**'Canes Travel to Florida Gulf Coast for Midweek Affair...**

The University of Miami and Florida Gulf Coast will conclude their three-game bounce series this year on Wednesday, April 5, at 7 p.m., at the Lee County Sports Complex in Hammond Stadium, which also serves as the Minnesota Twins' spring training facility.

Miami (17-11) has taken both of the previous meetings against the Eagles this year – using scores of 5-2 (March 23) and 13-2 (March 29). Travis Miller earned his only win of the year in the first meeting between the two teams, seeing two innings of relief action – striking out two batters while sitting down all six that he faced. He came on in relief of freshman starter AJ Salcines.

As recently as last Tuesday, Miami defeated FGCU (15-15) inside Alex Rodriguez Park in Coral Gables, Fla. UM leads the all-time series, 6-0.

Miami enters the contest working on a three-game win streak, sweeping both games of a doubleheader from Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) opponent Boston College on Sunday. UM is perfect in league road games on the year (5-0), also taking three games from Wake Forest two weeks ago in Winston Salem, N.C. The Hurricanes pounded out 36 hits collectively on Sunday, including a series season-high five home runs.

In true road games, the 'Canes are 5-5 on the campaign – winning each of their last five.

The Hurricanes are led offensively by this week's ACC Co-Player of the Week, junior infielder Rony Rodriguez. On the year, the Miami native and Sunset High alum leads the 'Canes in several categories, including batting average (.305) and home runs (4). Against BC, Rodriguez was 2-for-2 with three runs scored and two walks in the doubleheader opener, only to follow with a 2-for-3 performance in the nightcap – registering a solo home run in the fifth, which proved to be the game-winning RBI for the 7-6 decision. His slugging percentage for the week was 1.125, and he was perfect defensively with 14 putouts and an assist, all coming at the first base position.

Sophomore outfielder Zeke DeVoss leads the conference in stolen bases with 16 in 20 attempts, while batting .278 for UMIAMI – adding a team-best 25 runs and 26 walks, also producing 27 hits and 14 RBI. Junior infielder Harold Martinez, playing shortstop as of late for the injured Stephen Perez, is second on the team in batting with a .289 average on 28 hits (four doubles), a team-high 21 RBI and scoring 12 times.

**Miami Against Florida Gulf Coast...**

Miami leads the all-time series against FGCU by a 6-0 count, including wins against the Eagles in the two previous matchups in Coral Gables over the course of the last two weeks.

**Rodriguez Named ACC Co-Player of the Week...**

After hitting .750 and producing his team-leading fourth home run in helping the University of Miami to a perfect 3-0 week, junior infielder Rony Rodriguez has been selected as the Atlantic Coast Conference Baseball Co-Player of the Week for the week of March 28 – April 3.

Rodriguez, who started all three games last week for the Hurricanes at first base, led Miami in batting average with a .750 clip, producing six hits in eight official at-bats – including two walks and scoring seven runs. His 80.0 percent on-base percentage is the best for any Hurricanes performer in a week at this point on the campaign.

The Sunset High alum and former Miami Dade College product, now in his second year as a UMIAMI student-athlete, helped keep the Hurricanes perfect on the road in ACC play at 5-0 – using a doubleheader sweep of Boston College on Sunday in 19-4 and 7-6 (5 innings) wins in Chestnut Hill, Mass. His slugging percentage for the week was 1.125, and he was perfect defensively with 14 putouts and an assist, all coming at the first base position.

Against BC, Rodriguez was 2-for-2 with three runs scored and two walks in the doubleheader opener, only to follow with a 2-for-3 performance in the nightcap – registering a solo home run in the fifth, which proved to be the game-winning RBI for the 7-6 decision in the curfew rule enforced five inning affair.

**Miami to Honor 2001 NCAA Championship Team...**

The University of Miami will pay tribute to the 2001 NCAA College World Series Championship team during Saturday's contest against NC State on April 9. Throughout the week leading up to the event, HurricaneSports.com will relive each of the 'Canes four wins in Omaha, Neb., at legendary Rosenblatt Stadium – pushing in wins against Tennessee, Southern California and Stanford, respectively, en route to their fourth NCAA title in school history.

## UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI HEAD COACH JIM MORRIS - 18TH SEASON

2001, 1999, & 1994 National Coach of the Year • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



In his 18th season at Miami, no other program, nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 38 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 17 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 26 years, 17 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 793-309-3 (.718) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,297-553-4 (.700) Division I record in 29 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 32 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,428-594-4 (.705) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 18 years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the new stadium project.

### MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 26th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2010 when he guided the 'Canes to the NCAA Coral Gables Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 17 seasons (1994-2010), winning 15 of his last 17 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris has led the 2010 Hurricanes to their 38th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2010 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft. In 2008, the 'Canes reached the College World Series after winning the Atlantic Coast Conference, widely considered one of the toughest - if not the toughest - collegiate baseball conference in the country.

### MORRIS IN HIS 33RD SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,297-553-4 (.700) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,428-594-4 (.705) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 17 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

### JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- Guided the Miami Hurricanes to College World Series National Championship in 1999 and 2001.
- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 17 seasons and led Miami to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami, by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

### SHORTSTOPS AND JIM MORRIS

Morris, who played shortstop during college at Elon and then in the Boston Red Sox organization, has had great success developing the position while a head coach. Over the last decade Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases. He currently works with sophomore Stephen Perez, a slick-fielding switch-hitter expected to bat near the upper-half of the order this year for the 'Canes.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres, from 1997-99. Before Hill, it was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Nationals. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and played for the Oakland A's in 2009.

Miami pounded out a season-high 26 hits against Boston College in the opener of Sunday's doubleheader. That almost doubled the previous-high of 14 set against Illinois State (March 8). On the day, Miami staked 36 hits and scored 26 runs with five home runs from five different Hurricanes.

### Carey Me Home...

Freshman outfielder Dale Carey picked up his first multi-hit game as a Miami Hurricane on Tuesday against Florida Gulf Coast, going 2-for-4 at the plate with a pair of RBI and a run scored. It was also the first multi-RBI game of the career for the native of Marietta, Ga. He shares a common bond with another UMiami athlete – DeQuan Jones of men's basketball, both being highly-touted athletes out of Wheeler High School in the Greater Atlanta Metropolitan Area.

### Notes from the Last FGCU Game - 'Canes Storm Past Eagles for Second Time in as Many Weeks...

**Harold Martinez** makes his fourth consecutive start at shortstop for the injured **Stephen Perez**...**Dave Villasuso** is back behind the plate after a day off on Sunday...**Chris Pelaez**, coming off a shoulder injury, makes his second start of the year – as he was slotted as the DH and hit sixth...**Zeke DeVoss** hit a two-out grand slam in the bottom of the fourth inning to give the Hurricanes a 10-0 lead...It was the second grand slam of the season for the 'Canes, as **Michael Broad** hit one exactly a week ago against UCF...For DeVoss, it was his first home run of the season, and his first since May 29, 2010, against Virginia in the ACC Tournament...It was also DeVoss' second career grand slam, last clearing the bases against Boston College on May 27 of last year – also in the ACC Tournament...Freshman outfielder **Dale Carey** recorded his first and second extra-base hits of his career when he doubled in the second and third innings, respectively...Carey's double in the second inning drove home a run – his third RBI in as many games...With a double in the eighth inning, **Brad Fieger** reached base four times in one game for the first time this season...Sophomore **Michael Broad** hit a deep home run over the left field fence in the fifth inning, his second blast of the season. This was the first game this season where the Hurricanes had hit two home runs in one game...**Cade Kreuter** pinch-hit for Rony Rodriguez in the bottom of the fifth, and took over for him at first base in the top of the sixth inning...It was the first time all season Kreuter saw action in the field, defensively.

### Recapping the Last Game - vs. Boston College (April 3)...

After a two-day delay due to weather, the University of Miami and Boston College finally met Sunday for an ACC doubleheader at Eddie Pellagrini Diamond at Commander Shea Field in Chestnut Hill, Mass. Miami swept the doubleheader affair – using a 19-4 advantage in the opener, and a 7-6 decision in the nightcap in a fifth inning game.

Miami (17-11, 8-3 Atlantic Coast Conference) pounded out 36 hits on the day, including a season-high five home runs. The games were a make-up from Friday and Saturday when games were cancelled due to snow. The five-inning game in the nightcap happened due to the ACC Sunday curfew rule – where an inning cannot start after 4:45 p.m. for teams traveling via plane. The third game will not be made up.

In the opener, the Hurricanes pounded out a season-high 26 hits, surpassing the previous high of 14 against Illinois State (March 8).

Starting pitcher Eric Whaley collected the win in the first game, improving to 5-1 on the year, tossing just four innings, but with the 'Canes holding an 8-3 lead when he left the mound. In earning the win, Whaley allowed three earned runs on seven hits, walking one and striking out a batter. But it was the bats that did the work on Sunday for Miami.

