Canes Have Tar Heel State of Mind In ACC Series with UNC...

The 20th-ranked University of Miami baseball team gets back on the road this weekend, traveling to Chapel Hill for a much-anticipated ACC showdown with No. 10 University of North Carolina at Boshamer Stadium. The three-game series will be carried live on television by CSS, with the first game set for Friday, April 22, at 7 p.m.

Miami (25-12) enters the weekend after taking its fifth Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) series last weekend at Maryland, and is a winner in 11 of the last 12 games. The Hurricanes will look to snap a skid in Chapel Hill that dates back to 2005. UMIami has lost six consecutive in Chapel Hill, and has a tie (7-7) in a 10-inning affair in the third game of the 2005 series with the ACC curfew rule enforced at the time.

The Canes use sophomore second baseman Zeke DeVoss atop the order as he leads the team in batting average, hitting at a .323 clip entering the weekend. DeVoss leads the Canes in hits (42), runs scored (37), triples (2), walks (35) and stolen bases (25). His 25 steals also leads the league in that department.

DeVoss enters the UNC series working on a career-long nine-game hit streak, also leading the team in that category.

Junior Rony Rodriguez is second on the Hurricanes roster in batting average, now toting a .316 average with a team second-best 23 RBI on 36 hits and a team-leading six homers. Rodriguez also tops the Hurricanes in slugging percentage with a .579 average.

Classmate Nathan Melendres continues to swing a hot bat, hitting safely in nine of his last 11 contests, and chipping in with a .301 average at the dish. Melendres is tied for the team lead in doubles (10) and triples (2). He also sits second in steals, collecting 13 on 15 attempts this season.

Junior Preseason All-America selection Harold Martinez hits at a .303 clip for the Hurricanes, leading the team in RBI (30) with 40 hits and three homers. He has powered up in his last two home games, hitting home runs against Barry and Bethune-Cookman, respectively, and enters the UNC showdown with a seven-game hitting streak.

The addition of sophomore shortstop Stephen Perez back into the lineup has aided the Canes tremendously defensively, now allowing infielder Harold Martinez (who did play shortstop in high school at Braddock) to move back to first base – with Rodriguez returning to either the outfield or designated hitter position. Senior Chris Pelaez has also been reinserted into the lineup, seeing considerably more time at the DH position after a shoulder injury to begin the year. Pelaez has increased his average to .265 since the Florida series.

Miami Against North Carolina...

- The University of Miami leads the all-time series against the North Carolina Tar Heels by a margin of 22-20-1. Since arriving into the ACC in 2004-05, Miami is just 7-10-1 against the Tar Heels.
- The Hurricanes snapped a series-long five-game losing skid to the Tar Heels last season in Coral Gables, using a three-game series sweep of North Carolina (April 16-18, 2010) at Alex Rodriguez Park.
- The series sweep by the Hurricanes was the first time against UNC since the 1998 season when UMIami took all three games in Coral Gables, before dropping a contest and then winning an elimination game against the Heels in the NCAA Coral Gables Regional.

Scouting the North Carolina Tar Heels...

- North Carolina returns to ACC play after a midweek win over Coastal Carolina on Tuesday. The Tar Heels have won 19 straight games, and will look to join the 2005 squad as the only teams to win 20 straight home games in a single year. The Tar Heels are coming off a season in which they finished just 38-22, and one of the worst ACC seasons under head coach Mike Fox, ending the conference slate at 14-16.
- The Tar Heels were swept a week ago in an Atlantic Coast Conference series against in-state rival NC State in Raleigh. The Heels have won eight of their last 12 games, including a series sweep of Clemson (April 1-3) and taking the final two games of a three-game set against Florida State (April 8-10) in Tallahassee.
- UNC is led at the dish by third baseman Colin Moran holding a .359 average, adding a team-high matching 52 hits, team-high 12 doubles, seven home runs and 52 RBI. Moran is one of four Tar Heels batting above

In his 18th season at Miami, no other program, nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 38 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 17 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 26 years, 17 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 801-310-3 (.719) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,305-554-4 (.700) Division I record in 29 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 32 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,436-595-4 (.706) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 18 years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the new stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 26th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2010 when he guided the 'Canes to the NCAA Coral Gables Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 17 seasons (1994-2010), winning 15 of his last 17 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris has led the 2010 Hurricanes to their 38th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2010 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft. In 2008, the 'Canes reached the College World Series after winning the Atlantic Coast Conference, widely considered one of the toughest - if not the toughest - collegiate baseball conference in the country.

