NATION'S TOP OFFENSE

At 86.9 points per game, the Miami offense is the highest scoring among the NCAA's 336 Division I teams. The Canes are also highly ranked in scoring margin (3rd - 31.6), steals per game (2nd - 16.3) and turnover margin (2nd - 10.3).

"EPIC" PERFORMANCE

After rolling her ankle in Miami's win at Michigan State on Dec. 1, it wasn't a guarantee that Riguna Williams would play against No. 11 Rutgers on Dec. 5. Not only did Williams play, she dropped a career-best 36 points on one of the best defenses in the nation. Williams only had five points at halftime, but poured in 31 in the second half and two overtime sessions in helping the Canes erase a 16-point second-half deficit and defeat the Scarlet Knights, 92-81.

EXPLOSIVE DUO

During the 2010-11 season, Riquna Williams and Shenise Johnson combined for 50 or more points on five occasions. Against Rutgers (12/5) the duo combined for 61 points - the most ever for the two seniors.

HIGH PRAISE FOR THE CANES

After Miami defeated Michigan State in the Big Ten/ ACC Challenge, Spartan head coach Suzy Merchant said, "I'm not surprised. We knew what they were going to do. We practiced against six and seven guys on our scout team. But from 1 to 5, that's the fastest, most athletic team we've faced in my career. We've played Duke, and it's not even close.'

ULM's Mona Martin had even more praise to hand out, saying, "Last year we played Texas A&M, and they end up winning the thing [NCAA title], and I think this UM team could be a big contender for the national championship if they stay healthy," Martin said. "They have so much depth, play so hard. They're going to be way up there this year. I've watched a lot of film, lot of ballgames, and they run the floor better than any team I've watched from point guard to post. Their transition offense is unbelievable. I can't say we've ever played a team that runs the floor that well, and I've been in this business 36 vears. There is a lot of desire and fight in those kids."

PROTECTING THE BANKUNITED CENTER

With Miami's season-opening win over Texas-Pan American, the Canes won their 25th-consecutive home contest - setting a new program record. Miami has extended that record to 30 games after its 103-39 victory over ULM on Dec. 16. The streak is currently the third-longest active streak in the nation. Connecticut (91) and Stanford (67) are the two teams with longer active win streaks. Coincidentally, Stanford's Tara VanDerveer, Connecticut's Geno Auriemma and Miami's Katie Meier shared last season's AP National Coach of the Year Award.

The streak began with the team's final regular season home game of the 2009-10 season and continued with a perfect 20-0 home record last season.

The previous record of 24 straight wins at home was set from the 1990-91 through the 1992-93 seasons.

DOUBLE-FIGURE STREAK

With 16 points against OULM on Dec. 16, senior Shenise Johnson has now scored in double-figures in 81 straight games. After conducting a nation-wide survey, that streak is the longest of any player in the country.

MORE THAN ANY OTHER

After wins over Rutgers (12/5) - 36 points - and Ole Miss (12/10) - 17 points - Riquna Williams was voted the ACC Player of the Week for the seventh time in her career. No other active player has earned the award more than Williams. Second place on that list with six awards is Shenise Johnson.

THE ACC KNOWS

Johnson, the ACC Preseason Player of the Year and a preseason All-American, scored a game-high 18 points in a 72-55 victory over Alaska Anchorage in the Great Alaska Shootout's first round, earning Player of the Game honors. In the tournament final against USF, Johnson nearly recorded a triple-double with 11 points, nine rebounds and nine assists. For her performance in the two games, Johnson was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

The Henrietta, N.Y., native amassed game-highs in points (22), rebounds (6), assists (8) and steals (7) against Longwood in a 92-43 victory to wrap up the week.

The weekly honor is the sixth of Johnson's career, trailing only teammate Riguna Williams for the most active weekly accolades in the conference.

THREE-POINT STREAK

With eight three-pointers against ULM, the Canes have made at least one three-point field goal in 335 straight games dating back to the 2000-01 season.

THE BIG TEN/ACC CHALLENGE

The women's 2011 Big Ten/ACC Challenge ended in a 6-6 draw in its fifth year. The ACC won each of the previous four challenges.

Miami earned its first victory in the challenge in three attempts with its 76-60 victory at Michigan State. The Canes fell to Michigan in 2007 and then Indiana in 2008.

