LARRAÑAGA BY THE NUMBERS

5 - Coach Jim Larrañaga is one of five ACC coaches with a Final Four appearance to his credit. In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the NCAA Final Four in 27 years.

6 - In 31 years of coaching, Jim Larrañaga has a winning record in the NCAA Tournament, a 7-5 mark in six appearances.

7 - Larrañaga is no stranger to the ACC. In his seven seasons as an assistant coach at Virginia, the Cavaliers participated in the NCAA Final Four in 1981 and 1984, won three ACC Championships and finished in the Top 5 of the rankings.

10 - The 2015-16 marks the 10th anniversary of Larrañaga's Cinderella run to the 2006 NCAA Final Four with George Mason. Both associate head coach Chris Caputo and director of operations James Johnson were on that GMU staff.

LARRAÑAGA - WHY MIAMI?

Along with returning to the best basketball conference in the country, Coach L had a few personal reasons for accepting the head coaching job at Miami. Coach's grandfather was from Cuba, where he produced the Larrañaga [lare-en-YAH-ga] cigar. Coach's father was raised in Key West before moving to The Bronx, N.Y., getting married and raising six children. Coach L was raised in The Bronx, but vacationed to Florida as a boy. He also has owned a house in Sarasota - which he bought from Dick Vitale's daughter and three of his siblings have retired to Florida.

THE LAST TIME OUT ... MIAMI VS. UT RIO GRANDE VALLEY

Starters for the game: Angel Rodriguez, Sheldon McClellan, Davon Reed, Ivan Cruz Uceda and Tonye Jekiri.

Five players scored in double digits for the Canes: McClellan (18), Cruz Uceda (16), Reed (14), Ja'Quan Newton (11) and James Palmer (11).

McClellan's 18 points mark the ninth time as a Hurricane he has scored 18-or-more points.

- Senior Tonye Jekiri grabbed seven rebounds in the first half, and ended the night with 12 boards.
- Senior Angel Rodriguez dished out seven assists.

Sophomore James Palmer grabbed a career-best six rebounds, topping his previous high of four, which he pulled down three times last season, most recently against Temple March 31, 2015.

Senior Ivan Cruz Uceda tied a career high of seven rebounds, only matched against Alabama on March 21, 2015.

Freshmen Anthony Lawrence, Ebuka Izundu and Mike Robinson made their collegiate debuts in the season opener.

Junior forward Kamari Murphy will sit out the first three games of the season due to a violation of team rules.

Team

After scoring 28 points in the first half, Miami knocked down 58 points in the second stanza. UTRGV only scored 59 total points for the game.

Miami started the game 7-of-7 at the free throw line, and was 11-of-12 (91.7%) at the half. The Hurricanes finished the game hitting 24-of-33 free throws.

All 11 Canes played in the game, and nine of 11 scored.

Miami's first points of the season came from Sheldon McClellan with a iumper in the lane, just 90 seconds into the game.

The Canes' first free throws of the season came from Davon Reed, sinking two at the 18:07 mark.

Miami's first 3-pointer of the season came from Ivan Cruz Uceda at 17:09 in the first half.

Sheldon McClellan threw down the team's first alley-oop of the season, off an assist from Angel Rodriguez.

DID YOU KNOW

Coach L became the first Miami coach to win 20+ games in his first two seasons at UM and only the third of 12 UM coaches to post three 20win seasons.

Former Cane Rick Barry was named one of the Greatest Players in NBA History.

Miami native and former Cane James Jones won the 2010-2011 NBA All-Star Weekend 3-Point Contest and the NBA Championship in the 2011-2012 and 2012-13 seasons.

Six-time NBA All Star Amar'e Stoudemire enrolled at UM in 2013 and took classes to earn his bachelor's degree.

UM is in its 12th season in the ACC.

