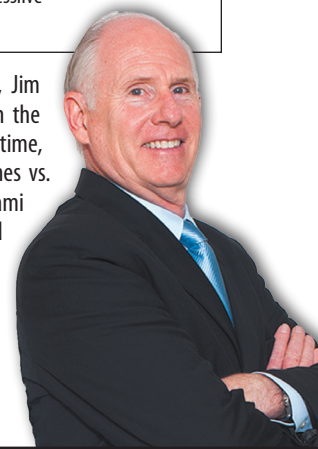

Two-time ACC Coach of the Year, Jim Larrañaga ranks in the top 60 on the list of winningest coaches all-time, and top 15 amongst active coaches in major schools. After leading Miami to the 2013 NCAA Sweet 16 and winning the school's first ACC regular season and tournament championships, Larrañaga was honored as the AP, Naismith, USBWA Henry Iba, Adolph Rupp Cup and ACC Coach of the Year.



THE GAME

No. 10/11 Miami marches on as a third seed in the NCAA Tournament, facing 11th-seeded Wichita State on Saturday, March 19 at 12:10 p.m. in Providence, R.I.

THE COACH

Head coach Jim Larrañaga has a 587-390 overall record in his 32nd season as a head coach. He is 117-56 in his fifth season at the University of Miami, with a 54-34 mark in ACC play. Coach L is 8-6 in the NCAA Tournament overall and 3-1 with the Hurricanes.

Miami's 17-consecutive weeks in the polls top the school record of 12 from 2001-02.

UM has been ranked in the AP's top 15 for 14 weeks this season, eclipsing the previous school record of 10 in the 1959-60 season.

The Canes are ranked 12-or-better in the AP for the eighth time this season, 15th time under Coach L, 19th time since 1985-86 and 26th time since 1959-60.

THE WEATHER

THE NOTE

Senior guard Sheldon McClellan is the ninth-most efficient offensive player in the country among players used in 20 percent of possessions, and 28th overall, according to KenPom.com on March 18. McClellan has posted the 14th-best shooting percentage (50.0%) in the country among guards, and has the top shooting percentage among guards in the ACC, according to stats on NCAA.org on March 18. McClellan's 2-point shooting percentage is 57.2 percent this season.

THE ANNIVERSARY

The 2015-16 season marks the 10-year anniversary of Coach Jim Larrañaga and George Mason University's Cinderella run to the 2006 Final Four.

LARRAÑAGA BY THE NUMBERS

5 - Coach Jim Larrañaga is one of five ACC coaches with a Final Four appearance to his credit. In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the NCAA Final Four in 27 years.

7 - In 32 years of coaching, Jim Larrañaga has a winning record in the NCAA Tournament, an 8-6 mark in seven appearances.

7 - Larrañaga is no stranger to the ACC. In his seven seasons as an assistant coach at Virginia, the Cavaliers participated in the NCAA Final Four in 1981 and 1984, won three ACC Championships and finished in the Top 5 of the rankings.

10 - The 2015-16 marks the 10th anniversary of Larrañaga's Cinderella run to the 2006 NCAA Final Four with George Mason. Both associate head coach Chris Caputo and director of operations James Johnson were on that GMU staff.

16 - Larrañaga has made 16 postseason appearances in the past 27 years, including seven NCAA tournaments.

32 - Larrañaga is in his 32nd year as a head coach and has successfully transitioned three institutions into successful programs: Miami, George Mason and Bowling Green.

500 - Coach L is one of five ACC coaches with 500 or more wins.

LARRAÑAGA - WHY MIAMI?

Along with returning to the best basketball conference in the country, Coach L had a few personal reasons for accepting the head coaching job at Miami. Coach's grandfather was from Cuba, where he produced the Larrañaga [lare-en-YAH-ga] cigar. Coach's father was raised in Key West before moving to The Bronx, N.Y., getting married and raising six children. Coach L was raised in The Bronx, but vacationed to Florida as a boy. He also has owned a house in Sarasota - which he bought from Dick Vitale's daughter - and three of his siblings have retired to Florida.

