2011-12 TAR HEEL BASKETBALL CAROLINA

TAR HEELS CLOSE OUT HOMESTAND BY HOSTING MIAMI TUESDAY

◆ North Carolina (14-2, 1-0 ACC) will close out its nine-game homestand and look to improve to 2-0 in Atlantic Coast Conference play on Tuesday night when it hosts Miami (9-5, 0-1 ACC) at 9 p.m. in the Smith Center. The game will be televised regionally by the syndicated ACC Network of stations. Bob Rathbun (play-by-play) and Mike Gminski (analyst) will have the call.

◆ Tuesday's game is the last in UNC's nine-game, nearly six-week homestand. Carolina's last road game was a one-point loss on Dec. 3 at top-ranked Kentucky and its next game away from the Smith Center will be Saturday at Florida State. Starting Saturday in Tallahassee, UNC will play four of six games on the road.

◆ Carolina opened ACC play with an 83-60 win over Boston College at home on Saturday afternoon and has won eight games in a row.

◆ Miami enters Tuesday's game with a record of 9-5 and lost its ACC opener 52-51 at Virginia on Saturday night.

◆ Against Miami, the Tar Heels will be aiming for their Smith Center-record 28th win in a row in the Smith Center and their 29th victory in a row at home overall (including a 2010 NIT game in Carmichael Arena). The overall UNC home winning streak record is 32 games, set from 1926-29.

◆ Carolina is ranked No. 3 in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today coaches polls this week. Miami is unranked.

◆ **UPCOMING:** After Tuesday's game, the Tar Heels will visit Florida State on Saturday Jan. 14 and Virginia Tech on Thursday Jan. 19 before hosting NC State (Jan. 26) and Georgia Tech (Jan. 29) in back-to-back home games.

THE SERIES VS. UM

◆ Carolina leads the series with the Hurricanes, 16-2, including eight consecutive Tar Heel wins over Miami.

◆ UNC holds an 8-1 advantage in Chapel Hill, a 6-1 edge on the road and a 2-0 edge at neutral sites.

◆ UNC beat Miami twice last season, including 74-71 in Coral Gables in January and 61-59 in the ACC Tournament quarterfinals in Greensboro.

◆ Carolina's last loss to Miami came on Jan. 14, 2006, in Chapel Hill.

◆ **Roy Williams** is 12-2 as a head coach against the Hurricanes, including a 10-1 mark at UNC and a 2-1 record at Kansas. At Carolina, Williams has a 5-1 mark against Miami in Chapel Hill, a 4-0 record in Coral Gables and a 1-0 mark in the ACC Tournament.

LAST SEASON IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT: BIG COMEBACK LEADS TAR HEELS PAST MIAMI, 61-59

◆ Tyler Zeller took a pass from Kendall Marshall and connected on a layup as the buzzer sounded to give top-seeded Carolina a 61-59 win over ninth-seeded Miami on March 11, 2011, in the ACC Tournament quarterfinals in Greensboro.

◆ Carolina's comeback win was its largest in ACC Tournament history. The Tar Heels trailed Miami by 19 points with 9:51 to play in the second half. Carolina closed the game on a 27-6 run over the last 9:51 of play.

◆ Miami led 31-22 at the half. That equalled UNC's largest halftime deficit overcome in an ACC Tournament game. In the 1969 ACC championship game, Duke led Carolina 43-34 but the Tar Heels rallied for an 85-74 win behind Charles Scott's 40 points.

◆ The 19-point comeback was Carolina's largest in any game since Feb. 15, 2006, when freshman Tyler Hansbrough scored 40 points in an 82-75 UNC win over Georgia Tech in Chapel Hill. The Yellow Jackets led 50-30 with four minutes left in the first half.

◆ The 19-point deficit in the second half was the largest overcome by Carolina to win since Jan. 27, 1993, against Florida State. In that game, UNC trailed by 21 in the second half and by 19 (73-54) with under 9:00 to play. The Tar Heels outscored the Seminoles 28-4 over the last nine minutes to win.

