MIDWEEK SERIES STORY LINES

- After sweeping a weekend ACC series vs. NC State, Miami wraps up its five-game homestand Tuesday vs. Army at 6 PM.
- UM has a 26-2-1 all-time series lead, but has not played the Black Knights since 1975 - the first meeting in 40 years.
- Miami is riding a five-game winning streak into Tuesday, and is 12-1 in games played at Mark Light Field in 2015.
- Miami is ranked in the top 25 of every major college baseball poll. The Hurricanes check in at #10 in *Perfect Game's* top 25, #17 by *Baseball America*, #20 in the Coaches Poll, #20 by NCBWA #20 by *Collegiate Baseball* & #25 by *D1Baseball*.
- Junior David Thompson was named ACC Player of the Week Monday. Thompson batted .524 (11-for-21), recording three multi-hit games, two doubles, three home runs and 13 RBI. His walk-off solo homer in extras beat NCST in the opener.
- Miami's team on-base percentage (.417) is the second highest mark in the conference and eighth-best nationwide.
- Junior George Iskenderian and sophomore Zack Collins are the only two players to have reached base in all 21 games.
- Jim Morris became just the eighth coach in Division I baseball history to accumulate 1,400 wins last year. With a 25-4 win over Rutgers in early February, Morris moved into eighth in all-time wins (1,439) for any coach at a four-year college.
- A number of Hurricanes have earned 2015 Preseason All-America accolades, including Zack Collins, Bryan Garcia, Andrew Suarez & David Thompson. Collins was a unanimous first-team selection on all major Preseason All-America lists.
- Miami captured the 2014 ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship, finishing atop the ACC with a 24-6 record.
- Miami's streak of 42 consecutive NCAA postseason appearances is the longest active streak in Division I athletics.

3 JIM MORRIS HEAD COACH

THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

Entering his 22nd season at Miami, few programs have qualified for the College World Series as much as Jim Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 42 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 21 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 947-370-3 (.717) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,450-637-4 (.694) Division I record in 33 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 36 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,581-677-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 20 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 30th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2014 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host spots in the tournament. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 21 seasons (1994-2014), winning 15 of those appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (1994-2006) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2014 Hurricanes to their 42nd-straight NCAA Tournament. Despite six signees being drafted in the 2013 MLB Draft, the Hurricanes reeled in a top-five recruiting class by national publications, with Zack Collins named *Baseball America* National Freshman of the Year under his direction in 2014.

MORRIS IN 36th SEASON AS HEAD COACH

Morris entered 2015 as the fourth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole possession of eighth-place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers. Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 victory on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including time at DeKalb College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern in March 2001.



MAJOR LEAGUE GUIDANCE

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Eddy Rodriguez (San Diego), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Blake Tekotte (Chicago White Sox), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston).

Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta. At the Goodwill Games, his USA squad won two of three games against Cuba, marking the first time in history a senior-level team won a series with Cuba. In 1987, Morris served as pitching coach under Ron Fraser at the Pan American Games (Silver Medal).

Coach Morris and his wife Nhan live in Miami with their three-year old son, James W. Morris IV (Will).

MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES

UM WRAPS UP FIVE-GAME HOMESTAND

- No. 17 Miami will wrap up its **five-game homestand** with a **midweek game** against **Army** at 6 p.m. Tuesday, March 17. The two teams **have not met since March 1975** - a span of **40 years**.
- Miami has a **26-2-1 all-time lead** in the head-to-head series, including nine of the last 10 matchups. The **29 games in the all-time series** have all been played at Mark Light Field.
- UM finished the 2014 season with a **11-4 home record in ACC** play, and a **23-10 overall home record**. UM has won **seven straight home series** dating to 2014, and is **12-1** at The Light in 2015.
- Army is off to a 9-4 start in 2015, including its **most recent sweep of UMASS** this past weekend. The **Black Knights** finished **33-18** and **15-5** in Patriot League play in 2014.