Zeke DeVoss started the day with a leadoff homer in the top of the first to pace four Hurricanes with homers in the game. UM scored in eight-of-nine innings during the first game, including four spots in the third and seventh innings, respectively. Boston College (10-15, 4-7 ACC) starter

Nate Bayuk was lifted after just 2 1/3 innings worked on the hill, allowing six earned runs on eight hits with four strikeouts and two walks.

With the game tied at two after two frames, the offense picked up for the 'Canes as they bolted for four runs in the third inning behind sophomore outfielder Chantz Mack's first career home run that scored Brad Fieger on the play. Fieger finished the first game with a game-high tying four RBI, alongside sophomore Cade Kreuter who hit his first homer as a Hurricane in the seventh as he hit a first-pitch fastball in a pinch hit effort, scoring Chris Pelaez and Harold Martinez.

In the contest, Miami was led at the plate by nine batters registering a multi-hit outing, including shortstop Martinez and Fieger with four hits apiece. Kreuter was 3-for-3, and freshman Dale Carey went 3-for-6 with two RBI.

E.J. Encinosa tossed three innings in relief, striking out three batters and not allowing a hit in that span. Michael Rudman and Zach Robinson closed the game with an inning each. BC used a season-high eight pitchers in the opener.

Overall, UMiami got homers from DeVoss, Nathan Melendres, Kreuter and Mack in the first game. Bryan Radziewski started the second game for the Hurricanes on the mound, with the ACC curfew rule looming the entire time. The 'Canes plated five runs in the opening inning – using Carey's two-run scoring single, in addition to Pelaez's RBI double.

Miami's Martinez brought around Nathan Melendres in the second inning to extend the 'Canes lead, 6-0.

With Miami holding a 7-3 advantage in the fifth after Rony Rodriguez hit his team-leading fourth home run, the Eagles charged back in the home-half of the frame.

Daniel Miranda struck out BC's Marc Perdios to end the game and preserve the win after the Eagles scored three runs in the bottom of the fifth.

The win went to Radziewski, tossing four frames and allowing four runs on five hits – and Miranda claimed the save (his seventh of the campaign) with a run allowed on two hits. The Eagles' John Leonard went the whole way in the loss with seven earned runs on eight hits and three walks.

UM was led offensively by Martinez and Rodriguez with two hits each. BC's Anthony Melchionda also had a two-hit game in the nightcap, as well as catcher Tom Bourdon finishing 2-for-2 in the game.

### Recapping the GT Series: Yellow Jackets Weather the Storm...

**Game 1:** Junior infielder and Louisville Slugger Preseason All-America selection **Harold Martinez** made his first career start at shortstop as a result of starter **Stephen Perez's** injured quadriceps and back-up **Joey Porro's** season-ending broken ankle...For the first time this season, **Chantz Mack** hit in the two-slot...UM's outfield traded places in the top of the seventh inning as **Zeke DeVoss** moved from left to center; Mack moved from right to left; and **Dale Carey** moved from center to right...Despite the loss, the 'Canes have won 10 out of the last 12 games since head coach **Jim Morris'** return from gall bladder surgery and an infection stemming from the surgery on March 8...Senior **Chris Pelaez** staked his first hit of the season on a single to the right side as a pinch hitter in the eighth inning...Both clubs came into tonight's contest on winning streaks – Miami having won its last nine, and Georgia Tech winning its last 13...After tonight's victory, GT remains the only program unbeaten in 2011 ACC play...Faces in the Crowd – Chicago Bears Tight End, and former 'Cane, Greg Olsen was in attendance...Former UM shortstop and recent University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame inductee **Bobby Hill** threw out the game's ceremonial first pitch...Miami head coach **Jim Morris** is familiar with the Yellow Jackets, having coached Georgia Tech from 1982-93 winning 504 games...Since moving from third base on March 11 versus Virginia Tech, **Harold Martinez** has resurged as a hitter going on a nine-game hitting streak...Before March 11, he was batting just .167. Since the switch, he is hitting .441...Tonight's game marks the sixth time this season in which the 'Canes have committed at least four errors...It also marks the second game in a row with at least four errant plays...Tonight's six errors are the most by a UM team since the 'Canes committed seven at Florida in the 2010 Gainesville Super Regional...Junior pitcher **Sam Abrams**, in 6 2/3 innings, has yet to give up a run this season...The bullpen's streak of 22 consecutive innings without an earned run came to an end when freshman Javi Salas gave up three runs in the eighth.

home was Clemson in 2006...Reliever **Sam Robinson** gave up a run in the top of the ninth inning...For Robinson, it was his first earned run given up after 17 2/3 innings this season... Head coach **Jim Morris** has preached aggressive base running throughout his illustrious career, with the 'Canes swiping 46-of-57 bases this season. **Zeke DeVoss** leads the way with an ACC-best 16 steals, followed by **Nathan Melendres (7)** and **Stephen Perez (6)**.

