STORY LINES

- For the second consecutive season, the Miami Hurricanes will open on the road at an Atlantic Coast Conference rival. Year two of the Al Golden era begins Saturday at Boston College (3:35 p.m. EDT, ABC/ESPN2).
- In the first season under Golden, the Hurricanes finished 6-6 overall with a 3-5 ACC record.
- Miami is 56-29-1 all time in season openers, winning three of its last four.
- ٠ Saturday will mark the 29th series meeting with Miami holding a 23-5 advantage over Boston College.
- Boston College and Miami are meeting in the season opener for only the second time. In 1993, then No. 4 Miami defeated . then-No. 20 Boston College 23-7 in Chestnut Hill.
- Miami is making its first trip to Chestnut Hill since 2007 a 28-14 Hurricanes loss.
- Miami is 7-3 against Boston College in Chestnut Hill; the last Hurricanes win at Boston College was an 18-7 triumph in 2001 (Miami was ranked No. 1 in the nation).
- · Junior QB Stephen Morris was appointed the starting signal-caller following the Miami Hurricanes' first fall scrimmage in August. Morris has five career starts under his belt, posting a 2-3 record as a starter.
- Nearly of 70 of Miami's 2012 roster hails from Florida (67 players), including 21 that hail from Miami Dade County.
- Four Miami Hurricanes are among 312 seniors named to the 2013 Senior Bowl Watch List, the nation's premier all-star game announced August 23. Senior RB Mike James, DB Brandon McGee, DT Darius Smith and S Vaughn Telemaque represent the Hurricanes on the Senior Bowl's inaugural watch list.

SEASON OPENERS

- Miami is 56-29-1 all-time in season openers, winning three of its last four. Since 1983, Miami is 22-7 in season openers and at one point won nine straight openers (1996-2004).
- After losing back-to-back season openers to Florida State in 2005 and 2006, the Hurricanes had won four straight openers until a 2011 loss at Maryland.

BOSTON COLLEGE SERIES HISTORY

- Saturday will mark the 29th series meeting with Miami holding a 23-5 advantage over Boston College.
- Boston College and Miami are meeting in the season opener for only the second time. In 1993, then-No. 4 Miami defeated then-No. 20 Boston College 23-7 in Chestnut Hill.
- Miami is making its first trip to Chestnut Hill since 2007 a 28-14 Hurricanes loss.
- Miami is 7-3 against Boston College in Chestnut Hill; the last Hurricanes win at Boston College was an 18-7 triumph in 2001 (Miami was ranked No. 1 in the nation).

SERIES NOTES: Miami has won 15 of the last 17 games dating back to 1985 ... Miami is 13-2 against Boston College in conference games (BIG EAST / ACC) ... In 2007 meeting in Chestnut Hill, Boston College ended its 15-game losing streak to the Hurricanes and earned a berth in the ACC title game ... The 2007 win was BC's first over Miami since the 1984 "Hail Flutie" pass that ended one of the greatest games in college football history.

ROAD OPENERS

- For the second consecutive season, Miami will be opening its schedule on the road. The Hurricanes have lost two of their last three season openers on the road. Miami won at Florida State in 2009.
- Miami is 15-12 when opening the season on the road and 2-0 when opening at a neutral site.

ACC OPENERS

- The Miami Hurricanes are 4-4 all-time in Atlantic Coast Conference openers, having lost its previous ACC opener in 2011 — a 32-24 loss at Maryland, the first game of the AI Golden era.
- Miami is 2-3 when opening the season against an ACC foe.

FOUR CANES NAMED TO SENIOR BOWL WATCH LIST

- Four Miami Hurricanes are among 312 seniors named to the 2013 Senior Bowl Watch List, the nation's premier all-star game announced August 23. Senior RB Mike James, DB Brandon McGee, DT Darius Smith and S Vaughn Telemaque represent the Hurricanes on the Senior Bowl's inaugural watch list.
- The top 100 seniors in the nation will be invited to participate in the 2013 Senior Bowl, which is set for Sat., Jan. 26 at Mobile's Ladd-Peebles Stadium. Appearing on the watch list is not a requirement for a player to earn a Senior Bowl invitation.
- The SEC led all conferences with 71 players on the list. The Big Ten had the second-highest amount of honorees with 46, followed by the ACC with 43.