BIG-TIME TEAM ON THE SMALL SCREEN

The Nov. 17 meeting with Tennessee was the first of 12 games that will be televised this season - a program record. Miami's next televised contest will be its ACC home-opener when it faces NC State at the BankUnited Center on Jan. 5. ESPNU will provide coverage beginning at 7 p.m.

Where Miami Ranks

GREAT ALASKA SHOOTOUT CHAMPIONS

The Hurricanes won their first Great Alaska Shootout in their third appearance in the event. A win over host Alaska Anchorage in the opening round and then over USF in the final gave the Canes the championship.

Shenise Johnson was named the Shootout Most Outstanding Player and earned Player of the Game honors against UAA. Riquna Williams was named the Player of the Game against the Bulls.

In their previous two appearances the Canes had a combined 3-3 record.

CANES BACKCOURT NAMED TO WATCHLISTS

The University of Miami's Shenise Johnson and Riquna Williams have been named to the Women's Preseason Nominee List for the 2011 John R. Wooden Award. The duo has also been selected to the "Wade Watch" list for the State Farm Wade Trophy Division I Player of the Year, as well as the Naismith Player of the Year List.

ON THE DOUBLE

Shenise Johnson and Morgan Stroman have each recorded at least one double-double for the Hurricanes this season. Johnson's second double-double of the season (25 points/12 rebounds) against No. 11 Rutgers gave her 29 for her career - tied for 12th in the nation among active players. Central Arkansas' Megan Herbert is the current leader at 50 career double-doubles.

MORE TO COME

National Player of the Year candidate Shenise Johnson ranks in the Top 10 of many categories for UM career records including points (4th), assists (6th), rebounds (5th), and steals (4th). Johnson is the only player in Miami history to be ranked in the Top 10 of all four of those categories.

MOVING UP THE RANKS

Shenise Johnson currently sits in fourth place all-time at Miami with 1,895 career points and needs 290 points to pass Frances Savage (1988-92) for third place. With 1,825 points, Riquna Williams ranks fifth all-time.

JOHNSON TABBED ACC PRESEASON POY

Shenise Johnson returns as the 2011-12 ACC Preseason Player of the Year. The senior was named the 2010-11 ACC Player of the Year, the first Hurricane player to win the award, and voted to last year's All-ACC First Team and All-ACC Defensive team.

TOP-10 MATCH UP IN TIP-OFF CLASSIC

On. Nov. 15. the seventh-ranked Hurricanes traveled to Knoxville. Tenn. to face the third-ranked Lady Vols in the 19th Annual State Farm Tip-Off Classic.

Miami was led by the performances of seniors Riquna Williams and Shenise Johnson, who scored 24 and 17 points, respectively.

However, an early second-half run from Tennessee broke the halftime tie and in the end, five Lady Vols scored in double-figures in the game, leading to a 92-76 Tennessee victory.

CANES OPEN SEASON RANKED SEVENTH

The Hurricanes, who finished the 2010-2011 season ranked tenth in the final ESPN/ USA Today Coaches' Poll, moved up three spots in anticipation of their 2011-12 season. The No. 7 ranking in the Coaches' Poll is the highest rank in program history to begin a season

The Hurricanes were also ranked No. 7 in the preseason Associated Press Poll.

Miami is currently ranked seventh in the AP Poll and eighth in the ESPN/USA Today's Coaches Poll.

MIAMI DUO NAMED PRESEASON ALL-ACC

The Preseason All-ACC Team is highlighted by the Miami senior guard tandem of Johnson and Williams. The two led the Canes to a 20-0 home record last season at the BankUnited Center

Johnson, the first Associate Press Preseason All-American in team history, earned 2010-11 ACC Player of the Year honors and her second straight selection to the All-ACC First Team, Williams, who led the conference and finished 11th in the nation in scoring, is also coming off a selection to the All-ACC First Team

CANE NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

University of Miami senior guard Shenise Johnson was one of five players named to the Associated Press Preseason All-America Team.

Johnson, who earned 25 of 40 potential votes, was joined on the preseason team by Baylor's Brittney Griner (40 votes), Notre Dame's Skylar Diggins (37), Stanford's Nnemkadi Ogwumike (37) and Tennessee's Shekinna Stricklen (21).