MORRIS IN HIS 33RD SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,305-554-4 (.700) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,436-595-4 (.706) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 17 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- Guided the Miami Hurricanes to College World Series National Championship in 1999 and 2001.
- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 17 seasons and led Miami to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami, by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

SHORTSTOPS AND JIM MORRIS

Morris, who played shortstop during college at Elon and then in the Boston Red Sox organization, has had great success developing the position while a head coach. Over the last decade Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases. He currently works with sophomore Stephen Perez, a slick-fielding switch-hitter expected to bat near the upper-half of the order this year for the 'Canes.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres, from 1997-99. Before Hill, it was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Nationals. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and played for the Oakland A's in 2009.

Recapping the Last Game – vs. Bethune-Cookman (April 20)...

Behind yet another display of power, and the continued excellence of Steven Ewing, the No. 20 University of Miami baseball team won its 10th contest in the last 11 tries, defeating visiting Bethune-Cookman University, 5-3, Wednesday evening at Alex Rodriguez Park.

Miami (25-12) – tuning up for three of their next four weekend series against top-ten opponents – used its third three-run home run game of the season, continued with solid pitching, to down the Wildcats of Bethune-Cookman (22-19) in their only meeting this season.

Bethune-Cookman took the early 1-0 lead in the top of the first. UMiami sophomore starter Steven Ewing, who has not allowed more than two earned runs in his last eight starts, settled down and allowed just four hits over the remaining six innings to collect the win.

The win is the sixth consecutive for Ewing, whose only loss of the season came in his season debut at Florida Atlantic (Feb. 23).

It did not take long for Miami to respond, as junior infielder Harold Martinez hit his third home run of the year in the bottom of the second inning. The very next batter, freshman Brad Fieger, hit a homer to the same spot over the left field wall – allowing the Hurricanes their first back-to-back series of home runs on the campaign.

Then after Stephen Perez walked and advanced to second on a wild pitch, sophomore second baseman Zeke DeVoss ripped a single through the right side, plating Perez for a 3-1 Miami lead.

The three runs spelled the end for B-CU starter Julio Morales who took the loss on just 1 1/3 innings tossed, allowing three earned runs on four hits and two walks.

The Canes added to the lead in the third, as junior Rony Rodriguez sent the third UM home run of the night to left field for a 4-1 advantage.

Bethune-Cookman plated one run in both the fourth and eighth innings, but was unable to catch the Canes as the bullpen allowed just two hits in relief of Ewing.

Daniel Miranda earned his 11th save of the season in the victory.

Ewing picked up the win in seven innings worked, spreading out two earned runs on five hits, 10 strikeouts and no walks allowed. It was the second time this year the Orlando native has fanned double-digit batters.

• On April 12, 2011, the University of Miami officially announced the hiring of Shawn Eichorst as the new Director of Athletics for the Hurricanes. He took over for Interim Director of Athletics, Tony Hernandez, who was serving in the position vacated by former AD Kirby Hocutt who left in March for a similar position at Texas Tech University. Eichorst comes to UMIami from the University of Wisconsin, having also served in the Department of Athletics at the University of South Carolina.

Canes Make Another Move In the Latest NCAA RPI Rankings...

• The University of Miami jumped another spot in the NCAA RPI rankings over the course of the last two days. The Hurricanes moved to their highest point of the season-to-date as No. 23, using a 5-3 win Wednesday night over Bethune-Cookman (with an RPI of 129).

Catch Me If "U" Can...

• This year's UMIami team is full of speed from all areas of the lineup, and through 37 games, it is quite prevalent. Head coach **Jim Morris** has preached aggressive base running throughout his illustrious career, with the Canes swiping 72-of-88 bases this season. **Zeke DeVoss** leads the way with an ACC-best 25 steals, followed by **Nathan Melendres** (13) and **Stephen Perez** (6).

Former Cane Gets MLB Contract Extension...

