STORY LINES

- After sweeping their midweek series with Columbia, Miami continues on its six-game homestand Friday when visiting No. 24 Virginia Tech arrives for a weekend series. First pitch is set for 7 p.m. for the series opener.
- Miami will be featuring three southpaws in its rotation for the first time this season, as **Bryan Radziewski** will be starting Saturday in place of **Javi Salas**, who started in Wednesday's win over Columbia.
- The Hurricanes will be looking to capture their first Atlantic Coast Conference series victory of the season against the Hokies, who took two of three from Miami in last season's series at English Field. The Hokies are 4-2 in ACC play so far this season.
- Despite dropping last year's head-to-head, the Hurricanes boast an impressive 18-6 all-time mark over Virginia Tech, and have won six of the last 10 match-ups.
- Virginia Tech has powered its way through the early part of its schedule, ranking top in the conference in homeruns (21) and fourth in team batting average (.305).
- Among last season's top UM/VT series performers: **Chantz Mack** (five hits, four RBI's) and **Michael Broad** (three runs).

3 JIM MORRIS 2001, 1999 & 1994 COACH OF THE YEAR • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



In his 20th season at Miami, no other program nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 40 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 19 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

- Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 867-328-3 (.724) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,371-595-4 (.696) Division I record in 31+ years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 34 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,502-636-4 (.701) mark
- In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 19 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

- Jim Morris earned his 28th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2012 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host sites for the first round of the postseason. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 19 seasons (1994-2012), winning 15 of his last 19 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.
- Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2012 Hurricanes to their 40th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2012 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft: E.J. Encinosa, Eric Erickson, Steven Ewing, Peter O'Brien and Stephen Perez.

MORRIS IN 35th SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

- Morris currently has a 1,371-595-4 (.696) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,502-636-4 (.701) record over 30-plus years.
- Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.
- Morris entered 2013 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball history with 1,354 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division.
- Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.



JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 19 seasons and led the Canes to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

HOME SWEET HOME...

• After sweeping its midweek series with Columbia, the Miami Hurricanes will continue their six-game homestand Friday when visiting Virginia Tech arrives for a weekend series.

• The Hurricanes boast an impressive 14-3 record inside the friendly confines of Alex Rodriguez Park, including a 7-1 mark in midweek contests played in Coral Gables.

• Miami is hitting an impressive .293 as a team at home, led by junior Brad Fieger (.386, 16 RBI's), junior Alex Hernandez (.389, 17 runs) and senior Alex San Juan (.347, nine RBI's).

• Southpaw Bryan Radziewski, slated to start Saturday's game, has a 19:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio in his three starts at A-Rod Park this season.

NEWCOMERS FINDING THEIR WAY...

• Members of the Hurricanes 2012 recruiting class, ranked in the top 10 by *Baseball America* for the first time since 2006, have already made quite an impact in the early going.

• Freshman Christopher Barr made his first career start in the series finale against Duke (March 10), and has reached base a team-best total of 19 times in the eight games since. He has hit first in the order for all six of those games, and has recorded a team-best nine runs over that span.

• Freshman shortstop Brandon Lopez and junior second baseman Alex Hernandez, both key members of a class ranked No. 9 in the nation by *Collegiate Baseball*, have provided the Hurricanes with impressive defensive range up the middle. The duo has started up the middle in 23 of 24 games this season.

• Freshman power hitter David Thompson leads the team in homeruns (two) and RBI's (18) entering Friday's opener against the Lions. He also is tied for the team lead with seven doubles.

STARTING OFF STRONG...

• Sophomore lefthander Chris Diaz has fared well in his new role of Friday night starter, delivering four quality starts in five chances this season. The Florida City, Fla., native ranks sixth in the ACC with an ERA of 1.41, and matched a career-long with seven innings in a win over No. 1 UNC (March 15).

• After tossing a gem in a win over Duke (March 10), sophomore Andrew Suarez delivered another strong outing in the series finale against UNC (March 17). Suarez struck out a career-best seven batters through 6.2 innings of work, marking the second-longest start of his career.

SCOUTING THE HOKIES...

• Virginia Tech has powered its way through its opening schedule with an overall mark of 17-5 and a 4-2 record in conference play.

• The Hokies' offense has carried the team in the early going. The visitors rank first in the conference homeruns (21), fourth in slugging percentage (.453), fourth in batting average (.305) and fifth in runs (161).