Johnson became the first player from Miami to make the preseason All-America team.

MIAMI VOTED ACC FAVORITES

The Hurricanes women's basketball team has been predicted to finish atop the 2011-12 ACC Women's Basketball standings for the first time since joining the league in 2004. The predictions were made by a vote of the Blue Ribbon Panel, consisting of national and local media, as well as school representatives.

The Hurricanes, who earned 30 of a possible 40 firstplace votes, are coming off the ultimate turnaround in which the squad finished 12th in 2009-10 and then tied with Duke for the ACC regular season crown one year later. The 12 ACC wins last season were the most for the UM program in the league, while Miami also won 20 games for the 10th time in program history.

Head Coach Katie Meier

Katie Meier enters her seventh season as the head coach of the Hurricanes' women's basketball program in 2011-12. A well known and respected figure in women's basketball, Meier has worked tirelessly to put her mark on Miami's program and to build a winning tradition. All of her hard work was rewarded after the 2010-11 season as she was named the Associated Press National Coach of the Year - sharing the award with Connecticut's Geno Auriemma and Stanford's Tara VanDerveer.

Meier led the Hurricanes into the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2004 and its win over Gardner-Webb in the first round was the first tournament win for the 'Canes since 1993. Miami entered the 2010-11 season with high internal expectations, but were picked eighth in the Preseason ACC Poll and were coming off a season in which it was the No. 12 seed in the ACC Tournament.

However, the Hurricanes exceeded all of the outside expectations and at one point, won 17 straight games. They were a perfect 20-0 inside the BankUnited Center and finished 12-2 in ACC play - earning their first regular season conference title since joining the league in 2004. As a reward, Meier was named the

ACC Coach of the Year and later would be selected as the WBCA/RUSSELL ATHLETIC Region 2 Coach of the Year, as voted on by her peers.

Hired on April 19, 2005, then UM Athletics Director Paul Dee announced the appointment of Meier in front of national and local media, fans, alumni and support staff, signifying the beginning of a new era.

Following an unprecedented career as one of the greatest athletes to ever play in the Atlantic Coast Conference, Meier quickly established herself in the coaching ranks. Upon her appointment at UM, following an impressive four-year tenure as the head coach at Charlotte where she helped bring the 49er program into national prominence, Meier made it clear that her goal is to make Miami one of the premier women's basketball programs in the country.

In her first season, Meier wasted little time in making the first steps towards those goals. After receiving little attention in the ACC preseason polls, the Hurricanes posted an impressive overall record of 17-13. After fighting through a conference that would send nine teams to the postseason, including three to the NCAA Final Four. Miami finished with a sixth-place, 6-8 record in ACC play en route to earning a berth into the second round of the 2006 Women's National Invitation Tournament.

Throughout the season Miami posted wins over ranked teams such as Mississippi (No. 25), Boston College (No. 21) and Virginia Tech (No. 25)-and nearly knocked off then-No. 1 Duke in double-overtime. The Hurricanes also recorded wins over two eventual conference champions in Hartford (America East) and Oakland (Mid-Continent). Under her direction, standout Tamara James produced one of the greatest seasons ever seen by a UM player in 2005-06, including becoming the University's all-time leading scorer before being taken as the No. 8 overall pick in the 2006 WNBA Draft by the Washington Mystics.

In Meier's second season in 2006-07, the Hurricanes got off to a strong start, winning seven of their first eight games--including a 79-70 win over Indiana to claim the UM Thanksgiving Tournament title. On Dec. 1, Meier picked up her 100th career victory as the Hurricanes defeated Jackson State, 77-50. However, with only eight healthy players to call upon by the start of the ACC schedule, Miami faced challenge after challenge competing in a league that ranked among the top-three strongest women's basketball conferences nationally and produced two of the NCAA Tournament's four No. 1 seeds in 2006-07.

Regardless, Renee Taylor emerged as the ACC's leading scorer-upholding Miami's streak of producing the league's leading scorer in all three years it had been a member. The AlL-ACC Second Team selection set school records in singlegame scoring with 42 points at Houston and became the 19th Hurricane to score at least 1,000 points–and just the sixth to do so in her first two seasons. In addition, transfer Maurita Reid emerged as a defensive threat, tying the school record with 10 steals versus Wake Forest and finishing among the ACC's leaders and NCAA's top 10 in steals per game.

