
MIDWEEK STORYLINES & NEWS

- . Miami is the unanimous No. 1 team across college baseball, earning the distinction for the first time since June 10, 2008.
- Tuesday's game was scheduled when two of three games vs. Notre Dame were cancelled April 9; Miami won 10-2 in Game 3.
- The Hurricanes lead the all-time series against the Sharks 4-0, but the two teams have not met since the 1996 season.
- UM's current nine-game winning streak is the second-longest in the country; its 85.7 winning percentage (25-4) is tops.
- The team's 11-2 conference record is the best in the ACC Miami has won the ACC Coastal Division two straight years.
- In the first NCAA RPI release of 2016 on April 5, UM was ranked No. 2. Miami has nine wins against the current RPI top 25.
- Head coach Jim Morris won his 1,000th game at the University of Miami in a 5-4 walk-off win over Clemson on March 26. With a 4-0 victory over FGCU on April 5, Morris moved past Larry Hays (1,508) into fifth place in all-time wins (1,509).
- · Miami's .983 fielding percentage is the fifth-best mark in the country and the best fielding percentage in the ACC.
- Junior Zack Collins opened the week ranked third among active Division I players in career home runs (33) and RBI (160).
- Junior Bryan Garcia is in a tie for third place in all-time saves (34) at Miami; he is the nation's active leader in saves.
- In a preseason poll of ACC head coaches, the Hurricanes were picked to win the ACC Coastal Division in 2016.
 The Hurricanes made their 24th trip to the College World Series in 2015, finishing 50-17 overall and 22-8 in ACC play.

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans, University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams in his 23rd season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in both 2008 and 2014.

In his 22-plus season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 43 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 12 of Morris' 22 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2015, when Miami was awarded the No. 5 national seed heading into the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 16 of 22 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13-straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 31 years - 22 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 1,006-409-3 (.709) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,510-653-4 (.697) Division I record in 33 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 37 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,640-692-4 (.700) mark.


In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 22 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

Morris became just the sixth coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500win plateau when Miami topped Louisville 8-4 in dramatic fashion on March 18, 2016. A walk-off grand slam from junior Willie Abreu gave Morris his 1,500th.

In 2015, Morris led the Hurricanes to their second straight ACC Coastal Division title, the 24th College World Series appearance in program history, and reached the 50-win mark for the 12th time in his 22 seasons.

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history. The conference win total set a new record for the program and tied the ACC's all-time single-season win total.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22. The Hurricanes, who have never missed the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship since joining the ACC in 2004, qualified for their 10th straight conference tournament under Morris and earned a Regional host spot for their 42nd consecutive postseason trip.



Morris has reached a number of other coaching milestones in his time in Coral Gables. His 1,000th Division-I game on April 4, 2004, at his old stomping grounds at Georgia Tech. He also achieved another milestone during the 2004 season, winning his 500th game at the helm of the Miami program. Morris' 500th win came just a few weeks following his 1,000th overall win as a Division-I head coach by beating Florida State 7-3 on April 17.

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), and Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston). Several more Hurricanes during the Morris tenure are right on the cusp of making the show, including Mike Rodriguez (Houston), David Gil (Cincinnati) and Jon Jay (St. Louis). Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta.

MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES

CANES HOST SHARKS TUESDAY NIGHT

- After winning the **only game** played on their trip to South Bend vs. Notre Dame 10-2 on April 10, the newly named **No. 1 Hurricanes** look to make it **10 straight wins** when they welcome the Nova Southeastern Sharks Tuesday, April 12. First pitch is set for 6 p.m.
- Tuesday's game was scheduled after a doubleheader against the Fighting Irish set for April 9 was **cancelled**, resulting in two lost games.
- Miami is a perfect **4-0 in the all-time series** with the Sharks, but the two teams have not met since **April 2, 1996** a 13-2 Miami win.
- Miami's regular Sunday starter Danny Garcia (4-2, 2.63 ERA) will oppose Sharks' lefthander Jonny Ortiz (4-1, 3.51 ERA).

THE UNANIMOUS NUMBER ONE

- Miami was ranked No. 1 in every college baseball poll released Monday, April 11 marking the first time the Hurricanes have been No. 1 since June 10, 2008.
- In polls from a week prior (April 4), the Hurricanes were ranked **No. 2** by *Baseball America, Collegiate Baseball*, Perfect Game, NCBWA and the *USA TODAY* Coaches Poll, and were **No. 3** by D1Baseball.com.

