## MIAMI TO HOST BOSTON COLLEGE IN SEASON FINALE

- ▶ The Miami Hurricanes will close out the 2011 campaign when they host ACC foe Boston College on Friday, Nov. 25. Kick-off is set for 3:36 p.m. at Sun Life Stadium. The game will be televised nationally on ABC.
- ▶ Hurricanes' director of athletics Shawn M. Eichorst announced on Sunday that UM has made the decision to withhold the football team from bowl consideration following the 2011 regular season in response to the ongoing NCAA inquiry and has informed both the NCAA and the Atlantic Coast Conference of its decision. Miami became bowl-eligible with a 6-3 win over USF last Saturday.
- ▶ Twenty-five seniors will make their final appearance as Hurricanes in Sun Life Stadium on Saturday against Boston College. The 2011 senior class has helped Miami to a record of 29-21 (.580) since 2008, including three straight bowl bids (2008 Emerald Bowl, 2009 Champs Sports Bowl and 2010 Hyundai Sun Bowl).
- ▶ Through seven ACC games, the Hurricanes are the most efficient team in the conference. Miami has completed 120-of-190 passes while scoring 14 touchdowns and only throwing four interceptions for an efficiency rating of 157.4. Florida State is the next most efficient team with a rating of 153.2.
- ▶ Miami has been a strong second-half team, outscoring its opponents 153-88 (+65) after halftime. In the fourth quarter alone, the Canes have outscored their opponents by 46 points, 101-55.
- ▶ Senior linebacker Sean Spence is the ACC's active leader in career tackles for loss and is second nationally among all active players with 46.
- ▶ At this time last season, quarterback Jacory Harris was 132-of-245 for 1,646 yards with 14 touchdowns, 11 interceptions and an efficiency rating of 120.19. In stark contrast, Harris' efficiency rating is currently 158.22. The senior signal caller has completed 172-of-261 passes for 2,241 yards with 19 touchdowns and only five picks.
- ▶ The Hurricanes' point total against USF was their lowest in any victory since a 6-0 result over Louisiana Tech on Sept. 29, 1979. It was also the first time any FBS team had scored less than seven points and won a road game since Auburn topped Mississippi State, 3-2 in 2008.

The MIAMI-BOSTON COLLEGE SERIES

- ▶ Miami leads the all-time series, 23-4.
- ▶ The last meeting between these two was in 2008 and ended in a loss at Chestnut Hill with the Eagles victorious 28-14.
- ▶ Miami has won 14 of the last 15 games dating back to 1985.

A CANES WIN OVER THE EAGLES WOULD...

- ▶ Give the Hurricanes their second consecutive victory and fifth overall at Sun Life Stadium this season.
- ▶ Give the Hurricanes seven or more wins for the fourth straight season.
- ▶ Be Miami's fourth Atlantic Coast Conference victory.
- ▶ Give Al Golden his first victory over Boston College and a winning record at Sun Life Stadium.

The COACHES

▶ Al Golden is in his first year as Miami's head coach and owns an overall record of 32-39. Boston College head coach Frank Spaziani sports a career record of 19-19 all with the Golden Eagles now in his third season.

Scouting THE EAGLES

- ▶ Boston College is coming off of a tough loss against the Fighting Irish of Notre Dame in Indiana, dropping a 16-14 contest.
- ▶ The Eagles possess one of the nation's least potent offenses, ranking 113th nationally in total offense (293.64 yards/gm), and 85th nationally in rush offense, producing a lackluster 128.91 yards/gm on the ground.
- ▶ Sophomore quarterback Chase Rettig ranks near the bottom in passing, sporting a 52.3 completion percentage and tossing for only 159.8 yards/game. His totals are good for 98th nationally, including 10 scores and nine interceptions.
- ▶ Starting receiver Bobby Swigert has a team-high 40 receptions this year and has pulled in three touchdowns. Not a deep threat, however, his longest reception of the season is for 37 yards.
- ▶ The running back tandem of Rolandan Finch and Andre Williams have combined for 1,074 yards with seven scores, averaging over 100 yards per game. Each is averaging over four yards per carry.
- ▶ Placekicker Nate Freese isn't the most accurate kicker hitting only 9 of 15. He has the leg to go from distance however, hitting from a long of 52 this season.
- ▶ Boston College possess the nation's leading tackler in junior linebacker Luke Kuechly with 182 total tackles, 35 more than the second leading tackler in Division I football.

