in 2016, as he led the program to its 25th College World Series appearance in history, its third straight ACC Coastal Division title and the program's second ACC Regular Season Championship in a three-year span.

Morris became just the sixth coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500-win plateau when Miami topped Louisville 8-4 in dramatic fashion on March 18, 2016. Eight days later, Miami topped Clemson 5-4 in 11 innings - also in walk-off fashion - to send Morris to his 1,000th win at the helm of the Hurricanes.

Under his direction, the Hurricanes set the program record for fielding percentage with a sparkling .983 mark in 2016, a figure that ranked best nationwide. Seven Hurricanes were selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, including the program's first first-round selection since 2010 in catcher Zack Collins (No. 10, Chicago White Sox). Morris also helped guide two Hurricanes to a pair of major awards: Collins became the first Hurricane to win the Johnny Bench Award as the nation's top collegiate catcher in 2016, while Bryan Garcia set the program saves record and became the first Hurricane to win the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award.

Morris entered 2015 as among the winningest active coaches in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole



possession of eighth place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers and then seventh place with a 9-5 win over Louisville on March 7 (1,445).

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that have gone on to play in the Major Leagues are Peter O'Brien (Kansas City), Chris Hermann (Arizona), Yasmani Grandal (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jemile Weeks (Boston), Danny Valencia (Oakland), Jon Jay (Chicago), Yonder Alonso (Oakland), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Pat Burrell (Philadelphia), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston), among many others. From his days at Georgia Tech include Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles), Jay Payton (Oakland) and Jason Varitek (Boston).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the international scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta.

CANES SET FOR HOME-AND-HOME WITH FIU

• The No. 17 Miami Hurricanes will play a **home-and-home** with crosstown foe FIU on **Tuesday, March 7** at Mark Light Field (6 p.m.) and Wednesday, March 8 at FIU Baseball Stadium (7 p.m.).

 The first scheduled game between the two teams for 2017, slated for Wednesday, Feb. 22 at FIU, was postponed due to rain.

• The matchup is the **first** between the two schools in the regular season since 2008; Miami topped the Panthers 6-2 in an NCAA Coral Gables Regional matchup at Mark Light Field in 2015.

 Miami carries a commanding 92-24 all-time series lead. including a 60-16 record at Mark Light Field and a 26-7 advantage in games played on the road. Freshman Greg Veliz (0-0) will make his second start in Game 1, and fellow freshman Evan McKendry (1-0) will make the first college start of his career in Game 2.

LAST WEEK: MIAMI FINISHES 2-2, TOPS FAU

• Miami captured a come-from-behind 5-2 victory on Wednesday, March 1 in its first of three games against nearby FAU in Boca Raton.

• Trailing 2-1 in the seventh, Miami used a **four-run rally** to take a lead it would not relinguish. James Davison's go-ahead drag bunt single put the Hurricanes up 3-2, and a two-RBI single from Johnny Ruiz made it 5-2.

• The Hurricanes dropped two of three games to visiting Dartmouth from March 3-5; Miami fell in Game 1 (0-1) and Game 3 (0-5) but won Game 2 (3-2).

• Junior righthander Jesse Lepore went a career-long 8.0 innings in Friday's 1-0 loss, the team's second straight series-opening loss by the same scoreline. A walk-off balk in the ninth inning of Game 2 gave Miami a 3-2 come-from-behind victory. Mlami lost 5-0 in Game 3.

LEPORE IMPRESSING AS WEEKEND STARTER

• After spending the 2016 season as the midweek starter, junior righthander Jesse Lepore has been impressive as Miami's Friday night starter in 2017.

 Despite picking up 1-0 losses in back-to-back weekends against No. 2 Florida (2/24) and Dartmouth (3/3), Lepore has pitched three straight quality starts to begin his 2017 season.

 Lepore went a career-long 8.0 innings in his most recent start against the Big Green. He has gone at least six innings in all three starts and his 0.90 ERA is fifth-best in the ACC.

• The Beverly Hills, Fla., native went 9-0 for the Hurricanes in 2016 as the team's midweek starter, compiling a 2.20 ERA. His career record on the hill is 10-2.

HIGH EXPECTATIONS

• Miami was ranked in the **top 25 in preseason polls** from three major college baseball outlets, including a No. 8 ranking from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper, No. 17 the USA Today Coaches Poll and a No. 21 ranking from D1Baseball.

• The Hurricanes have won three straight ACC Coastal

Division titles and have won the ACC Regular Season Championship in two of the past three seasons (2014, 2016).

• Miami had four players earn **Preseason All-America** distinction: Carl Chester, Jesse Lepore Michael Mediavilla and Johnny Ruiz.

DESTINATION: OMAHA

 Miami made its second straight trip to the College World Series in **2016**, marking the program's 25th all-time trip to Omaha, Neb.

 Miami's 25 College World Series trips are the second-most of any program in the country. The Hurricanes have won 48 games in the College World Series, the **fourth-most** of any program; Miami's four national championships rank fifth-most.

 Since the NCAA began award national seeds prior to 1999, Miami has been among the top eight seven seasons: 1999 (#1), 2001 (#2). 2003 (#8), 2004 (#3), 2008 (#1), 2015 (#5) and 2016 (#3).

LOOKING FOR A FOUR-PEAT

 Miami won its third straight ACC Coastal Division title in 2016, posting a **21-7 record in ACC play** to earn the division crown.

• The Hurricanes have won 67 ACC games over the past three seasons - the most wins in a three-year stretch by any program since ACC expanded to a 30-game conference schedule in 2005.

 Miami has won the ACC Regular Season Championship three times, most recently in 2016 when the Canes finished 21-7; UM won the ACC regular season crown & ACC Tournament in 2008.

ONE OF THE GAME'S TOP SKIPPERS

• Jim Morris' 1,539 wins at the Division I level are fifth-most in the history of college baseball and third-most among active skippers.

 Morris reached two major milestones in 2016 - he became the fifth coach to reach 1,500 wins on March 18 against Louisville and won his 1,000th game at Miami on March 26 vs. Clemson.

WELCOME TO THE LIGHT!

• Miami has made College World Series trips in back-to-back seasons (2015 and 2016) thanks in large part to its **dominant play** inside the confines of Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field.