• Former University of Miami outfielder and current Milwaukee Brewers left fielder Ryan Braun signed a \$105-million, five-year contract extension with the Brewers on Thursday, April 21. The deal includes a mutual option for one additional year worth up to \$20 million and is the longest commitment to a player in Brewers franchise history.

• Braun gets a \$10-million signing bonus and will make salaries of \$19 million a year in 2016-18, \$18 million in 2019, \$16 million in 2020. The mutual option is worth up to \$20 million with a \$4-million buyout.

Rony Rodriguez Picks Up Weekly ACC Award for Canes...

• After hitting .750 and producing his team-leading fourth home run in helping the University of Miami to a perfect 3-0 week, junior infielder **Rony Rodriguez** has been selected as the Atlantic Coast Conference Baseball Co-Player of the Week for the week of March 28 – April 3. He shares the award with Clemson infielder Richie Shaffer for the week of April 4. On the week, Miami defeated Florida Gulf Coast and Boston College, respectively.

• Rodriguez, who started all three games last week for the Hurricanes at first base, led Miami in batting average with a .750 clip, producing six hits in eight official at-bats – including two walks and scoring seven runs. His 80.0 percent on-base percentage is the best for any Hurricanes performer in a week at this point on the campaign.

• The Sunset High alum and former Miami Dade College product, now in his second year as a UMIami student-athlete, helped keep the Hurricanes perfect on the road in ACC play at 5-0 – using a doubleheader sweep of Boston College on Sunday in 19-4 and 7-6 (5 innings) wins in Chestnut Hill, Mass. His slugging percentage for the week was 1.125, and he was perfect defensively with 14 putouts and an assist, all coming at the first base position.

• Against Boston College, Rodriguez was 2-for-2 with three runs scored and two walks in the doubleheader opener, only to follow with a 2-for-3 performance in the nightcap – registering a solo home run in the fifth, which proved to be the game-winning RBI for the 7-6 decision in the curfew rule enforced five inning affair.

Last Time vs. North Carolina (4/18/10)...

The 13th-ranked University of Miami baseball team won in thrilling fashion over No. 21 North Carolina on Sunday, scoring three runs in the bottom of the eighth in a curfew-shortened game to pick up an 8-7 win at Alex Rodriguez Park. The win secured Miami's first ever series sweep over the Tar Heels since the Canes joined the ACC in 2005.

Down 7-5 heading into the bottom of the eighth, the Hurricanes (27-9, 14-4 ACC) knew it would be their last chance to come back due to the Atlantic Coast Conference's curfew rule that wouldn't allow for another inning to start.

Zeke DeVoss quickly made it 7-6 with a solo homer to lead off the inning. Back-to-back walks by Frankie Ratcliff and Scott Lawson put runners on first and second, with still no outs on the board. Yasmani Grandal - who already had two hits and four RBI on the day - then singled up the middle in center to load the bases. Harold Martinez grounded into a double play, but moved

Lawson to third and scored Ratcliff to tie it up at 7-7. Michael Broad, who had come on a pinch-runner in the seventh, then came to the plate with Lawson waiting on third. But the first pitch by reliever Nate Striz was thrown in the dirt and got away from catcher Jesse Wierzbicki, allowing Lawson to score easily to give the `Canes their second win this year on walk-off wild pitch.

The game started over an hour late due to inclement weather in the area and on a few occasions was stopped for field maintenance as rain fell on and off last in the game. No inning could start after 5:15 p.m., a time that passed in the bottom of the eighth during Miami's rally.

After UNC (22-16, 6-11 ACC) took a 7-5 lead in the top of the fifth, Miami's bullpen kept the game close, tossing four shut-out innings to give the offense a chance in the eighth. Daniel Miranda (3-1) earned the win, tossing two shut-out innings in the seventh and eighth. E.J. Encinosa, Sam Robinson and Eric Whaley kept the Tar Heels off the board in two combined innings after starter Jason Santana allowed seven runs - five earned - in four innings.

Grandal lead the `Canes at the plate, going 3-for-4 with four RBI. UM's first three batters in the line-up - DeVoss, Ratcliff and Lawson - combined to collect six hits and score seven runs - including the final three in the eighth.

Four UNC hitters finished with two hits, including Wierzbicki and Ben Bunting, who each scored twice. Michael Morin (5-1) allowed three runs in the ninth and suffered the loss. UNC starter Patrick Johnson struggled, allowing five runs in 3 1/3 innings.