Spence NAMED BUTKUS AWARD SEMIFINALIST

- ▶ On Oct. 24, Miami linebacker Sean Spence was named as one of 12 finalists for the 27th Annual Butkus Award® honoring the nation's top college linebacker.
- ▶ Spence was again the Canes' leader on defense against Duke. The prolific linebacker racked up eight tackles to lead his team. The Miami native had five solo stops and two tackles for a loss of two yards.
- ▶ Spence has been the anchor of the defense all season and has amassed 92 total tackles (34th nationally), 14.0 tackles for loss (18th nationally) for 39 yards, three sacks for 23 yards and a forced fumble.
- ▶ No other player at a BCS institution has won defensive player of the week honors for their conference three times this season. Only Mike Taylor, a linebacker at Wisconsin, has won it twice.

Wieclaw NAMED LOU GROZA SEMIFINALIST

- ▶ The Palm Beach County Sports Commission has released its 20 semi-finalists for the 2011 Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award presented by the Orange Bowl Committee and Miami's Jake Wieclaw is among those receiving recognition.
- ▶ The New Lenox, Ill. native has converted on all 37 of his extra point attempts and has made 10-of-13 field goal attempts, with a season-long 43-yarder coming at North Carolina.
- ▶ On 57 kickoffs, Wieclaw has recorded three touchbacks and has limited the opposition to an average starting field position of the 23-yard line.

- Miller is second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with 105.3 rushing yards per game, ranking 19th nationally.
- Through the first four games of the season, Miller was the only back in America with a rush of 40-yards or more in every game. He did not extend that streak at Virginia Tech, but did have runs of 37 and 30 yards.
- Of his eleven career rushes/receptions of 25-yards or more, nine have come after halftime.
- Miller recorded 166 rushing yards on 18 carries against Virginia Tech, posting his fifth-straight game with at least 100 yards rushing. Miller is the first Cane to open the season with five-straight 100-yard rushing games. Willis McGahee started the 2002 season with 100-plus in four of the first five games. The last time a Cane recorded five-straight 100-yard rushing games was Clinton Portis in 2001.
- Miller has eleven plays of 25-yards or longer this season: 10 rushes and one reception.
- Until the Ohio State game (184 yards), Miller's output against Virginia Tech was a career best. The Hokies' run defense came into the 2011 meeting ranked No. 4 nationally against the run, giving up only 58.20 yards on the ground.
- Miller joins former Cane Frank Gore (2001-04) with eight career 100-yard rushing games. Edgerrin James (1995-98) is the all-time leader with 15 games of 100 or more yards on the ground.

When IT COUNTS

► You can only bottle up the electric Lamar Miller for so long. His career shows that the second half is clearly Miller Time. Not only do his biggest plays (especially runs) come in the second half, but nearly 60 percent of his career yards have come after intermission.

Lamar Miller became the eighth player in program history to surpass the 1,000-yard mark in the Canes loss to Florida State on Nov. 12. Miller rushed for 92 yards on 22 carries against the Seminoles. The redshirt sophomore now ranks fifth in UM history with 1,158 rushing yards in a season.

- 1—Rank of Miami's offensive efficiency according to footballoutsiders.com. The ranking is based on the opponent-adjusted efficiency of the given team's offense.

**A GAME OF FIRSTS - USF RECAP**

- ▶ Sophomore linebacker Kelvin Cain made his first start of the season. Cain finished the game with three tackles.
- ▶ Freshman wide receiver Phillip Dorsett earned his first career start against the Bulls. The 5-9 wide-out caught three passes for 22 yards.
- ▶ Junior defensive back Brandon McGee picked off USF's B.J. Daniels on the Bulls' first offensive play. The interception was the first of McGee's career.
- ▶ The Hurricanes did not score a touchdown in the 6-3 win over USF. It was the first time this season and the first time since a 26-3 loss to Florida on Sept. 6, 2008 that Miami did not score a touchdown.
- ▶ The six combined points at the half were a season-low for the Hurricanes and is the lowest total score since Miami and USF met last season on Nov. 27, when the Bulls led 3-0 at the break.

**Complete HISTORY**

- ▶ Senior quarterback Jacory Harris has placed himself at the top of Miami records in all-time pass completions with his performance against South Florida on Saturday. Harris, after finishing 27-of-35 for 259 yards against the vaunted Bulls defense, now has more pass completions (680) than any other quarterback in Miami history.

**UM HAS NATION'S MOST EFFICIENT OFFENSE**

▶ According to footballoutsiders.com, the Hurricanes have the country's No. 1-most efficient offense (.805). Navy is the second-most efficient unit in the country at .679. A year ago, Miami's offensive efficiency was a feeble .137 to rank 40th in the nation.