The 2007-08 season, Meier's third with the Hurricanes, saw Maurita Reid continue her rise among the ACC elite. The senior was nothing short of impressive shooting beyond the arc and picking opponent's pockets. She hit four or more three-pointers on 10 different occasions and finished the season with 110 steals, good for second in the conference and fifth in the NCAA. The Queens, N.Y. native led the team in points (15.3 ppg) and rebounding (5.6 rpg) and was also named the ACC All-Defensive Team.

With a No. 21 incoming recruiting class, Meier and the Hurricanes saw significant improvement during the 2008-09 season. The freshman class was highlighted by McDonald's All-American Shenise Johnson - out of Henrietta, N.Y. and Riquna Williams - from nearby Pahokee, Fla.

Johnson lived up to the hype as she was the team leader on the season in points, rebounds, assists and steals. Under Meier's guidance, Johnson was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on three occasions and was named to the ACC All-Freshmen team as well as ACC Honorable Mention. The versatile guard/forward also led the U19 USA team to a gold medal finish in the 2009 World Championships in Bangkok, Thailand.

The 2009-10 season was one of the most successful in program history. Under Meier's vision, the Hurricanes advanced to the WNIT Championship game. Miami posted a 22-14 overall record - the first 20-win campaign since the 2002-03 season and just the eighth all-time.

In her sophomore season, Johnson was joined by a healthy Riquna Williams and the duo racked up accolades throughout the season. Johnson was named First Team All-ACC, while Williams garnered second-team honors. The tandem led Miami to a 5-1 WNIT record - the deepest postseason run in team history - with both earning all-tournament honors along the way.

Following the 2009-10 campaign, University of Miami Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt announced that Meier signed a contract extension through 2015.

"We are excited about the tremendous progress our women's basketball team achieved this past season," said Hocutt. "Coach Meier continues to assemble a special group of talented young women at the University of Miami and we look forward to the future success of our program."

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - Miami was leading by 20 points, and coach Katie Meier was steaming mad at halftime anyway

"You are plaving," she said, "as bad as my haircut."

OK, so Meier's locks were a bit out of place Friday. Maybe it was worth a bad hair day to see national player of the year candidate Shenise Johnson come within an assist of a triple-double, have nine different players score and the seventh-ranked Hurricanes open their season with an 83-37 win over Texas-Pan American.

Johnson finished with 20 points, 13 rebounds and nine assists, Riguna Williams scored 16 points and the Hurricanes (1-0) forced 35 turnovers on the way to winning their 25th straight game at home, a program record.

"Not quite sure exactly why we were so awkward to start the game," said Meier, who won the AP's national coach of the year award last season. "I don't know a better word. It just felt very awkward. There was no flow, there was no rhythm, there was no energy and that was really disappointing. ... I'm sure it had to do a lot with Texas-Pan Am.'

Say this for Texas-Pan American: The Broncs weren't intimidated early. Miami's lead was only 24-13 with less than 4 minutes left in the first half before the Hurricanes hit five straight shots, the last two by Stefanie Yderstrom.

The Hurricanes were shooting 23 percent late in the half then shot 54 percent the rest of the way. "We found out what you have to do and how hard to you have to play to play against a team like this," Broncs coach Denny Downing said. "I think we learned from their passion, because obviously they're very passionate about what they're doing."

LaQuita Garner scored 14 for the Broncs (0-1). Texas-Pan American played some of the Big 12's toughest teams last season - Baylor, Texas, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State - and lost them all by an average of 50.8 points.

This one didn't seem as though it would turn into one of those blowouts, not the way the Broncs hung around for much of the first half.

Yderstrom and Morgan Stroman scored 12 each for the Hurricanes, who visit No. 3 Tennessee on Tuesday

"We had it in mind." Yderstrom acknowledged afterward, when asked about the looming trip to Knoxville. "You can't overlook any competition. I think they gave us a good game, especially in the first half. We needed it."

Johnson was nearly perfect on the day. She shot 6 for 9 from the field, made all eight of her foul shots and controlled pace for the Hurricanes.

"The opponent is our opponent," Johnson said. "But if Miami does what Miami is supposed to do, we'll win. I don't think we were looking ahead. I think we were just worried about Miami.