MIAMI POSTS THIRD 25-WIN SEASON

Coach Jim Larrañaga has posted his third 25-win season and fourth 20-win season in five years at The U. This is also his fifth-career 25-win season and 10th-career 20-win campaign. Larrañaga is just the second coach in Miami history with four 20-win seasons, joining Bruce Hale (1954-67) and the only Miami coach with a 25-win year.

This is Miami's third 25-win year (all under Coach L) and seventh 20-win season since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 campaign.

13+ ACC WINS FOR THE SECOND TIME UNDER COACH L

Miami has won 13 games in ACC play for just the second time in school history, along with 15 wins in 2012-13. In five seasons under Larrañaga, the Canes have won seven-or-more ACC games each season. Prior to the arrival of Coach L, Miami had never won 10 ACC games in a season.

MIAMI AS A RANKED TEAM

Miami is one of 13 schools in the country to win at least five games over top 25 teams this season: 11-Kansas; 8-Oklahoma; 7-Virginia; 6-Texas, Xavier, West Virginia; 5-Miami, UNC, Michigan St., Wisconsin, Iowa, Baylor, Oregon. Miami is one of six schools to start the season unranked and defeat at least two top 15 teams: 5-Texas; 3-Iowa, Texas A&M, Xavier; 2-Miami, Oregon.

TIED FOR MOST REGULAR-SEASON WINS

Miami was 24-5 in the regular season, tied with the 24-6 record in 2012-13, for the most regular-season wins in Hurricanes history. In Larrañaga's five seasons, the Canes have the following records in the regular season: 2015-16: 24-5, 2014-15: 20-11, 2013-14: 16-15, 2012-13: 24-6, 2011-12: 18-11.

BEST FG SHOOTING PERCENTAGE IN 27 YEARS

The Canes are hitting 47.6 percent (861-1810) from the field, the best in Miami's history since the 1988-89 season when UM was hitting 49.2 percent (1024-2083) of its shots. Miami's 75.1 percent (553-736) at the line is the best since 77.1 percent (523-678) in 2001-02.

MURPHY AND REED POST DOUBLE-DOUBLES IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

Juniors Kamari Murphy and Davon Reed each posted a double-double against Buffalo. Murphy scored a season-high tying 11 points to go with his career-high tying 13 rebounds, and Reed had 10 points and tied a career-best with 12 boards. This was Murphy's fourth game this season with 10+ boards, and his fifth game with double-digit points. This was Reed's second game with 10+ rebounds, added to his 12 against Richmond in the NIT a season ago.

RODRIGUEZ AND McCLELLAN POST 20-POINT GAMES

Against Buffalo, Angel Rodriguez and Sheldon McClellan each posted 20+ points. Rodriguez' 24 were a season high, his fifth 20-point game at Miami and his first 20-point game of the season. McClellan notched 20 points, his 13th 20-point game at Miami and ninth of the season. Mac has scored 10+ points in 21-straight games.

MURPHY HOSTS BLOCK PARTY

Junior Kamari Murphy swatted four Buffalo Bulls' shots, setting a new school record for blocks in an NCAA Tournament game. The previous record was three, held by John Salmons (vs. Lafayette, 3/12/99) and Jimmy Graham (vs. Texas, 3/23/08)

WHAT'S TRENDING

Ja'Quan Newton has at least 10 points and two assists in each of his last three games. Davon Reed has scored 17+ points in four of his last seven games. Sheldon McClellan has tallied double-digit points in 21-straight games. Angel Rodriguez has recorded 17+ points in four of the last six outings. He also has hit a 3-pointer in 11-straight outings. He has posted 3+ assists in 13 of the last 15 games, including nine vs. Virginia Tech in the ACC Tournament. Kamari Murphy has pulled down 4+ rebounds in 10 of the last 11 outings.

THE CANES AWAY FROM HOME

Miami is 19-10 in games at neutral sites and 35-26 on the road in five seasons under Coach L.