BOTTS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-ACC

- Senior P **Dalton Botts** represented Miami on the 2012 Preseason All-ACC Football team, which was voted on by media members at the annual ACC Football Kickoff.
- The Taft, Calif., native served as the Hurricanes' punter in all 12 games as a junior last season, finished second in the ACC with a 42.7 yards-per-punt average in 2011.
- He booted a season-long 62-yarder in the season finale against Boston College and had one of his best games against then-No. 17 Ohio State with an average of 47.8 yards on four attempts. He had only three touchbacks in 48 attempts, with 11 kicks inside the 20 and 11 punts of at least 50 yards.

TRIO ON PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

- Junior WR Allen Hurns is one of 49 college receivers on 2012 Biletnikoff Award Preseason Watch List given to the nation's top receiver. Hurns, a native of Carol City, Fla., had a breakout season as a sophomore recording 31 receptions for 415 yards in 2011.
- Senior P Dalton Botts is one the Ray Guy Award Watch List (nation's best punter) and senior PK Jake Wieclaw earned placement on the Lou Groza Award Watch List (nation's best placekicker).
- Botts, who served as the Hurricanes' punter in all 12 games in 2011 as a junior, finished second in the ACC with a 42.7 yards-per-punt average. Wieclaw converted on 11-of-14 field goals and all 29 PATs in his first season as the starting placekicker to merit status as a Lou Groza Award Semifinalist in 2011.

MORRIS TABBED THE STARTER FOR BC GAME

- Junior QB **Stephen Morris** was appointed the starting signal-caller following the Miami Hurricanes' first fall scrimmage in August. Morris has five career starts under his belt, posting a 2-3 record as a starter.
- Morris' career-first start came as a true freshman in 2010 against Maryland, a 26-20 Hurricanes win. Morris
 then won his second start the following week a Georgia Tech (26-10). He started the Hurricanes' final two
 regular-season games in 2010 against Virginia Tech and USF.
- Morris' lone start in 2011 was in the season opener at Maryland, a 32-24 Hurricanes defeat.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

More than half of the Miami Hurricanes' 2012 roster are freshmen and sophomores. All-told, Miami's roster includes 42 freshmen — 34 true freshmen and eight redshirt freshmen — and 22 sophomores (11 redshirt sophomores).

FLORIDA-GROWN TALENT

• Nearly of 70 of the Miami Hurricanes' 2012 roster hails from the Sunshine State (67 players), including 21 that hail from Miami-Dade County.

A FAMILY TRADITION

• Listed at 6-6, 314-pounds, OL **Ereck Flowers** won't be the first true freshman to start in his first collegiate game in his family. His father, Everald, did that at Washburn University in Topeka, Kan. But he will be the first true freshman to do it at Miami since QB **Jacory Harris** and WR **Aldarius Johnson** started against Charleston Southern in the 2008 opener. *(Thanks to Manny Navarro of Miami Herald for the note)*

JAMES NOMINATED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

- Senior RB **Mike James** is one of 52 nominees for the 2012 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. As one of college football's most prestigious off-the-field honors, the award recognizes a select group of college football players committed to making a difference in their communities.
- James has played in every game for the Hurricanes the past three seasons (38) and was named Miami's 2011 Strength Training Athlete of the Year. The Haines City, Fla., native was second on the team with eight total touchdowns in 2011, and has reached the endzone 13 times in his career.
- James is working toward a degree in sport administration with a minor in sociology.
- Since coming to Coral Gables in 2009, James has been involved with several community service groups and initiatives, including the Annual University of Miami Marrow Donor Drive, Empowered Youth, The Ronald McDonald House, The Miami Rescue Mission, Rushing the Community and Canes on Patrol.
- In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved and committed to working with a charitable organization, service group or community service while maintaining a strong academic standing.

- 2 Consecutive years that Miami has had receivers surpass the 2,000-yard mark. Leonard Hankerson (2,160) eclipsed the mark in 2010 and Travis Benjamin (2,069) did so in 2011.