And while it was the beginning of a season with Final Four hopes, Miami's start was more than a little rustv.

Miami was 6 for 26 from the field in the first 16 minutes, an uncharacteristic clip for a team that shot 43 percent last season. Here's a great example of how cold the Hurricanes were in the opener: There was one possession where four players all missed shots and Miami came away empty, a series that had Meier pivoting around and taking a somewhat purposeful walk a few steps down the sideline.

Eventually, the defending Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season co-champions got going, making their final five shots of the opening half. Yderstrom hit a 3-pointer with 1:22 left to push the lead to 33-13. and she converted a nifty reverse layup about a minute later to keep the margin at 20 points going into halftime

So while Miami couldn't have liked the offensive numbers in the first 20 minutes, the defense made up for at least some of the trouble at the other end. In the first half, Texas-Pan American had 21 shot attempts - and 20 turnovers, unable to handle Miami's pressure.

In the second half, the offensive surge just kept going. The Hurricanes made seven of their first 13 shots after intermission, capped by a three-point play by Pepper Wilson with 13:14 left that gave Miami a 54-28 lead.

"Our bench did a fantastic job of changing our rhythm," Meier said. "And that's fun."

TENNESSEE 92, MIAMI 76 - NOV. 15, 2011

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP) - Pat Summitt has fielded plenty of questions about her health lately. Certainly nothing has changed about her ability to grill her players at halftime when she's disappointed in their performance.

The third-ranked Lady Vols came into halftime tied at 42 with seventh-ranked Miami after being manhandled on the boards. Summitt got onto them hard during her halftime speech, and they responded with a 92-76 victory on Tuesday night in the State Farm Tip-Off Classic.

"If you ever doubt if Pat Summitt is still coaching, look at how our team responds coming out in the second half," associate head coach Holly Warlick said. "She got on them pretty hard. We all did as a staff about our rebounding effort, our hustle plays that weren't there. We challenged them for 20 minutes, and I think they responded."

It was the first big test of the season for two veteran teams, and the matchup lived up to its billing in the first-ever meeting for the programs.

Though the game pitted preseason All-Americans Shekinna Stricklen and Shenise Johnson ag one another, the spotlight was stolen by Taber Spani and Meighan Simmons, who together hit 7 of 13 from 3-point range.

The Lady Vols (2-0) came out after intermission and unleashed an 18-4 run to take control. Glo Johnson, who struggled in the first half against Miami's inside defense, hit a layup that made it 60-46 with 16:19 to go.

The Lady Vols got sloppy, committing three turnovers that helped the Hurricanes charge back with nine unanswered points to cut the margin to seven, and with 7:31 to go, Shenise Johnson hit a jumper to cut the Lady Vols' lead to 73-68.

Miami (1-1) would get no closer. Two possessions later, Spani took an inbound pass with 10 seconds on the shot clock and launched a 3-pointer that hit nothing but net as the buzzer sounded.

"I thought that was the turning point of the game, as we were struggling kind of to get back in it," Miami coach Katie Meier said.

A couple of minutes later, Spani rebounded a missed 3-point attempt by Shenise Johnson and launched the ball across the court to Simmons, who charged to the basket for a layup to make it 84-68.

The basket capped an 11-0 run that began with Spani's trey and sent the orange-clad crowd into a frenzy. "I think it's more mental than anything else," said Spani, who played 39 minutes. "Obviously all of us have shot millions of shots throughout our careers, so it's just a mindset going in and knowing that you can knock down shots."

Simmons scored 18 points, Glory Johnson finished with 16 and nine rebounds, Stricklen added 15 points and Ariel Massengale had 11 points and nine assists.

"I thought across the board, everybody contributed in certain ways," Summitt said. "It's just a matter of who's coming in. At any given moment, we've got enough people that somebody's going to step up."

The Tennessee coaches expected a strong rebounding effort by the Lady Vols, so they instead asked the players to focus on not turning the ball over. By halftime, Tennessee had just six turnovers but had 13 fewer rebounds than Miami.

By the end of the game, the Lady Vols had put enough an effort on the boards to trail the Hurricanes 45-38 in rebounding, and it was Miami that was strugging to hang onto the ball. The Hurricanes turned the ball over 21 times, leading to 23 points for the Lady Vols - 10 more than Miami got off giveaways.