Coach L led the George Mason Patriots to the 2006 Final Four with big wins over some of basketball's elite teams such as Michigan State, UNC and UConn. He was the first coach to take a mid-major to a Final Four in 27 years (Penn '79) when his team advanced in 2006.

In 14 years at George Mason, Larrañaga led the Patriots to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999), including the 2006 Final Four.

Miami basketball received APR (Academic Progress Rate) Public Recognition Awards for being among the top 10 percent in APR in its sport. Miami ranks in the top 10 percent NCAA men's basketball with a 990 APR.

The Miami Department of Athletics recorded a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 89 percent. Miami's department-wide GSR is 16th overall among FBS programs. UM has exceeded the NCAA average GSR in each of the last 10 years.

The Canes have averaged 20.0 wins over the last 11 seasons.

The Hurricanes have made at least one trey in 905 of 911 games since the NCAA adopted the 3-point shot in 1986. The last time Miami was held without a 3-pointer was Feb. 26, 2014 at Virginia.

Miami has held 764 of its last 765 opponents to less than 100 points. North Carolina was the last team to score 100+, defeating UM 105-64 on Jan. 31, 2007.

MIAMI SETS SEASON TICKET RECORD

In just his fifth season in Coral Gables, Jim Larrañaga continues to set records with the University of Miami men's basketball team. Miami has nearly sold out the ticket allotment for all home games this season at the BankUnited Center. Currently only 348 seats remain for the 2015-16 campaign. If Miami sells out those remaining seats, this will be the first time in Miami athletics history a team has sold out their season. Due to the record season ticket sales, seats may not be available on a single-game basis.

Entering Coach Larrañaga's fifth season at The U, fans have bought approximately 5,100 season tickets, more than doubling the total number of season tickets sold in his first season in Coral Gables. When Coach L began his reign in Miami, fans bought 2,251 season tickets for the 2011-12 campaign. After a record-breaking season on the court in 2012-13, season tickets peaked at 3,674 for the 2013-14 year.

When he arrived at Miami, Coach L set out many goals to achieve, none of which had been accomplished in Coral Gables prior to his arrival, including: 1) win the ACC; 2) beat North Carolina and Duke; 3) draw a crowd at the BankUnited Center.

In Larrañaga's second season, Miami won the ACC Regular Season and Tournament Championships, then went on to play into the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. In his first four seasons, the Canes are 3-2 against Duke and 4-3 against North Carolina. And now, in his fifth campaign, Miami is less than 500 seats away from selling out the BankUnited Center, and accomplishing three of Larrañaga's goals.

MIAMI EARNING VOTES IN BOTH NATIONAL POLLS

Miami is garnering votes in both the AP (48) and the USA Today Coaches (11) preseason poll. The Canes are six places out of the Top 25 in the AP poll and 12 positions out in the USA Today poll. Miami was last listed in preseason polls in 2008-09, when the Canes were No. 17 in the AP and No. 16 in USA Today Coaches poll. The 2008-09 team went on to a 19-13 record and NIT appearance.

CANES BRING EXPERIENCE TO THE COURT

Miami will start four seniors and a junior, thus entering the year with 16 seasons of collegiate basketball experience. The average age of the starting five is 22.2 years old: Ivan Cruz Uceda: 24, three seasons; Angel Rodriguez: 23, four seasons; Sheldon McClellan: 23, four seasons; Tonye Jekiri: 21, three seasons; Davon Reed: 20, two seasons. The starting five combine for 391 NCAA Division-I games played, and 221 games started.

FOUR PLAYERS BOAST NCAA TOURNAMENT EXPERIENCE

Senior Tonye Jekiri returns from Miami's 2012-13 ACC Championship and NCAA Sweet 16 team. Sheldon McClellan (Texas), Kamari Murphy (Oklahoma State) and Angel Rodriguez (Kansas State) have also played in the NCAA Tournament, each with their previous schools.