**The CLASS OF 2011**

▶ The Class of 2011 includes wide receiver **Travis Benjamin**, wide receiver **Ben Bruneau**, wide receiver **LaRon Byrd**, full back **John Calhoun**, defensive back **Lee Chambers**, offensive lineman **Joel Figueroa**, tight end **Chase Ford**, linebacker **Jordan Futch**, defensive back **Nate Gholston**, linebacker **Sean Goldstein**, offensive lineman **Harland Gunn**, quarterback **Jacory Harris**, center **Tyler Horn**, long snapper **Chris Ivory**, linebacker **Miles Levine**, linebacker **Erik Lichter**, defensive back **JoJo Nicolas**, defensive lineman **Micanor Regis**, linebacker **Marcus Robinson**, defensive lineman **Andrew Smith**, linebacker **Sean Spence**, running back **David Thompson**, quarterback **Spencer Whipple** and defensive back **Mike Williams**. Those 24 seniors along with former tight end **Blake Ayles**, who retired from football prior to the 2011 season due to a career-ending injury, will be recognized during a pregame ceremony on Saturday.

**Logging PLAYING TIME**

- ▶ With one game remaining, four Canes are on track to play in a record number of games for Miami. Brandon Meriweather holds the UM all-time record with 52 appearances from 2002-2006.
- ▶ Seniors Travis Benjamin (48), LaRon Byrd (50), Chris Ivory (49) and JoJo Nicolas (49) have played in a combined 196 games since 2008.
- ▶ Byrd has already joined the all-time list with 50 games played to tie for third-place all-time with three others. With one game remaining, he could finish his career with 51 appearances, good for a tie for second place.

**Honoring A LEGEND**

- ▶ UM honored Russell Maryland in an on-field ceremony in the Sept. 17 contest against Ohio State to commemorate the defensive tackle's upcoming induction into the College Football Hall of Fame in December.
- ▶ Maryland finished his college career with 279 tackles, 25 tackles for losses and 20.5 quarterback sacks. He was the Jack Harding Most Valuable Player Award winner in 1990 and led the Hurricanes to four consecutive bowl berths, two national championships and an overall record of 45-3 during his career.

**Canes OPEN NEW ERA UNDER GOLDEN**

- ▶ Golden owns an overall record of 33-39 and is in his sixth season as a head coach.
- ▶ Golden arrived in Coral Gables after spending the last five seasons as the head coach at Temple University. Over five seasons at Temple, Golden took the Owls to unprecedented heights. Before his arrival, TU had just two winning seasons over its previous 26 years and had only won 22 percent of its games over the previous 30 years. Quickly, Golden made the Owls a contender, leading the team to a combined record of 17-8 his last two years there. The 2009 season marked Temple's first winning season since 1990, and Golden was rewarded with MAC Coach of the Year honors.

Harris' 69 career touchdown passes rank second in school history and fourth all time among ACC passers. His career TD-to-Int ratio is 1.57-to-1.

The numbers above show that Harris is a slow starter as his TD-to-Int ratio in the opening half is just 1.16-to-1. However, in the second half, his numbers improve dramatically to 2.54-to-1.

Beyond that increase, Harris' red zone numbers are outstanding. When inside the opponent's 20-yard and facing a more condensed defense, the senior has:

That equates to an impressive 7.17-to-1 TD-to-Int ratio.

When the game is on the line and points are necessary in the red zone, Harris has proven to come through in the clutch.

**Jacory SOARING**

▶ Under the tutelage of offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Jedd Fisch, Miami quarterback Jacory Harris has recorded career highs this season in several key statistical categories. Harris' 2011 QB rating (166.15), completion rate (65.9%), yards per attempt (9.0) and longest pass (77 yards) are all career highs.

**J12 AMONG THE BEST**

▶ With his 259-yard performance against South Florida on Nov. 19, Jacory Harris remains in second place in Miami's all-time records book with 8,581 career passing yards, surpassing Gino Torretta and trailing only Ken Dorsey (9,565).  
▶ Harris is among the nation's best quarterbacks with a passing efficiency of 158.22 - ranking 10th nationally. Harris has connected on 172-of-261 passes with 19 touchdowns and five interceptions.

▶ Harris entered the season ranked among Miami's top signal callers, appearing in six different career records categories.

▶ Harris is ranked second all-time in passing yardage, pass completions, pass attempts, touchdowns thrown and total offense, while ranking third in completion percentage. Harris is on track to upend Ken Dorsey in one category, needing to attempt 43 passes to surpass Dorsey as the record holder. Last season he connected on 148 passes and attempted 270.