◆ North Carolina scored its fewest points (61) in an ACC Tournament victory since a 57-51 semifinal win over NC State on March 9, 1985, in Atlanta.

◆ Carolina made 10 of its 22 field goals from three-point range in the game. UNC made 45.5 percent of its baskets from three-point range, easily its largest percentage of the season. UNC made 11 of 29 field goals (.379) against Rutgers from three-point range on Dec. 28.

◆ UNC's 20 turnovers were its most since it had 22 against Vanderbilt in Puerto Rico in the fourth game of the season. Carolina's previous high in an ACC game was 18 in the loss at Georgia Tech.

◆ Zeller scored each of UNC's last four field goals and finished with 13 points and nine rebounds. Zeller's game-winning basket as time expired was Carolina's first winning shot with no time remaining since Ty Lawson hit a running three-pointer at Florida State on Jan. 28, 2009.

◆ Leslie McDonald scored all 11 of his points in the second half, hitting three three-pointers. He hit two three-pointers to start the 19-point comeback. McDonald has scored in double figures in three of his last four games. McDonald has shot 14 for 26 from three-point range in the last seven games.

◆ Harrison Barnes led all scorers with 18 points. It was the ninth time in 15 ACC games Barnes had led UNC in scoring.

◆ John Henson had 10 points, 13 rebounds and five blocked shots.

LAST SEASON IN CORAL GABLES

◆ Harrison Barnes hit a three-pointer with 6.6 seconds left in the game to give Carolina a 74-71 win at Miami on Jan. 26, 2011, in the BankUnited Center in Coral Gables, Fla.

◆ Carolina called timeout with 14 seconds remaining in the game and Kendall Marshall found Barnes on the right wing for the game-winner as the shot clock expired.

◆ After two free throws by Miami's Malcolm Grant put the Hurricanes ahead 71-69 with 1:22 remaining, Barnes scored the last five points of the game in the final 1:09.

◆ Miami led by as many as 14 points in the first half, building an 18-4 lead seven minutes into the game and again leading by 14 at 28-14 with 8:44 left in the opening period. UNC closed the half on a 25-11 run to tie the score at 39-all at the break.

◆ Barnes (13) and Dexter Strickland (12) were the only Carolina players to score in double figures but eight Tar Heels scored six or more points and all nine UNC players who played scored at least four points. Tyler Zeller had nine points and John Henson, Justin Knox and Reggie Bullock scored eight apiece.

◆ UNC's bench outscored Miami's bench by a 26-13 margin. The Tar Heels held a 16-7 edge in second-chance points.

◆ Carolina hit 11 of 12 free throws in the second half and 12 of 14 in the game. Miami was 6 for 10 from the line.

◆ Carolina committed just three turnovers in the second half and 11 in the game.

◆ The Tar Heels shot 58.1 percent in the first half but 37.0 percent after halftime.

- ◆ Miami hit 13 three-pointers. The Hurricanes hit 8 of 13 first-half three-pointers.
- ◆ Durand Scott (18 points, 4 of 5 three-pointers) and Grant (17 points with three three-pointers) led Miami.

TAR HEELS SET SMITH CENTER WINNING STREAK RECORD

◆ Carolina is riding a 27-game Smith Center winning streak that stretches across three seasons and is the longest streak in the building's history.

◆ UNC's last home loss came on Feb. 24, 2010, against Florida State. The Tar Heels set the new record with the Jan. 1 win over Monmouth (breaking the previous mark of 25 in a row set from 1992-94).

◆ The overall home winning streak is 28 games and is actually one game longer than the Smith Center winning streak (the Tar Heels won a game at Carmichael Arena in the 2010 NIT).

◆ The current, 28-game home winning streak is the second-longest in UNC history. The record is 32 from 1926-1929 in the Indoor Athletic Center (aka the Tin Can).