MIAMI PREDICTED TO FINISH FIFTH IN ACC

Miami was predicted to finish fifth out of 15 teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season, as announced by the league during Operation ACC Basketball in Charlotte, N.C., Oct. 28. North Carolina was picked to win the league, followed by Virginia, Duke and Notre Dame.

In 2012-13, the Canes were picked to finish fifth, then won the league's regular season and tournament championship. In all four of Larrañaga's seasons at Miami, the Canes have finished the season better than predicted at ACC media day.

McCLELLAN ON JERRY WEST AWARD WATCH LIST

Senior Sheldon McClellan is among the 20 players named to the watch list for the 2016 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced.

As a junior in 2014-15, McClellan's 48.4-percent shooting was the second-best shooting percentage in the nation by a guard in the Power Five conferences, 18th-best shooting percentage by a guard in the nation, 90th-best shooting percentage in the nation among all positions, and the top shooting percentage by a guard in the ACC.

In 106 career games, the native of Houston, has scored 1,393 career points. In his first season at Miami, McClellan was the only Cane to start all 38 games. He averaged 14.5 points, 4.7 rebounds and 1.9 assists in 33.6 minutes per game, and hit 48.4 percent (192-397) from the field, 35.8 percent (54-151) from three and 82.4 percent at the line. McClellan posted a trio of double-doubles on the season and scored in double digits in 31 games, including 15-straight from Nov. 21 to Jan. 22.

UM HOSTS ESPN BIG MONDAY IN CORAL GABLES

Miami will host a pair of ESPN Big Monday games this season, facing Duke on Jan. 25 and Virginia on Feb. 22. Both games will tip at 7 p.m. in the BankUnited Center and will be televised on ESPN. Miami is one of six ACC schools to be featured two or more times, and the only school to play host to both of their ESPN Big Monday games.

COACHING CHANGES FOR THE HURRICANES

After having the same assistant coaching staff his first four years in Miami, Larrañaga has two new assistant coaches in 2015-16 in Jamal Brunt and Adam Fisher, following the departure of Eric Konkol (Louisiana Tech) and Michael Huger (Bowling Green). Konkol had been an assistant with Coach L 11 seasons and Huger was an assistant coach for eight years and player for four seasons.

Due to the lack of turnover, Coach L has only had nine assistant coaches in the last 14 seasons. Five of his assistants left for a D-1 head coaching job, and two others who have worked their way into head coaching jobs. In those 14 seasons, only twice two assistants left at the same time, 1996 (Stan Heath and Steve Merfeld) and 1989 (Jeff Snyder and Ricky Stokes).

Chris Caputo, in his 14th season on Larrañaga's staff and fifth in Coral Gables, was promoted to associate head coach in the summer of 2015.

COACH L REUNITED WITH JAMES JOHNSON

Larrañaga completed his 2015-16 staff with the addition of James Johnson as the team's director of basketball operations. Johnson, who was on Larrañaga's staff for two seasons at George Mason University, including the historic NCAA Final Four run in 2006, came to Miami after seven seasons on staff at fellow Atlantic Coast Conference school Virginia Tech, where he was the head coach for two seasons after five years as an assistant coach.

COACHING COORDINATORS FOR MIAMI

Miami's assistant coaching staff is set up in a coordinator system, with Jamal Brunt as the offensive coordinator, Chris Caputo manning the defense and Adam Fisher handling the scout for every opponent. James Johnson is the Dean of Discipline.

CANES SUIT UP IN ADIDAS GEAR

This season is Miami's first in a 12-year partnership with adidas and the squad has new orange, green and white jerseys. The "Hurricanes" moniker is laser etched across the jersey's shoulder for the players to see when they don the uniform. Lightweight knit shorts enhance breathability and ventilation, keeping players cool as the clock winds down.

Jerseys were designed with the same lightweight, sweatwicking technology used in the NBA and targeted ventilation zones on the chest, back and side to keep players cool even in the most intense moments of the game. The new shorts are highlighted by updated stripes on the waistband, incorporating hurricane style cuts and patterns throughout.

