


WEEKEND STORY LINES & NEWS

- No. 4 Miami wraps up a seven-game homestand with an ACC series against visiting Clemson from March 25-27 (ESPN3).
- Miami leads the all-time series with Clemson 35-28-1, having won two straight series and seven of the last 10 matchups.
- The Hurricanes' #4 ranking from Baseball America is its highest from BA since a similar #4 ranking in the final poll of 2008.
- Miami is ranked in the top 10 of every major college baseball poll. The Hurricanes check in at No. 4 in NCBWA and Baseball America, No. 5 in Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and the USA Today Coaches Poll & No. 7 by D1Baseball.com.
- Head coach Jim Morris won his 1,500th game as a Division I head coach in an 8-4, walk-off win over No. 4 Louisville
 on March 18. With seven more wins in 2016, Morris will move into fifth place in all-time Division I wins (Larry Hays, 1,508).
- Bryan Garcia is in sole possession of fourth place in all-time saves (33) in UM history; he leads the ACC with eight saves.
- The Hurricanes made their 24th trip to the College World Series in 2015, finishing with a 50-17 record and a 22-8 mark
 in ACC play. Miami was the No. 5 national seed for the postseason, and won its second straight ACC Coastal Division title.
- In a preseason poll of ACC head coaches, the Hurricanes were picked to win the ACC Coastal Division in 2016.
- Miami returned several hitters from an offense that ranked No. 1 nationwide in runs scored in 2015, including Preseason All-America Zack Collins, two-time All-ACC outfielder Willie Abreu and CWS All-Tournament selection Jacob Heyward.



It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans, University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams in his 23rd season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in both 2008 and 2014.

In his 22-plus season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 43 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 12 of Morris' 22 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2015, when Miami was awarded the No. 5 national seed heading into the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 16 of 22 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13-straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 31 years - 22 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 998-409-3 (.706) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,502-653-4 (.694) Division I record in 33 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 37 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,632-694-4 (.698) mark.


In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 22 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

Morris became just the sixth coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500win plateau when Miami topped Louisville 8-4 in dramatic fashion on March 18, 2016. A walk-off grand slam from junior Willie Abreu gave Morris his 1,500th.

In 2015, Morris led the Hurricanes to their second straight ACC Coastal Division title, the 24th College World Series appearance in program history, and reached the 50-win mark for the 12th time in his 22 seasons.

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history. The conference win total set a new record for the program and tied the ACC's all-time single-season win total.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22. The Hurricanes, who have never missed the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship since joining the ACC in 2004, qualified for their 10th straight conference tournament under Morris and earned a Regional host spot for their 42nd consecutive postseason trip.



Morris has reached a number of other coaching milestones in his time in Coral Gables. His 1,000th Division-I game on April 4, 2004, at his old stomping grounds at Georgia Tech. He also achieved another milestone during the 2004 season, winning his 500th game at the helm of the Miami program. Morris' 500th win came just a few weeks following his 1,000th overall win as a Division-I head coach by beating Florida State 7-3 on April 17.

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), and Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston). Several more Hurricanes during the Morris tenure are right on the cusp of making the show, including Mike Rodriguez (Houston), David Gil (Cincinnati) and Jon Jay (St. Louis). Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta.

WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES

HOMESTAND ENDS WITH TIGERS

- Miami wraps a seven-game homestand with an ACC series against visiting Clemson from March 25-27. All three games will be shown on ESPN3 (7 p.m., 7 p.m., 1 p.m.)
- The Hurricanes carry a **35-28-1 all-time lead** in the head-to-head series against the Tigers, including a **16-1-0-1 lead** in games played in Coral Gables. Miami has won seven of the last **10 matchups**.
- Miami has posted back-to-back series wins against Clemson, sweeping the Tigers at Doug Kingsmore Stadium in 2014 and winning two of three at The Light in 2013.
- The Tigers are off to a 17-3 start including a 5-1 record in ACC play under first-year head coach Monte Lee.