**The First Father/Son Duo...**

Freshman catcher **Shane Rowland** has stepped right into the UMiami starting lineup and taken charge. He belted his first home run over the weekend against Appalachian State. The Tampa native is the son of former UMiami second baseman and current international scout for the New York Yankees, Donny Rowland. They are the first father/son duo to ever play baseball at the "U".

**Miami Predicted to Finish Third In Coastal Division...**

Miami baseball has been predicted to finish third in the Coastal Division of the Atlantic Coast Conference Coaches Preseason Poll. The poll is voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. Capturing a 20-10 league record in 2010, the Hurricanes finished the year third in the Coastal Division behind Virginia and Georgia Tech, respectively. Miami posted a 43-20 overall record en route to claiming the NCAA Coral Gables Regional title, and advancing to the NCAA Gainesville Super Regional.

**Encinosa Has a Career Day in Gainesville...**

**Morris.** In fact, UM has claimed 50-plus wins 19 times in school history, and 60-plus wins on three occasions. Miami posted at least 40 wins from 1973-1986, marking one of the longest streaks in NCAA history with a school collected 40 or more wins in consecutive years.

### Miami in the ACC...

The 2011 season marks the seventh season the 'Canes have played in the Atlantic Coast Conference, and last year's 20-10 regular season mark in league play was the program's second-best behind the 2008 ACC championship squad that won 23 regular season league games.

### Miami Jumps 12 Spots in Latest RPI Poll...

Sitting at No. 42 just a week ago in the RPI standings, the University of Miami made a leap 12 spot this week to No. 30, with wins against UCF and Wake Forest – two teams with high strength of schedules and RPIs. The sweep of Wake Forest by the 'Canes definitely helped after the Demon Deacons took two-of-three in the series victory over the Tar Heels two weeks ago in Winston-Salem, N.C.

### Last Time vs. FGCU (3/29/11)...

The University of Miami scored in each of the first five innings, and sophomore Steven Ewing took care of the rest, as the Hurricanes blew out the visiting Florida Gulf Coast Eagles, 11-2,

Tuesday evening at Alex Rodriguez Park.

Eight different starters reached base, as the Hurricanes (15-11) scored a season-high in runs scored. Sophomores Zeke DeVoss and Michael Broad each hit home runs, as the Hurricanes recorded five extra-base hits in the win.

Ewing (3-1, 2.60 ERA) threw 4 1/3 innings of no-hit baseball in earning the victory. After Ewing left in the sixth inning, the bullpen returned to dominance to allow FGCU (13-13) just three hits and no runs in the final 3 1/3 innings.

Miami scored in the first when Harold Martinez recorded his team-leading 19th RBI with a sacrifice fly to drive in the speedy DeVoss from third.

In the second inning, Miami added two more runs as freshman right fielder Dale Carey hit his first double of the year to drive in Chris Pelaez and Brad Fieger. The runs effectively ended the night for FGCU starter Brandon Bixler (0-3) who took the loss after leaving in the second inning with no outs.

After Miami plated another score in the third inning, the 'Canes blew it open, scoring six runs in the fourth inning – capped off by DeVoss' grand slam (his first since May 27, 2010 vs. Boston College in the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament in Greensboro, N.C.).

UMiami forced FGCU Eagles head coach Dave Tollett to go to his bullpen early and often, using four pitchers through the first five frames, as the Hurricanes walked a season-high tying eight times in addition to their 11 hits.

DeVoss recorded four RBI to lead the 'Canes, while Fieger, Carey, and Shane Rowland each added two RBI as Miami put a halt to a recent three-game skid.

The Hurricanes now hit the road, returning to ACC action against Boston College this weekend in Chestnut Hill, Mass. The first game of the series will be Friday, April 1, at 2:30 p.m. Miami will throw freshman Bryan Radziewski (3-2, 2.48 ERA) to open the series, while Boston College's starter will be announced following its game on Wednesday evening.

## Free Baseball...

The Hurricanes are 2-2 in extra-inning games this year. The last extra-inning contest came against Georgia Tech on March 26, 2011, in a 10-inning affair in Coral Gables. UMiami began the year accomplishing a task that has never been achieved in school history – back-to-back games to open a season. The 'Canes went 1-1 in the opening two days against Rutgers.