Players will lace-up the latest adidas basketball footwear including special team colorways of the Crazylight Boost 2015, D Lillard 1, and D Rose 6 signature shoes from NBA All-Stars Damian Lillard and Derrick Rose.

- has the highest winning percentage of a Miami coach in the NCAA Tournament, a .667 mark with a 2-1 record.

CANES SIGN OAK HILL'S RODNEY MILLER, JR.

Rodney Miller, Jr., has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball for the University of Miami.

"Rodney Miller, Jr., impressed us from the very first time we saw him play with his size, rebounding and shot-blocking ability," Larrañaga said. "He has a lot of raw potential and we expect that he will improve dramatically in our program. He has learned to compete at the highest level in high school by playing for Steve Smith at Oak Hill Academy, the top ranked college prep school in the country."

Miller is a 6-foot-11-inch, 245-pound center playing prep ball at Oak Hill Academy in Virginia. A native of Laurelton, N.Y., Miller is a consensus four-star recruit, ranked No. 90 overall by Scout.com and No. 114 by Rivals.com. As a center, he is ranked No. 17 by Scout. com and No. 15 by ESPN. Miller, with a 7-foot-1-inch wingspan, has the ability to alter shots defensively, is a blue-collar rebounder and has good offensive touch around the rim. In 2014, he participated in the Nike Elite 100, and he played AAU ball for the NY Lightning. Rodney is the son of Maria and Rodney ,Sr., and chose Miami over offers from Connecticut, Florida, Virginia, Georgia Tech, Wake Forest and Seton Hall.

THE HIGHLIGHTS OF 2014-15

On Jan. 13, Miami defeated eventual national champion then-No. 4 Duke, 90-74, at Cameron Indoor Stadium, ending Duke's 41game home winning streak, the longest active streak in Division I, and snapping Duke's 19-game ACC home game winning streak. UM was the only team to defeat Duke at home last season.

The Canes defeated then-No. 8/7 Florida on Nov. 17 in the O'Connell Center, led by Angel Rodriguez' 22 points in the final nine minutes, draining five 3-pointers in the last seven minutes to help Miami to the win. With the victory, the Canes snapped Florida's 33-game home winning streak and 25-game home non-conference winning streak at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center. The 33-game streak was the third-longest in the country, behind 34 from both Duke and Stephen F. Austin.

UM downed both Duke and Syracuse on the road in the same season, the second time this has ever happened, and the first time since Michael Jordan's UNC team did so during the 1983-84 season.

Miami opened the season 8-0, and on Dec. 1 was ranked No. 15 in the country by both the AP and USA TODAY.

Miami suffered 13 losses, including six games (four opponents) against nationally ranked teams. In those six games, the Canes led by at least 12 points twice: 12 points at No. 12 Notre Dame and 13 points at No. 12 Louisville.

In one season, Miami defeated 500-win coaches Mike Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim and Billy Donovan.

Miami was one of 38 teams in the country, and one of 11 teams from a Top 8 conference, to win 10+ games away from its home arena last regular season. Gonzaga led the way with 14 road & neutral site victories.

Junior Tonye Jekiri led the Atlantic Coast Conference in rebounds (10.9 ACC only, 9.9 all games) and double-doubles (9) in ACC games. He is Miami's first player to average 10+ rpg in a season in ACC play.

MIAMI SETS SCHOOL RECORD FOR GAMES PLAYED, SECOND-MOST WINS

Miami played a school-record 38 games last season, topping the 36 games played in 2012-13. The Canes' 25 wins were second alltime in school history, behind the 29-7 mark in 2012-13.