• Virginia Tech is led offensively by Chad Pinder (.398 average, 20 runs scored), Mark Zagunis (.365, 23 RBI's) and Tyler Horan (.337, 19 RBI's).

• On the hill, the Hokies are paced by starters Devin Burke (5-0, 2.43 ERA) and Brad Markey (2-1, 3.06).

GETTING DEFENSIVE...

- Miami's defense has been one of the many brightest spots on the season, boasting a .972 fielding percentage - the fifth-best mark in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

- Miami's 2013 infield features four newcomers: freshman first base platoon David Thompson & Christopher Barr, junior second baseman Alex Hernandez and freshman shortstop Brandon Lopez. Junior third baseman Brad Fieger completes the infield lineup.

- The play of the Hurricanes infield has been the catalyst for a majority of the team's 24 double plays - the most of any team in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY...

- Head coach Jim Morris and his staff have received nine quality starts from their starters this season.

- Sophomore Andrew Suarez delivered back-to-back quality starts against Duke (March 10) and UNC (March 17), and ranks 18th in the ACC with a 2.73 ERA.

- Freshman LHP Thomas Woodrey went eight innings against Maine in his most recent midweek start (March 5), the deepest any pitcher has gone this season.

- Sophomore LHP Chris Diaz has delivered four quality starts in five opportunities in 2013, and tied a career-best with seven innings in a series-opening win over No. 1 UNC (March 15).

HEATING UP...

- Senior Alex San Juan is hitting a team-best .429 over the past five games, and reached base seven times in the series with No. 1 North Carolina - the most of any Hurricane.

- Since being inserted into the starting lineup March 10, Christopher Barr has totals of eight hits, 11 walks and nine runs scored over a span of eight games.

- Senior reliever Eric Nedeljkovic has not allowed a run in 11 appearances this season, and has struck out 12 batters in 12.2 innings of work. He leads the team with four saves.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH...

- A number of the Hurricanes' most important contributors have been underclassmen, many of whom were part of a recruiting class ranked in the top 10 by national publications.

- Freshman Ricky Eusebio recorded his first career multi-hit game in Miami's 6-3 loss to Florida on March 3, and drove in his first career RBI against Illinois State (March 13). He has started the past three games in the outfield.

- Freshman RHP Frank Grandinette is ranked second among in the ACC in appearances (12).

- Freshman OF Grant Heyman has shown glimpses of his power potential, including his first career triple in a matchup with Illinois State (March 12).

STAYING HOT IN THE SUNSHINE STATE...

- The Hurricanes' current six-game homestand continues a stretch of 25 of the team's first 28 games that will have been played inside state lines to open up the 2013 season.

- 20 of the team's first 27 games will have been played at Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field.

- Including the team's weekend series in Gainesville, Fla., and a midweek matchup on the road at FAU, the Hurricanes did not travel outside the Sunshine State until a March 15 series opener in Chapel Hill, N.C. with No. 1 North Carolina.

Miami has taken special steps to remember "The Wizard of College Baseball," who helped guide the Hurricanes to over 1,200 wins and two national championships in his storied 30-year tenure as head coach.

During a special tribute night against Milwaukee on Feb. 23, head coach Jim Morris called for the "Grand Illusion," a trick play for which Fraser became instantly famous after the 1982 College World Series. A new outfield banner portraying the legendary coach was also unveiled by Fraser's wife Karen, his three daughters and five grandchildren during the game.

The Hurricanes are wearing patches in remembrance of Fraser; #1 patches adorn the right breast of each and every jersey, while #1 decals have been placed on the back of each player's batting helmet.

A commemorative home plate painted on the field with the number 1, Fraser's retired jersey number, will remain all season.

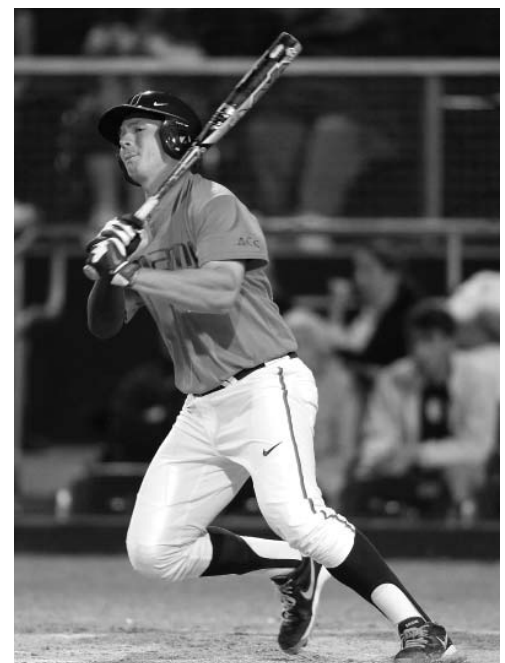

ERICKSON GUIDES #6 CANES TO 6-4 VICTORY

BLACKSBURG, Va. -- In a battle of Coastal Division foes under the lights in Blacksburg, Va., the Hurricanes won their series opener with the homestanding Virginia Tech Hokies by a final score of 6-4.

