THE GAME

- . Coming off their bye week, the Miami Hurricanes continue their month of October with a trip to Chestnut Hill, Mass., for a game with Atlantic Division foe Boston College. Kickoff for the matchup - the first between the two teams since 2012 - is set for 7 p.m. from Alumni Stadium.
- The game will be broadcast on ESPN with Sean McDonough (play by play), Todd Blackledge (analyst) & Holly Rowe (sidelines) on the call. Joe Zagacki (play by play) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the 560 WQAM radio booth for their 17th season together, while Josh Darrow will handle the sideline duty. Jose "Chamby" Campos (pxp) and Joe Martinez (color) will carry the game on 990AM ESPN Deportes from Chestnut Hill.

THE SERIES

- Miami carries a dominant 24-5 lead in the all-time series between the two schools, who were also foes in the BIG EAST Conference before the ACC.
- The Hurricanes lead the all-time series 8-3 in the 11 matchups in Chestnut Hill the last coming in 2012, a 41-32 win in that year's season opener.
- UM has won 18 of the last 21 matchups against Boston College, including a stretch of 15 straight wins from the 1985 through the 2006 seasons.

THE HURRICANES

- Mlami dropped its first game in more than a month last time out, falling to Virginia, 13-16, on Oct. 13 at Scott Stadium in Charlottesville, Va.
- The Cavaliers totaled just 231 yards, but took advantage of some Miami miscues and held on for the victory its first over the Hurricanes since 2014.
- Despite the loss, the Canes remain ranked among the nation's best statistical teams in multiple categories, including several on the defensive side.
- After another dominant performance by its defense vs. the Cavaliers, Miami is ranked No. 2 nationally in total defense at 237.0 yards per game.
- The Canes are ranked No. 3 in opponent vards per play the most important metric when measuring defense in 2018 and are also ranked No. 1 in team tackles for loss (11.6 per game), No. 3 in team sacks (3.57 per game), No. 7 in turnovers gained (17) and No. 1 in third down defense (20.8%). • Among UM's top defensive performers against UVa were DB Trajan Bandy (two interceptions), DB Jaquan Johnson (12 total tackles) and LB
- Michael Pinckney (career-high 12 tackles). RB Travis Homer (career-long 70-yard rush) and WR Lawrence Cager (58 yards) paced the offense.
- Miami returned 14 starters and 44 letterwinners from a 2017 team that won 10 games (10-3) for the first time since 2003 and advanced to the ACC Championship Game for the first time ever. The Hurricanes ended the year in the Capital One Orange Bowl for the first time since 2003.
- Miami's seven wins in ACC play (7-1) in 2017 were the most in program history, as the Hurricanes captured the ACC's Coastal Division title for the first time. Mark Richt was named ACC Coach of the Year in a year where UM finished with a perfect 7-0 home record during the regular season.

THE OPPONENT

- Boston College is under the direction of sixth-year head coach Steve Addazio, who has compiled a 36-35 career record as coach in Chestnut Hill.
 - Like the Hurricanes, the Eagles enter Friday coming off a bye week. They are off to a 5-2 start and topped Louisville, 38-20, last time on Oct. 13
- The Eagles' offense is led by RB AJ Dillon (652 rushing yards, 6 TDs), QB Anthony Brown (1,238 yards, 14 passing TDs) and WR Kobay White (281 yards, 3 TDs). Defensively, BC is led by LB Connor Strachan (54 total tackles), DE Zach Allen (4.5 sacks) and DB Hamp Cheevers (four interceptions).

QUICH HITS

UM LOOKS TO REBOUND, FACES EAGLES

• The Miami Hurricanes continue their month of October with a trip to Chestnut Hill, Mass., and a matchup with Boston College on Fri., Oct. 26 at Alumni Stadium. • The Hurricanes are looking to rebound from a 16-13 loss at Virginia last time out on Oct. 13. Both Miami and BC are coming off bye weeks heading into the matchup.

• The Hurricanes have not played Boston College since opening their 2012 season in Chestnut Hill on Sept. 1, 2012, a 41-32 win in Duke Johnson's collegiate debut - a 135yard, two-touchdown rushing performance.

Miami carries an eye-popping 24-5 alltime series lead against Boston College, and has won 18 of the last 21 matchups against the Eagles dating to 1976.

CANES D AMONG NATION'S ELITE

• Miami's defense continues to shine under third-year defensive coordinator Manny Diaz, who has shaped the Hurricanes' unit into one of the nation's elite during his tenure.

• The Hurricanes defense ranks among the nation's best in several categories. including No. 2 in total defense. No. 1 in third down conversion percentage (20.8%) and No. 1 in tackles for loss per game (11.6).

• The Canes are ranked second nationally in passing yards allowed (130.9), No. 12 nationally in rushing defense (106.1) and seventh nationally in turnovers gained (17).

. Gerald Willis III (13.0) and Jonathan Garvin (13.0) are two of only nine FBS players with more than 13 tackles for loss

WILLIS EARNING NATIONAL RECOGNITION

• No player has been a bigger part of UM's dominance on defense than redshirt senior DL Gerald Willis III, who missed all of 2017 while taking a leave of absence from Miami. • Willis was named the first-ever recipient of the Outland Trophy National Defensive

Player of the Month award by the FWAA after putting together a dominant September. . Willis was honroed as a Midseason

All-America first-team selection by the Associated Press and ESPN and was named a Midseason All-America second-team selection by The Athletic.