Riquna Williams, who led the Atlantic Coast Conference in scoring a season ago, sank 24 points for Miami. Shenise Johnson added 17 and Morgan Stroman scored 11. The stingy defensive play by both teams forced the ball to the hands of the outside shooters during

the first half, leading four lead changes and two ties. Miami took an early edge after scoring eight unanswered points. Williams and Stefanie Yderstorm

each had a 3, while Stroman hit a pair of free throws to take an 8-2 lead, their largest margin of the first half.

A few minutes later. Tennessee went on an 8-0 run of its own, capped by a 3-pointer by Simmons off a dish by Massengale. The basket gave the Lady Vols an 18-16 lead - their first since the opening basket. They slowly built their margin to 38-31 on a jumper in the paint by Alicia Manning with 4:52 in the first half, but Miami scored the final five points of the half to tie it at the break.

"Our confidence was high," Shenise Johnson said. "(The score) was zero-zero."

The teams launched a flurry of long shots during their streaks, and the Lady Vols hit 7 of 13 and Miami 6 of 14 from behind the arc in the first half. Tennessee finished 11 of 22 from long range, while Miami missed all nine of its second-half attempts.

The Lady Vols have now won 38 straight games at home on the court named for Summitt, dating to a 62-54 loss to Duke on Feb. 16, 2009. They travel to Virginia on Sunday before hosting No. 1 Baylor at The Summitt on Nov. 27.

ANCHORAGE, Alaska (AP)- Shenise Johnson scored 18 points and No. 9 Miami beat Alaska-Anchorage 72-55 on Wednesday night in the opening round of the Carrs-Safeway Great Alaska Shootout.

"Our game plan was to put everyone in the gym to sleep, except us," he said. It worked in the first half, he said, until the bigger, faster Hurricanes hit them with the stifling full-court pressure, something they're not likely to see the rest of their schedule.

"Our kids got a little nervous because they don't see it."

Meier credited Alaska-Anchorage's physical play for keeping the game close early. The Seawolves outrebounded Miami 39-33, and Miami adjusted on offense by moving its shooters outside, Meier said. Miami shot 40 percent from the field in the second half.

Johnson was 3 for 6 from 3-point range but Miami shot just 4 for 22 from beyond the arc. Stroman and Riquna Williams each scored 14 points for Miami.

Robison, Mathews, Hanna Johansson, and Hallie Holmstead had 10 points apiece for Alaska-Anchorage

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - A 20-hour trip from Alaska failed to affect No. 9 Miami. Still shaking off jet-lag from their return home early Saturday morning, the Hurricanes wore down Longwood in a 92-43 rout Sunday afternoon.

Shenise Johnson scored 22 points on 9-of-11 shooting and had six assists to lead the Hurricanes (5-1). Morgan Stroman finished with 20 points, shooting 8 of 10 from the field. "We handled a very difficult travel situation, getting home at 1:30 in the morning and having practice

EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP) - Morgan Stroman scored 20 points in a near-perfect shooting night to lead No. 9 Miami past Michigan State 76-60 Thursday night in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge

Stroman had 13 points at the break, hitting all four of her shots from the field and all five at the line for the much quicker Hurricanes (6-1). She finished 7 for 7 and 6 for 7, respectively. Shenise Johnson added 13 points and Stefanie Yderstrom had 11 in Miami's second-closest game this season.

Porsche Poole had 17 points for the foul-plagued Spartans (5-3), who played without starters Lykendra Johnson and Taylor Alton for most of the first half. Michigan State trailed 38-26 at halftime.

Courtney Schiffauer and Jasmine Hines each had nine points for Michigan State, while Becca Mills grabbed nine rebounds, all in the first 20 minutes.

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - Riquna Williams said her stomach was still burning nearly an hour after the final whistle. Shenise Johnson limped with every step. Miami coach Katie Meier said she was looking for some oxygen.

A comeback for the ages left No. 9 Miami drained - but still perfect at home.

Williams scored a career-high 36 points, Johnson added 25 points and 12 rebounds and the Hur-ricanes knocked No. 11 Rutgers from the ranks of the unbeaten with a 92-81 double-overtime win Monday night, Miami's 28th straight in its own building. The Hurricanes trailed by 16 points with 17 minutes left in the second half, then started a most improbable rally against one of the nation's top defensive clubs. "You've got to be really cocky and have some really confident kids to think that you're coming back

from that one," Meier said. "You really do. Especially when you look over on the other bench and it's Rutgers, one of the best defensive teams in the history of women's basketball.'