◆ Three of the four longest Smith Center winning streaks in history have come in the **Roy Williams** era (since the start of the 2003-04 season). Of the 112 victories that make up the five longest winning streaks at the Dean Smith Center, **Dean Smith** was the Carolina head coach for just 33 of them.

◆ Over a half-million Carolina fans (a total attendance of 518,138) have seen the Smith Center's current winning streak.

56 CONSECUTIVE NON-CONFERENCE WINS IN THE SMITH CENTER

◆ North Carolina's win over Monmouth on Jan. 1 was its 56th in a row against non-Atlantic Coast Conference opponents in the Smith Center.

◆ The Tar Heels' last non-conference loss in the Smith Center came on Nov. 29, 2005, to Illinois by a 68-64 score.

MARSHALL SHATTERING UNC & ACC ASSIST RECORDS

◆ Sophomore point guard **Kendall Marshall** may be Carolina's eighth-leading scorer, but his passing has been a key to UNC's success this season.

◆ Marshall is averaging 5.4 points and 10.1 assists per game with an assist-turnover ratio of 4.17 through 15 games this season.

◆ Marshall's 2011-12 assist-turnover ratio of 4.13 would easily be the best in ACC and UNC history if the season ended today (the existing mark is 3.48, set by **Ty Lawson** in 2008-09). Marshall has 13 double-digit assist games in his last 32 contests and seven this season.

◆ With 391 assists and 131 turnovers in 53 career games, Marshall has a career assist/turnover ratio of 2.98. That figure ranks first in ACC and UNC history, ahead of NC State's Sidney Lowe (2.94) and the previous UNC record of **Ty Lawson's** 2.78 from 2006-09.

◆ Marshall entered this week leading the nation in assists per game and was second in assist/turnover ratio (through games of Jan. 8).

◆ The UNC single-season assist record is 284, set by **Ed Cota** in 35 games in 1999-2000. Marshall enters the Miami game with 161 assists in 16 games (with 15 regular-season games remaining).

◆ The highest single-season assist per game average in school history is Cota's 8.1 figure in 1999-2000. Marshall is averaging 10.1 assists per contest this season.

◆ In his last 20 games, Marshall has only had two outings with an assist/turnover ratio lower than 2:1.

◆ The Texas game on Dec. 21 was Marshall's 50th as a Tar Heel and he finished the game with 361 career assists, the most assists by a Tar Heel in his first 50 games. That previous standard was held by **Raymond Felton**, who had 359 assists in his first 50 games. For comparison's sake, NC State's Chris Corchiani had 400 assists in his first 50 games and Duke's Bobby Hurley had 386 in his first 50 games.

◆ Marshall is the only Tar Heel in history to have multiple games with 15 or more assists, and he has done so four times (including three times this season). Felton (18), **Jeff Lebo** (17) and Cota (17) are the other Tar Heels with at least 15 assists in a game. Marshall's four 15-assist games are more than the total of every other player in Carolina history combined.

◆ There have been 15 occasions in which a Tar Heel had 14 or more assists in a game and Marshall now has six of those 15 games, including four this season and three in a four-game span in November.

◆ Cota, Lebo, Lawson, **Phil Ford** and Felton played a combined 600 games for the Tar Heels and had a combined three games with at least 15 assists. In 53 career games, Marshall has four such games.

◆ Marshall has assisted on 31.3 percent of Carolina's field goals this season, which would rank best in Tar Heel history if the season were to end today. The previous best mark in UNC history was Cota's 28.0 percent in 1999-2000.

◆ UNC is 16-0 in Marshall's career when he has at least nine assists.

◆ Of the 114 players in Carolina history to total at least 50 career assists, only three had more career assists than field goals attempted — **Jimmy Black** (525 assists, 512 field goal attempts), **King Rice** (629 A, 625 FGA) and **Quentin Thomas** (285 A, 177 FGA). Marshall has 391 career assists and 255 career field goal attempts.

TAR HEEL TIDBITS

◆ **Harrison Barnes** has scored 20 or more points in three of the last four games and is averaging 22.2 points in those four games. Barnes is 34 for 55 (.618) from the floor in those four games.