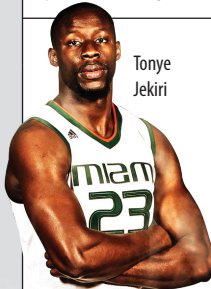

CANES 20TH IN NATION IN FT PERCENTAGE, 24TH IN FEWEST FOULS

Miami ranks 20th in the nation in free throw percentage, connecting on 75.1 percent of shots at the free throw line. UM averages 16.8 points per game at the line, and has posted a +8.8 scoring margin overall this season. The Canes have drawn 635 fouls, while committing only 548, which ranks UM No. 24 in the country in fewest fouls. Opponents have 551 free throw attempts.

REED NAMED TO ALL-ACC ACADEMIC TEAM

Davon Reed was named to the 2015-16 All-ACC Academic Men's Basketball team. The junior from Ewing, N.J., is majoring in sports administration.

MIAMI BASKETBALL – THE EARLY YEARS

The University of Miami basketball program was dormant for 14 years from 1971-1985. In 1983 Director of Athletics Sam Jankovich announced the resurrection of men's basketball at Miami, with the reinstatement vote by the UM Board of Trustees on Oct. 12, 1983. Head coach Bill Foster was hired March 21, 1984, adding assistants Clint Bryant, Seth Greenberg and Cesar Odio by July 1. Tim Harvey was the staff's first recruit, a 6-10, 240-pound center from Plainfield, N.J., who transferred from George Tech. On Oct. 15, 1984 the first men's basketball practice in 12 years was held on the patio in the center of campus, viewed by more than 200 students. Miami defeated The Citadel, 85-77, on Nov. 22, 1985, in the first game of the new era of UM basketball.

THE HURRICANES IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Canes are the No. 3 seed for the first time in UM history. Miami's highest seed has been No. 2, in 2013 and 1999.

Miami is 1-0 all-time vs. Wichita State, defeating the Shockers, 81-59, at the Eastern Airlines Palm Beach Classic on Dec. 30, 1988.

The Canes are playing in the NCAA Tournament for the eighth time.

Miami is 7-7 in NCAA Tournament play.

Miami is 2-2 in tournament games played in the Northeast: Boston 1-1 in 1999; Providence in 2016 1-0; Washington, D.C. 0-1 in 2013.

Miami has played in the Sweet 16 twice, Second Round three times and played just one game three times.

Under head coach Jim Larrañaga, Miami is 3-1 in the NCAA Tournament in just two appearances. The Hurricanes were 4-6 in the first six appearances.

UM has won at least one game in the NCAA Tournament in five of the eight appearances, including three-straight and in five of the last six.

UM has won four of its last six games in the NCAA Tournament after going 2-1 in 2013 and 1-1 in 2008.

Five different coaches have led Miami to their eight NCAA appearances. Leonard Hamilton (3: 1998-00) and Jim Larrañaga (2: 2013, 2016) are the only coaches to lead the Canes to multiple NCAA berths.

Miami entered the 2016 NCAA tournament with six tournament wins in its history. Since the field expanded in 1985 six teams have reached the Final Four in a year where they entered the tournament with six or fewer all time tournament wins. One of those teams was George Mason in 2006, led by Jim Larrañaga. - via ESPN.com

Miami and Texas A&M are only two schools among top three seeds who did not play in the NCAA tournament last year.

THE LAST TIME OUT: MIAMI 79, BUFFALO 72

(AP) Angel Rodriguez had 24 points and seven rebounds as third-seeded Miami held on to defeat No. 14 seed Buffalo 79-72 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament on Thursday. Sheldon McClellan added 20 points and five rebounds. It is Miami's first tournament win since it went to the Sweet 16 in 2013. The Hurricanes advance to play Wichita State in the second round of the South Region on Saturday at 12:10 p.m. Miami (26-7) kept the Bulls at bay for most of the second half, leading by as many as 12. The Bulls (20-15) finally got some traction, closing within 72-68 on a jumper by Lamonte Bearden with less than two minutes to play. But Miami hit enough free throws down the stretch to put the game away. Nick Perkins had 20 points and six rebounds to lead Buffalo. Bearden added 19 points. Miami trailed by 9 points about midway through the first half, before surging to take a 2-point halftime lead. Buffalo tried to sag in on Miami's big men in the second half, but were bitten several times when the Hurricanes were able to get the ball out to the perimeter for open 3s. Buffalo coach Nate Oats promised his team would come out attacking, and it did, connecting on four of their first five from

beyond the arc to take an early 12-6 lead. But Miami pecked away the rest of the half and took a 35-33 lead into the locker room after Bearden's layup at the buzzer was waved off.