A clash of styles - Miami's offense vs. Rutgers' defense - was all Scarlet Knights for the first 25 minutes. Rutgers (8-1) was up 40-24 early in the second half, and Meier acknowledged afterward that she thought the Hurricanes were in real trouble.

Miami outscored Rutgers 68-41 the rest of the way.

"I don't think we played scared at all," Rutgers coach C. Vivian Stringer said. "I don't think we played very smart.'

The Scarlet Knights got a layup from Erica Wheeler with 1.5 seconds left in regulation to force overtime and another game-tying shot from Betnijah Laney just before the buzzer and sending it to send it to a second OT.

But Williams took over for Miami in the second OT, hitting a pair of 3-pointers to get the Hurricanes going, and they survived. It was the first time Rutgers allowed 90 points since Jan. 2, 2003, and given the way the first 25 minutes of the game went, no one would have figured that was happening Monday night. Of course, the next 25 minutes were the ones that told the story.

"Awesome game," Johnson said. "My heart rate is still pumping. Credit goes to Rutgers. It was just a fun, fun game,'

April Sykes scored 19 points and grabbed 10 rebounds for Rutgers, Erica Wheeler scored 13 and Khadijah Rushdan added 10.

Miami trailed for all but 2:35 of regulation, and still had plenty of chances to win before the overtimes. Johnson went 2 for 4 from the foul line in the final 38 seconds of regulation, so the Hurricanes' lead

was never larger than two - giving Rutgers life. The Scarlet Knights took advantage. Taking possession with 10.7 seconds left in regulation, Rutgers got the ball down low to Oliver. She missed a layup, but Wheeler was there for the putback with 1.5

seconds to play in regulation, tying the game at 63. "We made a couple mistakes down the stretch," Wheeler said. "But it's a learning experience. We definitely are getting better from this situation."

Stefanie Yderstrom's 3-pointer gave the Hurricanes the lead with 1:47 left in the first overtime. She appeared to cramp up on the next possession, so Williams simply waited for her chance, connecting from beyond the arc to push the Miami lead to 71-67. And once again, Rutgers rallied - Sykes' 3 with a halfminute to play got the Scarlet Knights to 73-72, and when Laney knotted it, the Rutgers bench leaped for joy.

It was the Scarlet Knights' final celebration of the night.

"They've got to grow up - yesterday," Stringer said, unhappy that the chance was wasted. Rutgers came into the game having allowed only 70 points once - in the season opener - and on

a six-game streak of not allowing any more than 52 points. Opponents were shooting 31 percent and committing more than 20 turnovers a game against the Scarlet Knights through eight games, so the Hurricanes knew exactly what to expect.

So predictably, Rutgers' man-to-man gave Miami fits.

But the Hurricanes did little to help their own cause, missing at least nine shots near the rim in a 9-minute span of the first half alone, falling behind 31-22 going into the locker room - after the Scarlet Knights held them to 27 percent shooting. And when Rutgers started the second half on a 9-2 run, capped by a jumper from Sykes, the lead was 40-24 with 17:23 left.

With that, Meier called timeout, and something clicked, just in time.

"Gutsy," Meier said. "How are you gutsy when you're down 16? ... They were missing free throws they never miss, missing layups they never miss, and somehow still had the confidence. That's beyond me. That's them.'

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - A comeback early in the second half gave Mississippi upset hopes - then reality set in with one quick Miami surge.

The Rebels pulled within four points midway through the second half before the No. 9 Hurricanes scored 11 straight points to end the threat and pull away for a 76-48 win.

Riquna Williams scored 17 points, 13 in the second half, to lead the Hurricanes.

"I think we played very well for about 30 minutes against a very good Miami basketball team," Mississippi coach Renee Ladner said. "We changed defenses at halftime and that helped us a little bit and just when we thought we figured it out, Riquna Williams stood up and ignited (Miami)."

The Rebels rallied from a 34-22 halftime deficit and outscored the Hurricanes 11-1 in the first 6:20 of the second half. Whitney Hameth keyed the run with six points.