◆ **Harrison Barnes** has scored in double figures in 28 of his last 30 games, seeing his streak of 24 in a row end with back-to-back single-digit performances on Dec. 17 and 19 vs. Appalachian State and Nicholls.

◆ Former UNC radio play-by-play voice Woody Durham will be honored at halftime of Tuesday's game vs. Miami.

◆ Carolina has scored 80 or more points in each of the last eight games, its longest such streak since the 2008-09 team also did it eight games in a row.

◆ **Tyler Zeller** has grabbed 64 rebounds in the last six games, averaging 10.7 per game in that stretch. Prior to his eight boards against Boston College on Saturday, Zeller posted five consecutive games with 10 or more rebounds. He had not grabbed double-figure boards in any two consecutive games in his collegiate career prior to that stretch.

◆ The Tar Heels have 104 offensive rebounds in their last five games, averaging 20.8 per game in that stretch.

◆ In the last six games, the Tar Heels have made a combined 27 three-pointers and 120 free throws.

◆ **Reggie Bullock** (29 for 73) and **P.J. Hairston** (26 for 69) have combined to hit 55 three-pointers this season. The rest of the UNC team has combined to hit 33 three-pointers through 16 games, 22 of which have come from **Harrison Barnes**.

◆ **John Henson** is averaging 14.9 points, 9.9 rebounds (leading the ACC) and 3.2 blocks per game (leading the ACC) while shooting 56.0 percent so far this season (second in the ACC).

◆ Henson has double-doubles in points and rebounds in 15 of his last 26 games (including an ACC-high six this season).

◆ Henson did not grab 10 rebounds in any of his first 25 games as a Tar Heel. Since then, he has notched at least 10 rebounds in 34 of his next 65 (52.3 percent) games as a Tar Heel, including 23 of the last 32 (71.9 percent).

◆ Carolina's starting frontcourt is averaging 46.9 points per game this season —

Harrison Barnes (17.6 ppg), **John Henson** (14.9) and **Tyler Zeller** (14.3). All three are among the top nine scorers in the ACC this season.

◆ In **Roy Williams's** Carolina head coaching career, the Tar Heels are 133-21 against non-ACC competition, a winning percentage of .864.

◆ After entering the season having attempted a three-pointer every 25 minutes of action, **Dexter Strickland** has attempted just one three-pointer in 404 minutes this season.

◆ **P.J. Hairston** has attempted 69 three-pointers and 24 two-pointers during his Carolina career.

◆ This season, **Kendall Marshall** is averaging 10.1 assists and a team-high 30.7 minutes per game with an assist/turnover ratio of 4.13 (161 assists and 39 turnovers). He has 13 double-digit assist games in the last 32 contests.

◆ Carolina has scored 100 points or more 44 times in nine seasons under head coach **Roy Williams**, including four times this season.

◆ Junior **John Henson** blocked three shots against Boston College and is in third place on the all-time Carolina blocks list with 229. The only two Tar Heels above Henson, a junior, are **Brendan Haywood** (304) and **Sam Perkins** (245), both of whom reached their marks in four seasons.

◆ Henson has blocked at least one shot in 61 of his last 67 games and leads all active ACC players with 229. He is first in UNC history in blocks per game at 2.54 (229 blocks in 90 career games). **Rasheed Wallace** is second at 2.26 (156 in 69 games).

◆ As a freshman, 39.2 percent of **Harrison Barnes's** field goal attempts were three-pointers. Through 16 games as a sophomore, just 21.0 percent of his field goal attempts are from beyond the three-point stripe. Correspondingly, his free throw attempts have leaped from 3.4 per game last season to 4.7 per game this year.

◆ After the UNLV game on Nov. 26, **Tyler Zeller** was shooting 21-32 (65.6 percent) from the free throw line. Since then, he is 40-48 (83.3 percent) from the stripe over his last 10 games.

◆ Carolina's five home nonconference crowds of 20,000+ so far this season are the most since the 2008-09 team drew five home nonconference crowds of 20,000+.