 Willis has totaled at least 2.0 tackles for loss in four of seven games this season, and is tied for the ACC lead in tackles for loss with 13.0° he had 4.0 in the season opener vs. LSU

#25 HURRICANES HEADING NORTH FOR FOR MATCHUP WITH EAGLES

- Following their scheduled bye week, the #25 Miami Hurricanes return to the gridiron for a matchup with Boston College on Oct. 26. at Alumni Stadium in Chestnut Hill, Mass. Kickoff is slated for 7 p.m.
- The road game is one of four in a five-game stretch that began with a 16-13 loss at Virginia on Oct. 13.
- The Hurricanes have compiled an 8-4 record in 12 total road games under head coach Mark Richt.
- Miami leads the all-time series with the Eagles by a 24-5 margin and won its last matchup with Boston College on Sept. 1, 2012 in Chestnut Hill. The Hurricanes are 8-3 all-time in road games at BC.
- The Hurricanes played two Friday games in 2017, both on the road Miami topped Duke, 31-6, in a night game on Sept. 29 and fell at Pittsburgh, 24-14, in a Friday afternoon matchup on Nov. 24.
- With a win Friday night at BC, Miami would become bowl-eligible for the third straight season under Richt; Miami won the 2016 Russell Athletic Bowl and fell in the 2017 Capital One Orange Bowl.

LAST TIME OUT: VIRGINIA SNAPS MIAMI'S FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK

- Miami was tripped up by Virginia in a Saturday night matchup in Charlottesville, Va., on Oct. 13, falling to the host Cavaliers, 16-13, and snapping a five-game winning streak for Miami dating to Sept. 2.
- The loss ended a three-game winning streak over Virginia, marking UM's first loss to UVa since 2014.
- Despite the outcome, the Canes put together another dazzling defensive performance in the defeat.
- Miami's smothering defense finished with 9 tackles for loss, three forced turnovers and four sacks.
- DB Trajan Bandy had the first multi-interception game of his career and the first by a Hurricane since DB Michael Jackson had two against Syracuse in 2017. DB Sheldrick Redwine added an interception.
- DB Jaquan Johnson and LB Michael Pinckney tied for the team lead with 12 tackles, with Pinckney
 adding 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. LB Shaq Quarterman also posted 2.5 tackles for loss vs. UVa.
- QB N'Kosi Perry played the first four series before QB Malik Rosier entered in the second quarter.

DEFENSE CONTINUING TO DOMINATE UNDER DIAZ'S DIRECTION AS D.C.

- The Hurricanes defense has continued to shine under third-year defensive coordinator **Manny Diaz**, who has molded Miami's unit into one of the nation's elite during his tenure as coordinator at UM.
- The most important metric to measure a college football defense in 2018, according to the UM staff philosphy, is opponent yards per play; Miami ranks No. 3 in FBS (3.9) and ranked ninth last year (4.6).
- In the NCAA rankings released Oct. 21, Miami was second in the nation and first in the ACC in total defense (237.0 yards per game); its 130.9 passing yards allowed per game was second-best in FBS.
- Miami's defense ranked No. 1 nationally in both third down conversion percentage (20.8%) and team tackles for loss (11.6), while the Canes' 17 turnovers gained were tied for seventh-most in the nation.
- The UM rushing defense has been equally stout, holding opponents to an average of 106.1 yards per game, which was the 12th-best mark nationally and the third-best total in the conference.

ROSIER TO MAKE FIFTH START OF SEASON, 19TH OF CAREER ON FRIDAY

- On the ACC coaches call on Oct. 17, Mark Richt named Malik Rosier starter for Friday's game at BC.
- The Hurricanes have posted a 14-4 record in games started by Rosier during his Miami career as QB.
 In his first season as Miami's starting guarterback in 2017, Malik Rosier set UM's single-season
- "touchdowns responsible for" record with 31 besting Vinny Testaverde's previous record of 30 set during Testaverde's 1986 Heisman Trophy campaign. He threw for 26 TDs and rushed for five scores.
- The Mobile, Ala., native threw for 3,120 yards, setting the single-season total offense record at Miami (3,588) and finishing with a 10-3 record in 2017. He has compiled 11 TDs in 2018 (six rushing, five passing), and had a career-high five TD on the road at Toledo Sept. 15 (three rushing, two passing).
- Rosier has been responsible for 45 career TDs (12 rushing, 33 passing) in 31 career games at Miami.

WILLIS, JORDAN AMONG THOSE RECEIVING MIDSEASON RECOGNITION

- Redshirt senior defensive lineman Gerald Willis III and true freshman tight end Brevin Jordan were among those FBS players to receive national recognition for standout first halves of the season.
- Willis III was named to the Midseason All-America First Team by both the Associated Press and ESPN, and was named to the Midseason All-America Second Team by The Athletic. Willis III was named the best interior defensive lineman in the country through the first half by The Athletic's Bruce Feldman.
- Jordan was named a Midseason Freshman All-America by ESPN and a Midseason True Freshman All-America by 247Sports. In addition, both Willis III and Jordan were Midseason All-ACC picks by ESPN.