A two-run double by Grandal in the bottom of the first put UM up early on, but UNC scored three in the second and two more in the third to take a 5-2 lead.

The Hurricanes tied things up in the bottom of the fourth however, scoring their third run on Ryan Perry's second homer of the weekend on a deep blast to left. A bases-loaded single to center by Grandal later in the frame scored two more, but the lead was short-lived however as back-to-back as the Tar Heels put two more up in the fifth on an RBI double and an RBI single.

From there, both teams were held off the board until the `Canes big rally in the eighth.

• **Zeke DeVoss** started in center field tonight in place of **Nathan Melendres** – who served as designated hitter – and **Chantz Mack** suited up in left field with **Rony Rodriguez** over in right field...Late in the game, head coach **Jim Morris** made defensive substitutions with Martinez playing shortstop; Rodriguez moving to first base; **Dale Carey** going to center and Mack moving to right...DeVoss recorded his team-high tying fifth double of the night in the fourth inning, before swiping his team-leading 11th steal of the season – reaching safely at third...Junior pitcher **Travis Miller** saw action in his second game this year, picking up his first win since May 2, 2010...Miller toed the rubber in the fifth inning in relief of starter **AJ Salcines**...Miller's only other action came against Illinois State (March 8)...**Daniel Miranda** picked up his team-best sixth save of the year – sitting second-best in the ACC in that category...Miranda earned his fifth save in the last six games – and his fifth consecutive when toeing the rubber in relief...For the sixth consecutive game, the UMiami bullpen did not allow a single run, this time using the combination of **Travis Miller** – who earned the win, **Adam Sargent**, **Sam Robinson** and **Daniel Miranda** for the final five frames in relief of starter **AJ Salcines** who tossed the first four frames...**Harold Martinez** recorded a hit in his eighth straight game tonight, using a single to right in the sixth inning...Since making the move to first base in the series-opener against Virginia Tech on March 11, Martinez has a team-high .467 average at the plate – adding a team-leading 14 hits and a slugging percentage of .533 during that span.

Rodriguez Is Burnt Orange and Money Green...

• After a blistering fall campaign, leading the Hurricanes in batting average and hits, junior infielder/outfielder **Rony Rodriguez** has burst out of the gates quickly as a team leader in the spring as well. Rodriguez was selected as the ACC Co-Player of the Week (April 4-10), and is second on the Hurricanes team in batting average (.316) while leading the Canes in home runs (6) and slugging percentage (.579).

Position Change...

• In the second game of the series against Virginia Tech, Miami head coach **Jim Morris** elected to move All-American third baseman **Harold Martinez** to first, in a straight switch with freshman **Brad Fieger**. Since the move, Martinez has a .955 fielding percentage and leads the team in batting average with a .379 clip over the course of the past 23 games.

One Whale of a Game...

• Sophomore pitcher **Eric Whaley** picked up his team-best third win of the year in Miami's series finale win (and series sweep) of Virginia Tech on Sunday, March 13, going a season-long tying seven innings — allowing just three hits and striking out three with zero walks issued to the Hokies. The Pompano Beach native has earned wins in all three home series finales on the campaign.

Miami Too Much for Demon Deacons on the Road...

• Miami claimed its sixth consecutive conference win with a sweep of the Demon Deacons on the road. It's the first time Miami has started the Atlantic Coast Conference season 6-0 since 2006...The Canes advanced to the College World Series that same year...The Hurricanes claimed their first three road wins of the year, entering the weekend 0-5 in that capacity...**Bryan Radziewski** laid claim to his third win of season while striking out a season-high 10 batters in 6 1/3 tossed on Friday night...**Eric Whaley** collected his team-leading fourth win of the season with six innings pitched, accounting for nine strikeouts and allowing three earned runs [a three-run homer]...**Zeke DeVoss** batted .500 for the weekend, scoring six runs and claiming five hits and walking a team-leading four times...**Harold Martinez** drove in the game-winning run in back-to-back games during the second and third game of the series, respectively...Junior **Rony Rodriguez** hit his third home run of the season in helping start a Canes come-from-behind win in Sunday's series finale.

Canes Sweep Hokies in Much-Anticipated Rematch...