CAROLINA DOWNS BC IN ACC OPENER, 83-60

◆ Carolina got 25 points from **Harrison Barnes** and 20 from **Tyler Zeller** as it pulled away from Boston College to win 83-60 in the ACC opener for both teams on Saturday Jan. 7 in the Smith Center in Chapel Hill. After the Eagles pulled within nine points at 59-50 with 9:19 to play, the Tar Heels closed the game on a 24-10 run for a 23-point victory.

◆ UNC led by 13 at halftime and built a 21-point lead with a 10-2 run to start the second half before the Eagles responded and mounted their comeback to get within nine points.

◆ Carolina won its ACC opening game for the 50th time in 59 seasons and the seventh time in nine seasons under head coach **Roy Williams**.

◆ The Tar Heels extended their Smith Center record winning streak to 27 consecutive games (previous high was 25 from 1992-94).

◆ Including a win over William and Mary at Carmichael Arena in the 2010 NIT, the Tar Heels have now won 28 straight home games, the second-longest streak in UNC history and the longest since a 32-game stretch from 1926-1929.

◆ Barnes led all scorers with 25 points and added a career-high four steals. It was his sixth 20-point game this season and 14th of his career. He made a season-high 10 field goals in the game.

◆ Barnes has scored 20 or more points in three of the last four games and is averaging 22.2 points in those four games. Barnes is 34 for 55 (.618) from the floor in those four games.

◆ Barnes, Zeller and John Henson combined to make 23 of 36 shots from the floor against BC (.639). The rest of the team was 8 of 30 (.267).

◆ The 83 points were the second-most scored against Boston College this year and the most since Holy Cross had 86 in the Eagles' second game.

◆ **Kendall Marshall** had 11 assists and three turnovers. It was his seventh double-figure assist game this year and the 13th of his career. He tied **Kenny Smith** for fourth-most 10+ assist games by a Tar Heel.

CAROLINA DOWNS RICE-LED MONMOUTH, 102-65

◆ Carolina started the game on a 12-0 run, led by 31 at halftime and cruised to a 102-65 win over Monmouth on Sunday Jan. 1, 2012, in the Smith Center.

◆ The win was UNC's 26th in a row in the Smith Center, setting a new building record.

◆ The Hawks were coached by a trio of familiar Tar Heel faces, led by head coach **King Rice** (UNC '92) and assistants **Derrick Phelps** (UNC '94) and **Brian Reese** (UNC '94).

◆ Carolina closed the first half on a 28-7 run and its first-half field goal percentage of .618 was its second-best effort of the season.

◆ **John Henson** led the Tar Heels with 21 points on 9 of 12 shooting while grabbing eight rebounds and blocking three shots. **Harrison Barnes** finished with 20 points on 8 of 14 shooting. **Kendall Marshall** had six points, 11 assists and three turnovers and **Tyler Zeller** had eight points, 11 rebounds and three assists.

◆ UNC got good production off the bench with **P.J. Hairston** hitting four three-pointers and scoring 16 points, **Reggie Bullock** scoring 11 and **James Michael McAdoo** tallying six points and nine rebounds.

◆ Monmouth hit 11 three-pointers, including 7 of 15 (.467) in the second half. The Tar Heels hit 6 of 11 from behind the three-point stripe in the first half (.545).

POUNDING THE GLASS

◆ Carolina enters the Miami game leading the Atlantic Coast Conference in rebounding offense (46.8 rebounds per game), rebounding margin (+11.8 per game), offensive rebounds (15.9 per game), defensive rebounds (30.9 per game) and offensive rebound percentage (.411) and is second in defensive rebound percentage (.717).

◆ Carolina grabbed 20 or more offensive rebounds in three games in a row prior to getting 15 against Monmouth on Jan. 1. The three-game streak was the first time UNC has done that in **Roy Williams'** nine seasons as UNC's head coach. The Tar Heels grabbed 20 or more offensive rebounds in two straight games on two different occasions in 2006-07 and 2007-08 and on one occasion in 2005-06.