SIMPLY THE BEST

- **David Thompson** was named **ACC Player of the Week** on March 16 after **hitting .524 (11-for-21)** in a perfect 5-0 week for Miami, including a three-game sweep of NC State.
- Thompson recorded **three multi-hit games, two doubles, three home runs** and **13 RBI** in the prolific week, and led all Miami hitters with a **1.048 slugging percentage** over the five-game stretch.
- The Miami native, who leads the Hurricanes with **four home runs** and **26 RBI**, is slugging a **team-best .608** and ranks **second** in batting average (**.354**), **first** in doubles (**six**) and **third** in walks (**15**).
- Thompson carries a **10-game hitting streak** into Tuesday's game.

ONE-TWO PUNCH

- Despite the graduation of 1-2 hitters **Dale Carey** and **Tyler Palmer** - who combined in those roles in **62 of 63 games in 2014** - freshman **Carl Chester** and junior **Ricky Eusebio** haven't missed a beat.
- Chester is batting **.273** in **21 starts in leftfield**, ranks second with **three homers**, and is one of **five players with 20 or more hits (24, third-most)**.
- Eusebio is **reaching base at a .510 clip**, and leads the team in **runs (23)** and **steals (seven)**. His **18 walks** are **second-most**, and he leads the team in **HBP's with nine**.
- The speedy duo has combined for **14-for-22 on steal attempts**.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- Miami is off to a **12-1 start at home** through its first 13 games.
- UM finished the 2014 season with a **11-4 home record in ACC** play, and a **23-10 overall home record**. UM has won **seven straight home series** dating, including all three series in 2015: Rutgers, Wright State and NC State.
- Miami is batting **.326 at home** compared to just **.265 on the road**, and has a robust **.449 team on-base percentage (.364 road)**.
- Junior **David Thompson** is batting **.383** in **13 starts at home**, and leads the team with **18 hits, 15 runs** and **15 RBI**. **Ricky Eusebio** is **batting .375 at home** with **14 walks** and **five steals**.
- Miami's **staff ERA** is over a **full run better at home (2.52)** than on the road (**3.71**)
- Junior **George Iskenderian (.452)** and sophomore **Zack Collins (.290)** are both hitting better on the road than home through 21 games.

MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES

MILESTONES FOR MORRIS

- After leading his team to a 44-19 record in 2014, **head coach Jim Morris moved into ninth place** all-time in college baseball history (regardless of Division, four-year colleges) with 1,435 wins.
- Morris **wasted little time in moving up** that list in 2015, taking over **sole possession of eighth place** when Miami topped Rutgers 25-4 on Feb. 15, 2015 - his 1,439th win as head coach.
- **Morris ranks as the fourth-winningest** among active **Division I coaches by career victories (1,450)** and **fifth** in winning percentage (.694). He is also the **second-winningest coach in ACC history**.
- Morris became just the **eighth coach in the history of Division I baseball** to accumulate **1,400 wins** when Miami beat Boston College 5-2 on **March 8, 2014**.

PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF

- Then-freshman **Bryan Garcia** was named the team's closer just prior to the 2014 season opener and rewarded the coaching staff with an **All-American** campaign (NCBWA, third team).
- Garcia has **four saves in 10 appearances**, and has **allowed just one earned run in 13.2 innings**. He has 12 strikeouts so far, and now has **19 career saves** - tied for **No. 9** in **UM history**.
- An **All-ACC Second Team** selection as a reliever, **Garcia set the Miami freshman saves record** and **tied for 11th-most saves nationally with 15** in 2014. He was a consensus Freshman All American first-team selection at reliever.
- Garcia, whose 15 saves were **tied for the seventh-most** in a single season in UM history, was named a 2015 **Preseason All American** by *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* and *Perfect Game*.

#CARDIACCANES

- David Thompson's homer vs. **NCST** gave UM its **third walk-off W**.
- Miami picked up its **first two walk-off wins** of the 2015 season against **Wright State**, earning thrilling wins on **back-to-back nights**.
- Senior **Garrett Kennedy** connected on a two-run, two-out home run on Feb. 27, while **Willie Abreu** won the game on a bases-loaded single on Feb. 28.
- Miami has played **six one-run games in 2015**, and is 3-3 in those contests. The opening stretch continues a trend from last season for the Hurricanes, **who were 16-3 in one-run games in 2014**.