▶ He moved into sole possession of second place all-time in career passing TDs on Oct. 23, 2010 when he threw touchdown passes to LaRon Byrd, Travis Benjamin and Leonard Hankerson against the Tar Heels.

▶ With his TD pass against Florida State, Harris moved into fourth-place surpassing Darian Durant (North Carolina, 2001-04) on the ACC's Career TD passes list with 69. The senior is now only seven touchdown passes shy of Russell Wilson (NC State - 2008-10). NC State's Phillip Rivers is the all-time leader with 95.

▶ Harris passed NC State's Russell Wilson (2008-10; 8,545), with his 259-yard performance against the Bulls, for 13th place on the ACC's career passing yardage stats, as he now has 8,581 career passing yards.

**Four TO ENTER UM HALL OF FAME**

► The University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame announced on Sept. 22 that four former Hurricane football players will be among those to be enshrined in its Class of 2012. Current Baltimore Ravens Ed Reed and Bryant McKinnie as well as Rich Mercier and Ray Bellamy - the university's first African-American football player - will be enshrined into the hall on March 29, 2012.

**► Ed Reed (1998-2001)**

Consensus First-Team All-America and All-BIG EAST selection in 2000 and 2001... Set UM career records for interceptions (21) and interception return yards (389)... His nine interceptions in 2001 is the second-highest single-season total in UM history... Recorded eight interceptions in 2000 (third-best in UM history).

**► Bryant McKinnie (2000-2001)**

Outland Trophy winner as college football's outstanding interior lineman in 2001... Named a First-Team All-American by *The Football News* in 2000 and a consensus first-team All-American by every national service in 2001, including the Associated Press, Football Writers Association, *The Football News*, *The Sporting News* and the Walter Camp and the National Football Foundations... The 2001 National Player of the Year by CNNI.com... The 2001 College Football Offensive Player of the Year by The Football News... Did not allow a quarterback sack during his entire UM career.

**► Ray Bellamy (1967-1970)**

Miami's first African-American football player... Endured hardships and led the way for future African-American athletes... In 1968, had 37 receptions for 549 yards and two touchdowns... Had eight receptions for 121 yards vs. Auburn in 1968... In 1969, caught 45 passes for 712 yards... Near-fatal auto accident limited his career... Was voted Miami's first African-American student body president in 1971.

The senior ended the game with an interception and a fumble recovery for a touchdown. The Defensive Performance of the Year is part of a four-month competition that lets fans determine which individual performances reign supreme during the 2011 college football season.

**Miami FOOTBALL RANKED EIGHTH NATIONALLY IN APR**

► When the NCAA's Academic Progress Report (APR) was announced in May, the Canes' football program headlined an outstanding academic showing by the University of Miami this past school year. The football team (along with baseball, men's basketball and men's tennis) improved upon its APR score for an impressive seventh straight season. In fact, the UM football program's APR score (978) ranked eighth among all FBS schools.

**Eight CANES GO IN 2011 NFL DRAFT**

► The University of Miami's success in the NFL Draft continued this past spring, as eight Canes were selected in 2011. Orlando Franklin (2nd round to Denver), Brandon Harris (2nd round to Houston), Leonard Hankerson (3rd round to Washington), DeMarcus Van Dyke (3rd round to Oakland), Allen Bailey (3rd round to Kansas City), Colin McCarthy (4th round to Tennessee), Richard Gordon (6th round to Oakland) and Matt Boshier (6th round to Atlanta) were all taken off the board in the Top 200 picks.  
 ► Miami's eight draftees trailed only USC (9) and North Carolina (9) for the most in the country in 2011.  
 ► Since 2000, only Ohio State (78) and USC (77) have had more players drafted than the Canes (75).  
 ► Miami continues to comfortably lead the nation in first round draft picks in recent years, as 26 Canes have been selected in the first round since 2000. Ohio State (17) remains a distant second.

**GSR SCORES SHOW CONTINUED SUCCESS OF MIAMI ATHLETICS**

► In what has become an annual upward trend, student-athletes at the University of Miami continue to excel in the classroom at a record pace. According to the NCAA's Graduation Success Rates (GSR), Miami established a new athletics department-wide record with a GSR of 89 percent.  
 ► Last year, the athletics department-wide GSR was at its then-record high of 86 percent.  
 ► The athletics department has exceeded the NCAA average for GSR in each of the last seven years.