CANES POST 20+-WIN SEASON

With a victory at Virginia Tech on March 7, Miami posted its third 20-win season in four years since the arrival of Jim Larrañaga. Since 2011-12, Coach L has tallied seasons of 20-13, 29-7, 17-16 and 25-13, for an average of 22.8 wins per season. Since joining the ACC in 2004-05, Miami posted three 20-win seasons before Larrañaga, 23-11 in 2008, 20-13 in 2010 and 21-15 in 2011.

MIAMI'S ROAD WINS RANK TOP 11 NATIONALLY

Miami was one of 38 teams in the country, and one of 11 teams from a Top 8 conference, to win 10+ games away from its home arena last regular season. Gonzaga led the way with 14 road and neutral site victories.

The Canes have posted 10+ wins away from home in two of Coach L's four seasons at Miami. In 2012-13, Miami won 15 on the road, including five neutral-site games. Last year, Miami was 10-5 away from the BankUnited Center, with a 3-1 neutral-site record, in the regular season.

CANES IN NATIONAL STATS, VIA NCAA.COM

Miami was 13th in the country in turnovers per game (10.1), committing less than 15 turnovers in 35 of 38 outings.

The Canes knocked down 292 shots from 3-point range, good enough for 20th in the nation. UM hit at least seven shots from long range in 23 games, and tied a school record of 15 made in a game, going 15-of-25 at Virginia Tech on March 7.

UM shot 74.6 percent from the free throw line, which was the 22nd-best mark in the country. Miami drained at least 70 percent of its free throws in 28 games last year. The Canes' 544 free throws made were No. 39 in the NCAA.

Miami averaged just 15.6 fouls per game, a mark that was 22ndbest in the nation, grabbed 1317 total rebounds (29th) and posted a 1.27 assist-to-turnover ratio (44th).

CANES FINISH SIXTH IN ACC AFTER BEING PICKED 10TH

Miami finished sixth in the 2014-15 ACC rankings after being projected to finish 10th by the media at Operation Basketball in October. In each of Coach L's four seasons at Miami, the Canes have exceeded preseason expectations. In his first season, Miami was picked fifth and finished tied for fourth. In just his second season, UM won the ACC after being projected to finish fifth. A year ago, the Canes were selected 12th, but ended 10th.

The Canes and Notre Dame both made a jump of four spots: Miami from 10th to sixth and Notre Dame from seventh to third. Wake Forest and Virginia Tech were the only schools who were slotted in the correct spots. In order of preseason projections, here are the final mis-projections of each team: Duke -1, North Carolina -3, Louisville -1, Virginia +3, Syracuse -3, Pittsburgh -4, Notre Dame +4, Florida State -3, NC State +2, Miami +4, Clemson +2, Wake Forest +0, Georgia Tech -1, Boston College +1, Virginia Tech +0.

LARRAÑAGA POSTS FOURTH 25-WIN SEASON

With a 25-13 mark last season at Miami, Coach Jim Larrañaga has posted four 25-win seasons as a head coach. His first was a 27-8 mark at George Mason in 2005-06, when he led the team to the NCAA Final Four and in 2010-11 he was 27-7 with a 1-1 mark in the NCAA Tournament. At Miami, Coach L led the Canes to a 29-7 mark in 2012-13, winning the ACC regular season and tournament, then taking UM to the NCAA Sweet 16.

CARDIAC CANES - YEAR TWO

Miami played 16 games last season that were decided by five points-or-less. The Canes had five losses by a total of 22 points in the month of February. Three of those games were decided by a total of five points. Miami and Georgia Tech each had 13 games decided by four points or less last season. Miami and Notre Dame led the ACC with nine wins in close games. In 2013-14, Miami led the ACC having played 13 games decided by five points-or-less or in OT.

COACH L NOTCHES CAREER WIN NO. 550

In his first victory against Syracuse, Coach Jim Larrañaga won his 550th career game. Larrañaga's 100th win came in 1991 against Kent State while at Bowling Green. While at George Mason, win No. 200 came in 1997 vs. Northeastern, No. 300 in 2003 against East Carolina and No. 400 in 2008 vs. William & Mary. In 2012, the Canes defeated Georgia Tech for Coach L's 500th.

