- Miami took Friday's series opener in Gainesville, earning their 10th consecutive win to start the 2013 season. With the victory, the Hurricanes started their season 10-0 for the first time since 1981.
- Head coach Jim Morris and his staff are looking to continue their recent run of success against both Maine and UCF. Miami has won 18 straight over Maine dating back to the 1991 season, while the Canes own a 16-4 all-time advantage over UCF.
- Freshman Thomas Woodrey will be making his third career start Tuesday against the Black Bears. The freshman southpaw earned his first collegiate win last time out versus Barry (Feb. 27), throwing five innings and allowing one run.
- Despite dropping the series with Florida, a number of Hurricanes continued impressive early offensive streaks: junior Alex Hernandez has reached base in every game in 2013, Brad Fieger is riding a career-best 11-game hitting streak, and freshman David Thompson now has at least one RBI in all but two of the Hurricanes games so far this season.

3 JIM MORRIS 2001, 1999 & 1994 COACH OF THE YEAR • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

In his 20th season at Miami, no other program nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. which has qualified Miami, for the Tournament an NCAA-record NCAA 40 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 19 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 860-323-3 (.710) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,364-590-4 (.697) Division I record in 31+ years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 34 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,495-631-4 (.706) mark

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 19 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 28th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2012 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host sites for the first round of the postseason. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 19 seasons (1994-2012), winning 15 of his last 19 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2012 Hurricanes to their 40th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2012 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft: E.J. Encinosa, Eric Erickson, Steven Ewing, Peter O'Brien and Stephen Perez.

MORRIS IN 35th SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,364-590-4 (.697) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,495-631-4 (.706) record over HONORS AND AWARDS 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7·3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5.3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Morris entered 2013 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball history with 1,354 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardles of division.

HURRICANES RETURN HOME...

• After a weekend trip to Gainesville, No. 24 Miami opens a season-long seven-game homestand beginning Tuesday against Maine.

 Boosted by a midweek sweep of St. Thomas and Barry, the Hurricanes opened the season 10-0 for the first time since 1981. Eight of those first 10 wins came inside the friendly confines of Alex Rodriguez Park.

 After their midweek games against Maine and UCF, Miami continues on its homestand with a weekend series against Duke (March 8-10) and a pair of games with visiting Illinois State (March 12 & 13).

HEATING UP...

• Though his career-opening 10-game hitting streak ended in a March 2 loss at Florida, junior second baseman Alex Hernandez has reached base safely in all 12 games this season.

• Junior third baseman Brad Fieger has opened the season on fire, recording hits in a career-best 11 straight games. His streak dates back to game two of Miami's season-opening doubleheader against Rutgers on Feb. 16.

• Freshman Brandon Lopez is riding a career-best six-game hitting streak into Tuesday's game against Maine. The Miramar, Fla., native had a career-best three-hit performance in the team's series-opening win against Florida (March 1).

FRESHMAN PHENOM

· Freshman David Thompson has played a key role in Miami's early success, ranking first on the team and tied for fourth in the conference with 16 RBI's.

• The Miami, Fla., native connected for Miami's first homerun of the season on the road at FAU, a two-run shot that tied the game up at 4-4 in the eighth inning.

• Thompson has recorded at least one RBI in every Hurricanes' game but two this season, and delivered his third gamewinning hit of the season in Miami's 3-2 win over Florida on March 1.

• The first baseman leads both his team and the conference with seven doubles on the vear.

STARTING OFF STRONG

 Sophomore lefthander Chris Diaz and junior righthander Javi Salas have anchored Miami's weekend rotation.

. The duo ranks among the conference's best in terms of ERA Diaz rates as the third-best mark (0.47 ERA), while Salas ranks fourth (0.51)

· Diaz has delivered quality starts in all three of his outings this season, including a career best seven inning showing in Miami's March 1 win over Florida. The Florida City, Fla., native ranks ninth in the conference with 19.0 IP through his three starts.

IMMEDIATE IMPACT

· A multitude of players comprising the team's nationally-ranked recruiting class have made immediate impacts in the early going.

• Hernandez, Thompson, Lopez, RHP Frank Grandinette (seven appearances), outfielder Ricky Eusebio (three starts), and 1B Christopher Barr (three runs scored) have all been regular contributors to the team's success.