• The 'Canes opened up ACC play last Friday night with a win against the Virginia Tech Hokies. Miami has dominated Virginia Tech in Coral Gables, winning

The 'Canes are now 5-3 all-time in ACC-opening games...**Nathan Melendres** returned to the lineup as well, playing center field after a four-game absence due to a hand injury...Playing Small Ball — Miami looked to manufacture runs against the Hokies, bunting six different times throughout the game — with four resulting in bunt singles and one in a sacrifice...UM also had three steal attempts on the night, with two successful tries by sophomore **Stephen Perez**...As a team, Miami improved to 17-22 with stolen bases on the season...Runners left on base plagued the Hurricanes once again in the opening game of the series, as they left 11 men on the base paths in tonight's game...The 'Canes left the bases loaded in three different innings, and two on in another, with each four of the innings ending in a strikeout...Freshman starting pitcher **Bryan Radziewski** tossed a gem in the series-opener, going seven shutouts innings to earn his second career victory...It was the longest start of his career; the second time he has gone 5-plus innings without giving up a run; and his third quality start of the season...Junior **Sam Robinson** pitched a perfect eighth, and has yet to give up a run on the season...**Daniel Miranda** came in and pitched a bumpy ninth, allowing his first run of the season, before closing the door on the Hokies... Freshman **Dale Carey** made a diving catch in the top of the ninth inning to rob shortstop Tim Smalling of a potential extra-base hit...The hit would have brought the tying run to the plate with nobody out...Carey was inserted into the game in the bottom of the eighth as a pinch-runner and later on **Stephen Perez's** RBI double...He stayed in the game as the right fielder, where he proceeded to make his clutch play...Sophomore right-hander **E.J. Encinosa** threw 96 pitches in eight and two-thirds innings of work. Encinosa earned his first win of the season and now stands at 1-2...On Saturday, **Harold Martinez** and **Brad Fieger** swapped positions at the corners Friday night and were back at the positions tonight...It's Fieger's second career start at third and Martinez's second start of the season at first...Martinez played 10 games at first base during the 2009 season...**Harold Martinez** recorded two singles in tonight for his second multi-hit game this season...Southpaw hurler **Sam Robinson** earned his second save of the season, throwing only two pitches to seal Miami's 2-1 win over Virginia Tech...**Sam Robinson** made his 10 appearances to date, including a string of the last six of eight contests this month... Sunday's 11 runs scored was the highest runs production for the Hurricanes all season. The previous high was 10 against Appalachian State in the series finale on February 26...Sunday's Starters — Six of today's starters collected hits, while all nine starters reached base safely. **Harold Martinez** posted multiple hits for the second time in as many games (third time this year), knocking in a season-high four RBI...**Nathan Melendres** registered a season-high three hits, adding a RBI and scoring twice...**Rony Rodriguez** and **Stephen Perez** both tallied multiple RBI in the series finale...Sophomore right-hander **Eric Whaley** had another solid production in his fourth start of the year...Whaley went seven innings on the hill, spreading out three hits with no runs, no walks and striking out eight batters...Whaley has a team second-best 23 strikeouts on the year...Scoring 11 runs on nine hits meant Miami scored runs with guys on base, moving them over with bunts and driving them in with timely hits...Miami began the game with three consecutive bunt singles...UMiami has tallied five-plus hits in each of the last six games, including 14 against Illinois State (March 8)...The Canes showed great plate awareness on Sunday, drawing 10 walks from six Virginia Tech pitchers...The 10 walks taken was a season-high for UM.

The First Father/Son Duo...

- Freshman catcher **Shane Rowland** has stepped right into the UMiami starting lineup and taken charge. He belted his first home run over the weekend against Appalachian State. The Tampa native is the son of former UMiami second baseman and current international scout for the New York Yankees, Donny Rowland. They are the first father/son duo to ever play baseball at the "U".

Miami Predicted to Finish Third In Coastal Division...

- Miami baseball has been predicted to finish third in the Coastal Division of the Atlantic Coast Conference Coaches Preseason Poll. The poll is voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. Capturing a 20-10 league record in 2010, the Hurricanes finished the year third in the Coastal Division behind Virginia and Georgia Tech, respectively. Miami posted a 43-20 overall record en route to claiming the NCAA Coral Gables Regional title, and advancing to the NCAA Gainesville Super Regional.