## Morris Has Surgery to Remove Gall Bladder...

On Friday, March 25, 18th-year head coach **Jim Morris** received surgery to remove his gall bladder at the University of Miami Hospital. He stayed in the hospital a few extra days due to an infection stemming from the surgery. The skipper returned faster than expected to the 'Canes dugout, coaching against Illinois State (March 8) after missing a total of seven games - six consecutive.

## Morris Signs Contract Extension...

On Sept. 20, 2009, former University of Miami Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt announced that head baseball coach **Jim Morris** signed a contract extension through 2015. Morris, who is in his 17th season at the helm of the Miami baseball program, has led the Hurricanes to the College World Series in 11 of his 17 seasons in Coral Gables – including National Championship runs in 1999 and 2001.

## Miami Gets Them Drafted...

Over the last three years, Miami has produced four first round MLB draft picks, more than any other school in the nation. Last year, Yasmani Grandal was selected in the first round by the Cincinnati Reds, with four other players—David Gutierrez (Minnesota Twins), Chris Hernandez (Boston Red Sox), Scott Lawson (Houston Astros) and Iden Nazario (Washington Nationals) all taken on the second day of the Draft.

## Two of a Kind...

University of Miami head coach **Jim Morris** entered the season with 776 career wins with the Hurricanes and registered 504 wins at Georgia Tech prior to his arrival in Coral Gables. Morris is one of only two head coaches to ever amass 500 or more wins at two separate Division I schools. Augie Garrido at the University of Texas entered the year with 602 wins with the Longhorns program. Garrido logged 928 wins as head coach at Cal State Fullerton before his current stint in Austin.

## Closing In On the Lucky "8"...

Jim Morris is enjoying his 18th year at the helm in Coral Gables, and the skipper is closing in on his 800th career win. Morris sits at 793 wins at UMiami entering Wednesday's game against Florida Gulf Coast.

## New Era Behind the Plate...

Three catchers will be battling for playing time behind the plate this year, including junior **David Villasuso**. A season ago, Villasuso batted .245 with 20 RBI and five home runs while serving as a backup to MLB First Round Draft selection and 2010 ACC Player of the Year, Yasmani Grandal.

Others battling for playing time this season will be freshmen **Corey Janson** and **Shane Rowland**. After the fall season, Villasuso will probably make the start to begin the season, but don't be surprised if and when Rowland takes the spot behind the dish with improved confidence and skill.

## Athletics Gets a Changing of the Guard...

On March 3, the University of Miami Department of Athletics and UMiami President Dr. Donna E. Shalala announced that Tony Hernandez would succeed Kirby Hocutt as Interim Director of Athletics. Hocutt resigned a week prior to take a similar position at Texas Tech University. Hernandez has served in a variety of areas within the Department of Athletics at UM in his 13 years of service, including the last year and a half as Deputy Athletic Director.

## Fresh Faces In the Dugout...

This season, head coach **Jim Morris** has one of his youngest teams in recent memory. UMiami has 13 newcomers on this year's roster (12 freshman and one sophomore transfer). The 'Canes lost 2010 ACC Player of the Year, Yasmani Grandal, to the MLB Draft—Grandal was selected 12th overall in the Draft.

## 'Canes In the Classroom...

During the fall semester of 2010, the University of Miami baseball team recorded its highest team GPA ever. Freshman catcher **Corey Janson** collected a 4.0 GPA last semester, giving him one of the highest GPAs in the entire UMiami Athletic Department.

## Rookie Gets the Ball...

In starting the season-opener against Rutgers, freshman pitcher **Bryan Radziewski** became the first Hurricanes rookie hurler to start an opening night

game in the 18-year tenure under head coach **Jim Morris**. Radziewski, a Florida Christian School alum, was named the Florida Class 1-4A Player of the Year in 2010 as a senior in high school.

#### You've Gotta Start Somewhere...

Sophomore **Joey Porro** made his first collegiate start (second base) on Feb. 26 against Appalachian State; followed by another start against Illinois State (shortstop) on March 9. Porro was a student-manager for UM in 2010, only to earn two starts and post a .286 average with two hits, three runs driven in and one score thus far in 2011.

## ALEX RODRIGUEZ PARK INFORMATION

Renovations to Alex Rodriguez Park are thanks in large part to a \$3.9 million contribution by New York Yankees third baseman and 11-time MLB All-Star Alex Rodriguez. The gift - the largest ever to the University of Miami baseball program - has assisted the program in continuing to develop first-class facilities. The official announcement of his gift was made on Oct. 10, 2002.

Alex Rodriguez Park has taken form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.
- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box – along with four VIP suites – have been built atop the grandstand. This past offseason, addition seating was added down both lines while a new scoreboard was constructed in left field.