TIP-INS: Miami: Hit 5 of its final 7 field goals ... Outscored Buffalo 36-24 in the paint ... Went 26 of 34 from the free throw line ... Improves to 3-1 against Buffalo ... Improves to 7-7 all-time in NCAA Tournament.

TEAM NOTES: Miami improved to 3-1 all-time against Buffalo. The series dates back to 1993 ... The Hurricanes held a 35-33 lead at the half. Miami improved to 20-1 when leading at the half ... Miami opened the second half with a 14-5 run to take a 49-38 lead with 13:33 to go ... Miami never trailed during the second half of play ... On an alley oop from Ja'Quan Newton to Davon Reed with 4:13 remaining in the first half, Miami took the lead, 27-25. It was Miami's first lead since 2-0 at 19:18 ... Miami moved to 100-42 all-time as a ranked team. The Hurricanes also improved to 52-22 as a ranked team since joining the ACC.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES: Angel Rodriguez scored a game and season-high 24 points ... Rodriguez scored 20+ points for the fifth time this

season ... Rodriguez has hit a 3-pointer in 11 straight games and has three-plus assists in 13 of the last 15 games ... Sheldon McClellan has scored 10+ points in 21-straight games, dating back to Miami's ACC opener against Syracuse (1/2/16). He has scored at least 10 points in 30 of Miami's 33 games this season ... McClellan scored 20+ points for the 13th time this season ... Kamari Murphy has pulled down four-plus rebounds in 10 of the last 11 games. It was his fourth game of 10-plus rebounds on the season ... Murphy set a new school record for blocks in an NCAA Tournament game with four. The previous record was 3, held by John Salmons (vs. Lafayette, 3/12/99) and Jimmy Graham (vs. Texas, 3/23/08) ... Murphy recorded his first double-double as a Hurricane. Murphy scored 10+ points for the sixth time this season and first time since 2/7/16 at Georgia Tech ... Murphy tied a season-high with 11 points and tied a career-high with 13 rebounds ... Davon Reed has hit a 3-pointer in 8 of his last 10 games and 10 of his last 12 ... Reed recorded a season-high in rebounds with 12 ... Reed scored 10+ points for the 10th time in his last 12 games ... Ja'Quan Newton scored 10-plus points for the third straight game.

The UM locker room is closed at all times. For home games, Coach L and at least one Hurricane player will report to the media room for interviews following the opposing team's press conference.

LARRAÑAGA GRADUATES CANES STUDENT-ATHLETES

All four Hurricane seniors will be graduates of Miami following the 2015-16 campaign. Last May Sheldon McClellan earned his bachelor of liberal arts degree and in December Angel Rodriguez earned his bachelor's of education degree with a major in sports administration and a minor in sociology, the same degree Ivan Cruz Uceda and Tonye Jekiri will both complete in May 2016.

FOUR PLAYERS BOAST NCAA TOURNAMENT EXPERIENCE

Senior Tonye Jekiri returns from Miami's 2012-13 ACC Championship and NCAA Sweet 16 team. Sheldon McClellan (Texas), Kamari Murphy (Oklahoma State) and Angel Rodriguez (Kansas State) also have played in the NCAA Tournament, each with their previous schools.

ALL-ACC AWARDS FOR THE HURRICANES

Coach Jim Larrañaga was named the ACC Coach of the Year for the second time in four seasons while three players earned postseason honors. Coach Jim Larrañaga - Coach of the Year (ACSM/Coaches); Tonye Jekiri - All-Defensive Team (ACSM/Coaches); Sheldon McClellan - Second Team All-ACC (ACSM/Coaches); Angel Rodriguez - Third Team All-ACC (ACSM/Coaches); Tonye Jekiri - Honorable Mention (ACSM/Coaches). Since joining the league in 2004-05, Miami has had 34 honorees on ACC postseason award lists, 21 of which have come under Coach L's watch, including five of Miami's six All-Defensive Team players. Jekiri is the only Hurricane to be named to that team twice.