◆ The Tar Heels have 104 offensive rebounds in the last five games, averaging 20.8 per contest.

THREE-POINT SHOOTING A STRENGTH

◆ Carolina shot 32.8 percent from three-point territory last season and entered the 2011-12 campaign with outside shooting being a potential question mark, especially given the offseason knee injury to **Leslie McDonald** (last season's team leader at 38.1 percent from behind the arc) that will keep the junior guard out of action until at least midseason.

◆ Thus far in 2011-12, the Tar Heels have shot 38.8 percent as a team from three-point territory, ranking second in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

◆ The Tar Heels' three-point shooting efforts have been led by sophomore **Harrison Barnes** at 51.2 percent (22 of 43), sophomore **Reggie Bullock** at 39.7 percent (29 of 73) and freshman **P.J. Hairston** at 37.6 percent (26 of 69).

McDONALD CLEARED FOR SOME PRACTICE WORK

◆ Junior guard **Leslie McDonald**, who has been out of action since mid-summer after undergoing surgery to repair a torn anterior cruciate ligament and damaged meniscus on his right knee, has been cleared for some practice work but has yet to be cleared for full participation.

◆ UNC doctors cleared McDonald to shoot and participate in offensive walkthroughs in mid-December. In early January, head coach **Roy Williams** told reporters that McDonald has been cleared for some additional practice work.

◆ Any decision on when or if McDonald will return to game action this season or seek a medical redshirt has not been made at this point, pending further developments in McDonald's rehabilitation.

◆ Twelve former North Carolina players were on NBA opening-day rosters for 2011-12.

◆ Carolina has produced 40 first-round picks in its history, more than any school in the ACC.

◆ UNC's 29 first-round picks since 1980 are the most in the nation.

◆ Head coach **Roy Williams** has coached 20 NBA first-round draft picks.

◆ Former Tar Heel guard **Wes Miller** (UNC '07) was named the interim head coach at UNC Greensboro on Dec. 13, becoming the youngest head coach in the NCAA at age 28. Miller is in his second season on staff with the Spartans. He has previous Division I coaching experience as an assistant at both Elon and High Point.

◆ Six Tar Heels are serving as head coaches in the state of North Carolina this season — **Roy Williams** ('72) at Carolina, Miller at UNC Greensboro, **Jeff Lebo** ('89) at East Carolina, **Scott Cherry** ('93) at High Point, **Jason Capel** ('02) at Appalachian State and **Buzz Peterson** ('85) at UNC Wilmington.

◆ A native of Charlotte, Miller lettered three seasons at North Carolina (2005-07), helping the Tar Heels to the 2005 national championship. He graduated from UNC in 2007 with a degree in political science.

◆ Miller made his head coaching debut on Dec. 16 vs. East Carolina, which is coached by fellow former Tar Heel Lebo. ECU beat UNCG 71-62 in the game.

◆ Senior **Tyler Zeller** scored his 1,000th career point against Long Beach State on Dec. 10, becoming Carolina's NCAA-record 64th 1,000-point scorer. Zeller scored 17 points against the 49ers. He has 1,089 career points entering the Boston College game.

◆ Louisville is second in NCAA annals with 63 1,000-point scorers.

◆ UNC's most recent 1,000-point scorer had been **Deon Thompson**, who reached the plateau during the 2009-10 season and finished with 1,414 career points.

◆ **John Henson** (884 points) and **Harrison Barnes** (862) are the next-closest Tar Heels to 1,000 points.

ROSENBLUTH NAMED TO NC SPORTS HALL OF FAME

◆ Former Tar Heel and 1957 National Player of the Year **Lennie Rosenbluth** is one of eight new members of the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame to be inducted in 2012, the organization announced in early January.

◆ The eight new members are Wilt Browning, Wray Carlton, M. L. Carr, Sam Esposito, Dr. Jerry McGee, Kristi Overton Johnson, Rosenbluth, and Henry Trevathan.