MORRIS EARNS #1500 IN STYLE

- With a walk-off grand slam by junior Willie Abreu vs. Louisville on March 18, Miami head coach Jim Morris became just the sixth coach in history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500-win milestone.
- Morris, who has won 997 games during his illustrious 22-year-plus tenure at Miami, is three wins away from becoming the second coach in Miami history to reach 1,000 wins at the helm (Ron Fraser - 1,267).
- With eight more wins, Morris will move past Larry Hays (1,508) as the fifth-winningest coach in Division I baseball history by victories.
 - Since his arrival in 1994, Miami's 997 wins are sixth-most in D1.

CANES HAND CARDS 1ST ACC SERIES LOSS

- By capturing the **first two games** of a weekend series against **#4 Louisville** (8-4 in Game 1, 6-3 in Game 2) from March 18-20, Miami handed UofL its **first ACC series loss** since joining the conference.
- Miami is now 4-2 in ACC play through its first two weekends, having won both of its first two ACC series (Virginia Tech, Louisville).

USA TODAY TABS MIAMI #3 PROGRAM

- In a ranking of Division I baseball programs by athletic competitiveness, academic quality, return on investment and leadership, Miami was ranked the No. 3 program in America by USA Today.
 - Miami trailed only Vanderbilt & LSU in the list released on March 4.

COMEBACK CANES TOP HOKIES

- After dropping its ACC opener 14-3 on March 11 in Blacksburg, Miami came back to win the final two games of the series (11-6, 7-2).
- The road series win marked Miami's fourth in its last five ACC road trips dating to 2015, and the Hurricanes' fourth straight series win over the Hokies overall. UM is 28-8 all-time against Virginia Tech.

CLIMBING UP THE RECORD BOOKS

- Closer Bryan Garcia entered the year with the **fifth-most saves in Miami history (25)**, and has gotten off to a hot start in 2016. His **eighth save** of 2016 came last time out vs. **Bethune-Cookman** (3/23).
- Garcia is chasing the all-time record for saves in a career, which is **39** held by **George Huguet** (2001-2004). Garcia's 15 saves as a freshman in 2014 tied for the **seventh-most in a single season**.
- Garcia moved past **Danny Graves** (1992-94) for sole possession of fourth place (29), and needs one more to tie **Robbie Morrison** (1996 98) for third (34), four more to tie **Rick Raether** (1984-86) for second (37) and is six behind **Huguet** for first (39).

WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES

LOOKING FOR A THREE-PEAT

- Miami won its second straight ACC Coastal Division title in 2015, posting a 22-8 record in ACC play to earn the division crown.
- The Hurricanes, who were picked to win the ACC Coastal Division once again in 2016, won 46 ACC games over the 2014-2015 seasons - the second-best two-year stretch by any program since ACC expanded to a 30-game conference schedule prior to 2005.
- Miami has won the ACC Regular Season Championship twice, most recently in 2014 when the Canes finished 24-6; the Hurricanes won the ACC regular season crown & ACC Tournament in 2008.

HEATING UP

- Miami has won eight of its last 10 games key to that stretch has been junior Zack Collins (.400, three HRs, 10 RBI), junior Jacob Heyward (.344, two HRs, eight RBI), and sophomore Carl Chester (.325, two doubles, four RBI, three steals).
- Leaders on the hill include junior Danny Garcia (1-1, 2.25 ERA, 12.0 innings), junior **Bryan Garcia** (0.96 ERA, seven appearances, five saves, 17 strikeouts, 9.1 innings) and freshman Andrew Cabezas (1-0, 1.54 ERA, 11.2 innings, 15 strikeouts).

CANES SWEEP JASPERS

- Miami cruised to a weekend sweep of Manhattan at Mark Light Field from March 4-6; the Hurricanes outscored the Jaspers 31-8 in the three-game series, while the staff recorded a collective 2.33 ERA.
- Among Miami's top performers at the plate against the Jaspers were Edgar Michelangeli (.750, 9-for-12, 3 RBI), junior Zack Collins (.625, 5-for-8, 1 HR, 5 RBI) & sophomore Carl Chester (.400, 4-for 10, 5 runs, 3 RBI); UM hit .371 as a team and recorded 39 hits vs. MC.
- Senior lefthander Thomas Woodrey delivered a brilliant start against the Jaspers in the series opener, tossing eight shutout innings, allowing two hits, one walk and striking out a career-best 10 batters.
- In 20 combined innings against Manhattan, Miami's starting pitchers went 3-0, allowed 11 hits, surrendered one earned run and totaled 18 strikeouts and just five walks (0.45 combined ERA).