Nikki Byrd's put-back basket with 10:09 remaining reduced Miami's lead to 44-40. Williams' second 3-pointer with 9:43 remaining increased it to 47-40.

"It's been a long week with finals and basketball," Williams said. "I know that normally when coach is yelling she's not enjoying the game. We just wanted to make sure she was smiling.'

"To be honest I wasn't feeling it tonight because of the pressures of the week. I just went out and did it."

The win was Miami's 29th straight at home, while the loss snapped a five-game winning streak for Mississippi.

"We were flat coming out in the second half," Miami coach Katie Meier said. "Our second wave, our reinforcements, didn't score but went in with some energy and wore the other team down.

"When our starters came back in, we were fresh against a fatigued Ole Miss team and we were able to blow the game open with some special performances."

Byrd scored 10 points to lead the Rebels (6-2).

'This is the real world of college basketball," Ladner said. "Miami has an outstanding team and an outstanding coach. Playing in this type of environment can really help us." Miami ran off 11 unanswered points and took an 11-3 lead in the first 6:03.

Byrd, the Rebels' leading scorer, sat out 14 minutes of the first half with foul trouble and played only 18 minutes

"Had that not happened, we would have been in a dogfight the entire game," Meier said. "But it was partially our scouting. We wanted to go at her and get her in foul trouble."

Shenise Johnson's 3-pointer with 8:32 remaining in the first half gave the Hurricanes their first double-digit lead at 18-6.

"They put a lot of pressure and take the offense away from you," Ladner said. "Their game plan is to pick you up full court and beat you the last 10 minutes."

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - Louisiana Monroe absorbed an early blow and never recovered against Miami. Riquna Williams, Shenise Johnson and Krystal Saunders each scored 16 points, and the No. 7 Hurricanes opened with a 22-0 run to rout the Warhawks 103-39 on Friday night.

"I had a lot of babies out there - seven freshmen - I played them all, what the heck," Louisiana Monroe coach Mona Martin said. "We only have three seniors. It's been a very tough season so far.

The 16 points was a career best for Saunders, who went 6 of 8 from the field, including 2 of 3 from 3-point range. Through the Hurricanes' first nine games, the sophomore was shooting 27 percent from the field and was just 1 of 19 from beyond the arc.

"My teammates always have had confidence in me," Saunders said. "They told me to keep shooting." Morgan Stroman added 14 points and Michelle Woods had 13 for the Hurricanes in their 30th straight home win.

"It's fun this year; it's not just (Williams and Johnson)," Miami coach Katie Meier said. "We have a balanced team. The upperclassmen did a fantastic job of taking care of the game early. They made sure that we shared minutes like we did."

Johnson scored eight points, including two 3-pointers, during an opening 22-0 run by Miami (9-1), which was never threatened.

The Warhawks broke the scoring drought on Larrie Williams' jumper 4:53 into the game, but Miami scored the next 11 points and took a 33-2 lead on Jessica Capers' jumper with 9:26 to go in the half.

Williams scored 11 points to lead Louisiana Monroe (1-10). "They are very impressive, they run the ball so well," Martin said. "I've been in this business for 36 years and they run the floor better than any team I've ever seen."

The Hurricanes shot 12 of 16 from the field in the first 9 minutes, while the Warhawks converted only one of 13 shots. Miami used mostly reserves over the second 10 minutes of the first half and built a 55-19 lead at halftime.

"There are a lot of people in our second wave that would be starters somewhere else," Meier said. "It's very hard to break into a starting lineup that brought back every starter.

"I've been very blessed that I've had the same starting lineup for 43 games in a row."

Johnson's put-back 3:51 into the second half put the Hurricanes up by 40 - 64-24 - and Riquna Wil-liams' layup with 10:34 remaining increased the lead to 79-28.

The Hurricanes also outscored the Warhawks 25-6 in fast break points and forced 30 turnovers "They've got so much depth and they play hard," Louisiana Monroe coach Mona Martin said. "They run the ball so well from point guard to post.

Miami, which surpassed 90 points for the fifth time this season and topped 100 for the second time, outscored Louisiana Monroe 17-0 in the final 7:18. "Last year we played Texas A&M and they were ranked 12th at the time," Martin said. "They wound

up winning the thing and I thought (Miami) could be a good contender for the national championship if they stay healthy."