◆ They will be enshrined at the 49th annual induction banquet on the evening of May 10, in the main ballroom of the North Raleigh Hilton.

FRASOR, MANUEL ADDED TO STAFF

◆ Head coach **Roy Williams** has added **Bobby Frasor** and **Jackie Manuel**, two former UNC players who played on national championship teams, to the basketball staff.

◆ Frasor, a member of the 2009 NCAA champions, serves as assistant video coordinator. Manuel, who played on the 2005 title team, serves as assistant strength and conditioning coordinator.

◆ Both are six-month appointments that run until May 15, 2012.

◆ "These are two outstanding young men who have decided to end their competitive playing careers and are looking to get into basketball from a non-playing perspective," says Williams. "I think this will be a great opportunity for them to focus on what it takes to run a program. They'll set good examples for our current players because they know what it takes to win at a high level."

NO. 1 IN BOTH PRESEASON POLLS

◆ UNC grabbed the top spot in both national preseason polls, receiving 62 of 65 first-place votes in the Associated Press poll and 30 of 31 in the ESPN/USA Today coaches poll.

◆ The Tar Heels have been the AP's preseason No. 1 eight times since the poll's inception in 1961-62, tied with UCLA for the most of any program in the nation. UNC's previous AP preseason No. 1s were in 2008-09 (NCAA championship), 2007-08 (Final Four), 1993-94 (second round), 1986-87 (regional final), 1983-84 (regional semifinals), 1981-82 (NCAA championship) and 1977-78 (first round).

◆ This is the eighth season in which the coaches have selected the Tar Heels No. 1 to begin the season. UNC was also No. 1 in the initial coaches' poll in 1957-58, 1981-82, 1985-86, 1986-87, 1987-88, 2007-08 and 2008-09.

◆ Carolina has been preseason No. 1 in both the AP and coaches polls in three of the last five seasons, doing so in 2007-08, 2008-09 and 2011-12. Prior to 2007-08, the last time UNC had topped both preseason polls was the 1987-88 season.

◆ UNC has been ranked No. 1 in both national preseason polls five times — in 1981-82, 1986-87, 2007-08, 2008-09 and 2011-12.

◆ Four high school seniors have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of North Carolina and play men's basketball for the Tar Heels, head coach Roy Williams announced on Nov. 10.

◆ The incoming student-athletes include **Joel James** (pronounced joe-ELL) of West Palm Beach, Fla.; **Brice Johnson** of Orangeburg, S.C.; **Marcus Paige** of Marion, Iowa; and **J.P. Tokoto** (pronounced TOE-kuh-toe) of Menomonee Falls, Wis.

◆ James is a 6-11 forward who plays for Coach Fred Ross at Dwyer High School in Palm Beach Gardens, Fla. "Joel is an incredible story," says Williams. "He is one of 11 kids, and he decided on his own to do a great job in the classroom and on the basketball court. His is an incredibly positive story both in basketball and life. I know he will help us rebound the ball, block shots and improve his game on the offensive end."

◆ Johnson is a 6-9 forward who plays for Coach Herman Johnson at Edisto High School in Cordova, S.C. "Brice plays for his dad at a small school in South Carolina and he has tremendous upside as a player," says Williams. "He's just now starting to realize what he can do on the basketball court. He blocks shots, is effective around the basket and is going to be a big-time athlete for us."

◆ Paige is a 6-1 point guard who plays for Coach Chris Robertson at Linn Mar High School in Marion, Iowa. "Marcus is a great floor general who, like the other three young men that we've signed, comes from a great family. He's a straight-A student who comes from a basketball family. His mom was a long-time high school basketball coach and his older sister plays at Wisconsin. Marcus is the type of player that everyone on the floor likes to play alongside."

◆ Tokoto is a 6-6 wing player that plays for Coach Dan Leffel at Menomonee Falls High School. "J.P. is an incredibly athletic player and a wonderful young man," says Williams. "He really works hard and appreciates life. He has the ability to be a big-time defender and is outstanding around the rim. He has to be one of the most athletic players in the entire class."