MIAMI FOOTBALL RECOGNIZED FOR OUTSTANDING GSR

- The University of Miami was one of only 17 institutions recognized for an outstanding NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of over 90 percent for their football student-athletes in the latest six-year window, as announced by the American Football Coaches Association.
- The GSR is based on a six-year graduation window for student-athletes which is a change from the five-year window used by the CFA and AFCA. The GSR was developed by the NCAA as part of its academic reform initiative to more accurately assess the academic success of student-athletes. The GSR holds institutions accountable for transfer students, unlike the federal graduation rate. The GSR also accounts for midyear enrollees.
- Only sixteen other institutions Air Force, Army, Boise State, Boston College, Central Florida, Duke, Florida, Iowa, Miami (Ohio), Navy, Northern Illinois, Northwestern, Notre Dame, Penn State, Rice, Stanford — achieved a rate of 90 percent or better.

MIAMI FOOTBALL RANKED EIGHTH NATIONALLY IN APR

 When the NCAA's Academic Progress Report (APR) was announced in May, the Canes' football program headlined an outstanding academic showing by the University of Miami for the 2010-11 year. The football team (along with baseball, men's basketball and men's tennis) improved upon its APR score for an impressive seventh straight season. In fact, the UM football program's APR score (978) ranked eighth among all FBS schools.

GSR SCORES SHOW CONTINUED SUCCESS OF MIAMI ATHLETICS

- In what has become an annual upward trend, student-athletes at the University of Miami continue to excel in the classroom at a record pace. According to the NCAA's Graduation Success Rates (GSR), Miami established a new athletics department-wide record with a GSR of 89 percent.
- In 2010-11, the athletics department-wide GSR was at its then record high of 86 percent.
- The athletics department has exceeded the NCAA average for GSR in each of the last seven years.

KENNEDY ENSHRINED IN PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

- Former All-American Cortez Kennedy was officially enshrined into the Pro Football Hall of Fame on August 4. The defensive tackle is the fifth Hurricane to earn the honor, joining Jim Otto (1980), Ted Hendricks (1990), Jim Kelly (2002) and Michael Irvin (2007) in Canton.
- . Kennedy registered 58 sacks and scored one touchdown on a fumble recovery in his 11-season career with the Seattle Seahawks. The No. 3 overall pick in the 1990 NFL Draft, Kennedy had a streak of 116 games played, earned selection to eight Pro Bowls (1992-97, 1999, 2000) and missed just nine games out of a possible 176 in his career.
- As a senior defensive tackle in 1989, he emerged as a dominant force on what many considered to be the nation's top defensive line unit. Kennedy started all 12 games and his tenacious defense helped lead UM to a 11-1 season, a victory in the Sugar Bowl over Alabama and the 1989 National Championship. He earned second team AP All-American honors.

'MAD STORK' ON ACC LEGENDS CLASS OF 2012 ROSTER

- Former Hurricanes DE and Pro Football Hall of Fame DE Ted Hendricks is a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference's Class of 2012 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game Legends.
- Hendricks, known as the "Mad Stork" for his tall (6-7), angular build and his dominating defensive play, started three seasons at defensive end for the Miami Hurricanes under coach Charlie Tate. A three-time All-America for the Hurricanes, he earned consensus, first-team All-America honors in 1967 and 1968, and led Miami to a 20-11-1 record. He ended his collegiate career as Miami's all-time leading tackler with 318 hits in 1968. That year, he was named UPI National Lineman of the Year and finished 5th in the Heisman Trophy balloting.
- He went on to a spectacular 15-year NFL career as an outside linebacker playing in 215 consecutive games with the Baltimore Colts, Green Bay Packers, Oakland and L.A Raiders. During his time in the NFL, he helped lead his teams to four Super Bowl championships, was an eight-time Pro Bowl selection, four times selected as an All-Pro and five times named second-team All-Pro. He was inducted into the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame in 1987 and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1990. He was named to the NFL's 75th Anniversary All-Time team and to the NFL's All-Decade team of the 1970's.
- He was inducted into the University of Miami Hall of Fame in 1980, to its Ring of Honor in 1997 and had his jersey number-number 89-retired, also in 1997.