Top-Ranked Gators Bite Back in Tough Gainesville Series...

- Sophomore **E.J. Encinosa** came into Gainesville and pitched the game of his life...Facing the number one team in the country on the road, Encinosa went 7+ innings, allowing just five hits and one run to go along with three K's...Encinosa was the tough luck loser, as the Canes were unable to push a run across...**Sam Abrams**, a walk-on, saw his first action of the season when he came in the game in the bottom of the fourth after relieving freshman **Bryan Radziewski**... Abrams went 3 2/3 innings without giving up a run, giving a Miami a chance to claw their way back into the game...**Dale Carey** was the only man to reach base for the Hurricanes in game two of the series, as reached twice with a hit and hit by pitch...He also stole his first base of he season, but no 'Cane was able to drive him home...Despite the 'Canes struggles offensively, **Shane Rowland** quietly had himself a nice series against the Gators...Although just batting at a .222 average, Rowland posted an impressive .400 on base percentage, and had one of the six RBI's for the Hurricanes...Yet again, **Sam Robinson** pitched brilliantly out of the 'pen...In 2 2/3 innings, Robinson did not yield a run, while giving up three hits...On the season, he has not allowed a run in 7.2 innings pitched, and those three hits are the only three hits he's allowed...As the rest of the Hurricanes struggle to find their groove at the plate, **Rony Rodriguez** has been the only Canes player to hit with consistency...Through the first eleven games, he leads the team in batting average with a .286 mark, slugging percentage with a .536 mark, and doubles with four.

Encinosa Has a Career Day in Gainesville...

- Sophomore starting pitcher **E.J. Encinosa** went a career-long seven innings against top-ranked Florida (March 5). In a 1-0 loss to the Gators, Encinosa allowed just the one run on five hits and struckout three in a pitchers' duel with UF's Hudson Randall. Though not giving up the game-winning hit, Encinosa walked the first batter he faced in the eighth frame before being relieved out of the bullpen.

The 40-40 Club in Miami...

- Once again, the Hurricanes achieved a 40-win season, finishing 43-20 and a spot in the NCAA Super Regional. All-time at UMiami, the 'Canes have achieved at least 40 wins 32 seasons — including 13 times under **Jim Morris**. In fact, UM has claimed 50-plus wins 19 times in school history, and 60-plus wins on three occasions. Miami posted at least 40 wins from 1973-1986, marking one of the longest streaks in NCAA history with a school collected 40 or more wins in consecutive years.

Miami Defeats Appalachian in Three-Game Home Affair...

- **Brad Fieger** had a career series against Appalachian State, going 6-13 for in the series, scoring three runs and doubling in the Canes series win... Sophomore **Stephen Perez** went 5-11, but slugged a robust .818 with nine total bases, as he doubled twice and tripled...In the rubber match of the three game set, **Eric Whaley** pitched seven innings of shutout ball with nine strikeouts to lead the Canes to a much needed 10-0 win...It was Whaley's second win of the season, and dropped is ERA to 2.13...**Joey Porro**, who was the student-manager for the Hurricanes last year, made his first career start on Sunday as he started at second base...He singled twice and drove in three runs for his first career hits and RBI...The Miami offense, which had struggled through the first part of the season, woke up on Sunday, when the Canes banged out a season-high 10 runs on 10 hits...They scored all their runs in three different innings, as they put up three in the fourth and eighth innings, and four in the sixth...The UMiami bullpen pitched brilliantly during the series, allowing just two earned runs over 8 2/3 innings during the series...**Adam Sargent** and **Daniel Miranda** each appeared in two games and allowed zero

ALEX RODRIGUEZ PARK INFORMATION

Renovations to Alex Rodriguez Park are thanks in large part to a \$3.9 million contribution by New York Yankees third baseman and 11-time MLB All-Star Alex Rodriguez. The gift - the largest ever to the University of Miami baseball program - has assisted the program in continuing to develop first-class facilities. The official announcement of his gift was made on Oct. 10, 2002.

Alex Rodriguez Park has taken form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.
- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box – along with four VIP suites – have been built atop the grandstand. This past offseason, addition seating was added down both lines while a new scoreboard was constructed in left field.