JEKIRI EARNS MOST WINS IN PROGRAM HISTORY

In four seasons at Miami, senior Tonye Jekiri has won 95 games, the most of any Hurricane in school history. Jekiri is the only remaining player from the 2012-13 ACC Championship and NCAA Sweet 16 team. That season, Jekiri did not play in a pair of games, playing in just 27 wins individually. He has played in every victory since, with 17 as a sophomore, 25 as a junior and 26 this campaign.

NEWTON BEST SIXTH MAN IN THE COUNTRY

Dick Vitale has lauded Miami sophomore Ja'Quan Newton as the "best sixth man in the country." Newton has immensely improved his stats from last year, and has scored in double digits 18 times this season.

In 10 ACC victories Newton played in (not vs. VT twice, Louisville and Notre Dame), he averaged 11.4 points and 2.3 assists per game, hitting 50.6 percent from the field. In the Canes' four losses he played in, he put up 6.8 points and 1.3 assists per outing, knocking down 26.5 percent of his shots.

THE U AGAINST RANKED TEAMS

In eight games against ranked teams, Miami is 5-3 with wins over No. 3 Virginia, No. 11 Louisville, No. 16 Utah, No. 20/22 Butler and No. 24/20 Duke, and losses to No. 13/11 Virginia, No. 5/4 North Carolina and No. 3 Virginia. In those games, Sheldon McClellan averages 14.8 points per game, hitting 48.7 percent from the field. Angel Rodriguez averages 13.1 points and 4.4 assists while Tonye Jekiri records 8.6 points and 8.3 rebounds per game. Complete stats against ranked teams are on page 10.

CANES IN THE MIAMI RECORD BOOK

Senior center Tonye Jekiri has 890 rebounds in 137 career games at The U, good enough for fourth on the all-time rebounding list. Harry Manushaw is third with 914 career boards.

Jekiri is also moving up the list for career blocked shots, currently at No. 6 with 126. He trails No. 5 Julian Gamble's (2008-13) 132 swats.

In four seasons, Jekiri has played in 137 games, the most of any Hurricane.

With 145 handouts this year, senior Angel Rodriguez is eyeing Miami's top-five list for assists in a season. Rodriguez is currently sixth behind Michael Gardner (1992-93) 154 and Shane Larkin (2012-13) 164.

Sheldon McClellan has tallied 1,076 points in 71 games at Miami. Added to his 843 points at Texas, he is also closing in on 2,000 career points.

MIAMI PREDICTED TO FINISH FIFTH IN ACC

Miami was predicted to finish fifth out of 15 teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season, as announced by the league during Operation ACC Basketball in Charlotte, N.C., Oct. 28. North Carolina was picked to win the league, followed by Virginia, Duke and Notre Dame.

Miami finished the season tied for second place.

In 2012-13, the Canes were picked to finish fifth, then won the league's regular season and tournament championship. In all five of Larrañaga's seasons at Miami, the Canes have finished the season better than predicted at ACC media day.

CANES HAD HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

With the BankUnited Center sold out for every game this season, the Canes were 15-1 overall and 9-0 in ACC play this year at home. The 15 wins are the most in school history, topping 14 in 2012-13, 2011-12 and 2007-08. The Hurricanes posted a 13-game home winning streak which is tied with the 2012-13 season for the second longest in school history, trailing only the 15-game streak between Dec. 15, 1964 and Dec. 1, 1965.

MCCLELLAN AND JEKIRI ON NATIONAL AWARD WATCH LISTS

Senior Sheldon McClellan is currently on three national player of the year watch lists: Naismith Trophy Men's College Player of the Year, Oscar Robertson Trophy for Men's National Player of the Year and Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award.