BREAK OUT THE CHAIN AGAIN! TURNOVER CHAIN 2.0 IS HERE FOR 2018

- When sophomore DB Trajan Bandy pounced on a loose ball in the second quarter of Miami's game vs. Savannah State, the crowd turned to observe a familiar sight from 2017: the "Turnover Chain."
- But instead of last year's chain, which was modeled in the shape of the iconic "U" logo, Bandy was presented a brand new turnover chain to wear featuring a charm in the model of Sebastian the lbis.
- Turnover Chain 2.0 is comprised of more than 4,000 stones (compared to 900 last year), weighs roughly three kilograms (compared to two last year) and has an 8.5-inch charm (compared to 5.5).
- The Hurricanes defense totaled only 19 turnovers gained in 13 games in 2016 the season before the Turnover Chain's inception. Since, Miami has compiled 48 in just 20 games, averaging 2.4 per game.
- No Hurricane has worn the new chain more often than Bandy, who has rocked it four times on three interceptions and one fumble recovery. DB Sheldrick Redwine is second (three, all on interceptions).

CAGER HAS BEEN TD MACHINE FOR CANES, TIED FOR ACC LEAD IN TDS

- WR Lawrence Cager is tied for the ACC lead with six receiving touchdowns and has been among UM's top targets in the end zone; he had the second multi-TD game of his career vs. Florida State (Oct. 6).
- Cager's six touchdowns this season already mark a career high; his previous high was three in 2017.
- Of Cager's 39 career catches, 10 have gone for TDs (25.6%), including six of 15 this year (40%); he has two of UM's three multi-touchdown performances this season, vs. FIU (Sept. 22) and vs. FSU (Oct. 6)
- Cager's is tied for 20th-most TDs nationwide and tied with UVa HB Olamide Zacchaeus atop the ACC.
- Cager still holds the Calvert Hall high school jump record from 2015, having jumped a whopping 6'2".

JACKSON AMONG FBS ACTIVE SACKS LEADERS, MIAMI D-LINE THRIVING

- Junior DL **Joe Jackson**, who is tied for the Miami lead with five sacks this season, is one of just eight active FBS players with at least 20.0 career sacks; he ranks fifth among Power 5 players with 20.0.
- Jackson has at least one tackle for loss in his last five games and is tied for third on UM with 9.0 TFLs.
- In addition to Jackson's strong play at defensive end, DL Gerald Willis III is tied for fifth in the nation and leads the ACC in tackles for loss (1.9 per game). Tied with Willis? Teammate Jon Garvin, who has matched Willis' tackle-for-loss total (13.0) and in a sophomore surge, has started all seven games.
- Willis III became the first-ever recipient of the Outland Trophy National Defensive Player of the Month when he was honored. He has been added to watch lists for the Bednarik Award and Outland Trophy.
- Miami's unit is under the direction of first-year line coach Jess Simpson, who arrived from the Atlanta Falcons. Simpson helped ATL rank ninth in the NFL in both total defense and rushing defense in 2017.

JORDAN EMERGING AS TOP TARGET AT TIGHT END AS TRUE FRESHMAN

- Playing his first season of college football, TE Brevin Jordan has already emerged as a go-to target in the Miami offense; Jordan leads the Hurricanes in receptions (18) and is second in touchdowns (four).
- Jordan was named a Midseason Freshman All-America and a Midseason All-ACC selection by ESPN.
- Jordan, who has 208 receiving yards and is averaging 11.6 yards per reception, has played in all seven games and made six starts this year. He had a career-long 41-yard TD catch vs. Florida State (Oct. 6).
- The Las Vegas native posted career-high totals of seven catches & two TDs vs. Savannah St (Sept. 8).
- Jordan was ranked the No. 1 tight end in the country by ESPN.com and 247Sports and No. 2 by Rivals.

MIAMI ON PACE TO SHATTER SCHOOL'S SINGLE-SEASON TFL RECORD

- Playing in his first game since Nov. 26, 2016, DL **Gerald Willis III** delivered an overpowering performance vs. LSU, recording an eye-popping 4.0 tackles for loss the first such performance by a Hurricane defender since 2008. Miami combined for 8.0 TFLs in the game, setting the tone for 2018.
- There are only nine players in the nation with more than 13 tackles for loss, and UM has two of them in Willis III (13.0) and DL **Jon Garvin** (13.0). Miami's 81 TFLs are 10 more than the next-highest FBS total.
- At its current pace over a 13-game schedule, Miami will total more than 150 TFLs, shattering the mark.
- UM has had six individual performances of 3.0 tackles for loss this year through the first seven games; Miami had six total in the first two seasons combined under Manny Diaz' direction (26 games).
- Willis, who was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for his game vs. LSU, has not slowed down since; he is tied with Garvin for the ACC lead in tackles for loss per game, averaging 1.9 / game.

OFFSEASON FOCUS ON 3RD DOWN PAYING OFF FOR OFFENSE, DEFENSE

- After the very first day of fall camp, Mark Richt & staff stressed an emphasis on third downs on both sides of the ball, saying Miami practiced third downs on Day 1 as opposed to waiting til later in camp.
- The Hurricanes, who finished last year ranked 125th in third down conversion percentage on offense and 75th on defense, have benefited from the offseason focus; Miami is ranked No. 37 on offense on third down conversion percentage (43.0%) and ranked No. 1 nationally on the defensive side (20.8%).