MARSHALL A FINALIST FOR COUSY AWARD

◆ The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced on Jan. 4 that UNC's **Kendall Marshall** is among the 20 finalists for the 2012 Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award. The annual honor, named for Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtic Bob Cousy, recognizes the top point guards in college basketball. Almost 60 candidates originally were nominated for the award in December.

◆ This list of candidates will be narrowed down to a final 10 by February 1st, and final five by March 1st. The winner of the 2012 Bob Cousy Award will be presented at the Hall of Fame's Class Announcement on Championship Monday in New Orleans as part of NCAA Final Four weekend.

◆ Former Tar Heels **Raymond Felton** (2005) and **Ty Lawson** (2009) are among the seven previous winners of the Cousy Award, a list that also includes Jameer Nelson (St. Joseph's), Dee Brown (Illinois), Acie Law (Texas A & M), DJ Augustin (Texas), Greivis Vasquez (Maryland) and last year's recipient, Kemba Walker (Connecticut).

FOUR TAR HEELS ON WOODEN WATCH LIST

◆ North Carolina became the first school to have four players named to the Wooden Award preseason top 50 list when **Harrison Barnes**, **Tyler Zeller**, **John Henson** and **Kendall Marshall** grabbed spots on the list, the Los Angeles Athletic Club announced. No other Atlantic Coast Conference players made the list.

◆ Tar Heels to win the Wooden Award include **Phil Ford** (1978), **Michael Jordan** (1984), **Antawn Jamison** (1998) and **Tyler Hansbrough** (2008).

FOUR TAR HEELS ON NAISMITH WATCH LIST

◆ Tar Heel players **Tyler Zeller**, **John Henson**, **Harrison Barnes** and **Kendall Marshall** all grabbed spots on the 2011-12 Naismith Trophy Pre-season Watch List, the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced in early November. UNC's four members led the nation, tying with Kentucky, which also had four players on the list. Carolina's Naismith Award winners include **Michael Jordan** (1984), **Antawn Jamison** (1998) and **Tyler Hansbrough** (2008).

TAR HEELS PICKED ATOP ACC PRESEASON POLL

◆ North Carolina received 57 of 59 first-place votes and was the media's choice of to finish first in the Atlantic Coast Conference in 2011-12.

◆ The Tar Heels were the media's choice for the fifth time in the last six years and a record 20th time overall. UNC has won the conference regular season title five times in eight previous seasons under head coach Roy Williams.

◆ Carolina's returning starting forwards were the top three vote-getters for the Preseason All-ACC team. **Harrison Barnes** was the only unanimous first-team choice with 59 votes. **John Henson** was second with 47 votes and **Tyler Zeller** was third with 46.

◆ Barnes was the overwhelming choice for Preseason ACC Player of the Year, receiving 57 votes. Henson received the only other two votes.

Career: Has 391 assists and 131 turnovers for an assist-error ratio of 2.98, the best ratio in ACC history by any player with at least 300 assists (NC State's Sidney Lowe, 2.94) • Is second in assists per game in UNC history (7.38 per game) behind only Ed Cota (7.46) and fourth in ACC history behind NC State's Chris Corchiani (8.37), Duke's Bobby Hurley (7.68) and Cota • Is the only Tar Heel ever with 15 or more assists in multiple games and he accomplished that four times in his first 25 games as a starter • Only happened

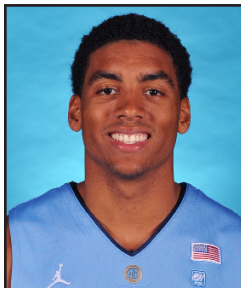

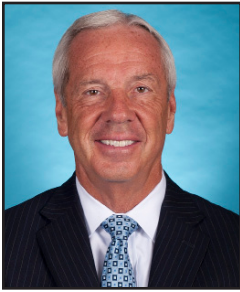