Senior Tonye Jekiri is one of 11 college basketball players selected as semifinalists for the sixth Eddie Sutton Tustenugee Award. The award singles out a player who exhibits the traits of tenacity and unselfishness that Sutton advocated during his 36-year career.

DEWAN HUELL NAMED 2016 MCDONALD'S ALL-AMERICAN

Miami signee Dewan Huell has been named a 2016 McDonald's All-American, as announced on ESPN Jan. 17. Huell will become the fourth McDonald's All-American to play at Miami, joining Darius Rice (2000 McDonald's All-American), Steve Edwards (1992) and Tito Horford (1985). Since the inception of the McDonald's All American Game in 1977, only 38 players have hailed from the state of Florida, 11 of which were from 'The State of Miami' - Broward, Dade and Palm Beach counties. Just six of those players have been from Dade County, the most recent before Huell being Corey Louis in 1994.

THE BUC WAS SOLD OUT

In just his fifth season in Coral Gables, Jim Larrañaga and Miami SOLD OUT the season ticket allotment for all home games this year at the BankUnited Center. This was the first time in Miami athletics history a team sold out their season. In Coach Larrañaga's fifth season at The U, fans bought 5,500 season tickets, more than doubling the total number of season tickets sold in his first season in Coral Gables. When Coach L began his reign in Miami, fans bought 2,251 season tickets for the 2011-12 campaign. After a record-breaking season on the court in 2012-13, season tickets peaked at 3,674 for 2013-14.

MIAMI'S STARTERS SHOW EXPERIENCE

Miami starts two redshirt seniors, one true senior, a redshirt junior and a true junior. Those players combine for 404 starts and 592 games played. Sheldon McClellan has started 93 games playing in 138, Tonye Jekiri has 85 starts in 136 games, Angel Rodriguez is at 101/129, Davon Reed 63/95 and Kamari Murphy 62/95.

Those five players have been on a Division I team a combined 21 seasons, as McClellan and Rodriguez are both in their fifth year on the court, Jekiri and Murphy are each in their fourth season, and Reed is a true junior. The average age of that starting five is 21.8 years old: Rodriguez - 23; McClellan - 23; Murphy - 22; Jekiri - 21; Reed - 20.

COACHING COORDINATORS FOR MIAMI

Miami's assistant coaching staff is set up in a coordinator system, with Jamal Brunt as the offensive coordinator, Chris Caputo manning the defense and Adam Fisher handling the scout for every opponent. James Johnson is the Dean of Discipline.

JIM LARRAÑAGA

Head Coach, Fifth Season
Providence, 1971

Jim Larrañaga was named the 12th head coach of the University of Miami men's basketball program on April 22, 2011.

After leading UM to the 2013 NCAA Sweet 16, and winning the school's first ACC regular season and tournament championships, Larrañaga was honored as the AP, Naismith, USBWA Henry Iba and ACC Coach of the Year. The Bronx, N.Y., native helped Miami to a No. 2 national ranking by both the AP and USA TODAY, and a No. 2 seed in the NCAA tournament. He is the 10th coach in the last 10 years to lead two top-10 programs, as Miami was No. 2 on Feb. 18, 2013, and George Mason was No. 8 in the final Top 25 poll in 2006.

In 2014-15 Larrañaga led the Hurricanes to the championship game of the NIT, the first time Miami played into the month of April. Larrañaga's Canes played in his home state of New York, his first game competing as a head coach in Madison Square Garden. The Hurricanes' 25-13 record marked the second-most victories at the school, behind UM's 29 in 2012-13, and Larrañaga's fourth 25-win season as a head coach. In January, the Canes downed eventual national champion then-No. 4 Duke, 90-74, at Cameron Indoor Stadium, the only team to defeat Duke at home this season. Miami also defeated No. 8/7 Florida and Syracuse on their home courts, two of Miami's 10 regular season wins away from home. The Canes ranked 13th in the country in turnovers per game (10.1), were 22 in the nation with a 74.6 percent clip at the free throw line and No. 53 with 7.7 3-pointers made per game. Miami finished the season sixth in the ACC after being projected to finish 10th, the fourth-straight year the Canes have exceeded expectations. Junior forward Tonye Jekiri was named to the All-ACC Defensive Team and third in voting for ACC Most Improved Player, and along with classmates Sheldon McClellan and Angel Rodriguez, all three were honorable mentions to the All-ACC team.