HURRICANES HAVE BEEN TOUGH TO BEAT AT HARD ROCK UNDER RICHT

- With a 28-27 win over Florida State last time out on Oct. 6, the Hurricanes won their 13th straight regular season game at home. The streak dates back to Oct. 15, 2016, its last loss (vs. North Carolina).
- Miami has a 15-3 overall record at Hard Rock Stadium since Mark Richt's arrival prior to 2016, and finished last year with a 7-1 record at the venue - including a perfect 7-0 mark in the regular season.
- Miami's 7-0 record at home in the 2017 regular season marked the first undefeated regular season at home since 2002; the Hurricanes finished a perfect 4-0 in ACC games at Hard Rock Stadium last year.
- In 17 regular season games at home under Richt's direction, the Hurricanes are averaging 40.0 points per game and allowing an average of 16.5 points, a positive differential average of 23.5 points/game.

MIAMI HAS TWO-PRONGED RUSHING ATTACK IN DALLAS AND HOMER

- Miami's two-pronged running back attack in junior RB Travis Homer (529 rushing yards) and RB
 DeeJay Dallas (393 rushing yards) has provided a boost for the Hurricanes offense this season.
- Both backs have averaged 5.8 yards per carry on 160 combined carries (92 by Homer, 68 by Dallas), and the two are one yard apart in receiving yards so far this season (68 by Homer, 69 for Dallas).
- The two running backs have split reps over the past few weeks, with Dallas recording 100-yard rushing games vs. Toledo (Sept. 15, 110 yards) and North Carolina (Sept. 27, 114) and Homer doing it vs. FIU (Sept. 22, 114). Homer has four career 100-yard rush games while Dallas has two such games.
- Homer had a career-long 70-yard rush last time out at Virginia (Oct. 13) in UM's loss in Charlottesville.

RICHT OFF TO STRONG START IN COACHING CAREER AT ALMA MATER

 Head coach Mark Richt's 24-9 start to his head coaching career at Miami is the fourth-best mark through 33 games in the modern era of Hurricanes football (since 1979).

AFTER REDSHIRTING 2017, PERRY SEEING FIRST ACTION AT QB IN 2018

- After impressing vs. FIU (Sept. 22) upon entering at QB in UM's third series, QB N'Kosi Perry made the first start of his career vs. North Carolina (Sept. 27), finishing 8-for-12 for 125 passing yards & 1 TD.
- Perry is ranked sixth in the ACC in pass efficiency (127.6) in conference play with 5 TDs this year.
- Perry threw three TDs and finished 17-of-25 for 224 yards and one pick in his action vs. the Panthers.
- Perry entered for Miami's third series vs. FIU and eventually compiled the longest scoring drives of 2018 by yards (87) & time (7:11), and tied the season long for a scoring drive by play count (14).
- In his second start vs. Florida State (Oct. 6), Perry threw for a career-high four touchdown passes to help complete an epic second-half comeback. He played the first four series at Virginia (Oct. 13).
- The Ocala, Fla., native was a consensus four-star quarterback by 247Sports, ESPN, Rivals and Scout, and was rated as the third-best dual sport in the nation by ESPN and sixth-best by 247Sports.
- Despite making just three starts, QB N'Kosi Perry has already orchestrated UM's season-long drive by time (7:49, vs. FSU), tied the mark for plays (14, twice) and has second-longest in yards (87 vs. FIU).

THOMAS SHOWCASING ELECTRIC PLAYMAKING ABILITY IN YEAR 2

- Sophomore WR Jeff Thomas has showed off his playmaking abilities through the first seven games.
- Thomas ranks third in FBS in average yards per catch and leads the ACC at a whopping 23.59 yards.
- In UM's road game vs. Toledo (Sept. 15), Thomas led Miami in all-purpose yards (171) for the third straight game. Thomas has led UM in all-purpose yards in four of seven games, including 124 vs. FSU.
- Thomas has a team-high 17 plays of 20-or-more yards in 2018 he had 22 such plays during 2017.
- Against LSU (Sept. 2), Thomas started and made a number of acrobatic catches, hauling in a careerhigh five passes for a career-high 132 yards; his previous highs were three receptions and 101 yards.
- Thomas once again showcased his electric speed vs. Savannah State (Sept. 8) when he hauled in a 67-yard TD pass and finished with 183 all-purpose yards - including career-high 90 punt return yards.
- Thomas' 67-yard TD vs. Savannah State was UM's longest play of the season and the fourth catch of at least 50 yards in his career; Thomas also hauled in a 50-yard reception in the opener against LSU.
- The East St. Louis, III., native was on the receiving end of the two longest pass plays for UM in 2017.

JACKSON, JOHNSON NAMED THORPE AWARD SEMIFINALISTS ON OCT. 22

- The Oklahoma Sports Hall of Fame announced the 14 semifinalists for the 2018 Paycom Jim Thorpe Award Monday, and two Miami Hurricanes made the cut: **Michael Jackson, Jr.**, and **Jaquan Johnson**.
- The Canes were one of just three teams nationwide to have two players selected to the 14-member list.
- The only Thorpe Award winner in program history is Bennie Blades, who won the award in 1987.

JONATHAN GARVIN ENJOYING SOPHOMORE SURGE ON DEFENSIVE LINE

- The Miami Hurricanes' defensive line took a hit when three of its four 2017 starters departed this past
 offseason, but one of the players who has stepped up in his sophomore year has been end Jon Garvin.
- Garvin, who totaled just nine tackles as a true freshman in 2017 is fifth on the Hurricanes with 33 tackles; he set a career high with eight vs. LSU (Sept. 2) and matched it vs. Savannah State (Sept. 8).
- Garvin is ranked fifth in FBS and tied for the ACC lead with an average of 1.9 tackles for loss per game.
- Garvin, who had just 3.0 tackles for loss as a true freshman, already has 13.0 tackles for loss in 2018; he became the first Hurricane to have multiple games with 3.0 TFL since **Denzel Perryman** in 2011.
- The Lake Worth, Fla., native goes by "Neo" his middle name and the name of his grandfather.