MORRIS EARNS MILESTONE WINS IN STYLE

- With a walk-off grand slam by junior Willie Abreu vs. Louisville on March 18, Miami head coach Jim Morris became just the sixth coach in history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500-win milestone.
- A little over a week later, Morris became the **second coach** in the history of Miami baseball to win **1,000 games** when the Hurricanes walked off against Clemson 5-4 on **March 26** (Ron Fraser 1,267).
- With a 4-0 win over FGCU on April 5, Morris moved Larry Hays (1,508) as the fifth-winningest coach in Division I history by wins.
 - Since his arrival in 1994, UM's 1,006 wins are sixth-most in D1.

USA TODAY TABS MIAMI #3 PROGRAM

- In a ranking of Division I baseball programs by athletic competitiveness, academic quality, return on investment and leadership, Miami was ranked the No. 3 program in America by USA Today.
 - Miami trailed only Vanderbilt & LSU in the list released on March 4.

CLIMBING UP THE RECORD BOOKS

- Closer Bryan Garcia entered the year with the **fifth-most saves in Miami history (25)**, and has gotten off to a hot start in 2016. His **ACC-leading ninth save** of 2016 against **North Carolina** (April 3).
 - 34 career saves are the most by **any active pitcher** in the nation.
- Garcia is chasing the **all-time record for saves in a career**, which is **39** held by **George Huguet** (2001-2004).
- Garcia moved into a tie with **Robbie Morrison** (1996-98) for third (34) in the history of Miami baseball with a save on April 3. He needs three more to tie **Rick Raether** (1984-86) for second (37) and is five behind **Huguet** for first (39).

COLLINS AMONG NATION'S BEST

GOLD GLOVE DEFENSE

- In the newest NCAA Division I statistics released April 11, Miami had the fifth-best fielding percentage in the country and the best fielding percentage in the ACC at .983.
- Miami has made just 19 errors in 2016, compared to 49 by opponents. The Hurricanes had made 39 errors at this point in 2015 - a year where Miami made it to the College World Series.
- The Hurricanes' starting infield of third baseman Edgar Michelangeli (1), shortstop Brandon Lopez (4), second baseman Johnny Ruiz (3) and first baseman Christopher Barr (2) have combined for just 10 errors - good for a .982 fielding percentage.

GOING STREAKING

- To open the week, Miami's nine-game winning streak was the second-longest in the nation behind Lamar's 15-game streak.
 - Miami's five-game road winning streak was tied for sixth-longest
- The Hurricanes **85.7 winning percentage** (25-4) was tops in the nation at the start of the week (April 11).

BUILDING A RESUME

- In early Preseason 'Field of 64 projections' by both Baseball America and D1Baseball.com last week. Miami was projected to be the No. 2 national seed for the NCAA postseason.
- In the first NCAA RPI release of the 2016 season on April 5, Miami was No. 2, trailing only Florida. The Hurricanes have nine wins against the RPI top 25 (9-3) and are 13-3 against the RPI top 100.

HEATING UP

- Miami has won 20 of its last 22 games dating to a 6-2 win over FGCU at Mark Light Field on March 2. Key contributors over the stretch have been Zack Collins (.455, 7 HR, 31 RBI, 26 BB, .588 OBP), Carl **Chester** (.419, 6 2Bs .500 OBP) and **Brandon Lopez** (.378, 8 2Bs).
- Top players on the mound have been Michael Mediavilla (4-0, 3.15 ERA, 34.1 IP with 32 Ks), Bryan Garcia (2-0, six saves, 27 Ks in 16.2 IP) and Jesse Lepore (4-0, 2.28 ERA, 26 Ks in 27.2 IP).

MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES

LOOKING FOR A THREE-PEAT

- Miami won its second straight ACC Coastal Division title in 2015, posting a 22-8 record in ACC play to earn the division crown.
- The Hurricanes, who were picked to win the ACC Coastal Division once again in 2016, won 46 ACC games over the 2014-2015 seasons the second-best two-year stretch by any program since ACC expanded to a 30-game conference schedule prior to 2005.
- Miami has won the ACC Regular Season Championship twice, most recently in 2014 when the Canes finished 24-6; the Hurricanes won the ACC regular season crown & ACC Tournament in 2008.

HIGH EXPECTATIONS

- Miami was ranked in the top 10 in preseason polls from nearly every major college baseball outlet, including a No. 4 ranking from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and a No. 6 ranking from several outlets.
- Miami's preseason ranking of No. 4 from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper was its highest from the publication since 2005; its No. 6 ranking from Baseball America was its highest from BA since 2007.

DESTINATION: OMAHA

- Miami made its return to the College World Series in 2015, marking the program's first trip to Omaha, Neb., since 2008. Miami's 24 College World Series trips are the second-most of any program.
- The Hurricanes have won **48 games** in the College World Series, the **fourth-most** of any program nationwide; Miami's **four national championships** (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) rank **fifth-most**.