With two of the better pitchers in the Atlantic Coast Conference facing off to begin the series, Eric Erickson (6-3) outpitched Hokies' counterpart Joe Mantiely (4-3) in impressive fashion. The Sarasota, Fla. native, who allowed only one earned run in his last start at English Field nearly two years ago to the day, pitched equally as well on Friday night against a talented Virginia Tech offense.

Erickson finished up another effective outing by allowing only six hits and two runs to the second-best hitting team in the conference. The Hokies, coming off a series against Boston College where they scored 24 combined runs, entered the game as one of only two teams in the conference boasting a team batting average of .300 or better (.303). Despite a tough final inning where he allowed three of his six hits, Erickson needed only 81 pitches to earn his sixth win of the season.

The Hurricanes struck first in support of Erickson, plating the game's first run in only the third inning. Though Michael Broad flew out to begin the frame, sophomore Tyler Palmer connected for the Hurricanes' third single of the night off Mantiely. After advancing to second on a groundout from Dale Carey, Palmer was driven in on another single, this one from senior catcher Peter O'Brien, to give the Hurricanes an early 1-0 lead.

Miami would continue to pound Mantiely through the early innings, collecting their seventh and final hit off the lefthander in only the fifth inning. With Broad on third base, Carey drove in the junior designated hitter with a big two-out hit to left field, extending the Hurricanes' lead to 2-0. After a prolonged conference at the mound involving coaches, an athletic trainer and the homeplate umpire, Mantiely was pulled in favor of reliever Clark Labitan.

The righthanded reliever hit O'Brien with his third pitch to begin his outing, but induced a groundout from Brad Fieger to end the threat. With the way Erickson was pitching against a talented Hokie line-up, the Hurricanes' 2-0 lead seemed more than comfortable.

Beginning in the third inning, the veteran southpaw set down nine straight batters before allowing his third hit of the night in the sixth. Erickson retired Hokies' sluggers Chad Pinder (fielder's choice) and Johnny Morales (foul out) back-to-back, however, to get out of the inning unharmed.

The Hurricanes tagged reliever Manny Martir for two more runs in the seventh. After Broad opened up the inning with his second double of the game, Palmer laid down a perfect sacrifice bunt to move Broad to third. Martir managed a big punchout of Carey, but the Hurricanes came through in another two-out situation to increase their lead to 4-0.

Martir intentionally walked O'Brien to get to third baseman Brad Fieger, who was unintentionally walked on four pitches to load the bases. Chantz Mack then ripped the first pitch he saw into right field, driving in Broad and O'Brien for his seventh and eighth RBI's in the last five games.

HURRICANES TRIPPED UP IN GAME TWO

BLACKSBURG, Va. -- The sixth-ranked Miami Hurricanes and Virginia Tech Hokies resumed their weekend series on a picturesque Saturday afternoon for baseball at English Field. Unfortunately for the Hurricanes, the result of the game was not nearly as appealing, as the Hokies set the series up for a decisive rubber match Sunday with a 5-4 win.

The Hurricanes bullpen, which entered the game with only one earned run allowed in the previous 27 combined innings, allowed two costly runs late in the game. Eric Nedeljkovic allowed a run in the eighth to tie the game up at 4-4, while the Hokies walked off on a bases-loaded walk issued by sophomore sidewinder Adam Sargent (0-2) to tie the series at one game apiece.

It was the Hurricanes who struck early once again on Saturday, opening the game's scoring in the first inning on an RBI double from Peter O'Brien. Virginia Tech starter Marc Zecchino would begin the game by plunking Tyler Palmer, and centerfielder Dale Carey promptly advanced Palmer on a clean sacrifice bunt. O'Brien then crushed a ball off the left field wall for his team-leading eleventh double of the season, driving in Palmer to give the Canes an early one-run advantage.