In 2012-13 Larrañaga directed the Canes to a 27-point win over No. 1 Duke and three other 20+ point wins over ACC opponents that season, including North Carolina (+26), Florida State (+24) and Boston College (+22). UM's 29 overall and 15 ACC wins in 2012-13 were program-bests, as was the 14-game winning streak and 13-0 start in conference play. Other program firsts include defeating all three teams in the North Carolina Triangle in the same season, beating a trio of teams in the Top 20 since joining the ACC and hosting five sellouts at the BankUnited Center.

Individually, Coach L saw Shane Larkin earn the ACC Player of the Year and Lute Olson National Player of the Year awards, as well as All-American status and finalist nods for the Bob Cousy, John Wooden and James Naismith player of the year honors before declaring early for the 2013 NBA Draft. Larkin was also the ACC Tournament MVP, on the All-ACC Defensive team and a defensive All-American. Durand Scott was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year, three players – Larkin, Scott and Kenny Kadji – were listed on all-conference teams and four were on the ACC All-Tournament Team – Larkin, Scott, Julian Gamble and Trey McKinney Jones. All six seniors on the Sweet 16 team earned academic degrees from the University of Miami and one player was listed on the All-ACC Academic Team.

Larrañaga came to Miami after serving as the head coach at George Mason for 14 seasons. He guided that program to five NCAA Tournament appearances (1999, 2001, 2006, 2008, 2011) – including an unprecedented run to the 2006 Final Four that captured the nation's attention, defeating Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and UConn along the way. Following that run, he was selected the 2006 Clair Bee Coach of the Year. Larrañaga built the GMU Patriots' program into a perennial contender in the highly-regarded Colonial Athletic Association, winning more games (273) than any other coach in program and conference history en route to three conference titles (1999, 2001, 2008). A two-time CAA Coach of the Year honoree, Larrañaga earned the accolade in 2011, leading the Patriots to a 27-7 overall record and 16-2 conference mark en route to the CAA regular-season title and their fifth NCAA Tournament appearance under his leadership. Seeded a program-best eighth in the NCAA Tournament, George Mason rallied from a double-digit deficit to defeat ninth-seeded Villanova, 61-57, before falling to overall No. 1 seed Ohio State in the third round. In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the Final Four in 27 years and earned an at-large berth for a CAA team for the first time in 20 years. Along the way, he led Mason to a school record in wins, the school's first national ranking, George Mason's first appearance in the Top 10 and the school's first wins over Top 10 teams.

With 31 years of head coaching experience, the native of The Bronx, N.Y., previously served as the head coach at Bowling Green for 11 seasons (1986-1997) and at Division II American International for two seasons (1977-79). His first coaching opportunity came at Davidson College, where he served as an assistant coach to Terry Holland. Davidson captured three Southern Conference regular-season championships and an NIT berth in his five years there, and he compiled a 47-12 record doubling as the freshman team coach. In 1976, he left Davidson and spent one season as player-coach for the Geronemo Basketball Club in Belgium. A 1971 graduate of Providence College with a degree in economics, Larrañaga was a four-year letterman for the Friars. As the team captain in his senior season, he led Providence to a 20-8 record and an NIT appearance. He graduated as the school's fifth all-time leading scorer with 1,258 points and was selected in the sixth round of the draft by the Detroit Pistons of the National Basketball Association. He was the team's top scorer as a sophomore and junior and was named New England's Division I Sophomore of the Year in 1969. He was inducted into the Providence College Hall of Fame in 1991.

Larrañaga and his wife, Liz, have two sons – Jay, who played for his father at Bowling Green and is an assistant coach with the Boston Celtics, and Jon, who was a member of his father's George Mason teams from 1999-2003 – and four grandchildren: Tia, James, Jon Temple and Henry.