"NO FLY ZONE" - MIAMI'S PASSING DEFENSE RANKS AS NATION'S BEST

- Miami's defense, ranked second nationally in total defense, has been especially stout on quarterbacks, holding opponents to an ACC-low of 130.9 passing yards per game the second-lowest mark in FBS.
- Led by three apiece from Trajan Bandy and Sheldrick Redwine, the Hurricanes have totaled 11
- interceptions through the first seven games the eighth-most nationwide and tied for most in the ACC.

DALLAS HAS ALREADY FAR SURPASSED FRESHMAN YEAR RUSHING TOTAL

- Running back **DeeJay Dallas** has been a big factor in Miami's offense in 2018, and is second on UM
 with 393 rushing yards in seven games. He is averaging 5.8 yards per carry with two rushing scores.
- In a win over Toledo on Sept. 15, Dallas posted the first 100-yard game of his career (110) in Miami's 49-24 victory. Dallas has already surpassed his 2017 true freshman mark of 217 total rushing yards.
- Dallas' 17 rushes against the Rockets also marked a career high for the Brunswick, Ga., native.
- Dallas did it again vs. UNC on Sept. 27, posting a career-high 114 yards on just 11 carries with one TD.
- His 569 all-purpose yards are the third-most on Miami, trailing WR Jeff Thomas and RB Travis Homer.
- Dallas, whose full first name is Demetrius, served as recruiting ambassador for the Hurricanes' "#Squad17" class and was originally committed to Richt during his time as Georgia head coach.

HARLEY IMPRESSING AS TEAM LEADER, WAS A CAPTAIN FOR UNC GAME

- With WR Jeff Thomas struggling with first-quarter dehydration against FIU (Sept. 22), WR Mike Harley stepped up in his absence and delivered the best performance of his career in a 31-17 win.
- Harley led all players with a career-best seven catches in the win over FIU for a career-high 76 yards.
- Harley was named a team captain vs. North Carolina (Sept. 27) and made his first career start. He led all Hurricanes with 70 receiving yards, and tied a career-long with a 42-yard reception vs. UNC.
- The south Florida native is tied for third with 15 catches for 173 yards in 2018 besting his personal totals from last season already (nine catches, 91 yards). He is averaging 24.7 yards per game.

LINGARD POSTS LONGEST RUN BY TRUE FRESHMAN SINCE DUKE IN 2012

- With a 64-yard touchdown run on Sept. 8 against Savannah State, RB Lorenzo Lingard recorded the longest rush by a true freshman running back since Duke Johnson had a 65-yard rush against Duke in his true freshman season finale on Nov. 24, 2012 in Durham, N.C., which was also a touchdown run.
- Lingard, who has seen action in six games, is third on the team with 136 rushing yards this season on 17 carries. Lingard is averaging 8.0 yards per carry and 34.0 yards per game through his first four games.

HURRICANES SET RECORDS IN WIN OVER TIGERS IN HOME OPENER

- The Miami Hurricanes opened their 11th season at Hard Rock Stadium on Sept. 8 vs. Savannah State, capturing a 77-0 shutout victory to improve to 11-0 all-time in home openers at the stadium.
- Miami's 77 points tied a program record for most points in a single game (also set against Savannah State, in September 2013), while its 77-point margin of victory was the largest in program history.
- The Hurricanes have not lost a home opener since 2006, when they fell to Florida State 13-10 at the Orange Bowl on Sept. 4, 2006. Miami has won 12 straight home openers since, a program record.

DEFENSE RECORDS FIRST SHUTOUT SINCE 2015 IN WIN OVER TIGERS

- The Miami Hurricanes' defense was able to compile its first shutout since the 2015 season opener against Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 5, 2015) in a 77-0 win over Savannah State on Saturday, Sept. 8.
- The shutout was the first under the current Miami staff, including defensive coordinator Manny Diaz.
- Diaz's last shutout as defensive coordinator came exactly six years to the day before Miami's win over Savannah State; as the coordinator at Texas, Diaz's Longhorns shutout New Mexico on Sept. 8, 2012.

26 HURRICANES MAKE THEIR DEBUTS IN HOME OPENER AT HARD ROCK

- 15 offensive Hurricanes made their career debuts on Saturday, Sept. 8 vs. Savannah State: QB N'Kosi Perry, QB Cade Weldon, WR Mark Pope, FB Realus George, Jr., WR Marquez Ezzard, OL John Campbell, Jr., RB Robert Burns, OL Zalon'tae Hillery, OL Cleveland Reed, Jr., RB Cam'Ron Davis, TE Nicholas Ducheine, OL Zach Dykstra, K Alejandro Cardenas, OL Sam York and QB Jarren Williams.
- 11 defensive Hurricanes made their career debuts in the same game: DL Nesta Jade Silvera, DB Gilbert Frierson, LB Waynmon Steed, DB Gurvan Hall, Jr., DB James Murphy, DL Jordan Miller, LB Patrick Joyner, Jr., DB Nigel Bethel, DB Tyler Murphy, DB Colvin Alford and DL Tyreic Martin.