Zecchino would settle down after the first inning, however, allowing no hits until the fourth, when the Hurricanes (25-10, 12-5 ACC) tacked on their second run of the game. After outfielder Chantz Mack led off the frame with a single, Stephen Perez helped execute a perfect hit-and-run that advanced Mack to third and gave Miami runners on the corners with only one out.

Junior designated hitter Michael Broad, who finished Friday night's game 2-for-3 with two doubles, then attempted a rare squeeze play in an effort to plate Mack. His bunt ended up right in the glove of Zecchino, however, who made an easy play to catcher Mark Zagunis to tag Mack out at home. It was only through ensuing back-to-back walks, including a bases-loaded, four-pitch rendition to Palmer, that gave the Hurricanes a 2-0 advantage.

Some untimely lapses from the Hurricanes defense in the bottom of the frame would help the Hokies tie the game up. On what looked like a routine flyball from Tyler Horan to begin the inning, Mack misjudged the route of the ball and ended up chasing after it towards the left field wall. Horan then advanced to third on a sacrifice bunt from Johnny Morales, and was driven in on an RBI single from designated hitter Ronnie Shaban.

With one run already in, Mark Zagunis' single gave Virginia Tech two runners on with only one out. Two batters later, Brendon Hayden connected on a weak groundball to the right side of the infield that may have ended the inning. But a miscommunication between first baseman Esteban Tresgallo and second baseman Jarred Mederos allowed the ball to slip right through, plating Shaban and tying the game at two runs apiece.

The Hurricanes would atone for their errors by plating two more runs in the top of the fifth. Back-to-back hits from Brad Fieger and Chantz Mack gave the Canes runners on the corners. Mederos then hit a chopper to third as Fieger took off for home. The throw from Pinder to Zagunis would hit Fieger in the back, as the Naples, Fla. native slid home safely.

CANES DROP HEARTBREAKER IN BLACKSBURG

BLACKSBURG, Va. -- Sunday's rubber match between the sixth-ranked Miami Hurricanes and the Virginia Tech Hokies turned into a pitcher's duel at English Field, as the Hurricanes dropped the series finale in heartbreaking fashion by a final score of 3-2.

After taking their first lead of the game in the top of the ninth on a two-RBI single from outfielder Chantz Mack, the Hokies struck for two runs of their own off closer E.J. Encinosa (2-2), who was charged with a blown save. Mike Zagunis' RBI single through the right side of the infield gave the Hokies their second straight walk-off win and the series victory.

After earning the win in his last outing against North Carolina, junior southpaw Steven Ewing was sharp once again on Sunday afternoon. The Orlando, Fla. native, who struck out a season-high nine batters last weekend, followed up with another stellar showing against a strong Hokies line-up. Ewing allowed only one hit through his eight innings of work, striking out seven batters while walking only one.

One of the few blemishes for Ewing came in the third inning, when Hokies' first baseman Brendon Hayden launched the first pitch he saw from the lefthander into the visitor's bullpen, giving Virginia Tech a 1-0 lead. The homerun would be the only hit Ewing would allow all day, as he set down the next 17 batters before issuing an eighth-inning walk to Zagunis.

Unfortunately for the Hurricanes, Hokies' righthander Andrew Aizenstadt was equally as effective in the series finale. After allowing a single to Chantz Mack in the second inning, the redshirt senior would not surrender another hit until the sixth on a single from Garrett Kennedy. Aizenstadt allowed only six baserunners through his eighth innings of work, striking out a season-high seven batters while issuing only two walks.

One of those free passes came in the ninth, as Aizenstadt issued a full-count walk to Dale Carey. The righthander then plunked Peter O'Brien on the hand, and was subsequently pulled in favor of reliever Jake Joyce. Brad Fieger would load the bases on a perfect bunt down the third base line before Mack connected for the two-RBI single to right-center, plating both Carey and pinch-runner Michael Broad. Joyce would retire Stephen Perez, Julian Santos and Jarred Mederos in order, however, to limit the damage and maintain the 2-1 deficit.

Coming off a week where he earned ACC Pitcher of the Week honors, Encinosa entered the game and promptly allowed a single to Alex Perez and then plunked lead-off hitter Gabe Ortiz. After a bunt by Johnny Morales loaded the bases, Encinosa then hit his second batter of the inning, this time Hokies slugger Tyler Horan, to tie the game up at two runs apiece. Zagunis then delivered the knockout blow on a game-winning single to right field, sending the Hokies to their first series victory over the Hurricanes since 2010.