COMEBACK CANES TOP HOKIES

- After dropping its ACC opener 14-3 on March 11 in Blacksburg, Miami came back to win the final two games of the series (11-6, 7-2).
- The road series win marked Miami's fourth in its last five ACC road trips dating to 2015. UM is 28-8 all-time against Virginia Tech.

MIAMI HANDS #1 FLORIDA FIRST LOSS

- Miami dropped **two of three** in its weekend series with No. 1 Florida at Mark Light Field from Feb. 26-28; the Hurricanes **won Game 2** by a final score of **5-3**, but dropped Games 1 and 3.
- The Hurricanes got five strong innings from lefthander Michael Mediavilla (2-0) in Game 2 and four RBI from sluger Zack Collins.
- Saturday's 5-3 win was played in front of a **sellout crowd of 4,999**; over **13,000 fans made their way through the gates** to see the annual rivalry between the Hurricanes and Gators.

CANES SWEEP JASPERS

- Miami cruised to a weekend sweep of Manhattan at Mark Light Field from March 4-6; the Hurricanes outscored the Jaspers 31-8 in the three-game series, while the staff recorded a collective 2.33 ERA.
- Among Miami's top performers **at the plate** against the Jaspers were **Edgar Michelangeli** (.750, 9-for-12, 3 RBI), junior **Zack Collins** (.625, 5-for-8, 1 HR, 5 RBI) & sophomore **Carl Chester** (.400, 4-for 10, 5 runs, 3 RBI); UM hit .371 as a team and recorded 39 hits vs. MC.
- Senior lefthander **Thomas Woodrey** delivered a brilliant start against the Jaspers in the series opener, tossing eight shutout innings, allowing two hits, one walk and striking out a career-best 10 batters.

ONES TO WATCH

- Two Hurricanes picked up 2016 Preseason All-America honors: junior catcher Zack Collins and junior closer Bryan Garcia.
- Collins, a unanimous Preseason All-America candidate, was among the 50 players named to the initial watch list for the Golden Spikes Award by USA Baseball. He was also named to last year's list.
- · Garcia, who was recognized by Louisville Slugger and Perfect Game, was named to the watch list for the Stopper of the Year Award by NCBWA for the second straight year.
- Both players have earned All-America recognition in their two-year Hurricane careers; Collins was a third-team ABCA/Rawlings All America choice last season, while Garcia was a NCBWA third-team All American after his freshman year in 2014.
- UM had three All-Americans in 2015: David Thompson (unanimous), George Iskenderian (NCBWA) & Collins (ABCA).

MIAMI ADDS ANOTHER MAJOR LEAGUER

- Arizona Diamondbacks slugger Peter O'Brien became the 53rd former University of Miami player to play in Major League Baseball when he was called up late in 2015.
- O'Brien joined a 2015 group that included now Oakland A's teammates Yonder Alonso and Danny Valencia, San Diego Padres outfielder Jon Jav. Dodgers All-Star catcher Yasmani Grandal, new D-Back Chris Herrmann, and Milwaukee All-Star Ryan Braun.
- Miami had five players selected in the 2015 MLB Draft; lefthander Andrew Suarez, third baseman David Thompson, infielder George Iskenderian, catcher Garrett Kennedy and outfielder Ricky Eusebio.

ESPN NETWORK TO CARRY HOME SCHEDULE

- All 37 of UM's home games will be carried on the ESPN Networks in 2016 - Miami is the only ACC school to have its entire home schedule carried.
- In total, 46 of Miami's 55 games are tentatively slated for broadcast on ESPN Networks.
- 560 WQAM, the flagship radio station for Miami Athletics, is slated to carry 15 regular season games throughout the 2016 season. WVUM 90.5 FM carries every game, home and away.

- In its annual exhibition against the program's alumni, the 2016 Hurricanes won 17-4 on Saturday, Feb 13.
- Roughly 2,000 fans made their way thorugh the gates for Fan Fest and the Alumni Game, which featured a number of Hurricane greats taking part in pregame ceremonies.
- MLB All-Star Yasmani Grandal, former Marlins first-round Draft pick and retired number honoree Charles "CJ" Johnson and 2015 Miami staff ace **Andy Suarez**, with about 50 others, were introduced.
- Alumni taking part in the game included "Downtown" **Kevin** Brown, former MLB outfielder Brian Barton, fan favorite Jose Trujillo and sidewinder Sam Abrams, who was a key member of Miami's 2015 CWS team.