1983 NATIONAL CHAMPION TEAM RECOGNIZED FOR 35-YEAR REUNION

- The 1983 national champion Miami Hurricanes football team was recognized on Saturday, Sept. 22 on the occasion of the 35-year anniversary of the first football national championship in UM history.
- Former head coach Howard Schnellenberger led the 1983 champions "through the smoke" at halftime
 of Miami's game against FIU. Roughly 65 former players, coaches & staff members from that national
 championship team were in attendance. UM held a special closed ceremony on Sept. 21 on campus.
- The Hurricanes finished that season with an 11-1 record and topped Nebraska, 31-30, at the Orange Bowl on Jan. 1, 1984 for the first national championship in program history.

JOHNSON BACK FOR SENIOR YEAR AFTER CONSULTING IDOL ED REED

- After discussing his future with legendary Miami safety Ed Reed, DB Jaquan Johnson turned down the opportunity to enter the NFL Draft, choosing to return for his senior season with the Hurricanes.
- The Hurricanes are undoubtedly happy with his decision, as Johnson a Preseason All-America firstteam selection by the Associated Press, a Preseason All-ACC selection and a watch list member for three major defensive awards - led Miami with 96 tackles and tied for the team lead with four picks.
- In his first game of 2018, Johnson served as one of four captains and totaled a game-high 11 tackles.
- Johnson missed games vs. FIU (Sept. 22) and North Carolina (Sept. 27) with a hamstring injury.
- He returned as a captain vs. Florida State (Oct. 6) and totaled a game-high 10 tackles in the win.
- As a junior, Johnson was of four defensive semifinalists for the Walter Camp Player of the Year.
- Johnson was named ACC Defensive of the Back three weeks in a row in 2017 (Nov. 6, Nov. 13, Nov. 20), becoming the first Hurricane player to ever be honored by the ACC in three consecutive weeks.
- The last ACC player to earn honors in three straight weeks was Deshaun Watson of Clemson in 2014.

THREE-HEADED LINEBACKER MONSTER IN MIDST OF JUNIOR YEARS

- Miami's three-headed monster junior linebacker trio Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney and Shaq Quarterman - has started nearly every game together since arriving to UM as early enrollees in 2016.
- In a win over North Carolina (Sept. 27), the trio started, combining for 17 tackles, 5.0 tackles for loss, two sacks & one forced fumble. The trio has started alongside each other five of seven games in '18.
- McCloud has started 27 of 33 career games through the first seven weeks of 2018. McCloud finished with 48 tackles (29 solo), 4.5 tackles for loss in 2017. He led Miami with eight total tackles vs. UNC.
- One of UM's most instinctive players, Pinckney started 11 of 13 games last season and ended up with 68 total tackles, 11.0 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks. He recorded a career-high 12 tackles at Virginia.
- Quarterman, who has started all 33 games for the Hurricanes in two-plus seasons, ranked second on the team with 83 tackles a sophomore in 2017. Quarterman was unblockable in a win vs. UNC, ending with 3.0 tackles for loss, two sacks, one forced fumble & five total tackles in a 47-10 victory.

- Five Canes had fathers who suited up in orange and green: TE Michael Irvin II (father is Michael) II, DL Scott Patchan (Matt), DL Pat Bethel (Randy), P Zach Feagles (Jeff) & DB Al Blades, Jr. (Al, Sr.)
- WR **Evidence Njoku** is the brother of David, who was taken by Cleveland in the 2017 NFL Draft.
- QB Cade Weldon is the son of Casey Weldon, former quarterback at Florida State under Mark Richt.

TRUE FROSH TIGHT END DUO MAKING AN EARLY IMPACT FOR MIAMI

- Two key members of Miami's #Storm18 signing class have played bigger roles than already was anticipated after junior tight end Michael Irvin II suffered an MCL injury during fall camp.
- Freshman tight end duo Brevin Jordan and Will Mallory, who became friends through the recruiting
 process and were ranked among the nation's best at the position, have been counted on early in 2018.
- In addition to playing together on the field, Jordan and Mallory are freshman roommates at The U.
- In the home opener vs. Savannah State (Sept. 8), Mallory opened the game's scoring with a two-yard touchdown pass the very first catch of his career. Mallory made his first career start in the victory.
- Jordan, who started the season opener, had a dominant outing of his own against the Tigers, setting
 career marks in receptions (seven) to go along with the first two touchdowns of his Miami career.
- Jordan was ranked the No. 1 tight end in the country by ESPN.com and 247Sports and No. 2 by Rivals, while Mallory was ranked the third-best tight end by ESPN.com. The two are roommates at The U.

HIGHTOWER WOWS IN FIRST COLLEGIATE GAME, SCORES TOUCHDOWN

- Among Miami's most impressive freshman performers vs. LSU (Sept. 2) was WR Brian Hightower, who hauled in a 32-yard TD reception on a connection with QB Malik Rosier in the fourth quarter.
- Hightower, who saw signification action in the game vs. LSU, became the first Hurricane wide receiver to record a touchdown for his first collegiate catch since **Tyre Brady** vs. Nebraska in 2015.
- Hightower made the first start of his career on Sept. 22 vs. FIU; he has 3 catches for 53 yards this year.
- The last Hurricane to have his first catch end up in a touchdown was FB Marquez Williams in 2016.
- Hightower was a consensus four-star recruit ranked the No. 141 overall player in his class by ESPN.