MIAMI VS. RANKED OPPONENTS LAST SEASON

Miami was 3-6 against ranked teams last season, including 1-1 against top-5 teams and 2-2 against top-10 teams. Of the six losses, one was a double-overtime defeat against Virginia, and the Canes came up 6.1 ppg short in the other five outings. The Canes were 1-3 at home, 2-2 on the road and 0-1 at neutral sites vs. Top 25 opponents. See a complete list vs. ranked opponents since the arrival of Coach L on page 10.

POSTSEASON AWARDS FOR FOUR HURRICANES

Junior forward Tonye Jekiri was named to the 2015 Coaches and ACSMA All-Atlantic Coast Conference Defensive Team. Jekiri also joined Sheldon McClellan and Angel Rodriguez as honorable mentions on the 2015 ACSMA All-ACC Team.

Sophomore guard Davon Reed was named to the All-ACC Academic Men's Basketball Team.

Reed and McClellan were named to the five-player NIT All-Tournament Team.

LARRAÑAGA RETURNS HOME, NY COACHES IN NIT

Coach Jim Larrañaga returned to his roots for the NIT, playing in his home state of New York. Larrañaga grew up in the Parkchester neighborhood of The Bronx, playing high school basketball for Jack Curran at Archbishop Molloy High School in Queens.

Since 2000, only four coaches originally from the state of New York have led their team to the championship game of the NIT. In 2015, coach Jim Larrañaga is from The Bronx. In 2014, Larry Brown (Brooklyn) was the runner up with SMU. John Beilein (Burt) won the event in 2007 with West Virginia. In 2000, Matt Doherty (East Meadow) was runner up with Notre Dame.

COACH L IN MADISON SQUARE GARDEN

In Larrañaga's 31 years of coaching, he had never been the head coach of a team playing a game in Madison Square Garden, until March 31 against Temple. He played in the World's Most Famous Arena multiple times while playing college ball for Providence, and was an assistant coach for Virginia when the Cavaliers won the NIT in 1980. Larrañaga's final collegiate game as a Friar was played against UNC in 1971, an 86-79 loss for PC in the NIT Elite 8.

MARCH WAS HURRICANE SEASON

Miami was 7-1 in the month of March last season, and Jim Larrañaga is 19-8 in the month of March while coaching at Miami.

JEKIRI'S JUNIOR SEASON NUMBERS IMPROVE

Junior Tonye Jekiri posted 11 double-doubles, including nine in ACC play. Jekiri posted 10+ rebounds 21 times, and in 16 of his last 23 games. Last season he had 10+ points in 15 outings.

The native of Nigeria nearly doubled his output in points and rebounds each season as a Hurricane. The 7-footer averaged 8.7 points and 10.1 rebounds last season, up from 4.2 ppg and 5.5 rpg his sophomore year and 1.4 points and 1.6 rebounds his rookie campaign.

CANES MAKING COMEBACKS

In three-straight games against Alabama, Richmond and Temple, Miami trailed by at least six points in the second half, but come back to win.

Against Temple, Miami trailed by 11 in the first half and six in the second stanza. With 16:51 left in the quarterfinal game at Richmond, Miami trailed the Spiders by 18 points, 36-18. A 3-pointer made by Sheldon McClellan with 2:04 left in the game knotted the score at 55, then Miami took a 6-point lead with 26 seconds remaining and again with 14 seconds left, to take home the win. Against Alabama, Miami trailed by seven with 17:45 left in the game.

Earlier last season, Miami overcame a 15-point second-half deficit at then-No. 8/7 Florida for the Canes' first road win of the season over a Top 10 team.

Miami won nine games last season in which it trailed by six-ormore points and four games in which it trailed by at least seven in the second stanza.

BALANCED ATTACK IN THE POSTSEASON