HIGH EXPECTATIONS

- After capturing the **2014 ACC Regular Season Championship**, the Hurricanes entered 2015 ranked in the **top 15 of every major college baseball preseason poll**.
- Miami was also ranked No. 10 by *Perfect Game*, No. 14 by *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper*, No. 14 in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll and No. 14 by *D1Baseball.com*.
- The Hurricanes feature a number of **Preseason All-Americans**, including reigning **2014 ACC Freshman of the Year Zack Collins** (consensus), **All-ACC closer Bryan Garcia** and **Washington Nationals' second-rounder & staff ace Andrew Suarez**.
- Miami's recruiting class was **ranked No. 2 nationwide** by *Perfect Game*, and includes MLB Draft picks: **George Iskenderian** (34th round), OF **Carl Chester** (38th) and LHP **Michael Mediavilla** (40th).

MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES

DEATH, TAXES & THE NCAA POSTSEASON

- The Miami Hurricanes extended their own college baseball record with their **42nd consecutive trip** to the NCAA postseason in 2014. Miami has not missed the postseason since 1973.
- The Hurricanes' 42 straight trips to the NCAA postseason are the longest active postseason streak of any Division I program in any sport nationwide.
- Jim Morris has led teams to the NCAA postseason in 30 straight years - all 21 years at Miami and his final nine years at Georgia Tech. Miami has not missed the postseason since 1972.

SPIKES & STOPPER WATCH LISTS

- In addition to Preseason All-America accolades, **Zack Collins** and **Andrew Suarez** were among the 50 players on the watch list for the USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award.
- Miami was one of just seven programs with multiple players on the watch list for the Golden Spikes Award. The only Spikes winner in program history is **Pat Burrell (1998)**.
- Sophomore closer **Bryan Garcia** was named to NCBWA's Stopper of the Year watch list, recognizing the top closer in the country.
- **Zack Collins** was named to the **Johnny Bench Award** Watch List, honoring the top college catcher, in early March.

"THE LIGHT" RANKED AMONG BEST PARKS

- In recent rankings released by Stadium Journey, Alex Rodriguez at Mark Light Field was ranked the **No. 27 overall experience** and **second-best experience** in all of college baseball.
- Miami drew over **100,000 fans** to "The Light" in 2014, averaging over 2,500 fans per game. The Hurricanes finished **23-10 at home** last season.
- The famous "Mark Light Milkshake" stand has begun its **30th year of operation** in 2015. In 2013, the 250,000th milkshake was sold - follow @MarkLightShake on Twitter and Instagram for more.
- Miami is **12-1 in its first 13 home games** at Mark Light in 2015.

ACC TOURNEY IN DURHAM THROUGH 2018

- The ACC Championship will be held at **Durham Bulls Athletic Park** through the 2018 season, the conference office announced. The tournament had alternated between Greensboro and Durham in recent years.
- The ACC Baseball Championship has been held in Durham **eight times previously**, including three of the past six years. In 2013, tournament records for single-game attendance (11,329) and championship game attendance (8,697) were set.
- Durham Bulls Athletic Park began a **\$20 million transformation** last year. In 2014, the DBAP boasts an all new playing surface, improved field lights, new seats, additional group picnic areas, and upgraded video displays and sound system.
- Miami was the **top seed** at last year's ACC Championship after finishing **No. 1 in the conference with a 24-6 record in ACC play**. The Hurricanes have not missed the ACC Championship since joining the conference prior to the 2005 baseball season.

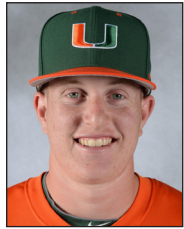

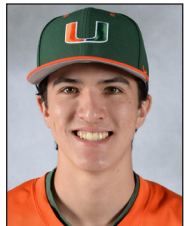