DEFENSE, TURNOVER CHAIN HAS DAZZLED UNDER DADE'S OWN DIAZ

- Defensive coordinator Manny Diaz has directed the UM defense into one of the nation's top groups in his two-plus seasons at The U, and his 2017 unit ranked among the nation's best in several stats.
- Miami's defense ranked ninth nationally in opponent yards per play (4.5) in 2017, the most important modern metric when measuring a college football defense. UM ranked No. 16 in OYPP (4.7) in 2016.
- The Hurricanes led the nation in team sacks (3.38) and was 3rd in team tackles for loss (8.8) in 2017.
- One of college football's biggest storylines in 2017 was the emergence of Miami's "turnover chain," and after the Canes posted the ACC's best turnover margin in 2017, the chain will be back in 2018
- Miami's 31 turnovers gained were the third-most in the nation and most in the ACC, while its +1.00
 average turnover margin (+13 for the season) was tied for the fifth-best mark in the nation.
- The Hurricanes have already begun to make their mark in 2018, ranking fourth nationally in total defense, first in third down conversion percentage defense and first in team tackles for loss.

10 TRUE FRESHMEN, 13 TOTAL SEE FIRST ACTION OF CAREER VS. LSU

- 10 true freshmen suited up for the first time in the season opener vs. LSU, while three others redshirt freshman WR Evidence Njoku, DL Tito Odenigbo and OL Venzell Boulware - also debuted.
- 10 true freshmen made their debuts against LSU in the AdvoCare Classic: RB Lorenzo Lingard, WR Brian Hightower, DB Al Blades, Jr., DB DJ Ivey, WR Dee Wiggins, TE Brevin Jordan, DL Gregory Rousseau, K Bubba Baxa, OL DJ Scaife, Jr. and TE Will Mallory.

RICHT RECOGNIZES MIAMI PAST, INVITES HONORARY CAPTAINS

- After his return to his alma mater, head coach Mark Richt instituted honorary captains all of whom are Miami Football alumni to speak to the team on the Fridays before home games in-season.
- The first honorary captain for the 2018 season was OL Dennis Harrah, who played at UM from 1972-74.
 In 2017, the list of honorary captain list included all-time Miami greats like QB George Mira, DB Bennie
- Blades, WR Reggie Wayne, DB Ed Reed and DB Antrel Rolle, among others.
- Richt's invitation to honorary captains further extends his dedication to his alma mater and the
 alumni who have passed through the program; in August of 2017, Richt hosted his first "U Network"
 event dedicated to helping Miami Football alumni find jobs in their post-football lives.
- Richt and his wife Katharyn personally dedicated \$1 million to the construction of the Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility, which helped spurn more than \$2 million in gifts from former players.

CAROL SOFFER INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY OPEN FOR BUSINESS

- On August 17, 2018, history was made at the University of Miami, as the Miami Hurricanes practiced inside the Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility for the very first time during fall camp.
- In September 2016, Miami announced the largest donation in the history of the athletics department as the lead gift for a state-of-the-art football indoor practice facility. In honor of their mother Carol, Jeffrey Soffer and Carol's other children made a \$14 million commitment towards the facility.
- Head coach Mark Richt pledged \$1 million towards the facility and football alumnus and linebacker great Jon Beason was among those alumni to give to the project. Beason's gift was \$250,000, as Miami alumni and former players teamed up to contribute more than \$2 million for the project.
- The 81,800-square-foot facility features two field-turf fields one 90 yards long and one 40 yards.

HURRICANES LOOKING TO GAIN STRENGTH IN YEAR 3 UNDER RICHT

- Miami enjoyed an impressive 2017 season under the direction of head coach Mark Richt, who guided the Hurricanes to 10 wins and a College Football Playoff ranking as high as No. 2 in his second year.
- The Hurricanes, who captured the ACC's Coastal Division for the first time in its history for a spot in the ACC Championship, earned an invite to the Capital One Orange Bowl for the first time in 13 years.
- Richt was named 2017 ACC Coach of the Year and was also named Walter Camp Coach of the Year.
- Miami had three players selected to the Preseason All-ACC Football Team: DB Michael Jackson, DB Jaguan Johnson and LB Shaguille Quarterman. In addition to his recognition by the conference, Johnson was selected to the Associated Press Preseason All-America First Team at safety.
- The Hurricanes return 3,120 of their 3,153 passing yards from 2017 (98.9%) and 1,697 of 2,090 rushing yards (81.2%), which accounts for a combined 91.8% of total offense returning heading into 2018.

TRUE FRESHMEN ALREADY MAKING AN EARLY IMPACT FOR UM IN 2018

- Miami's recruiting class, nicknamed #Storm18, was ranked the consensus No. 1 class in Florida and a consensus top-8 class overall for the first time since 2012. It was ranked No. 6 nationally by Rivals.
- True freshmen have accounted for six total touchdowns already, including two each from RB Lorenzo Lingard and TE Brevin Jordan. TE Will Mallory and WR Brian Hightower each have one.
- Both Jordan (two games) and Mallory (one game) have earned starts in the early going of their college careers, while DB Al Blades, Jr., was named special teams captain for UM's game at Toledo.
- UM's recruiting class included 14 players ranked in the ESPN300, 12 in 247Sports' national rankings, 12 ranked in Rivals 250, and 10 players who were either U.S. Army or Under Armour All-Americans.
- Miami's class was ranked No. 8 nationally by both 247Sports and ESPN and ranked the second-best class in the ACC by both organizations. 247Sports, ESPN and Rivals all had UM's class No. 1 in Florida.
- 10 members of the signing class enrolled early and took part in spring practice: QB Jarren Williams, RB Lorenzo Lingard, WR Brian Hightower, WR Dee Wiggins, DL Greg Rousseau, OL John Campbell, Jr., OL DJ Scaife, Jr., DB Gurvan Hall, Jr., DB DJ Ivey and DB Gilbert Frierson