Canes Start the 2011 Campaign with Series Win Over Rutgers...

• The Canes trotted out **Brad Fieger** at first, **Michael Broad** at second, **Stephen Perez** at short, **Harold Martinez** at third and **David Villasuso** for the opening game...In the outfield, **Nathan Melendres** played center, while he was flanked by **Zeke DeVoss** in left and **Chantz Mack** in right...**Bryan Radziewski** started on the hill...Freshman infielder **Brad Fieger** started all three games at first base for the Canes in the season-opening series, the only freshman position player to start on Opening Day this season for Miami...Freshman hurler **Bryan Radziewski** became the first rookie starter in more than 18 years to pitch on Opening Night for the Miami Hurricanes...**Zeke DeVoss** started off the season hot, as he started in the leadoff slot for each of the opening series games against the Scarlet Knights...He posted a .533 on base percentage, a .727 slugging percentage, and scored two runs in the three game set...**Bryan Radziewski** became just the latest Hurricane starter to hurl a gem on opening night...With Radziewski's line of one run allowed in six innings while striking out eight, he became the fifth straight opening day starter to go at least five innings and give up just one run or less...Projected eighth and ninth inning men **Sam Robinson** and **Daniel Miranda** started the season off in style, as they both appeared in two games and gave up zero runs. Combined, they went 6 1/3 innings while striking out 9 and giving up just two hits and one walk...With the 'Canes 5-3 win on Sunday, Miami won their opening weekend series for the third consecutive season...They beat Rutgers two out of three last season, and swept Cincinnati in the 2008 campaign.

NCAA Tournament Recap...

• Miami made its 38th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance last season, hosting two rounds of postseason action at Alex Rodriguez Park, where the club registered a 28-9 (.757) mark. The Hurricanes went 3-1 in the NCAA Coral Gables Regional, downing Dartmouth (12-8) and Texas A&M (14-1), before falling to the Texas A&M Aggies a day later (11-7). The Canes then overpowered the Aggies (10-3) to advance to the NCAA Super Regional. The Hurricanes fell to the Gators in consecutive games (7-2) and (4-3 - 10 innings) to end the season with a record of 43-20.

Miami in the ACC...

• The 2011 season marks the seventh season the Canes have played in the Atlantic Coast Conference, and last year's 20-10 regular season mark in league play was the program's second-best behind the 2008 ACC championship squad that won 23 regular season league games.

New Era Behind the Plate...

• Three catchers will be battling for playing time behind the plate this year, including junior **David Villasuso**. A season ago, Villasuso batted .245 with 20 RBI and five home runs while serving as a backup to MLB First Round Draft selection and 2010 ACC Player of the Year, Yasmani Grandal.
• Others battling for playing time this season will be freshmen **Corey Janson** and **Shane Rowland**. After the fall season, Villasuso will probably make the start to begin the season, but don't be surprised if and when Rowland takes the spot behind the dish with improved confidence and skill.

Fresh Faces In the Dugout...

• This season, head coach **Jim Morris** has one of his youngest teams in recent memory. UMiami has 13 newcomers on this year's roster (12 freshman and one sophomore transfer). The 'Canes lost 2010 ACC Player of the Year, Yasmani Grandal, to the MLB Draft—Grandal was selected 12th overall in the Draft.

Canes In the Classroom...

• During the fall semester of 2010, the University of Miami baseball team recorded its highest team GPA ever. Freshman catcher **Corey Janson** collected a 4.0 GPA last semester, giving him one of the highest GPAs in the entire UMiami Athletic Department.

Rookie Gets the Ball...

• In starting the season-opener against Rutgers, freshman pitcher **Bryan Radziewski** became the first Hurricanes rookie hurler to start an opening night game in the 18-year tenure under head coach **Jim Morris**. Radziewski, a Florida Christian School alum, was named the Florida Class 1-4A Player of the Year in 2010 as a senior in high school.

You've Gotta Start Somewhere...

• Sophomore **Joey Porro** made his first collegiate start (second base) on Feb. 26 against Appalachian State; followed by another start against Illinois State (shortstop) on March 9. Porro was a student-manager for UM in 2010, only to earn two starts and post a .286 average with two hits, three runs driven in and one score thus far in 2011.