MIAMI HANDS #1 FLORIDA FIRST LOSS

- Miami dropped two of three in its weekend series with No. 1 Florida at Mark Light Field from Feb. 26-28; the Hurricanes won Game 2 by a final score of 5-3, but dropped Games 1 and 3.
- The Hurricanes got five strong innings from lefthander Michael Mediavilla (2-0) Saturday and four RBI from sluger Zack Collins.
- Saturday's 5-3 win was played in front of a sellout crowd of 4,999; over 13,000 fans made their way through the gates to see the annual rivalry between the Hurricanes and Gators.

OPENING WEEKEND SWEEP

- Led by dominant performances from the starting rotation, Miami opened its 2016 season with a sweep of visiting Rutgers Feb. 19-21.
- Lefthanders Thomas Woodrey (5 IP, 1 ER), Michael Mediavilla (6 IP, O R, 7 K) and Danny Garcia (7 IP, O R, 4 K) combined for a 0.50 ERA with two walks and 15 strikeouts in 18 innings of work.
- Junior Johnny Ruiz led the offense with a .667 (6-for-9) average against the Scarlet Knights.

WEEKEND SERIES NEWS & NOTES

HIGH EXPECTATIONS

- Miami was ranked in the top 10 in preseason polls from nearly every major college baseball outlet, including a No. 4 ranking from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and a No. 6 ranking from several outlets.
- Miami's preseason ranking of No. 4 from *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* was its **highest from the publication since 2005**; its No. 6 ranking from *Baseball America* was its highest from BA since **2007**.

DESTINATION: OMAHA

- Miami made its return to the College World Series in 2015, marking the program's first trip to Omaha, Neb., since 2008. Miami's 24 College World Series trips are the second-most of any program.
- The Hurricanes have won **48 games** in the College World Series, the **fourth-most** of any program nationwide; Miami's **four national championships** (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) rank **fifth-most**.

ONES TO WATCH

- Two Hurricanes picked up 2016 Preseason All-America honors: junior catcher **Zack Collins** and junior closer **Bryan Garcia**.
- Collins, a unanimous Preseason All-America candidate, was among the 50 players named to the initial watch list for the Golden Spikes Award by USA Baseball. He was also named to last year's list.
- Garcia, who was recognized by Louisville Slugger and Perfect Game, was named to the watch list for the Stopper of the Year Award by NCBWA for the second straight year.
- Both players have earned All-America recognition in their two-year Hurricane careers; Collins was a third-team ABCA/Rawlings All America choice last season, while Garcia was a NCBWA third-team All American after his freshman year in 2014.
- UM had three All-Americans in 2015: **David Thompson** (unanimous), **George Iskenderian** (NCBWA) & **Collins** (ABCA).

MIAMI ADDS ANOTHER MAJOR LEAGUER

- Arizona Diamondbacks slugger **Peter O'Brien** became the **53rd** former University of Miami player to play in Major League Baseball when he was called up late in 2015.
- O'Brien joined a 2015 group that included now Oakland A's teammates **Yonder Alonso** and **Danny Valencia**, new San Diego Padres outfielder **Jon Jay**, Dodgers All-Star catcher **Yasmani Grandal**, new D-Backs catcher/outfielder **Chris Herrmann**, infielders **Ryan Jackson** and **Jemile Weeks** and Milwaukee All-Star **Ryan Braun**.
- Miami had five players selected in the 2015 MLB Draft: lefthander Andrew Suarez, third baseman David Thompson, infielder George Iskenderian, catcher Garrett Kennedy and outfielder Ricky Eusebio.

ESPN NETWORK TO CARRY HOME SCHEDULE

- All 37 of Miami's home games will be carried on the ESPN Networks in 2016; 35 games will be broadcast on ESPN3, while a pair of games against Louisville are tentatively slated for ESPNU.
- In total, 46 of Miami's 55 games are tentatively slated for broadcast on ESPN Networks.
- 560 WQAM, the flagship radio station for Miami Athletics, is tentatively slated to carry 15 regular season games throughout the 2016 season. WVUM 90.5 FM carries every game, home and away.