HOMER IMPRESSED IN FIRST YEAR AS STARTING RUNNING BACK IN 2017

- After a season-ending injury to Mark Walton in the early part of 2017, RB Travis Homer stepped up and saw action in all 13 games last year. He took over starting duties four games into the year.
- Homer has posted 434 rushing yards through the first six games (5.2 yards-per-carry average) and had the first 100-yard rushing game of the season in a 31-17 victory over the FIU Panthers on Sept. 22.
- The 100-yard rushing performance was the fourth of his career; he had three such games in 2017.
- Homer rushed for 966 yards on 163 attempts (5.9 yards per carry) with eight rushing TDs in 2017.
- The West Palm Beach native, who was selected to the All-ACC Second Team in 2017, compiled 1,203 all-purpose yards and three 100-yard rushing games including 170 in his first start vs. Georgia Tech.
- The Palm Beach native became the eighth Miami tailback to have recorded a 100-yard game in his first career start since 2000, and the fourth to do it in an Atlantic Coast Conference game.
- Homer is Miami's leading active rusher with 1,539 rushing yards and nine rushing touchdowns.

HEAD COACH | THIRD SEASON AT MIAMI (18th OVERALL) | 169-60 (.738)

In just two seasons as head coach, Mark Richt has made an indelible impact on his alma mater's football program -- both on and off the field.

Richt posted a 19-7 record over his first two seasons, the third best start in Miami history, and a stretch that included a 15-game winning streak -- UM's longest since 2002. The Hurricanes won 10 games in 2017, climbing as high as second in the College Football Playoff rankings. Miami captured the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coastal Division for the first time in its history and earned an invitation to the Capital One Orange Bowl for the first time in 13 years. Richt won 2017 ACC Coach of the Year honors and was also named the 2017 Walter Camp Coach of the Year.

The Hurricanes ranked first in team sacks per game (3.38), and ranked third the nation in turnovers forced in 2017 (31). Junior quarterback Malik Rosier accounted for 31 total touchdowns, breaking Vinny Testaverde's single-season school record, and helping Miami rank 15th in the nation in red zone offense (90.7 percent). Junior defensive back Jaquan Johnson had a breakout season, leading the team with 96 tackles, picking off four passes and earning ACC Defensive Back of the Week honors three times. Overall, 10 Hurricanes earned All-ACC honors, including kicker Michael Badgley, who was named first-team All-ACC.

Off the field, Richt has energized the program, from supporting the fundraising efforts for the Carol Soffer Football Indoor Practice Facility to launching The U Network, which assists former Hurricanes in networking and career placement after their playing careers have concluded. Miami was one of three schools, along with Stanford and Northwestern, to earn the 2016 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Academic Achievement Award. In addition, the Hurricanes ranked first among all FBS programs in 2016 in the NCAA Team Works Helper Helper Community Service Competition, and helped Miami finish first among Division I schools overall in 2018.

Richt was named the University of Miami's 24th head football coach on Dec. 4, 2015. His hiring provided immediate dividends as the Hurricanes posted a 9-4 record in his first season in Coral Gables. Miami then defeated West Virginia, 31-14, in the Russell Athletic Bowl for the program's first bowl victory in 10 years. The Hurricanes were ranked No. 20 in

the final Associated Press poll and No. 23 in the final Amway Coaches Poll – the program's first season-ending rankings since 2009.

Miami had 10 players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors in 2016, while quarterback Brad Kaaya became Miami's all-time passing yards leader. Freshman wide receiver Ahmmon Richards broke the 31-year-old freshman receiving record at Miami originally set by Michael Irvin, while sophomore running back Mark Walton became the 11th 1,000-yard rusher in program history.

Six Hurricanes were selected in the 2018 NFL Draft. Nine Hurricanes were selected in the 2017 NFL Draft, the most for Miami since 2006, including first-round pick David Njoku to the Cleveland Browns. Richt has had 99 of his players drafted as a head coach, including 14 first-round picks.

Richt, born in Omaha, Neb., and raised in Boca Raton, Fla., returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Georgia football program for the previous 15 years. He compiled a 145-51 overall record and an 85-40 mark in Southeastern Conference play. Georgia won two SEC championships, six SEC East titles and nine bowl games under Richt, and finished the season in the Associated Press Top-10 rankings seven times.

Richt's 164 career wins rank fourth among active FBS head coaches and his .744 winning percentage ranks as the seventh best among current FBS coaches with at least five years of experience. Richt is one of only seven head coaches in SEC history to record four straight 10-win seasons (2002-05).

Richt coached some of the greatest quarterbacks in Georgia history, including David Greene, a four-year starter who left Athens as the then-winningest quarterback in NCAA history with 42 career wins. Aaron Murray, also a four-year starter, is the SEC's all-time leader in passing yards (13,166) and touchdown passes (121). Matthew Stafford threw for 3,459 yards and 25 touchdowns (then a school record) as a junior for the Bulldogs.

Richt is married to the former Katharyn Francis of Tallahassee. The couple has four children – Jonathan, David, Zach, and Anya. Jon, the Miami quarterbacks coach, was married to the former Anna Cearley in May 2010. They have two daughters, Jadyn and Zoe.
